BUFFALO -The Steelers took the field in Buffalo knowing they had qualified for the playoffs but left the turf at Bills Stadium with a two-game losing streak.

Kansas City's 33-27 victory over Miami on Sunday afternoon assured the Steelers of their first trip to the postseason since 2017, but there wasn't much to celebrate after a 26-15 loss to the Bills on Sunday night. The Steelers fell to 11-2.

The Bills improved to 10-3.

Buffalo exhausted the final 7:11 of regulation after the second interception of the night thrown by Steelers quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** gave the Bills possession at their 29-yard line.

"We're facing some adversity but we're not hitting the panic button," Roethlisberger said. "We all need to look in the mirror and understand we all need to play better.

"It starts with me."

Kicker Tyler Bass' 23-yard field goal with 8:07 left in the fourth quarter re-established breathing room for the Bills at 26-15 with 8:07 left in regulation.

Buffalo had 334 total net yards to the Steelers' 224, 21 first downs to the Steelers' 14 and possessed the ball for 35:15 to the Steelers' 24:45.

The Bills converted seven of 14 third downs (50 percent).

The Steelers went 1-for-10 on third downs (10 percent).

"Just not enough play-making for us," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin said. "We gotta possess the ball better. We gotta score more points.

"It got tough as attrition set in. We had (left guard) **Matt Feiler** go down with a pec (pectoral injury). We had (**Kevin**) **Dotson** (who had replaced Feiler) go down with a pec. Such is life in the NFL. We gotta find a way to collect ourself and make sufficient plays. We didn't, so we accept responsibility for that and get ready for our next opportunity."

The Steelers are at Cincinnati a week from tonight.

Buffalo gained 232 of its total net yards and scored both of its offensive touchdowns in the second half. "We played like crap, simple as that," defensive tackle **Cam Heyward** said. "We can talk about our defense in the first quarter but after that it all went to hell."

The Steelers battled back from a 16-point deficit and made it a one-score game early in the fourth. Roethlisberger capped a 10-play, 81-yard drive in 4:38 with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver

JuJu Smith-Schuster. Roethlisberger followed with a two-point conversion pass to tight end Eric **Ebron** that brought the Steelers to within 23-15 with 12:18 left in the fourth.

Quarterback Josh Allen's 13-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Gabriel Davis and Bass' extra point gave the Bills a 23-7 lead with 7:02 left in the third quarter. Buffalo moved 57 yards in four plays in 2:05 for its second touchdown in as many second-half possessions.

Buffalo took the second-half kickoff and drove 68 yards in eight plays in 4:37 for a touchdown that increased a two-point halftime advantage to nine. The march culminated on a 19-yard pass from Allen to wide receiver Stefon Diggs. Bass' extra point gave the Bills a 16-7 lead with 10:23 left in the third quarter.

Cornerback Taron Johnson's interception and 51-yard return for a touchdown put the Bills ahead, 9-7, with 52 seconds left in the first half. Johnson stepped in front of a pass from Roethlisberger that was intended for Smith-Schuster on second-and-5 from the Steelers' 47-yard line. Bass missed the extra point wide right.

"We made a few plays in the first half," Tomlin said. "They made a few plays.

"Their plays were more significant than ours. The pick-six was the significant play."

Bass had brought Buffalo to within 7-3 with a 34-yard field goal with 1:42 left in the second quarter. The Bills drove 58 yards in nine plays in 3:14.

The Steelers opened the scoring on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to wide receiver **James Washington** with 8:21 left before the half. What became a three-play, 30-yard scoring drive in 1:15 began after a completion from Allen to tight end Dawson Knox, a fumble by Knox and a recovery by cornerback Cam Sutton. Running back James Conner fumbled on the first snap from the Buffalo 30, but Smith-Schuster recovered. Kicker **Chris Boswell** converted the extra point.

Nose tackle **Tyson Alualu** was credited with a sack when he forced an Allen fumble on first-and-10 from the Buffalo 24 midway through the second. Bills center Mitch Morse recovered, but the play allowed

PITTSBURGH -Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger threw for four touchdowns, two to wide receiver **Chase Claypool**, and the defense held Cincinnati without a conversion on third down on all 13 Bengals' attempts in a 36-10 victory on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field.

"I like what we did on third down," Steelers head coach **Mike Tomlin** said. "We were very good on the possession downs."

The Steelers improved to 9-0 for the first time in franchise history.

The Bengals fell to 2-6-1.

Announced attendance was 5,909.

"We're just taking it one game at a time," outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** said. "We'll take a win any way we can get it.

"The train keeps rolling."

Roethlisberger's fourth touchdown pass and Claypool's second touchdown reception, a 5-yard connection, finished off a five-play drive that began at the Cincinnati 15-yard line following a 42-yard punt return by wide receiver **Ray-Ray McCloud**. Kicker **Chris Boswell**'s extra point gave the Steelers a 36-7 lead with 10:31 left in the fourth quarter.

Roethlisberger finished 27-for-46 passing for a season-high 333 yards and four touchdowns and wasn't

His preparation in the week leading up to the game was virtual until he was activated from the Steelers' Reserve/COVID-19 list and able to participate in what Roethlisberger described as an "up-tempo walkthrough" on Saturday.

"I attribute it to the guys around me," he said. "It was way more than me. It was a total team victory. Added wide receiver JuJu Smith-Schuster: "Ben does what Ben does, I'm nit surprised."

Mason Rudolph took over at quarterback for a possession that began with 5:02 left in regulation, just after a 37-yard field goal by Bengals kicker Randy Bullock accounted for the final margin.

The Steelers took a 22-point lead late in the third quarter on a 12-play, 67-yard drive in 4:12 that culminated on an 11-yard pass from Roethlisberger to Claypool. Roethlisberger converted three third downs, including two third-and-10s, with completions on the march (11 yards to Claypool, 14 yards to tight end **Eric Ebron** and 12 yards to Smith Schuster). Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 29-7 advantage.

Boswell's third field goal in three tries in the first half gave the Steelers a 22-7 lead with 1:48 left in the second quarter. They carried that 15-point advantage into halftime.

The Steelers opened the scoring thanks in part to a turnover generated on special teams.

Outside linebacker **Ola Adeniyi** forced a fumble on a punt return and running back **Benny Snell** recovered at the Cincinnati 32-vard line. The Steelers were unable to register a first down but Boswell converted from 41 yards away from a 3-0 lead with 11:23 left in the first guarter.

A 15-yard punt return by McCloud gave the Steelers possession at the Bengals' 46 midway through the first. They drove to the Cincinnati 12 but ultimately settled for a 30-yard Boswell field goal and a 6-0 lead with 4:50 left in the opening quarter.

The offense required just three plays to score the game's first touchdown on the Steelers' next possession. Roethlisberger hit wide receiver **Diontae Johnson** for 46 yards, wide receiver **James Washington** for 16 and then Johnson again for a 12-yard touchdown on successive snaps. A two-point conversion pass from Roethlisberger to Claypool fell incomplete, keeping the Steelers' lead at 12-0 with 1:51 left in the first.

The Bengals responded with an eight-play, 90-yard touchdown drive in 3:21. A pass from quarterback Joe Burrow to wide receiver Tee Higgins on fourth-and-goal from the Steelers' 2 got Cincinnati into the end zone and onto the scoreboard. Bullock's extra point trimmed the Steelers' lead to 12-7 with 10:37 left in the second. Cincinnati went 2-for-3 on fourth down, including a fake punt that gained 39 yards to the Steelers' 27 and set up Bullock's field goal.

The Steelers' second touchdown, an 8-yard pass from Roethlisberger to Smith-Schuster, capped a seven-play, 78-yard drive in 3:14. Boswell's extra point upped the Steelers' advantage to 19-7 with 7:23 remaining prior

Johnson finished the first half with six catches for 116 yards and a touchdown and didn't catch a pass in the second half.

The two teams combined for just 45 rushing yards in the opening 30 minutes (29 for the Bengals and 16 for the Steelers). The Bengals out-rushed the Steelers, 139-44, overall.

The Steelers sacked Burrow four times and have registered at least one sack in 66th consecutive regular-season games, three off the NFL record of 69 set by Tampa Bay from 1999-2003.



EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. – There was one overriding reason QB **Ben Roethlisberger** worked so hard to return from a major elbow injury.

His team.

Roethlisberger, who missed the final 14 games last season after elbow surgery, threw for three scores and the Steelers beat the New York Giants 26-16 at an empty and eerie MetLife Stadium. He also got all the help he could ask for from his defense and backup RB Bennie Snell.

A key part of it, along with several defensive plays and Snell's 113 yards on 19 carries -- his first 100-yard performance in his second NFL season.

The defense, while not quite on the level of the famed Steel Curtain, was stingy and physical. It held Saquon Barkley to 6 yards on 15 carries, swarming in the backfield nearly all night.

Three Steelers stars got them their first touchdown. All-Pro LB **T.J. Watt** made a clever interception at the New York 36. Roethlisberger beat a blitz with a perfect throw to WR JuJu Smith-Schuster for a 10-vard second-quarter score. K **Chris Boswell's** extra point hit the upright, leaving them behind 10-9.

They got the lead with 7 seconds remaining in the half as Roethlisberger connected with WR James **Washington**, who dived into the end zone for a 13-yard score. Boswell made the PAT this time, and added a 36-yard field goal early in the final quarter. That came following the night's biggest play.

Even though the Pittsburgh defense broke down as the Giants marched 87 yards on 19 plays in the third quarter, it still came up with a huge stop. LB **Bud Dupree** pressured quarterback Daniel Jones as he rolled left from the 4 and deflected his pass. DT **Cam Heyward** practically made a fair catch in the end zone for the interception.

Roethlisberger then took Pittsburgh 62 yards for the field goal and a 19-10 lead. He hit Smith-Schuster again for a 10-yard touchdown and a 26-10 lead before New York got a late TD.

Roethlisberger finished 21 of 32 for 229 yards has now thrown for 366 touchdowns, a franchise record, tying Eli Manning for the eighth most in NFL history.

PITTSBURGH – They started strong but in the end they were hanging on.

All the twists and turns made the Steelers' 26-21 victory over Denver this afternoon at Heinz Field less than aesthetically pleasing, but the final result sure beat the alternative.

"We were far from perfect," head coach **Mike Tomlin** assessed. "We gotta get better. We're thankful to win in spite of it.

The biggest play was made by SS **Terrell Edmunds**.

Edmunds' sack of Broncos backup quarterback Jeff Driskel on fourth-and-2 from the Steelers' 15-yard line with 1:51 left in the fourth quarter ended what turned out to be Denver's final possession.

The Broncos had driven from their 18 to the Steelers 15 but couldn't finish what could have been a game-stealing march.

RB **James Conner's** subsequent 59-yard burst allowed the Steelers to run out the clock.

A fumble by RB **Benny Snell** immediately after the Steelers' punt-return team had registered a safety opened the door for the Broncos to get back in the game.

Denver eventually turned that into a 16-yard touchdown pass from Driskell to running back Melvin Gordon that brought the Broncos to within 26-21.

QB **Ben Roethlisberger** finished 29-for-41 passing for 311 yards and two touchdowns, but he was also intercepted once (the Broncos turned that turnover into a field goal and a 17-6 third-quarter deficit) and directed an offense that converted just two of 12 third downs.

"I didn't play well and that's on me," he said.

In the early stages it was the Steelers' defense generating the turnovers and the Steelers' offense taking advantage.

The tone was set on Denver's second possession, when Steelers outside LB **Bud Dupree** sacked guarterback Drew Lock and forced a fumble that was recovered by CB **Mike Hilton** and returned 8 yards to the Steelers' 41.

Denver lost Lock (shoulder) for the remainder of the afternoon on the play, the first of five sacks registered by the Steelers in the first half.

The Steelers' offense responded with a nine-play, 59-yard drive in 3:19 for a 7-0 lead.

CB Joe Haden's interception of a Driskel pass that deflected off the hands of wide receiver Courtland Sutton and 24-yard return set the Steelers up at the Denver 11 with 1:58 left in the second guarter. But this time Conner lost 1 yard on third-and-1 from the Broncos' 2 and the Steelers settled for K Chris **Boswell's** 21-yard field goal and a 17-3 lead.

In between, the Steelers sprinkled in some spectacular via an 84-yard connection from Roethlisberger to rookie second-round WR Chase Claypool. Roethlisberger let it fly on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 16 and Claypool hauled the ball in over rookie third-round cornerback Michael Ojemudia, managed to navigate the sideline after coming down with it and sprinted the final 47 yards into the end zone. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 14-3 lead with 6:23 left in the half.

A 36-yard punt by P **Dustin Colquitt** and 9-yard return by Diontae Spencer started a Broncos' possession at the Steelers' 36 at the start of the second. Kicker Brandon McManus' 49-yard field goal drew Denver to within 7-3 five plays later.

And a stop by the Denver defense on fourth-and-2 from the Broncos' 35 (Roethlisberger threw incomplete for TE **Eric Ebron**) turned into a six-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 20-yard touchdown pass to tight end Noah Fant and a two-point conversion to Fant that sliced the Steelers' lead to 17-14 with 1:07 left in the third.

The Steelers countered with a 28-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to WR **Diontae Johnson**, and with a safety when Broncos punter Sam Martin fumbled a snap and the ball was eventually knocked out of the back of the end zone.

Roethlisberger broke a tie with Eli Manning and assumed sole possession of eighth place on the NFL's all-time touchdown passes list at 368.

His 311 passing yards moved him ahead of Manning and into seventh place all-time with 57,085.

PITTSBURGH – QB Ben Roethlisberger's record-setting afternoon turned into a first-half shootout with Houston.

Roethlisberger appeared in his 221st regular-season game, which broke a tie with Hall-of-Fame center Mike Webster and elevated Roethlisberger into sole possession of first place on the Steelers' all-time list.

The Steelers made it an occasion to celebrate with a 28–21 victory over the Texans.

The Steelers improved to 3-0.

What had been a back-and-forth exhibit of offense in the first two quarters turned into a slug-fest in the second half.

Trailing 21-20 in the fourth quarter, Roethlisberger directed a 12-play, 79-yard drive in 7:03 that ended on a 12-yard burst for a touchdown by RB **James Conner** and a pass for a two-point conversion from Roethlisberger to WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster** and a 28-21 Steelers' lead with 6:24 left in regulation.

The Texans failed to manage a first down on their next possession and punted, and the Steelers exhausted the final 4:47 left on the clock.

Houston had put up 21 points and gained 209 total net yards in the first half.

The Steelers' defense pitched a second-half shutout while limiting the Texans to 51 total net yards and two first downs, and coming up with the game's only turnover, an interception by nickel CB Mike **Hilton** that set the table for what became the game-winning drive.

"They had a really good plan," Steelers head coach **Mike Tomlin** said of the Texans. "It took us a while to get adjusted to it. It took us a while to find our rhythm."

Roethlisberger found TE **Eric Ebron** with a back shoulder-fade on third-and-goal from the Houston 10 with 5:05 left in the second quarter. Boswell's extra point brought the Steelers to within 14-10.

The Steelers got the ball back 2:38 before the break and turned the possession into a seven-play, 63-yard march for a touchdown in 1:24. Smith-Schuster ran through the Houston secondary uncovered and walked into the end zone on a drive-capping, 26-yard catch-and-run touchdown. Boswell's PAT made in 17-14 Steelers with 1:14 remaining in the second.

It took the Texans just 50 seconds to re-take the lead.

A five-play, 75-yard drive ended with a 14-yard fade from quarterback Deshaun Watson to wide receiver Will Fuller over CB **Steven Nelson** in the back of the end zone. Ka'imi Fairbairn's extra point gave Houston a 21-17 lead with 24 seconds left before halftime.

PITTSBURGH – Rookie WR Chase Claypool, a native of Abbotsford, British Columbia, rushed for one touchdown and caught passes for three more scores and the Steelers broke open what had been a tight game at halftime and then hung on and outlasted the Eagles, 38-29, on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field. Claypool tied a Steelers record for most touchdowns scored in a game with the four, and most points scored in a game with 24 (tying records set by Roy Jefferson, 1968, and Ray Mathews, 1954)

The Steelers improved to 4–0 for the first time since 1979 and for the fourth time in franchise history (1978, 1973).

The Eagles fell to 1-3-1.

Philadelphia trailed 31-29 and had a chance to grab a late lead but a 57-yard field goal attempt by kicker Jake Elliott missed wide right with 3:18 left in regulation.

The Steelers countered with a 35-yard touchdown pass from QB **Ben Roethlisberger** to Claypool with 2:59 left in the fourth quarter. Claypool's fourth touchdown of the day and K Chris Boswell's extra point turned the two-point lead into a nine-point advantage at 38-29.

Claypool finished with seven catches for 110 yards and three touchdowns, and three carroes for 6 yards and a score. Claypool became the fourth rookie since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger with two receiving touchdowns and one rushing touchdown in the same game.

An announced crowd of 4,708 attended the first game fans were permitted to attend amid the pandemic. The Steelers lost G David DeCastro (abdomen) for the game after their initial touchdown drive. DeCastro was replaced by rookie G Kevin Dotson.

WR **Diontae Johnson** went down and stayed down (back) after a 5-yard punt return at the end of Philadelphia's second possession and did not return.

C Maurkice Pouncey (foot) left for the locker room at the two-minute warning. Pouncey was replaced at center on the Steeler's game-ending possession by C **J.C. Hassenauer**.

PITTSBURGH-The Browns came to Heinz Field determined to challenge for first place in the AFC North Division but the Steelers had all the answers on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field. The defense sacked quarterback Baker Mayfield and took the ball away. The offense ran the ball and sprinkled in big plays. It all added up to a 38-7 Steelers' victory.

"That was varsity ball today," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin announced. "They stepped up and stepped up big and met a challenge."

Mayfield, battling a rib injury at the outset he had officially been listed as "questionable/chest" watched the fourth quarter from the bench as the Steelers improved to 5-0 for the second time in franchise history and for the first time since 1978. The Browns saw their four-game winning streak snapped and fell to 4–2. Cleveland has lost 17 consecutive games at Heinz Field and is 1–19 all-time at the facility.

"It was a good win, but I'm going to leave it at that," Steelers defensive tackle and defensive captain

A sequence late in the third quarter told the story as well as any.

Down 24-7, the Browns went for a first down on fourth-and-1 from the Cleveland 29-yard line and 5:59 left in the third. Running back Kareem Hunt was engulfed for a 1-yard loss and the Steelers took

From there the Steelers ran the ball eight consecutive times on the way to re-establishing a 24-point lead at 31-7. The march included a 2-yard sneak by QB **Ben Roethlisberger** on fourth-and-1 from the Browns' 5 and a 3-yard touchdown run by WR **Chase Claypool** on a sweep. The Steelers dominated the first half while building a 24-7 lead.

The first big play was an interception and 33-yard return for a touchdown by F3 Minkan Fitzpatrick
on third-and-3 from the Cleveland 28 with 9:05 left in the first quarter. K Chris Boswell's extra point
gave the Steelers a 10-0 advantage.

"We needed to set the tone on defense," Fitzpatrick said. "A pick-six on the first (defensive) drive of the game is definitely a way to do it."

Added Tomlin: "I think it sent a message to them, third down wasn't going to be easy sledding today." The Eagles had converted 10 of 14 third-down attempts in the Steelers' 38-29 victory over Philadelphia on Oct. 11.

Cleveland went 1-for-12 on third down and 0-for-3 on fourth down. Mayfield was sacked four times and intercepted twice.

And the Browns' No. 1 rushing offense was held to 75 yards on 22 carries, less than half of the 188.4 yards per game on the ground Cleveland had been amassing on average.

The Steelers rushed for 129 yards, including 101 on 20 carries by RB **James Conner**, and scored three touchdowns on the ground.

"At the end of the day it comes down to respect," Conner said. "We just want our respect."

NASHVILLE -A blowout became a nail-biter that wasn't decided until the final hold-your-breath seconds. Titans K Stephen Gostkowski missed wide right on a 45-yard field goal attempt with 14 seconds left in the fourth quarter and the Steelers held on to beat Tennessee, 27-24, on Sunday afternoon in Nashville.

The Steelers improved to 6-0.

Tennessee fell to 5-1.

"All we can say is we're 6-0," DT **Cam Heyward** offered. "It's a good win but there's a lot we have to improve on going forward."

Tennessee had trailed by 20 at 27-7 early in the third quarter but pulled to within three at 27-24 with

RB Derrick Henry blasted home on first-and-goal from the Steelers' 1-yard line after a defensive holding penalty on FS **Minkah Fitzpatrick** on fourth-and-goal from the 1 had given Tennessee a fresh set of downs. Gostkowski's extra point brought the Titans to within a field goal of tying the game."

"No one's really satisfied after today," LB **T.J. Watt** said. "We gotta do a much better job in the second half." The Steelers held Henry to 75 yards on 20 carries a week after he had rushed for 212 yards against Houston. Steelers RB James Conner out-gained Henry on the ground (20 carries, 82 yards) and the Steelers enjoyed a 36:37-23:23 advantage in time of possession and out-gained the Titans, 362-292. A big reason for the offense's success was a 13-for-18 performance converting third downs (72 percent). The Titans converted five of 13 third-down tries (38 percent).

Three interceptions thrown by Steelers QB **Ben Roethlisberger**, two off of deflections, were the only turnovers of the game.

"It wasn't always pretty," Roethlisberger said. "There were times it was but three interceptions is unacceptable. "At the end of the day, we got a win against a really good football team at their place."

The Steelers improved what had been a 17-point halftime advantage on their first possession of the third, which ended on a 30-yard field goal by K **Chris Boswell** that upped their lead to 27-7.

The Titans answered back with a two-play, 75-yard touchdown march comprised almost entirely by a 73-yard touchdown pass from QB Ryan Tannehill to WR A.J. Brown. The catch was made at the Tennessee 35, after which Brown eluded Fitzpatrick and was gone. Gostowski's extra point drew Tennessee to within 27-14.

The Titans crept back within to within 10 at 27–17 on a 51-yard Gostkowski field goal with 2:55 left in the third.
Tennessee took over at the Steelers' 30 after a pass by Roethlisberger was tipped by DT Jeffery Simmons and
intercepted by LB Jayon Brown. But the defense stiffened and forced the Gostkowski attempt after a sack of
Tannehill for a 3-vard loss and a couple of incompletions

The Steelers dominated on third downs in achieving a commanding lead in total net yards, time of possession and on the scoreboard through 30 minutes.

They opened by winning the coin toss, taking the ball and driving it 75 yards for a touchdown in 16 plays that consumed the game's first 9:18. The monster march ended on an 11-yard pass from Roethlisberger to WR **Diontae** Johnson and included conversions on third-and-3, third-and-11 and two third-and-1s. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead with 5:42 left in the first quarter.

The Steelers' second possession resulted in a second touchdown and a 14-0 advantage.

This time the Steelers drive 61 yards in 13 plays and ate up 7:05. RB **Benny Snell** followed just-activated DL **Henry Mondeaux**, who had lined up at fullback, around left end for a 1-yard score on second-and-goal. The Steelers moved the chains on third-and-14, third-and-1 and third-and-12 on the way to the end zone. Boswell's extra point made it 14-0 Steelers with 12:16 left in the second quarter.

Tennessee countered with a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in 6:50 that cut the Steelers' lead to 14-7. Tannehill finished it on third-and-goal with a 4-yard pass to WR Corey Davis with 5:26 left in the second.

The Steelers finally failed to convert on third down on their eighth opportunity (Roethlisberger threw incomplete for WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster**) and settled for a 38-yard field goal by Boswell that ended their third possession and upped their lead to 17-7 with 2:50 left prior to halftime.

The Steelers struck again after WR **Ray-Ray McCloud**'s 57-yard punt return set up a first-and-10 at the Tennessee 17. Roethlisberger hit Johnson for another touchdown, this one a catch-and-run, 9-yard connection, on third-and-2. The Steelers' eighth third-down conversion in nine attempts and Boswell's third extra point upped the Steelers' lead to 24-7 with 52 seconds remaining before the break.

The Steelers out-gained the Titans, 228-83, and had a 19:56-10:04 advantage in time of possession in the first two quarters.

BALTIMORE -The Steelers started slowly but finished strong in Baltimore and improved to 7-0 with a 28-24 victory over the Ravens.

Baltimore fell to 5-2.

The game featured five lead changes, including three in the second half.

"This rivalry is what it is, man," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin observed.

Nose tackle **Isaiah Buggs**, who was playing due to a knee injury sustained by **Tyson Alualu** early in the game, came off a block and started to take Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson to the ground short of the line to gain on fourth-and-3 from the Steelers' 8-yard line just inside the two-minute warning. Free safety **Minkah Fitzpatrick** helped finish Jackson off on the play, which resulted in a fumble and a recovery by inside linebacker Robert Spillane.

The Steelers were unable to generate a first down and punted the ball back to the Ravens with 52 seconds left in regulation.

The Ravens took over at their 37-vard line and drove to the Steelers' 23 with eight seconds left in the fourth quarter but Fitzpatrick successfully defended Jackson's last-gasp pass into the end zone for wide receiver Willie Snead IV, with help from cornerback Justin Layne.

"This wasn't our best defensive performance," defensive end Stephon Tuitt acknowledged. "But those two drives we had to stop them on was what's most important."

Added Spillane: "We knew what it was going to take to win the game."

The Steelers rallied from a 24-21, fourth-quarter deficit with an eight-play, 80-yard drive in 4:27 that ended on an 8-yard touchdown pass from guarterback Ben Roethlisberger to wide receiver **Chase Claypool**. Kicker **Chris Boswell**'s extra point gave the Steelers a 28-24 lead with 7:29 left in regulation.

The Ravens had re-taken the lead on their previous possession, an eight-play, 53-yard drive in 3:58 for a touchdown and a 24-21 advantage. Jackson finished the march with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Marquise Brown. Kicker Justin Tucker converted with 11:56 left in the fourth.

The Steelers struck for two touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the third quarter that turned a 17-7 deficit into a 21-17 lead.

The first took advantage of a short field thanks to an interception by outside linebacker **Alex Highsmith** that set the Steelers up at the Ravens' 21 with 14:04 left in the third. Roethlisberger found tight end Eric

Ebron wide open on a shallow cross on second-and-7 from the Ravens' 18 and Ebron cruised untouched into the end zone. Boswell's extra point trimmed the Baltimore lead to 17-14 with 13:21 left in the third.

After the defense produced a three-and-out, the Steelers drove 77 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown and their second lead of the game.

Running back **James Conner** finished the possession with a 1-yard touchdown run. Roethlisberger had found wide receiver **JuJu Smith-Schuster** for 14 yards on second-and-13 from the Rayens' 15 just prior to the TD. Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 21-17, with 5:38 left in the third.

The Steelers gained 157 of their 221 total net yards in the second half.

Baltimore rushed for 265 yards and had 457 total net yards but came up 23 short.

"They punched us in the mouth," Ebron said. "We had to make adjustments.

"We fought our (backside) off."

The Steelers didn't produce any points on offense and only held the ball for 9:51 in a first half that ended with a 51-vard field goal by Tucker that increased Baltimore's lead to 17-7. Baltimore took over at its 8 with 3:44 left in the second quarter and was able to convert three third downs on a 15-play, 59-yard drive that exhausted the remainder of the first half.

The Ravens had taken a 14–7 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by running back Gus Edwards and Tucker's extra point with 7:24 left in the second quarter. Edwards' rumble into the end zone capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive in 5:18.

Baltimore tied the game at 7-7 on 6-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to wide receiver Miles Boykin and a Tucker extra point with 8:48 left in the first quarter. The Ravens moved 75 yards in nine plays and ate up 5:22 on their second possession of the game.

Baltimore's first possession on the afternoon ended on an interception and 33-yard return for a touchdown by Spillane. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead just 54 seconds into the game.

The Ravens went 5-for-8 on third downs and gained 254 total net yards, including 179 on the ground, while possessing the ball for 20:09 in the first two quarters.

The Steelers allowed an average of 68.8 yards against on the ground over their first six games.

The Steelers went 0-for-3 on third downs and had 64 total net yards in the first 30 minutes.

ARLINGTON -A week after trailing by 10 points at halftime in Baltimore, the Steelers faced a 10-point, fourth-quarter deficit in Dallas.

As they had done against the Ravens, the Steelers rallied to beat the Cowboys.

"I joke I feel like I'm too old for this stuff," QB **Ben Roethlisberger** said. "But we keep winning, having fun with the guys, that's all that matters."

Roethlisberger's 8-yard touchdown pass to TE **Eric Ebron** with 2:14 left in regulation achieved the Steelers' first lead and they hung on for a 24-19 victory.

Dallas' next possession ended when defensive tackle Cam Heyward and LB T.J. Watt sacked quarterback Garrett Gilbert on fourth-and-8 from the Dallas 41-yard line with 1:37 left in regulation.

The Cowboys regained the ball at their 19 with 38 seconds left after the Steelers turned it over on downs. Dallas reached the Pittsburgh 23 but Gilbert's pass into the end zone was knocked down by S **Minkah Fitzpatrick** on a third-and-4 snap with four seconds left.

"Every time we face adversity we fight," Ebron said. "At the end of the day I wouldn't bet against us." The Steelers improved to 8-0 for the first time in franchise history.

"We're humbled and honored to be that group," head coach **Mike Tomlin** said. "I'm really proud of our football team. We've got a group that sticks together, a group that's mentally tough." Dallas fell to 2-7.

Tomlin tied Marty Schottenheimer's NFL record for consecutive seasons coaching with a .500 record or better at 14.

Roethlisberger was temporarily lost to a left knee injury but only missed one offensive series.

He finished with 29 completions on 42 attempts for 306 yards, three touchdowns and a passer rating of 113.8. The six-play drive for the game-winning touchdown covered 79 yards in 1:57.

K Chris Boswell's second field goal of the day, this one from 43 yards out, drew the Steelers to within one point at 19-18 with 7:11 left in the fourth. The 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive in 4:34 began at the Steelers' 1 after an interception in the end zone by Fitzpatrick (strong safety Terrell Edmunds was penalized for an illegal block on the return).

The Steelers pulled to within 19-15 on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to WR JuJu **Smith-Schuster** on the first play of the fourth (Boswell's extra point attempt was blocked).

The six-play, 75-yard scoring drive in 2:22 included completions to Smith-Schuster for 20, 20 and 9 yards prior to the touchdown pass (Ebron was penalized 10 yards for holding and the Cowboys 5 yards for offside on the march).

Dallas improved a four-point halftime cushion to 10 by turning consecutive third-quarter possessions into field goals by kicker Greg Zuerlein.

The first, from 45 yards out, increased the Cowboys' lead to 16-9 with 10:17 left in the third.

The second, a 39-yard effort with 2:13 left in the third, gave Dallas a 19-9 advantage.

The Steelers turned their final two possessions of the first half into nine points and headed to the locker room at halftime trailing, 13-9.

Boswell's franchise-record 59-yard field goal closed the second quarter.

The Steelers had regained possession at the Dallas 39-vard line 52 seconds before the half on a forced fumble by CB Cam Sutton and a recovery by Fitzpatrick.

The Steelers first got on the board on a 17-yard touchdown pass from

Roethlisberger to WR **James Washington** 1:10 prior to intermission. Boswell missed the extra point attempt wide left and the Cowboys led, 13-6.

Roethlisberger limped to the locker room after the touchdown pass favoring his left knee.

Backup QB Mason Rudolph directed the subsequent four-play field goal drive and completed two of three passes for 3 yards.

The Cowboys grabbed a 3-0 lead on a 38-yard field goal by Zuerlein that ended a 12-play, 65-yard drive in 6:47 on Dallas' first possession.

The Cowboys upped their lead to 10-0 on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Gilbert to wide receiver CeeDee Lamb and a Zuerlein extra point with 7:45 left in the second. The scoring strike wrapped up an eight-play, 65-vard drive in 3:41.

Dallas turned a throwback on a punt return that went for 73 yards after an illegal block penalty had been enforced into a 44-yard field goal by Zuerlein and a 13-0 lead with 3:46 left in the second.

PITTSBURGH - Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger threw for four touchdowns, two to wide receiver **Chase Claypool**, and the defense held Cincinnati without a conversion on third down on all 13 Bengals' attempts in a 36-10 victory on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field.

"I like what we did on third down," Steelers head coach **Mike Tomlin** said. "We were very good on the possession downs."

The Steelers improved to 9-0 for the first time in franchise history.

The Bengals fell to 2-6-1.

Announced attendance was 5,909.

"We're just taking it one game at a time," outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** said. "We'll take a win any way we can get it.

"The train keeps rolling."

Roethlisberger's fourth touchdown pass and Claypool's second touchdown reception, a 5-yard connection, finished off a five-play drive that began at the Cincinnati 15-yard line following a 42-yard punt return by wide receiver **Ray-Ray McCloud**. Kicker **Chris Boswell**'s extra point gave the Steelers a 36-7 lead with 10:31 left in the fourth quarter.

Roethlisberger finished 27-for-46 passing for a season-high 333 yards and four touchdowns and wasn't

His preparation in the week leading up to the game was virtual until he was activated from the Steelers' Reserve/COVID-19 list and able to participate in what Roethlisberger described as an "up-tempo walkthrough" on Saturday.

"I attribute it to the guys around me," he said. "It was way more than me. It was a total team victory. Added wide receiver JuJu Smith-Schuster: "Ben does what Ben does, I'm nit surprised."

Mason Rudolph took over at quarterback for a possession that began with 5:02 left in regulation, just after a 37-yard field goal by Bengals kicker Randy Bullock accounted for the final margin.

The Steelers took a 22-point lead late in the third quarter on a 12-play, 67-yard drive in 4:12 that culminated on an 11-yard pass from Roethlisberger to Claypool. Roethlisberger converted three third downs, including two third-and-10s, with completions on the march (11 yards to Claypool, 14 yards to tight end **Eric Ebron** and 12 yards to Smith Schuster). Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 29-7 advantage.

Boswell's third field goal in three tries in the first half gave the Steelers a 22-7 lead with 1:48 left in the
second quarter. They carried that 15-point advantage into halftime

The Steelers opened the scoring thanks in part to a turnover generated on special teams.

Outside linebacker **Ola Adeniyi** forced a fumble on a punt return and running back **Benny Snell** recovered at the Cincinnati 32-vard line. The Steelers were unable to register a first down but Boswell converted from 41 yards away from a 3-0 lead with 11:23 left in the first guarter.

A 15-yard punt return by McCloud gave the Steelers possession at the Bengals' 46 midway through the first. They drove to the Cincinnati 12 but ultimately settled for a 30-yard Boswell field goal and a 6-0 lead with 4:50 left in the opening quarter.

The offense required just three plays to score the game's first touchdown on the Steelers' next possession. Roethlisberger hit wide receiver **Diontae Johnson** for 46 yards, wide receiver **James Washington** for 16 and then Johnson again for a 12-yard touchdown on successive snaps. A two-point conversion pass from Roethlisberger to Claypool fell incomplete, keeping the Steelers' lead at 12-0 with 1:51 left in the first.

The Bengals responded with an eight-play, 90-yard touchdown drive in 3:21. A pass from quarterback Joe Burrow to wide receiver Tee Higgins on fourth-and-goal from the Steelers' 2 got Cincinnati into the end zone and onto the scoreboard. Bullock's extra point trimmed the Steelers' lead to 12-7 with 10:37 left in the second. Cincinnati went 2-for-3 on fourth down, including a fake punt that gained 39 yards to the Steelers' 27 and set up Bullock's field goal.

The Steelers' second touchdown, an 8-yard pass from Roethlisberger to Smith-Schuster, capped a seven-play, 78-yard drive in 3:14. Boswell's extra point upped the Steelers' advantage to 19-7 with 7:23 remaining prior

Johnson finished the first half with six catches for 116 yards and a touchdown and didn't catch a pass in the second half.

The two teams combined for just 45 rushing yards in the opening 30 minutes (29 for the Bengals and 16 for the Steelers). The Bengals out-rushed the Steelers, 139–44, overall.

The Steelers sacked Burrow four times and have registered at least one sack in 66th consecutive regular-season games, three off the NFL record of 69 set by Tampa Bay from 1999-2003.

PITTSBURGH -The Steelers fell behind early but responded with 27 unanswered points and stayed undefeated with a 27-3 victory over the Jaguars this afternoon at TIAA Bank Stadium in Jacksonville.

The Steelers improved to 10-0.

The Jaquars lost their ninth straight and fell to 1-9.

The focus turned immediately in the aftermath to Thursday night's hosting of Baltimore (6-4 after an overtime loss to the Titans and third in the AFC North Division behind the Steelers and 7-3 Cleveland).

A potential regular season record of 16-0 remains off the Steelers' radar.

"Just focus on one week at a time, and that's what this team has done," quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** said. "We're not chasing perfection, we're chasing a Lombardi (Trophy)."

Roethlisberger's 20-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Eric Ebron** with 6:40 left in the fourth quarter provided the exclamation point in Jacksonville. Kicker **Chris Boswell'**s extra point accounted for the final margin.

"We did the job," head coach Mike Tomlin said. "We checked the boxes.

"It wasn't perfect, but nothing's perfect about us except our record."

Wide receiver **Diontae Johnson** had his second consecutive 100-yard game receiving, with 12 catches for 111 yards.

Boswell's 47-yard field goal with 10:21 left in regulation had been the only scoring in the second half prior to the Roethlisberger-to-Ebron touchdown.

The Steelers have scored at least 24 points in every game this season.

"We gotta put more points on the board," Roethlisberger insisted. "Offensively, we got the win but we know we need to be better."

Roethlisberger went 32-for-46 passing, for 267 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception, before being relieved late by Mason Rudolph.

The Steelers gained 110 yards on their first 24 rushing attempts after failing to crack the 50-yard plateau on the ground in three consecutive games. Their final possession consisted of Rudolph kneeling three times and losing 4 yards while running out the clock.

Running back **James Conner** had 89 yards on 13 carries (a 6.8 average).

"We weren't down on ourselves," he said of the running game. "We knew we had an opportunity to keep arowina."

Running back **Benny Snell**'s 1-yard touchdown run with 44 seconds left prior to halftime gave the Steelers a two-score lead. The Steelers drove 61 yards on seven plays in 2:13 after nose tackle **Tyson Alualu**'s pass deflection and free safety **Minkah Fitzpatrick**'s interception and 37-yard return to the Steelers' 39-yard line. Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 17-3.

The Steelers achieved their first lead of the afternoon on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to wide receiver **Chase Claypool**. The possession covered 71 yards over six plays in 2:49. The touchdown was Claypool's eighth receiving and 10th overall in 10 games. Boswell's extra point made it a 10-3 game.

Boswell had tied the game at 3-3 with a 44-yard field goal with 10:45 left in the second, a kick that capped a nine-play, 50-yard drive in 4:15.

The Jaguars took a 3-0 lead on the game's first possession. Jacksonville's nine-play, 52-yard drive in 4:03 was culminated by kicker Chase McLaughlin's 41-yard field goal.

Boswell missed a 45-yard try with 8:47 left in the first quarter, which snapped streaks of 14 straight field goals this season and 25 in a row overall dating back to last season.

An interception in the Jacksonville end zone on the last play of the first half denied the Steelers a chance to add to their advantage.

The Steelers outscored the Jaguars, 17-0, out-gained them, 185-69, and possessed the ball for 9:46 in the second quarter. Strong safety **Terrell Edmunds** also had an interception, his first of the season, in the quarter. Edmunds and Fitzpatrick each accounted for their second interception on the day, the third and fourth collected by the Steelers' defense, in the fourth quarter.

Defensive end **Stephon Tuitt'**s sack of quarterback Jake Luton in the third quarter extended the Steelers' streak to 67 games with at least one sack, two shy of the NFL-record of 69 (Tampa Bay, 1999-2003). The defense finished with two sacks.

PITTSBURGH — The Steelers overcame rust and the Ravens in the two teams' thrice-postponed rematch and improved to 11-0 with a 19-14 victory on Wednesday afternoon at Heinz Field.

Head coach Mike Tomlin was happy about the result but little else associated with the Steelers' performance. "I'm really disappointed," Tomlin fumed. "It was really junior varsity in all three phases.

"It was just bad by all parties involved, coaches first, players second. We didn't play well or coach well." The game had originally been scheduled for Thanksgiving night.

Quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** acknowledged "a very challenging last few days," but wouldn't attribute the way the Steelers played to the multiple postponements.

"I don't want to make excuses," he said. "We just weren't good enough at all today."

Added wide receiver **JuJu Smith-Schuster**: "I wouldn't say it hindered us. It was kind of frustrating the game kept being pushed back"

Tomlin cited too many dropped passes among what he found disappointing.

"I need to be more accurate with my passes," Roethlisberger said. "I'll take the heat for the drops and things that weren't accurate."

Baltimore crept within five points on a two-play, 84-yard drive in 32 seconds late in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Trace McSorley, who had replaced injured starter Robert Griffin III, hit wide receiver Marquise Brown for a 70-yard catch-and-run touchdown on first-and-10 from the Baltimore 30-yard line and kicker Justin Tucker's extra point brought the Ravens to within 19-14 with 2:58 left in regulation.

The Steelers received the subsequent kickoff and were able to run out the clock from there. Baltimore fell to 6-5.

The Ravens activated 10 players from their practice squad as COVID-19 replacements prior to kickoff.

"We played like JV," said Smith-Schuster, who caught eight passes for 37 yards and a touchdown. "We played down to their level.

"They came out with a JV squad. We were playing JV. We didn't come out and execute and play the way we wanted to play.

"It was a close game, which it should't have been."

The Steelers out-gained the Ravens, 334-219, and held a 33:39-26:21 edge in time of possession but scored just one touchdown in four red zone possessions.

Roethlisberger completed 36 of 51 passes for 266 yards, with one touchdown and one interception.

The interception occurred on a throw into the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the Baltimore 1 that ende	d
the Steelers' second possession	

The McSorley-to-Brown touchdown late in the fourth quarter was the Ravens' first first down converted through the air.

Roethlisberger's 1-yard touchdown pass to Smith-Schuster with 13:20 left in the fourth was the first score of the second half. Kicker Chris Boswell's extra point upped the Steelers' five-point halftime lead to 12 at 19-7. The Steelers' offense failed to score a touchdown in the first half.

Cornerback Joe Haden opened the scoring when he intercepted Griffin on third-and-4 from the Baltimore 12 and returned the ball 14 yards for a touchdown. Boswell's missed extra point, his fourth on 34 attempts, kept the Steelers' lead at 6-0, with 6:57 left in the first quarter.

The Ravens countered after gaining possession at the Steelers' 16 following a muffed punt return by wide receiver Ray-Ray McCloud and a recovery by Ravens defensive back/linebacker Anthony Levine Sr. Baltimore turned the turnover into a four-play, 16-yard drive in 2:24 that ended on a 1-yard carry by running back Gus Edwards. Tucker's extra point put the Ravens ahead, 7-6, with 2:07 left in the first.

The Steelers regained the lead at 9-7 on a 25-yard field goal by Boswell with 11:50 left in the second quarter. The Steelers' 12-play, 73-yard drive in 5:17 achieved a first-and-goal at the Ravens' 5 but eventually stalled.

Boswell's second field goal of the day, this one from 27 yards out, upped the advantage to 12-7 with 4:27 left prior to halftime. This time a 13-play, 65-yard drive in 5:14 established a first-and-goal at the Baltimore 8 before fizzling.

The Steelers took a lead into the locker room at halftime thanks in part to free safety **Minkah Fitzpatrick'**s pass defensed on a throw into the end zone from Griffin to tight end Luke Willson on third-and-goal from the Steelers' 1 with three seconds remaining before the break.

Griffin was sacked twice in the first half and three times overall.

The Steelers increased their streak of consecutive games with at least one sack to 68, one shy of Tampa Bay's NFI -record 69 (1999-2003).

The Steelers announced prior to kickoff that center **Maurkice Pouncey** had been placed on the Reserve/ COVID-19 list

First-year pro **J.C. Hassenauer** started at center, his first career start.

Running back Benny Snell started in place of James Conner (Reserve/COVID-19 list) and finished with 60 yards on 16 carries and 33 yards on three receptions.

PITTSBURGH —The Steelers' dreams of an undefeated regular season are history and they'll have to wait at least until this Sunday to clinch a return trip to the postseason following Washington's 23-17 victory this evening at Heinz Field.

Washington kicker Dustin Hopkins' 45-yard field goal with 2:04 left in regulation provided Washington's first lead. The visitors got into position to break a 17-17 tie on a 29-yard completion from quarterback Alex Smith to wide receiver Cam Sims on third-and-4 from the Washington 44-yard line.

Steelers quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** was intercepted by former Steelers linebacker Jon Bostic on a pass that was tipped by defensive end Montez Sweat on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 25 with 2:04 left in the fourth quarter. Hopkins added another 45-yard field goal with 17 seconds left in the fourth quarter.

The Steelers' last-gasp possession started from their 25 and ended with a completion to tight end Eric Ebron that ran out the clock.

"We're not frustrated," cornerback **Mike Hilton** said. "We just know we gotta play better."

Added quarterback Ben Roethlisberger: "We just need to make plays. I need to deliver us into plays that are best suited for situations. It starts with me. I need to be better."

The 5 p.m. kickoff was the second game in a stretch that includes three in 12 days for the Steelers, who next play this Sunday night in Buffalo.

The Steelers fell to 11-1.

Washington improved to 5-7.

"We just gotta make routine lays routinely," head coach Mike Tomlin said. "We're not making them routinely

The Steelers finished with slight edges in total net yards (326-318) and third down conversions (6-for-15, 40 percent to Washington's 4-for-17, 24 percent).

Washington had a slight edge in time of possession (30:26-29:34) after having the ball for just 12:49 in the

Washington moved 53 yards in eight plays midway through the fourth and tied the game at 17-17 on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Smith to tight end Logan Thomas and Hopkins' extra point.

Fill-in kicker **Matthew Wright**'s 37-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth put the Steelers ahead by seven at 17-10. Wright was activated from the practice squad prior to kickoff to replace Chris Boswell (hip).

Washington closed to within 14-10 after receiving the kickoff to open the second half. The visitors used 14

plays to drive 82 yards in 6:44 on a march that was capped by a 1-yard touchdown burst by running back Peyton Barber. Hopkins' extra point drew Washington within four. Washington was able to extend the drive on a 31-yard flanker screen from Smith to Sims on third-and-14 from the Washington 14-yard line. Smith also hooked up with Thomas for a 30-yard gain to the Steelers' 1.

The Steelers broke the ice early in the second quarter following an opening 15 minutes that saw the two teams combine for six first downs and punt a combined six times.

Roethlisberger capped a 14-play, 72-yard drive in 6:16 with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Diontae** Johnson. Wright converted the extra point and the Steelers led, 7-0. Running back Benny Snell converted a thirdand-1 with a 2-yard gain at the outset of the drive, and Roethlisberger hit Johnson for 17 yards on third-and-12, Ebron for 15 on third-and-6 and wide receiver **Chase Claypool** for 8 on third-and-7 on the way to the end zone.

The Steelers struck again late in the second on a 50-yard catch-and-run touchdown connection from Roethlisberger to wide receiver **James Washington.** The one-play drive concluded a sequence that saw Snell stopped on fourth-and-goal from the Washington 1 and the Steelers' defense force a three-and-out from the Washington offense. Wide receiver **Ray-Ray McCloud**'s 17-yard punt return established possession for the Steelers at midfield. Wright's second successful extra point made it 14-0 with 3:54 left in the first half.

Washington got on the scoreboard on a 49-yard field goal from Hopkins with one second left before the break. Washington used six plays and drove 28 yards in 49 seconds to close to within 14-3.

Inside linebacker **Robert Spillane'**s sack of Smith in the first quarter extended the Steelers streak of registering at least one sack to an NFL record-tying 69 consecutive games. Tampa Bay established the mark from 1999-2003. Smith was sacked three times overall, including outside linebacker T.J. Watt's NFL-leading 12th of the season. Watt forced a fumble in the fourth quarter that was recovered by Washington.

The Steelers out-gained Washington 211-114 in the opening 30 minutes, held a 17:11-12:49 edge in time of possession and converted four of nine third downs (44.4 percent) to zero for Washington in eight attempts.

Washington lost rookie running back Antonio Gibson to a toe injury in the first quarter after he'd carried twice and gained 14 yards on the ground.

The Steelers lost Spillane (knee) and cornerback Joe Haden (evaluated for a concussion) in the second half.

BUFFALO -The Steelers took the field in Buffalo knowing they had qualified for the playoffs but left the turf at Bills Stadium with a two-game losing streak.

Kansas City's 33-27 victory over Miami on Sunday afternoon assured the Steelers of their first trip to the postseason since 2017, but there wasn't much to celebrate after a 26-15 loss to the Bills on Sunday night. The Steelers fell to 11-2.

The Bills improved to 10-3.

Buffalo exhausted the final 7:11 of regulation after the second interception of the night thrown by Steelers quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** gave the Bills possession at their 29-yard line.

"We're facing some adversity but we're not hitting the panic button," Roethlisberger said. "We all need to look in the mirror and understand we all need to play better.

"It starts with me."

Kicker Tyler Bass' 23-yard field goal with 8:07 left in the fourth quarter re-established breathing room for the Bills at 26-15 with 8:07 left in regulation.

Buffalo had 334 total net yards to the Steelers' 224, 21 first downs to the Steelers' 14 and possessed the ball for 35:15 to the Steelers' 24:45.

The Bills converted seven of 14 third downs (50 percent).

The Steelers went 1-for-10 on third downs (10 percent).

"Just not enough play-making for us," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin said. "We gotta possess the ball better. We gotta score more points.

"It got tough as attrition set in. We had (left guard) **Matt Feiler** go down with a pec (pectoral injury). We had (**Kevin**) **Dotson** (who had replaced Feiler) go down with a pec. Such is life in the NFL. We gotta find a way to collect ourself and make sufficient plays. We didn't, so we accept responsibility for that and get ready for our next opportunity."

The Steelers are at Cincinnati a week from tonight.

Buffalo gained 232 of its total net yards and scored both of its offensive touchdowns in the second half. "We played like crap, simple as that," defensive tackle **Cam Heyward** said. "We can talk about our defense in the first quarter but after that it all went to hell."

The Steelers battled back from a 16-point deficit and made it a one-score game early in the fourth. Roethlisberger capped a 10-play, 81-yard drive in 4:38 with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver

JuJu Smith-Schuster. Roethlisberger followed with a two-point conversion pass to tight end Eric **Ebron** that brought the Steelers to within 23-15 with 12:18 left in the fourth.

Quarterback Josh Allen's 13-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Gabriel Davis and Bass' extra point gave the Bills a 23-7 lead with 7:02 left in the third quarter. Buffalo moved 57 yards in four plays in 2:05 for its second touchdown in as many second-half possessions.

Buffalo took the second-half kickoff and drove 68 yards in eight plays in 4:37 for a touchdown that increased a two-point halftime advantage to nine. The march culminated on a 19-yard pass from Allen to wide receiver Stefon Diggs. Bass' extra point gave the Bills a 16-7 lead with 10:23 left in the third quarter.

Cornerback Taron Johnson's interception and 51-yard return for a touchdown put the Bills ahead, 9-7, with 52 seconds left in the first half. Johnson stepped in front of a pass from Roethlisberger that was intended for Smith-Schuster on second-and-5 from the Steelers' 47-yard line. Bass missed the extra point wide right.

"We made a few plays in the first half," Tomlin said. "They made a few plays.

"Their plays were more significant than ours. The pick-six was the significant play."

Bass had brought Buffalo to within 7-3 with a 34-yard field goal with 1:42 left in the second quarter. The Bills drove 58 yards in nine plays in 3:14.

The Steelers opened the scoring on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to wide receiver **James Washington** with 8:21 left before the half. What became a three-play, 30-yard scoring drive in 1:15 began after a completion from Allen to tight end Dawson Knox, a fumble by Knox and a recovery by cornerback Cam Sutton. Running back James Conner fumbled on the first snap from the Buffalo 30, but Smith-Schuster recovered. Kicker **Chris Boswell** converted the extra point.

Nose tackle **Tyson Alualu** was credited with a sack when he forced an Allen fumble on first-and-10 from the Buffalo 24 midway through the second. Bills center Mitch Morse recovered, but the play allowed
