## KICKOFF WEEKEND

- Pittsburgh owns a 45-38-5 (.540) all-time record on Kickoff Weekend, including a 14-20-2 (.417) mark on the road.
- The Steelers opened six consecutive seasons (2015-20) away from Heinz Field. Pittsburgh is 3-3 (.500) in those six match-ups.
- The Steelers opened the season on the road against an NFC foe for the first time since 2016 at Washington (W, 38-16).
- Pittsburgh owns an 9-4 (.692) record against NFC foes on Kickoff weekend.
- Pittsburgh had not previously faced the New York Giants in a season opener since Sept. 15, 1968, when the Steelers lost at home, 34-20.
- Last week's meeting with the Giants marked the first time in franchise history that Pittsburgh opened a season in New York against the Giants.
- The Steelers have played the New York Giants on Kickoff Weekend six times. Pittsburgh is 2-2-2 (.500) in those six meetings.
- Since 1960, Pittsburgh is 14-2-1 on Kickoff Weekend when a Steelers running back rushes for 100 yards or more.
- The Steelers are 16-1-1 in Week 1 games since 1940 when the team scores 30+ points.
- Pittsburgh **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns Steelers Kickoff Weekend records (since 1960) for the most completions (33), passing attempts (43) and passing yards (365) – the first two during the team's 2009 opening day, 13-10, win over Tennessee and his yardage total in 2014's Week 1 30-27 win vs. Cleveland.
- Pittsburgh's 45 all-time victories on Kickoff Weekend are the most among AFC teams.

## STEELERS 2020 TEAM CAPTAINS

- The Steelers selected five players to serve as team captains for the 2020 season determined by a vote of their teammates.
- QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **C Maurkice Pouncey** were selected to serve as offensive captains, **DT Cameron Heyward** and **LB T.J. Watt** were picked to serve as defensive captains and **S Jordan Dangerfield** was chosen to serve as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 12th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-20). This marks Heyward's sixth consecutive year as a captain (2015-20), and the fourth time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-20).
- Watt and Dangerfield were named captains for the first time in their respective careers.

## SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Steelers are slated to appear in four nationally televised primetime regular-season games in 2020, highlighted by the franchise's first-ever Thanksgiving home game.
- Pittsburgh's four nationally-televised, regular-season primetime games is tied for the eighth-most of any franchise in the League.

- The Steelers will play host to the Baltimore Ravens at 8:20 p.m. ET on Thanksgiving, Thursday, Nov. 26, on NBC. Pittsburgh has played eight times on Thanksgiving, but each previous contest occurred outside of Pittsburgh. The Steelers defeated the Indianapolis Colts, 28-7, on November 24, 2016, in their last appearance on the holiday.
- Pittsburgh will also make two appearances on Monday Night Football, which extends the Steelers streak to 16 consecutive years with at least one MNF game. Pittsburgh opened its regular season on Monday Night Football at the New York Giants in Week 1 on Sept. 14 (W, 26-16). The Steelers will also travel to the Cincinnati Bengals for an MNF contest in Week 15 on Dec. 21 (ESPN 8:15 p.m.).
- Pittsburgh's other nationally televised primetime game is scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Buffalo Bills in Week 14 on Dec. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.).
- The Steelers' bye week will be on Nov. 1 (Week 8).
- "Flexible scheduling" will be used in Weeks 11-17. Additionally, in Weeks 5-10, flexible scheduling may be used in no more than two weeks. In Weeks 5-16, the schedule lists the games tentatively set for Sunday Night Football on NBC. Only Sunday afternoon games are eligible to be moved to Sunday night, in which case the tentatively scheduled Sunday night game would be moved to an afternoon start time. A flexible scheduling move would be announced at least 12 days before the game in Weeks 11-16 and at least six days prior to Week 17. Flexible scheduling will not be applied to games airing on Thursday or Monday nights.





#### FOUR STEELERS NAMED ALL-PRO

- **DT Cameron Heyward, LB T.J. Watt and S Minkah Fitzpatrick** were all named first-team Associated Press All-Pro.
- Heyward is an All-Pro for the second time, while Fitzpatrick and Watt are first-time selections.
- Heyward, who was named All-Pro after the 2017 season, registered 9.0 sacks, 22 quarterback hits, 11 tackles for a loss and six passes defended.
- Fitzpatrick had 5 interceptions, 2 forced fumble and 3 fumble recoveries, while making a huge impact on the defense after being acquired via trade from the Miami Dolphins. He led the NFL in takeaways with 8 and tied for the League lead in defensive touchdowns with 2.
- Watt was named first-team edge rusher after finishing the year with 14.5 sacks. He finished with eight forced fumbles, two interceptions, four fumble recoveries and 36 quarterback hits. Also voted second-team All-Pro at linebacker, Watt had multiple sack games four times this season, including two sacks against both the Rams and Dolphins, and a sack and a half against the Bengals and Colts.
- Rookie Diontae Johnson was also named second-team All-Pro as a punt returner. Johnson returned 22 punts for 272 yards, a 12.36-yard average. He also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals, which was the play of the game in the Steelers 23-17 win. The touchdown included him reversing direction and then turning on the afterburners. It was the longest punt return in team history, and it broke a dry spell, as the last punt return for a touchdown by the Steelers was in 2015.
- **WR Diontae Johnson** was named second-team All-Pro as a punt returner. He returned 22 punts for 272 yards, a 12.36-yard average. Johnson also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals.

#### FIVE STEELERS SELECTED TO THE 2020 PRO BOWL

- **DT Cameron Heyward, LB T.J. Watt, C Maurkice Pouncey, S Minkah Fitzpatrick and G David DeCastro** were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- The Steelers are sending multiple players to the Pro Bowl for the 19th straight season and for the 28th time in the last 31 seasons. With five players named to the 2020 Pro Bowl, Pittsburgh has had five or more selections in each of the last four Pro Bowls.
- Heyward earned his second consecutive selection to the Pro Bowl and third trip overall (replaced an injured player following the 2017 season).

## TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with 3 100-win head coaches.
- Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in his 157th career regular-season game, which marked the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark (**Chuck Noll**, 158; **Bill Cowher**, 163).
- Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (**Bill Cowher**, 1992-2001, 99; **Chuck Noll**, 1976-78, 88).
- Tomlin also joined an elite NFL head coach fraternity by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season,

- In 57 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted a 39-18 record, including winning each of his first seven starts against conference members.
- On Monday Night Football in Week 3 of 2018 vs. Tampa Bay, Roethlisberger led the Steelers to a 30-27. He threw for 353 yards on 30-of-38 passing with three TDs and one interception for a 120.7 passer rating.
- Roethlisberger tossed three TDs in a 41-17 win vs. Atlanta in Week 5 and recorded a perfect passer rating of 158.3 with five TD passes in Week 10 vs. Carolina.

- QB Ben Roethlisberger** became the eighth quarterback in NFL history — first in team history — to reach 50,000 career passing yards in regular-season games. He accomplished the feat in Week 13 of 2017 at Cincinnati.
- Roethlisberger reached 50,000 career passing yards in his 197th regular-season game. He became the fifth quarterback in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 200 games.

### STEELERS D-MEN DOMINATES GIANTS

- Pittsburgh bottled up Giants' RB Saquon Barkley in Week 1. The Steelers limited the dynamic back to just 6 yards on 15 carries, tied for the second-fewest yards by any player with 15 or more rushes in a game since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- Barkley's 6 yards rushing were the second-fewest of his career. He had 1 yard rushing in Week 10 of 2019 at the New York Jets.
- The Steelers were just the sixth defense since 1970 NFL-AFL merger to limit an opposing running back to fewer than 10 yards on 15 or more carries.
- Pittsburgh held the Giants to 29 yards rushing on 20 carries, good for a 1.5 yards per rush average. The 29-yard rushing output was New York's lowest total since they ran for 23 yards at the Jets in Week 10 of 2019.
- The Steelers registered 11 tackles for loss, 8 quarterback hits, 5 passes defended, 3.0 sacks and 2 interceptions. Pittsburgh forced 3 three-and-outs and limited the Giants to 2 yards or less on 6 of their 11 offensive possessions.

### DEFENSIVE RESURGENCE

- Over its first 2 games of 2019, Pittsburgh allowed 61 points (fifth worst in the NFL), 7 TDs (tied for fifth worst), 75.0 opposing completion percentage (fourth worst) and 131.3 opposing passer rating (fourth worst).
- Over their final 14 games of 2019, the Steelers ranked first in the League in takeaways (34), first in fumble recoveries (15), tied for first in interceptions (20), second in quarterback hits (104), second in passes defended (79), second in sacks (48.0), third in forced fumbles (18), tied for third in tackles for loss (79) and tied for third in defensive TDs (3).
- The Steelers also allowed 4.48 yards/play (1st), 6 rush TDs (t-1st), 72.4 opposing passer rating (2nd), 242 points (3rd), 17.3 points/game (3rd), 23 offensive TDs (2nd), 6.29 passing yards/attempt (3rd), 58.8% completion percentage (2nd), 176.6 passing yards/game (3rd), 284.0 total yards/game (3rd), 3.76 yards/rush (3rd) 17 passing TDs (t-6th) and 10.7 passing yards/completion (t-8th).

## TURN DOWN FOR WATT

- LB T.J. Watt** opened the 2020 season exactly where he left off in 2019. He registered 2 passes defended, 2 quarterback hits, 1 tackle for loss and 1 interception in Week 1 against the Giants. Watt has now picked off four passes over his career. The interception set up the Steelers at the Giants' 36-yard line. Pittsburgh would take advantage and score a touchdown.
- Watt put together an NFL Defensive Player of the Year-caliber season in 2019. He ranked in the top-five in the NFL in sacks (14.5, t-4th), quarterback hits (36, 3rd), forced fumbles (8, t-1st) and fumble recoveries (4, t-2nd). Watt also ranked tied for 12th in tackles for loss (14).

## SACK NOTES

- DT Cameron Heyward** registered the first interception of his career in Week 1 of 2020 against the Giants. He's played 10 years, 135 games and 100 starts. The interception halted a New York drive that opened at its own 9-yard line and marched 87 yards on 19 plays, taking New York down to the Steelers' 4-yard line.
- The Giants 19-play drive was tied for the longest since 1999 that resulted in a turnover. The Saints had a 19-play drive end in a lost fumble in 2018, and the Broncos had a 19-play drive end with a fumble in 2002.
- Heyward was named All-Pro in 2019 for the second time in his career (2017) and finished the year with 9.0 sacks, 22 quarterback hits, 11 tackles for a loss and six passes defended.
- Heyward ranked second on the team in quarterback hits (22), third in sacks (9.0) and third in tackles for loss (11).
- Heyward not only led all NFL defensive tackles in stops with 83, but he also led the League in tackles by a defensive lineman. In fact, his 83 tackles were the most by a Steelers defensive lineman since Donald Evans had 84 in 1993.
- Heyward registered 7 or more tackles in 3 different games in 2019.

## BUSHWHACKING THROUGH THE NFL

- **LB Devin Bush** made quite an impact in his rookie season in the NFL.
- Bush set a franchise rookie record with 109 tackles, which is the most by a Steeler in a season since Lawrence Timmons had 114 in 2016.
- Bush was the only NFL rookie with a fumble recovery (4), interception (2), forced fumble (1) and 100 or more tackles (109).
- Bush was the first NFL rookie with at least 100 tackles, 4 fumble recoveries, 2 interceptions, 1 forced fumble and 1 sack in the same season since Bennie Blades of the Detroit Lions in 1988.
- Bush was the first NFL rookie since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger with at least 85 tackles, 4 fumble recoveries, 2 interceptions and 1 TD fumble return in a season.
- Bush was tied with five other players, including teammate **LB T.J. Watt**, for the second-most fumble recoveries in the NFL (4).
- In Week 6 at Los Angeles Chargers, Bush became the first NFL rookie with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game since S Eddie Jackson of the Chicago Bears vs. Carolina on Oct. 22, 2017.
- Bush was the 11th NFL rookie with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.
- Bush was the first Steelers rookie, and just the second since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger, with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game (Delton Hall accomplished the feat vs. San Francisco on Sept. 13, 1987).
- Bush was the fifth overall Steelers player to accomplish the feat since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- In Week 3 at San Francisco, Bush became the first Steelers rookie with 2 fumble recoveries in the same game since at least 1950.
- Bush led the Steelers in solo tackles (72), assisted tackles (37), total tackles (109) and fumble recoveries (tied, 4). He also ranked tied for third on the team in interceptions (2) and fourth in tackles for loss (9).
- Bush led NFL rookies in solo tackles, total tackles and fumble recoveries, and also ranked second in assisted tackles, tied for third in interceptions and fourth in tackles for loss.
- Bush registered 7 or more tackles in 10 games in 2019.

## CONNER STRONG

- **RB James Conner** has recorded 20 career TDs, which ranks tied for the ninth-most since 2018. Each of the 8 players with more TDs than Conner have played in more games than the Steelers running back and 7 of the 8 have played in at least 5 more games.
- Conner rushed for a 2019 season-high 145 yards on 23 carries, including a 9-yard TD run in the 27-14 victory over Miami Dolphins (Oct. 28).
- Conner's 145 yards rushing was the second-highest single-game total of his career (he had 146 yards rushing exactly 1 year earlier — Oct. 28, 2018 vs. Cleveland).
- Against Miami, Conner registered his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and sixth of his career.
- Conner registered his fifth career game with at least 100 yards rushing and 1 touchdown.
- Conner set career-highs in both receptions (8) and receiving yards (83) in the rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30. His previous career-highs in receptions (7 at Baltimore on Nov. 4, 2018) and receiving yards (75 vs. Atlanta on Oct. 7, 2018) both came last season.
- Conner became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 TDs in the team's first 8 games of a season (2018), and scored at least 1 TD in 5 straight games (Games 5-9).
- Conner recorded 3 straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and 2 TDs in 3 consecutive games in 2018 (Games 5-7), becoming the first player in Steelers history — and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) — to tally 3 straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and 2 TDs.
- Conner rushed for 9 TDs in the first 8 games of 2018, tied for the most by a Steeler through the first 8 games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage were the second-most through 8 games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 1,086; 2014).

- Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), TDs (2 rushing) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland. He added 5 receptions for 57 yards.
- Conner's 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards were the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.
- Conner totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing TD and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a 1-yard run, in Week 2 against Kansas City.
- In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with 2 rushing TDs. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and 2 rushing TDs in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

## CONNER'S HONORS

- **RB James Conner** earned 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week 8) and 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.
- In Week 8 of 2018, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing TDs (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week 8's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.
- Conner led the AFC in rushing TDs (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and 2 TDs in each of his 3 October games — becoming the first player in Steelers history with a 3-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and 2 rushing TDs and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.
- This marked the second time that Conner has taken home AFC honors in 2018 (Offensive Player of the Week: Week 8).

## HOLY TOLEDO, WR DIONTAJE JOHNSON

- As a rookie, **WR Diontae Johnson** was named second-team All-Pro as a punt returner in 2019.
- Johnson returned 22 punts for 272 yards, good for 12.4 yards/return. He also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals.
- Johnson was the first Steelers' rookie with a punt return for a TD since Santonio Holmes had a 65-yard punt return TD vs. Carolina on Dec. 17, 2006.
- Johnson was the first Steelers player with a punt return for a TD and TD reception in the same game since Antonio Brown vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 6, 2015.
- Johnson was the fourth player in franchise history with a punt return for a TD and TD reception in the same game (Antonio Brown-3; Louis Lipps-2; Roy Jefferson).
- Johnson was the first Steelers' rookie with a punt return for a TD and TD reception in the same game since Louis Lipps at New Orleans on Nov. 19, 1984.
- Johnson was the second rookie in franchise history with a punt return for a TD and TD reception in the same game.
- Johnson, who led the NFL in punt-return average (12.4), is the first Steelers player to lead the League since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

## BOZ FROM 50-PLUS

- K Chris Boswell** converted 4 field goals from 50 yards or further in 2017 – the most by a Steelers kicker in a single-season.
- Boswell has made 8-of-11 field goal attempts in his NFL career from 50 yards or further, including a 51-yard try in Week 9 of 2019 at Heinz Field against Indianapolis.
- His 8 field goals made from 50-plus yards are tied for the most in Steelers history (Gary Anderson and Jeff Reed: 8).

## WIZARD OF BOZ

- K Chris Boswell** made 29 of his 31 field goal attempts in 2019, including 29 of 30 from inside 54 yards and 10 of 12 from 40+ yards.
- Boswell ranked tied for third in the NFL in field goals made, tied for fourth in field goals attempted and fourth in points (115).
- Among NFL kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts in 2019, Boswell ranked second in field goal percentage (93.5%).
- Boswell was the only kicker in 2019 that did not miss an extra-point attempt (28 of 28) and connect on at least 90% of his field goal attempts.
- Boswell was the first kicker to accomplish the feat since 2017 and fifth to do so since 2015, when the extra-point attempt was moved to the 15-yard line.
- The other kickers who also reached this milestones were Harrison Butker (2017), Justin Tucker (2016 and 2017), Dan Bailey (2015), and Stephen Gostkowski (2015).

- P Dustin Colquitt** enters his 16th season in the NFL and first with the Steelers in 2020.
- Colquitt is the son of former Steelers punter Craig Colquitt (1978-81, 1983-84).
- Colquitt ranks first in Chiefs annals with 1,124 career punts (regular season) for 50,393 yards. He ranks eighth in NFL history for most gross punting yards with 50,393. Colquitt is only one of nine players in NFL annals to record more than 50,000 gross punting yards.
- Colquitt was voted by teammates to be a captain for the Kansas City in 2013, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 postseason games.
- Colquitt has played in 12 postseason contests, the most in Chiefs history, producing 43 punts for 1,938 yards (45.1 gross, 37.8 net) with 15 inside the 20-yard line and three touchbacks.
- Colquitt's 238 games played with the Chiefs are the most regular season games played by a punter with one team in NFL history and the most games played by any player in franchise history.
- Colquitt owns 463 total punts inside the 20-yard line, ranking third in NFL history.
- Colquitt owns the top spots in Chiefs history with a 39.7-yard career net average and a 44.8-yard gross average.







## Denver 24 Pittsburgh 17

NOVEMBER 11, 2018 /// BRONCOS STADIUM AT MILE HIGH (76,536)



**DENVER** – Despite 462 passing yards from Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger, Pittsburgh fell to the Denver at Broncos Stadium at Mile High, 24-17.

The Broncos were first on the scoreboard with a field goal after blocking a 48-yard attempt by Steelers K Chris Boswell on the previous drive.

A successful 41-yard kick from Boswell tied the game at 3-3 early in the second quarter, but Denver re-gained the lead on the following drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass from QB Case Keenum to TE Matt LaCrosse.

Before halftime, Pittsburgh orchestrated a 12-play 75-yard drive that culminated in a fake field goal attempt in which Boswell threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to OT Alejandro Villanueva to tie the game.

The Steelers took the lead early in the third quarter with a 97-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to WR JuJu Smith-Schuster, but the game was tied for a third time when a turnover gave the Broncos a short field, setting Keenum up for his second touchdown pass of the day.

Denver took back the lead on the first drive of the fourth quarter with a 2-yard touchdown run from RB Philip Lindsay. An interception by Roethlisberger in the end zone with 1:07 remaining ended the game in favor of the Broncos.
