COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

301	Since 2014, the Steelers have recorded 301 sacks, which is the most sacks among all NFL teams.
200	<b>WR JuJu Smith-Schuster</b> had three receptions, including his 200th career catch, in the Steelers' 26-24 win over the Colts on Nov. 3, 2019. At 22 years and 346 days old, Smith-Schuster was the first player to record 200 career receptions before his 23rd birthday in NFL history.
173	Since 2014, the Steelers' offensive line unit has yielded 172 sacks, which is the second-fewest sacks allowed among all NFL teams.
139	Since entering the NFL in 2010, <b>CB Joe Haden</b> has recorded 139 passes defensed, which is the most of any NFL player since 2010. He also ranks second overall among active NFL players.
119	<b>Mike Tomlin</b> and <b>QB Ben Roethlisberger</b> picked up their 117th regular-season victory in Week 2 of 2020 against Denver, breaking a tie with Don Shula and Dan Marino for the third most wins by a head coach-quarterback tandem in NFL history. The duo's 119 regular-season wins are the third-most by a head coach-quarterback pairing in NFL history.
109	<b>LB Devin Bush</b> set a franchise rookie record with 109 tackles, which is the most by a Steeler in a season since Lawrence Timmons had 114 in 2016
96	<b>S Minkah Fitzpatrick</b> registered a 96-yard interception return for TD in the 26-24 victory over the Indianapolis Colts on Nov. 3, 2019. The 96-yard interception return for TD was the second-longest in regular-season franchise history. The longest interception return for TD in regular-season franchise history is a 99-yard interception return for TD by Martin Kottler on Sept. 27, 1933 (the first year of the Steelers existence).
85	<b>WR Dontae Johnson</b> returned a punt 85 yards for a TD at Arizona on Dec. 8, 2019. The punt return for a TD was Pittsburgh's first since Antonio Brown raced 71 yards for a TD vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 6, 2015. The 85-yard punt return for TD is the longest punt return for a TD in franchise history and second-longest punt return in franchise history.
84	<b>WR Chase Claypool</b> hauled in an 84-yard TD from <b>QB Ben Roethlisberger</b> that gave the Steelers a 14-3 lead with 6:34 left in the second quarter. The 84-yard TD reception was tied for the fourth-longest by a rookie in franchise history. The 84-yard TD reception marked the longest scrimmage TD by a Canadian-born player in NFL history.
84	<b>OL Alejandro Villanueva</b> extended his regular-season games played streak to 84, which is the fourth-longest active streak among active NFL offensive tackles.
78	<b>OL Alejandro Villanueva</b> extended his regular-season games started streak to 78, which is the fourth-longest active streak among active NFL offensive tackles.
63	With the victory in Week 5, Mike Tomlin moved past NFL Hall of Fame coaches Bud Grant and Vince Lombardi for 12th in League history with a career record of 63 games over .500.
61	Pittsburgh has registered at least 1 sack in 61 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the NFL. The 61-game streak is also the longest in regular-season franchise history and second longest in NFL history. The NFL record for consecutive games with at least 1 sack is 69 games by Tampa Bay (1999-2003). Head coach <b>Mike Tomlin</b> was on the Buccaneers staff during the final three seasons of the streak.
55.5	<b>DT Cameron Heyward's</b> 55.5 career sacks are the second-most by a Steelers' defensive lineman, fifth-most among active NFL DT and eighth-most by any Steelers defender (since 1982).
45	Pittsburgh leads the NFL with 45 takeaways since the start of the 2019 season. The Steelers forced 38 turnovers in 2019, which led the NFL. The 38 takeaways were the most for the Steelers in a season since 1996 -- when Pittsburgh forced 40.
39.0	Since entering the NFL in 2017, <b>LB T.J. Watt</b> has recorded 39.0 sacks, which ranks fourth overall and second among all NFL linebackers over that span.
36	Pittsburgh has registered at least 7 tackles for loss in each of its first four games. The 36 TFLs are the most by an NFL team over its first four games of a season since at least 2008.
28	<b>CB Joe Haden</b> picked off his first pass of the season vs. Denver on September 20, 2020. His 28 career interceptions are second most of any NFL player since he entered the NFL in 2010.
26	Pittsburgh has scored at least 26 points in each of its first four games in 2020. The Steelers have not opened a season with four straight games of at least 26 points in franchise history
27.0	<b>LB T.J. Watt</b> has now recorded 27.0 sacks in 27 career games at Heinz Field.
23-310	<b>WR JuJu Smith-Schuster</b> became the fourth-youngest player in NFL history to reach 3,000 career receiving yards and 20 career receiving TDs. At 23 years, 310 days, Smith-Schuster passed Odell Beckham Jr. (23 years, 325 days).
22-297	At 22 years and 297 days old, <b>WR JuJu Smith-Schuster</b> , who now has 3,055 career receiving yards, surpassed Randy Moss (22 years, 310 days) as the youngest player to reach 2,500 career receiving yards in NFL history
21	With a victory over Cleveland in Week 6, the Steelers have won at least 4 home games in 21 straight seasons, which is the longest active streak in the NFL.

15	<b>LB T.J. Watt</b> has recorded 15 forced fumbles in his career. The 15 forced fumbles are the most in the League since the start of the 2017 season.
15	<b>LB T.J. Watt's</b> 15 combined interceptions (3), forced fumbles (8) and fumble recoveries (4) lead the NFL since 2019.
15	Pittsburgh ranks among the top 2 in the NFL in 15 different defensive categories: quarterback hit percentage on pass plays (1st, 29.1), quarterback hurries/game (1st, 7.0), yards lost by sack (1st, 145.0), sacks/game (1st, 5.0), quarterback pressures (1st, 64), quarterback pressures/game (1st, 16.0), quarterback hits (1st, 50), tackles for loss (1st, 36), total yards allowed (1st, 1,206), sacks (t-1st, 20), quarterback hurries (2nd, 28), interceptions/game (2nd, 1.50), rush yards allowed/carry (2nd, 3.32), rushing yards allowed/game (2nd, 64.0) and defensive completion percentage (2nd, 59.4).
13	<b>LB T.J. Watt</b> needs at least 13 sacks to join Pro Football Hall of Famers Reggie White (four seasons) and Derrick Thomas (three) as the only players to record at least 13 sacks in three of their first four seasons since 1982, when the individual sack became an official NFL statistic. Watt recorded 13 sacks in 2018 and 14.5 sacks in 2019.
12	With his five catch, 103-yard effort against Miami Dolphins on Oct. 28, <b>WR JuJu Smith-Schuster</b> became the first wide receiver in NFL history to post 12 100-yard receiving games prior to his 23rd birthday.
3.0	Pittsburgh already has 4 different players with at least 3.0 sacks in 2020 ( <b>LB T.J. Watt</b> with 4.5, <b>DE Stephon Tuitt</b> with 3.5, <b>LB Bud Dupree</b> with 3.0 and <b>CB Mike Hilton</b> with 3.0). The Steelers are the only team in the NFL with 3 players, let alone 4, that have already recorded at least 3.0 sacks.
5.0	The Steelers tied a franchise record with their third consecutive game of at least 5.0 sacks in the Week 5 victory over Philadelphia. Pittsburgh also accomplished the feat spanning the 2017-18 seasons and the 1982 campaign. The 3-game streak with at least 5.0 sacks is tied for the eighth-longest since 1982 (when sacks became an officially recognized stat by the NFL).
8	<b>LB Bud Dupree</b> picked up his first sack and forced fumble of the season midway through the first quarter vs. Denver on September 20, 2020. He forced his eighth turnover caused by pressure since the start of 2019, most in the NFL in that span. Dupree has now recorded 34.0 career sacks and 7 career forced fumbles.
8	<b>S Minkah Fitzpatrick</b> 8 total takeaways (interceptions and fumble recoveries) is tied for the most in the NFL since 2019.
8	<b>RB James Conner</b> registered his eighth career 100-yard rushing game vs. Denver on September 27, 2020, which is tied for the seventh-most in franchise history (Rashard Mendenhall, 2009-11).
9	<b>LB Vince Williams' 9</b> tackles for loss are tied for the sixth most by any player over the first 4 games of a season since 1999.
5	<b>LB Bud Dupree's 5</b> forced fumbles are tied for the fourth most in the NFL since 2019.
5-0	Pittsburgh has opened one season in franchise history with five consecutive victories (1978). The Steelers went 14-2 and won the Super Bowl. Eighty-four teams have started the season with a 5-0 record since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970 and 76 of those teams reached the playoffs.
4TH	<b>WR Chase Claypool</b> is the fourth rookie with at least 2 receiving TDs and one rushing TD in a single game since 1970, joining Lynn Cain (Oct. 14, 1979), Joey Galloway (Nov. 12, 1995) and Kareem Hunt (Sept. 7, 2017).

- **QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **C Maurkice Pouncey** were selected to serve as offensive captains, **DT Cameron Heyward** and **LB T.J. Watt** were picked to serve as defensive captains and **S Jordan Dangerfield** was chosen to serve as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 12th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-20). This marks Heyward's sixth consecutive year as a captain (2015-20), and the fourth time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-20).
- Watt and Dangerfield were named captains for the first time in their respective careers.

- The Steelers will play host to the Baltimore Ravens at 8:20 p.m. ET on Thanksgiving, Thursday, Nov. 26, on NBC. Pittsburgh has played eight times on Thanksgiving, but each previous contest occurred outside of Pittsburgh. The Steelers defeated the Indianapolis Colts, 28-7, on November 24, 2016, in their last appearance on the holiday.
- Pittsburgh will also make two appearances on Monday Night Football, which extends the Steelers streak to 16 consecutive years with at least one MNF game. Pittsburgh opened its regular season on Monday Night Football at the New York Giants in Week 1 on Sept. 14 (W, 26-16). The Steelers will also travel to the Cincinnati Bengals for an MNF contest in Week 15 on Dec. 21 (ESPN 8:15 p.m.).
- Pittsburgh's other nationally televised primetime game is scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Buffalo Bills in Week 14 on Dec. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.).
- The Steelers' bye week will be on Nov. 1 (Week 8).

- "Flexible scheduling" will be used in Weeks 11-17. Additionally, in Weeks 5-10, flexible scheduling may be used in no more than two weeks. In Weeks 5-16, the schedule lists the games tentatively set for Sunday Night Football on NBC. Only Sunday afternoon games are eligible to be moved to Sunday night, in which case the tentatively scheduled Sunday night game would be moved to an afternoon start time. A flexible scheduling move would be announced at least 12 days before the game in Weeks 11-16 and at least six days prior to Week 17. Flexible scheduling will not be applied to games airing on Thursday or Monday nights.

**FOUR STEELERS NAMED ALL-PRO IN 2019**

- **DT Cameron Heyward**, **LB T.J. Watt** and **S Minkah Fitzpatrick** were all named first-team Associated Press All-Pro.
- Heyward is an All-Pro for the second time, while Fitzpatrick and Watt are first-time selections.
- Heyward, who was named All-Pro after the 2017 season, registered 9.0 sacks, 22 quarterback hits, 11 tackles for a loss and six passes defended.
- Fitzpatrick had 5 interceptions, 2 forced fumble and 3 fumble recoveries, while making a huge impact on the defense after being acquired via trade from the Miami Dolphins. He led the NFL in takeaways with 8 and tied for the League lead in defensive TDs with 2.
- Watt was named first-team edge rusher after finishing the year with 14.5 sacks. He finished with eight forced fumbles, two interceptions, four fumble recoveries and 36 quarterback hits. Also voted second-team All-Pro at linebacker, Watt had multiple sack games four times this season, including two sacks against both the Rams and Dolphins, and a sack and a half against the Bengals and Colts.
- Rookie Diontae Johnson was also named second-team All-Pro as a punt returner. Johnson returned 22 punts for 272 yards, a 12.36-yard average. He also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals, which was the play of the game in the Steelers 23-17 win. The touchdown included him reversing direction and then turning on the afterburners. It was the longest punt return in team history, and it broke a dry spell, as the last punt return for a touchdown by the Steelers was in 2015.
- **WR Diontae Johnson** was named second-team All-Pro as a punt returner. He returned 22 punts for 272 yards, a 12.36-yard average. Johnson also had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals.

TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with 3 100-win head coaches.

- **Mike Tomlin** and **Ben Roethlisberger** recorded their 108th regular-season win together in Week 5 of 2018 against Atlanta, breaking a tie with Chuck Noll and Terry Bradshaw for the most wins by a head coach-quarterback tandem in franchise history.

- Pittsburgh has scored at least 26 points in each of its first four games in 2020. The Steelers have not opened a season with four straight games of at least 26 points in franchise history.
The Steelers scored at least 26 points just four times in 2019, and Pittsburgh failed to do so in each of its final seven games of the season.

LET THE HORSES RUN

- Pittsburgh has registered a 100-yard rusher in each of the season's first 3 games. RB Benny Snell Jr. ran for 113 yards on 19 carries (5.9 yards/rush) in Week 1 at New York Giants. RB James Conner followed with 106 yards on 16 carries (6.6 yards/rush) and 109 yards on 18 carries (6.1 yards/rush) against Denver and Houston, respectively, in Weeks 2 and 3.
The Steelers had not registered 100-yard rushers in the season's first 3 games since 2007.
Pittsburgh has never had a 100-yard rusher in each of the season's first 4 games in franchise history.

BEN'S YEAR 15 IN 2018

- Ben Roethlisberger set single-season franchise records for TD passes (34), pass completions (452) and passing yards (5,129) in 2018, while leading all NFL players in pass completions and passing yardage.
In Week 17 at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger eclipsed 5,000 passing yards in 2018 to become the seventh player in League record books to reach the milestone.

- **QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw three TDs in Week 11 of 2017 vs. Tennessee to increase his season total to 16, which broke a tie with Peyton Manning to set the longest streak of 15 TD campaigns to start an NFL career.
- In Week 9 of 2018, Roethlisberger threw a scoring pass to WR Antonio Brown giving him 15 TD passes on the season. It marked the 15th consecutive year to open his NFL career with at least 15 TD passes:

- Conner rushed for 109 yards on 18 carries, including a 25-yard run and 12-yard TD run in the Week 3 victory over Houston. He registered his eighth career 100-yard rushing game, which is tied for the seventh-most in franchise history (Rashard Mendenhall, 2009-11).

- Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), TDs (2 rushing) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland. He added 5 receptions for 57 yards.
- Conner's 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards were the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.
- In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with 2 rushing TDs. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and 2 rushing TDs in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

**STEELERS HANDLE HOUSTON IN THE SECOND HALF**

- After allowing 209 total yards and 21 points in the first half against Houston in Week 3, the Steelers defense shut out the Texans in the second half and limited Houston to just 51 total yards.

STEELERS D-MEN DOMINATES GIANTS

- Pittsburgh bottled up Giants' RB Saquon Barkley in Week 1. The Steelers limited the dynamic back to just 6 yards on 15 carries, tied for the second-fewest yards by any player with 15 or more rushes in a game since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- Barkley's 6 yards rushing were the second-fewest of his career. He had 1 yard rushing in Week 10 of 2019 at the New York Jets.
- The Steelers were just the sixth defense since 1970 NFL-AFL merger to limit an opposing running back to fewer than 10 yards on 15 or more carries.
- Pittsburgh held the Giants to 29 yards rushing on 20 carries, good for a 1.5 yards per rush average. The 29-yard rushing output was New York's lowest total since they ran for 23 yards at the Jets in Week 10 of 2019.

- LB T.J. Watt** has opened the 2020 season exactly where he left off in 2019.
- Watt is tied for the NFL lead with 13 quarterback hits and ranks second in the League in tackles for loss (8) and fifth in the NFL in sacks (4.5).
- Watt has recorded at least 1.5 sacks in 9 career games.
- Watt outperformed his brother J.J. in Pittsburgh's 28-21 victory over Houston in Week 3. He recorded 4 tackles, 4 QB hits, 2 TFL and 1.0 sack.
- Watt registered 4 tackles, 4 quarterback hits, 2 quarterback hits and 2.5 sacks in the Week 2 victory over Denver.

- LB Bud Dupree** has picked up in 2020 where he left off in 2019. He has 11 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 8 quarterback hits, 3.0 sack, 1 pass defended and 1 forced fumble through 4 games.
- Dupree ranks tied for 10th in the League in quarterback hits and tied for 16th in the NFL in sacks.
- Watt has recorded at least 1.5 sacks in 4 career games.

LET MY CAMERON GO

- **DT Cameron Heyward** registered the first interception of his career in Week 1 of 2020 against the Giants (year 10 years, game 135 and start 100). The interception halted a New York drive that opened at its own 9-yard line and marched 87 yards on 19 plays, taking New York down to the Steelers' 4-yard line.
- The Giants 19-play drive was tied for the longest since 1999 that resulted in a turnover. The Saints had a 19-play drive end in a lost fumble in 2018, and the Broncos had a 19-play drive end with a fumble in 2002.
- Heyward was named All-Pro in 2019 for the second time in his career (2017) and finished the year with 9.0 sacks, 22 quarterback hits, 11 tackles for a loss and six passes defended.
- Heyward not only led all NFL defensive tackles in stops with 83, but he also led the League in tackles by a defensive lineman. In fact, his 83 tackles were the most by a Steelers defensive lineman since Donald Evans had 84 in 1993.
- Heyward's 91 tackles rank tied for first in the NFL among defensive tackles since 2019.

## Cleveland 13 Pittsburgh 20

DECEMBER 1, 2019 /// HEINZ FIELD (62,157)



**PITTSBURGH** — After being down early, the Steelers fought back and defeated the Cleveland Browns, 20-13, at Heinz Field to improve their record to 7-5 on the season, while the Browns drop to 5-7. The win keeps the Steelers in the playoff hunt with four regular season games remaining.

Devlin Hodges made his second NFL start, guiding the offense with a 30-yard touchdown pass to James Washington, while Benny Snell added a one-yard touchdown run.

The Browns had one final shot with 1:45 to play. Minkah Fitzpatrick broke up Baker Mayfield's first down pass. Bud Dupree was called for roughing the passer giving the Browns a first down. Joe Haden came up with the play of the game when he intercepted Mayfield to secure the win.

After the Browns' closed the gap with the field goal, Devlin Hodges' pass was intercepted by Terrance Mitchell and returned 28 yards to the Steelers 30-yard line. The defense stepped up, though. On third down Javon Hargrave sacked Baker Mayfield for an eight-yard loss. Austin Seibert punted, and the Browns down the ball at the one-yard line. The Steelers were able to get out of the hole with a run by Benny Snell and a 14-yard completion to Diontae Johnson. A third down completion to Vance McDonald also proved to be huge. But with two minutes to play the Steelers weren't able to convert and had to punt.

The Browns closed to within 20-13 on a 34-yard field goal by kicker Austin Seibert with 7:30 left in the fourth quarter. The Steelers' defense held for three consecutive snaps after Cleveland had achieved a first-and-10 from the Steelers' 14-yard line. The drive covered 61 yards in seven plays in 2:48.

The first turnover generated by the Steelers' defense helped establish a 10-point lead early in the fourth quarter.

Outside linebacker Bud Dupree's sack of quarterback Baker Mayfield and forced fumble and defensive tackle Cam Heyward's recovery set the Steelers up at the Browns' 46-yard line with 4:49 left in the third. The Steelers drove as far as the Cleveland 3, but the drive stalled and kicker Chris Boswell finished it with a 29-yard field goal that gave the Steelers a 20-10 advantage.

Running back Benny Snell Jr.'s 1-yard touchdown run gave the Steelers their first lead with 10:36 left in the third.

Snell's rumble capped a seven-play, 69-yard drive in 4:24 that opened the second half. Quarterback Devlin Hodges beat a blitz when he found wide receiver James Washington in single coverage by cornerback Denzel Ward for 44 yards to the Cleveland 15. A third-and-7 fade from the Browns' 12 into the end zone for wide receiver Deon Cain drew a pass interference flag and set the Steelers up at the Browns' 1.

Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 17-10.

The Steelers scored the final 10 points of the first half and the teams went to their locker rooms with the game tied at 10-10.

Hodges finished off a two-minute drive late in the second with a 30-yard touchdown pass to Washington, who made an acrobatic catch in the end zone despite a pass interference flag on Cleveland nickel cornerback T.J. Carrie. Boswell's extra point tied the game at 10-10.

The Steelers had taken possession following a punt and 13-yard return by wide receiver Diontae Johnson to the Steelers' 31-yard line with 1:48 remaining in the second quarter. Hodges hit Washington for 6 yards, Cain for 5, threw incomplete and found wide receiver Tevin Jones for 28 prior to the scoring strike to Washington. The touchdown drive covered 69 yards in five plays.

Boswell had gotten the Steelers on the board with a 39-yard field goal with 2:56 left in the second.

The big play on their 10-play, 62-yard march in 4:44 was a 31-yard completion to Washington on third-and-9 from the Steelers' 18. The Browns had jumped offside on the play and Hodges used the "free play" to target Washington deep down the left sideline.

Running back Jaylen Samuels quarterbacked consecutive "Wildcat" snaps on the drive and ran twice for a combined 12 yards. The "Wildcat" plays followed a 17-yard gain by Johnson on a reverse.

The Browns had taken a 10-0 lead on a 15-yard catch-and-run touchdown pass from Mayfield to running back Kareem Hunt on third-and-5 from the Steelers' 15. Hunt broke attempted tackles by cornerback Joe Haden and safety Cam Sutton on the way to the end zone and Seibert converted for the 10-0 advantage with 7:40 left in the second.

Seibert had opened the scoring with a 31-yard field goal that concluded the Browns' 13-play, 62-yard, game-opening drive in 7:29.

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - There was one overriding reason QB Ben Roethlisberger worked so hard to return from a major elbow injury.

His team. Roethlisberger, who missed the final 14 games last season after elbow surgery, threw for three scores and the Steelers beat the New York Giants 26-16 at an empty and eerie MetLife Stadium. He also got all the help he could ask for from his defense and backup RB Bennie Snell.

A key part of it, along with several defensive plays and Snell's 113 yards on 19 carries -- his first 100-yard performance in his second NFL season.

The defense, while not quite on the level of the famed Steel Curtain, was stingy and physical. It held Saquon Barkley to 6 yards on 15 carries, swarming in the backfield nearly all night.

Three Steelers stars got them their first touchdown. All-Pro LB T.J. Watt made a clever interception at the New York 36. Roethlisberger beat a blitz with a perfect throw to WR Juju Smith-Schuster for a 10-yard second-quarter score. K Chris Boswell's extra point hit the upright, leaving them behind 10-9.

They got the lead with 7 seconds remaining in the half as Roethlisberger connected with WR James Washington, who dived into the end zone for a 13-yard score. Boswell made the PAT this time, and added a 36-yard field goal early in the final quarter. That came following the night's biggest play.

Even though the Pittsburgh defense broke down as the Giants marched 87 yards on 19 plays in the third quarter, it still came up with a huge stop. LB Bud Dupree pressured quarterback Daniel Jones as he rolled left from the 4 and deflected his pass. DT Cam Heyward practically made a fair catch in the end zone for the interception.

Roethlisberger then took Pittsburgh 62 yards for the field goal and a 19-10 lead. He hit Smith-Schuster again for a 10-yard touchdown and a 26-10 lead before New York got a late TD.

Roethlisberger finished 21 of 32 for 229 yards has now thrown for 366 touchdowns, a franchise record, tying Eli Manning for the eighth most in NFL history.

PITTSBURGH -- They started strong but in the end they were hanging on. All the twists and turns made the Steelers' 26-21 victory over Denver this afternoon at Heinz Field less than aesthetically pleasing, but the final result sure beat the alternative.

"We were far from perfect," head coach Mike Tomlin assessed. "We gotta get better. We're thankful to win in spite of it.

The biggest play was made by SS Terrell Edmunds.

Edmunds' sack of Broncos backup quarterback Jeff Driskel on fourth-and-2 from the Steelers' 15-yard line with 1:51 left in the fourth quarter ended what turned out to be Denver's final possession.

The Broncos had driven from their 18 to the Steelers 15 but couldn't finish what could have been a game-stealing march.

RB James Conner's subsequent 59-yard burst allowed the Steelers to run out the clock.

A fumble by RB Benny Snell immediately after the Steelers' punt-return team had registered a safety opened the door for the Broncos to get back in the game.

Denver eventually turned that into a 16-yard touchdown pass from Driskell to running back Melvin Gordon that brought the Broncos to within 26-21.

QB Ben Roethlisberger finished 29-for-41 passing for 311 yards and two touchdowns, but he was also intercepted once (the Broncos turned that turnover into a field goal and a 17-6 third-quarter deficit) and directed an offense that converted just two of 12 third downs.

"I didn't play well and that's on me," he said.

In the early stages it was the Steelers' defense generating the turnovers and the Steelers' offense taking advantage.

The tone was set on Denver's second possession, when Steelers outside LB Bud Dupree sacked quarterback Drew Lock and forced a fumble that was recovered by CB Mike Hilton and returned 8 yards to the Steelers' 41.

Denver lost Lock (shoulder) for the remainder of the afternoon on the play, the first of five sacks registered by the Steelers in the first half.

The Steelers' offense responded with a nine-play, 59-yard drive in 3:19 for a 7-0 lead.

CB Joe Haden's interception of a Driskel pass that deflected off the hands of wide receiver Courtland Sutton and 24-yard return set the Steelers up at the Denver 11 with 1:58 left in the second quarter. But this time Conner lost 1 yard on third-and-1 from the Broncos' 2 and the Steelers settled for K Chris Boswell's 21-yard field goal and a 17-3 lead.

In between, the Steelers sprinkled in some spectacular via an 84-yard connection from Roethlisberger to rookie second-round WR Chase Claypool. Roethlisberger let it fly on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 16 and Claypool hauled the ball in over rookie third-round cornerback Michael Ojemudia, managed to navigate the sideline after coming down with it and sprinted the final 47 yards into the end zone.

Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 14-3 lead with 6:23 left in the half.

A 36-yard punt by P Dustin Colquitt and 9-yard return by Diontae Spencer started a Broncos' possession at the Steelers' 36 at the start of the second. Kicker Brandon McManus' 49-yard field goal drew Denver to within 7-3 five plays later.

And a stop by the Denver defense on fourth-and-2 from the Broncos' 35 (Roethlisberger threw incomplete for TE Eric Ebron) turned into a six-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 20-yard touchdown pass to tight end Noah Fant and a two-point conversion to Fant that sliced the Steelers' lead to 17-14 with 1:07 left in the third.

The Steelers countered with a 28-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to WR Diontae Johnson, and with a safety when Broncos punter Sam Martin fumbled a snap and the ball was eventually knocked out of the back of the end zone.

Roethlisberger broke a tie with Eli Manning and assumed sole possession of eighth place on the NFL's all-time touchdown passes list at 368.

His 311 passing yards moved him ahead of Manning and into seventh place all-time with 57,085.

PITTSBURGH – QB Ben Roethlisberger’s record-setting afternoon turned into a first-half shootout with Houston.

Roethlisberger appeared in his 221st regular-season game, which broke a tie with Hall-of-Fame center Mike Webster and elevated Roethlisberger into sole possession of first place on the Steelers’ all-time list.

The Steelers made it an occasion to celebrate with a 28-21 victory over the Texans.

The Steelers improved to 3-0.

What had been a back-and-forth exhibit of offense in the first two quarters turned into a slug-fest in the second half.

Trailing 21-20 in the fourth quarter, Roethlisberger directed a 12-play, 79-yard drive in 7:03 that ended on a 12-yard burst for a touchdown by RB James Conner and a pass for a two-point conversion from Roethlisberger to WR JuJu Smith-Schuster and a 28-21 Steelers’ lead with 6:24 left in regulation.

The Texans failed to manage a first down on their next possession and punted, and the Steelers exhausted the final 4:47 left on the clock.

Houston had put up 21 points and gained 209 total net yards in the first half.

The Steelers’ defense pitched a second-half shutout while limiting the Texans to 51 total net yards and two first downs, and coming up with the game’s only turnover, an interception by nickel CB Mike Hilton that set the table for what became the game-winning drive.

“They had a really good plan,” Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin said of the Texans. “It took us a while to get adjusted to it. It took us a while to find our rhythm.”

The Steelers had closed to within 21-20 on a 26-yard field goal from K Chris Boswell with 9:54 left in the third quarter. Their 12-play, 62-yard drive in 5:06 required a pair of fourth-down conversions, one a 2-yard effort by Conner to the Houston 48-yard line and one on a 29-yard pass interference penalty on a deep ball to WR Chase Claypool that set the Steelers up at the Texans’ 10.

The drive that closed out the game included a 7-yard pass from Roethlisberger to WR James Washington on fourth-and-1 from the Houston 35 with 3:11 left in the fourth

The Steelers responded to an early 14-3 deficit with consecutive touchdown drives for a 17-14 advantage.

Roethlisberger found TE Eric Ebron with a back shoulder-fade on third-and-goal from the Houston 10 with 5:05 left in the second quarter. Boswell’s extra point brought the Steelers to within 14-10.

The Steelers got the ball back 2:38 before the break and turned the possession into a seven-play, 63-yard march to a touchdown in 1:24. Smith-Schuster ran through the Houston secondary uncovered and walked into the end zone on a drive-capping, 26-yard catch-and-run touchdown. Boswell’s PAT made in 17-14 Steelers with 1:14 remaining in the second.

It took the Texans just 50 seconds to re-take the lead.

A five-play, 75-yard drive ended with a 14-yard fade from quarterback Deshaun Watson to wide receiver Will Fuller over CB Steven Nelson in the back of the end zone. Ka’imi Fairbairn’s extra point gave Houston a 21-17 lead with 24 seconds left before halftime.

PITTSBURGH – Rookie WR Chase Claypool, a native of Abbotsford, British Columbia, rushed for one touchdown and caught passes for three more scores and the Steelers broke open what had been a tight game at halftime and then hung on and outlasted the Eagles, 38-29, on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field. Claypool tied a Steelers record for most touchdowns scored in a game with the four, and most points scored in a game with 24 (tying records set by Roy Jefferson, 1968, and Ray Mathews, 1954)

The Steelers improved to 4-0 for the first time since 1979 and for the fourth time in franchise history (1978, 1973).

The Eagles fell to 1-3-1.

Philadelphia trailed 31-29 and had a chance to grab a late lead but a 57-yard field goal attempt by kicker Jake Elliott missed wide right with 3:18 left in regulation.

The Steelers countered with a 35-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger to Claypool with 2:59 left in the fourth quarter. Claypool's fourth touchdown of the day and K Chris Boswell's extra point turned the two-point lead into a nine-point advantage at 38-29.

Claypool finished with seven catches for 110 yards and three touchdowns, and three carries for 6 yards and a score. Claypool became the fourth rookie since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger with two receiving touchdowns and one rushing touchdown in the same game.

An announced crowd of 4,708 attended the first game fans were permitted to attend amid the pandemic. The Steelers lost G David DeCastro (abdomen) for the game after their initial touchdown drive.

DeCastro was replaced by rookie G Kevin Dotson.

WR Diontae Johnson went down and stayed down (back) after a 5-yard punt return at the end of Philadelphia's second possession and did not return.

C Maurkice Pouncey (foot) left for the locker room at the two-minute warning. Pouncey was replaced at center on the Steeler's game-ending possession by C J.C. Hassenauer.
