

A NEW ERA

The Houston Texans hired Head Coach DeMeco Ryans as the sixth head coach in franchise history, and he will make his regular season NFL head coaching debut on Sunday, Sept. 10 at noon CT when the Texans travel to Baltimore to play the Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium on CBS. With a win, Ryans can join Bill O'Brien as the only two head coaches in franchise history to win their first game on the road.

This matchup marks the earliest the two teams have met in franchise history and the just the eighth time the Texans have started the season on the road. The Ravens hold a 9-2 all-time record against the Texans but with a win on Sunday, it will mark the first time the Texans have defeated the Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium. The last win against Baltimore came in Week 16 of the 2014 season, when the Texans defeated the Ravens, 20-13.

Ryans is in his first year as an NFL head coach after most recently serving as defensive coordinator of the San Francisco 49ers. Prior to coaching, Ryans was a standout linebacker in the NFL from 2006-15 after originally being drafted in the second round (33rd overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft. During his 10-year playing career, Ryans was named AP Defensive Rookie of the Year and PFWA Rookie of the Year in 2006, first-team All-Pro in 2007 and was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2007 and 2009. He appeared in 140 career games (139 starts) and registered 970 tackles, seven interceptions, 46 passes defensed, 13.5 sacks, seven forced fumbles and 10 fumble recoveries.



C.J. Stroud was named the Texans starting quarterback on August 27 following the team's final preseason matchup against New Orleans. He is slated to be the second rookie quarterback in franchise history to start in Week 1. Stroud finished his career at Ohio State with a 21-4 record, while completing 575 passes for 8,123 yards, and 85 touchdowns. He is a two-time Heisman Trophy finalist, a two-time Big Ten Conference Offensive Player of the Year and a two-time Big Ten Quarterback of the year.

TEXANS NAME 2023 TEAM CAPTAINS

On Tuesday, Sept. 4, the Texans named four players team captains for the 2023 season. The team captains include QB C.J. Stroud, T Laremy Tunsil, S Jalen Pitre and S Jimmie Ward. Captains were elected by their teammates. Tunsil served as a team captain for the Texans in 2022 and Ward was a team a captain for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons.
