## TITANS-DOLPHINS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

**LANDRY THRIVES UNDER THE LIGHTS:** Titans outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** goes into this week's Monday night matchup at Miami with a team-high three sacks in 2024. He is tied for eighth place in the NFL and fourth place among AFC defenders.

Landry is set to appear in his 15th career primetime game since being selected in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft. In the first 14 night games of his career, he posted nine sacks. Most recently, he set a career high with three sacks at Miami on Monday, Dec. 11, 2023.

With one or more sacks this week, Landry will become the franchise's third player to reach double digits in sacks in primetime games since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982. He would join **Ray Childress** (15.5) and **William Fuller** (15.5) in accomplishing the feat.

Additionally this week, Landry can move up the franchise leaderboard for career sacks. With 44.5 career sacks, he is tied with **Derrick Morgan** for 10th place in the organization's history, and for third place in the franchise's "Titans era," which began in 1999. The only players with more sacks than Landry and Morgan in the Titans era are **Jevon Kearse** (52) and **Jurrell Casey** (51).

**HOPKINS APPROACHING SELECT COMPANY:** In last week's game against the Packers, Titans wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins** led the team with six receptions and 73 yards, including an 11-yard touchdown reception.

Now in his 12th NFL season and his second campaign with the Titans, Hopkins' career receiving numbers include 936 receptions, 12,445 yards and 79 touchdowns. With five more receiving yards and one more receiving touchdown, he will join a select group of 13 other players in NFL history to reach a minimum of 900 receptions, 12,500 receiving yards and 80 receiving touchdowns.

From the 13 current members of the group, nine have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

**YOUNG OFFENSIVE NUCLEUS GAINING EXPERIENCE:** The Titans have a trio of players from the past two drafts who have played every snap on offense in 2024: quarterback **Will Levis**, left guard **Peter Skoronski** and left tackle **JC Latham**. Skoronski was selected in the first round (11th overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft, followed by Levis in the second round (33rd overall). Latham was the club's first-round pick (seventh overall) in 2024.

With 174 offensive snaps each, the trio accounts for the majority of the 676 total offensive snaps played in 2024 by members of the Titans' last two draft classes. The other contributors are tight end **Josh Whyle** (68 offensive snaps; fifth round in 2023), running back **Tyjae Spears** (65 snaps; third round in 2023), tackle **Jaelyn Duncan** (20 snaps; sixth round in 2023) and wide receiver **Jha'Quan Jackson** (one snap; sixth round in 2024).

Only one other team in 2024 has eclipsed the Titans' total offensive snaps by its past two draft classes. With a total of 677 snaps, the Pittsburgh Steelers lead the Titans by one.
