TITANS-COLTS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

TITANS ENTER WEEK 6 RANKED FIRST IN DEFENSE: The Titans approach Sunday's clash with the Colts ranked No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, allowing an average of 243.8 opponent yards per contest. It is the first time the Titans/Oilers defense has ranked first overall entering the NFL's sixth week since 1976, when opponents averaged 208.2 yards (1,041 total in five games) after five weeks.

The defense's first four games resulted in 148 yards by the Chicago Bears, 265 yards by the New York Jets, 378 yards by the Green Bay Packers and most recently 184 yards by the Miami Dolphins.

The Titans' average of 243.8 yards allowed per game is the fourth-best figure in franchise history through the first four games of a season and their best since 1990 (243.5).

<u>PASSING DEFENSE AT THE TOP IN PER-GAME AND PER-PLAY AVERAGES:</u> In addition to leading the NFL in total defense, the Titans are in first place in passing defense. Opponents are passing for an average of 124.0 net yards per contest against the Titans.

The highest net passing total allowed by the Titans defense through its first four outings was Green Bay's 190 net passing yards. If the Titans defense holds the Colts under 200 net passing yards, it will be the team's first time doing so in each of the first five games of a season since 1986.

On a per-play basis, the Titans also lead the league in defending the pass. Opponents have attempted 100 passes against the Titans for 567 gross yards, averaging a league-low 5.7 yards per attempt.

TITANS KEEPING OPPONENTS FROM BIG INDIVIDUAL GAMES: The Titans have yet to allow a player from an opposing team to pass for 300 yards, rush for 100 yards, or post a 100-yard receiving game in 2024. The Los Angeles Chargers are the only other NFL team that can make the same claim entering Week 6.

The only 300-yard passing performance allowed by the Titans in their past 19 games was by then-Colts quarterback **Gardner Minshew II** on Dec. 3, 2023. If the Titans defense keeps the Colts from an individual 300-yard passing effort this week, it will be the 10th consecutive game the defense has accomplished the feat. The last time the Titans had a streak of 10 such games was a 12-game stretch from November 2018 to September 2019.

If the Titans are able to keep the Colts from an individual 300-yard passing game, 100-yard rushing game or a 100-yard receiving game this week, it will mark only the seventh time in franchise history the club has started the season without allowing any such performances in its first five games. The last time was 2000.

TITANS LOOK TO CONTINUE POST-BYE WINNING STREAK: The Titans enter Sunday's game against the Indianapolis Colts following a Week 5 bye. It was their earliest bye since they were idle in Week 4 of 2020.

The Titans have won eight consecutive games after a bye week, dating back to the 2016 campaign. During the eight-game winning streak, they have outscored their opponents 215 to 113, for an average winning margin of 12.8 points per game.

The Titans' run is the second-longest active streak in the NFL. Only the Buffalo Bills' streak of nine consecutive wins following a bye is longer than that of the Titans.

With a victory against the Colts, the Titans will join the Bills and the Philadelphia Eagles as the NFL's only franchises ever to win nine consecutive games after a bye. The Eagles hold the record with 13 such wins from 1999 to 2011.
