TITANS-BENGALS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

TITANS DEFENSE ASCENDING OVER 7-1 STRETCH: Last week's win at Green Bay was Tennessee's seventh win in their last eight games. Since dropping their first two contests of the season, the only blemish on the Titans' record has been an overtime loss at Kansas City on Nov. 6.

During the last nine weeks of the NFL season, which included eight games and a bye for the Titans, Tennessee has the league's top scoring defense (15.4 points allowed per game), the top rushing defense (60.4 opponent rushing yards per game) and the top third-down defense (30.1 percent conversion rate allowed).

The Titans will be matched up against a Cincinnati offense that over the same span (Weeks 3-11) has tied for third in scoring offense (28.5 points per game), averaged 91.1 rushing yards per game (29th in NFL) and ranked second in third-down percentage (50.6).

GAMES WITH 125 SCRIMMAGE YARDS AND ONE TD: Last Thursday at Green Bay, running back **Derrick Henry** helped lead the Titans to victory by rushing for 87 yards and a touchdown, catching two passes for 45 yards, and throwing a touchdown pass on one of his two pass completions.

While his passing exploits fall outside of the norm, the performance at Green Bay was his 24th career game with at least 125 scrimmage yards and a scrimmage touchdown. That is the most among all active NFL players and five more than the next-highest total by an active player—19 by current Tampa Bay Buccaneers receiver **Julio Jones**.

It was Henry's fifth such game of 2022, which leads the NFL. Las Vegas Raiders wide receiver **Davante Adams** and Minnesota Vikings wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** each have four.

Henry goes into Week 12 with the NFL lead in rushing yards (1,010) and scrimmage yards (1,209). His 10 scrimmage touchdowns are tied for fifth place, two behind the league lead (12 by **Jamaal Williams**).

With one more 125-yard, one-touchdown outing by Henry, which would be his 25th since entering the NFL in 2016, he would surpass **Earl Campbell's** total with the organization (24) and be one behind **Chris Johnson** (26) for the most in franchise history.

ROOKIE RECEIVING: Titans rookie wide receiver **Treyton Burks** produced his first career 100-yard receiving game last week with a seven-catch, 111-yard effort that included receptions of 43 yards and 51 yards. Another rookie, tight end **Chig Okonkwo**, reeled in a 31-yard pass.

The big plays at Green Bay by Burks and Okonkwo were the most recent of the Titans rookie class's 10 total catches of at least 20 yards. Burks and Okonkwo each have four such plays, and wide receiver **Kyle Philips** has two. They are tied with the Packers and New Orleans Saints rookie classes for the second-most 20-plus-yard receptions in the league, trailing only the Pittsburgh Steelers, who have 12.

As a rookie class, the Titans have 39 receptions for 521 yards. Their combined 13.4-yard receiving average is the third-best in the NFL, trailing only the Saints (15.3) and Indianapolis Colts (14.4).

FIRST-DRIVE PASSING: The Titans' first offensive series at Green Bay was capped by a 14-yard touchdown pass from **Ryan Tannehill** to running back **Dontrell Hilliard**. Tannehill completed four of five passes on the drive for 68 yards.

The Tannehill-Hilliard touchdown marked the fifth time this season the Titans scored a touchdown on their opening drive. They are tied with the Philadelphia Eagles and Cleveland Browns for the second-most opening-drive touchdowns behind only the six scored by the Minnesota Vikings.

Tannehill has been the NFL's most efficient passer on opening drives. He has completed 21 of 27 passes (77.8 percent) for 240 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions, and his 143.3 passer rating leads the league.
