#### **G PETER SKORONSKI**

(on how much he felt the Titans were interested in him)

I felt like, honestly, they probably had a need at O-line. My interview went really well. They seemed to be really interested in me and what I had to say. Coach Vrabel was very involved in the meeting, too. That was a good sign so I felt like I could be a possible fit there. They definitely seemed interested in me.

#### (on if he will play guard or tackle with the Titans)

I don't really have too much of a preference. I'll play where the Titans need me to play. I think my biggest thing is I can play any position, including tackle, but guard, center and right side too. I'm happy to help the team, so I'll play wherever.

#### (on overcoming criticism about his arm length)

Yeah, you know obviously, that came up a ton. There's so much more that goes into a pass block or a run block than just arms. There's things I can do to fix them, including my hands. There's so much more in terms of footwork and hand placement and hand usage that I can definitely use to overcome that arm length deal.

#### (on if his strength is more of a pass protector or run blocker)

I think I've become pretty proficient at both. I think early on in my career in college I was definitely more of a pass protector, but I really worked hard in recent years to get better at run blocking too. I think I do both well. Obviously at O-lineman, we love to run the ball. Run blocking is kind of fun, but I love to pass block too. I don't know if I really have something I prefer or that I'm more proficient at. I obviously just try to perfect both sides of the game.

#### (on if the Titans were a preferred destination for him with the team's history of running the ball)

Yeah, for sure. Like I said, I'm an O-lineman. I love to run the ball and the Titans are obviously huge on that. I was really, really happy with that. That was definitely a big thing that I thought the Titans would be awesome just for that aspect alone.

#### (on how much his versatility came into play with what the Titans liked about him)

Yeah, I think, you know, I think any O-line coach is going to like that. Obviously, you never know what's gonna happen on O-lines. You want guys who can play multiple positions, which I think I can do. I think, obviously, Coach Hoss and Coach Vrabel really valued that. I think that was an asset for me in this process.

#### (on Titans Coach Mike Vrabel referring to him as violent and if that is a good thing on the offensive line)

I think so. Yeah, it's the trenches, man, You gotta be violent.

#### (on the significance of watching the draft at a pizzeria)

We've come here my whole life. My dad's an investor here. My baptism reception was held here so it's about as old as I am. It felt like the best place to have this major event. It's pretty private too, so definitely a top spot to go.

#### (on who he models his game after and who he thinks he is similar to)

There's tons of guys that I've watched growing up and continue to watch, (Los Angeles Chargers Guard) Rashawn Slater obviously being a number one, having been my teammate. Growing up I loved watching (Indianapolis Colts Guard) Quenton Nelson, (former Cleveland Browns Tackle) Joe Thomas. Having been a Packers fan growing up, (Green Bay Tackle) David Bakhtiari. I don't know if I'm necessarily just like them in that sense. But I think it's someone, guys I look towards and try to take stuff from their game and try to emulate that. But those are definitely some names that I really like to watch.

#### (on the biggest differences in playing guard and tackle)

I'll be completely honest. I don't have a ton of experience at guard, especially at the college level. I know that things happen a lot faster, especially at pass rush for sure. It will be a timing thing for sure. I think that will challenge me. I've got a ton of experience but I'm ready to learn anywhere and adapt to whatever position I'm at. I guess I'll learn that as I go in the process.

#### (on what it has been like at the pizzeria where he is)

Yeah, I'm outside, because it's about a 100 people inside right now and you guys will not be able to hear me. I'm sure you're always through for long, anyways. But outside right now, because (there are) just tons of tons of fun for just everyone. So excited and supported with me, and had to run away like in the corner to get the phone call originally, but just awesome to be surrounded by supported people and a lot of people for sure. That's why I'm outside right now.

#### (on the name of the pizzeria)

Should I reveal that? Well, just for the sake of local media, maybe keep that private? Maybe sometime tomorrow I can say.

#### (on what he had to eat and drink)

I've only had about, I probably had one beer. I don't know I've got to stay locked in for the night. Tons of pizza that I've been eating. I don't know if you guys can tell, I'm pretty sweaty right now, it's hot in here.

#### (on how much growing up in a football family had an impact on his career and love of the game)

For sure, yeah, you know, my grandfather having played with the Packers, you know it's just wanting to follow in his footsteps and playing that up all some day. So it's been a it's been a goal of mine from since I knew what football was so super happy and yeah, just happy to carry on his legacy.

#### (on how much being a Big Ten guy he knows of his new teammate Nicholas Petit-Frere)

Yeah, I obviously watched him a ton on film in terms of scouting other defenses, and I've always thought he's a really good player. Just so athletic and physical just kind of someone that you want to play as well as too, because he had a great career at Ohio State and he started off really well with Tennessee, so excited to play with him for sure.

Obviously just a really really physical team and a team that's always competitive, you know even I know they had a lot of injuries last year, and so a really competitive team. #### **QB WILL LEVIS**

Q. You sat all night last night in Kansas City and you didn't hear your name. With the Titans coming up to get you, does that maybe help ease the sting of that incredibly long wait last night?

Yeah, I mean, last night was tough. But, I mean, I just stay positive. And I knew that what was meant to be was going to happen. And then, when I saw that they traded up for me, I mean that alone was telling that they wanted me. They wanted this to happen. So I'm just really, really excited and thankful for the opportunity.

#### Q. What was the conversation with them like once you got the call?

It was great. I heard from Mr. (Ran) Carthon and Coach (Mike Vrabel) and I knew I was going to cry and the tears came immediately and I didn't really know how the conversation was going to go. It's one of those things where you feel like you're going to handle yourself and be composed, but the water works started flowing and just emotions overwhelmed me.

## Q. You had a really good meeting with them? Can you take us back? Did you feel like it was good and what made it so?

It definitely was. It definitely was. I feel like every single visit that I went on, I made sure that I put my best foot forward, and I did the best that I could to show them just who I was as a person and as a player. Actually, literally every single person that I met with on their staff, top to bottom, I connected with on a really high level. I told myself I wouldn't fall in love with anybody throughout this process, because I knew I didn't really have a say in the matter, but, I mean, if there was one team I did, it was definitely Tennessee.

# Q. You were one of the guys projected to go in the first round. You obviously didn't. How much does that put a chip on your shoulder? And how are you able to use that for motivation?

I think, regardless of where I got picked, I feel like it's not going to change my work ethic, regardless if I went first overall or 33rd. You can't let the circumstances dictate your preparation and the level of intensity you bring to your everyday practice. Definitely, a little bit of a chip, but I just know that I was going to work hard regardless of where I got picked.

Q. I think you said the day before the draft that your attitude would be the same whether you went first overall or in the second round, and you end up going in the second round. How much does that shape your mindset moving forward and following through with that?

I mean, like I said, not much. I can't let the circumstances dictate my work ethic. Your work ethic is your work ethic and an extra little motivation doesn't help, but I ended up where I was meant to be and I'm just looking forward to competing and getting started.

# Q. How is your health? How is the toe in particular, and how much of that impacted this past season for you?

It feels great. It feels good. It was tough. It was a pain in the butt or a pain in the foot. The second half of the season, that definitely affected my play style. My athleticism and my feet are something that I feel like is one of my strengths in my game and to not have that was, you know, it sucks. But, I mean, that's the nature of this game. This is a game where most people aren't playing at 100 percent week in and week out. I think I've learned a lot from that. I think I learned just mentally and physically, just how to persevere through difficulties, and it helped me for my future, I believe.

#### Q. Do you need any kind of follow-up procedures on that?

No, from what I've heard, I've talked to some of the best foot doctors in the country and everyone that has looked at it, they said that it looks good and the progress that I made since it happened has been great. I think probably since late January, early February, I've been feeling 100 percent. I'm looking forward to getting back and being able to play at full force.

## Q. What did you feel, Will, that they liked a lot about you, and maybe vice versa, too? What do you like about the organization and coach and so forth?

I think they just like my mentality. I think they think that I'm a guy that's going to go in and compete and just work my ass off and I got what it takes to play quarterback at the next level. I think I have the mental capacity to understand and execute a game plan at a high level. I'm just looking forward to learning from Ryan (Tannehill), from Malik (Willis), from all the coaches. It's just bettering myself throughout this whole process and I just really liked how they believed in me, one, and then two, just their mentality with how they, I guess, try to get the right guys on the team and get the right people in the right positions in the program, in the franchise, to create a culture that Coach (Mike) Vrabel has been working on throughout his entire career. I think I fit into that culture really, really well and that's why they like me.

# Q. Two guys you were in the draft with, Texans QB CJ Stroud and Colts QB Anthony Richardson, will be right here in the division. Are you looking forward to competing against them over the next few years and kind of seeing where it goes?

For sure. Those are my guys. I wish them the best. I was extremely happy to see them go where they did and, as long as they're not playing me, I wish them the best. Definitely, it's gonna be cool to have a lot of young quarterbacks in that division and kind of see how it pans out in the near future.

# Q. You mentioned Ryan Tannehill and Malik Willis. How familiar are you with those guys? You've only been with the team for 30 minutes, but what's the thought process as you enter a competition to try to get on the field as fast as you can?

I just want to learn from them. They've been in the NFL a lot longer than I have even though Malik's only been a year. They already have a lot more experience and are going to be able to teach me a lot of things. I just want

to be a great teammate to them and a great teammate to everybody else on the team while competing at the same time, and just feeling that out and just making sure I can do whatever I can to help the team win.

#### Q. How would you describe differences between 2021 and 2022 for you and what variables went into that?

A lot. I think we touched on the injury that I sustained and that was only one of a couple that I had dealt with. But, like I said, I feel like that just overall made me a better player in the long run. New personnel, new coaches, there's just not a lot of carryover. That's always tough. We should have been a better team than we were, but I feel like throughout all the adversity that we faced, I was able to just improve and learn from it.

#### Q. How do you feel about your accuracy and your decision making at this stage coming in?

Confident in it. Confident in it. I definitely have room to improve, but accuracy and decision making, I feel like, are a couple of my strengths and especially at this next level I know that they have to be taken to the next level if I want to be successful. Again, just looking forward to learning from the staff and the other players to just develop me to be the best quarterback that I can be.

# Q. Where did you end up watching the draft? What went into that after all that happened last night. What was tonight like?

It was crazy. We had a big family gathering planned tomorrow morning. Obviously, I was thinking there was a good shot that I would go yesterday, so really the only reason I didn't stay is because I couldn't get back home in time if I were to have left tomorrow. So I ended up coming back today. The flight was supposed to be at 9. It did not take off until about 12. Traffic on the way home from Newark, I live in Connecticut, I literally walked through the door as my name got called. All my bags, all of our luggage. There will probably be some videos at some point that my parents took of me when I got the call when I was a crying mess. It was so funny. We are all in our airport clothes and a very different atmosphere compared to, you know, everyone getting dressed up with the nice suits and dresses last night. This is what was meant to be and I was ecstatic to get the call.

#### Q. So it was just you and your mom and dad?

No. We have some extended family here as well, so we are going to have a nice family gathering tomorrow morning. Some of them got here this afternoon. They were waiting at the house for me. It was so funny. I was starving. I got home, put the bags down, went to get some food, and as I was stuffing my face, I got the call and it just all happened bang, bang! It was pretty funny.

#### Q. What was the eruption like in the house when that happened?

It was insane. Tears were flowing. The emotions were high and just a lot of excitement.

## Q. Do you think there are any similarities in the system that you ran there in Kentucky and what you might be seeing with the with the Titans?

Yeah. I think, I mean, that's another thing that I think that they saw in me that they believe is going to help me at this next level. When we were going through their formations, their concepts, their protection rules, it's a lot of carry over, a lot of similarities as to what I've been exposed to these last couple of years. I feel like my experience there is going to help me going forward.

#### Q. How much did playing in pro-style offenses prepare you to be able to take the next step quickly?

I think it helped me a lot. I think it helped me a lot. I have the reps of I guess what's going to be expected of me at the next level already. I think that it's going to be, take that next step. There might be a little bit more intricacies involved with the NFL offense. I do believe that's one of the strengths I have going into this process.

### Q. Have you spent much time in Nashville? You know many people here or know anything about the team?

Yeah, I have only been a couple of times, I mean being that Lexington is only a few hours away I was actually surpised I didn't make it any more weekend trip that I did. I never really had....we were there for the bowl game and I mean my family was there for New Year's eve this past year, it was funny actually. We were all in our airport clothes, as I had mentioned, today. My sister, as we came through the door as I got the call, realized she was wearing her Jason Aldean's bar shirt, as I got that call from that Nashville zone number, so it felt like it was meant to be, you know.

## Q: What's the plan now? Did they tell you to come here, I guess, for the rookie camp coming up, or you got a trip here before that?

Yeah, I won't be there until rookie mini camp. So, just looking forward to getting started then.

## Q. Well, now that this whole process is played out for you, how do you sum up all this? What has the last few months been like for you and right down to last night, and now have this happen?

It's a test. I mean it tests your physical, obviously, capacity, you know, leading up to the Combine and your pro day, and you know, tip-top shape for those things, but mentally more so, you know, with all the meetings, the top 30 visits, the Combine visits obviously, and a lot of uncertainty as we saw yesterday. I mean, I didn't know how yesterday was going to go. Obviously, I thought that was going to go a little different. But hey, I am going to attack this this opportunity with the most intensity that I have, and just take advantage of what's such a great opportunity.

# Q. What was it like? I mean, you got so much air time on television. Your parents were there, your sisters, girlfriend. What were they telling you through that whole process and maybe what have you told them after this has been finalized now?

Just stay positive, it's all going to work out. Stay positive. I was very proud of my family, and how we composed ourselves last night, and you know the cameras beaming down on us the whole time. I feel like we did a great job of, you know, just taking it in stride and trust in that, regardless of what happens that it was going to happen for a reason, and it was all going work out.

## Q: For you, do you have any connections with any of the Titans. You have any connections just from college with any of these guys, you know any of these guys just from the game?

Oh, yeah, I mean, you guys just signed Justin Rigg, my tight end from last year at Kentucky, and it's funny that his first day in the building was my top 30 visit, so he was in there working out, and he was excited to get started with the team, and I was texting him leading up to this whole kind of process coming to an end. And I was like there's good chance that we will be teammates again, and I know he's excited. I'm looking forward to reaching out to him and talking to him. Top of my head, there might be a couple more guys, but I'm not thinking of anyone right now.

Q. So you know, you didn't know what to expect out of the first round, but you know I am sure there were thoughts that possibly another AFC South team could take you like the Colts. Now that you're with the Titans, you're in this AFC South Division that could have all brand new starting quarterbacks at one point. Does that kind of continue that, I don't want to say, chip on your shoulder, but just now the will to want to be a winner even more with the Titans going against some of these teams that may have passed you over?

Yeah, I mean, I want to win against everybody, regardless of who the opponent is, but I mean it's cool. It's a really cool dynamic if you think about it with all of the quarterbacks. I'm just going wait to earn the opportunity and just put my head down and work. I mean, I know I'm going in there as last on the depth chart, and I got to earn every rep that I can get. #### **RB TYJAE SPEARS**

Q. What have the last 24 hours been like for you?

It's been amazing to hear my name get picked and also spend time joining and celebrating with my family. It's been amazing.

Q. Where are you right now? Are you driving through New Orleans?

Yes, sir. I'm actually going to pick up some Titans jerseys. We got one more party today. I'm going to pick up some Titans jerseys. I have to rep my team.

Q. What was the celebration like last night and how much sleep did you get last night?

It was great. It was great just seeing everybody around from start to finish and their smiling faces. Everybody had pure energy. They came in to support no matter what the turnout was going to be. I got a good four to five hours. I was excited. I couldn't sleep that much.

Q. One of your strengths is yards after contact. I wonder if that is something you take particular pride in, and kind of getting some extra yardage after hits?

Yeah, you have got to be able to make that one guy miss and also you have to be able to break tackles. I feel like that is why I separate myself. I'm still willing to elevate even more.

Q. Who are some of your favorite running backs or anybody that you maybe particularly modeled your game after?

Starting off, I modeled it after Reggie Bush. Reggie Bush is my favorite for a while. I like Alvin Kamara and guys like Aaron Jones too. It's going to be great to learn from Derrick Henry too.

Q. Knowing your knee injury history, do you ever look at guys like maybe Frank Gore, Willis McGahee and how they were able to overcome that and have long careers?

I've actually reached out to Frank Gore. I'm going to ask him for some pointers and tips on how to stay healthy. I do a good job of it because I take pride in everything that I do, that I do greatness-wise. Off the field stuff is going to keep me on the field.

Q. And knowing that history, you're able to carry the ball 230 times last year. What was the key in being able to make it through that and be so productive?

I knew my significance on the team. I knew my role on the team, so I had to do it. It starts with mindset first, just understanding my significance on the team, just day in. I work hard. I work hard to put myself in positions like that.

#### Q. Do you find yourself having to do any extra maintenance or anything to be able to work through that?

You have to understand that whenever you get surgery on something you're going to have to work that area out anyway. #### Q. Are you going to talk to him about getting number 22?

I was playing with somebody over there. I was like maybe he will let me get it, but they was like naw, that ain't going to happen. Hopefully he will want to go back to number 2 like he had at Alabama.

#### Q. What do you think about him as a back and kind of being a 1-2 punch with him?

They don't call him King Henry for no reason. They don't call him King Henry for no reason. You have to be a special type of player to keep on running for 2,000 yards. I think he did that on every level that he played in. You have to be a special type of player because it takes a lot to get to 1,000. And another 1,000 on top of that? You got it.

#### Q. What kind of pass catcher are you? Can you talk us through your game as a target?

I see any way in which I can put myself in a position to make plays when it is coming out of the backfield like I'm doing. I'm very versatile and I got some great hands, too.

I interacted with them at the Senior Bowl. You know Charles London. Charles, he came on as the OC with the American team, my team at the Senior Bowl, so had a great impression of him. #### TE JOSH WHYLE

#### Q. Would you describe yourself as a better pass catcher or blocker at tight end?

I think naturally pass catcher just because I grew up a wide receiver. I transitioned to wide receiver halfway through high school. Especially this last year of college, I think I really improved inside the box blocking, technique and foot work. So, if that answers your question, definitely pass blocking, but I have improved a lot.

#### Q. What is your official size and how much does that help you as a tight end?

I am about 6'6 ½, and right now I am hanging between 245 and 250. It helps a lot man. I came into UC at like 230 and really they wanted me light because they expected to spread me out a little bit more, but as we got into my fourth or fifth year, they asked me to put on some weight. In the box it just makes just a huge difference, even five to 10 pounds. Whether it's confidence or whatever.

#### Q. How quickly did someone get you that Titans cap?

We had them ready to go. We had them all lined up right when I got off the phone with Coach Vrabes (Mike Vrabel).

#### O. What was the call with Coach Vrabel like?

It was pretty cool. Me and Vrabes (Mike Vrabel) have talked in the past. Obviously, him and Coach Fick (Luke Fickell) were roommates at Ohio State. He's been down to UC a couple of times. It was just a good conversation. We are both just excited for me to get down there and contribute any way I can to the team.

#### Q. Is your versatility one of the things the Titans focused on when they were talking to you?

Yeah, they liked the idea that I could do a little bit of both. You know, kind of be an in-line blocker and spread me out to catch a ball. Not only that, I think I have good special teams value.

#### Q. What made you choose Cincinnati instead of a Power 5 program?

I knew I wanted to stay relatively close to home. It was most places like O-State, Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee and obviously UC. Once I took my visit to Cincinnati and Coach Fick (Luke Fickell) and Coach (Mike)

Denbrock at the time, I just felt like it was the right fit for me. I really like what Coach Fick had to preach and just kind of bought in.

#### Q. You played some fullback during your career at UC?

Yes sir, Power I.

#### Q. Did you work well in that position?

Yes sir, I felt really comfortable it that. And that was something we kind of did that was kind of new this past year, but anything that the coaches ask, I'm going to try to do.

#### Q. Why did you switch from wide receiver to tight end in high school?

That wasn't really my decision. Our coaches just came up to me and said, 'We think you'd be one of the best tight ends in the country. We think it'd be really good for us.' And they asked me to put on a little bit weight, spent some time in the box and you know, here we are.

#### Q. Where did you think you would go in the draft and what was the wait like?

I heard anything three through five, but truthfully I just kind of let it come as it came. I didn't put too much pressure on myself. All I've heard throughout this process is just to have fun with it. That it only happens once and to enjoy it. When that call came from Coach Vrabes (Mike Vrabel), I don't even know if he could understand what I was saying. My heart was pounding. It was a pretty cool moment. I got probably about 100 family members and friends here, so it was pretty cool to share that with them as well.

#### Q. You think there's kind of some more untapped potential there just in terms of catching the ball?

Yeah, I think I mean, I expect a lot of myself. I hold myself to a high standard, but at Cincinnati, you know, I just try to do what they ask me to do. You know, I'm a strong believer in that the most important stat on the sheet is a W at the end of the day, whatever that takes for the team to get the win, I'm all about that. So I try not to think about that too much, just kind of be in the right places at the right times and the ball will find me when it does.

# Q. The Titans offense uses a lot of 12 or 13 personnel. How much do you think that prepared you to be able to transition to that type of offense here?

Fortunately for me, like I had to know, when it was more the inbox guy. We called it Y or H or F in the NFL, and so I kind of had to know both. And at times it can be, maybe a lot when you're first learning the playbook, but it was really cool too. I felt like I really understood the playbook conceptually. I got to know what everybody was doing, so honestly I think it'll be a pretty smooth transition these next couple of months, but we'll see how it goes.

#### Q. What was the fastest you've ever run the 40?

I might have got a 4.65, but 4.69 is really where I am at. Right around that. What I did at the Combine.

#### O. Did you know you're on Bruce Feldman's Freak list?

Yeah, I didn't know that. Yeah.

#### Q. What do you have to do to get on the freak list? You think you deserve to be on there?

I'm not really sure the requirements to be a part of that, but I think it's just kind of a like, for example, Troy Tucker and Tyler Scott were on it as well. And those two guys, I mean, they're animals. You know, Troy Tucker, he's 5'9, but can squat a house. I'm 6'6 ½ and 250 and I think I can move really well, and so I think that's kind of probably why I'm part of it.

# Q. Is there a tight end in the league that you've been a fan of? And probably my guess is Travis Kelce is maybe one of them?

Yes, sir. That's always been, I guess, my role model in a way. I mean, the guy I try to look to when Sunday comes around, but it's just obviously because he's a Cincy guy, he gets the ball in his hands a lot. And if you're not looking at the best tight end you know, he's one of the best ever do it. I don't know what I'm trying to say, but you always should be looking towards the best. You know, that should always be your goal.

#### Q. How long does your relationship with Coach Vrabel go back and what are your impressions of him?

The first time I met Vrabes (Mike Vrabel) was the pro day last year. When Dez (Desmond Ridder) and all those guys are going through it and he's just a really good dude. I remember he was talking to our team after practice during spring ball and he really emphasized the importance of effort and fundamentals. He said they travel with you wherever you go and you know, that's a lot of the same thing we believe at Cincinnati with Coach Fick (Luke Fickell). It was just really cool to hear the things that we practice and we believe in at Cincinnati. It's the same thing at the NFL, so I think it'll be a smooth transition for me.

#### O. Did you get to know anyone else on the Titans' staff yet?

I've had a couple meetings. I just got off phone with Coach (Tony) Dews, tight end coach and he's pretty cool. I like him, good personality, a really personable guy. I'm excited to get started with him.

#### Q. He coached Derrick Henry and he's not a bad guy to be coached by?

Yeah, absolutely. He probably expects the best out of people, so I'm really excited about that.

#### Q. Where did you watch the Draft?

I'm like two minutes away from my parent's house. This place called Knights of Columbus, just here in Cincinnati. My dad is one of nine, so there's a bunch of family in there right now. It's just the quietest place I could find around.

#### O. How did you end up a football player and did you play some basketball, too, growing up?

I played every sport you could imagine. My parents started me out in gymnastics when I was a young, but I played basketball and football through high school. And football is just something, one, I've always been good at and it's just something I've always found fun, which I think is really important. I mean, if you're going to play this game and make it make a career out of it, you got to have fun with it.

#### Q. How quickly did you grow out of that gymnastics body?

Pretty quick. I think I only did that for a year or two, but a lot of sports growing up for sure. Baseball, basketball, track, volleyball, tennis, golf. Anything you can imagine. So, yeah.

# Q. Did you talk with the Titans before the draft and how much contact did you have with them? Were you expecting to go around this point?

I met with them at the Senior Bowl. I met with them at the Combine. I also had a 30 visit with them. All of the meetings went very, very good. I did not think I was going to leave today, if we are being completely honest. I thought I was going to leave yesterday. God has his own plans and he works in his own ways, so I went today. I'm proud of it. I'm grateful that they picked me up. I'm ready to get to work.

#### Q. What your 30 visit was like here?

It was great. I had a great time talking with everybody; the whole staff, coaches, player personnel, people, everything. It was just a great visit all around. I enjoyed it. I enjoyed the staff. I enjoyed being out there in Tennessee. It was all great.

#### Q. How would you describe yourself as a player?

I think I'm a great player, very athletic. I think I move well. I think, of course, I still need to practice on a couple of things. But, like I said, I'm great. I think I can move well. I've got good feet. I can bend. I excel in the pass play and keep working in the run, but it's always an improvement in every aspect of the game.

#### Q. What excites you about the opportunity in Tennessee?

Just to be able to get in there and just work. Like I said, I had a 30 visit with them and I really enjoyed the O-line coach. He's a great guy. Our visits went very well. The meetings we had together went very good. I'm ready to just get there and get coached by him and do what he tells me to do and be a great addition to the O-line.

# Q. Some reports said that you might be better at the NFL level playing guard. Do you have much experience at guard or are you just primarily a tackle?

I don't have any experience at guard, but, like I said, I'm willing to do anything and everything. There's some things you have to work on at practice, you know, stuff like that. You just got to keep improving on it. It's a bunch of things you haven't done yet, so I just got to work on it. I have no issue playing guard. I wouldn't be against it, but I would just have to continue to work.

# Q. I saw somewhere that you trained with, or trained with the same trainer as Peter Skoronski worked with. Is that true? Do you know Peter a little bit?

Yes, sir. We all trained. Me and Peter (Skoronski) were training together through this process.

#### Q. How cool is it to be here in Tennessee with him?

Pete (Skoronski) is a cool guy. We both played in the Big Ten, so we played against each other. We didn't really talk much. We got to Texas and we started training together. Peter's a great guy. He's a great athlete. He's smart. Like I said, he moves well. I'm happy to be with Peter. I think he's a great addition to the O-line room as well.

#### Q. What are some of the things you mentioned that you might need to work at the next level?

Just technique things, hand timing, punch timing, hand placement, just keeping great balance, stuff like that. You don't want to lean and stuff. Just being more consistent and finishing, just continuing to drive and get it done every play.

#### Q. What have the last three days been like for you?

It's a big waiting game. That's really all it is. You just sit in the house and wait for your phone to ring. It's been a little bit of being anxious. I've been a little bit nervous. At the end of the day, like I said earlier, God has a plan. I've just been waiting. I didn't get called last night. I wasn't upset about it. I just went home, prayed. I woke up today hoping that today would be the day. And it turned out.

## Q. What do you know about the Titans' style of play, what kind of offense they have and what you like about it?

Up front, I know they run off the ball, they're very dominant, they finish to the whistle. They play very hard. I'm just ready to get in there and be a part of that, just go in there and just be a part of that grind, and just watch all the guys get through the workouts every day. You know, just like I said, just be together with the team.

#### Q. Are you close with Chig Okonkwo from your Maryland days?

Yes, sir. Me and Chig (Okonkwo) are pretty close. You know, we all we came in the same time of 2018. Chig is a great guy. I loved him as my tight end when he was here with me. And I still get to be with him again, so I can't wait to step in there and go see him.

#### Q. Have you heard from Chiq Okonkwo by chance already?

I haven't. I haven't been on my phone, really? Not yet, at least. I've been talking to the staff, you know, Ran (Carthon) and Mike (Vrabel).

#### Q. What did they tell you specifically in welcoming you to the team?

Just come in and just be myself. Just work hard, you know? Just keep my head up, and just like I said, and if I need anything, they got me. They are going to take care of me, just make sure I'm doing okay, but just come in and be ready to work.

#### Q. Did you just start playing football at 14?

Yes, sir. I started playing at 14. You know, so life stuff was going on. Wasn't a lot in the right circumstances at a young age. I ended up when I turned 14, I found being in the right place, you know and found football.

#### Q. What would you do to keep yourself busy or hobbies up until you were 14?

You know, just outside, running around with friends, just playing basketball, playing throwback football. Outside in the grass, just having fun.

#### Q. How big were you when you started?

When I was 14, I was probably want to say like 6-4 maybe like 300, maybe. I'm not....

#### Q. And then did it take you long to catch up with everybody else from a technique standpoint?

Oh, yeah it took me pretty long. It probably took me until like my redshirt freshman year, maybe even a year after that, up until college, you know, throughout high school. I was just out there just moving people, just being a bigger body, not really using a lot of techniques. So when I got to college, that was one of the main focuses that I needed on my plays, just improving on technique because the same thing you do in high school definitely did not work on the college level.

#### Q. Did you have any idea the Titans were interested in you?

Yes ma'am. I got a couple of coaches that coached at UT Martin that are now with the Titans. I knew they had interest, but being drafted by them is a dream come true. I did not know that that was going to happen.

#### Q. Were you in Nashville for a local pro day and what was that like?

Yes sir, I did have a local day and it was cool to see the practice facility from the inside. Me and my dad, we always try to get up there in the summer when they are going through training camp. It was really cool to see the inside and I definitely, while I was there, envisioned myself playing there and putting on that two-toned blue.

#### Q. How much of an impression do you feel like you put on in the game against the University of Tennessee?

I feel like I just showed that I am a good player. Even though I came from a small school, I can compete with the top dogs, whoever they put in front of me. I am a competitor, I work hard and just prove myself time after time against good talent.

#### Q. What did the Titans tell you about your opportunity here?

They just said that I could come in there and carve my rôle in their offense with hard work and I am buying into that. I am a hard-working guy. That's basically what they said. It is up to me how far I go.

#### Q. You were here for training camp with you dad?

Yes sir.

#### Q. How old were you?

I had a couple of teammates come to the Titans in college and so I would say probably around 2018, 2017 and I was probably about 19 years old. We have always watched the Titans in my house.

#### Q. What were your other options coming out of high school in terms of college football?

Coming out of high school, I had Chattanooga, Richmond, Mercer, Furman, a lot of smaller FCS schools.

#### Q. When did you first believe that this sort of thing was possible for your career?

I always believed it, honestly. I've always been the type of guy that, you know, works for what he gets. I've had to work as hard as I could just to get anything, you know. I know that hard work reaps results. And, through that belief, I knew that I could make it if I just wanted it and worked for it hard enough.

# Q. For a guy who wasn't at the Combine, who played at a smaller school, what did you do to stand out during this pre-draft process?

I try to build my body and build my arms, build my speed, and then just show up in the flashy areas. I've always been a strong guy, so getting 23 on bench, that kind of gave me a little spotlight and then the vertical and the 40. I just put a lot of emphasis into making myself as athletic and as strong as I could for the draft.

#### Q. Did you visit any other NFL teams or did any show interest in you?

Yes, sir. I had multiple Zoom calls with teams like Arizona and the Patriots, the Broncos, the Chargers. And I actually went on a 30 visit to Chicago. So, yeah, definitely.

# Q. What kind of stuff did you do growing up in Lebanon? Did you play Pop Warner as a kid here in this area?

As a kid, I'm more in the county area, so me and my brother, we will build forts and everything and we'd use all my dad's tools in the woods and chopping down trees. But I played Pop Warner baseball and I played a little basketball growing up.

#### Q. Any odd jobs in Lebanon?

I was actually an usher at a movie theater. And then from that, I would chop wood with my dad and sell firewood with him.

# Q. How much do you know about the Titans? You said you're a fan of the team and some guys on the team and now you are going to be their teammates.

Definitely, you know. Derrick Henry is a big one, right? He's just an awesome guy. He's a bruiser on the field. and what he does with how big he is, it's just amazing. It's fun to watch and guys like (Ryan) Tannehill, he's a fun, fun guy to watch on the field and I love how he's kind of revamped his career through the Titans. I love (Jeffery) Simmons on the D-line. He's a freakin' beast. It's fun watching them play. I follow the team pretty, pretty good.

# Q. How about the receiver coach Rob Moore? Was he kind of like the primary touch point for you as far as communication with the team?

As far as communication with the team it was Clinton McMillan. He was my guy that I was in his ear and as well as Coach (Matt) Jones, both of them guys came from Martin and that was kind of like my point of contact with the team. But I love Coach (Rob) Moore. We had a good conversation on the local day. I can tell that he wants to develop players, and he really cares about this game. I'm looking forward to working with him.

# GENERAL MANAGER RAN CARTHON & HEAD COACH MIKE VRABEL APRIL 27, 2023

#### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA

RAN CARTHON: All right, I guess I'll start it off. We all know why we are here. We just selected Peter Skoronski with the 11th overall pick. Peter checks all the boxes for us and what we're looking for in our offensive line and what we're looking for to bring into our program.

He was a guy that, truth be told, we targeted from the very beginning. Didn't know that if he was going to be there or not so we had other contingency plans, just in case, and we got lucky and he was there. So it made the pick really easy for us to pull off at 11. So, Mike? Nothing?

MIKE VRABEL: Well, I would just say I want to thank Ran, his staff, our coaches for putting a lot of work in not only on Peter but this entire draft. So far an amazing process. Exactly, you know, where we were yesterday in some of the scenarios, our communication. Have absolutely enjoyed it thus far. We're getting a fantastic player, a physical player, a violent player, he's got versatility. And those are things that we covet. And with the durability. I know when he grabs people most of the time they stop moving. So that's really a good thing for an offensive lineman.

## Q. That's the thing, it may not be a sexy pick going for offensive linemen. But 49 sacks allowed last year, how important is it to protect the quarterback?

MIKE VRABEL: We've said since the end of the season, during the season, multiple times, numerous times, we have to do a better job protecting our quarterback. We have set out to do that, not only by improvement, but in the off-season and some of the free agent acquisitions, but also tonight. And you have to be able to do that. And this isn't just a pass protector. This is an all-around very, very good football player, very good offensive lineman.

#### Q. Did you guys talk to Arizona, anybody else, about moving up? Was a quarterback in play?

RAN CARTHON: If you guys remember, when we spoke, I guess it was Monday, and I told you guys about everybody being nosy. That included me. So you have to know all the scenarios above you, below you. So we called everybody. Whether it was teams above us, teams below us, just exploring to see where we were going to be.

It's funny, Mike and I were, we were just talking about it downstairs, how they came off is about how we predicted and where we thought was going to be there for us at 11 to choose from. We did think Peter was going to go a little higher than expected, but we would have loved for him to fall for us and he did.

#### Q. Do you envision him as a tackle or inside?

MIKE VRABEL: Really just going to play him at offensive line to start and see where we go and see where we feel like he can best help the football team and where he can best help himself. We haven't targeted him anywhere. Really when we set off to talk about this offseason we wanted to identify speed, violence and versatility and he checks those boxes and we'll kind of let that materialize as we work through the off-season, into training camp. That's when the offensive line is going to come together, we talked about that, is in training camp.

#### Q. Do you think in the end, between Dillard and Skoronski, one's at left tackle, one is at left guard?

MIKE VRABEL: Well we hope that they both are going to be able to contribute. Obviously that's why we made the acquisition we did in the offseason and that's why we made the pick that we made tonight. We have played against teams that have really good lines of scrimmage. I'm glad that Ran feels the same way that we do, is that that line of scrimmage is critical in this league. And you see what some of those guys have to block across from them. And Peter and hopefully the rest of these guys as they come in here and develop and gel are going to be able to do that for us.

## Q. You mentioned value at different positions. How, like later you could get guys who have similar value. You taking Skoronski at 11, what is it that you feel separates him from the other tackles or guards in the draft?

RAN CARTHON: Well I think the thing about Peter what Mike was saying is his versatility. When he grabs people for the most part they stop, you know, when he gets his hands on guys. So whatever his length is is his length, but he played at a high productive level using that same length to stop people. And again it's another way for us to add not only a good football player but a good person.

He's a consummate pro, even in college, the way he carried himself. That was just -- he just made it a comfortable and easy pick for us to pull off the board.

#### Q. You mentioned the length. Are you referring to the arm length?

RAN CARTHON: Yeah, because that was the pre-draft motion from everybody, can he play tackle. And it wasn't because he wasn't successful playing tackle in college, it was because of the quote, unquote desired arm length. So we know at the end of the day we got a good football player that is going to be productive wherever he plays.

## Q. This was a first for you as a general manager of a team. What was it like when 11 came on the clock and you had to make your pick? What was going through your mind?

RAN CARTHON: Nothing. Communicating with my partner. We talked throughout. We were doing a countdown, hey, we're three out, we're two out, we're one out. Here is this scenario, here's that scenario. It helped having his leadership and his veteran knowledge of how to do it. It made it easy. Like we talked about the other day, us being locked in that room together, going through that board, working through discrepancies that he we may have. Whether it was our scouts, whether it was our coaches or whether it was ourselves, put everything into vision for us. So when that pick came we knew immediately. We didn't have to have much conversation. Just a quick, hey, we're good and we were good and so it made it easy.

Everybody's been asking me how I feel, am I excited and all those things. I've been telling everybody the same thing. I think about, you know, you score your first touchdown and you dance and you celebrate and most coaches will pull you to the side and act and say, Act like you been there before. So I approached today as if I've been there before.

MIKE VRABEL: I told Ran you never forget your first though. So we laughed about that.

And just to echo that, it was easy. There was a comfort to it. Having worked through those scenarios up and down. And so like he said, it was, it kind of happened. And there we were and I was hoping -- it just, it kind of came to us and it was easy. So that was probably the best part of this entire process is having spent those last couple hours yesterday, just him and I, putting everybody's thoughts together and everybody's vision together for these players.

#### Q. How has Peter worked through the short arms and overcome that? What's a guy with shorter arms do?

MIKE VRABEL: Great foot work. He's square. He plays square. He's strong. He's got -- you can watch some of these clips and these are 280-pound guys, 270-pound guys rushing on the edge or blocking down on a three technique. And he gets his hands on you, they, for the most part, they don't go very far.

I think he uses his mind. I mean, he's intelligent. There's a lot of things you can do to make up for not having 35-inch arms, which very few tackles have. So it's angles, it's strength, it's body control, it's playing square and being able to move his feet.

## Q. You talked the other day about the value of getting face-to-face time with these prospects. What did you learn about Peter when you got with him in pre-draft and how did that inform the pick?

RAN CARTHON: So we met with Peter at the combine, felt really good about him. Then our O-line coach, Coach Hoss (Jason Houghtaling) went to the pro day and spent time with him.

Again, the player and the person checked all the boxes for us. So we felt like who he was and what he brings here was easy.

### Q. If he ends up playing inside at guard, how good is he at getting to the second level of run blocking like your guards do?

MIKE VRABEL: Good. When any offensive lineman for us is uncovered there's times where they're going to have to play in space. Whether that's at the second level or that's pulling and those what we would call movement blocks. He's very, very proficient. It's not like he hangs his hat on one thing. This isn't just a player that's just a one-trick player. He's a complete offensive lineman coming out of college. There will be a lot of things that he's going to have to learn and that we're going to have to help him learn and continue to develop him and maybe some of the tricks of the trade. But I don't think that there's any concern with Peter's ability to move and block in space or on the edge.

#### Q. Does he check your box about being a glue player that he can play right away?

RAN CARTHON: Yes, he is that. And hence why he goes at 11.

# Q. You mentioned being nosy and checking things out and so forth. With the proximity you guys had to the top of the draft this year and the quarterbacks that were up there, was there much of a temptation in your mind to kind of take (inaudible)?

RAN CARTHON: I mean, again, it goes to what we were talking about earlier this week, trusting the board, and that's exactly what we did. He was a player that, like I said, we coveted, and we didn't think would be there. So when he was there and where we had him slotted it was an easy pull, because we trusted not only our communication but we trusted our board.

## Q. When you look at the division and particularly two young quarterbacks, are you thinking defensively about stopping those guys? Are you thinking offensively about matching what those guys might be?

MIKE VRABEL: Yeah, I don't think we thought that way. I think we obviously want to improve our football team. We're not setting out to -- obviously we have a goal every year, we want to win the division and host home playoff games and win championships. But I don't think that ever crossed our mind is that, hey, we have to go get somebody to stop whatever rookie quarterback.

We're trying to build a team, a complete team. We have lot of work to do. We're just getting started, but I think it's a great start.

#### Q. Is there a quarterback that you especially like that went off the board?

MIKE VRABEL: There's a lot of players in this draft I like and there's a lot of players that Ran likes and that we both like. I think we're going to continue to try to find players at all levels, quarterbacks, running backs, receivers, defensive linemen.

So we ended up where we were, we stuck and we knew this was a player that when we said, if we're going to stay there and pick Peter Skoronski is going to be one of those players.

## Q. You guys both talked about speed, offensive line speed probably not the first play you think of, does that remain obviously a big deal going into tomorrow now?

MIKE VRABEL: Yeah, but we talked to our players already, the ones that we have on the roster, about the ability to play fast and the ability to be and get timed fast. So we're going to find a way to get them to play faster. And then we're going to target some players that have speed. But at his position, this is a fast player, plays fast, isn't unsure of what he's supposed to do. He goes and hits somebody and blocks the guy and keeps them away from the quarterback.

#### Q. (No microphone.)

MIKE VRABEL: Well, I think Ran caught him at the pizzeria, they probably had some pitchers (laughing.) He congratulated him, obviously. I thanked him for the way that he played. I told him that the reason that he was in this position was for those people around him and that he should be gracious and he should always remember to put the team first and come in here and be ready to get to work.

RAN CARTHON: Good afternoon. How's everybody doing? Good. It is with great pleasure that Mike and I sit here having our first pick together in attendance with his parents, Bob and Ann.

Like we talked about last night, Peter's a guy that we coveted. A guy that we didn't expect to be here for us at 11. We're thrilled to have him.

So I'm going to pass it on to Mike before we bring him up and introduce him to the Titans fans.

MIKE VRABEL: Absolutely. Just want to welcome Peter and his family to our organization. On behalf of the coaching staff and everybody involved it's been great to see him in the building and meet everybody. I know he's excited just as we are and it's just been cool. It's been really comfortable. Like to welcome you guys. Obviously this is a great opportunity, not only for us, but for you and your family and I know that Peter's ready to get to work. And the first job that he has is to take your questions. So we would like to welcome him and have a great picture here.

RAN CARTHON: Peter Skoronski, everybody.

# Q. With your grandfather playing for the Packers, was playing offensive line just kind of in the bloodline, so to speak?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, I think bloodline and the genetics. I don't think I really had a choice when I started playing tackle football. I think I was too heavy to even be allowed to carry the ball so I always had to play O-line. Never really played anything else. So just always felt natural. I was a bigger dude, so, yeah.

Q. You mentioned the versatility that you have. If you're asked to go and play guard, what is -- since the sixth grade you haven't played that position, I don't believe it was. So what is it makes you feel you can do that successfully?

PETER SKORONSKI: More than anything I'm going to try to do what I can do to help the team. So if that's what I'm asked to do I'll definitely do it. Obviously it's an adjustment having only played tackle. The game's a lot faster in there, it's a lot different. But that's just going come with reps and drill and technique. So obviously just happy to do it if it helps the team. That's just my mentality and I'll get the hang of it, for sure.

Q. Working with Duke (Manyweather) is that something that, leading up to the draft, is that something that you worked on just some of the things you maybe had to do?

PETER SKORONSKI: To a little bit of an extent. Obviously nothing like too position-specific. Work both sides of the line, both positions. So just trying to be ready to play anywhere. But, yeah, I think that helped a little bit. But it's hard to really do anything without putting pads on, which I didn't do with Duke. So obviously once I get the pads on I'll have a better feel for that.

# Q. Are you surprised by -- I don't know how much attention you paid to it, but you said you took an awful lot of questions about it -- just how much big draft machine automatically looks at the arms and puts you at guard, despite the fact that you started every game at left tackle and had a very successful career there had the bloodline and all of that?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, yeah, obviously it was a big talking point. I just feel like my opinion is that there's so much more that goes into being a good tackle than just arm length. There's so much more to blocking than that. I think at the end of the day it's just about blocking people and I think I proved I could do that in college. But there's so much in terms of foot work and punching and efficiency with your hands that I think matter. That's something that I have to continue to work on to get better at. But I think that that sort of matters more than just, oh, your arms are this measurement. So, yeah, I just think there's more to it than that and that's why I feel like I can play the tackle position.

# Q. Was that happening back before January or was it kind of just manifesting during the draft that people were talking about your arms?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, so I didn't realize it was a thing until probably last spring when I sort of knew that the NFL process could be in my future. And it was kind of funny, like during spring ball I think last year I made some comment about a rep and I mentioned to my coach about, oh, my arms are shorter, so I have to do this. And he was just like, I don't care. So that was sort of the end of that discussion and it was just sort of -- I didn't really think about it much until that.

Then obviously it's been a big talking point with people. But I always just had to go out there and block people. It's not about length and that's it.

# Q. What have the last 18 hours been like for you? You talked about your phone blowing up. How have you handled it?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, it's been a whirl wind. It feels crazy, 24 hours ago I didn't know what was going to be in my future and now here I am in Nashville. So it's been a whirlwind and I got to take a second to stop and soak it in for a little bit. But just a huge blessing to be here and be a part of the Titans organization. So really happy about how things have gone, yeah.

#### Q. What went into your decision to not attend the draft?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, I just feel like -- obviously I'm not a huge media guy generally, so kind of wanted to avoid that scene there. Obviously nothing against it.

But also wanted the opportunity to have a bunch of family and friends and teammates around me, which I was able to do at home. So really appreciated that and spending that time with them, because a lot of those people helped me get to where I am. So that was what really kind of drove that and having those people around me for that.

# Q. Talking to your friend Dan Pompei talking about some your leadership, going outside of your comfort zone. There's room here even for a new young guy probably to lead on this line. How do you plan on kind of gauging the room for that and what you're able to do as a first-year guy?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, yeah, I know obviously as a young guy it can be tough to be in that position because you don't have the experience under your belt. But I think it just starts with just doing your job and being a consistent guy right off the bat. Someone who does what they're supposed to do on and off the field.

So that's just where I'm, that's what I'm going to start with and go from there. I think guys will, you know, I'll earn guys' respect by doing what I'm supposed to do. That's really the only thing you can do to sort of earn that leadership position.

# Q. In your meeting with Ran and Coach Vrabel were you able to kind of gauge and just get a feel for like what this organization is about?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, that for sure and just obviously being a NFL fan and knowing the Titans organization and how they play and just like a hard-nosed team and really tough mentality. I was Packers fan and pretty upset when they beat the Packers last year. So just kind of familiar with what they do. Sort of really admired that from afar. Obviously now really happy to be a part of it.

#### Q. Now having gathered that information, how do you feel you will fit into the organization?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, I think it's kind of similar to how like our general mentality at Northwestern in terms of work ethic and physicality and violence and just sort of that hard nosed, gritty mentality that we had at Northwestern I think that will be a pretty good transition for me coming here I think it's the same values here too.

# Q. We talk about the physical part of your game. How would you rate yourself as a technician because as a left tackle you got to be probably the most athletic person on the offensive line?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, I think technician is probably the number one title I would sort of strive for personally behind being violent, being a physical player. But offensive line's so difficult you have to have technique. Especially, I guess, someone like me who is not like the built-in-a-lab-type tackle. So technique is something I always really, really pride myself on and that's how you're going to be able to win, especially at this level with this competition.

#### Q. What do you want Titans fans to know about you?

PETER SKORONSKI: I think I'm someone who prides myself on consistency. I want to be someone for this organization that people can count on day-in and day-out on and off the field. That they can count on for a good performance week-in and week-out. So that's what I promise and I hope fans will realize that.

#### Q. Have you had anybody reach out, player-wise, from the Titans?

PETER SKORONSKI: Ryan Tannehill texted me last night just real quick. I haven't checked my phone or my texts, there might be more.

#### Q. What did he say?

PETER SKORONSKI: Just welcoming me to the organization. Excited to get to work. So I'm excited too.

#### Q. Do you have any other connections just with college or Big Ten that you know some guys?

PETER SKORONSKI: I really don't actually. Obviously familiar with a lot of guys on the team, but not personally.

#### Q. Now that the draft process is over, what are the next steps for you?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, just getting through minicamp and rookie development and finding my way through the organization and learning the playbook for sure is big and kind of conquering that mental aspect will be big priority on my mind before we put the pads on.

## Q. The family ties to Green Bay, how quick is the transition then to turning them over to converting to Titans fans here?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, well I'm going to put on it that blue jersey, so it's not too hard once I'm going out there. I don't think it will be an issue.

Obviously the organization, having my grandfather play there will always be a part of our family history and a part of me. But definitely all Titans now.

#### Q. Is there anything your grandfather ever told you that kind of stuck with you?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, his big thing was keep your head up was kind of his mentality. I think, especially at offensive lineman things can get rough and it's a tough positions, it's just keep your head up and keep going. Even from a technique standpoint. As my offensive line coach in college says, 'There's nothing to look at on the ground,' as far as coming off blocks and stuff.

## Q. Did your grandfather take you to any Packers games? Take you down to the locker room or any of those types of things when you were young?

PETER SKORONSKI: Not really. Mostly went to Packers games with my uncles who were season ticket holders.

I do remember one game I went with him where he did an autograph signing and he was announced at Lambeau Field which was real cool to see that and have the whole stadium sort of cheer for him. But I've been to tons of Packers games, but mostly with my family and uncles.

## Q. Was there ever a question about what position you would play? You didn't start playing until you were 12, is that right?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah.

#### Q. How big were you then?

PETER SKORONSKI: I was pretty big. I was a sixth grader playing -- that was my first year, sixth grade, playing on a seventh and eighth grade league. So I was pretty large. Immediately I had like the stripe on the

helmet saying I couldn't carry the ball, I had to play O-line. So there wasn't really much of a question about it. I was an O-lineman right off the bat.

#### Q. What do you think your size was?

PETER SKORONSKI: Oh, I don't know. Looking at my dad right now. I can't remember.

## Q. Talking to Pat Fitzgerald, he told me that you, on the biggest day of your life so far, you went to Northwestern and worked out. What does that say -- is that just who you are?

PETER SKORONSKI: I think it's just a routine thing, personally. Just it's really another day and obviously if it's a normal Thursday morning, I'm probably going in and working out. Definitely getting some nervous energy out too. So just wanted to do that. Keep up with my workout routine.

I think in the afternoon, actually, I was like super anxious and stuff just laying around the house, so I like started doing planks randomly. Just like to get the energy out. So, yeah, just part of my routine and get the energy out, for sure.

## Q. That physicality, the violence that you're known to play with, everybody has their own reason for it. What's your why? Why do you play with that physicality?

PETER SKORONSKI: I just kind of love the aspect of the game of being able to dominate someone for 60 minutes. I think that so much of that relies on physicality and violence and just sort of like moving a guy against his will, sort of getting him to fold. So I think that's really cool to think about.

I think some of the best moments offensive linemen will talk about is like a series where you only run the ball and just kind of beat the piss out of the defensive line and just run it up their throats and move down the field. Just because there's such a physicality, physical aspect to that and just like mano-a-mano, kick their ass.

#### Q. And that vibes right with Derrick Henry, right?

PETER SKORONSKI: Yeah, yeah, for sure. That's kind of why I was definitely really excited to come here because I know this team has that mentality. Especially with Derrick and the offensive line. So really excited for that.

## Q. When you were being recruited who all was offering you and what made you decide to go to Northwestern?

PETER SKORONSKI: It kind of game came down to Stanford, Northwestern, Notre Dame. So I wanted to go to a good academic school, for sure. I think just Northwestern kind of had everything I was looking for in terms of culture, coaching staff, academics, like I said. It was relatively close, it's close to home. That's not what I set out to do, but it was convenient for sure, kind of checked all the boxes. So it worked out great.

Q. Were either of you, Ran or Mike -- the decision to trade up spots and go after Will Levis and make him your pick in the last year of Ryan's deal, why move up, and is Levis going to be backing up Ryan, or how are you going to play this?

RAN CARTHON: So to explain the move-up, again, is what we talked about Monday, what we talked about yesterday is trusting our board, and he was a player that was highly ranked on our board.

We had the opportunity to do so, so why not do it. It was a chance to improve our football team, and [Will] will start off as our third quarterback, and from there, it's on him.

Q. Mike, can you talk about the efficiency of the passing game in his career. He's not always been the most accurate guy and doesn't always seem to have made the best decisions. How does that translate into the coaching that you need to do and into the efficient play that you're looking for?

MIKE VRABEL: Well, when you look at completion percentage, 65 percent, two years in the SEC, what we felt like was over 30 drops, that probably would have led to closer to 70 percent completion. Every player that we bring in here is going to have a chance to improve and will have to improve.

Again, the decision making, toughness, accuracy are obviously things that we feel are critical with quarterbacks, and we think that the three that we have here are going to be able to do that.

Q. He was made available at 11 and you guys didn't take him or trade up to get him. Was that just a value perspective, or was that someone that you earmarked as your quarterback?

RAN CARTHON: It's a value thing. Again, he's a player that had we wanted to choose him at 11, we most certainly could have. Like we talked about last night, didn't expect for Peter to be there, and he was a guy that we highly coveted, so we were able to make that move. Happy that we were able to move up to get a player like Will.

Again, just playing the board. We were just talking on the way here, playing the board game. We're rolling the dice and playing the board. That's pretty much --

#### Q. How high was Will at that point on the board?

RAN CARTHON: I mean, had Peter not been there, Will was amongst the conversation. That's really all I can give on that right now.

#### Q. I think Ran may have misspoke when you said that Ryan would start off as a 3--

RAN CARTHON: I meant to say Will.

MIKE VRABEL: Ryan will be the starting quarterback on Monday, Malik will be the backup, Will will be the third quarterback, and what I've told them is whatever happens after that will be up to the players. That's what it's always been here. That's what we always want it to be.

RAN CARTHON: Good catch.

#### Q. Will you keep three quarterbacks through the season?

MIKE VRABEL: Of course. There's a million scenarios that we'll have to work through between me, Ran and the staff and myself and everybody. We just are starting the off-season. We're two weeks into the off-season program. Looking forward to Phase II with the players that come on Monday, and then when we're able to get the rookies in here with rookie mini camp.

## Q. You've talked a lot about player development. How much for Tim and Charles now is Will kind of the project and something for them to have a big role in?

MIKE VRABEL: That would never -- whether it's Will or Tyjae or Peter, our coaches, again, it's ad nauseam. We've been here going on six years. They have to be great teachers. They have to be able to develop the players at their position, and then they have to be able to make a connection with them and hopefully inspire them to do their job better. That's what their job is, and they're going to put into each player as much as that player will allow us, and we'll coach them as hard as they'll allow us. We're excited about the three players that we've added as well as the new players that we added in free agency, to be able to get to work with them on Monday.

## Q. When you look at this wide receiver group and some of the options available, what's behind not picking a receiver to this point?

MIKE VRABEL: What's behind it? The same thing Ran discussed, it's taking a look at our board and seeing where things are. We know we have needs. We come into each phase of player acquisition with needs. It's certainly something we're going to continue to target.

Again, what the roster looks like today and what it's going to look like at the first part of September is probably a little different.

#### Q. What can you reasonably expect from a fifth-round receiver given the state of your receiving corps?

MIKE VRABEL: I think there's been players throughout the history of the NFL Draft that have contributed somewhat large success at every round. Whatever you say reasonable, I don't know what the number is. That's not how we want to approach this. We want to take a look at the board, see where things are, try to improve our football team, and I am going to speak for myself, I'm confident that we did that tonight.

# Q. This franchise seems to have diminishing feelings about receivers. You traded A.J. Brown, you drafted Dez Fitzpatrick, you played somebody like Cody Hollister last year. Are you dedicated to the passing game with productive players like you've talked about?

MIKE VRABEL: Yeah, of course. We want to be able to throw the ball efficiently, be able to throw the ball down the field, be able to create X plays, and I'm confident that we'll continue to try to work on that, and we'll do it.

# Q. Ran, you talked about bringing these QBs in for top-30 visits, getting them in front of you and diving into the person that the quarterback is. What did you see in Will when he came into this building that gives you guys confidence in moving up to grab him?

RAN CARTHON: Will is a diligent worker, extremely smart, extremely bright, puts a lot of time in to be a good quarterback, so you appreciate his ability to pick up concepts and things quickly, and just who he is, he's hard-wired. He's tough. His most recent offensive coordinator, Rich Scangarello, I had experience with in San Francisco so kind of knew how he operated within that system.

Then when we brought him here, our coaches and our scouting staff, we had good interactions with him, so just made it easy for us.

#### Q. (Inaudible)

RAN CARTHON: It's like Mike said. It's a myriad of things that you can contribute to whatever you feel was a lack of. There were the drops and things like that, so we talked about it, about other players. You don't want to just put it all on one person. You have to understand the full concept of everything that was going on.

Again, Will is here. Our coaches are going to work their asses off to help him improve, and we think that he will improve.

MIKE VRABEL: I think we can obviously be transparent. Kentucky was a much different football team in 2021 than what they were in 2022. If we protect him when he's out there at whatever point, if we don't protect him better than what it was, it's probably going to look the same, just like it is for every quarterback.

We try to look at the really good exposures, the great performances. We try to look at them what they look like at their worst, and then just try to pull the curtain and see what it looks like. But there was some really impressive performances against some big-time defenses in the SEC.

Now, there's some decisions that have to be better. Can't put the ball in harm's way no matter who our quarterback is.

## Q. How much of this offseason was making sure you got a healthier football team? Spears has had some knee problems in the past. Are you convinced that his issues are past him and that he'll be fine?

MIKE VRABEL: Played a lot of really productive snaps. Didn't miss much time at all. Was a full participant throughout the week at the Senior Bowl.

I think both of us are comfortable with where we're at with Tyjae and what his availability will be going forward. Now, that may change, but feel good about where it is right now.

## Q. Ran, with you on Tyjae, what stands out about his skill set when you watch him play and how you feel like he's a complement to Derrick?

RAN CARTHON: Oh, he's a three-down runner, he can run between the tackles. He's elusive; he can make guys miss, as well as contribute in the passing game. He catches the ball well out of the backfield, is a good route runner. Just another guy that can do it all for us, and you can put him in the game in any situation and there will be some production there.

I just want to say something real quick. Today, as yesterday, these kids are living their dreams, having their name called, realizing a dream and being drafted, and I don't want these interactions between us to always feel like we've got to take a

negative turn. This should be a joyous moment for us to praise these kids. This is a moment, these kids are going to see this, and this is a moment for them and their families to rejoice because it's only going to happen once.

We joked earlier about – Jim and I joked earlier about me not being drafted, and that's a moment in my career I can never get back. Coach was drafted in the third round. It's a moment he'll always remember, so let's keep that in mind when we're talking about these kids and where they've come from because a lot of these kids have overcome a lot to get to this point, so let's keep that in mind in moments like this.

There will be other times to critique what they've done. These kids haven't seen stepped on an NFL field yet, so let's keep that in mind. This is a moment for them and their families to have something to be proud of and enjoy this moment.

## Q. Could you circle to the wide receiver topic; is the fifth-round miracle-pick plan the best way to get explosive at wide receiver and to give your quarterbacks dynamic receivers to go with Treylon?

RAN CARTHON: Rolling the dice, playing the board. That's what we're doing. We're going to take the best available player in the fifth round. We hope that it's a receiver because we're going to continue to address our needs. If we take a receiver in the fifth round, it's a player that we feel can contribute to our team. Like Coach said, it's players that have come into this league that have performed at high levels in all rounds of the draft. We don't look at it as a fifth-round guy that's not going to be able to come in here and contribute. Everybody that we bring here will have the opportunity to earn it on the grass.

## Q. Did you have some receivers that you maybe had eyes on that went about five or six picks before you made that pick at 81?

RAN CARTHON: Is there a specific one?

#### O. Well, the two from Tennessee.

RAN CARTHON: I knew we were going there. Again, it's playing the board. Like we talked about yesterday, we're always fielding calls, we're always making calls to try to move around and do things to improve our football team, and we've got to take it as it comes.

But we're always looking to improve our football team at every stance we get.

#### Q. Do you ever let need overtake the board at all?

RAN CARTHON: We play our board. Like go back to yesterday; just so happened at a position of need, a best player was there, so we were able to do that. We're going to continue to do that.

Again, if there was a camera full-time in there, you would see the constant communication that we have going on between picks and understanding value and where different people fall on our board within picks, so this isn't -- we don't go in locked in in one spot, and that's how we're going to be.

# Q. One of the advantages of bringing Levis in here, you get to sit down and work through the interceptions and everything. How did that process go for you guys as far as him being able to explain what happened and what he could have done differently?

MIKE VRABEL: Great. Had a lot of great exposure with Will at the combine, the pro day, here. I think that with any player, when there's a mistake, it's how you allow them to make mistakes. Can they explain it? Hey, here's what I was trying to do, it was fourth down, I'm trying to feel like I've got to force the ball in there, and if they can't explain it, then that's what you have to come in as a coach and figure out why those things happen.

We did that with a lot of different situations with every quarterback, whether it was situationally, third down, red zone, interceptions, times where we felt like that was a bad decision. We did that with all the quarterbacks that we met with.

## Q. Obviously Ryan has been through this a lot in his career, knows the lay of the land. What kind of message and what kind of -- how do you want the league to approach the fact that another quarterback has been brought in?

MIKE VRABEL: That's our job is to bring in competition at every position. That's not a secret. I hope that by now that everybody understands that we have to prove our value to this football team each and every day, and I've said that to every player on our football team, to every coach, and that's what our goal is. They're going to come in and compete, and the players ultimately will determine their role.

## Q. Ran, probably tonight still some work to do, look at the board and in the morning, but how do you think it stacks up as far as needs that you have and what's left?

RAN CARTHON: I think Coach said it as we were leaving the draft room talking to the staff, tomorrow is where the fun begins. Tomorrow -- and it's still what Coach said -- our scouts in the room tomorrow, it's their day, and our coaching staff and our scouts have put in a ton of work. I feel really confident in the work that they've done and the players that they've identified for us as future picks or future signed free agents, so I feel really good about where we are in the process and have the utmost confidence in our coaches and scouts.

# Q. You kind of touched on both you guys followed your own path to the league. What advice do you give some of these guys that are in the league for the first time, everything is new, probably overwhelming at first? How do you try to get them to settle in and get comfortable?

RAN CARTHON: For me, it's fairly simple. Put your head down and work and just eliminate the distractions. It's really that simple in my mind, when you come in and you're young. It's all about putting in the work and learning as much as possible and taking advantage of the resources.

Prior to me coming here, Coach has brought in a lot of resources for these guys, both on and off the field, that are going to make them better people, better players, players not only here but just around the league. You have to just take advantage of those resources and apply your work ethic to it.

MIKE VRABEL: If the NFL Draft is the best night of their NFL career, they're not going to have a very good career.

#### Q. (Inaudible)

RAN CARTHON: I'll say him developing into -- that's all on him. I can have all the predictions, all the comparisons, but if he doesn't come in and put in the work, which I believe he will, then all my predictions will be for naught. It's just like I said, just come in, put your head down and work, I believe he'll do that, so what he becomes in his career is totally up to him.

#### Q. You talked at the combine about how important those comps were in painting that picture. Who's the picture?

RAN CARTHON: You tell me. I'm just saying from a standpoint -- I'll say it this way: Our comps that we give are usually within our draft room to kind of paint the picture for us. I think Will Levis is Will Levis, and I think that's the best he's going to be. It's the best Will Levis.

Extremely happy for him. Had a really cool conversations with him. As soon as we called, you could hear it, it was really a cool story. He literally had just walked in his home from traveling back from Kansas City, and --

MIKE VRABEL: Bags in the foyer.

RAN CARTHON: Bags in the foyer still, and I just kind of told him, he was telling me about his travels, I was like, hey, none of that means anything because we're bringing you to Nashville. But to answer your question, we can say and call him everybody you want to, but I think in the grand scheme of things, he's going to be a best Will Levis.

Q. You talked about staying in contact with Ryan (Tannehill) and communicating with him all the way through. Do you have to even let him know you're going there or do you communicate with him that pick and how do you want him to approach his job moving forward?

MIKE VRABEL: Reached out to Ryan. Those things happen pretty fast. Would say that was able to reach out to him and then ultimately have a conversation with him and explain to him what I told you and some other things that obviously will remain between Ran and myself and Ryan, and expect him to compete, just like Ryan has done every day since he's been here, and what Ryan did was come in from another situation, put his head down, learn our playbook in probably a week, push the starting quarterback in his own way, prove to the football team that he was ready, and then when given the opportunity, took advantage of it.

I would expect him to continue to do that and be the consummate pro, compete for his job, and I would expect Malik and Will to do the same thing.

#### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA AT CONCLUSION OF NFL DRAFT

RAN CARTHON: Good evening, everybody. Wrapped up today. Feel really good about the guys that we brought in. We took Josh Whyle in the fifth round. Josh is a guy we think can come in and compete for a spot. He's a versatile guy. You've heard us talk about that a lot lately. In terms of guys with versatility, we think he can play Y, we think he can play F. So got him as a contributor.

Then Jaelyn Duncan, tackle, has played some left tackle, played a little bit of right tackle this year. He's a guy that we envision having a ton of upside. Really, really athletic, has some high-end traits that we'd love to work with and develop and look forward to working with him.

And then to close things out, our man CD (Colton Dowell), UT-Martin, a kid that's put it all on tape. We had a chance to visit with him here during local day and he was really impressive. So I was really glad to get him. I think he has a ton of upside as well. You guys have met with me and Vrabes these last couple nights, you guys obviously know Vrabes very well. This time we have our assistant GM Chad Brinker here who will be in front of you guys for the first time. So I want to welcome Chad. And also just want to say thank you again to our staff downstairs, Ryan (Cowden), Jon Salge, our coaches. We talked about it this morning, the way our coaches and our scouts have worked together these last couple weeks is amazing. I've been a part of some really good processes and this was a really good process and one of the best I've been around in terms of those guys working together, creating the list and the way we had it tiered and then their ability to actually go out and execute and get some of these kids. And then the guy to my right I was just telling him when I came up here, had he recruited me coming out he might not have wanted to come down to Key West to come get me (laughing.) But I definitely would have came and played for him. I've never been around a guy that takes so much passion in talking to these kids and getting to know these kids and recruiting these kids in college free agency so thanks to you too, coach. Guys?

## Q. Ran, all six on the offensive side of the ball, with as that the plan trying to focus on offense or did it just play out that way?

RAN CARTHON: It honestly just dawned on me about 30 minutes ago that it was all offense. We were just playing the board and every time you came up at a pick I guess the way it was stacked and it was ranked your eyes went to the left and the way our board is constructed and healthy conversation on every pick. Everyone that we took off the board at wherever we took them we felt convicted. It just so happened to be all offense but it wasn't a designed plan or anything.

## Q. Seemed like everything every pick you made were highly athletic guys. How much did that athleticism play into your evaluation process?

RAN CARTHON: I think you're always looking for guys that are athletic and have athletic skills and traits to develop. That gives you guys that still have growth in their bodies. And as you guys know with this league, I mean it's growing rapidly, these positions are getting more and more athletic, bigger, stronger, faster, longer. So we wanted to be able to bring those players in here to compete.

### Q. When you look at skill position players from below the Division I level, how much does productivity play into it because Dowell certainly seems to have a lot of good numbers that's put up?

RAN CARTHON: Well I mean when he had to play Power Five competition he played well and proved well. Then when we brought him in for local day and he was amongst the other Power Five guys that we brought in here locally he stood out and looked like a Power Five to us. It just so happened that he was at UT Martin.

### Q. Your relationship with Luke (Fickell), how much did that help you with familiarity when it came to Josh, who said he met with you a couple of times over the past year.

MIKE VRABEL: We've been to Cincinnati. We've been there for pro days in the past. And he's a local kid and somebody you get to know having been there, kind of followed his career I think just the last couple years, being a local kid growing up in Cincinnati and deciding to stay there. So he's been consistent and the versatility as Ran mentioned is something that I think we're excited to work with.

### Q. Ran you said when we talked to Colton Dowell you said you thought he had run a 4.40 and 4.41, 40. Are those times you had him at?

RAN CARTHON: I don't know off the top of my head. I know he did run well and we felt and saw his speed when we saw him live and that speed showed up on tape. I don't know off the top for my head what it was.

## Q. I know Jaelyn came in on a 30 visit. How much did that help kind of getting to know him through the process and how you feel like you have added to the competition --

RAN CARTHON: You said Jaelyn?

#### Q. Yeah. And him pairing him with Skoronski coming in, how do you think that helps the competition up front?

RAN CARTHON: Jaelyn was a guy that we brought in on a visit. We've had some productive visits with him throughout the process. I met with him at the Senior Bowl originally and this was our first exposure to him in person. Then we brought him in here on a top 30, it was just a truly awesome visit. Really, really got to know him. It was a great day. We had great day with him. And then Coach Vrabes and I both having a relationship with Coach Locksley down at the University of Maryland, we were able to get on the phone with him and ask any other further questions that we may have had. So it was good getting to know Jaelyn throughout the process.

## Q. Chad, part of what you brought here is analytical eye. Can you talk maybe to the role analytics played in sorting through the board as you said it and maybe narrowing the focus on some of these guys?

CHAD BRINKER: Analytics is part of the process. It doesn't drive the decision making, it augments the decision making. So it just helps us make better decisions. We're still building a lot of this stuff out here. There's a whole thing from data management to predictive analytics to the information system and how that gets translated to the staff and to us and helping us in our decision-making process. So we use it, it's part of the process.

#### Q. Is there maybe an example of an analytics element that pulled you towards any of these guys?

RAN CARTHON: Not an exact example. Like Chad said, it's a part of it, right. So we trust our scouts and our coaches' evaluations and then we use the different cognitive testing that we talked about. And like Chad said, some of this stuff we're still building out and we have things to still work through. But again, any analytical component that we have that comes from Adam (Bondi) or Matt (Iammarino) we consider those things in terms of researching guys' backgrounds in terms of injury history and how those predictors set up. As well as how their numbers may stack at positions at certain times. Just different ways to run the data. So we take all that into consideration when we're using these guys.

#### Q. To follow-up on that Chad so your model of injuries is also a part of that is that correct and can you explain how that works?

CHAD BRINKER: Yeah, that's correct. There's a couple things we're going to use it for and we have been and it has to do with the salary cap as well as the injury model that we built. And those things are in process. So we're a little bit head on the salary cap side we're going to continue to build out the injury prediction model. So we're in the middle of doing that now

#### Q. Mike, how much does this class help towards your goal of getting faster as an offense?

MIKE VRABEL: Well I think there are some guys that really, that do that and again there's some, these were really easy choices as we looked at it and looked at the board. Excited to work with this group. I think they all bring a little bit something different whether it's some versatility or just looking at Colton at the end as big, fast, for you Volunteer fans played pretty well against them. And Jaelyn, just extremely athletic as Turron put it. And then we talked about some of the players that we drafted last night and then even in this post-draft process. I think there's a large group of players we're excited to work with, whether that's skill players or defensive linemen and we do think that there are some players that can run and ultimately the play speed is what's critical. But it was a great process.

## Q. How heavily do you feel like you guys will have to be in the undrafted market, especially on the defensive side of the ball and maybe at receiver where you only drafted one guy with only six picks?

MIKE VRABEL: Yup, that's all happening. It's finishing up right now. I think we're pretty close. But we won't probably be at 90 or 91 tomorrow. You don't have to be. I don't think there's any reason to just, we all agree, sign just to sign. But a lot of these guys were targeted and really feel good about that post-draft process that we've done well at. The coaches, the scouts, working together, communicating with players, communicating with us and communicating with the agent.

#### Q. What is first for these guys as far as scheduling goes? When is the rookie camp?

MIKE VRABEL: I think the first time they can be in here is next Thursday into our building. I know the players will communicate with them and get them in here and have some of the post-draft guys go through a physical at much greater length than what we've done. But we've had the ones at a combine and had the ones on local day. But they will go through a physical, they will meet and then we'll practice here for a couple days and then they will start to incorporate themselves into what the veterans are doing for that last week of phase two.

## Q. You said the fun started today in terms of the scouts having maybe more say or flexing their muscle if you will. Can you tell us a little bit about the role they played in these picks?

RAN CARTHON: Yeah, so each one of these guys and it's really been like this throughout the whole entire process is when we're sitting there and we're looking at the board and as the board starts to take shape you tend to look at your scouts and, 'Hey, man, talk to me about this guy. Give me...' you know, and you listen to what they say, right. The report is there, you can read the report, but you listen for them to see if they have conviction on these guys. We do the same thing with the coaches. Spent time with the coaches this morning going through some guys that were sitting there in different clumps and we watched a couple guys together just to see how the coaches felt about bringing guys along. Then, like I say, you really get to this undrafted process and that's when it gets really fun. You know sometimes you walk out of that undrafted process, you lose a guy late or you don't get a guy that you're targeting and it almost feels like the whole day is blown, you know, no matter who you drafted, because it's so much passion and you feel the urgency of guys and the collaboration, you want to bring it home and if a guy slips through it almost feels you feel defeated sometimes.

But like Mike said, all in all it was a great process, we feel really good about some of the guys we got. Some of the guys we targeted, but it's, you know, a huge shout out to our coaches and our scouts for that.

# Q. In regards to the receiver position I assume that you guys were really patient and able to come away with someone that you were really happy with. What was had to do with that, like was it the depth of the class or what allowed you to be so patient at that position?

RAN CARTHON: I think always you have to be patient. We talked about it not just taking a guy to fill a need. We want to get the right people and the right players in here that will help this program. But also understanding the board and value and if there's a valuable player that can help us and contribute and we have a clear vision for it, and it's standing out then we're going to take that guy as well. And again, like coach said, we don't have to be at 90 tomorrow. There's still a million more ways we can go about acquiring guys to help us. So we just got to let this full process take shape. We don't have to have the roster at 53 until September. So we've got to continue to let this process go. We have free agency first, we started there, now it's draft season and still there's still players that are going to come available to us and it's just all a part of the process.

## Q. You guys have been acquiring a skill set a little bit and maybe how it differs from Chig (Okonkwo), (inaudible) are they different enough that they can both be used together?

MIKE VRABEL: Yeah, we think that Josh has the ability to maybe put on some weight, he's done that, played at the line of scrimmage. I think going through some of the training he's probably gone down a little bit but I know that he feels comfortable in his frame to add and to lose, to figure out what the best playing weight is for him. And I think he has shown to be physical, I think he's shown to be able to make plays in the intermediate part of the field. So I think that there is a level of versatility and we talked about that. So we'll kind of see where he best fits, but absolutely him and Chig could play on the field at the same time together.

## Q. Not rushing to get the very last player on the 91, but the last couple years that you guys have been filling out the roster you all the way through September and into the season?

MIKE VRABEL: Well yeah, we'll do that.

#### Q. With injuries and stuff?

MIKE VRABEL: And we'll do that. We're going to get to 91. I mean it's just, we're talking about a couple spots here and there instead of just grabbing -- you get to a point down there it's like the wild west down there after the draft ends. So when you have, when you look up and you're like, okay, we need 20 spots, you know, you're not going to take the 97th corner just to get the 91 or whatever it may be. We've targeted guys, our coaches and scouts have watched a lot of film we've had communications and so you miss out on some of those. You think you're going to get some of the players and you don't. And it's competitive and it's unfortunate, but you can't just go down to the bottom of the list and take somebody that you've never heard of and bring in here. But we've, you know, we've got extensive lists and so maybe we're going to be a few short of 91, it was just saying that you don't have to fill up every spot. We feel good about these players that we were able to sign in the post-draft process, same way as we felt good about the ones that we drafted.

### Q. You and Ran both referred to the picks in the moment as easy choices for you guys. Is that typical of drafts you've been a part of in the past and what made it that way for you?

MIKE VRABEL: There were some players that kind of stood out on lines that separated themselves. Could have come off that and probably dropped down a rung and got into that other pond. But the players that we've took at certain levels were kind of sticking out by themselves. And Ran mentioned you kind of looked to the left and there was a player that was still there, felt really good about them and spent time with them and were able to make the pick.

## Q. Chad, in terms of analytics again, how has analytics changed the way you evaluate a quarterback and what part of analytics stood out with the pick of Will?

CHAD BRINKER: I'll guess I'll say this. Ran brought me in here because of my background of having the college experience, the pro experience, and salary cap experience and analytic experience, and also playing the game.

Now, I think that there's -- when you look at this decision-making tree, like I think of the experiential intuition. That's traditional scouting. You can't take the collective wisdom of the scouts and the coaches in the room and just throw it out. That's a major, major part of the decision-making and the process.

But I do think you look at the exploratory analytics or descriptive analytics and then there's a predictive component of it as well. So I mean, all those things -- if that's getting to the question you're asking, yeah, all that's being brought into the decision-making as we look at these players. We have this communication and we talk about it, but at the end of the day, it's about that tape, you know, can the guy play.

## Q. I understand why you like Colton and know you brought in one free agent, but for the things you've talked about the wide receiving corps, is that enough turnover to get out of that group what you've talked about?

MIKE VRABEL: Going into Monday, it will be, yeah. We're going to continue to explore and find ways to improve our roster and make it as competitive as possible. So on Monday, it will be. We felt good if -- for us to add a receiver we would have come far off our board at those certain levels. That's what I'm happy about. You guys are going to trust us. We're going to put players in here that are going to help us win.

## Q. That last part kind of goes back to the previous question. You're going to find ways to improve your roster. Free agency is over and the draft's over. Aren't those the places --

MIKE VRABEL: No, free agency is not. They're going to let us sign free agents Monday. They will. Chad will. Ran will. They will let us sign free agents on Monday.

Free agency is going to go all the way up until the season starts. There will be players that are on other teams that will become available Monday. Take a look. It will be a real large waiver wire. We'll scour that. We'll continue to look for trade possibilities and opportunities. Chad and Vin (Marino) will help us with the salary cap, find ways to open up salaries so that we can potentially sign other players. There's been a pretty good process here and I'm excited about it.

## Q. In the current receiver room, Mike, a couple guys coming back, Kyle Phillips, Racey McMath. What do you think you can get from them this coming season?

MIKE VRABEL: I think that will be determined by the efforts they put in and Kyle's ability to come back and maintain some consistency that he had early on and through training camp.

Racey knows that this is a critical point in his career and he's got to continue to play and improve and be big and fast and help us and adjust to the football down the field and do some of the things that he did in training camp last year before unfortunately he got hurt.

So those are two guys that we're excited to work with. One is really quick in the slot and the other one is a big outside receiver that is starting to improve and knows that he needs to continue to take steps.

## Q. You mentioned the analytical model and how that -- regarding injuries. How does that impact like the way you look at a guy like Spears, with the history of injuries, how does that impact you guys all being comfortable making a selection like that?

CHAD BRINKER: Well, I think, first and foremost, you go to your medical team. That's where it starts. You've got to trust your medical team and their evaluation. Obviously we selected that guy because he's a great player and we felt really comfortable about where he was medically.

And then of course, yeah, you look at all the other factors, how many games did they miss, how often were they injured. Just there's a variance of things that we look at throughout the process. We felt really good about that running back.

## Q. When you first got here, you told us about the Eureka moment with Mitchell and his tape. Did you have anything similar in this pre-draft process with any of the guys you guys picked just kind of falling in love with them?

RAN CARTHON: Yeah, I don't know if it was -- again, for me, I can't take credit for the Elijah Mitchell thing. Again, it was the work of our coach, our coach on the defensive side, and our analytics guy.

But coming in and looking at all these guys, there's something to love about each and every one of them. Again, we talked about getting the right people in here, but I think if you go through this list, all six guys, like there are traits in each one of these guys that they can contribute to our team. Like Mike tells everybody, it doesn't matter how you got here, it's what you do out here on the grass.

So we see these traits and hopefully these guys continue to grow and develop out here on the grass when they get here and they will create their own way.

### Q. Mike, you talked about Duncan, but I'm getting the sense there's a lot of upside there. What's he got to do to reach that level? What's he got to refine?

MIKE VRABEL: He has to show up and be the person that we saw and everybody in this building saw on that 30 visit. It was a special player that showed up there that day. That was one that was engaged, that had gained significant weight and looked really good, had put weight on and put strength on. That's what he has to do.

And everything else, we'll take care of everything else. We'll push him, we'll teach him, we'll coach him. But if he shows you up -- if that person shows up every day, we'll be excited to work with him.

## Q. Ran, obviously this year wasn't the way it will be in future years for you, given that you came in kind of late, I guess, in the process. How much different do you think it's going to be for you moving forward having gone through this now, and now you'll have a full year before the next one of these?

RAN CARTHON: J-Rob and I, our backgrounds are similar in terms of the systems that we were taught under. So some of the things conceptually are kind of similar.

But more than anything the process here is really good. It's not about me. The process is systems that I think work, because it's our scouts that do a lot of the work and a lot of the core things that we want to do. So it's about Chad and I collaborating with our current scouts about what works for them, what makes for the best and most efficient process for them to continue to getting us the best information to help us make the most informed decisions.

So once we get through this next week or so, we'll sit down as a group and we'll kind of start ironing out how we're going to do things moving forward. But, again, it's about creating the best environment for those guys downstairs right now to make us better.

## Q. Ran, how would you describe what the activity is like as far as trades, teams trying to engage with you, you trying to make moves, and how you think all that -- you handled all that as a first-time GM?

RAN CARTHON: I told you guys last night, I'm lucky to have an experienced guy like Mike. There were several moments where I'm thinking something, I look at Mike, I look at Chad, and we're like, hey, what do you think? Asking them for their genuine advice and their thoughts. And both guys were very, very helpful. There was no decision that was made throughout this whole weekend that was singular. It was just us working together.

Some of these picks we had people on the phone wanting to come to our spot. There were thoughts of maybe us going back, trying to play the board and see if guys would be there. But at each turn that we had to pick, we were convicted about someone. It was -- I won't get too particular or specific, but there were at least two picks that we made this weekend

where we had a team on the phone waiting on us to say yeah or nay, but we look up there on the board and we felt convicted about a guy. So it was one guy telling said team no while the other guy was calling the player.

# Q. Going back to when you were younger, the TV on the dresser, you always wanted to do something like this. Having gone through it, is there anything that kind of surprised you or what do you think of the overall experience?

RAN CARTHON: Definitely a cool experience. I won't say anything surprised me. I've been fortunate to be under some really good GMs that all did it different ways, and I always watched and paid attention in those moments. I said it last night, I just wanted to act like I've been here before, you know, and not try to get too high, not try to get too low, but just stay in the middle and try to be consistent throughout it all.

There were a couple spots where, in my mind, there was a player there that you would love to get and that player comes off the board and it's -- you hit that damn and it hits you in your chest a little bit, but you got to keep rocking, got to keep pushing forward, and we did that. And at each turn, there may be a player there that you like or that you were hoping is going to be there, but there's also a player there that you're like, hey, I like this guy just as much and it just -- everything just fell accordingly. Maybe a one-off this year. Next year, future years, could be crazy. Again, I'm thankful and grateful to have the experience in these two guys that are flanking me to lean on.

# Q. You enjoy the kind of story line -- I know you picked him as a football player, but the story line of a guy like Dowell, small school, like that, managed to work out, make impression for you guys. Do you like seeing that kind of thing happen for guys from smaller schools?

RAN CARTHON: Yeah, I mean, again, we're in a player acquisition business. You know, however that comes -- you know, there was that term back in the day, the diamond in the rough. That doesn't exist anymore. The way these scouts work, if there's a good player out there, we're going to find them. And with a guy like him, it was a cool phone call. He's right here locally, right down the road. And to hear a player say, This was the phone call I was hoping I was going to get. Not just a phone call of being drafted, but wanting to play for your team and feeling good about his one visit here coming away from here really wanting to be here, how it says a lot about what coach has built in terms of the culture, and it says a lot about the people we have here.

#### O. What would you say to your new fan base about the collective guys that you've got in this class?

RAN CARTHON: I think we have great people, first and foremost. I think we have really good players that will all work. They're all going to put in the work. They're all going to come here and hope to live out their dreams of playing in Nissan Stadium on Sundays, and we're excited to have them.

TITANS SELECT NORTHWESTERN OL PETER SKORONSKI IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THURSDAY'S NFL DRAFT

KANSAS CITY – Peter Skoronski huddled with over 100 family members, friends, coaches and former teammates at a pizzeria on Thursday night, waiting for his name to be called in the NFL Draft.

Eleven picks in, the Titans selected the big Northwestern offensive lineman.

It capped off an emotional night that included pizza, hugs, and just one beer

"Everyone is so excited, and supportive of me," Skoronski said on a Zoom call after being picked. "I had to run away into a corner to get the phone call (from the Titans). It's just awesome to be surrounded by so many supportive people.

"I probably only had one beer – I had to stay locked in for the night. But tons of pizza, though – I've been eating."

A first-team Associated Press All-American in 2022, the 6-foot-4, 313-pound Skoronski started 12 games for Northwestern last season, and 33 games over the past three seasons.

An Outland Trophy finalist in 2022, Skoronski was also a first-team All-American in 2021 as well. He was a two-time first-team All-Big Ten Conference selection at Northwestern.

Titans General Manager Ran Carthon said Skoronski is a player the Titans targeted all along.

"Peter checks all the boxes for us, and what we're looking for in an offensive (lineman), and what we're looking for in our program," Carthon said. "He's a guy that, truth be told, we targeted from the

beginning, but we didn't know if he was going to be there or not. So, we had other contingency plans in place. But we got lucky, and he was there, and so it made the pick real easy to pull off at 11.

"The player and the person checked all the boxes for us. So, we felt like who he was and what he brings here was easy."

Titans Coach Mike Vrabel said the team will ultimately have to make a decision whether to start Skoroski out at tackle or guard.

Earlier this offseason the team signed former Eagles tackle Andre Dillard and former 49ers guard Daniel Brunskill in free agency.

Vrabel said it was a priority to improve the offensive line this offseason to get better at the line of scrimmage.

"He has great footwork, he plays square, and he's strong," Vrabel said of Skoronski. "You can watch some of these clips and these are 270-pound guys, 280-pound guys rushing on the edge or blocking down on a three technique, and he gets his hands on you, and for the most part they don't go very far.

"I think he uses his mind; he is intelligent."

Skoronski thinks the Titans are a great fit for his game, no matter where he ends up playing.

Others at the pizza party agreed.

"I am decently familiar (with the Titans) – obviously I know Derrick (Henry) is one of the best to run the ball in the league right now, so it's going to be an honor to block for him," Skoronski said. "I know they're just a really physical team, a team that's always competitive. I know they had a lot of injuries last year, and were still a really, really competitive team. So, I think that kind of mentality as an organization, I am really happy to be a part of, because the Titans are kind of known for that.

"I've already had family members come up to me at the party right now saying how much they respect the Titans, and how much they love the way they play. So, I am really happy to be a part of that."

Skoronski's grandfather, Bob Skoronski, was a team captain and won five titles with the Green Packers in the 1960s.

Since he was little, Peter Skoronski said he wanted to play in the NFL himself.

He'll get his chance in Tennessee, with the Titans.

"I just wanted to follow in his footsteps and play in the NFL someday" Skoronski said. "It's been a goal of mine since I knew was football was, so I'm super happy. I am happy to be carrying on his legacy."

#### TITANS FIRST-ROUND PICK PETER SKORONSKI ARRIVES IN NASHVILLE, AND IS READY TO GET TO WORK

NASHVILLE – Peter Skoronski boarded a private jet out of Chicago's O'Hare Airport on Friday.

His destination: Nashville, Tennessee, his new NFL home.

Less than 24 hours later after being selected 11th overall by the Titans in the first round of the 2023 NFL Draft, the big offensive lineman was in Music City driving past Nissan Stadium after landing around 1 p.m. today.

On his first day as a Titan, Skoronski also had lunch with his new head coach, Mike Vrabel, after shaking hands with controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk and General Manager Ran Carthon in the hallway of the team's Metro Center facilty.

"Everybody has been welcoming me, and just showing me around a little bit, which is cool," Skoronski said. "I'm getting a feel for the place, and it's been great. This is going to be my place of work now, and I'm looking forward to it.

"It's been a whirlwind," Skoronski continued. "Obviously, 24 hours ago I had no idea where I was going. Now, here I am, in my new city. It's been crazy, but it's so exciting. It was an awesome night with friends and family (at the draft party back home) and then getting that call."

Skoronski's parents, Bob and Anne, made the trip.

On Thursday night, over 100 family members, friends, former teammates and coaches gathered at a pizzeria in Chicago, when Skoronski got the NFL call.

Skoronski will be officially introduced at a press conference at Ascension Saint Thomas Sports Park at 4:15 p.m.

"We drove by the stadium on the car ride here," he said. "I like how it's right downtown, and I am excited to play there. Nashville is just a great place to be."

A first-team Associated Press All-American in 2022, the 6-foot-4, 313-pound Skoronski started 12 games for Northwestern last season, and 33 games over the past three seasons. Skoronski, a first-team All-American in 2021 as well, was a two-time first-team All-Big Ten Conference selection at Northwestern.

Per Pro Football Focus, Skoronski allowed zero sacks and committed one penalty in 480 career snaps vs. AP-ranked teams.

Skoronski is now ready to get to work.

"It was weird kind of being in noman's land, not having a team and not knowing where you're going," Skoronski said. "So, I'm ready to get to work and ready to get started and get back to doing football stuff."

#### TITANS MOVE UP, SELECT QB WILL LEVIS IN SECOND ROUND OF FRIDAY'S NFL DRAFT

NASHVILLE – The long wait for Kentucky quarterback Will Levis finally ended on Friday night.

The Titans made sure of that by moving up in the second round of the NFL Draft to pick him.

"I stayed positive, and I knew what was meant to be, was going to happen," Levis said on a Zoom call after being picked. "When I saw (the Titans) traded up for me, that alone was telling me that they wanted me, they wanted this to happen. I am really, really excited and thankful for the opportunity."

Levis, projected as a Top 10 pick by many draft analysts heading into the draft, sat inside the green room with cameras on him and his family all night on Thursday night, waiting for his name to be called.

It never happened.

So, Levis left Kansas City on Friday morning, but his frustration didn't end there. After a three-hour flight delay out of Kansas City, and a nightmarish traffic experience on his way home to Connecticut after landing in Newark, N.J., Levis barely made it home before his name was called on the second day of the draft.

That's when the Titans traded up to get him with the 33rd overall selection. The team was initially scheduled to pick 41st overall.

"It was so funny. I was starving, I got home, put the bags down, went to get some food, and as I was stuffing my face, I got the call. I was ecstatic to get the call," Levis said. "It was bang-bang-bang."

The Titans gave the Arizona Cardinals the 41st pick of the draft,

along with the 72nd pick (third round). The team also gave up a third-round pick in 2024. The Titans got the 33rd overall pick, which they used to pick Levis, along with the 81st pick the draft (third round).

Levis said his emotions got the best of him when he got on the phone with Titans General Manager Ran Carthon and Coach Mike Vrabel.

"I knew I was going to cry, and the tears came immediately," Levis said. "I didn't really know how the conversation was going to go – it's one of those things where you feel like you're going to handle yourself and be composed, but the waterworks started flowing and the emotions overwhelmed me."

Levis (6-4, 229) played in 24 games over two seasons at Kentucky, starting all 24 games. In 2022, Levis threw for 2,406 yards and 19 touchdowns, with 10 interceptions, as the Wildcats finished 7-4.

Levis threw for 2,827 yards and 24 touchdowns in 2021 for Kentucky, with 13 interceptions, as the Wildcats finished 10-3.

In four college seasons, Levis threw for 5,877 yards and 46 touchdowns, with 25 interceptions. Levis began his collegiate career at Penn State, and he played in 15 games in two seasons at the school.

As Levis arrives in Tennessee, where Ryan Tannehill and Malik Willis are already on the roster, his mindset is to come in and compete.

"Regardless of where I got picked, I feel like it's not going to change my work ethic," Levis said. "You can't let the circumstances dictate your preparation, and the level of intensity you bring to your everyday practice. Definitely a little bit of a chip ... I ended up where I was supposed to be, and I am just looking forward to competing and getting started."

#### TITANS SELECT TULANE RB TYJAE SPEARS IN THE THIRD ROUND OF FRIDAY'S NFL DRAFT

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected Tulane running back Tyjae Spears in the third round of Friday night's NFL Draft.

Spears was taken with the 81st overall pick.

"He's a three-down runner," Titans General Manager Ran Carthon said of Spears. "He can run between the tackles. He's elusive, and he can make guys miss as well as contribute in the passing game. He catches the ball well out of the backfield, is a good route-runner. Just another guy who can do it all for us, and you can put him in the game in any situation."

Spears ran for 1,581 yards and 19 touchdowns in 2022 for the Green Wave, averaging 6.9 yards per carry. He also caught 22 passes for 256 yards and two touchdowns. Spears had a big game in the Cotton Bowl against USC, when he ran for 202 yards and four touchdowns. He was named the Cotton Bowl MVP after the team's win.

In four college seasons, Spears ran for 2,910 yards and 31 touchdowns while also catching 48 passes for 564 yards and three scores.

Spears was the 2022 American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, when he tied for the FBS lead with 21 scrimmage touchdowns.

"He played a lot of really productive snaps," Titans coach Mike Vrabel said of Spears. "He didn't miss much time at all. He was a full participant throughout the week at the Senior Bowl. I think both of us are comfortable with where we're at with Tyjae and what his availability will be moving forward."

#### TITANS GM RAN CARTHON, HC MIKE VRABEL DISCUSS DAY 2 OF THE NFL DRAFT

NASHVILLE – The Titans turned some heads on Day 2 of the NFL Draft when the team traded up to take Kentucky quarterback Will Levis in the second round.

Also on Friday, the Titans picked Tulane running back Tyjae Spears in the third round.

At the end of the day, Titans General Manager Ran Carthon and Coach Mike Vrabel discussed the moves.

Some of the highlights from Friday's presser:

-Vrabel said he talked to Ryan Tannehill to let him know the team was planning to pick Levis. Vrabel said Tannehill will be the starting quarterback on Monday, Malik Willis will be the back-up and Levis will be the third OB. "And what I've told them is whatever happens after that will be up to the players," Vrabel said of the competition. "That's what it has always been here, and that's what we always want it to be." Vrabel said there's a scenario the team could keep three QBs this season. Vrabel said he anticipates Tannehill to compete "just like Ryan has done every day that he's been here." Vrabel said he expects Willis to take a similar approach.

-Carthon said the selection of Levis was a "value thing" early in the second round. "I'm happy we were able to move up to get a player like Will." Carthon called Levis "a diligent worker who is extremely smart and extremely bright" along with being "hard-wired and tough." "Will is here, and our coaches are going to work their asses off to help him improve," Carthon said, "and we think that he will improve."

-The Titans didn't take a receiver on Friday, and the team hasn't used a pick on a receiver so far in the draft. "What's behind it?," Vrabel said. "It's taking a look at our board and seeing where things are. We know we have needs. We come into each stage of player acquisition with needs. It's certainly something we're going to continue to target. What the roster looks like today and what it's going to look like the first part of September is probably a little different." Carthon said the team is eveing receivers on the final day of the draft.

-Carthon and Vrabel both discussed the selection of Spears, who ran for 1,581 yards and 19 touchdowns in 2022 for the Green Wave, averaging 6.9 yards per carry. "He's a threedown runner," Carthon said. "He can run between the tackles. He's elusive, and he can make guys miss as well as contribute in the passing game. "Coach said it as we were leaving the draft room, talking to the staff," Carthon said. "Tomorrow is where the fun begins. Tomorrow, and to steal what coach said, our scouts, tomorrow is their day. And our coaching staff and our scouts have put in a ton of work. I feel really confident in the work that they've done, and the players they have identified for us as future picks, or future (undrafted) free

agents. I feel really good about where we are in the process."

TITANS SELECT CINCINNATI TE JOSH WHYLE IN FIFTH ROUND OF SATURDAY'S NFL DRAFT

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected Cincinnati tight end Josh Whyle in the fifth round of Saturday's NFL Draft.

Whyle, selected with the 147th overall pick, is an athletic big man who proved in college he can make plays, scoring 15 touchdowns.

Whyle said he met Titans head coach Mike Vrabel several times in the past year, as Whyle's former college coach, Luke Fickell, was roommates with Vrabel at Ohio State.

"It was a good conversation (with Coach Vrabel)," Whyle said of his draft day call. "When that call came, I don't even know if he could understand what I was saying. My heart was pounding. It was a pretty cool moment. ... We're both just excited for me to get down there and contribute any way I can to the team.

"(The Titans) like the idea that I can do a little bit of both – I can be an in-line blocker, and they can spread me out to be able to catch the ball. Not only that, but I think I have good special teams value."

Whyle (6-6 ½, 248), a former receiver who switched to tight end, caught 32 passes for 326 yards and three touchdowns last season for the Bearcats. He caught 88 passes for 1,062 yards for 15 touchdowns in his college career. He was a first-team All-American Athletic Conference performer in 2022, when he played in 12 games, with 10 starts.

Whyle caught six touchdowns in both 2020 and 2021.

Whyle ranked 78th on Bruce Feldman's 2022 Freaks List for The

Athletic (4.65 in the 40, 35.5" vertical, 10'3" broad, 20 mph on GPS, 16 reps of 225).

"I'm 6-6, 250 and I think I can move really well," Whyle said. "Growing up I played every sport you can imagine. My parents started me out in gymnastics when I was young, but I played basketball and football throughout high school. Football is something that I've always been good at, and it's something I've always found fun, which I think is really important.

"If you are going to play this game and make a career out of it, you have to have fun with it."

The Titans think Duncan, selected with the 186th overall pick, is an intriguing prospect himself.

Duncan played in 42 games for the Terrapins in his college career, with 39 starts.

The 6-foot-5, 298-pound Duncan made an official visit to the Titans leading up to the NFL Draft, and he also participated in the Senior Bowl and attended the NFL Combine.

"I had a great time talking with everybody, the whole staff, coaches, player personnel people and everything," Duncan said of his visit. "It was a great visit all-around. I enjoyed being in Tennessee. It was all great."

Duncan, an Honorable Mention All-Big Ten Conference selection, started all 12 games at left tackle in 2022. He was long considered a late bloomer, as he didn't start playing football until he was 14 years old.

But after playing in high school, and getting plenty of experience at Maryland, he'll head into the NFL looking to sharpen his technique even more while competing to make the roster, and play on Sundays.

"Just to be able to get in there and work, and be a part of that grind," Duncan said. "I want to be a great addition to the o-line room. I am willing to do anything and everything."

# TITANS SELECT UT MARTIN WR COLTON DOWELL IN THE SEVENTH ROUND OF SATURDAYS NFL DRAFT

NASHVILLE – Colton Dowell grew up just down the road from Music City.

All the while, through work and play, he kept his NFL dream alive.

On Saturday, the Titans selected the Tennessee-Martin receiver in the seventh round the NFL Draft, making his life-long dream come true.

"It awesome," Dowell said. "I can't explain the feeling, because I've never felt this before. But it is awesome, it's awesome. My phone has been buzzing in my pocket the whole time after they announced that pick. I have talked to old coaches, a couple of old teammates, high school teammates, everybody—they have all been hitting me up.

"It's a blessing. Being drafted by them is a dream come true."

Dowell, selected with the 228th overall pick, took part in a local pro day at Ascension Saint Thomas Sports Park earlier this month.

On that day, he wondered what it would be like to be picked by the Titans. He'd actually been to the facility in the past to watch training camp practices.

"It was cool to see the practice facility on the inside," Dowell said. "Me and my dad, we'd always try and get up there on the summer when they're going through training camp. It was cool to see the inside, and while I was there I definitely envisioned myself playing there, and putting on that two-tone blue.

"I would describe myself as a Titans fan, especially seeing what coach (Mike) Vrabel has done these past years running the team. I definitely consider myself a Titans fan, been to a couple of games."

In his final season at UT-Martin in 2022, Dowell caught 67 passes for 1,036 yards and six touchdowns. Dowell had six 100-yard games in 2022, including a seven-catch, 112-yard performance against Tennessee in October.

Dowell (6-3, 212) was a two-time All-OVC first team performer at UTM. He holds the school's all-time receiving yards mark at the school with 2,796 yards and 19 touchdowns.

Now he hopes to make a mark with the Titans.

"(The Titans) told me I could come in there and carve my role in their offense, and on their team, with hard work," Dowell said. "And I bought into that – I am a hard-working guy. It's up to me how far I go."

TITANS GM RAN CARTHON, HC MIKE VRABEL DISCUSS DAY 3 OF THE NFL DRAFT AND MORE

NASHVILLE – The 2023 NFL Draft is now officially in the books.

On Saturday, the Titans drafted Cincinnati tight end Josh Whyle in the fifth round, Maryland offensive lineman Jaelyn Duncan in the sixth round and Tennessee-Martin receiver Colton Dowell in the seventh round to close out the draft.

Earlier, the team drafted Northwestern lineman Peter Skoronski in the first round, Kentucky quarterback Will Levis in the second round, and Tulane running back Tyjae Spears in the third round.

Titans General Manager Ran Carthon, Coach Mike Vrabel and Assistant GM Chad Brinker met with reporters at a press conference on Saturday afternoon.

"We wrapped up today, and (we) feel really good about the guys we brought in," Carthon said in addressing today's picks. "Josh is a guy we think can come in and compete for a spot, a versatile guy. We think he can play Y, we think he can play F. We got him as a contributor. And then Jaelyn Duncan, he's played some left tackle and a little bit of right tackle. He's a guy we envision as having a ton of upside, really, really athletic, has some high-end traits that we'll love to work with and develop.

"And then to close out, our man C.D. from UT-Martin, he's a kid that's put it all on tape. We had a chance to visit with him on local day, and he was really impressive, so we're really glad to get him. We think he has a ton of upside as well."

Some of the snippets from today's presser:

-The Titans didn't take a defensive player in this year's draft. Carthon said the team was just playing the board, and the way it was ranked throughout, the offensive player had the best value each time the team was on the clock.

-Vrabel acknowledged his familiarity Whyle made the selection easier. Vrabel is friends with Whyle's former coach at Cincinnati, Luke Fickell, and he met the player on several occasions. "I have followed his career," Vrabel said of Whyle. "He's been consistent, and the versatility is something we're excited to work with." Vrabel said Whyle has the possibility to put on even more weight to his 6-7 frame (he's currently 248 pounds) and "absolutely him and Chig (Okonkwo) can play on the field at the same time."

-Carthon said Duncan was a player the team brought in on a 30-visit before the draft. Carthon said the team also met with him at the Senior Bowl and built a good relationship with him throughout the process.

-Vrabel mentioned the undrafted free agent possibilities, saying "there's a large group of players we're excited to work with, whether that's skill players, or defensive linemen and we do think there are some players that can run and ultimately play speed is what's critical." Vrabel said the team is in the process of communicating with players in the post-draft process.

-Vrabel said the rookies can be in town for a rookie minicamp starting a week from Thursday. The players will undergo a physical, meet, and then the rookies will practice for a few days before being incorporated into work with veterans in the offseason program.

-Vrabel said the Titans will continue to explore other options over the next few months, at all positions. "Free agency is not over – they are going to let us sign free agents Monday, they will," Vrabel said. "Free agency is going to go all the way up until the season starts. There will be players on other teams that will become available Monday, and we'll take a look. And we'll continue to look for trade possibilities and opportunities."

-Vrabel, when asked about veteran receiver Racey McMath, said "Racey knows that this is a critical point in his career, and he has to continue to play and improve and be big and fast and help us." Vrabel said McMath and fellow receiver Kyle Philips have unique skill sets and are capable of helping the team.

-Carthon said the Titans twice had teams ready to trade when they were on the clock, but both times they had a player they liked better than the potential trade back. "At each turn that we had to pick," Carthon said, "we were convicted about someone."

ESPN DRAFT GURU MEL KIPER JR. TALKS TITANS, AND THE NFL DRAFT: "I WOULD BET ON WILL LEVIS"

NASHVILLE – The Titans picked six players in the 2023 NFL Draft, and so far, most of the reaction has centered on the second pick (Kentucky quarterback Will Levis), instead of the first (Northwestern offensive lineman Peter Skoronski).

On Monday, I chatted with ESPN draft guru Mel Kiper Jr. about Tennessee's six-man draft class, from Skoronski to Levis to the team's seventh-round pick, Tennessee-Martin receiver Colton Dowell.

Kiper thinks the Titans got a steal in Levis, and overall, he thinks the Titans got great value, and potential across the board.

"I like his toughness," Kiper said of Levis. "I like his arm. I like his makeup. I like the way he is so smart - he was a straight-A student in high school. He's 24 years of age (in June), so he is mature. He can move, he is mobile – he had nine rushing touchdowns in 2021 when he was healthy, so he can stress a defense with his legs. He played in NFL systems back-to-back years at Kentucky. Last year, he lost his offensive line, he lost his top receiver, and he was beat up from head to toe. And the toe injury was significant - he couldn't move. He had no mobility. So, he was no threat as a runner, and obviously that affected his passing. Now he did, on the negative side, turn the ball over a lot. But when you're at Kentucky, you have to try and make plays to compete – you don't have 4and 5-star recruits all over the place. He got a little reckless with the football and didn't take good care of the football at times, but the ultracompetitiveness of a guy like Josh Allen, a guy like Will Levis, leads to that until they learn to dial that back

just a bit. ... Will just needs to strike that balance between being so competitive ... and understanding the situation he is in and understanding the risk-reward.

"I don't have a crystal ball, but I would bet on Will Levis. He is in a great situation there in Tennessee."

Kiper said Levis can learn behind veteran Ryan Tannehill in 2023, but he didn't rule out the possibility of him playing sooner.

And Kiper thinks the Titans got great value in Levis in the second round, at pick 33.

Kiper had Alabama's Bryce Young as his highest-graded QB, with Levis, Ohio State's C.J. Stroud and Florida's Anthony Richardson next. Young went 1st overall to the Panthers, while Stroud went 2nd to the Texans and Richardson 4th to the Colts.

Kiper said Levis slid into the second round because he fell into no-man's land on the back half of the first round, with teams that didn't need a QB. And because of that, the Titans got a steal, Kiper said.

"Now all of a sudden they don't have to pay that much money to an early second-round pick, and if he doesn't pan out, they could cut the cord pretty quickly if Will is not up to the challenge," Kiper said of the Titans. "It is kind of a win-win. Tannehill is there now and can play, and then Will – it is kind of like Alex Smith and Patrick Mahomes in Kansas City, although Will Levis obviously didn't carry the same grade as Patrick Mahomes did.

"Again, I don't have a crystal ball on this, but I like a lot of things that Will Levis brings to the table," Kiper said continued. "And I said all along I would have thrown out this past year because he was hurt. To grade him based off of (2022) is unfair, in my opinion, because he couldn't move and a part of his game is movement, rolling and running, and stressing the defense."

Here's what Kiper said about the rest of Tennessee's draft class:

1st round, guard Peter Skoronski: "To get him where they did, I liked it. He can play left tackle. I thought he was more of a guard, but he can play center, too. He can play any of the five positions, but it's a matter of what he'll be the best at. Where will he maximize his ability? I think it is more guard than left tackle, but we'll see. But he is a heck of a player. As a guard, I think he can be a Pro Bowl guard. But can he play tackle? Maybe he can. But he has short arms, and he is only 6-3 ½."

3rd round, running back Tyjae Spears: "He had a great year. Tyjae Spears is a heck of a running back. The only question on him is the medical, with the knee. He had the ACL a few years ago, and that is the concern – the durability, and the longevity of Tyjae Spears in the NFL."

5th round, tight end Josh Whyle: "That's the Mike Vrabel-Luke Fickell connection. (Whyle) played for Fickell, and Fickell and Vrabel of course played at Ohio State. Josh Whyle is a big target, he catches the ball, has some ability after the catch – he's an H-back. He is a move tight end."

6th round, lineman Jaelyn Duncan: "He has talent - I watched him throughout his career at Maryland, and Duncan has a lot of ability. Some thought at some point he could be a first or second rounder, he was just too inconsistent. He was inconsistent with his focus at times, and inconsistent with his technique. He needs an offensive line coach who can keep him on course. He has a ton of talent. Talent is not lacking with Jaelvn Duncan. The consistency was lacking and that's why he dropped. But he has a chance to be a starting tackle in this league."

7th round, receiver Colton Dowell: "I had an undrafted free agent grade on him, but in this draft, there was no difference between player 140 and player 340. I was trying to grade those guys up to 350, and I was

down there at 150 and I was looking at the guys at 250, and there was hardly any difference (in value). So there was very little difference between a fifth-rounder and an undrafted free agent this year. (Colton) has a chance to make the team."

Kiper said the team's draft class will be remembered for what happens with Levis.

"I think every one of these guys has a chance to be a factor moving forward," Kiper said. "But when we look back on this draft, it's going to be based on Will Levis. Will Levis is their future, and if he's not, then we are going to look back on this draft and say: 'Boy, that's not a good draft.' If this turns out to be a good draft, no matter what Skoronski and all these other guys do, it's all about Will. If he is the heir apparent to Ryan Tannehill, then he has to be a quality quarterback, especially in this division where you are going against Richardson and Stroud and Trevor Lawrence. They are all young. ... And the AFC is loaded with quarterbacks."
