TITANS-COMMANDERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

LEVIS PRODUCES 109.3 PASSER RATING OVER THREE GAMES: In recent weeks, Titans quarterback **Will Levis** has been one of the NFL's most efficient passers. During a stretch that began on Nov. 10 at the Los Angeles Chargers, he has completed 53 of 78 passes for 748 yards with five touchdowns and two interceptions. His three-game passer rating is 109.3.

Levis generated a 127.4 passer rating at Los Angeles, followed by an 84.7 passer rating on Nov. 17 against the Minnesota Vikings and most recently a 123.3 passer rating at the Houston Texans.

With at least 20 attempts and a 120-plus passer rating this week at Washington, Levis will join **Ryan Tannehill** (2019) as the only quarterbacks in franchise history to record three such performances within a four-game span (single season).

Among NFL quarterbacks with at least 50 attempts in the past three weeks, Levis ranks fifth in passer rating. Only **Derek Carr** (128.4), **Bo Nix** (118.6), **Tua Tagovailoa** (117.9) and **Lamar Jackson** (109.8) have fared better than Levis, whose recent resume also boasts the third-best passing average (9.6 yards per attempt) among quarterbacks with 50-plus attempts.

TITANS & COMMANDERS IN TOP FIVE IN ROOKIE SNAPS: This week's matchup between the Titans and Commanders features two of the NFL's teams that have most relied upon rookie contributions in 2024.

The Titans have had 10 rookies combine for a total of 2,584 snaps on offense (734), defense (1,135) and special teams (715). Tennessee's rookie snap total ranks fifth in the league. Left tackle **JC Latham**, the seventh overall pick in the 2024 NFL Draft, leads the club's rookies with 713 total snaps played.

The Commanders have used 10 rookies on a combined 3,389 snaps, led by quarterback **Jayden Daniels'** 695 snaps. Daniels was selected by the Commanders with the second overall pick in the draft and has started every game. Only the Los Angeles Rams (3,999) have totaled more rookie snaps in 2024 than the Commanders.

SIMMONS DOMINANT SINCE RETURN FROM INJURY: Titans defensive tackle **Jeffery Simmons** impacted last week's victory in Houston with a sack, three quarterback pressures and a pass defended. Late in the fourth quarter, his takedown of Texans quarterback **C.J. Stroud** at Houston's one-yard line preceded **Harold Landry III's** sack of Stroud for a game-clinching safety.

Simmons, who passed the 30-sack mark for his career (30.5), has been among the most statistically productive interior defensive linemen over the past seven weeks. He suffered an injury during the team's game against Green Bay on Sept. 22 and then missed the next contest at Miami (Sept. 30). After the team's bye, he returned to action on Oct. 13 against Indianapolis. Since his return, his 27 quarterback pressures are tied for the best total in the NFL among interior defensive linemen, per Next Gen Stats. Detroit Lions defensive lineman **Alim McNeill** also has 27 quarterback pressures in the same span of time.

Simmons' totals from Week 6 to 12 also include three sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, 25 total tackles and three passes defended.

FOLK NEARS MILESTONE: Last week at Houston, kicker **Nick Folk** provided three field goals—all from beyond 50 yards—to help beat the Texans. He finished the game with 399 career field goals on 474 career attempts since entering the NFL in 2007 as a sixth-round pick of the Dallas Cowboys. He has spent his career with the Cowboys (2007-09), New York Jets (2010-16), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2017), New England Patriots (2019-22) and Titans (2023-24).

With one more field goal, Folk will become the 15th player in NFL history to reach 400 career field goals. Additionally, he will tie **Mason Crosby** (400) for the 14th most field goals in NFL history. Among active players, only Baltimore's **Justin Tucker** (412) and Arizona's **Matt Prater** (407) have reached 400 career field goals.

Since being acquired by the Titans in a trade with New England prior to the 2023 season, Folk has made 95.8 percent of his field goals. On 48 attempts, he has split the uprights 46 times.

With two more field goal attempts, Folk will become the 12th player to attempt 50 field goals with the Titans/Oilers. None of the previous 11 kickers have made more than 43 of their first 50 attempts with the organization. **Ryan Succop** established the benchmark with 43 field goals in his first 50 attempts with the Titans from 2014 to 2016.
