# TITANS-TEXANS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

**LEVIS CONNECTS ON LONG-RANGE TD PASSES:** In last week's game against the Minnesota Vikings, **Will Levis'** 98-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** tied for the longest pass in franchise history. It was the longest completion in the NFL in 2024 and the longest completion for the franchise since Nov. 25, 1962, when Oilers quarterback **Jacky Lee** and tight end **Willard Dewveall** connected for a 98-yard touchdown strike against the San Diego Chargers.

Additionally, the touchdown pass by Levis against Minnesota increased his average career touchdown pass to 27.5 yards. Among all NFL quarterbacks in the past two seasons with a minimum of 400 total pass attempts, he leads the league in average yards per touchdown pass.

Levis, a second-round draft choice in 2023, became the team's starter in Week 8 of the 2023 campaign. Since that weekend, he has a total of six touchdown passes of at least 40 yards. The only NFL quarterbacks in that span with more touchdown passes of 40-plus yards are Cincinnati's **Joe Burrow** (nine), San Francisco's **Brock Purdy** (nine), New Orleans' **Derek Carr** (eight) and Baltimore's **Lamar Jackson** (eight).

MOST TOUCHDOWN RECEPTIONS SINCE WEEK 6: Titans fifth-year wide receiver Nick Westbrook-Ikhine established a carer high with his fifth touchdown reception of the season last week. His 98-yard touchdown catch, which tied for the longest reception in franchise history, gave the former undrafted free agent five touchdown grabs within the past six weeks.

Since Week 6, when Westbrook-Ikhine registered his first touchdown reception of the year against the Indianapolis Colts, he is tied with Baltimore tight end **Mark Andrews** for the third-most touchdown receptions in the NFL. Only Cincinnati's **Ja'Marr Chase** (seven) and Detroit's **Amon-Ra St. Brown** (seven) have more than Westbrook-Ikhine in that span.

**KEY AMONG LEAGUE'S MOST DISRUPTIVE DEFENDERS OVER PAST FIVE GAMES:** Arden Key provided one of the Titans' two sacks last week against the Vikings. The seventh-year outside linebacker increased his season total to five sacks—all of which have come in the past five weeks. He has at least one sack in four of the last five games.

Since Week 7, when he tallied a sack at Buffalo, Key's five sacks are the most he has produced in any five-game stretch in his career. His total also put him in a tie for third in the NFL in the past five weeks behind **Tuli Tuipulotu** of the Los Angeles Chargers (seven sacks) and Cincinnati's **Trey Hendrickson** (6.5).

Meanwhile, the Titans offense this week must contend with an opponent—Houston defensive end **Danielle Hunter**—who has an identical sack number as Key in the same time frame.

**STONEHOUSE LEADS IN 60-YARDERS:** Last week at Nissan Stadium, Titans punter **Ryan Stonehouse** boomed a 62-yard punt against the Minnesota Vikings, launching his seventh punt of the season that went at least 60 yards.

Since entering the NFL as a rookie free agent in 2022, Stonehouse has totaled 41 punts of 60-plus yards. His total leads the league in that time, despite missing the final five games of the 2023 campaign due to a season-ending injury. He had 15 total 60-yarders in 2023 following his league-leading 19 as a rookie.

AJ Cole of the Las Vegas Raiders and Corey Bojorquez of the Cleveland Browns are tied for second place with 40 punts of 60-plus yards since 2022.
