# TITANS DRAFT NOTES

April 23-25, 2026



## TEAM DRAFT NOTES

- **Mike Borgonzi** led the Titans draft process in his second year as general manager.
- The 2026 Titans draft class consisted of eight members: wide receiver **Carnell Tate** (Round 1), edge **Keldric Faulk** (Round 1), linebacker **Anthony Hill Jr.** (Round 2), guard **Fernando Carmona Jr.** (Round 5), running back **Nick Singleton** (Round 5), defensive tackle **Jackie Marshall** (Round 6), center **Pat Coogan** (Round 6) and tight end **Jaren Kanak** (Round 7).
- It was the second consecutive draft for the Titans in which they had eight or more picks after using nine selections in 2025. Prior to 2025, the last time the Titans had eight or more picks was 2022.
- All eight of the Titans' selections came from either the Southeastern Conference, Big Ten or the Big 12: four players from the SEC (**Keldric Faulk**, **Anthony Hill Jr.**, **Fernando Carmona Jr.** and **Jaren Kanak**), three from the Big Ten (**Carnell Tate**, **Nick Singleton**, **Pat Coogan**) and one from the Big 12 (**Jackie Marshall**).
- For the first time since 2017, the Titans had two first-round picks: **Carnell Tate** (fourth overall) and **Keldric Faulk** (31st). In 2017, wide receiver **Corey Davis** (fifth overall) and cornerback **Adoree' Jackson** (18th overall) were selected by the Titans in the first round.
- First-round wide receiver **Carnell Tate** (Ohio State) and sixth-round center **Pat Coogan** (Indiana) were high school teammates at Marist High School in Chicago, Ill., prior to Tate transferring to IMG Academy in Florida.

## WR CARNELL TATE | ROUND 1 (4TH OVERALL)

- **Carnell Tate** (6-2, 192) was selected by the Titans with the fourth overall selection. This marks the first time in franchise history the team used the fourth overall pick in the draft.
- The fourth overall pick is the highest selection used by the franchise to draft a wide receiver in the common draft era. The previous high pick for a Titans/Oilers wideout was fifth overall for **Corey Davis** in 2017.
- Tate is the seventh Ohio State player drafted by the Titans/Oilers in the "common draft" era (1967-present).

- The last first-round pick by the organization from Ohio State was running back **Eddie George** in 1996 (14th overall).
- Tate extended Ohio State's streak to five consecutive seasons (six total players) with a wide receiver drafted in the first round, joining **Garrett Wilson** (10th by New York Jets in 2022), **Chris Olave** (11th by New Orleans in 2022), **Jaxon Smith-Njigba** (20th by Seattle in 2023), **Marvin Harrison Jr.** (fourth by Arizona in 2024) and **Emeka Egbuka** (19th by Tampa Bay in 2025).
- In three seasons at Ohio state (2023-25), he appeared in 39 games and caught 121 passes for 1,872 yards and 14 touchdowns, averaging 15.5 yards per reception.
- In 2025, he started 11 games and totaled 51 receptions for 875 yards (17.2 avg.) and nine touchdowns.
- Earned second-team Associated Press All-American and first-team Academic All-American honors in 2025.

### **DE KELDRIC FAULK | ROUND 1 (31ST OVERALL)**

- **Keldric Faulk** (6-5, 274) was selected by the Titans with the 31st overall selection after the Titans acquired the pick in a trade with the Buffalo Bills.
- Faulk and wide receiver **Carnell Tate** (fourth overall) became the first Titans duo selected in the first round of a draft since wide receiver **Corey Davis** (fifth overall) and cornerback **Adoree' Jackson** (18th overall) in 2017.
- Faulk (6-5, 274) is the first Titans draft selection from the University of Auburn since the team selected cornerback **Roger McCreary** with the 35th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft.
- With drafting Faulk, the franchise has now selected 16 Auburn players in team history, tied with Penn State for second behind only the University of Texas (22 through 2025).
- Faulk was the first Auburn player selected in the first round since 2020, when defensive tackle **Derrick Brown** (seventh by Carolina) and cornerback **Noah Igbinoghene** (30<sup>th</sup> by Miami) were both selected in the opening round.
- Faulk became the first defensive player chosen by the Titans in the first round since cornerback **Caleb Farley** in 2021 (22nd overall).
- In three seasons at Auburn (2023-25), Faulk appeared in 37 games with 32 starts. His career totals included 109 total tackles, 10 sacks, 19.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and six passes defended.
- Finished his career with 32 consecutive starts.
- As a 20-year-old junior in 2025, he was named a team captain and registered 29 tackles, two sacks, five tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and four passes defended.

- He was named third-team All-SEC in 2025.

### **LB ANTHONY HILL JR. | ROUND 2 (60TH OVERALL)**

- **Anthony Hill Jr.** (6-2, 238) was selected by the Titans with the 60th overall selection after the Titans acquired the pick in a trade with the Chicago Bears.
- Hill became the 23rd all-time draft pick by the Titans/Oilers franchise from the University of Texas, which is the most among all schools.
- This was the third consecutive year in which a Texas player was drafted by the Titans, following the 2025 selection of tight end **Gunnar Helm** in the fourth round and 2024 second-round nose tackle **T’Vondre Sweat**.
- In three seasons at Texas, Hill appeared in 40 games with 32 starts. His career totals included 249 tackles, 17 sacks, 31.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, eight forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.
- In 2025, he played and started in 10 contests, tallying 69 tackles, four sacks, seven tackles for loss, two interceptions, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.
- Named second-team Associated Press All-American in both 2024 and 2025 and was a Butkus Award finalist in 2025.

### **G FERNANDO CARMONA JR. | ROUND 5 (142ND OVERALL)**

- **Fernando Carmona Jr.** (6-5, 316) was selected by the Titans with the 142nd overall selection in the fifth round.
- Carmona spent three seasons (2021-23; redshirted in 2021) at San Jose State before transferring to Arkansas for his final two collegiate campaigns (2024-25).
- He appeared in 50 games with 49 starts in college, including 37 starts at left tackle and 12 starts at left guard. He transitioned to guard in 2025, starting 12 contests there for the Razorbacks.
- He is the seventh all-time Arkansas player to be drafted by the Titans/Oilers and the first since wide receiver **Treyton Burks** (first round, 18th overall) in 2022.
- He did not play football until he lined up at tight end during his junior year at Las Vegas (Nev.) High School in 2019. In 2020, his senior season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **RB NICK SINGLETON | ROUND 5 (165TH OVERALL)**

- **Nick Singleton** (6-0, 219) was selected by the Titans with the 165th overall selection in the fifth round.
- He appeared in 53 games with 31 starts in four seasons at Penn State (2022-25). His career totals included 622 rushing attempts for 3,461 yards and a school-record 45 rushing touchdowns. His rushing yardage and attempt totals ranked fifth and eighth, respectively, in Penn State history.
- Added 102 career receptions for 987 yards and nine touchdowns.
- Also established Penn State records with 5,586 career all-purpose yards and 55 total touchdowns.
- Logged eight career 100-yard rushing games.
- As a senior in 2025, he played in 12 games with four starts, rushing for 549 yards and 13 touchdowns on 123 carries. He added 24 catches for 219 yards and a score.
- Became the 16th all-time Penn State player to be drafted by the organization, tied with Auburn (16, including 2026) for the second-most from any school in franchise history behind only Texas (23).
- The Titans drafted a Penn State player for the second consecutive season after selecting safety **Kevin Winston Jr.** in the third round in 2025.

### **DT JACKIE MARSHALL | ROUND 6 (184TH OVERALL)**

- **Jackie Marshall** (6-2, 293) was selected by the Titans with the 184th overall selection in the sixth round.
- Became the 15th all-time Baylor player drafted by the organization and the first since first-round wide receiver **Kendall Wright** in 2012.
- Played three seasons at Baylor in a five-year span after enrolling in 2021. He redshirted in 2021 and missed the 2023 campaign due to injury.
- Appeared in 37 games with 24 starts at Baylor. He totaled 94 tackles, five sacks, 13 tackles for loss, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and three passes defensed.
- In 2025, he played in 12 games with 10 starts, collecting 30 tackles, two sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss.
- In 2024, he established career highs with 13 starts, three sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss and 42 total tackles.

### **C PAT COOGAN | ROUND 6 (194TH OVERALL)**

- **Pat Coogan** attended Notre Dame from 2021 through 2024, including a redshirt season in 2021. In 2025, he transferred to play for the eventual national champion Fighting Irish.

- His collegiate totals included 42 starts in 44 games played. He started 13 games at left guard in 2023 for Notre Dame before moving to center for the 2024 season at Notre Dame (14 games, 13 starts) and the 2025 campaign at Indiana (16 starts).
- Played in consecutive national championship games following the 2024 (Notre Dame) and 2025 (Indiana) seasons.
- Named third-team All-Big Ten in his only season at Indiana. Additionally, he was named the Rose Bowl MVP for his performance against Alabama. He was the first offensive lineman to earn Rose Bowl Game MVP since guard Norm Verry (G) for the University of Southern California in 1944.

### **TE JAREN KANAK | ROUND 7 (225TH OVERALL)**

- **Jaren Kanak** (6-2, 234) was selected by the Titans with the 225th overall pick.
- Name pronounced “JAIR-in CAN-ick.”
- After playing linebacker at Oklahoma through his junior season, he was a third-team All-SEC tight end in 2025.
- Finished with 52 games of total playing experience in college, including 39 at linebacker before starting all 13 appearances at tight end last season.
- Recorded 44 receptions for 533 yards in 2025.

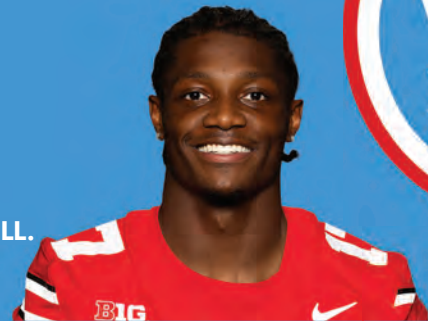

*(on the Titans, Cam Ward and the chance to play with him)*

I've been watching them since the Derrick Henry days, and I'm very excited for Cam Ward, being able to go out there and run routes and catch balls from him.

*(on if he had a sense he would get selected by the Titans this early)*

I knew there was a thought, but I didn't have any idea that I was going to go this early.

*(on the lineage of productive Ohio State receivers in the NFL)*

It starts with coach (Brian) Hartline. He pours so much love and attention into us that he allows us and sets us up for the next level. And then that's why our game is so easy to be able to translate to the next level.

*(on how he sees himself adjusting to NFL defenses and facing the top cornerbacks in the league)*

I'm looking forward to it. That's all you could ever want, the best on best. So I'm looking forward to going out there and making plays and helping the organization.

*(on what he can take from his role at Ohio State to help him adjust to a new role with the Titans)*

The same thing, just make the most of your opportunities. I think that's what football is especially at the receiver position. As long as you make the most of your opportunities and catch the balls that come your way, good things happen.

*(on his ability to gain yards after the catch)*

That's definitely a work-in-progress. I'm looking to improve that game at the next level and continue to get better.

*(on what it means that Brian Daboll believes he can make an immediate impact)*

I'm happy for him and I'm very appreciative of coach (Brian) Daboll. He's done a lot for them as an OC caller and trusting his guys. He's going to put the guys in the best position to succeed.

*(on the touchpoints he had with the Titans during the process and his impressions of Mike Borgonzi and Robert Saleh)*

I just had my two meetings with them. At the Combine, and I obviously went down on my top-30 visit, so those are the two visits I only had, and that was the only time we were in contact with each other.

*(on the Titans current wide receiver room)*

### **EDGE KELDRIC FAULK**

*(on if he knew the Titans were interested in him)*

No, not as much as my agent was saying. I really didn't know they had really any interest in me, man, I'm glad they did.

*(on what he knows about the Titans and what was his phone call with the front office and coaching staff like)*

To be honest, I really don't know too much about the NFL in general. I really just started watching players in the NFL as soon as I got to college, probably two, three years ago. So, it's kind of been a little while since—the NFL is kind of brand new to me. So, I'm kind of picking up knowledge about the NFL as I go. And then, as far as my phone call with the front office and everybody in the building, man, it was great. I really couldn't hear a whole lot because I was crying and everybody else was crying around me but I could tell that they were excited for me. So I'm excited to be there for sure.

*(on his game and if the analysis that his production dipped below his ability last year at Auburn is fair)*

I do. I do say that it's fair. My production did go down a little bit last year, but I feel like that was just really on me. I've got to finish my plays. And then like I said, I've got to finish on the quarterback a whole lot better than I have been. Going into the next level, that's the biggest thing that I'm working on right now.

*(on what he could do to better close on the quarterback and finish the deal at the next level)*

Really just training myself to drive through the quarterback's legs and stop tackling so high because I'm a taller guy. So I've got to make sure that I'm low and I'm driving through that quarterback to get them on the ground.

*(on his experience in the Draft's green room)*

Man, there was some doubt towards the mid part of it, but my momma always told me keep a positive mindset and positive things will happen. So I erased that mindset and I got back positive. As the picks kept going and going, I was waiting for my name to get called and then once it got called, I felt like I knew what it was going to, really because I just changed my mindset on how I thought about it. Yeah, I can say I got a little frustrated towards the mid part, but I kind of just let that go and let God take his course.

*(on what the Titans told him about what position he'd be playing)*

I really didn't have a whole lot of time to dive in depth with it. But whatever that team needs me to do, that's what I'm going to do for us to win.

*(on if he has heard of Jeffery Simmons and what he thinks about getting play with him)*

I've heard of him. I haven't watched a ton of him, but I've heard of him. From what I've heard, it sounds like he's a really good player in himself. So, I can't wait to just get into that building and get ready to learn from him and really just soak up all the knowledge from him. He is a veteran guy. So, my biggest thing coming into the next level is making sure that I get as much knowledge from him as I can.

*(on his ability to set the edge and defend the run opposed to rushing the passer and how his pad level plays into both)*

Really just because I come out of a—well I probably—coming out of three-point stance is probably one of the bigger reasons why I come out lower, especially in the run. And then we two-gapped a lot of stuff at Auburn, too. So you had to stay low as far as playing the run, if you was high you really couldn't two-gap anything because you were getting drove off the ball. So, it was stay low or get drove off the ball. So we shoot out the hips, and we stayed low and we drove guys back.

*(on his love for the game of football and the passion he plays with)*

Man, the love for the game really came from whenever—I played since my first grade year. But it really came from whenever I found out my father played. He passed in '08 and whenever I found out he played, it just ignited the fire even more. And then from there, man, it was just like, 'Why not keep playing? Why not make his name great?' And that's been my life's goal is to make his last name great.

*(on if he feels like there is still a lot of upside to his game fans haven't seen yet)*

Definitely. I feel like I haven't even touched 40 percent of what I could actually do yet. And man, that's just me being honest. I feel I've only touched 40 percent of what I can actually do. I feel like here being able to develop with the veterans, I could tap into the other 60 percent.

#### LB ANTHONY HILL

*(on playing for Robert Saleh and his history of developing linebackers)*

I know one thing, he's a fast and physical football coach. So I'm excited to play for a defense and a DC that's going to be able to play fast and physical.

*(on when he got the inclination that the Titans may be interested in drafting him)*

I had a 30 visit with them actually. So when I kind of met the DC, I met the linebackers coach and I kind of met some of the staff and I feel like it was a great connection. I love the city. When I was out there I got to go around the city a little bit. So man, I just love the city. I'm so excited to be in Nashville.

*(on his top-30 visit with the Titans)*

Just kind of learning about myself, trying to get to know me. What is my moral compass? Just scheme stuff, trying to understand scheme, going through some of the scheme stuff they do, and it was pretty awesome getting to go through some of that stuff.

*(on what he brings to the NFL after a productive college career)*

Well, I think I bring versatility, and I bring a physical presence that a lot of people don't have. I feel like I'm a guy that's going to work hard and do his job and be a great teammate.

*(on where his productive pass rush ability as an inside linebacker comes from)*

I've been having great coaches and I played some edge as a younger—growing up, middle school, high school. So I had a pretty good job and understanding on how to do that stuff when I got to college. And I had great coaches that kind of helped me work through some of that stuff as well as doing linebacker stuff.

*(on the additions the Titans have made on the defensive front since he was hired)*

Man, you know I love playing with the big guys up front. I love playing with the big guys that's going to take up blocks so I can run free and make the plays. So I love playing with big and physical linemen like that. I love playing with big physical lineman that are going to just make my job a lot easier.

*(on how playing at Texas has prepared him for Robert Saleh's defense)*

Yeah, so I'm actually—I'm a big football fan, so I'm kind of excited to play for a guy like him because I know his resume. I know what he did with other linebackers. Bobby Wagner, some of those guys in the past, Fred (Warner) and (Dre) Greenlaw. So I'm excited to play with a guy that I know is going to focus on the linebackers and he's going to make sure I'm developed to the best in my ability.

*(on if he can be developed from a good linebacker into a great one for the Titans)*

I just really want to just come in and focus on working on my details and working on my craft and just taking it wherever it leads me. So I know he's going to develop me. So I'm going to be all ears. I'm ready to learn and I'm ready to be coached.

*(on where he watched the Draft and where he is now)*

So I was sitting in there—I got a nice little venue because I wanted to invite a good amount of family and friends. So once I got that call, I kind of had to separate out and get in the car to get a little bit more space, a little more quiet.

*(on who is in the car with him)*

That's my dad right there.

*(on what this moment is like for his father)*

**ANTHONY HILL SR.:** A blessing, man. We've been working for a long time for this. Since five years old. I'm so proud of him. He worked hard to be in this moment.

*(on how much he knows about the Titans and Tennessee)*

I got a lot of family in Memphis and a lot them are here tonight. So, he is going to have a lot of support. We know a lot about the Titans. (Steve) McNair. We're blessed to be here.

*(on linebackers he models his game after)*

I watched a lot of (DeMarvion) Overshown, and I watched a lot of Edgerrin Cooper, and of course I watched some Bobby Wagner. Those are three guys I kind of watched and always kind of modeled my game after.

*(on the pride he takes in being the green dot on the field at Texas and how prepared he feels to do so in Tennessee)*

I took a lot of pride in being able to do some of that stuff. I did it for two years, so I'm capable of doing it. And if it calls for it, I'm ready to do it. I feel like it takes a lot of hard work and preparation to do it, but I feel I'm up for the challenge if called to be.

*(on where he expected to be drafted)*

It was a little longer than I expected, but I'm just happy to be here. I'm happy to be a Titan and I'm to be picked. So yeah, nothing to really complain about on my end.

*(on the possibility of focusing more on coverage than blitzing if that's how it pans out)*

I want to just say that I want to contribute that to how versatile I am. I feel like I do a good job of making plays and running sideline to sideline. So just being able to be versatile and just trying to get better at that. So I would say that contributes to that and how versatile I am and I feel like I'm capable of being less of a blitzer and more of an off-the-ball linebacker.

*(on if he knew he was born in the same hospital as Barry Sanders)*

Yep, I did.

*(on if he has met Barry Sanders and if anyone else has come out of Wichita, Kansas)*

I don't know a lot of people that came from there. But I've never met Barry (Sanders) and hopefully one day I get to meet him.

*(on if his game is versatile enough to translate to the NFL)*

Yes, I feel like that's something that I really want to focus on. Again, I want to kind of be all ears and kind of learn and develop between the guys in front of me, guys like Cody Barton and some of those guys. I want to kind of learn from them, develop and whenever my name's called, I'll be ready to go.

*(on how he was able to get his hands on the ball so many times in college in the form of takeaways)*

Just really focus on it and develop it. It's something that I've done a good job of doing since I was a young age. So just being able to go to high school and continue to work it and continue to get better at it is something I really tried to focus on. And it's something, knowing I'm with a defensive head coach, that they're going to help me take the next level at as well.

*(on Cedric Gray and the Titans linebacker group)*

I wouldn't say—right now I'm not too familiar with him. So that's somebody that, of course, I'm going to have to connect with and learn from. I'm really more familiar with (Cody) Barton since I kind of grew up watching him a little bit more since he was with Seattle. So I'm kind of excited to just kind of meet all the guys in the LB room and just learn from them.

**PRO:** The Titans selected Fernando Carmona Jr. in the fifth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-5-inch, 316-pounder is an athletic, versatile offensive lineman with a strong competitive nature. The Las Vegas, Nev., native spent three seasons (2021-23) at San Jose State before transferring to Arkansas for his final two collegiate seasons. Carmona finished his college career with 49 consecutive starts.

## TITANS TIDBITS:

- Despite growing up the son of a football coach, Carmona never played tackle football growing up. It wasn't until his junior year of high school his older brother convinced him to give football a try. In high school, Carmona lined up at tight end, but transitioned to offensive line upon arriving at San Jose State.

## CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Las Vegas, Nev., native was selected by the Titans in the fifth round (142nd overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

## COLLEGE:

- Started 49 of 50 college games over three seasons (2021-23) at San Jose State and two seasons (2024-25) at Arkansas. Started 37 games at left tackle before making the transition to left guard where he started the final 12 games of his college career.

**AS A SENIOR (2025)**, made the transition to left guard and started all 12 games. Helped pave the way for six games with 500-plus yards of total offense. Named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

**AS A JUNIOR (2024)**, started all 13 games at left tackle for the Razorbacks. Helped Arkansas average 495.5 yards of total offense per game which ranked 10th nationally while pass blocking for an aerial attack that ranked 18th nationally with an average of 274.7 yards per game. Named to the All-SEC third team by the conference coaches.

**AS A SOPHOMORE (2023)**, started all 12 games at left tackle to help guide San Jose State to a co-regular season Mountain West Championship. Played a total of 765 snaps and finished the season with an overall grade of 81.5 per PFF. Logged a pass block grade of 81.0 and a run block grade of 78.9. Allowed just two sacks in 424 pass blocking snaps. Named honorable mention All-Mountain West. Transferred to Arkansas following the season.

**AS A FRESHMAN (2022)**, started all 12 games at left tackle. Recorded 809 offensive snaps. Allowed just three sacks in 569 pass blocking snaps. Earned his first collegiate start against Portland State (9/1). Earned Academic All-Mountain West honors.

**AS A REDSHIRT FRESHMAN (2021)**, appeared in one game before redshirting.

## **PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA**

### **G FERNANDO CARMONA JR.**

*(on how much contact he had with the Titans prior to the draft)*

Yeah, I had lots of conversations with them, just great conversations. I got to visit down there, so I got to see the facilities and all the great things that they are doing. I'm just excited to go to work and be back in the great state of Tennessee.

*(on his experience at left guard and if the Titans have talked to him about moving to the right side)*

Yeah, you know in this league you've got to be able to play all five, and especially for me I'm trying to go out there and play right away. So, yeah, obviously wherever their need is I'm going to go out there and compete and work hard and if that is the right guard spot, I'm going to go right for it. But, yeah, in this league you've got to know how to play all five if you want to be out there on Sunday.

*(on if he worked out in other positions to show teams his versatility leading up to the draft)*

Yeah, I mean, this whole offseason I've really been working both sides, a little bit of center, too. Just showing that I can be versatile and come Sunday, you can throw me in any of those five spots and I'll go out there and compete.

*(on what he learned from working with offensive line coach Duke Manyweather)*

Yeah, I learned a lot from Duke (Manyweather). Honestly, that's one of my biggest blessings coming into this whole process. Just the knowledge that he has and the people that he's worked with he got to spread that wisdom onto me, so I got to work with even top people in this draft, Vega (Olaivavega Ioane), Keylan Rutledge, there's a lot of great people in my group, Kadyn Proctor. There's a lot of people. Just being around all these great people and learning from Duke, it was a true blessing to be there in the offseason, and I learned and have grown so much. I'm forever grateful for them.

*(on where he developed his mentality and how it will serve him in the NFL)*

Honestly, it was something I had to learn earlier on in my college experience. Being a tight end in high school and then coming into college and not really having played any offensive line, I had to learn how to get that nasty mentality and I remember my first few years, or really my first year, I had to learn how to flip that switch. My first coach at San Jose, Josh Oglesby, helped me learn when you step on the field and you cross those white lines, this nice junior has to go somewhere else and there has to be a new person that steps into your body. I think the way it's going to help me in this league, you have to be nasty. I'm about to go up against some of the biggest freaks in the world and I got to be able to go out there and compete and get after them and that starts by being nasty.

*(on his familiarity with the Titans)*

Yeah, I know a good amount. I mean being in the facility and all the people in the building are incredible, man. I really enjoyed my time there and all the energy. I mean there's a lot of good players on this team so I'm excited to go to work with them and show my worth and work hard and work my way up the ranks.

*(on the motivation to switch from tackle to guard last year and what he learned about himself in the process)*

It was something that Coach Sam Pittman came up to me and my coach Coach [Eric] Mateos and they're like, 'A lot of teams see you as an inside guy going into the league,' so I just trusted their word. They've produced a lot of linemen, especially Coach Pittman, so he had that vision for me and I trusted his vision. I learned it's a place that I like to be. I like being in that phone booth and just getting after it and just hitting people in the mouth and being in those tight quarters. I feel like I really thrive in that area and so moving inside this year was a lot of fun and I'm looking forward to continuing to grow.

*(on what he knows about Cam Ward and Titans running backs)*

Yeah, I mean we got one of the best in Cam Ward. He's going to be one of those guys that's going to play in this league for a long time. I'm excited because I've heard great things about him and his work ethic and how he shows up early to the facility and so I'm excited to get to work with him and try to beat him to the facility and just be as hard working as he is.

*(on his leadership and how he plans to establish himself in an NFL locker room and translating it to the field)*

Yeah, I think it's very simple, you've got to work hard. You've got to show everybody in the building that you're not just talking but your work is backing it up. I've always told myself, I'm not going to talk until people know I'm one of the hardest working, if not the hardest working person in that building. So, I think it just starts with working hard and gaining that respect from my teammates early.

*(on playing tennis and his size in high school)*

Oh yeah, there's not many tennis players 6'4, I was about 260 [pounds]. I wasn't the greatest, but yeah, no, I was about 260 in high school.

*(on being a journalism major and if he ever considered being a sports writer)*

Man, I'd love to be in one of your guys' seats when this is all said and done. I love the game, obviously of football, and a bunch of different things. But I love just talking about sports and getting with people and just communicating like this. I feel like this is something I could see myself doing post-ball.

*(on where he watched the NFL Draft)*

I got to watch it in Vegas. I have all my family and friends right outside right now. Man, it was a true blessing having all of them here. Having family around is a big part of who I am. They are the ones who have made me the man I am today, so being able to share this moment with them meant the world to me.

*(on if the red room he is taking the call from is Arkansas themed)*

No, this is actually a pink room. My late great grandma, I'm in her room right now. She's been my biggest role model, so I'm kind of getting goosebumps right now talking about her because growing up she was the one raising me while my mom was at work. She was a hardworking woman and I wish she was here today, but I can feel her presence right now and I miss her.

*(on what it was like getting the call from the Titans)*

I got to speak to the GM and the head coach. To be honest with you, I couldn't tell you what they said to me. I was so overcome with emotions and so many types of different feelings. I couldn't even tell you what I said, what they said, I was just so excited and they seem excited. So yeah, I wish I could answer that question better, but I can't.

*(on his thoughts on the Liberty Bowl play)*

Yeah, it was somewhere where I had to grow. I crossed the line and it was something that was very embarrassing towards me, my teammates, and my coaches. It's not the kind of player I am at all and it's something that I had to grow from and learn how to control my emotions while I'm on the field and being able to keep a level head. I think I did a great job this past offseason working hard with some mental coaches and just trying to work on being able to stay more consistent and not go too high or go too low. It's something that I'm extremely embarrassed about and it will never happen again.

*(on playing tight end in high school and how that has impacted his approach and how he sees the game now)*

Yeah, you gain respect for those tight ends that go out there and block and have to learn both the offensive line side and the wide receiver side. Being able to have that perspective in high school and then shifting over to the offensive line where it's strictly blocking, you gain a lot of respect for those guys and what they do and how hard of a job they have. Obviously, it starts with a good offensive line, but you need good tight ends in there and know the offense and block and catch, too.

The 6-foot, 219-pounder is powerful, athletic ball carrier that also excels as a receiver out of the backfield and as a kick returner on special teams. The Shillington, Pa., native played four seasons (2022-25) at Penn State where he finished his collegiate career as the Nittany Lions' all-time record holder with 55 career touchdowns, 45 career rushing scores and 5,586 career all-purpose yards.

## TITANS TIDBITS:

- Singleton enjoys giving back to his community. He volunteered for the Governor Mifflin midlevel football program, took part in Mifflin's elementary school literacy outreach program and given his time to numerous community clean-up events.
- Singleton was teammates with Titans safety Kevin Winston Jr. at Penn State.

## CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Shillington, Pa., native was selected by the Titans in the fifth round (165th overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

## COLLEGE:

• Saw action in 53 games with 31 starts over four seasons (2022-25) at Penn State and registered 622 carries for 3,461 yards with 45 rushing touchdowns and 102 receptions for 987 yards with nine receiving scores. Set the all-time Penn State records with 55 career touchdowns, 45 career rushing touchdowns and 5,586 career all-purpose yards. Became first Big Ten player with 5,000-plus career all-purpose yards and 50-plus touchdowns since Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor (2017-19) and joined Saquon Barkley as the only Nittany Lions to do so.

**AS A SENIOR (2025),** selected All-Big Ten honorable mention (coaches and media - return specialist) and All-Big Ten honorable mention (media - running back). Played in 12 games with four starts and rushed 123 times for 549 yards with 13 touchdowns. Added 24 catches for 219 yards with a receiving score and seven kick returns for 145 yards.

- Against Florida International (9/6), ran the ball 13 times for 76 yards with a five-yard touchdown. Surpassed the 3,000 career rushing yards mark.
- Against Indiana (11/8), collected 143 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns. Recorded 10 rushes for 71 yards, including two touchdowns and a season-long 59-yard run. Tallied three receptions for 22 yards with a receiving score.
- At Rutgers (11/29), rushed nine times for 86 yards with two touchdowns. Broke the Penn State career touchdowns and career rushing touchdowns records.

**AS A JUNIOR (2024),** named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media as a running back and a return specialist. Appeared in 15 games with 12 starts and recorded 172 carries for 1,099 yards with 12 touchdowns on the ground, while adding 41 catches for 375 yards with five receiving scores. Posted 14 kickoff returns for 331 yards with a long return of 66 yards. Led the Big Ten in all-purpose yardage (1,805; 7th nationally), while finishing third in yards from scrimmage (1,474; 19th), fourth in yards per carry (6.3), tied for fifth in rushing touchdowns (12) and sixth in rushing yardage (1,099).

- Against Maryland (11/30), totaled 87 yards and a pair of touchdowns on 13 carries. Added three receptions for 17 yards. Kickstarted Penn State's unanswered point stretch with a 66-yard kick return on the Nittany Lions'

first scoring drive.

- Against Oregon (12/7), recorded 105 rushing yards on 10 carries, including a 41-yard scamper in the first quarter. Added 43 receiving yards and a touchdown on four catches, including a 22-yard receiving score in the first quarter.
- Against Notre Dame (1/9), posted 84 yards and three touchdowns on 15 carries. The three rushing scores matched a career high. Scored on a five-yard run in the second quarter and added a pair of seven-yard touchdown rushes in the fourth quarter.

**AS A SOPHOMORE (2023),** earned third-team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media as a running back and honorable mention honors from the coaches and media as a return specialist. Appeared in 13 games with seven starts and notched 171 rushes for 752 yards with eight touchdowns. Posted 26 catches for 308 yards with two touchdowns. Tallied 13 kick returns for 313 yards (24.1) with a long return of 51 yards. Ranked third in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards (105.6) and tied for fifth in rushing touchdowns (eight). Was an Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

- Against Delaware (9/9), scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns. Rushed for 47 yards and added an 18-yard reception. Found the end zone on a two-yard rush on Penn State's opening drive and scored on a pair of five-yard runs in the second quarter.
- At Michigan State (11/24), finished with 118 yards on 18 carries with a touchdown. Caught two passes out of the backfield for 68 yards. Scored on a 14-yard rush in the fourth quarter. Had a 53-yard reception in the first quarter, his longest career reception.
- Against Ole Miss (12/30), rushed for 50 yards on eight carries and added four receptions for a career-high 86 yards with a touchdown. Hauled in a 48-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.

**AS A TRUE FRESHMAN (2022),** named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year. Earned Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year honors. Picked up FWAA Freshman All-America laurels as an all-purpose player. Tabbed All-Big Ten third team by the coaches and media as a running back after appearing in all 13 games with eight starts. Led the team with 1,061 yards rushing on 156 carries with 12 touchdowns. Posted seven 40-plus yard runs with five of those resulting in touchdowns. Had five games with multi-touchdown rushes and four 100-yard rushing games. Added 11 receptions for 85 yards with a score. Also handled returning kickoffs, logging 14 returns for 349 yards with a 100-yard touchdown.

- Against Ohio (9/10), ran for a career-high 179 yards on 10 carries with two touchdowns. Scored on a 70-yard run in the first quarter, his first career touchdown. Added a 44-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Finished with 219 all-purpose yards (179 rushing, 40 kick return).

#### **RB NICK SINGLETON**

##### *(on his foot injury)*

Yeah, I've been feeling good right now. Just being able to run around a little bit these last couple of weeks. Once I get to Tennessee, just meet with the medical staff and just get on the field as fast as I can, man. I'm feeling good and I'm just blessed.

##### *(on how being a track and field athlete translates into his football athleticism)*

Yeah, definitely. I have been doing track my whole life, especially in high school and it has been translating a lot during football. Obviously, my speed and all of that, my strength, being able to have more stamina, but I feel like it will translate really well into Tennessee. I rely on my speed a lot too, and I can bring that to the table.

##### *(on what went into the decision to play all four years at Penn State)*

Yeah, Penn State was just a great place, coaches were good, players too. My last year, my third year, we ended up losing, and I wanted to come back up with Penn State. A lot of our seniors came back, too, so we just wanted to leave our mark here at Penn State. That was kind of the reason why I wanted to stay, but it was just really good.

##### *(on adjusting to splitting playing time his senior year after a successful junior season)*

That adjustment was a little crazy but at the same time, I stuck with it, I stuck with my teammates, coaches and all that. Just being a team player, man. It doesn't matter if I was carrying the load, splitting the rest, I'm just here for my team, make our team better.

##### *(on what it was like when he received the call from the Titans)*

I was watching at the Reading Phillies Stadium, so luckily, they had a little section room for me and my family. So my dad, my parents, brothers, sisters, cousins, aunts, they are all here. So, to get that call, it meant a lot. I walked outside to talk to the coaches but once I went back inside, family was all there excited. So, it was a surreal moment, man. I am just so blessed.

##### *(on how he would describe his game)*

I feel like I am a really physical back, a really speed back, too. I'll go in, it doesn't matter what it is, I'll just go out there. I feel like I am a complete back too, being able to run the ball, catch the ball out the backfield and be able to go block, stick my nose down and go block. So, that's kind of my game.

##### *(on his contact with the Titans in the pre-draft process and what he knows about the organization)*

Yeah, a little bit. I talked to them, I think, during the combine and some a little the Senior Bowl, too. But they are really good, great program. I have been watching them my whole life. They produce a lot of good players.

##### *(on how many draft hats he had ready and how he got the Titans one on so fast)*

I had all 32 caps but to end up with the Titans, man, I am just blessed. I am just so grateful and so blessed to be a part of this organization, and I just can't wait to leave my mark here.

*(on how much his pass catching ability can grow in the NFL especially with the Titans)*

Yes, for sure. I definitely think it is a big advantage for my game, too. I try to make myself a complete back, so to be able to put me not just in the back field, but the slot position, the receiver slot position, it doesn't really matter. Just put me anywhere on the field, I'm just going to make a play. And I have just been doing that my whole life I feel like.

*(on what he thinks his 40 time would have been given his track background)*

Definitely a low 4.3, trying to aim for like a high 4.2, but between that, definitely, for sure.

*(on where his passion for giving back to the community comes from and how he hopes to continue that in the NFL)*

Yeah, definitely, for sure. I'm big on giving back. When I was young, I used to watch high school players and they always give back to my community, too. I always wanted to grow up, have a name for myself, and always give back because you don't get there by yourself. The people around you help you and support you and all that type of stuff. So, I'm always big on giving back.

*(on how he rates his elusiveness and how he can improve at the next level)*

I definitely feel like I can get better with that, really just everything. I feel like I can get better with everything, especially with elusiveness, too. But I feel like I bring that to the table too, but obviously get better with that.

*(on how playing in the Big 10 has prepared him to be a running back in the NFL)*

I would definitely say the Big 10, a lot of good teams in there, it's a physical conference, too, and obviously the next level is obviously physical. So, I feel like I got a good head start with it, especially at running back in the Big 10, Penn State. So, I just can't wait to go to the NFL and show what I can do.

*(on his relationship with Titans Safety Kevin Winston Jr.)*

Yeah, yeah, KJ, my guy, man. We both came in together at Penn State. We're both, obviously, came in the same class. He's just a guy that comes in to work, man. So I kind of look up to him when he came up to Penn State just working, so I can't wait to be teammates with him again.

*(on breaking a lot of Saquon Barkley's records at Penn State and if he has connected with him about the transition from college to NFL)*

Yeah, for sure. He said congratulations to me when I broke the record. But he's always told me just to keep my head down and just work, man, just stay locked into everything, man. So, he's a big brother in my—really just a big brother at Penn State and just my family, too, man. Saquon, yeah, he's really good.

*(on where he thought he would go in the draft)*

Yeah, definitely they were saying there were a couple of teams—there was third, fourth, fifth like it didn't matter. I always stay locked in through the draft. Never left my seat, just had my eyes to the TV just waiting for my name to be called. But I'm just super blessed.

*(on what it was like waiting for his name to be called)*

It was good. Obviously, you're waiting for your name, you get a little anxious because you never know what team you're going on. But I'm just super blessed to be part of the organization. Titans are really good. I just can't wait to get to work.

*(on his knowledge of Titans historic running backs)*

A little bit, yeah. Obviously I know they produce a lot of good running backs, too. They've been to big games. Running backs they produce in the big games, too. I just can't wait to put my name on that list, too.

*(on his excitement to be on the field with Cam Ward)*

Yeah, Cam Ward, he's a really good player. He just texted me once I got drafted, which is crazy. But I seen him my whole college career, too, at Miami as a big quarterback, fast too, elusive. He obviously got an arm too. He's one of them leaders too that'll step up. So, I can't wait just to meet him, just take over the field with him.

#### DT JACKIE MARSHALL

*(on his contact with the Titans leading up to the draft)*

First of all, thank you, I appreciate it. The contact for me, honestly, little to none. I had no clue, honestly.

*(on what head coach Robert Saleh told him about where he fits into the defense)*

Just for me to come in and do as much as I can to impact the team. I'm excited to work in this scheme and be in something new.

*(on his versatility on defense and if he prefers one spot over another)*

I'll play anywhere. I have no picks. I can play anywhere up and down the line of scrimmage, wherever they want me at.

*(on if he can further develop his power throughout his NFL career)*

Yes, sir. 100 percent. That is definitely something that I've been working on, and I'll continue to work on.

*(on how he put on 60 pounds from high school to college)*

Oh man, just being at Baylor. Getting behind that program, they put me right.

*(on him returning kicks in the past)*

Yes, sir. It's true.

*(on if he could return kicks now)*

If they need me to.

*(on how he ended up wearing number 0)*

Just working, man. I worked all summer for that. I earned that one.

*(on the motivation to switch from linebackers to defensive line)*

Initially I switched over because of depth. We were thin in our D-line room, and I switched over and just ran with it.

*(on joining Roydell Williams as the only East St. John alumni to play for the Titans)*

Man, it's a blessing, man. An extreme blessing. I don't even know what to do right now, man. I can't even believe it. Just thank God for sure.

*(on meeting with the Titans and the feedback he got throughout the process)*

I don't think I had a meeting with the Titans at all.

*(on where he watched the draft and what the celebration was like after getting the call)*

I'm here in Waco, me and my family. I got all my brothers with me, my sister, my girlfriend, and her family, a couple of her friends. Man, we are just excited sitting around watching the draft and I got the call. Everybody started crying and screaming and we all got together for a group hug.

*(on how Baylor has prepared him for the NFL)*

I feel like being under Coach (Dave) Aranda's system and playing his defense definitely helped me understand defenses better. Just being able to think through some of the things and just getting ahead of things while I'm on the field.

*(on being exposed to the league at the East-West Shrine Week and what that experience was like)*

Being at the Shrine was cool. It was a different experience for me. I got to play a different system, a scheme I feel like, and I loved it. It was one of those things — I never played in that scheme before, so that was the first time. I had fun though.

*(on how you earn single-digit jersey numbers at Baylor)*

With single digits at Baylor, you have to earn them all. They only give out one single digit to each player. We do a vote right before fall camp, so spring and summer is your time. If you want to earn a number, you have to put in work through that time. Right before fall camp came, they announced that I had number 0.

*(on what it feels like to be recognized with a single-digit number)*

You know, you get to look good, you play good. That was my motivation behind it.

*(on Calvin Ridley currently wearing number zero for the Titans)*

I'm not worried. You can give me whatever number. I don't care.

*(on how he came back from tearing his ACL in 2023)*

Yeah, it was a big test to me. It was the first real injury I ever dealt with, and I feel like I had to find myself outside of football. But, being at Baylor, I felt like I was at the right space and I was able to grow as a person, better player, and just as a human being.

### **C PAT COOGAN**

*(on his contact with the Titans leading up to the draft)*

I actually just met with them this past Monday, five, six days ago, or whatever the case may be. It was a great meeting. We went over a lot of offensive line stuff, and I love it. It's a great fit and I am just very excited to get to work. The waiting process is a unique experience, right. It's a long day, but I am really just blessed to be a Titan, blessed to be a part of the community and a part of this football team, and I am just overly grateful for the opportunity.

*(on what he learned going through a culture shift at Indiana and what he can bring with him to the Titans)*

It takes everybody. Everybody in the organization, everybody at Indiana truly everyone bought in to the mission, and that was just to be the best versions of ourselves each and every day, to put our best foot forward. That's what it takes. It's never going to be about one guy. It's never going to be about one player, one, whatever the case may be. It takes everybody. It takes a village. Just thinking of my friends and family who are here celebrating right now, it takes a village, and it's the same way for an organization. Like I said, I'm just overly blessed and grateful.

*(on his relationship with Carnell Tate and their reunion after playing together in high school)*

I can't wait to FaceTime him after this. Me and Carnell, we go way back. Marist High School. We would drive to morning workouts together, 5:45 in the morning. I am super proud of Carnell. He earned it. He really did. It's a great connection. There's a saying here on the south side of Chicago, where me and him are both from, 'South side, there's nothing like it, there are connections everywhere.' It's funny how far that travels, now into the NFL. I am happy to be his teammate again. He is an unbelievable football player, and I remember talking to him early, really early, when he was a freshman and I was a junior. I had just gotten an offer from Notre Dame, I believe I was committed and he was still super young and green but you could see the talent right away and I remember talking to him and trying to get him to go to Notre Dame with me but he was like, 'No, I'm going to Ohio State. Ohio State is my dream,' and it came to fruition. So, I am really proud of him and I'm really happy for him and I can't wait to call him and be teammates again. Really, it's awesome.

*(on the leadership that comes with playing at center, what that transition was like going from Notre Dame to Indiana and now to the NFL)*

I take a lot of pride in the center position. There's a lot of responsibility, but I take a lot of pride in it. I take a lot of pride in doing my job, doing my job to the best of my ability. The center position has a lot of roles, obviously. But it's an exciting spot, it's an exciting position, one where the leadership of who I am, what I am made of, kind of comes to the forefront. Taking control of the huddle, that was a big thing at Indiana, where we got to huddle up again and taking control of the huddle and breaking the huddle, 11 as one. I'm just really excited. It's hard to put into words, but I love the position and it's everything that I am, that I want to be and that I continue to strive for. Everything that encompasses the position.

*(on his relationship with Indiana wide receiver and Nashville native Charlie Becker)*

Charlie B. from Nashville, Tennessee. I'm sure he's texted me. My phone is blowing up a little bit. But yeah, Charlie was unbelievable for us, and he's going to certainly be a high pick next year. But I know he takes a lot of pride in Nashville, and I'm excited to call him.

*(on his familiarity with Cam Ward and earning a spot to play in front of him)*

Absolutely, you said it, everything is earned. What a dynamic football player and an unbelievable talent. I think everyone saw that, what he put out on the field last year. So, I am just excited to meet him, excited to get to work, really.

*(on what goes into being a successful center and the role film review plays)*

A lot of film, but that's what I love. I love watching ball, watching defenses and what the defense is trying to do. I really do love that part of the game. A lot goes into it, but like I said, I take a lot of pride in it, and it's what I love to do. You have to take each defense as it's own, you have to study, you have to be in the film room, and you have to really try and see what the defense is trying to present. You have to understand how the defense is trying to attack you but at the same time, you have to be on the offense, on the tip of the spear. And that's what I'm really all about and that goes into my preparation as well, understanding what the defense is trying to do but also having the attack mentality to go out there and really be the hammer.

*(on what the Titans have shared with him about the opportunity to start at center)*

All I am looking to do is come in and get to work. That's who I am, that's what I am about. Just compete every single day, put my best foot forward, come into the facility every single day and be the same guy no matter what happened the day before. Good day, bad day, it doesn't matter, I am going to come in and put my best foot forward and go out there and compete. That's truly who I am and what I am all about.

*(on his pre-game speeches and how that will fit in with the Titans as a rookie)*

Everything's earned, everything is earned. That kind of just happened at Notre Dame, and it continued at Indiana. But everything is earned. I'm back to the bottom of the totem pole, which excites me because I'm ready to earn everything and every opportunity and really just blessed for the opportunity, for the chance. The Titans believe in me enough to give me this unbelievable opportunity. So, I owe everything to the organization and to them to go out and earn it.

*(on his familiarity with Fernando Carmona)*

I met him at the Combine, great dude, really great dude. I don't know him well, I'm sure we'll get really close. But I met him at the Combine, we were in the same group. So, I'm really excited and I'm happy for him. I know he went a little earlier in the day, but I'm really happy for him.

*(on how his experience with two successful collegiate programs can help position the Titans for success)*

Yeah, I think everything that I present: smart, tough, dependable, reliable, trustworthy, it's what this organization is about and is going to continue to be about. So really just excited to get to work. That's what it takes. It takes work, everything is earned. No good thing comes easy. I think everybody knows that now, but especially stepping up to this to this league. It's going to be hard and that's good. Hard is what we want, no

good things come easy. Everything that I believe I am and I've shown to be who I am, like I said: smart, tough, dependable, reliable, every single day. I believe I fit like a glove.

*(on his experience leaving Notre Dame and establishing himself at Indiana)*

Yeah, no doubt. South side Chicago kid, Irish Catholic raised. Notre Dame was the dream, and I got to live out my dream. I graduated in three and a half years, led my team to a national championship in my senior year. All the good, all the bad, all of the ugly, all the great victories, bad losses, it's really made me who I am today. I'm really grateful for it. But the end of that four years was a chapter closing in my book, in my journey, and moving on to Indiana was certainly one of the best decisions I've ever made in my life. And it continued to build who I am today, the man I am sitting in front of you guys. So, I'm really just grateful for it all. It's been an unbelievable five years in the college game, but it's been a blessing.

*(on his familiarity with Peter Skoronski)*

Yeah, he is obviously older than me. I believe he went to Maine South, which is up north and then obviously Northwestern. So, I've never had the chance to meet him, but another Illinois boy. So, I'm excited to meet him and excited to get to work.

*(on if his height played a factor in the broken ceiling fan in the background)*

Yeah, um, yeah, that's... I probably broke it one night. This is my longest time home in my childhood home for a while now. So, that's a great question, I'm glad you guys noticed that. I'm glad everyone's laughing because I kind of just noticed that myself. My parents got me a bed and the air conditioning works and that's all that matters.

*(on what it's like being back in his childhood home while getting drafted)*

Yeah, it's hard to put into words, really. Having my family here and them getting to experience this moment with me, that's really what it's all about, right? ### **TE JAREN KANAK**

*(on his switch from linebacker to tight end at Oklahoma)*

Yeah, definitely. So I grew up, my entire life I was an offensive player and just coming out I was recruited at the college level as more of a defensive style player and that's what I did my first three years. I kind of got to a position in my career, in my junior year of college, where I kind of realized that maybe defense wasn't for me. I basically approached Coach in the offseason and said, 'Hey, listen I got the offensive background. I'm kind of hitting a wall here in my career on defense and I really think I can offer more to this team if you let me try out offense.' I was really just trying to find a place where I can add value to the team and be a guy who can lead us toward success. They gave me the opportunity to switch over in the spring. They gave me a spring to try it out, and it ended up working out pretty well for me.

*(on what parts of his defensive mentality he took with him when he switched to offense)*

Yeah, I mean obviously playing linebacker you have a little more of an edge to you. There's a little more tenacity there. Obviously, you play the game in an aggressive style manner and that's something I like to do.

*(on how playing quarterback in high school helped with his transition to tight end and how that past will benefit him in the NFL)*

Like you said, playing quarterback, you have a very wholistic understanding of what goes on in an offense and offensive scheme and then having that defensive background as well and the system I was in with [Oklahoma] coach Brent Venables, it was a very wholistic system as well where you needed an understanding of everything that was going on around you to make everything work. Having that mindset and understanding of the whole concept of any given play is really going to help me moving forward and has really helped me.

*(on the draft process and getting the call from the Titans)*

Obviously just the draft process in the spring, the Pro Day, the Combine, all that stuff, I felt incredibly blessed to be in the position to go through that. Obviously getting to draft day, there's a lot of different emotions going through the day and getting here towards the later rounds, it's a crazy thing but I'm glad I ended up where I did and I'm happy to call myself a Titan.

*(on what role he sees himself fitting in with the Titans)*

I plan on walking in day one and making an immediate impact on special teams in particular. Just with my linebacker background and athletic ability and understanding of the game of football and being able to use my athletic abilities to my advantage. I'm looking to be a big contributor on special teams and then carving out a role for myself within offense and being a playmaker in that sense.

Real excited about the two guys we added here tonight. Carnell Tate, we thought he was the best receiver in the draft. And then coming back up and getting Keldric Faulk, who really fits this defense. I mean, long, can play outside, inside. Looking back to some of (Robert) Saleh's defenses, too, it reminded me a little bit of (Arik) Armstead when he had him there in San Francisco. So, really excited about adding these two guys here tonight. Great character guys, too.

*(on what Carnell Tate brings at wide receiver)*

Well, he's a bigger, vertical guy. The route running, very efficient, his route running. I thought he had exceptional ball skills to be able to track the footballs, catch radius downfield. I think he's going to be a great fit in this offense. And you know, he's 20 years old last year playing at Ohio State. He's a young kid. So is Keldric (Faulk). They are both 21 now. Two young kids. But Tate has the ability to play big downfield. That's the one thing, all these contested catches downfield, his ability to go up and catch the football, contort his body in certain ways. I think it's going to be great for Cam (Ward).

*(on what Carnell Tate can do with yards after the catch at the pro level)*

I mean, listen, all these guys have to improve in certain areas. What I think he really does well, though, is at the top of routes and he's able to separate in his burst and everything to separate at the second, third level, and you can see the burst off the line of scrimmage, too. And those are always things—there's always things these guys can improve on. They are still developing.

*(on how much he sees Carnell Tate playing as the X receiver and his ability to play against press coverage)*

I see that he does a pretty good job at it. Some guys win versus press in different ways. With him, he's elusive and sudden off the line of scrimmage a lot. When we study these guys, we're able to cut up all these plays off coverage, press coverage, and that was the one thing that really stood out, just his savviness to get off the line of scrimmage and his quickness.

*(on if he figures him to be an X)*

I think he can move all around. He's played inside, outside. He's played X. He's played Z. I think we can move him all around.

*(on what convinced him Carnell Tate could be a No. 1 receiver after being the number two last season)*

Listen, when guys come to the league, they want to project No. 1 receivers. You have to work your way to be a No. 1 receiver. The guys that he's played next to are some pretty good players over the last couple years at Ohio

State. I saw a 20-year-old kid that continued to get better. And his ability to get open at the top of the routes and really catch the ball downfield, that's the one thing that really stood out to us is his ability to track the football.

*(on the deciding factor in choosing the best receiver available over other positions)*

Yeah, those guys were really good players. We did a lot of work on Carnell (Tate). Had a chance to see him at practice at Ohio State late in the fall. Spent time with him at the Combine. Brought him in here. Really smart. He's really an unselfish player, too. When you study these guys, too, on tape, and some of these receivers and how much they block, and he actually — he's feisty in there as a blocker as well. We spent a lot of time on him, and you know, credit to our coaches, too. Spent a lot of time on him, too, when we brought him in here. So, we're really excited to get him here.

*(on if there was any thought in trying to slide back and still be able to draft Carnell Tate)*

No. It's always a fluid situation on draft day. You get calls, and we felt really comfortable staying there at that point.

*(on if they got the sense that Keldric Faulk wouldn't be available at pick 35)*

Yeah. Just looking at some of the needs and stuff, and where we had him on the board, he was our highest-rated guy at the time, and we thought this guy really fit the defense well. So, we just went up. When you see a player that you like, you just go up and get him.

*(on if they feel unbalanced at depth on interior defensive line versus the outside rush ends)*

No, not necessarily. I mean, these guys come in waves, and I feel good about some of the outside rush ends that we do have right now. And Keldric (Faulk), we can move all up and down the line of scrimmage, really.

*(on if they will play a lot of personnel groups that don't need a 'wide-nine' outside rush end)*

No, some of these guys will line up wide. You've seen it in the defenses. You're always looking sometimes for some of those, like speed guys in there. But, it's just the way — these guys come in waves in (Robert) Saleh's defense.

*(on what needs to happen for Keldric Faulk to bring the quarterback down consistently at the next level)*

Yeah, it's all about development, and he's a taller guy. Like I mentioned (Arik) Armstead before, and coming out of college, it was kind of the same thing. These guys, they have to learn to play with some of the pad level, and being a guy that's 6'6, these guys will — we have some really good coaches here. So, all these guys are still developing. But that's one area, yeah.

*(on a reasonable expectation for Carnell Tate coming in as a rookie)*

Listen, we're going to take it — I don't want to set expectations for anyone, but I think what he's going to do is he's going to come in and work, put his head down and work and earn his role here. We're confident in that.

*(on how he balances doing thorough research on players without giving away who they are interested in drafting)*

Yeah, both of them are really high-character guys and I actually got a chance to see Keldric (Faulk) versus (Texas) A&M before one of our games this year. I remember going to the game early in the year. So, I spent some time with him.

*(on why Keldric Faulk's skill set didn't turn into more sack production)*

I think these guys are still learning how to play with some more pad level, and I think that will get there eventually.

#### GM MIKE BORGONZI

We're excited to get Anthony Hill Jr. It was a guy that we've done a lot of work on. Brought him in here on a 30 visit. Spent a lot time with him. He is the prototype linebacker in this defense. Long, fast, violent, that we always talk about. Tremendous kid, great football character. As we were going through at pick 69, we were just—he's still up there. We had made some calls to try to go up. We felt with some of the teams maybe ahead of us that there could be a chance that he goes. So, we made a move to go get the guy that we wanted.

*(on his comfort level for what is left on the offensive line)*

Yeah, I mean, we got five picks tomorrow. There's still a good amount of guys up there right now. I know the draft's not over here yet. But we feel good about some of the guys up there.

*(on how much not having a third or fourth round picks limit them)*

Yeah, I mean, listen, we have five picks, so you can try to move around a little bit more if we had to. But we'll see how the board falls.

*(on Anthony Hill Jr.'s learning curve)*

Yeah, he's a smart kid, playing that green dot in this defense too, which he did at Texas, but just like any young linebacker, just going through reads and it's going to be a process for him. But I saw a guy that continued to get better as a young kid. He's a young kid who was 20 years old last year playing and continuing to get better. I thought he was really good in coverage. I do think his instincts are good. The one thing about him, when he sees it, he goes. He's fast and violent. He fits what we want here.

*(on all of the picks being younger so far)*

I think you're always looking for younger, healthier guys that have more of an upside. It wasn't really something that we totally just said, 'We're going to do this,' just happened to draft the first three guys that were all 20 years old last year playing basically. But of course, there's always—this guy is 20 years old, I mean, some guys they come out now at 24. So these guys are going to be finishing their first contract while some guys are still in college. So I think there's still room for these guys to grow.

*(on the process in knowing when you have to trade up to get a player you want)*

Yeah, there's all those scenarios. You're on the clock, something happens. But I think our pro department does a great job of studying team needs, teams in front of us, what they need. We track teams that have visits with players. There's all sorts of information and intel that you might take into account. And that's really what you do. You really don't know, but you try to have as much information as you can with the teams in front of you or even behind you if you think you can move back and still get that same player.

*(on what he believes is still available at the nickel position)*

I got to see who goes the rest of the night, but there are some guys in some of that bigger nickel role that we have down there. But Marcus (Harris) is—I think Robert (Saleh) said he's one of the bigger nickels he's ever had. He's tough in there, he can tackle. So we'll see how it shakes out, but there are some players on the board that we do have in that category.

*(on how Anthony Hill Jr. will fit into the inside linebacker room and if he expects him to start immediately)*

No, I mean, all these guys have to come in and earn their role. The guys we have in there, I thought played well last year. And just like anything else, these guys will come in, it's a competition. That's the name of the game.

*(on how the new scheme changes how they evaluate the linebacker room)*

It's not so much from the off the ball linebacker. It's not much of a bigger transition as it was, I guess, in the past with some of these 34 linebackers who were just downhill thumper guys. The game has changed so much where you have to be athletic. So it's really more of the front that you have figure out the edge, defensive ends versus outside backers. Off the ball linebacker is pretty comparable.

*(on how this draft has been different than last year's draft)*

Well, I think anytime you have a year under your belt with the staff, it really hasn't been much different, but I guess there is a sense of more, it's more comfortable because guys have been through the process before. The process that I was putting in last year just going through the fall with the scouts was a whole new thing, but certainly the more drafts that you have and going through a cycle with the same staff, it's a lot easier.

*(on if they will not be utilizing Anthony Hill's pass rushing skills)*

No, there are some different schemes that Robert (Saleh) has done, especially with Fred Warner. And we've gone over that, and how he's going to be used and certainly that role as a blitzing will be used here in the scheme.

*(on how his comfortably being in this role helps him navigate the later rounds and potential trades)*

I think you try to stay true to the board and then once you get into free agency, it's a little bit of the process. Probably less numbers than we have to fill than last year in terms of the 90-man. So that'll be a little bit different.

*(on three draft picks spending their entire college career at the same school)*

Yeah, I do think it's case-by-case, I guess, really. But I do you think having stability in one place and taking coaching in one school is probably a little bit easier, just in terms of—I touched on offensive linemen before, just the fundamentals and being there at one place, it certainly helps.

Welcome. Certainly an exciting day here. What's better than having one first-round pick than having two? We couldn't be more site to welcome Carnell Tate and Keldric Faulk to the Titans organization. Just two obviously outstanding football players. They are even better human beings. They embody everything we want this in this organization: Work ethic, resiliency, toughness, intelligence. They have it all, and that's why they are sitting up here today. Without further ado, we'll open it up to questions here.

*(on if he has had a chance to do homework on the team he is joining and the quarterback he will play with)*

**TATE:** Yes, since being drafted, that's what I've been doing, watching videos of all the guys here. Great group of guys here, great coaches, great players. Just getting familiar with the players and the coaches.

*(on maximizing Keldric Faulk's measurables as a coaching staff)*

**SALEH:** Knock-on-wood, we've had a lot of history with guys with his skill set from Arik Armstead to a guy — a gentleman who is here now, with John Franklin-Myers. We drafted Mykel Williams a year ago. We know exactly what's going to be great with him, how to utilize his strengths, if you will. But the sky is the limit for this young man. He's young. There's a lot of football he's got to learn but we're excited to have him.

*(on the different ways to use Keldric Faulk on the defensive front)*

**SALEH:** Yeah, we're going to roll eight or nine on game day, and we roll them pretty good. We try to keep our guys around 60 percent play time, at max. Keep them fresh. Keep them rolling. We see him outside on early downs and kick him inside on pass downs. And we think he's got an elite trait to rush the passer on the inside, and combination between him, Jeffery (Simmons), John Franklin-Myers, I mean, that's a pretty lethal combination between the three of them. We'll find different ways to get them all on the field.

*(on the plan for rotating defensive linemen, particularly at the outside rush position)*

**SALEH:** For sure. One, that's why Aaron Whitecotton gets paid so much money. In all seriousness, I know the two obvious ones are Jacob Martin and Jermaine (Johnson II), but I think a lot of people are forgetting about Femi (Oladejo). He was drafted last year. He's a talented young man. We're going to do our best to give him every opportunity to be successful as a wide-nine edge rusher on third down. We feel really good about the rotation that's being built here. I think Borgo (Mike Borgonzi) has done a great job collecting of group of men that have different skillsets and have versatility to them. Look, when you guys start watching us, you'll start seeing what we do third down-wise with regards to our alignments and all the different fronts that we create to try to create one-on-ones and mismatches. So with regards to the complexity of it, it is complex trying to get all these guys on the field. But it's something that we're very comfortable with, and something we've done in our past and something we'll continue to do.

*(on what the last 24 hours have been like and going through this process together)*

**FAULK:** The last 24 hours, they've kind of been a little hectic. Mostly exciting, though, just because I get to start a new part of my journey. It's really been exciting. Came in the building today to get to know some of the great people in this building, and I brought my family down here, so they get to witness it, as well. So, it's been great.

**TATE:** Like Keldric (Faulk) said, it's been hectic the past 24 hours. This is all we've ever worked for. We are very appreciative of the Titans organization for them believing in us, and also it wouldn't be without our parents and our family that got us this far. We appreciate them all and we appreciate the Titans organization for bringing us in.

*(on how his versatility as a receiver will help him in the pros and his excitement to work with Greg Lewis and Calvin Ridley)*

**TATE:** Playing different roles in the offense will allow me to thrive and just allow me to understand the concepts that way if any guy goes down, I can move and go to a different position. That just shows how versatile I am, and also with these guys up here, if they are putting me in a position to go in the slot, I'm ready for it. I've seen that look.

*(on his interaction with Cam Ward upon arriving to the facility)*

**TATE:** It was a fun interaction. Cam (Ward) is a great guy, elite quarterback, great guy. I grew up watching him. I watched him at Washington State. We can't wait to get out there and light it up together.

*(on if they have looked at the offense and defense they are joining and what they can contribute)*

**TATE:** I just got done watching a few plays today. Wherever the coaches need me to go out there and play, I think that's where I fit in. Whatever they ask for me, I'll give my all and go out there and do it.

**FAULK:** The first thing that popped out to me was that everybody play fast and violent. We set edges hard, and we play fast and we play violent. That's the thing that popped out to me the most. I feel like I could play a lot of the positions across the D-Line, like Coach said on early downs like first and second on the edge, and having that ability to go inside on third downs, is where I see myself for sure.

*(on Brian Hartline's impact on him and Ohio State receivers)*

**TATE:** Coach (Brian) Hartline did a great job with us, a phenomenal job with all the receivers that came out of Ohio State. Obviously from Ohio, grew up an Ohio State fan, played at Ohio State and played at the highest level. All he did was pure his experience to us and allowed us to thrive and translate to the next level, and he also harped on details. Like little things with Coach Hartline that gets you to the next level, and he's always big on that and always big on getting better.

*(on what he emphasized to make the leap he made from his sophomore to junior year)*

**TATE:** It was ultimately a mindset change to go out there. This is the year I had set for myself to go out there and ultimately declare for the Draft. Just go out there and show everybody who I think I am.

*(on what allows him to be able to excel at the outside as well as on the inside)*

**FAULK:** Really just my length. My length has given me the ability to just go down there and hold my own on the inside. Set edges when I'm on the edge. And then it's just the power that I bring behind it. So my length and power just help me do both of them really well.

*(on Keldric Faulk's versatility and how they can deploy him)*

**SALEH:** The other part, too, and he didn't mention his short area quickness and his foot speed is really, really good for a man of his size, which is why kicking inside, when you bring that combination of power, length and then the foot speed and short area quickness, that's a really, really tough down for a guard, which is why we think he can win in there more consistently if we can get him going on reps.

*(on what he can do better at the next level)*

**FAULK:** Yeah, one of the things was rush the passer better. I mean, I had too many pressures and not enough sacks. Too many times where I got to the quarterback and didn't finish that play. So like I said, it's just so much room that I have in that. It's a small thing but it's a huge thing in my mind. Like that's the next — that's the next 10 to 20 percent that I need to get, and from there, it's just refining everything that I already have and making sure that I perfect them. You know, take some time but I'm perfecting myself for sure.

*(on when the NFL became a dream for them)*

**TATE:** It became a dream my eighth grade year. That's when I made the transition to receiver fully on, and from there, I fell in love with the game. I knew I could have fun and go and do great things with it. That's when I fell in love with it and had dreams of playing in the NFL.

**FAULK:** I kind of fell in love with it going into my eighth-grade year. Got my first offer going into the eighth grade, and then shoot, from there, it's just like, what else can I do with it? And then I figured why not take all the way? So I'm taking it all the way.

*(on which school made his first offer)*

**FAULK:** It was UAB.

*(on what about the two first round picks makes them foundational pieces for the future)*

**BORGONZI:** A lot of the stuff I talked about. Obviously, they are very talented. That's why they are being taken in the first round. But another part of that is, all these guys have to develop no matter where they are taken, and what — how can they get to their ceiling as a player. And like I said, they embody everything that takes them to the next level in their game. It's their work ethic, their commitment to being the best, to film watching. It's a lot of stuff that we uncovered with our scouts, really, going into school and talking with people and what they are all about. So that's why we are very confident that they are going to be able to contribute.

*(on the production of Tate and Faulk in college and projection of their potential in the NFL)*

**BORGONZI:** I think you're always looking for, obviously, the upside. Every position is different no matter what position they are playing or what the scheme is and the talent. You know, we certainly think they are going to be very productive at this level. You know, Keldric (Faulk) has just talked about it, things that he can improve in his came, and Carnell (Tate) has played — he's gotten better every year, and he's played with some pretty

good receivers at Ohio State, as well. But that's part of when you're going through the whole process and scouting is projecting, too. We feel like these two guys are going to be high-level production pieces in the NFL for us.

**SALEH:** Same thing. Production, that's part of the evaluation but it's not the entire evaluation. You're always looking at circumstance. You're always looking at situation, and these two young men are going to produce in this league. I'm sure you can make an argument for Carnell (Tate) that every opportunity that he got, he took advantage of it. It's not his fault that they are blowing teams out in the first half and they are only playing half a game, you know. So you can make all kinds of — pinpoint all those things but the fact of the matter is these are two extremely talented young men, and they are going to be very, very productive in this league.

*(on how the coaching staff landed on Carnell Tate at the fourth pick)*

**SALEH:** Well, not to say it's the most important piece but he's a pretty damn important piece, and that's the quarterback and doing everything we can to help him and surround him with players who can get the ball in their hand and go score. So Carnell (Tate) is obviously by far the top receiver on our board, and so when we got to 4, it was a very easy decision to make.

*(on how much these players' youth was a part of the evaluation)*

**BORGONZI:** Yeah, I think that can be, certainly, a part of it. These guys were 20 years old last year playing, and so that's certainly part of it. We think there's obviously room to grow with every player that enters the league. They have to develop more. Certainly with these guys, they have a lot of potential here to get even better than they are right now for sure.

*(on how he can bring explosiveness to this offense)*

**TATE:** The same way I brought explosiveness at the collegiate level. Just going out there and making the most of my opportunities and showing the team that they can trust me and put the ball in my hands more and more.

*(on the receivers he has modeled himself after and how he describes his mentality)*

**TATE:** All do I is watch football. So I've watched Davante Adams a lot, Stefon Diggs and C-Rid (Calvin Ridley), who is here. The mentality of football is just go out there, make the most of it, and just what happens when the ball comes your way. Either you make the play or you don't.

*(on his ability to contort his body to make contested catches)*

**TATE:** Just comes from the mindset of just going out there, when the ball comes your way, just go out there and go get the ball. When the ball is in the air, the team is depending you to go out there and go make that play. So, by any means, you have to go out there and make that play for the team.

*(on why that question made him laugh)*

**TATE:** It was just a different way to put it, the question, that's it.

*(on how he benefited from the Ohio State receivers pushing each other)*

**TATE:** We take that very personal at Ohio State. Like I said, I'm thankful for the ones that came before me that allow me to be on the path I am today. The older guys paved the way for the younger guys, so I'm thankful for them.

And also, we just learned from each other, whether that's different moves to run on the field or even just off the field, how each guy had their own routine. So just learning from each other and perfecting our own routine.

*(on press coverage)*

**TATE:** Yeah, press. In the NFL, in the league, you just have to know to win on one-on-one coverages. That's all it's about. You have to take that very personal. The team is going to rely on you to go out there and win that one-on-one matchup with the top corner on the other side of you. That's very personal, and the biggest thing in the league is, can you win one-on-one coverage, so yeah.

*(on if they knew each other before last night and what it's like knowing they are in this together moving forward)*

**FAULK:** Shoot, I seen him one time before. We shot basketball together but that's about it. The plane ride was cool. Like, man, it's exciting. Like to have this kind of caliber player get drafted in the first round with me is a blessing in itself, and I can't wait to get to know him and you know get to be a teammate for him.

**TATE:** Yeah, that's how we met. We met on a little trip. He carried me in basketball. We was out there shooting, and I was out there disappointing him. From there, we just chopped it up.

*(on if he played basketball in high school)*

**FAULK:** I did.

*(on if they played one-on-one basketball)*

**FAULK:** Oh, no, no, no. We ain't doing that.

*(on Faulk's comments that he wasn't very familiar with the NFL and how much that transparency fits the culture of what they want to build)*

**SALEH:** For sure, that's a good one. Transparency is everything. Communication is everything. Being able to speak your mind and have confidence that you can walk right into your coach's office and tell him what's on your mind and try to nip whatever negativity is flowing through your head. Try to get it out and get it solved. They are both extremely young, which is awesome. They both haven't even scratched the surface of what we think they are capable of, and Mike (Borgonzi) hit it on the head in his opening statement. These two are elite character men who have elite work ethic, and they are going to find a way to get better. They are going to maximize who they are.

#### GM MIKE BORGONZI

We wrapped up today with five more picks. First, I want to thank everybody in the organization for the past few days here. It's really more than three days. It's an entire year, especially with our scouts, all the time that they put in on the road away from their families. They are really the lifeblood here scouting these players. To all the people in the building, in our department, personnel department, the coaches that put so much time and energy into evaluating these guys, and communication I thought was really good between the personnel department and the coaching. Then just our entire support staff, our medical, we bring these guys in on 30 visits, there's a lot of different touchpoints with everybody in the building. Strength coaches, trainers, dietitians. Ev (Evert Geerlings) sits down with them, too. He'll give us his evaluation. There's so much time that's put into it for these three days, but I really appreciate all the work that they have given us here.

*(on how quickly he pictures Pat Coogan and Fernando Carmona Jr. getting in the mix at offensive line and competing to start)*

Yeah, I mean, listen, these guys have played a lot of football, both of them. They really do fit the definition of how we say, like, the tough, smart, dependable. They epitomize it, those two guys. Like I said, they've had a snaps here in college football. Physically where they're at right now, the size, I think they can come right in here and compete.

*(on how their experience can benefit them in getting ready to compete right away)*

I think there's a maturation to it, especially with the O-linemen. They've played so much, and they've been around probably a lot of different coaches, both guys. Fernando (Carmona Jr.) was at San Jose State and went to Arkansas. Then Pat (Coogan) was at Notre Dame and then finished his season for the National Champs (Indiana). Yeah, so they've played a lot of football, so I think that does help.

*(on a brief summary of all five picks)*

Yeah, I'll take Fernando (Carmona Jr.) first. Like I just said, the intangibles part with these guys. They're gritty. We have these alpha tags for leadership for these offensive linemen. Both him and Pat (Coogan) both have that. Fernando played left tackle at San Jose State, played some tackle in '24 at Arkansas and then played guard. Also has the capability of playing center, too. Just hasn't done it much in a game but done it in practice before. With Pat, you know, Pat obviously played center at Indiana this past year. I've never seen a guy get an MVP as an offensive lineman in the Rose Bowl. It just speaks to the type of player he was there for them, the leadership, and Pat has also played some guard at Notre Dame as well. With Nick (Singleton), I mean, Nick was a highly productive running back at Penn State. Played a lot of snaps there, too. He basically started there four years. It's funny, I remember turning on the film—I forget who I was watching at Penn State, a couple of years ago. It might have been two, three years ago, and I see this No. 10. He runs really angry, and he's fast, and he can catch

the ball. There was a guy we had in Kansas City, (Isiah) Pacheco, he kind of reminded me of him a little bit. So, I feel like I've been watching him a long time. And then with Jaren (Kanak), he was really interesting because you talk about an athlete. I mean, the guy was a linebacker for three years and hadn't even played tight end and picked it up. He's played H-back, he's moved around, has played full back a little bit. Really athletic, really good special teams player. So, he's going to I think contribute there right away on teams. Jackie (Marshall), the first time you saw him, I kind of watched a little bit of him last year. He's played five-technique. He's played three-technique, so I think he's versatile. He's explosive on contact. He's twitchy. We see him here, he can probably play a little big end, but probably inside as a DT for us. Coach Aaron Whitecotton actually had him at the East-West and coached him in that game, and our scouts got to visit with him there. Then Aaron actually was at his pro day and worked him out too. We've had a lot of different touchpoints with him.

*(on balancing lacking athleticism with the intangibles on the offensive line)*

Sometimes with these guys—that's a good question because the toughness part always shows up. That's the intangibles part. They're usually strong, they're tough, they're smart. Sometimes they're so smart, sometimes they know some of their limitations as well, they're so technically sound. So when you have some of these guys playing next to each other, they're kind of the same way. They make up sometimes for whatever limitations they might have with their toughness and their technique and fundamentals.

*(on where he envisions Jackson Slater playing right now)*

Right now, obviously with the new staff, he's playing both. He's going back and forth between guard and center. He's played probably more guard primarily right now, but he also has some center snaps. Those guys will be interchangeable here throughout OTAs and training camp, too.

*(on Nick Singleton's injury and if he adds something to the running back room that wasn't there)*

You know, I think he's a bigger back. He's probably a little — you know, he's a little bigger than Tony (Pollard). The speed, he actually catches the ball really well out of the back field too. As far as the injury, yeah, he should be — I don't want to put a timetable, but when he comes in here, we'll take a look. He'll be participating here in the spring.

*(on if they will need to cut some players to have a bigger undrafted class)*

Those are the things we're working on here throughout the week, tonight and really throughout the week, because technically all these guys — I know you might hear some stuff on Twitter and all that stuff. None of these guys can really be signed until they walk in the building.

*(on if he expects to have a regular-sized undrafted class)*

We'll see how it shakes out, yeah.

*(on when the rookies will be in the building)*

They'll be back --- today is (Saturday) — the end of the week, yeah.

I do. I think that's the goal. Obviously, you want to take the best player, but you're trying to marry up value with need as a part of that without reaching for the need, and that's why I always say just take the best player, let's not just reach for a guy just because we need. But I do think we did fill some needs, yeah.

*(on if they are targeting undrafted players to fill holes they missed in the draft or to add value to the current draft class)*

Yeah, I think it's an extension of really the draft class. I wish we could have 20 picks sometimes.

*(on what it says that they did not draft a defensive back)*

Yeah, I mean, obviously we added (Cor'Dale) Flott and Alontae (Taylor) too to come in here and start and then having Marcus (Harris) back and signed Tony (Adams) as well. When the draft is over, we're still working here on trying to improve the roster. It's never going to stop. Whether it's waiver claims, try-outs, it doesn't stop. We're going to continue at every position to keep working, try to get the best 53 here by the start of the season.

*(on the tributes to coach Dave McGinnis around the league during the Draft)*

I thought it was a great tribute to him and to how many people—he really had an impact on in the league. You know, the more you find out—he knew everybody throughout the league, it seems like. I thought it was really special to see us wear these shirts here today and some of the pins that everybody was wearing throughout the draft. It was a great tribute to him.

## **TITANS SELECT WR CARNELL TATE IN FIRST ROUND OF THURSDAY'S NFL DRAFT**

PITTSBURGH – Carnell Tate wasn't sure where he'd be picked when he decided to make the trip to the Steel City for the NFL Draft.

The Ohio State receiver said his only expectation was to be picked in the first round, although draft analysts suspected he wouldn't have to wait too long before his name was called.

The Titans surprised Tate by picking him fourth overall in the first round here on Thursday night, which admittedly even surpassed his hopes.

With a smile, Tate said he wants to prove the Titans right for valuing him.

"I'm very excited, I'm very humbled, and I'm very thankful to the Titans organization for believing in me," Tate said after being picked. "It makes me very excited. The team believes in me, and they trust in me to improve the organization."

Tate (6-2, 192) caught 121 passes for 1,872 yards with 14 touchdowns in three seasons at Ohio State while playing in 39 games, with 27 starts. He caught 51 passes for 875 yards (17.2-yard average) and nine touchdowns in 2025.

Tate was a second-team Associated Press All-American in 2025, and a first-team All-Big Ten Conference performer.

In Tennessee, he wants to establish himself like he did in college.

"Just going out there and earning the team's trust," Tate said. "Going out there and making plays and being a reliable target for the organization.

"I'm ready to go play fast and play violent and earn the trust of the organization. I am thankful for the organization and I'm going to bring it all to the table."

Tate was a playmaker for the Buckeyes, where he started 15 games for the school's national championship team in 2024. Tate followed up that season with another big year, and after running a 4.53 at the NFL Combine, his draft stock was solidified even more.

Tate led the country with five receiving touchdowns with a throw depth of 40-plus yards in 2025, per Pro Football Focus. Per PFF, he also led the Big 10 with six receiving touchdowns on contested targets.

During the pre-draft process, Tate made a visit to Nashville to meet with the Titans, when he had lunch with quarterback Cam Ward and offensive coordinator Brian Daboll.

"I talked to Cam, a great conversation with G-Lew (receivers coach Greg Lewis), Brian Daboll, Coach (Robert) Saleh," Tate said. "It was great.

"G-Lew is my guy. ... I chopped it up with Cam a little bit, too, he just wished me well. I was able to sit down with him during lunch, and also coach Daboll. He believes in his guys, and he ultimately believes in me. I am thankful for him, and he is a great OC, great play-caller."

Tate hopes to make a difference in Tennessee, alongside Ward and others.

Tate is scheduled to fly to Nashville on Friday morning, and he'll be introduced at a press conference on Friday afternoon.

"I know Cam is one of the elite quarterbacks in the league," Tate said, "and he's only continuing to get better.

"I'm looking forward to (the next step). I'm looking forward to going out there and making plays and helping the organization."

## **TITANS SELECT AUBURN EDGE KELDRIC FAULK AFTER TRADING BACK INTO THE FIRST ROUND**

PITTSBURGH – Keldric Faulk was here in the green room on Thursday night, waiting.

The first round of the NFL Draft was nearing a conclusion, and the Auburn edge rusher thought his patience might be tested into Friday.

The Titans changed that, however, when they moved into the back of the first round to get Faulk, snagging him with the 31st overall pick.

"It feels great," Faulk said after being picked. "I (saw) the number come up (on my phone) and it said Titans on the bottom, and I said, "Shoot, I know who it is now. ... When I first got the call, everybody started jumping and hollering, it kind of startled me."

The Titans traded with the Bills to get the pick. In doing so, the Titans received Faulk with the 31st pick, along with picks 69 (3rd round) and 165 (5th round). The Bills received picks 35 (2nd), 66 (3rd) and 101 (4th) from the Titans.

Faulk is ready to make an impact in Tennessee, just like he did at Auburn.

"I bring versatility," Faulk said. "I'll be able to play multiple positions across the d-line, and that's just how I play. I bring a leadership, and of course I'll have to earn that role, especially being on a new team. I am excited for that part, earning my place on the team and earning respect of the guys – that's really what I am most excited about."

Faulk (6-5, 274) was a third-team All-SEC performer for the War Eagles in 2025, when he started all

12 games and tallied 29 tackles, five tackles for a loss and two sacks. Faulk last year was second on Auburn's team with 30 pressures, per Pro Football Focus.

In 2024, Faulk recorded 11 tackles for a loss and seven sacks.

In three college seasons, Faulk posted 109 tackles with 10 sacks and 19.5 tackles for loss.

Faulk started 32 straight to end his college career, and he was a team captain.

"I am always going to be there for my teammates, I am going to play for my teammates," Faulk said. "Nothing is going to be done through myself, if it's not for the team."

PITTSBURGH – The Titans hit the daily double in the NFL Draft on Thursday, getting two players in the first round.

After taking Ohio State receiver Carnell Tate with the fourth overall pick, the Titans traded back into the first round and snagged Auburn edge Keldric Faulk at 31st overall.

"Real excited about the two guys we added here tonight," Titans GM Mike Borgonzi told reporters back in Nashville. "Carnell Tate, we thought he was the best receiver in the draft. And then coming back up and getting Keldric Faulk, who really fits this defense. I mean, long, can play outside, inside. Looking back to some of (Robert) Saleh's defenses, too, it reminded me a little bit of (Arik) Armstead when he had him there in San Francisco. So, really excited about adding these

two guys here tonight. Great character guys, too."

Borgonzi had this to say about Tate:

"Well, he's a bigger, vertical guy. The route running, very efficient, his route running. I thought he had exceptional ball skills to be able to track the footballs, catch radius downfield. I think he's going to be a great fit in this offense. And you know, he's 20 years old last year playing at Ohio State. He's a young kid. So is Keldric (Faulk). They are both 21 now. Two young kids. But Tate has the ability to play big downfield. That's the one thing, all these contested catches downfield, his ability to go up and catch the football, contort his body in certain ways. I think it's going to be great for Cam (Ward)."

As for Faulk, Borgonzi said the team addressed a need with talent.

"Just looking at some of the needs and stuff, and where we had him on the board, he was our highest-rated guy at the time, and we thought this guy really fit the defense well," Borgonzi said of Faulk. "So, we just went up. When you see a player that you like, you just go up and get him."

## **TITANS SELECT TEXAS LB ANTHONY HILL JR. IN SECOND ROUND AFTER MOVING UP IN TRADE WITH THE BEARS**

NASHVILLE – Linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. was a productive playmaker during a decorated college career at the University of Texas.

In the NFL, with the Titans, Hill hopes to make his mark in more ways than one.

"I think I bring versatility, and I bring a physical presence that a lot

of people don't have," Hill said after being picked. "I'm a guy who is going to work hard and do his job and be a great teammate."

"I am happy to be a Titan."

The Titans selected Hill in the second round of Friday night's NFL Draft after trading up to pick him with the 60th overall pick.

He's looking forward to playing for head coach Robert Saleh, a defensive-minded coach in Tennessee.

"I know one thing: He is a fast and physical football coach," Hill said of Saleh. "And I am excited to play for a defense and a DC that's going to be able to play fast and physical. ... I know (Coach Saleh) is going to develop me, so I am going to be all ears. I am ready to learn and I am ready to be coached."

Hill (6-2, 238) was a second-team Associated Press All-American two years in a row for the Longhorns.

In 2025, Hill tallied 69 tackles, four sacks and seven tackles for a loss while earning the honor in a year when he was also finalist for the Butkus Award, which goes to the nation's top linebacker.

In 2024, Hill earned second-team AP All-American honors after leading the team with 113 tackles, eight sacks and 16.5 tackles for a loss.

In three college seasons, Hill played in 40 games and accumulated 249 tackles, seven sacks and 31.5 tackles for a loss.

Titans General Manager Mike Borgonzi said the team likes what he's all about on and off the field.

"He is the prototype linebacker in this defense – long, fast, violent – that we always talk about," Borgonzi said. "When he sees it, he goes, fast and violent. He fits what we want here. ... A tremendous kid, great football character."

Hill paid a 30 visit to Tennessee during the pre-draft process, and he said he loved his connection with the coaching staff.

"I feel like it was a great connection," he said. "I loved the city, and I am so excited to be in Nashville."

The Titans moved from the third round to the second round to get Hill.

The Titans received pick No. 60 from the Bears in the second round, and the Titans sent picks 69 (third round) and 144 (fifth round) to the Bears.

As Hill sat in his car doing a Zoom call after being picked, his father looked inside the window and expressed his feelings about his son being drafted by the Titans.

"It's a blessing," Anthony Hill Sr. said. "We've been working for a long time for this, since (Anthony) was five years old. I am so proud of him, and he worked hard to be in this moment. We're blessed. We're blessed to be here."

"You have to be nasty," Carmona said. "I am about to go up against some of the biggest freaks in the world, and I have to be able to go out there and compete and get after it, and it starts by being nasty. ... I like being in that phone booth (on the interior line) and just hitting people in the mouth."

Carmona (6-5, 316) was a second-team All-SEC performer in 2025 after starting all 12 games at left guard for the Razorbacks, when he allowed just one sack while playing 469 snaps.

Carmona started 13 games at left tackle in 2024.

Carmona started 25 consecutive games at Arkansas over the past two seasons after playing his first three seasons at San Jose State, where he played in 25 games at left tackle.

In his college career, Carmona played in 50 games, with 49 starts. Carmona played tight end in high school, and transitioned to the offensive line.

"Coming into college, I really hadn't played any offensive lineman, and I really had to learn how to get that nasty mentality," Carmona said. "I remember my first two years I had to learn how to flip that switch."

NASHVILLE – Penn State running back Nick Singleton had draft caps ready for all 32 teams.

On Saturday, after being selected in the fifth round by the Tennessee Titans, he slid on his new lid with a smile.

"To end up with the Titans, I'm just blessed, man," said Singleton, who was selected with the 165th overall pick. "I am so grateful, so blessed to be a part of this organization. I just can't wait to leave my mark here."

Singleton was an extremely productive player for the Nittany Lions.

In four college seasons, Singleton set a Penn State record with 5,586 all-purpose yards.

The 6-foot, 219-pound Singleton ran for 3,451 yards in four college seasons, with 45 rushing touchdowns. He also caught 102 passes in his college career, for 987 yards and nine touchdowns. Singleton was also used to return kicks at Penn State, where he tallied 1,138 yards.

"I feel like I am a really physical back, a speed back, too," Singleton said. "I feel like I am a complete back, too, can run the ball, catch the ball out of the backfield and be able to go block, stick my nose down and go block. That's kind of my game."

Singleton scored a career-high 13 rushing touchdowns in 2025 despite the lowest rushing total of his college career (549 yards). Singleton ran for 1,061 yards as a freshman, 752 yards as a sophomore and 1,099 yards as a junior.

Singleton was a five-star recruit coming out of high school at Governor Mifflin in Pennsylvania, where he was named the 2021 Gatorade National Player of the Year.

Now he's made it to the NFL, with the Titans.

"I know they produce a lot of good running backs, and I can't wait to put my name on that list, too," Singleton said. "I am super-blessed to be a part of the organization and I can't wait to get to work."

In college, Marshall showed his versatility and he's ready to do the same with the Titans.

"I'll play anywhere," he said. "I can play anywhere up and down the line of scrimmage, anywhere they want me at."

Marshall wants to earn his spot in Tennessee, just like he earned his single digit at Baylor, where he wore No.0.

"With single digits at Baylor, you have to earn them all," Marshall said. "We do a vote right before fall camp, so spring and summer is your time, if you want to earn a number, you have to put in work throughout that time. Right before fall camp

came, they announced I had No.0. It's a blessing, man."

"All I am looking to do is come in and get to work," Coogan said after being picked. Coogan was named Offensive MVP of the Rose Bowl, representing the entire offensive line unit.

Per Pro Football Focus, Coogan (6-5, 311) did not allow a sack in 483 pass block snaps while protecting

quarterback Fernando Mendoza, the first pick in the 2026 NFL Draft.

Coogan started 29 consecutive games at Notre Dame in 2023 and 2024 combined, starting 13 games at left guard in 2023.

During his conference call with Titans media after being picked, Coogan said he loves the center position and everything it's about.

"I take a lot of pride in the center position," he said. "There's a lot of responsibility, but I take a lot of pride in it. I take a lot of pride in doing my job, doing my job to the best of my ability. The center position has a lot of roles, obviously. But it's an exciting spot, it's an exciting position, one where the leadership of who I am, what I am made of, kind of comes to the forefront. Taking control of the huddle, that was a big thing at Indiana, where we got to huddle up again and taking control of the huddle and breaking the huddle, 11 as one. I'm just really excited. It's hard to put into words, but I love the position and it's everything that I am, that I want to be and that I continue to strive for. Everything that encompasses the position."

Coogan, high school teammates with Titans first-round pick Carnell Tate, is looking forward to his opportunity with the Titans.

He wants to earn a spot in front of quarterback Cam Ward.

His mindset coming in is to be the same guy he's always been.

"I think everything that I represent: smart, tough, dependable, reliable, trustworthy, it's what this organization is about and is going to continue to be about," Coogan said. "So really just excited to get to work. That's what it takes. It takes work, everything is earned. No good thing comes easy. I think everybody knows that now, but especially stepping up to this to this league. It's going to be hard and that's good. Hard is what we want, no good things come easy. Everything that I believe I am and I've shown to be

who I am, like I said: smart, tough, dependable, reliable, every single day. I believe I fit like a glove.

## **TITANS SELECT OKLAHOMA TE JAREN KANAK IN THE SEVENTH ROUND OF SATURDAY'S NFL DRAFT**

NASHVILLE – Jaren Kanak was a high school phenom who had to wait his turn to shine in college.

When he did, after switching from linebacker to tight end, he did enough to earn the attention of NFL teams.

On Saturday, the Titans selected the Oklahoma tight end in the seventh round of the NFL Draft.

Kanak, selected with the 225th overall pick, made the switch from linebacker to tight end following the 2024 season and he became a third-team All-SEC performer last year.

"I grew up, my entire life, I was an offensive player and just coming out I was recruited at the college level as more of a defensive style player and that's what I did my first three years," Kanak explained after being picked. "I kind of got to a position in my career, in my junior year of college, where I kind of realized that maybe defense wasn't for me. I basically approached Coach in the offseason and said, 'Hey, listen I got the offensive background. I'm kind of hitting a wall here in my career on defense and I really think I can offer more to this team if you let me try out offense.' I was really just trying to find a place where I can add value to the team and be a guy who can lead us toward success. They gave

me the opportunity to switch over in the spring. They gave me a spring to try it out, and it ended up working out pretty well for me."

Kanak (6-2, 234) caught 44 passes for 533 yards in 2025 after playing 39 games on defense and special teams in his first three college seasons at Oklahoma.

Kanak, who ran a 4.52 in the 40 at the NFL Combine, was a four-star recruit coming out of high school and ranked as the 125th overall prospect in the country as an athlete after playing quarterback and linebacker. Kanak ran for 1,615 yards and 23 touchdowns as a high school senior, when he also threw for 910 yards and 12 passing touchdowns.

With the Titans, he'll look to earn a roster spot, and a role on the team.

"Getting to draft day, there's a lot of different emotions going through the day and getting here towards the later rounds," he said. "It's a crazy thing but I'm glad I ended up where I did and I'm happy to call myself a Titan.

"I plan on walking in day one and making an immediate impact on special teams in particular. Just with my linebacker background and athletic ability and understanding of the game of football and being able to use my athletic abilities to my advantage. I'm looking to be a big contributor on special teams and then carving out a role for myself within offense and being a playmaker in that sense."

## **WHAT TITANS GM MIKE BORGONZI SAID ABOUT THE TEAM'S FIVE DRAFT PICKS FROM SATURDAY**

NASHVILLE – The 2026 NFL Draft is officially in the books.

General Manager Mike Borgonzi on Saturday gave a CliffsNotes version on the five players selected on Saturday.

Here's a look at snippets from Borgonzi on each of the picks:

Round 5, Pick 142: Guard Fernando Carmona Jr., Arkansas

What Borgonzi said: "Fernando played left tackle at San Jose State, played some tackle in '24 at Arkansas and then played guard and he also has the capability of playing center, too, just really hasn't done it much in a game, he's done it in practice before. ... The intangibles part with (Fernando and sixth-round pick Pat Coogan), they are gritty. We have these alpha tags for leadership with these offensive linemen and both him and Pat have that."

Round 5, Pick 165: RB Nick Singleton, Penn State

What Borgonzi said: "Nick was a highly productive running back at Penn State. Played a lot of snaps there, too. He basically started there four years. It's funny, I remember turning on the film — I forget who I was watching at Penn State, a couple of years ago. It might have been two, three years ago, and I see this No. 10. He runs really angry, and he's fast, and he can catch the ball. There was a guy we had in Kansas City, (Isiah) Pacheco, he kind of reminded me of him a little bit. So, I feel like I've been watching him a long time. ... He's a bigger back. He's probably a little — you know, he's a little bigger than Tony (Pollard). The speed, he actually catches the ball really well out of the back field too. As far as the injury, yeah, he should be — I don't want to put a timetable, but when he comes in here, we'll take a look. He'll be participating here in the spring."

Round 6, Pick 184: DT Jackie Marshall, Baylor

What Borgonzi said: "Jackie, the first time you saw him, I kind of watched a little bit of him last year. He's played five-technique. He's

played three-technique, so I think he's versatile. He's explosive on contact. He's twitchy. We see him here, he can probably play a little big end, but probably inside as a DT for us. Coach Aaron Whitecotton actually had him at the East-West and coached him in that game, and our scouts got to visit with him there. Then Aaron actually was at his pro day and worked him out too. We've had a lot of different touchpoints with him."

Round 6, Pick: 194: C Pat Coogan, Indiana

What Borgonzi said: "Pat obviously played center at Indiana this past year. I've never seen a guy get an MVP as an offensive lineman in the Rose Bowl. It just speaks to the type of player he was there for them, the leadership, and Pat has also played some guard at Notre Dame as well. ... (Carmona and Coogan) have played a lot of football, both of them. They really do fit the definition of how we say, like, the tough, smart, dependable. They epitomize it, those two guys. Like I said, they've had a snaps here in college football. Physically where they're at right now, the size, I think they can come right in here and compete."

Round 7, Pick 225: TE Jaren Kanak, Oklahoma

What Borgonzi said: "Jaren, he was really interesting because you talk about an athlete. I mean, the guy was a linebacker for three years and hadn't even played tight end and picked it up. He's played H-back, he's moved around, has played full back a little bit. Really athletic, really good special teams player. So, he's going to I think contribute there right away on teams."
