DRAFT PREVIEW: TITANS HOLD SEVENTH PICK AND SEVEN TOTAL SELECTIONS

NASHVILLE — The Titans are scheduled to have the seventh overall selection and seven total picks in the 89th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting, which will be held next week in Detroit, Mich.

The draft opens with the first round on Thursday, April 25 at 7 p.m. CDT. Rounds 2 and 3 are set for the following evening, beginning at 6 p.m. CDT, and the process concludes with Rounds 4-7 on Saturday, April 27, at 11 a.m. CDT.

The draft will take place in the downtown Detroit area surrounding the award-winning Campus Martius Park and Hart Plaza. Thirteen prospects are scheduled to attend the draft in person and will be greeted on the main stage by NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell**. Fans interested in attending the festivities can find more information at NFL.com/DraftAccess.

Meanwhile, Titans personnel involved in the selection process, including executive vice president/general manager **Ran Carthon**, head coach **Brian Callahan**, president of football operations **Chad Brinker** and the team's player personnel staff, will be situated in the C.O. Brocato Draft Room at Ascension Saint Thomas Sports Park in MetroCenter, just north of downtown Nashville.

DRAFT BROADCASTS

All three days of the 2024 NFL Draft will be televised on NFL Network, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and ABC, including Nashville ABC affiliate WKRN News 2.

For the 18th year, NFL Network will provide live on-location coverage. NFL Media—comprised of NFL Network, NFL Films, NFL.com, NFL+, the NFL App, NFL RedZone and free-ad supported television streaming service NFL Channel—will feature more than 60 original hours of Draft Week coverage beginning Sunday, April 21.

On Thursday and Friday, ESPN and ABC will have two distinct draft telecasts, offering viewers multiple ways to consume the event. On Saturday, ABC will simulcast ESPN's presentation.

The draft will be streamed live via NFL and ESPN digital properties across devices (phone, PC, tablet and connected TVs). Restrictions may apply.

Titans Radio, including Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone, will carry draft programming across the Mid-South with a team that includes **Mike Keith**, **Dave McGinnis**, **Ramon Foster**, **Amie Wells** and **Rhett Bryan**. Titans Radio's broadcast includes Thursday coverage from 6-10 p.m. CDT, Friday coverage from 6-9 p.m. CDT, and Saturday coverage from 4-6 p.m. CDT.

National radio coverage will be provided by SiriusXM NFL Radio, Westwood One and ESPN Radio.

Senior writer/editor **Jim Wyatt** will lead the draft coverage at TennesseeTitans.com, which will feature interviews, videos, press conferences and more, updated continuously on the web, at the Titans mobile app and on all official team social channels.

SEVEN PICKS

The Titans' current picks are comprised of four of their seven original selections and three additional picks acquired in trades. They surrendered their third-round choice to the Arizona Cardinals in the 2023 draft-day deal that allowed them to select quarterback **Will Levis**. Their original fifth-rounder

went to the Carolina Panthers in the 2022 swap for offensive lineman **Dennis Daley**. Most recently, the Titans sent their seventh-round selection to the Cleveland Browns for offensive lineman **Leroy Watson IV**.

The Titans own their original sixth-rounder, but only after dealing it to the Philadelphia Eagles in 2022 for defensive back **Ugo Amadi** and then reacquiring it in the 2023 trade that included safety **Kevin Byard**.

The Titans also gained a fifth-rounder from Philadelphia in the Byard deal, a sixth-rounder from Philadelphia in the Amadi swap, and a seventh-rounder from Kansas City as part of the 2024 offseason trade for cornerback **L'Jarius Sneed**.

This year the Titans did not receive any of the NFL's 32 compensatory picks that are awarded in Rounds 3-7 based on net unrestricted free agency losses a year ago.

Teams are permitted to trade any pick, including compensatory selections.

THE SEVENTH OVERALL PICK

In determining draft order, non-playoff clubs select first through 18th, according to the reverse order of their standing (i.e., the team with the lowest winning percentage receives the first pick, the team with the second-lowest winning percentage receives the second pick, etc.). Playoff teams select 19th through 32nd based on their level of advancement in the postseason.

Ties in the draft order are broken by figuring the aggregate won-lost-tied percentage of each involved club's regular season opponents (strength of schedule) and awarding preferential selection order to the club which faced the schedule of teams with the lowest aggregate won-lost-tied percentage. If ties still exist, the divisional, conference or interconference tie-breaking methods are applied, whichever is applicable.

Clubs involved in two-club ties alternate positions from round-to-round. In ties that involve three or more clubs, the club at the top of a tied segment in a given round will move to the bottom of the segment for the next round, while all other clubs in the segment move up one position. This rotation continues throughout the draft.

The Titans were one of two teams with a 6-11 record in 2023, along with the New York Giants. The Giants had a .512 strength of schedule in 2023, while the Titans finished with a .522 strength of schedule. As a result, the Giants own the sixth overall choice in the first round, and the Titans pick seventh. In the second round, the Titans move to the sixth slot (38th overall), while the Giants pick seventh (39th overall). They will rotate positions throughout the remainder of the draft.

Since 1967, when the NFL and AFL agreed to a "common draft," the Titans/Oilers have never had the seventh overall draft pick. They did have the seventh pick in the 1962 AFL Draft and took Howard Payne University defensive tackle **Ray Jacobs**.

The seventh pick of the 2023 NFL Draft was Texas Tech defensive end **Tyree Wilson**, who was taken by the Las Vegas Raiders. As a rookie, Wilson appeared in all 17 games and registered 3.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

The recent list of players selected seventh overall also includes tackle **Penei Sewell** (2021, Detroit), defensive tackle **Derrick Brown** (2020, Carolina), outside linebacker **Josh Allen** (2019, Jacksonville), quarterback **Josh Allen** (2018, Buffalo), defensive lineman **DeForest Buckner** (2016, San Francisco), wide receiver **Mike Evans** (2014, Tampa Bay) and running back **Adrian Peterson** (2007, Minnesota).

In 57 drafts in the common draft era, there have been 26 total No. 7 overall picks (45.6 percent) that have gone on to make at least one Pro Bowl. The list includes two members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame: defensive lineman **Bryant Young**, who was selected seventh overall by the San Francisco 49ers in 1994, and cornerback **Champ Bailey**, chosen by the Denver Broncos in 1999.

TITANS FANS INVITED

WHAT: 89th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting in Detroit, Mich.

WHEN: 7 p.m. CDT, Thursday, April 25 (Round 1)
6 p.m. CDT, Friday, April 26 (Rounds 2-3)
11 a.m. CDT, Saturday, April 27 (Rounds 4-7)

TIMING: The first round will conclude on Thursday by approximately 10:30 p.m. CT. In 2023, the first round consumed three hours and 40 minutes. The second and third rounds will conclude on Friday by approximately 10:00 p.m. CT. The second and third rounds took a combined three hours and 59 minutes in 2023. The draft will conclude by approximately 6:00 p.m. CT on Saturday with the final four rounds. Rounds 4 through 7 took six hours and 51 minutes in 2023.

SEVEN ROUNDS: Round 1 on Thursday, April 27; Rounds 2 through 3 on Friday, April 28; and Rounds 4 through 7 on Saturday, April 29.

There will be 257 total selections, including 34 compensatory picks awarded to 14 teams.

Three clubs possess two choices in the first round: the Chicago Bears (1, 9), Arizona Cardinals (4, 27) and Minnesota Vikings (11, 23). Three teams do not have a pick in the opening round: the Carolina Panthers, Cleveland Browns and Houston Texans.

TIME LIMITS:

Round 1: 10 minutes per selection

Round 2: Seven minutes per selection

Rounds 3-6, including compensatory picks: Five minutes per selection

Round 7, including compensatory picks: Four minutes per selection

COMPENSATORY PICKS: Under the rules for compensatory draft selections, a team losing more or better compensatory free agents ("CFA") than it acquires in the previous year is eligible to receive compensatory draft picks.

The compensatory picks will be positioned within the third through seventh rounds based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost.

Tennessee was not awarded any compensatory picks this year.

Teams are permitted under NFL bylaws to trade compensatory picks.

Compensatory free agents are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. The formula was developed by the NFL Management Council. Clubs that suffer a net loss of CFAs during the prior free agent signing period are eligible to receive a corresponding number of compensatory selections. Not every free agent lost or signed by a club is covered by this formula, and additional stipulations apply.

In addition to the 32 compensatory selections awarded under the net loss formula, a special compensatory selection was awarded to the Los Angeles Rams and the San Francisco 49ers under a 2020 amendment to the League's Collective Bargaining Agreement, which was agreed upon by the NFL and the NFLPA to promote equal employment opportunities and an inclusive workforce within NFL clubs. This initiative provides that the prior employer-club of a minority employee who has been hired by another club as its head coach or primary football executive (general manager) will receive compensation in the form of a special compensatory draft selection in the third round of each of the next two drafts, or in each of the next three drafts if two minority employees from the employer-club are hired for these positions by another club or clubs.

TELEVISION DETAILS: The 2024 NFL Draft will be televised nationally by NFL Network, ABC, ESPN and ESPN Deportes.

NFL Media Coverage

Live NFL Network coverage of the 2024 NFL Draft is available across multiple devices (smartphone, PC, tablet and connected TVs) through NFL+, the NFL app or NFL.com/watch for subscribers of participating NFL Network providers.

NFL Network's coverage kicks off with first round coverage provided by host Rich Eisen, Daniel Jeremiah, Charles Davis and Joel Klatt, along with quarterback Kurt Warner and Ian Rapoport. Additionally, Kaylee Hartung interviews the draftees on-stage following their selection.

NFL Network's coverage continues on Friday with Peter Schragger joining Eisen, Jeremiah, Davis, Klatt and Rapoport. Coverage concludes on Saturday with Eisen, Jeremiah, Davis, Schragger and Rapoport.

ESPN/The Walt Disney Company

ESPN and The Walt Disney Company will present the 2024 NFL Draft across ESPN, ABC, ESPN Radio, ESPN Deportes and ESPN's social media platforms. ESPN's long-standing NFL Draft tradition will reach 45 consecutive years, dating back to 1980.

For the first two nights (Thursday and Friday), ESPN and ABC will provide two broadcast options, a tradition dating back to the 2019 NFL Draft, and new this year a third option on Thursday night with The Pat McAfee Show Draft Spectacular on YouTube, TikTok, the ESPN App and streaming on ESPN+.

ESPN's NFL Draft presentation will focus on areas of need for each team, the draftee's football resume—with highlights and analysis on his playing style, technique and physical attributes—and how he will fit in with the team that drafted him.

ABC will provide player analysis with a deeper emphasis on storytelling, providing viewers insight into the draftee's background and journey to the NFL. On Saturday, ESPN's presentation will be simulcast on ABC.

On ESPN Deportes, Eduardo Varela and Pablo Viruega will deliver exclusive Spanish-language coverage from ESPN's headquarters, alongside NFL experts Sebastián M. Christensen and Miguel Pasquel. Reporter Carlos Nava will be on-site in Detroit.

PROSPECTS AT THE DRAFT IN DETROIT

Thirteen prospects are confirmed to attend the 2024 NFL Draft in Detroit.

Alabama and Louisiana State each will have three players on-site, the most among all colleges. The Southeastern Conference leads all conferences with seven prospects confirmed to attend, followed by the Pac-12 (three), Atlantic Coast Conference (one), Big Ten (one) and Mid-American Conference (one).

2024 OPPONENTS

The Titans' opponents for the 2024 regular season are set under the NFL's 17-game scheduling formula. During the regular season, they are slated for eight games at Nissan Stadium and nine road contests.

As always, the Titans have home and road games against each of the AFC South rival Houston Texans, Indianapolis Colts and Jacksonville Jaguars.

Based upon the NFL's schedule rotation, the Titans will face every team from the AFC East in 2024. They are slated for home games against the New England Patriots and New York Jets and are scheduled to meet the Buffalo Bills and Miami Dolphins on the road.

Additionally, the Titans will square off against the NFC North. They are scheduled for home dates against the Green Bay Packers and Minnesota Vikings and road games versus the Chicago Bears and Detroit Lions.

Every team plays two intraconference games that are determined by order of finish within its division. By finishing fourth in the AFC South in 2024, they are slated for a 2024 home matchup with the AFC North's equivalent finisher, the fourth-place Cincinnati Bengals. The Titans will go on the road to meet the AFC West's fourth-place Los Angeles Chargers.

Similarly, the NFL's 17-game format unveiled for the first time in 2021 features interconference matchups based on the previous year's divisional standings. The AFC will be the road conference for the 17th game in 2024 after hosting in 2023. As a result, the Titans are scheduled to travel for a ninth road game, which means a trip to face the fourth-place finishers of the NFC East, the Washington Commanders.

The complete league schedule with dates and times, including each club's three-game preseason slate, is typically released by the NFL in May.

Ran Carthon was named the 14th general manager in franchise history on Jan. 18, 2023. He joined the Titans after spending six seasons with the San Francisco 49ers, including the last two as the team's director of player personnel.

A year after initially joining the franchise, Carthon was promoted to executive vice president/general manager. His duties expanded to include all areas that impact the football team: roster control, team activities and personnel decisions including draft and free agency acquisitions, oversight of head coach **Brian Callahan** and his coaching staff, scouting, sports medicine, and player engagement.

"Over the past year, Ran has impressed me and our staff with his innovative approach to roster building," said Titans controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk upon Carthon's promotion in 2024. "Ran's exceptional reputation around the league as a talent evaluator and culture builder was a clear competitive advantage during last year's free agency and draft process, as well as our recent search for a head coach. Simply put, Ran Carthon makes the Tennessee Titans a destination for the league's top talent. By expanding his role to include full roster control and oversight of the coaching staff, our organization will now benefit more completely from Ran's unique ability to build and lead a championship-caliber football team."

Shortly after receiving his promotion, Carthon and his staff embarked upon the 2024 offseason. Their efforts resulted in several notable signings in free agency: cornerback **Chidobe Awuzie**, linebacker **Kenneth Murray Jr.**, defensive lineman **Sebastian Joseph-Day**, center **Lloyd Cushenberry III**, running back **Tony Pollard**, quarterback **Mason Rudolph** and wide receiver **Calvin Ridley**. The Titans then used a trade to acquire former Kansas City Chiefs cornerback **L'Jarvis Sneed**.

In his first year with the Titans, Carthon re-worked the roster with several veteran additions who would become key starters for the team in 2023, including wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins**, outside linebacker **Arden Key**, linebacker **Azeez Al-Shaair**, cornerback **Sean Murphy-Bunting** and offensive lineman **Daniel Brunskill** in free agency. In his first draft, offensive lineman **Peter Skoronski**, quarterback **Will Levis** and running back **Tyjae Spears** were selected in the first three rounds, respectively. Carthon also used a trade to acquire kicker **Nick Folk**.

Carthon arrived in Tennessee with a range of experience from multiple teams. In San Francisco, he was the 49ers director of pro personnel for four seasons (2017-20) and then promoted to director of player personnel in 2021, serving in that capacity until joining the Titans. In his role as director of player personnel, Carthon was responsible for evaluating the top college prospects and assisting in the construction of the pro free agent board and evaluations. He joined the 49ers when head coach **Kyle Shanahan** and general manager **John Lynch** took over in 2017 and played a part in the team's three playoff appearances, two division titles and an NFC championship in 2019. Additionally, the 49ers had nine players account for 13 total Pro Bowl selections from 2021 (seven selections) to 2022 (six selections)—evidence of the talented roster the personnel staff amassed.

Before joining San Francisco, Carthon spent five seasons (2012-16) with the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams as their director of pro personnel. He entered the NFL scouting world as a pro scout with the Atlanta Falcons for four years (2008-11).

As a player, Carthon spent three seasons in the NFL (2004-06) primarily with the Indianapolis Colts, after entering the league as an undrafted college free agent. At the University of Florida, he tallied 1,353 career rushing yards over four seasons and was part of the Gators' 2000 SEC Championship team.

Carthon was raised in an NFL family with his father, **Maurice Carthon**, having a distinguished playing and coaching career. Maurice Carthon played for the Colts and New York Giants, and he coached for New England, the New York Jets, Detroit, Dallas, Cleveland, Arizona and Kansas City.

Following his playing career, Ran Carthon received his bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Florida in 2008. As a member of the Rams (2013) and 49ers (2018) he was selected to participate in the NFL Career Development Symposium at the Wharton School of Business, and in 2022, he took part in the inaugural NFL coach and front office accelerator program.

Born Arandic Kornell Carthon in February of 1981, in Osceola, Ark., he attended Key West High School in Key West, Fla.

FIRST-ROUND PICKS BY POSITION

Since the team's initial draft as a charter member of the American Football League in 1960, the Titans have made 60 first-round selections, using that pick on an offensive player 35 times and on defense 25 times.

On offense, running backs lead the list, having been chosen eight times in the first round, three of which were Heisman Trophy winners: **Billy Cannon** (1960), **Earl Campbell** (1978) and **Eddie George** (1996). The most recent was **Chris Johnson**, the 24th overall selection in 2008 who went on to rush for 1,228 yards as a rookie and eclipse 2,000 yards in his second season.

On the defensive side of the ball, linebackers have been selected the most—eight times—by the Titans in the first round. **Robert Brazile** (1975), **Lamar Lathon** (1990) and **Keith Bulluck** (2000) headline the linebackers chosen. Most recently, the Titans selected linebacker **Rashaan Evans** with their first-round pick in 2018.

During the franchise's "Titans era," which began in 1999, Tennessee has chosen an offensive player with a first-round pick 13 times and a defensive player 11 times. On two occasions during that span—2001 and 2004—the team did not have a first-round pick due to trades.

In the first round of the draft, the Titans were not involved in any first-round trades from 2005 through 2015. Since then, they have been involved in five different trades involving first-rounders.

In the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft, the Titans acquired the 18th overall pick and a third-rounder (101st overall) from the Philadelphia Eagles in the trade of wide receiver **A.J. Brown**. They selected wide receiver **Treyton Burks** with the first-round pick. Then, when they were on the clock with the 26th overall selection, which was their original first-rounder, they traded out of the round to acquire multiple picks from the New York Jets.

PICKS BY COLLEGE CONFERENCE

Since 1994, the first year of the current seven-round draft format, the Titans have picked 51 players from the Southeastern Conference, more than any other conference. The Big Ten is second on the list, having sent 39 players to the organization, followed by the Pacific 12 Conference (33; formerly the Pac-10) and the Atlantic Coast Conference (26).

In 2023, the Titans had six total picks. They selected one player from the SEC, taking Kentucky quarterback **Will Levis** in the second round, and two players from the Big Ten—Northwestern offensive lineman **Peter Skoronski** in the first round and Maryland offensive lineman **Jaelyn Duncan** in the sixth round. They also took a pair of players from the American Athletic Conference in Tulane running back **Tyjae Spears** in the third round and Cincinnati tight end **Josh Whyle** in the fifth round. Finally, they used a seventh-round selection on an Ohio Valley Conference product, Tennessee-Martin wideout **Colton Dowell**.

UNDRAFTED TALENT

At the conclusion of Round 7 of the draft, the Titans personnel department remains at work. At that point, general manager **Ran Carthon** and his staff along with head coach **Brian Callahan** and his assistants begin the process of contacting undrafted players the team hopes to sign as free agents.

In 2023, the Titans initially signed 14 undrafted free agents following the NFL Draft. Six more were added after participating in the team's rookie minicamp. From that group of 20 players, eight played in at least one game, and the group collectively accounted for 65 games played and 12 starts. Eleven of the 20-player undrafted class remain with the team heading into 2024: cornerback **Anthony Kendall** (16 games played/0 starts), cornerback **Eric Garror** (12/4), safety **Matthew Jackson** (10/0), linebacker **Otis Reese IV** (7/3), defensive end **TK McLendon Jr.** (7/2), offensive lineman **John Ojukwu** (3/3), outside linebacker **Caleb Murphy** (3/0), wide receiver **Kearis Jackson** (2/0), defensive tackle **Shakel Brown** (0/0), wide receiver **Tre'Shaun Harrison** (0/0) and outside linebacker **Thomas Rush** (0/0).

Punter **Ty Zentner** also entered the NFL as a rookie free agent in 2023, originally with the Philadelphia Eagles before signing with the Titans.

Current Titans wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine**, a member of the 2020 undrafted class, is ranked fifth for the team since 1999 in games played by those who originally entered the NFL as rookie free agents with the club. Only long snappers **Beau Brinkley** (135) and **Ken Amato** (125), wide receiver **Drew Bennett** (87) and fullback **Ahmard Hall** (85) rank higher than Westbrook-Ikhine on the list.

Brian Callahan was named head coach of the Titans on Jan. 24, 2024, becoming the 20th head coach in franchise history.

"This is an exciting time for our franchise, and we're thrilled to have Brian as our head coach," said Titans controlling owner **Amy Adams Strunk**. "We went through a thorough candidate search and Brian stood out as the best person to lead our football team. I want to thank the other candidates who were part of this process and wish them well moving forward.

"Brian has a track record of success and a range of experience that has prepared him for this opportunity. His football knowledge and his enthusiasm for the game really stand out, and beyond that, we think his ability to lead will make him the ideal fit for our franchise.

"If you look at his history, Brian has been a part of a Super Bowl winning team (Denver, 2015) and another team that advanced to the Super Bowl (Cincinnati, 2021). He's worked in a variety of dynamic offenses with top-flight quarterbacks. At each step of his career, he's shown the flexibility and intelligence to make an impact.

"During his time with the Bengals, he was trusted with a number of responsibilities—offensive design, quarterback development, a contributor to the free agency and draft processes—and showed the ability to be a resource in all of those areas. As we seek sustained success and pursue a championship, Brian has seen firsthand what that looks like, and he is the right person to lead us there.

"To our fans, thank you for your support and for sticking with us. You deserve a championship team, and we're going to get there. I can't wait for you to get to know Brian and his family."

Callahan arrived in Tennessee with 18 years of coaching experience and 14 years of NFL coaching experience, including the previous five seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals.

During his time in Cincinnati, Callahan served under head coach **Zac Taylor** and was part of two AFC North titles, two AFC Championship appearances and a Super Bowl berth. He also helped guide quarterback **Joe Burrow** from the No. 1 overall draft pick in 2020 to multiple single-

season franchise records by his second year and Pro Bowl honors within three years.

Over Callahan's final three seasons in Cincinnati (2021-23), the Bengals offense ranked in the NFL's top 10 in several categories: sixth in scoring (24.9), seventh in passing (250.8 yards per game), seventh in red-zone efficiency (61.5 percent), 10th in third-down percentage (41.0) and sixth in time of possession (31:00).

From the time Burrow entered the NFL in 2020 through the 2023 campaign, he recorded the league's seventh-best passer rating (98.6) and tied for the third-best completion percentage (68.0). His 270.8 passing yards per game in that period ranked fifth.

Additionally, Cincinnati's offense under Callahan featured a trio of 1,000-yard wide receivers in **Ja'Marr Chase** (2021-23), **Tee Higgins** (2021-22) and **Tyler Boyd** (2019). Chase quickly emerged as one of the NFL's top wide receivers after being drafted in the first round in 2021. He earned three consecutive Pro Bowl nods and became the eighth player in NFL history to reach 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first three career seasons, including 1,216 yards on a career-high 100 receptions in 2023. Boyd's statistical highlights included 1,046 receiving yards in 2019, while Higgins contributed 1,091 yards in 2021 and 1,029 yards in 2022.

Bengals running back **Joe Mixon** exceeded 1,000 scrimmage yards four times in five seasons with Callahan as his offensive coordinator. From 2019 through 2023, he joined **Christian McCaffrey** and **Aaron Jones** as the NFL's only players with at least 4,500 rushing yards (4,618) and 1,500 receiving yards (1,556). Mixon was named to the Pro Bowl in 2021.

In 2023, Burrow was limited to 10 total games due to multiple injuries. Backup **Jake Browning** stepped into the lineup, and in the first action of his career, he registered a season passer rating of 98.4—qualifying as the seventh-best number in the NFL.

In 2022, the Bengals ranked seventh in the NFL in points per game (26.1), eighth in total offense (360.5 yards per game) and fifth in passing offense (265.0). Burrow earned his first career Pro Bowl selection while setting single-season franchise records for completions (414) and touchdown passes (35). The third-year signal caller also placed fifth in the NFL with 4,475 passing yards. The team's new-look offensive line came together during the season and did not allow more than two sacks in any of the final eight games of the regular season.

En route to an appearance in Super Bowl LVI, the 2021 Bengals ranked seventh in passing offense (259.0 yards per game) and tied for seventh in points per game (27.1). Burrow, after returning from a knee injury suffered in 2020, led the NFL in completion percentage (70.4) and established single-season Bengals records for passing yards (4,611) and passer rating (108.3). Chase was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year after posting a team-record 1,455 receiving yards, while Mixon placed third in the NFL in rushing yards (1,205).

In 2020, Callahan helped develop Burrow as a rookie despite facing the challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, including the cancellation of all in-person NFL offseason programs. Before a knee injury ended his rookie campaign in Week 11, Burrow's 264 completions were the most ever by an NFL quarterback through his first 10 career games, while his 2,688 passing yards were fifth.

Callahan joined the Bengals after spending 2018 as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. Under his tutelage, Raiders quarterback **Derek Carr** passed for a then-career-high 4,049 yards and led the AFC with a 68.9 completion percentage.

From 2016 to 2017, Callahan was the quarterbacks coach for the Detroit Lions. Working with **Matthew Stafford**, he helped the veteran finish third in passing yards (4,446) and fourth in passing touchdowns (29) in 2017, while posting a then-career-best 99.3 passer rating. In 2016, Stafford's eight game-winning drives were the most by a quarterback in a season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

Callahan broke into the NFL with the Denver Broncos in 2010 and served in multiple roles for the franchise through 2015. He began as a coaching assistant (2010) before transitioning to offensive quality control coach (2011-12), offensive assistant coach (2013-14) and finally offensive assistant/quarterbacks coach (2015). In 2013, Broncos quarterback **Peyton Manning** won the Associated Press NFL MVP award after completing a league-record 55 touchdown passes. Callahan's tenure in Denver was capped by the team's victory in Super Bowl 50 following the 2015 campaign. Before reaching the NFL, Callahan spent time at his alma mater, UCLA, as a graduate assistant in 2006 and 2007. He then spent two years (2008-09) as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Junipero Serra High School in San Mateo, Calif.

As a former walk-on quarterback at UCLA, he appeared in 13 games as a holder on PATs. He earned a bachelor's degree in sociology in 2006 and added a master's in education in 2008.

Born in Champaign, Ill., Callahan attended De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif., where he was a part of the school's national-record 151-game winning streak and a No. 1 national ranking.

He and his wife, Allyson, have a son, Ronan, and a daughter, Norah. He is the son of longtime NFL coach **Bill Callahan**, the current Titans offensive line coach.

NOTEWORTHY IN 2023

LS MORGAN COX

- Handled all of the team's long snapping duties for the third consecutive season.
- With 51 consecutive games played in his first three seasons with the Titans, he finished the 2023 campaign with the longest active streak of games played for the team.
- Selected as a captain by his teammates.

K NICK FOLK

- Set a new NFL record for most consecutive field goals made under 40 yards. Through 2023, Folk carried the all-time NFL-record streak of 78 consecutive field goals from under 40 yards—a streak going back to 2017.
- Folk appeared in all 17 games and made 29 field goals on 30 attempts. His career-best 96.7 percent accuracy on field goals led the NFL and tied for the 14th-best single-season mark in NFL history. It also established a new franchise record for a single season, breaking the record of 92.3 percent by **Al Del Greco** (1998) and **Rob Bironas** (2010).
- Named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after nailing the game-winning field goal against the L.A. Chargers (9/17/23).

CB ERIC GARROR

- Appeared in 12 games with four starts and led all Titans defensive rookies in defensive snaps (329), tackles (22) and passes defended (two). He also led the team in punt returns, totaling 159 yards on 21 returns (7.6 avg.).

LB JACK GIBBENS

- Set career highs with 92 tackles and 13 games started.

S AMANI HOOKER

- Played in 13 games and recorded career-high 13 starts.
- Established a career-high with 80 tackles.
- Recorded his first defensive points on a defensive two-point conversion on Dec. 3 against Indianapolis, marking the first defensive two-point conversion in franchise history and the NFL's first defensive two-point conversion since 2021.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Over his 11 NFL seasons (2013–2023), Hopkins ranks first in receptions (928), first in first-down receptions (642), first in receiving yards (12,355), third in receiving touchdowns (78) and first in receptions of 25-plus yards (113).
- Through 2023, he had at least one reception in all 162 career games he played during the regular season. That represents the longest active streak in the NFL at the conclusion of 2023 and the third-longest streak in NFL history to begin a career behind only **Marvin Harrison** (190 consecutive games) and **Keyshawn Johnson** (167).
- Hopkins became one of 17 players in NFL history to reach 900 receptions, 12,000 receiving yards and 75 touchdown catches during a career. Only five players—Hopkins, Harrison, **Jerry Rice**, **Brandon Marshall** and **Larry Fitzgerald**—reached all three milestones within their first 11 NFL seasons.
- Recorded his seventh 1,000-yard receiving season and the first for the franchise since 2020.

CB ANTHONY KENDALL

- Tied for the team lead with nine special teams tackles. He was one of three NFL rookies in 2023 with nine or more special teams tackles.

OLB ARDEN KEY

- Ranked second on the team with a career-high 57 quarterback pressures, including 11 quarterback pressures in Week 1 at New Orleans.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

- Played in all 17 games (10 starts) after missing the entire 2022 campaign due to injury. He ranked second on the team with 10.5 sacks, producing his second-best career total (12 sacks in 2021).
- Became the NFL's third veteran player since 1982 to miss an entire NFL season and come back the next year to record at least 10 sacks. The only previous players to do so were a pair of New Orleans Saints: **Joe Johnson** in 2000 (12 sacks) and **Charlie Clemons** in 2001 (13.5 sacks).
- Landry's 14 tackles for loss led the defense and matched his career high, and his 48 quarterback pressures were third on the squad and were one off his career high in 2021 (49). His statistics also included 70 tackles.
- Of Landry's 10.5 total sacks, 8.5 of his sacks came in the fourth quarter. His fourth-quarter total was more than any other NFL player in 2023 and the most in franchise history for a single season.

QB WILL LEVIS

- Became the third rookie quarterback in franchise history to start at least nine games. Only **Vince Young** (13 starts in 2006) and **Marcus Mariota** (12 starts in 2015) preceded him in the accomplishment.
- His 84.2 passer rating was the second best in franchise history by a rookie quarterback (91.5 by Mariota in 2015), and the number also ranked first in NFL history among second-round quarterbacks in their rookie season (minimum 200 attempts).
- Averaged 12.13 yards per completed pass in 2023, accounting for 1,808 yards on 149 completions. His average per completion ranked fourth in the NFL for the 2023 season behind only San Francisco's **Brock Purdy** (13.90), Houston's **C.J. Stroud** (12.88) and the Los Angeles Rams' **Matthew Stafford** (12.16).
- Against Atlanta on Oct. 29, he became the third player to record four touchdown passes in his NFL debut, joining **Fran Tarkenton** and Mariota.
- Became the first NFL rookie quarterback to pass for 300 or more yards on Monday Night Football at Miami (12/11). He became the franchise's first rookie starting quarterback to win a primetime game since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

CB ROGER McCREARY

- Ranked third on the team and led all Titans defensive backs with 86 tackles.
- Among all NFL cornerbacks, his 86 tackles tied Las Vegas' **Nate Hobbs** for the third-highest total behind Buffalo's **Taron Johnson** (98) and Indianapolis' **Kenny Moore II** (93).
- Recorded one interception in back-to-back seasons to begin his career.

DB ELIJAH MOLDEN

- Appeared in 15 games and registered a career-high eight starts.
- His 72 tackles also established a career high.

TE CHIG OKONKWO

- Finished second on the team in receptions (54) and receiving yards (528), which both set new career-highs.
- Averaged 11.4 yards per reception in his initial two NFL seasons, collecting 978 yards on 86 catches. That not only led all qualifying tight ends in his draft class but also tied with **Travis Kelce** and **Dallas Goedert** for the sixth-best average in the NFL among all NFL tight ends with a minimum of 60 receptions.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

- Won the Titans Walter Payton Man of the Year Award for the first time in his career.
- Selected as a captain by his teammates.
- With 5.5 sacks in 12 games, he registered his fourth consecutive season with at least three sacks and his third consecutive season with at least 5.5 sacks.

OL PETER SKORONSKI

- He was one of nine NFL rookie offensive linemen in 2023 to register 14 or more starts, and he joined **Nicholas Petit-Frere** (2022), **Jack Conklin** (2016), **Chance Warmack** (2013), **Michael Roos** (2005) and **Jacob Bell** (2004) as the only rookie offensive linemen to record at least 14 starts for the franchise during its "Titans era" (1999–present).

RB TYJAE SPEARS

- Totaled 838 scrimmage yards, which ranked seventh in franchise history among rookie running backs. The total also placed fourth among NFL rookie running backs in 2023.
- Finished the season with 52 receptions for 385 yards and one touchdown. Became the franchise's first rookie running back with at least 50 receptions since **Sid Blanks** in 1964 (56).
- His 20 third-down conversions, which included 11 receptions and nine rushing attempts, ranked first among players at his position.
- Returned a team-high 13 kickoffs for 270 yards.

P RYAN STONEHOUSE

- Averaged a league-high 53.06 yards per punt, grossing 2,812 yards on 53 attempts. The average qualified as the second-highest figure in NFL history behind his own record-setting 53.10 yards per punt as a rookie in 2022.
- Became the first player in history to lead the NFL in gross punting average in each of his first two NFL seasons.
- Also finished sixth in the NFL with a 43.87-yard net punting average, which ranked third in franchise history.
- Selected AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after punting seven times for 376 yards (53.7 avg.) with five kicks placed inside the 20-yard line against Carolina (11/26/23).

WR NICK WESTBROOK-IKHINE

- During his first four seasons in the NFL (2020–2023), no player appeared in more games in a Titans uniform than Westbrook-Ikhine, who logged 61 games in that stretch with 30 starts.
- From 2021 through 2023, he led the Titans in receptions (91), receiving yards (1,243), touchdown catches (10) and receptions for first downs (59).
