Signed by the Titans as an undrafted free agent on May 13, 2022... appeared in 56 games with 29 starts over five seasons at Houston (2017-21)...tallied 99 career tackles, 32 tackles for loss, 20.5 sacks, seven passes defensed, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.
