TITANS-COLTS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

DERRICK HENRY'S SECOND DIVISIONAL GAMES: This week the Titans play their second of two annual games against the Indianapolis Colts. It is their first divisional rematch of the season. They have yet to face the Houston Texans (Dec. 17 and 31) and finish the season with their second matchup against Jacksonville (Jan. 6 or 7).

Titans running back **Derrick Henry** has participated in 19 combined games in his career against the Colts, Texans and Jaguars after previously playing the opponent earlier in the season. In those rematch opportunities, he has averaged 119.5 rushing yards per game, totaling 2,271 yards and 20 touchdowns on 387 carries. Those numbers exceed the totals from his 22 combined first games against AFC South opponents in which he has 374 carries for 1,850 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Henry has rushed for 100-plus yards in 10 of his last 12 AFC South rematches. However, the two contests in which he did not do so were against Indianapolis.

TITANS HAVE MOST OFFENSIVE SNAPS BY ROOKIES SINCE WEEK 8: Titans rookie quarterback **Will Levis** is scheduled to record his sixth consecutive start this week. He has not come out of the lineup since playing and starting for the first time against the Atlanta Falcons on Oct. 29. On 152 passing attempts, he has 91 completions for 1,042 yards with six touchdowns and two interceptions.

The second-round signal caller has been on the field for a total of 282 offensive snaps. Since his debut in Week 8, he leads the team's offensive rookies in snaps, edging out first-round left guard **Peter Skoronski**, who has been on the field for 278 snaps on offense during that span.

Levis and Skoronski have been joined on the field by the four other members of the 2023 Titans draft class. Third-round running back **Tyjae Spears** (144 snaps), sixth-round offensive lineman **Jaelyn Duncan** (78), fifth-round tight end **Josh Whyte** (69) and seventh-round wide receiver **Colton Dowell** (10) have contributed on the offensive side of the ball over the past five weeks.

* Jackson was credited with an offensive snap on Oct. 29 when the Titans rushed for a first down on a fake punt.

Collectively, Titans rookies have played more offensive snaps than any other team in the past five weeks. Their 862 combined offensive plays are 45 more than the next-closest team, the Chicago Bears.

NOVEMBER REIGN: Titans punter **Ryan Stonehouse** was named the AFC Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance against the Carolina Panthers. He punted seven times for a 53.7-yard gross average and a 46.7-yard net average with five punts placed inside the 20.

In four total games during the month of November, Stonehouse recorded 18 punts and led the NFL with a 54.9-yard gross average and a 48.4-yard net average. He tied Pittsburgh's **Pressley Harvin III** for the league lead with 12 punts inside the 20.

Stonehouse's 54.9-yard gross average was the highest ever recorded by a player during the month of November, eclipsing **Logan Cooke's** 2022 record of 54.2 yards per punt.

Stonehouse's November gross average tied for the fifth-best average in any single month in NFL history. He already held the mark for the best gross average in any month after posting 57.1 yards per punt in September 2022.

Additionally, Stonehouse accomplished the following during November:

- His 48.4-yard net punting average was the third-best November net punting average since at least 1992 behind only Kansas City's **Tommy Townsend** in 2021 (50.7) and Seattle's **Michael Dickson** in 2022 (49.0).
- His 66.7 percent of punts placed inside the 20 in November (12 of 18) ranked first during the month among all players with at least 10 punts.
- He was the only player during November with a punt of 60-plus yards in every game. His current streak of five consecutive games with at least one 60-yarder is the longest active streak in the NFL and the longest by a member of the franchise during its "Titans era" (1999–present).

FOLK'S PLACE IN PAC-12/NFL HISTORY: Titans kicker **Nick Folk** is 11 games into his tenure with the Titans. He has made 22 of his 23 field goal attempts and all 17 of his extra point attempts for a total of 83 points. He is tied for seventh place in the NFL in field goals made.

In 16 NFL seasons, the University of Arizona product has scored a total of 1,600 points in the NFL with 375 field goals (449 attempts) and 475 extra points (490 attempts). He enters this week's game tied with Baltimore's **Justin Tucker** for 22nd place on the NFL's all-time scoring list.

With the Pac-12 scheduled for its final conference championship game this weekend, Folk is likely to finish his career as one of the top three all-time NFL scorers among players who came out of the Pac-12 and its previous forms, including the Pac-10. His 1,600 points currently rank third among former Pac-12 players. Washington State's **Jason Hanson** is the leader with 2,150 points in the NFL, followed by California's **Ryan Longwell** at 1,687 points and then Folk.

At Arizona, Folk made 30 field goals on 47 attempts and 79 extra points on 81 attempts. He totaled 169 points scored for the Wildcats. As a senior in 2006, he earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors.
