TITANS-JAGUARS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

HENRY SET TO PLAY 100TH REGULAR SEASON GAME: Titans running back **Derrick Henry** is preparing to play in his 100th career regular season contest. Since he was selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he has rushed for 7,996 yards and 76 touchdowns on 1,676 career attempts. In last week's game against the Jacksonville Jaguars, he rushed for 121 yards and a touchdown, and in the process, he passed **Chris Johnson** (7,965 yards) for third place on the franchise's all-time rushing list.

With four or more rushing yards this week at Los Angeles, Henry will become the seventh player in NFL history to record 8,000 rushing yards and 75 rushing touchdowns within his first 100 NFL games. He would join **Eric Dickerson**, **Jim Brown**, **Eric Dickerson**, **Emmitt Smith**, **Shaun Alexander**, **LaDainian Tomlinson** and **Adrian Peterson**.

Henry, who played in 31 games during his first two NFL seasons but started only four of them, has the fewest number of carries (1,676) compared to the other six players in their first 100 contests.

Additionally, Henry can accomplish the following this week at Los Angeles:

- With 79 career touchdowns (76 rushing, three receiving), Henry needs one touchdown of any kind to reach 80. Only current Las Vegas Raiders wide receiver **Davante Adams** (81) has reached 80 total touchdowns since the beginning of the 2016 campaign.
- He needs 131 scrimmage yards (9,162 currently) to surpass **Earl Campbell** (9,292) for the third-most scrimmage yards in franchise history behind **Eddie George** (12,153) and Johnson (9,968).
- With 1,199 rushing yards and 11 rushing touchdowns in 2022, Henry is on the verge of reaching 1,200 rushing yards and 12 rushing touchdowns in the same season for the third time in his career. He would become the 14th player in NFL history to record three such seasons and the first to do so since **Marshawn Lynch** (2011, 2013, 2014).

OKONKWO, HOOPER SURGING AMONG TIGHT ENDS: Last week against the Jaguars, Titans rookie tight end **Chig Okonkwo** tallied a season-high six receptions for 45 yards and his second career touchdown. He also caught a pass for his first career two-point conversion. The fourth-round pick from the University of Maryland improved his season totals to 21 catches for 320 yards and two touchdowns.

With 10 more receiving yards this season, Okonkwo will establish a new record for franchise rookie tight ends, surpassing the 329 yards **Ben Troupe** had as a second-round pick in 2004.

Okonkwo also has a chance to become the organization's second rookie tight end with three or more touchdown receptions, joining **Chris Dressel**, who had four touchdown catches after entering the NFL in 1983.

Okonkwo has led a surge in production by tight ends in recent weeks that also includes Titans veteran **Austin Hooper**. Since the start of Week 9, when the Titans visited the Kansas City Chiefs (Nov. 6), Okonkwo has caught 16 passes for 268 yards and one score. His yardage total during that span ranks third in the NFL among tight ends, trailing only the Chiefs' **Travis Kelce** (486) and the Minnesota Vikings' **T.J. Hockenson** (302). During the same time period, Okonkwo's 16.8-yard receiving average is the best in the league among players at his position with at least 12 catches.

Meanwhile, Hooper has 22 receptions for 231 yards and two scores in the past six weeks. He owns the third-best reception total in the league at his position, and his yardage total ranks sixth during that stretch.

In the past six weeks, Okonkwo and Hooper are the only tandem among NFL tight ends with 200 yards each, and they are the only tight-end duo with 16 receptions each.

TANNEHILL AMONG BEST IN NFL UNDER DURESS: Titans quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** has performed among the top signal callers in the NFL this season when under pressure. According to Next Gen Stats, his season statistics when under pressure include 50 completions, 706 yards, five touchdowns and no interceptions on 94 passing attempts.

Tannehill's 95.4 passer rating under pressure this season ranks second in the NFL. San Francisco 49ers quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, who is currently on injured reserve, has a 125.2 passer rating under pressure and is the only quarterback to fare better than Tannehill.

Despite suffering losses in the last two contests at Philadelphia and against Jacksonville, Tannehill's passing numbers when under pressure were 13-of-21 for 147 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions, amounting to a 122.4 passer rating.
