TITANS-PACKERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

GOING FOR SEVEN STRAIGHT WITH THREE SACKS AND AN INTERCEPTION: In last week's game against the Denver Broncos, the Titans defense registered a season-high six sacks and an interception. It marked the sixth consecutive game in which the Titans accumulated at least three sacks and an interception, dating back to Oct. 2 at Indianapolis.

With three more sacks and an interception this week at Green Bay, the Titans would become only the fourth team since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to do so in seven straight games within a season. The Colts had an eight-game streak in 1975, followed by Washington in 1984 (seven games) and Chicago in 1985 (seven). The last team to record a six-game streak was the Raiders in 1998.

EIGHT PLAYERS WITH AN INTERCEPTION: In the final minute of last week's victory, cornerback **Terrance Mitchell** intercepted a pass at the goal line to help seal the outcome. It was Mitchell's first interception of the season and his first as a member of the Titans.

Mitchell became the eighth Titans player to record an interception in 2022. Linebacker **David Long Jr.** has a team-high two interceptions, while seven other players each have one: safeties **Kevin Byard**, **Andrew Adams** and **Amani Hooker**; defensive lineman **Teair Tart**; and cornerbacks **Roger McCreary**, **Kristian Fulton** and Mitchell. No NFL team in 2022 besides the Titans has recorded an interception from eight different players.

Since 1999, the highest single-season total of Titans players with an interception is 10, accomplished by the 1999, 2007 and 2012 squads.

18 QUARTERBACK HITS A NEW BENCHMARK: The defense's six sacks against Denver accounted for the Titans' best total in the regular season since Mike Vrabel became head coach in 2018. The sacks were part of the total accumulation of 18 quarterback hits in the contest, all without the aid of several defensive starters who were inactive with injuries, including defensive tackle Jeffery Simmons and outside linebacker Bud Dupree.

Defensive end Mario Edwards Jr. and outside linebacker Rashad Weaver led the parade with four quarterback hits apiece. Also contributing were DeMarcus Walker (three), Denico Autry (two), Andrew Adams (one), Dylan Cole (one), Naquan Jones (one), Elijah Molden (one) and Teair Tart (one).

Ten weeks into the 2022 season, the 18 quarterback hits by the Titans were the most by any team in any game.

Additionally, the Titans' quarterback hits tally against the Broncos was the team's top mark since 2006, the first year quarterback hits were tracked. In that time period, the Titans posted 13 quarterback hits on six different occasions, but never more.

TANNEHILL 20 ATTEMPTS FROM TAKING FRANCHISE LEAD IN TWO MAJOR CATEGORIES: Since Ryan Tannehill arrived in Tennessee in 2019, he has attempted 1,480 passes. His 987 completions have gone for 11,647 yards and 84 touchdowns with 30 interceptions. With 20 more passing attempts, he will reach the team standard of 1,500 attempts needed to qualify for career completion percentage and passer rating records.

The current franchise leader in completion percentage is **Marcus Mariota**, who completed 62.9 percent of his passes (1,110 of 1,765) from 2015 through 2019. Tannehill's completion rate with the club is 66.7 percent. No matter what happens on his next 20 attempts, should he get there, Tannehill will instantly take over the top spot in completion percentage.

Tannehill enters the week with a 100.9 passer rating as a member of the Titans. The best career passer rating in franchise history among qualifiers is Mariota's 89.6, putting Tannehill in position to take the top spot upon hitting the 1,500-attempt qualifier.

SIMMONS APPROACHES 50TH GAME: Titans defensive tackle **Jeffery Simmons** could appear in his 50th career game this Thursday. Last week marked only the third game he has missed since his first NFL appearance on Oct. 20, 2019.

With 19 career sacks entering the week, Simmons can join **Jevon Kearse** and **Harold Landry III** as the franchise's only players since 1982, when individual sacks became an official statistic, to reach the 20-sack mark within their first 50 NFL games. Kearse had 35 sacks in his first 50 contests from 1999 to 2002, and Landry had 20.5 sacks in his first 50 outings from 2018 to 2021. Simmons would be the club's first interior lineman to do so.

PREPARING FOR THE FROZEN TUNDRA: With temperatures in Green Bay expected to be in the 20s on Thursday, the Titans could take the field for one of the franchise's coldest games in recent years among those played before the month of December.

In the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present), its coldest non-December/January game was a 25-degree contest with the Pittsburgh Steelers at Nissan Stadium on Nov. 17, 2014. It is the only Titans game played before December in which the temperature at kickoff was below the freezing mark.
