#### **CORNERBACK CALEB FARLEY**

*(on the Draft process and landing with the Tennessee Titans)*

This process has been absolutely bizarre for me, but landing in Tennessee has been great, and I'm enjoying every second of it. I'm extremely grateful. I thank God, thank Jesus Christ, and my parents. I'm extremely excited to get to Tennessee and get to work.

*(on answering questions about his back injury through the Draft process)*

Numerous.

*(on the frustration of telling teams he was OK to play despite his injury)*

It's frustrating. You get to a point where you want a team to draft you that believes in you, and if you don't believe in me, then play against me.

*(on expected availability for training camp and the upcoming season)*

I feel great. I'm extremely excited to get to Tennessee and get on the field and get to work and get to meet all my new coaches. I'm ecstatic for tomorrow.

*(on making the decision to opt out of the 2020 season)*

I've talked about the opt out one thousand times, so there's no point to go back, but I feel great. I'm a Tennessee Titan. I'm in good health and I'm extremely excited for the upcoming season. I feel great.

*(on the Titans defense and joining the cornerback room of Janoris Jenkins, Kristian Fulton, and Kevin Johnson)*

I've never met any of those guys personally, but I've been a fanboy from a distance. I'm (a) fan (of) all their games, and I'm extremely excited to get in the locker room and bond and get to meet new guys and be a great teammate to them.

*(on where he thinks he will fit best within the Titans defense)*

My best fit within the defense is, 'Caleb (Farley), you got that guy.'

*(on going through the Draft process injured while rehabbing)*

The hardest part was being patient, canceling out the noise, waiting for the Draft. That was the hardest part. I feel great. I can't wait to get back on the field, and I'm extremely excited to be a Tennessee Titan.

*(on the level of excitement to play after 17 months)*

You have no idea. You have no idea. I can't even wait. When they called me, when Coach (Vrabel) called me to tell me I was going to be a Tennessee Titan, the first thing out of my mouth was, 'When can I get the playbook?' I'm extremely excited to get back on the field and to rep these colors.

*(on the mindset of locking down receivers in man-to-man coverage)*

I'm thinking that they're not on my level. I'm trying to dominate. I want to be a great corner, and I'm going to show up to work every day to try to make that happen, and hopefully I can help the Tennessee Titans win games.

*(on modeling his game after other players)*

I try to take a little bit from everybody and put it together as I see fits my need, as my skillset and things like that. I can't really name one person, but I've tried to pick and pull different specialties from everybody.

*(on being ready for training camp)*

I believe so, we're 100 percent yes.

*(on needing additional surgeries)*

That's completely false, completely false.

*(on testing positive for COVID-19 before the Draft)*

It could have been a false positive. I tested negative today at the hospital. I feel great.

*(on what teams were interested in drafting him)*

I knew the Tennessee Titans were interested in me, and I'm so glad that it worked out.

*(on what teams besides the Titans would have drafted him)*

Different teams here and there. Nobody really showed me more interest than the Titans.

*(on how he'll approach training camp if he doesn't receive a medical clearance)*

I rebuke that in the name of Jesus. I'm expecting to be ready.

*(on cat coverage ability and being an outstanding cover corner)*

I don't know. I'm not an analyst. I give my heart to the game. I work extremely hard, and I'm going to give the Tennessee Titans all I got.

*(on where he's going in the car)*

I'm going home to get ready to go to Tennessee tomorrow.

*(on where he was before he headed home)*

I was at a family member's house.

*(on the mental fortitude it took to rehab for 17 months while preparing for the Draft)*

For me, I leaned on my faith, which was extremely helpful to me. I trust in God. I trust in Jesus Christ. Lord willing, I knew I was going to be playing football this year, so I was excited and patient. I didn't set any expectations, and I let it play out how it was going to play out, and it was amazing. I couldn't ask for a better experience, and I'm so thankful to be a Tennessee Titan. Oh man. Words can't put it to justice.

***(on the passing of his mom and reflecting on her reaction to the Draft)***

My mother was my biggest fan. It could have went a lot different if she was here. It was a little weird because I had to be in the room by myself on the couch in front of the camera by myself, but once I got off camera and got to see some of my family members, it was very emotional. I had a great time. It was surreal. Like I said, it was everything I could of asked for, dreamed for. It was like something out of a movie.

***(on discussing the Draft with his mom prior to her passing)***

I was telling my mother I was going to be a first-round draft pick when I was like seven years old. I hope she's smiling down on me from the sky. She always believed me.

***(on head coach Mike Vrabel praising his football knowledge)***

Talking to Coach (Vrabel), I could tell he was a genuine, honest person, and that for me means everything. I'll give him everything I got. For us to be able to sit down and talk a lot of football was easy because we both are in love with the game, and if you bring two people together that's in love and passionate about the game of football, we can sit up and talk and never get any sleep. We hit it off immediately and always had great calls, and that's why I'm so excited and ecstatic to be a Tennessee Titan.

***(on if the second surgery was correcting the original lifting injury)***

I had both injuries from the original incident, probably should have got it fixed at the same time, but it didn't play out like that. I'm so glad that it's behind me, and I'm a Tennessee Titan. Let's go.

***(on his top physical and mental skills)***

I believe it's studying that week, coming in prepared, knowing the gameplan, and also being relaxed and trusting in my abilities and my technique. That should take care of itself.

***(on using the scrutiny through the Draft process as motivation this season)***

I've always had a huge chip on my shoulder so I'll stay motivated until I hang up the cleats, but looking back, I smile and I thank God because I never let the devil get me down one time in that process. This season, I'm going to reap the benefits for that.

***(on getting a procedure on the L5 vertebrae)***

I had a discectomy on L5, L4, and L5-S1.

***(on getting a procedure on the bulge on L5-S1 vertebrae instead of letting it go down)***

Yes, that's what we fixed.

### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA

#### **TACKLE DILLON RADUNZ**

*(on getting drafted by the Titans and the offense having an identity in Tennessee)*

I love it. I hope I can come in and contribute to the successful program they already have. I hope to be known. I know Taylor Lewan is the staple lineman there. I listen to his show all the time. I hope I can emulate what he brings to the Titans and that aggressive style of football to that offensive line. Again, I hope I can go there, fit in, super happy with this pick for me.

*(on adjusting from the FCS to the NFL)*

Obviously, there's faster, stronger guys, and I've been putting in the work this offseason, been putting in the work since my coaches thought I can go to the NFL. I've been making sure I've been going up against those opponents. I think I proved myself well at the Senior Bowl. I was able to perform well against those guys and continuing to get stronger, get faster against those high-level opponents is going to be huge. So, continuing to get better, not thinking that I made it at any point in my career, doing that and I think I'll be very successful.

*(on training for and exceling at the Senior Bowl)*

When I did training, like you said, I only had one game, so I flew out to California immediately after that game, went to train with Joe Staley, ex-49er, future Hall of Famer, so he was super good in my development. He was a huge testament to that, so shout out to him. I did that a lot with previous NFL players. I worked out with Paul Alexander, he was a previous NFL coach. I worked with a lot of NFL guys to get myself ready and, like I said, I performed pretty well. I think being able to bring that nastiness from the FCS, NDSU power-style football to the Senior Bowl was a huge benefit to me and I think it showed.

*(on the Titans and other teams interest level)*

There's a lot of teams that showed interest. I sparked a lot of good relationships. It was great to talk to a lot of GMs and coaches. I've met with GM (Jon Robinson) down at the Senior Bowl. We were talking about Taylor Lewan, talking about Derrick Henry's running style. I mean, built a good relationship down at the Senior Bowl, and through more of the offseason, I was able to get on a few Zoom calls with them and built a good relationship. Wasn't exactly expecting it to happen where it happened, but was definitely super excited that it did and Tennessee was always on my radar, and me and my agent always talked. They weren't exactly number one, but I'm happy to be here so it was a good pick for me, like I said.

*(on the next steps of development as the transition to the NFL starts)*

I think it's meeting teammates, getting around the offensive line, getting the playbook, getting around the offensive coordinator, getting to know the whole team, the organization. Then putting my nose to the grindstone and grinding it out and getting ready for this upcoming season because I'm definitely going to want to be one of those starting five. That's the competitor in me, and if not, I want to help this team win a lot of games, so getting into the organization is going to be the next step.

*(on staying in shape and in rhythm after only playing one game due to COVID-19)*

For sure, it was hard. Thank goodness I had the Senior Bowl to help me stay in football shape. We always say that. I mean you can always condition. You can always lift weights, stuff like that, but there's something different about hitting guys. So, being able to just hit pads, being able to train with other offensive linemen, they understand the physicality of the game, so having them hold pads for you and stuff. It's been difficult, but at the same time, I think I did a good job at it. Things showed at the Senior Bowl, and we'll continue to do that through OTAs and rookie minicamp.

*(on being a strong run or pass blocker and the prospect of blocking for running back Derrick Henry)*

For sure, so I think both my games are going to transition really well to the NFL. We are a power-run scheme at NDSU, so being able to run block. I'm able to come off the ball, and then we had Trey Lance, obviously, so we let him air it out a few times. Obviously, pass blocking, but there's always going to be things to work on, but I feel like that will transition really well. Like you said, blocking for Derrick Henry, that's going to be awesome. I mean, he got the 2,000 yards last year, and I listened to Taylor Lewan's podcast and stuff. They're always trying to get him to break that record, and whatever I can do to contribute to help him get that. I mean, he's an awesome running back. It's going to be an awesome offensive line and just excited to contribute.

*(on the challenge of switching to right tackle after playing majority left tackle in college)*

I played a lot of my career at left tackle, so just switching over, that will probably be the first challenge. I've been working on it in the offseason, doing drills and stuff with the right tackle if that is the position they want me to be at. So I've been working on both sides of the ball, switching up my stance like that, so that is probably the biggest challenge and then making sure everything you're dotting your I's and crossing your T's when you switch over. Making sure the play calls are right, stuff like that. As long as you do that, I have, I do that well, and then follow what the coaching staff tells me to do, I think there would be no problem in the transition.

*(on the level and style of play at North Dakota State)*

It's a pro-style offense. Obviously, yes, we're a heavy run team. We love to run power football. We do a little outside zone, inside zone when we need to, but we run everything under the sun there. I've run all kinds of plays with protection, all this stuff, called Mike (linebacker) ID, so I have no problem about transitioning into a next-level offense. Just being able to do that at NDSU, I think that's why we produce a lot of NFL players or starting to produce a lot of NFL players, especially with quarterbacks, and we produced two other offensive linemen. Yeah, there's a jump in skill, but other than that, mental wise and running an offense like that, I think it'll transition really well.

*(on taking the rookie season to develop if a starting role doesn't work out)*

First and foremost, like you said, I'm always going to want to start. I'm not going to speak it into existence that I won't be, but like you said, if that for some reason happens, I'm always going to be competitive. I'm always going to want teams to win. I'm always going to want my team to win, so I'll push the guys in front of me and make sure they're on their P's and Q's about that. It's going to be a competitive atmosphere. We'll get after each other. I'm sure I'll get pushed around a lot. I'm sure they'll get pushed around, whatever it may be, but ultimately, the team is trying to win a lot of games, so whatever we can do to do that, I'm sure that'll be the end goal at the end of the day.

*(on the Titans need for a tackle after cutting Isaiah Wilson)*

Yes, I'm familiar with what happened. Very unfortunate circumstances.

*(on watching and emulating tackle Taylor Lewan's game and what stands out about the Titans on film)*

Firing off the ball, I think that says for Taylor (Lewan) and the whole offensive line. If you get firing off the ball, getting that pressure on the defensive lines, Derrick Henry can make his cuts. I watch Taylor (Lewan) in the pass game a lot because he's got such good hand placement, good hand striking and he's so balanced in his feet. You never see him really leaning one way or another. He always seems cool, calm and collected when he's dropping back in his pass set, so looking at all those things. I feel like I'm going to be able to learn a lot from this whole offensive line group.

*(on the level of excitement to get back on the field after only playing once last year and the additional challenge that presents)*

Like I said before, being in football shape is a little bit different, but I mean everybody's going through the offseason. Luckily, we'll have OTAs, mini-camps to get me ready. But then at the same time, there's a positive not playing or only playing in one game. My body is super fresh. I literally have no injuries at all, no nicks and bruises. I was able to gain a lot of strength too through that because I wasn't playing in the season, so my body's in tip-top shape. It's just a matter of getting back into or I should say coasting into that football shape that I was talking about since I haven't played football, but I'd say there's a lot of positives about only playing one game.

*(on a noteworthy quality he brings to the Titans)*

Throughout this draft, I've tried to make myself as versatile as possible. I think that's what's going to be unique about me. We talked about moving to right tackle, but who knows maybe I'll be pushing a guy at right guard, maybe pushing a guy at left guard, whatever it may be, maybe taking some snaps, probably won't happen, but we'll see. Just being able to push teammates and build a good core group there. I think that'll be a uniqueness that I bring just being so versatile. Overall, like I said, it's going to be a good group to jump into.

*(on where he watched the Draft)*

Back home in Minnesota, so just north of Minneapolis here.

*(on what the Draft night was like after his name was called)*

It was crazy. It was a crazy night. It was fun to watch. I trained with a lot of guys that got drafted tonight and just congratulating them as they went and I have a little get together with my immediate family. I saw the phone ring from the Tennessee area code, and it said Tennessee on it, and I was like, 'Well guys, I guess I'm

going to be a Titan,' and everybody's like, 'Wait, what?' and then I was like, 'Yeah, they're calling me right now,' and so it was good. Tears were shed, tears of joy, and hugs were going around. This is a moment my family's been waiting for a long time. It's a very exciting process. I'm super happy to be where I'm at.

*(on what head coach Mike Vrabel and executive vice president/general manager Jon Robinson said on the phone)*

I talked to Jon (Robinson). He's like, 'Hey, how's it going?' I was like, 'It's going well. How are you?' and he's like, 'We're going to make you a Titan with this next pick,' and I was just like, 'Oh my gosh!' trying to hold back tears as I talked to him, and then I talked to Mike (Vrabel) too, and he was saying congratulations and all that stuff and getting me down there and all that stuff, so it's all good things, it was a great conversation. I can't wait to get down there.

*(on meeting with offensive line coach Keith Carter)*

I do not believe so, maybe if I have, I don't quite recall, but I don't believe so.

*(on what led to being the Senior Bowl Player of the Week)*

Just being able to go out there and I think I was one of Jim Nagy's favorites which was good to be in for the situation, but I think going in there and displaying my dominance and my physicalness and firing off the ball and running to running backs as they finished in the end zone. I'm able to fly around and stuff like that. I think that proved to give me the opportunity to win that award, and, I mean, there's a lot of great players that probably could deserve it too, but it was just a huge honor to win that one.

*(on his current weight and playing weight)*

I might be pushing 310 right now. We've had some Mexican food catered in tonight, so had a lot of tacos. I probably weigh around 305, around playing weight. That's what I'd like to play at. Obviously, there's room for development there. I've been developing a lot, cutting down on body fat, so if they need to put a few more pounds on me then that'll be what I do, but other than that, I'd like to play at 305.

### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA

#### **LB MONTY RICE**

*(on how excited he is to be drafted and what he thinks he brings to the Titans)*

I'm very excited. I'm very excited. I've been waiting on this moment since I was a kid, and, you know, it's special. One percent of college athletes get a chance to even be a part of the NFL Draft, and I'm just blessed. It means more to my family than anything. I'm going to come to work every day and live right on and off the field and just do what I'm supposed to do to help the team win.

*(on what his strengths are as a football player and what he can work on to take his game to the next level)*

I can call a defense, I can run, I can get, I can cover. You know, I can do what a three-down linebacker needs to be able to do. I just think that in today's NFL, you've got to be able to run and hit at linebacker, and I think I do a pretty good job at that. But, you know, you can always get better.

*(on what the Titans told him to expect and focus on when he arrives in Tennessee)*

You know, I think they're just ready to get to work and help me be a better football player, and just perfect my craft at a high level and just do whatever I can do to be a better player. I think that starts with staying in the weight room and staying strong and mastering the playbook.

*(on how the defensive scheme he played at Georgia will translate to the NFL)*

You know, at Georgia we've got the most complex defense in college football, so I feel like I'm ready for whatever as far as playbook-wise, just because I'm able to learn any new defense because at Georgia we learned it all. I'll be prepared for that in that aspect, but Tennessee's defense, obviously, will be a little different or whatever. So, it's going to be important to be able to adapt and do whatever they need me to be able to do.

*(on if his NFL Draft party was low-key)*

No, it's definitely a huge party. I just had to come in here or I wouldn't have been able to do this Zoom. I'm a big family guy, so it's mainly the fam. I got some friends here, but I consider them family too. I can't give you a number. There could be about 50 people here, but that's just me saying a number. I'm not sure. I'm a big family guy so this is not a win for Monty, it's a win for the Rice fam, my whole family and everybody else that's helped me because I've had outside sources, and by outside sources I mean other families who have helped me get to this point. They've sacrificed their time and their money and their household to help me be able to be the person I am today, so I want to thank them as well.

*(on what he thinks of playing for Titans head coach Mike Vrabel)*

At Georgia I played for a defensive guy, so I think I love, like, playing for defensive guys because they love the game. It's hard to love defense because on defense you got to practice, you've got to do it over, like, it has to be perfect. It takes a lot of reps and it takes a lot of time and it take a lot of thought, and it's a process on defense, and he was good at what he did, and he was a linebacker as well at Ohio State and in the league for a long time. So, I'm glad to be able to be coached by a guy like that. I'll be able to get a lot of intel and information from him because he's already done it.

*(on if he heard a lot from the Titans leading up to the NFL Draft)*

Honestly, I had no idea. I honestly thought it was going to be the Lions to be honest with you, but it wasn't. I talked to Coach (Mike) Vrabel and their linebackers coach and I talked to their player development guys last week. So, it was like a couple days in a row when I was hearing from people at Tennessee, so that was a sign, but nothing's for certain.

#### **CORNERBACK ELIJAH MOLDEN**

*(on what he knows about the Titans and how he thinks he will fit in)*

I guess I know a decent amount about the Titans. There was a handful of teams, really, only, I don't know, I can count on one hand, the teams I had interest in going into the draft. So, I did a little breakdown of their defense over the past year. Funny enough, they are a team that, even from the jump, I told my parents and fiancée that I would end up a Titan and sure enough.

*(on if he was an inside or outside corner at Washington)*

I was more inside and I also played safety. I would switch back and forth. I would be nickel on sub-personnel. Whenever we would go base, I would slide back to safety.

*(on what intrigued him about Tennessee and how much his father influenced him)*

The first part about Tennessee, I think it was more I guess the personality of the team. Just from the outside looking in, they were always a team that did it the right way. They are a gritty, hard-nosed team in front office. They play tough-nosed football, and obviously too, Tennessee is not a bad place to live. That's the first part. The second part, ever since I can remember I felt like called to play this game. That is mostly because of my dad. My first memories are of him getting interceptions and me going in the locker room with his teammates and all of that stuff. So, it's finally here and it was a moment where all along I knew I would get here. It was just a matter of when and what obstacles I had to overcome. Now I'm super grateful to be a part of this organization and to get to work.

*(on what makes him a solid option in the nickel and outside)*

I think, first and foremost, it's just the way that I approach the game from an effort standpoint and from a film standpoint. Beyond that I think is my change of direction and my ability to read offenses and read patterns. That makes me a solid player in nickel and also at safety. I'm not sure where I'm going to play. All I know is I'm going to, wherever they need me, give it 110 percent.

*(on if he comes in with a chip on his shoulder with questions about his speed)*

Yeah, a little bit. I wouldn't say – if you had asked me this a couple months ago, I'm not really the player to have a chip on my shoulder. I more play for the love of the game. The last couple months have been challenging for me. I've had some of my own obstacles. I think I will channel some of that, some of those emotions, towards how I approach the game.

*(on scouting reports of him being a top tackler and what he thinks his top skills are)*

I take pride in my tackling. Really, I feel like (Washington Head Coach) Coach Lakes and my coaches said tackling is 80 percent tackling and 20 percent technique. I never worried too much about the repercussions of tackling and hitting bigger bodies. I've been healthy doing it. With that being said, it's nice to not have to tackle Derrick Henry in the league. In terms of what else I do I feel like I'm just a football player, and in this league you need to be able to have a very good change of direction and good speed. I think I have both of those too, along with the skills of defensive back.

*(on the challenges of creating a cohesive group since three of the top four corners are new to the team)*

That's a good question. I think first and foremost we have to know what we are doing as a defense. We also have to know what the offense is going to drop against us. I think the two biggest things are communication and trust. If you look at the best secondaries in the NFL, they are talking nonstop. I also think that we are going to get that going.

*(on how valuable of a resource his father was through the draft process)*

Very valuable. He's someone, he knows what I'm thinking before I even say it. He is always there to give me little nuggets of wisdom and words of encouragement. We have a special bond, especially when it comes to football. Like I said, he was my coach in high school and youth and then he passed me off to (Washington Head Football Coach) Coach Lakes. Throughout my own journey of football, he has always been that person in my ear giving me feedback and keeping me going.

*(on having a feeling he would end up with the Titans and his impression of the Titans' defense)*

I got that initial feeling just off of an interview that I had with them a month and a half ago. It seems like our personalities fit well together. In terms of defense, they are always going to mix it up. I think in the league you have to mix it up from week to week and attack the offense where they are weak at. With that being said, I'm just ready to learn the playbook completely and make an impact wherever that is.

*(on how much it has helped to know what an NFL life is like and how much he emulates his father)*

Yeah, tremendously. With him, and especially with other people I have been in contact with throughout my life, it's just like the work ethic and the approach to the game and really to everything in life. I take pride in every day, going about my day with intent and passion. That's easy to do when you love a game or when you love something like that the way I love football. I think if a player loves the game and approaches it the right way, then everything else will fall into place.

*(on how many other teams were interested in him)*

It was tricky just because my versatility, playing inside, playing safety and also the ability to play outside, my agent told me like 15, 20 teams. Whereas, maybe as a quarterback, you have four or five teams. I went in open-minded but definitely in the back of my head I was hoping I would be a Titan. I mean that sincerely. It's crazy it worked out the way it did. I know God has a plan for me and I'm looking forward to being in Tennessee.

*(on what it is about Washington Head Coach Jimmy Lake's system that prepares defensive backs so well for the NFL and what he learned from the older players while in college)*

Really, they set the standard for the DB room at Washington. I knew going into that DB room that nothing but my best was going to be acceptable. I also knew that I needed to get better every day and every year as well. It

was Coach Lakes. I think the reason he has had success putting DBs out in the league, I'm still waiting for one of my old teammates, (Washington DB) Keith Taylor to get drafted here soon, but I think it's just because he teaches a position not just as a corner or safety. He teaches it as one part to a bigger piece of the puzzle. We learn the whole defense and we know the whole defense. That is when people are able to communicate effectively and make plays.

*(on the Titans trading up to select him and his fit in Tennessee)*

I was super excited to get to hear the call and see the Nashville area code pop up and the conversation I had with the coaches. I definitely felt wanted and I can't wait to be a Titan.

*(on what the coaches said when they called)*

They told me that they had to trade up for me when they saw that I was still on the board and they feel like I fit into what they're trying to do in Nashville and this is such a great organization, such a great team and I'm at a loss for words right now. I'm so sorry. I'm so happy to be a Titan.

*(on fitting the Titans offense as both a slot and outside receiver)*

They definitely said that they saw the reps that I had in the Senior Bowl in slot and my earlier years at Louisville. They said that they're really impressed that I can play inside, outside at my size. I'm so excited to be a Titan right now.

*(on being a vertical threat)*

It works from me being able to run the underneath routes, me being able to run every route in the route tree. I keep them guessing. I like to say that I'm a complete receiver and not one dimensional. It keeps them on their toes.

*(on playing X, Z, or slot at Louisville)*

Going back to my first two years at Louisville, I played the Z position, which allowed me to play inside and outside, but the last two years at Louisville I played the X position.

*(on the familiarity with the Titans offense and their needs at receiver)*

I'm definitely familiar with them since Corey Davis was drafted there at first and I've definitely been keeping up, obviously, the AFC and everything. I'm very excited. I get to learn more about their offense. I can't wait until the playbook comes and I can study and dive deep down into it.

*(on meeting with the Titans at the Senior Bowl)*

Yes. I did.

*(on speaking with the Titans during the Senior Bowl)*

The conversations were positive, obviously, talking about they liked my stature. They liked how I can move at a big size, a thicker frame. They always asked me, 'How would you like us?' back then. *(on the importance of stretching the field and making big plays)*

*(on having memories or notable catches in Nissan Stadium)*

I played well against Western Kentucky. The bowl game I was sick, unfortunately, but I had a couple of catches.

*(on playing opposite of wide receiver A.J. Brown)*

I love to learn new stuff by the guys who've been doing it in the league, doing it well in the league, and I definitely can't wait to link it up with him and talk ball and ask him what works out and how is he successful in the NFL and learn. That's what I'm more excited about doing, is learning right now.

*(on players he's watched and emulated his game after)*

Growing up, obviously, I loved the Larry Fitzgerald's. I loved the Dez Bryant's. Recently I've been really involved with Davante Adams. I love his game a lot. I kind of think it resembles to my game. I'm super excited to do everything.

*(on where he expected to be drafted and what other teams were interested)*

I really didn't have any expectations going into it. I know the board and the Draft is crazy. I was expecting somewhere late day two, early day three like around this time. A couple other teams that I thought might pick me up was probably the Rams or a couple other teams that were in contact with me a lot. #### **OUTSIDE LINEBACKER RASHAD WEAVER**

*(on how far he has come from a technical standpoint playing five seasons)*

I think from the lowest freshman technically to one of the best players in college football. I just think that is due to the coaches we had at Pitt. Coach (Charlie) Partridge is the best D-line coach in the country. He just teaches technique and it's all about technique in the run, in the pass and any time you are on the field you have got to be able to make plays in the technique. With that coaching and the way we play ball at Pitt, I think I put my technique to the top compared to any other college pass rushers.

*(on where he fits in a 3-4 defense)*

I never played inside except for at the Senior Bowl. I always played on the edge at Pitt. We were a 4-3 (defense). I think my redshirt freshman year I played nose (tackle), but that was in one of our pass-rush packages. After that year, I went back out to the edge, but I know I can do it. That's one thing about me, I am versatile. I can move up and down the line. Wherever they plan on seeing me at, I think they can see me standing up on the edge or if they need to knock me down there at the defensive end with my hand in the dirt. I think they know I have the ability to do either and I will be able to do either one they kind of point me towards.

*(on how effective it was to play last season to show his recovery from injury and erase any doubts)*

I think it was a must. I may be looking at, how this weekend went, an undrafted free agent, seventh round or something later because that tape from 2018, you know, I was making plays, but it's not good technically. It's not good technique there. I was just kind of going off natural skill. Before that 2019 season, I put in a lot of work because I didn't want to be that type of player anymore. I went down, so I just continued that work before the 2020 season. Coming off the injury, I had a lot to prove, then there was doubt with the season with COVID. One of our old strength coaches just said if you put the money in the bank, it will be there when it is time to pull it out. I carried the mindset through every day. I worked out and prepared my leg rehab or my technique and my skill set just preparing myself to be ready in 2020. When it was time to cash out and make those plays, all the deposits would be there.

*(on what he feels like the Titans are getting out of him)*

First, I am so excited. I am so thankful for them and Coach (Mike) Vrabel and the whole staff. They put the faith in me to pick me. I will be ready to come there and work and make plays and do whatever I am asked. When I got on the phone, I felt like they got the biggest steal in the draft. I thought I would be gone on day two, honestly, but some things just change. We are at this point now and I have been drafted and people dream of

this. I am so thankful for it. For them to pick me, I am excited, but I think they got a great value pick in me and I am excited to prove that to them.

*(on playing with Bud Dupree who formerly played with the Pittsburgh Steelers)*

Just from him being a previous (Pittsburgh) Steeler, I've always watched him and T.J. (Watt) and they are great pass rushers. Actually, when I was out in Arizona training, I got connected with Bud (Dupree) and we have the same financial advisor now and I have been out with him a few times. I text with him. He was out at EXOS where I was at recovering from his ACL. We would chat it up and talk and we have had dinner. Me and him are a little bit acquainted and I will definitely be trying to learn from him and pick his mind and maybe try to get on his nerves. I know he likes asking me questions here and there about ACLs. So, maybe if I help him, he will help me even more.

*(on what he learned from things not going as planned)*

I have talked about this a lot. I have always been a big 'it is what it is type of person' so I kind of hold the emotions down. I just deal with it and on to the next. I think with the ACL, I learned the most. Back with the Michigan situation, I was still young. I wouldn't say I had learned it yet. I just kind of went with the flow and was excited to be at Pitt and thankful that they wanted me. I was going somewhere where I was wanted, same way with the Titans. With the ACL, mainly, even this draft, it tested my patience. My work ethic and the desire to be great stayed the same through the rehab and the recovery. That wasn't hard for me just the patience and not being where I wanted to be at the time I wanted to be, just being prepared at all times so that when my time did come and it was time for me, I would be ready and be able to show that. For me, it is about patience and continuing to strengthen my patience.

*(on taking pride in making plays behind the line of scrimmage)*

Absolutely. Even with that I always set high standards for myself. The higher standards you set, if you achieve them you are looking at an elite status and if you fall a little bit short, you are still in great status. With that 14 (tackles for loss), I wanted more sacks. I should have had at least a sack every game and I had played nine games and I didn't have nine sacks. In college those sacks count as TFLs. I just see I could have had more, but I definitely pride myself in that. I feel like I can affect every play. Whether I am the one making the play, the TFL or the sack, or I am the one taking on blocks so someone else can go make the play. I just want to help the defense on every play and cause havoc for the offense and cause them to have to plan for me.

*(on where he is best as a pass rusher and where does he need to develop)*

I am best naturally on the edge and that's because that is all I have ever played. If I get reps inside or at the three or somewhere in practice, I think I would be just as good at that. I think that I have the versatility to play up and down the line. For me, I would say the biggest thing to work on, these tall guys, I have heard it from middle school all the way through college is pad level. It is consistency with my pad level. My pad level is low. When my pad level is low my get off is fine, I have a quick first step. I get back there and I win. It's when I get high and I look in the backfield and I try to see maybe a little too much is when it really doesn't look as good on film. So for me, it is just my consistency with my pad level.

*(on the challenge of getting on the field behind Bud Dupree and Harold Landry)*

That's why they picked me. I am excited to get behind both those guys and learn and push them. It gives me something to work for and if it was easy for me to step into then it would be a little different mindset. It just gives me something to even work for and it adds to the list to work harder for. It is just another task or hurdle to work toward and that is nothing I haven't done before, so I am excited for it and just excited again to be behind those guys and learn from them and be a part of this defense. Turn it around on the defense and the pass rush. That is why they picked up Bud Dupree and I feel like that is why they just drafted me.

*(on how Pitts' defense prepared him for how the Titans could use him)*

I think that it prepares us well. That is why I chose Coach (Pat) Narduzzi and Pitt. Everybody knew what he did at Michigan State and then again working with Coach Partridge. Those two guys I am just so thankful for and the position that they put that D-line in. Our defense was designed for us to make plays. Some defenses are made for the linebackers to make plays and the D-line just to hold gaps and stuff like that. Our defense, they want us to get back there. They will put us in situations to have one-on-ones. They will put us in situations have to blitzers to get one-on-ones. They expect us to make the play. We play man coverage, so they expect us to get back there so our DBs aren't running up and down the field five seconds because it will break down eventually. I think being in that type of defense where essentially if there's no D-line our defense isn't going to perform very well, but we had a good line these last couple of years. We have been in the top of every category so I think it just prepares me to step in on the Titans defense and put my best foot forward and no matter what I am asked to do, be able to do it.

*(on discussing playing against Tyler Vrabel with Coach Vrabel)*

You are going to get me in trouble before I even get there. So I had some meeting with J Rob (General Manager Jon Robinson), Coach Vrabel and Coach (Ryan) Crow and all of them. I think the second meeting I had was with Coach Vrabel and I brought it up to him and he just laughed at me. He may have cussed at me, but besides that it was a good little laugh. He said I had a good game. His son will be a good player. He is still young.

*(on where he is for the draft)*

Actually, I am down home in Cooper City, Florida. I am at my best friend's house. I have got the pool out here. All my friends and family, I have had my best friend from high school, his parents and brothers, three other of my best friends from high school and their parents, my mom and dad, sister, both sets of grandparents. My college best friend, Keyshon Camp, who is also my teammate. I live with him three years out of the four at Pitt. That's just my go to right there. Just to have all that love and support around me and everybody that has helped me get here through the great times and the bad times. It has just been great. I don't where I would be if it wasn't for them so I am just so thankful for them to be here. They have helped me throughout the pass few days. Day two was a little rougher on me, but I came back day three and they were all here waiting just like I was. None of them ever waived or left when the nights got long on day one or day two. I am just so thankful for them.

*(on the importance of being a run stopper)*

To me it is everything. Coach Narduzzi and Coach Partridge, especially Coach Narduzzi, preaches you have to stop the run. If you don't stop the run, you are not going to get sacks, you are not going to get at the quarterback, you are not going to get to do the fun stuff, stuff that gets you drafted, stuff that gets you paid

when you get in the league. Those type of things. Once you stop run, teams have to pass, so that was our mindset as a D-line. We weren't mad or shied away from playing against the run. We want to stop the run, get TFLs, stop teams that were highest in the NCAA is rushing and have their lowest average of the season so they would have to start passing, so we could just go out there and have fun. For me, I look forward in stopping the run. When you stop the run, you are taking the whole heart and soul from them because if they can't stop the run block they definitely can't stop you in the pass block. So, when you just shut them down, making TFLs and getting in the backfield and running backs that are used to being able to get six yards a carry are getting negative yards a carry it just makes the game fun. That's when you get up and celebrate with the whole defense and you get excited to start in the second quarter, third quarter or it gets late in the game when they can't run and you get after the passer that makes the whole game fun.

*(on his experience with the Michigan recruitment and getting to the NFL draft)*

Honestly, my whole life I always thought maybe I was a pretty revengeful. Like I said, I am a 'it is what is it is type of person.' After that freshman year in college, I was kind of over the Michigan thing. It's a business. NCAA is a business. They have got to do what they think is best for them. I was excited I was at Pitt because they wanted me. When they recruited me with a week left for signing, they made it known how much they wanted me. Looking back, I always say everything happens for a reason, so it wasn't meant for me to go to Michigan. Who knows? I may not be getting drafted if I went there. Nobody knew how it would have played out. I went to Pitt and had a great career, was an All-American and just got drafted to the NFL, so I just want to be thankful for that and not think about the people that weren't to high on me.

*(on what the Titans told him they want to develop to unlock his potential)*

They want me to come in and just really learn the game and develop and be a great receiver. They see the potential in me and know I have the work ethic to be a great receiver, so that is what they are looking for me to do when I get to the team.

*(on current Titan and former Louisiana State cornerback Kristian Fulton saying he would be the next star at LSU and if he has talked to Fulton since being drafted by the Titans)*

No sir, it just happened but I'm pretty sure after things settle down I'm going to call and talk it up with him. That was my roommate at LSU, so we are closer than close.

*(on his strengths on special teams)*

I feel like it is how I use my speed. I have the size. I play with a physical edge to the game, but I know my speed is a big thing in my getting up and down the field and making those plays.

*(on how much he worked with Louisiana State Special Teams Coach Greg McMahan on perfecting his technique and integrating himself into special teams )*

Coach McMahan gave me the opportunity. He stayed on me. I always asked him questions and he always just gave me pointers on being a great special teamer because he saw the potential I had, and he always pushed me. He was the hardest on me at practice because he saw the potential. If I made a mistake, he would let me have it. I just know that was him wanting the best out of me because he saw the potential I had.

*(on his biggest strength as a receiver)*

I know it has to be my speed, me getting up the field. I have a lot of other things I can always get better at, but my strong suit is definitely going to be speed.

*(on his conversations with the Titans at the Senior Bowl and if he thought Tennessee could be a landing place for him)*

I did, because we had a conversation, and it wasn't even about football to be honest. It was just a general conversation of them getting to know me. I felt like this was a place that I could have ended up and I just appreciate the organization choosing me really. I'm just going to give it my all.

*(on what he needs to do to develop as a better receiver)*

I know me becoming a better receiver is just me getting in and out of my routes and making every route look the same. Once I get that down to a T, the sky is the limit from there.

*(on what kept him from getting the same production as the other wide receivers at LSU)*

To be honest, those guys, they are just great players. There were just kind of ahead of me and I learned from those guys and we always competed at the end of the day. I can't say that I didn't work hard or anything like that and that I didn't know what I was doing. But it was just something that happened. *(on returning the football for touchdowns and if it ever gets less exciting)*

It never gets less exciting. The more the merrier, honestly. But to describe that feeling, it's indescribable. Especially the work I put in and stuff, and the film that I had to watch to even be able to make those plays or even the drives that, you're tired, where you don't really want to push through it, but then you push through and sure enough the ball pops in your hands and stuff. Just knowing that you put in all that work and then being able to make plays like that, it's definitely very special to me and I know it's special to my family as well, to see me go to make plays like that. I'm so thankful.

*(on what contributes to having a knack for finding the ball)*

That's hard work, man. Really the way to get your hands on the ball the best is by hustling and stuff, being around the ball, being around the ball carrier, running sideline to sideline and stuff like that. That's really the best way that I was able to make the plays I had. There's a lot of times where the ball pops out and it's right there, but it's really hustle. I remember Ray Lewis was doing an interview about it that I watched one time, and he was talking about the reason he got so many turnovers was because he was hustling around the field, doing the little things right when he was tired and stuff like that, so I've always tried to do that, making big hits because that's fine. I've always done that growing up being a big hitter and stuff. But definitely being around the ball, it's all about hard work and hustle for sure.

*(on if playing 700 special team snaps in his three collegiate seasons sounds accurate)*

Every single year I played at Oregon, I played every single special teams, all phases of the game and everything. I really took pride in that. The other number does sound pretty familiar. I mean maybe not that high, but definitely somewhere around there. Special teams is something that I took near and dear to my heart, and that's really what has brought me to the position where I am, playing special teams, making plays that way, put in the hard work. But, played a lot of special teams snaps for sure. Ready to do that in the next level as well for the Titans.

*(on interacting with the Titans through the Draft process)*

I had a lot of good Zoom interviews with some of the coaches through the Draft process and stuff. Did a lot of Zoom and stuff, breaking down film, breaking down special teams as well defense, everything. I definitely had a great feeling about the Titans. I really had a good connection with those coaches, and I feel like they knew – know that I took pride in special teams and I took pride in defense and stuff like that. So, I feel like yeah, for sure there's definitely a connection, and man, my family and I, we couldn't be more happy and more blessed to say that I'm a Titan. So, feeling very excited.

*(on opting out of the 2020 season and if that impacted his draft stock)*

At this point, it doesn't really matter where I'm at. I'm with the Titans, obviously. I was able to get drafted and stuff. But the reason I opted out wasn't because I didn't want to play in the 2020 season or anything like that. I came back for my senior year, was ready to rock and roll. But being in the Pac-12, obviously, you know, it was kind of weird how they canceled our season last second. I moved out my apartment, said goodbye to my teammates and stuff, hugged all my teammates, moved out of my apartment, moved back home, was training for the Draft and everything, and then five weeks later I get a phone call from my coaches asking me to return and come back and move back into my apartment because we had practice the next day and that we had a game in four weeks, because the Pac-12 announced our season so shortly. We were on such a short notice. Really, what it came down to is like, 'You know what, it's such a short notice. Five weeks later I'm getting told I'm playing a season now?' So, I was very frustrated with the Pac-12. I know my coaches were obviously upset with the Pac-12 as well. My teammates, we had a lot of a lot of Ducks that opted out last year, so it was very frustrating. But I don't think it affected my draft stock because the coaches understood how crazy it was with the Pac-12 and stuff. Regardless, I'm ready to be a Titan and I'm ready to make some plays and get on that field.

*(on joining fellow Pac-12 safety Elijah Molden in the Titans backfield)*

Me and Elijah (Molden), we're good family friends. My uncle Chad Cota and his dad, Alex Molden, were teammates at Oregon for the Gang Green back in the day when they played in the Rose Bowl. I've known Elijah (Molden) my whole life, so it's pretty cool to be able to call ourselves teammates and I'm definitely excited. When I saw him get drafted to the Titans, I was like, 'Oh, that'd be pretty sweet to, you know, be his teammate.' Sure enough, I get a call from Head Coach (Mike) Vrabel. I was pumped. I'm like, 'Dude, I get to play, you know, with one of my lifelong friends.' So that's definitely going to be some special for us, to be able have that connection and stuff, playing 7-on-7 and stuff in high school. So, we're excited for sure.

*(on getting answers on Caleb Farley's injury history before drafting him)*

Absolutely. We had a lot of meetings with Caleb (Farley) via Zoom. Our doctors and trainers spent a lot of time analyzing the stuff and talking with Caleb over the phone, and we're super stoked to have him as a part of our football team.

*(on Caleb Farley's ability and competitiveness)*

Yeah, I mean, he was a fun guy to evaluate on film. Extremely competitive, excellent size and speed for the position that he played. I talked to several of his coaches there at Virginia Tech, who raved about him as a person and his ability to learn and go out on the field and make plays for that defense there and he really just checked every box for us.

*(on the confidence that Caleb Farley can perform as he did before his injury)*

Yeah, again, I'm no doctor, but our medical staff they've dealt with a lot of injuries in the National Football League, and they feel confident in it. We spoke to him several times and said he was feeling great after having the latest procedure, and I have the utmost confidence he's going to attack the process to get himself ready as soon as possible.

*(on if he feels the Titans got increased value drafting Caleb Farley in the second half of the first round)*

Yeah, I don't know where the rankings are, but we certainly thought he was a premium player on our board. We had a lot of good grades from our scouts, from our coaches. We watched a lot of film on him, and just a guy with a really, really, really cool, really explosive skill set that's going to help our football team.

*(on if Titans doctors were able to spend time with Caleb Farley or if they had to rely on outside reports)*

No, we spent time with him and got the medicals on him and had follow-up phone calls. We talked to trainers over at Virginia Tech that he's worked with and really got a detailed breakdown of what he's been doing and how he attacks everything, and everybody spoke glowingly of that. And, I've had follow-up conversations with our medical team several times about Caleb (Farley) because we had such an affinity for him, and again, just excited that he was there and we were able to pick him.

*(on the Titans doctors speaking with Caleb Farley at the NFL Combine)*

Well, I think there were certain players that our doctors, we had certainly earmarked for them to try to get to and talk to, and they did a great job of hustling around there at Indy and talking to the guys we kind of had starred.

*(on if Caleb Farley is a good match of best player available and a Titans need)*

Yeah, we'll see how it goes. I think we're trying to add this weekend, guys that we think can come in and help our football team. You can never have enough cover guys and you can never have enough good football players, and I think that he certainly fits both of those. We were excited when he was still there and we were on the clock.

*(on if the Titans received any calls about trading the 22<sup>nd</sup> pick)*

We did; we had a little bit going on there. We had a couple chances, but the value to move back, we didn't feel like was worth risking losing the player.

*(on if there is concern that Caleb Farley has not played in 17 months)*

No, we felt confident in his ability. There were a lot of guys that opted out (of the 2020 season) in this draft and we didn't take their cards off the draft board just because they didn't play this year. Everybody had their own reasons for not playing and we evaluated those guys and stacked those guys up based on the film that we had and the games that they played in.

*(on how the reports on Caleb Farley's back impacted the Titans evaluation of him)*

I'd say we stayed pretty much the same with him the whole way. Anytime a player has a medical condition, it's up to the doctors and those guys to investigate that and provide us with information. My hat goes off to those guys. They did an outstanding job of vetting out all the information and clearing him for us. The skillset that you see on tape and the person that we got to know and the recommendations that all the coaches and staff that I talked to about Caleb (Farley), all that stayed the same.

*(on how many positions were in play for the Titans with the 22<sup>nd</sup> pick)*

There were a couple. Yeah, there were a couple guys we were looking at, but we just felt Caleb (Farley) was far and away at the top of the heap.

*(on if he expects Caleb Farley to be ready for training camp and to contribute in Week 1)*

Yeah, we don't put timetables or expectations on that. I know that when I talked to him, he said 'when can I get the playbook? I'm ready to come in and get to know my teammates and work hard.' That's our expectation for him and he knows what that is. His work ethic was outstanding at Virginia Tech and we expect the same thing when he comes in here.

*(on whether Caleb Farley will need additional medical procedures on his back)*

Yeah, I don't think so. I'm not going to get into the medical files on him. I think whatever's been disclosed out there is what it is and he said he's feeling good. When we talked to the training staff over at Virginia Tech, they said he's working hard over there with those guys and feeling good. So, he's excited to get in here and work with our guys.

*(on Caleb Farley's character)*

Yeah, I mean this guy's...I've talked to several position coaches that just raved about his work ethic and his desire to come in and meet extra when he switched positions and learn the cornerback position. He was a guy that wanted to know the entire defense, not just his job because he wanted to know how he fit into that puzzle, if you will. So, a guy that's totally all in when it comes to football.

*(on what Caleb Farley will learn as he becomes more experienced playing cornerback)*

Yeah, I think he'll come in and learn the techniques that we teach for corner play and learn our terminology, learn our scheme, work hard at getting that down and be a good teammate. I mean, I think that's the one thing he told me on the phone tonight; he's like 'When can I get the playbook, and when can I come? I want to meet my teammates?' So, that's kind of where his mindset is right now, and I can't wait to get him here.

*(on if just one team doctor was allowed at the NFL Combine)*

I think that's correct. I don't have the medical rules in front of me Paul (Kuharsky). Sorry.

*(on his thought process heading into Rounds 2 and 3 of the NFL Draft)*

Yeah, we'll see kind of how the guys come off the rest of the night here and then we've got to weather some picks tomorrow and we'll see kind of as we inch closer down there to where we're at who's available and if we get any action to move around. We're still open to that and just see how it goes. Continue to add players that we know are going to come in and help the team.

### **HEAD COACH MIKE VRABEL**

*(on getting answers on Caleb Farley's injury history before drafting him)*

I think Jon (Robinson) said everything. We were comfortable, I think, with where the issues were and enjoyed our numerous meetings with him, interactions with him. It's just something that we'll have to work through here.

*(on Caleb Farley's ability and competitiveness)*

I think the thing that stood out to me was the athleticism. I think you see a former receiver who has learned how to play corner and will continue to, hopefully like a lot of us, continue to improve. But there is a certain level of athleticism, smoothness, a lot of fluidity. So, that was really what stood out there was just the athleticism.

*(on the Titans plan for Caleb Farley to get on the field)*

The plan is to get him here as soon as he's able to be here to begin working with Todd (Toriscelli) and continue to evaluate where he's at. Get him into minicamp and begin to meet with him, get him acclimated to what we're doing, get him acclimated to this football team, but neither his agent nor anybody else knows when he's going to be ready. We've been down this road before. I'm not going to compare him with what Jeffrey Simmons might have went through; different injuries, different players. So, we're confident and comfortable, and that's why we took him. We're extremely excited, but we're not going to sit here and try to give everybody a timeline of when that might happen.

*(on how Caleb Farley fits into the Titans secondary)*

He's long and I think that's something they did a lot at Virginia Tech. Those guys were manned up outside; not a whole lot of help and that's what they did. So, he's coming from a very aggressive scheme that puts a lot of pressure on those guys on the outside. That's what they've always done there and they've been successful. So, I think it's Cat coverage. I got this cat, you got that cat, and that's what he's used to. So, we'll get him to learn what we're doing and see where he fits in.

*(on how Virginia Tech has historically developed cornerbacks)*

Well, I think what the draw is, and there are a lot of great coaches that prepare players for the next level, and certainly that program is one of them. Bud (Foster) has done that throughout the years. They've had some really, really good defensive players. He's also a former receiver, so I think that development is going to continue to happen. They don't play every coverage and I think that's something that he'll learn quickly is to try to have probably a larger playbook, expand what they asked him to do in the past as opposed to what we would ask him to do.

*(on Caleb Farley's ability to improve)*

Well, I think (the learning curve) will probably be pretty high. I mean, I think that when you're talented and you're willing...this is a guy we love to talk football with. We've talked a lot of ball and had some really good conversations between Jon (Robinson) and I, position coaches and scouts. These were easy communications, they were easy conversations. So, talented players that are willing to play hard and willing to be coached; they have a pretty high ceiling.

*(on the versatility that Caleb Farley brings to the Titans cornerback room)*

I think we'll kind of see how a lot of those things play out as he continues to work his way onto this football team. That's a long way away, but we're excited about adding a talented player at a position that is a premium position in this league and can make a huge impact. But, to try to figure out where all those pieces are going to fit right now is not something that we're going to do. We're going to try to work with him and try to improve him and try to get him acclimated to this football team.

*(on Caleb Farley as a person)*

I saw a very genuine, dedicated player who appeared to be a great teammate. In the conversations, he was well-spoken. You know, I would say the conversations I have with players are probably private in nature, and so, again I enjoyed it. I thought the time went quickly. It wasn't something that, when we asked them to ask us questions, he was quick to ask questions. You know, sometimes Jon (Robinson) and I get tired of being the ones asking questions and so we really like to see what these players want to learn from us and what they want to ask us. So, again, those conversations were very easy.

### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA

**Q. A lot of people thought you guys might hit in the first couple of rounds, was that a consideration given the losses or were people selected just before?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, there were certainly players in those position groups that we liked. We tried to move around some tonight. We were able to slide back. We tried moving up and couldn't get up quite high enough a couple times, and that's just kind of the way the players fell at the end. But there are some players still left. We've got six picks tomorrow, and there are still some players on the board that we like.

**Q. As kind of a follow-up to that, you said there are players at the receiver and tight end spot that you like. Are some of those capable of being able to come in and be significant contributors at those positions and be guys who can be starter, even day three draftees?**

JON ROBINSON: I think, yeah, we've said it all along, once we add them to the team, we have a certain evaluation on the player and what we think the skillset is going to be. Ultimately it will be up to the player to come in and work hard, buy into our program, and what play time they get they will earn. I think that we have proven that with players that we historically have selected in the third day, guys that have come in here. (Jayon) Brown was a fifth-round pick that worked and earned playing time as a starter for us. We tell these guys, 'It doesn't matter where you're selected, what matters is you come in here and you're committed to improving and you're committed to being coached,' and we feel like certainly these guys that we've picked the last two nights are about that. Hopefully looking to add six more tomorrow.

**Q. What are you adding with (Monty) Rice to your linebacker core and why is it important to create competition with any group, not necessarily linebacker?**

MIKE VRABEL: Competition is something – we would love to build our competition around. It's about competition and winning, and so when you try to put a roster together, and Jon (Robinson) and I communicate about it daily, is just try to put pieces together, people that are going to want to reflect us on and off the field that are willing to put the team first, obviously love football, those things, and just really enjoyed our conversations. This is a player that as we watched other players – and watch a lot of SEC football when you get ready for the Draft – he kept showing up, kept making plays and the more we talked with him, got to know him, this is a confident player who was willing to lead inside and was productive.

**Q. You mentioned trying to move around a little bit. When you do make the decision to move back when you did with the one pick, was that after missing out on some guys at that spot?**

JON ROBINSON: No, there were a couple guys that we were still considering there. But you know, that pick in the fourth round to slide back a few spots we felt was a good value to us, adding another player early on in the process tomorrow. There were still players there that we would have considered at that pick but just felt like the value to slide back and pick up that fourth was really good for us.

**Q. In talking to Elijah (Molden) early in the process, he said he really liked the meetings with you guys and he just said that on the Zoom just now. What was it about the connection? Why did he seem like such a guy that matched what you guys want to do?**

MIKE VRABEL: I think he's been raised well. Obviously, his upbringing and his career in Washington, what he learned there, (there were) a lot of things. That was early on. That was one we checked off pretty quickly and said we're all set with this guy. We asked him about school and he gave such a genuine answer. He said, 'I don't really love school but I love to learn.' That really, I think, sunk in. He was just intelligent. Talked ball. He knew about our football team. He had prepared for the interview by watching our football team. He spoke highly of how we played and the effort and finish which we play with. You know, this was an exciting pick for Jon (Robinson) and I and everybody involved with our organization, our coaches and Miss Amy (Adams Strunk). This is going to be a fun guy to coach.

**Q. You said on Monday that you liked the depth at pass rusher and you feel like there's guys situationally that could come in and help. Did that kind of go into overlooking some of the players that you had options to get and now you're in a situation where you will probably have to pick one later?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, we'll see how it comes off tomorrow. There's still some depth there at that position spot for us. We'll see who of those guys are available tomorrow. We were in between picks on a couple of those guys there that came off and certainly we would have considered if we were on the clock, and that's just kind of the way it goes with the draft. We try to position ourselves to get a couple guys and it just never really manifested itself. There's still pretty good depth at that position in the later rounds.

**Q. What kind of an advantage does (Elijah) Molden have with growing up with a father who played in this league?**

MIKE VRABEL: I don't know that. I mean, again, I think that would be – I'm sure you've asked him. You'd have to ask Tyler (Vrabel). You'd have to ask my son. I don't know. I think there's a lot of opportunities that I think children have that parents, fathers are professional athletes, just being around teams, being around the locker room, understanding how powerful that thing can be and the bond that's created between athletes from all over that come together to form a team, and that's probably something that I would have said. You know, my dad wasn't an athlete, he was a coach when I was growing up, so I don't know.

**Q. Have you talked to Atlanta about Julio Jones?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, I'm not going to comment about any talks that we might have had with other teams regarding players.

**Q. You've spent three picks in the last six years at right tackle, two firsts and a second now. Isn't that an awful lot at one spot?**

JON ROBINSON: I think tackle is a premium position in the National Football League. I think that's a position that resources are allocated towards, and you know, we are going to keep looking and keep trying to add football players at that position that we think can come in and contribute to the team and help us win.

**Q. When you're thinking about scheming cornerbacks and putting the right guys on the field, do you think about it in terms of this guy might be more of a slot corner, this guy is more outside, base, or is it just simply get the best three on the field in a nickel situation?**

MIKE VRABEL: You know, I appreciate that. I don't think right now we're in a scheme mode. I think that we do do that, I think, in our evaluations. Sometimes it's nickel only, it's inside, outside, it's outside and can potentially play inside. Those are conversations we have. I think as we get closer to the season and we start to say, 'OK, maybe there's a bigger slot or there's a quicker slot that maybe you would match up differently there.' We would like them to know all the positions.

You know, obviously the no outside, and we do get into substituted defenses, having a few guys that can play inside, sometimes we play nickel versus 12 personnel and that may be a bigger nickel or that could even be a safety. We talked about (Amani) Hooker that's learned more than one position. Right now, I don't know about the scheme factor, but certainly I think that that comes in play with some of our evaluations that we look at as where we would probably look at this player at, whether it's, you know, nickel or inside outside or outside inside?

**Q. With (Monty) Rice, you talked about the other two players with this. What did he do or say pass the loves football test?**

MIKE VRABEL: I don't think there's anything that you say. I would rather go by the old adage of, 'Show me and don't tell me because I see better than I hear.' He does play with a demeanor that we think – kind of really enjoy watching him, and again, we've been through this. Jon (Robinson) and I sit in there with these scouts that do a fantastic job, and kept showing up, kept tackling the ball, kept flying around. And I think that this was a player that really grew on us, and me personally I think as a coach in our conversations with him and watching him on film. I think that's always a good sign. When you're putting on a tape or you notice another player that you weren't intending to watch, that's usually a pretty good sign.

**Q. What's a realistic role for (Monty) Rice as a rookie and how similar is he to Rashaan (Evans) and what's the confidence in Rashaan?**

JON ROBINSON: We have good confidence in Rashaan (Evans). Monty (Rice), he'll come in and compete at the inside linebacker position on special teams. To what degree he picks up the defense and understands that and learns that and earns play time, that will be determined by him and his work ethic and based on the information that we were – that I got from Georgia. Consummate worker, loves football, works hard, leader, vocal. All those things were very positive in his favor.

MIKE VRABEL: I guess I would just first address Rashaan (Evans). Extremely confident and comfortable with Rashaan. He comes in and tries to make a daily impact on our football team in virtual meetings. He's learning. We're doing some things that continue to change that position and I think he's excited about that. And then with Monty (Rice), it was looking at a player, trying to get younger and help us on special teams and what his expectation level is is the same for everybody. You know, come in and know what to do as quickly as possible, and play as hard and as fast as you can and try to help the team in any possible way.

**Q. Wonder how difficult it is to evaluate a guy who plays at an FCS level like (Dillon) Radunz and how important was he did at Senior Bowl and seeing him play against higher level competition?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, that's a good question. Their season was shortened obviously. That Senior Bowl exposure was really good for him to go against some of the best of the best in college football. Got a chance to spend some time down there with him, get to know him. He's about what we're about, you know, football-wise and makeup and commitment to being a good football player. Yeah, that Senior Bowl experience and week down there for him both in the practices and in the game was very positive in his favor.

MIKE VRABEL: I wouldn't have too much to add to that. I agree with everything Jon (Robinson) said. I don't want to sit there and repeat it. Some of these players have played at a smaller school and when given the opportunity to go to the Senior Bowl and they take advantage of it, you take notice and you go back. That's what the Senior Bowl does, and then you go back and study what tape is available and watch their workout and try to project and have a vision for them.

**Q. Four of your five top cornerbacks now new, and Kristian (Fulton) didn't play a heck of a lot last season; he's only in his second year. How much of a challenge for those guys to rebuild that cohesion and clubhouse mentality that your secondary thrived on when it was at its best?**

MIKE VRABEL: Well, I don't think that – you don't play well and don't win games in this league because of tee shirts and slogans. You win games in this league by coming together as a team and as a unit and a position group and going out there and pushing each other and trying to work, and every year is new. Every year there's going to be change. There's going to be different things that are going to be asked of him from a playbook perspective and sometimes from a role. I think that they got off to a great start. I think all of these meetings have been fantastic. I think they have been better than what I remember it being last year with the virtual sessions. Some players are coming in and when we have an opportunity to have in-person meetings, we will. So, we'll just keep coaching them, and I think these guys are still – continue to go build a bond and I know they will do that as we work closer towards the season.

**Q. When you bring in a guy like (Elijah) Molden who has versatility and can play safety or nickelback and things like that, do you just try to figure out where he best fits in or do you try to think of creative ways to use a guy with that type of versatility?**

MIKE VRABEL: I think you have to give the young players a position to focus on and then as they expand and they are showing an ability to understand and comprehend what that job is, then you can give them another job. I'm sure that Elijah (Molden) will be excited about doing that, but I think you've got to give them a place to start and we'll consider what we feel like is best for him and what's best for the football team.

### PRESS CONFERENCE WITH LOCAL MEDIA

**Q. This defense is going to look different; how important is it to make changes in this unit?**

JON ROBINSON: In my time, you go into free agency and the Draft and there's roster turnover every year and we added players in free agency after the season was over, we added some guys this weekend via the draft, and excited to work with all these guys whenever we can get back and get rolling.

**Q. For both of you, how critical were the interactions that you had with the guys that you ended up picking at the Senior Bowl? Seemed like there was a pretty good run, I think six players that you ended up selecting participated in the Senior Bowl this year.**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, that's a great question. I think that those guys – that was the one setting where we could really sit down and talk to those guys. They had Plexiglass up. Restrictions certainly weren't as loose then as they are now. But we had masks on and we were able to talk to them face-to-face and interact with those guys and came away impressed with those guys that we selected this weekend after talking to them down there.

MIKE VRABEL: Some of the practices are critical, that you can go back and watch, the one-on-ones and drill work and watch practice. Sometimes the game gets a little muddy. There's not a whole lot of time to prepare. It's pretty simple scheme on both sides. But I think the practices are really cool, to be able to go back and watch on tape as well.

**Q. You move up to go (Dez) Fitzpatrick. How do you see him fitting in as a rookie?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, we watched a lot on him and we like his size. We like his speed. We like his length. He's got good route running skills. He's got some things he's got to clean up. I love his toughness. I love his tenacity as a blocker. He's good in traffic catching the football. One of the things as we continue to visit with him and talk to the staff there at Louisville about him is how tireless his work ethic was. That's one thing we talked about is get ready to bring your work ethic here to Nashville.

MIKE VRABEL: Things are going to be the same for Dez (Fitzpatrick) as everybody else we added this week and the players currently on our roster, is try to make a daily impact on our football team. But for rookies, it's about coming in and learning what to do, and being able to go out on the practice field at some point in time and be in positions to help themselves and to compete and try to earn the respect of their teammates.

**Q. For both you guys, on the tight end position, not drafting a tight end, how close were you there at various points, is it disappointing not to get one and how would you assess where you are at that position right now?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, we were close a couple times. We had some discussions yesterday, some today. And you know, we like the group that we've got and we'll continue to evaluate players that are available here after the Draft as we start that process. I've gotten several calls from general managers on other teams that have players on their roster, so the

roster building process is never over. But we are excited with the group that we've got back, and see how those guys come in and compete and continue to evaluate the players that are available as we continue to move through the offseason.

MIKE VRABEL: I don't know what you'd like me to add. Is there something you didn't get answered there?

**Q. Just, I guess, let me quick follow up then since you threw that out --**

MIKE VRABEL: I don't want to be redundant, that's all, you know what I mean.

**Q. It's probably more of a giant question, but MyCole Pruitt, is there a possibility that he could be back?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, we'll see kind of how it goes here and like I said in the post-draft, and as we inch closer to mandatory minicamp and the offseason and training camp, and MyCole (Pruitt) has played a lot of good snaps for us. He's done nothing to warrant not being under consideration to come back here.

**Q. Wondering if you can evaluate (Rashad) Weaver, edge rushers, seems likes a lot of times, sometimes they forget about playing against the run. This guy seems to get a lot of high marks for playing against the run in addition to going against the quarterback and wonder if you guys can talk about that a little bit.**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, I think that he's a tough player, he's a team captain and they speak very highly of him. He's got good length. He's got good strength in the position, you know, so much so that they even kicked him down at the Senior Bowl and you can see him play down some over the guard in there and he held his own. He's a high motor player. He's a fun player to watch. I think he's a disruptive player in both the run and the pass game, and excited for him to come in here and compete and work.

MIKE VRABEL: I think touching on that Senior Bowl experience, so many of these players go down and they are looking to showcase their skills and they ask them to move down inside and here is a kid that's going to go and try to make a name for himself or get recognized playing a position he's played for four years in college and they move him inside to play 3-technique, and he didn't leave. He didn't pack his stuff up and leave. He went in there and tried to do it the way they coached him to do it. Didn't run around blocks. He tried to play blocks how they coached him to do it. That's impressive and certainly stood out to me. I'm like, 'Why don't you try and run around and make some plays?' He was just like, he was trying to do it however they were coaching him how to do it and I think that says a lot about who he is.

**Q. (Racey) McMath seems like a guy that has all the measurables you could want in a receiver. Probably needs a little more polish before he's really ready to go. What's the key to unlocking his potential and getting him to be more than a special teams contributor?**

JON ROBINSON: Well, I think it will be his daily work ethic, which is good, his preparation, his attention to details. But he is a big, fast receiver. He plays the game with toughness and a physicality component that's easy to see on film. And then his contributions in the kicking game, you know, certainly had him pushed up there for us and we had him really highly rated for what he's been able to do on special teams.

MIKE VRABEL: He plays with a lot of speed and violence and is willing to put his body on the line for his football team, and we'll continue to develop him and work with him on route craft and details and coverage recognition and all those things that go into improving as a wide receiver. But just enjoy his demeanor, his play demeanor and how fast and how physical he plays.

**Q. How more dynamic do you feel you are as a team after the Draft?**

JON ROBINSON: I think we are a better football team after this weekend. I said it last night and I said it this morning to the group. These guys that we selected this weekend, we loved watching those guys play football. We loved watching – putting the tape on and watching them do a job that we are now going to hire them to do. I think they are going to add value to the football team in their various roles, and they are about what we are about with their play style and their makeup.

**Q. Is Weaver an outside linebacker as opposed to an end? He's with that group?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, I think he starts in that group and goes in the outside linebacker group. He's a guy with, how we have been able to evaluate, has shown he's able to play down at guard or hit up on a tackle. He has some versatility to play some defensive end potentially. We'll try him at a couple different spots but he certainly goes into the outside linebacker room to start.

**Q. Could you speak to the dynamic question? Is that something that's important to you?**

MIKE VRABEL: Why did you say it so fast? You said it so quickly?

**Q. Because I was going to get cut off maybe.**

MIKE VRABEL: OK. No, I mean, I don't think we're looking for – we're looking for a successful football team. We're looking for a team that's complements each other and that's competitive at every position. Those are the conversations that Jon (Robinson) and I have. We want a team that's about winning and pushing each other, and so whether that's dynamic or not, I don't know. I know that there were guys that we really enjoyed watching play football. Whether they had speed or size and they did something really, really well at their position. That's all I would allude to.

**Q. You all lost a lot of defensive starters from last year in free agency and obviously have a big crop coming in both from this weekend and what you did in free agency. What's the key as a coaching staff when you have a lot of turnover and new faces to get everybody on the same page and ready to go quickly in a new system?**

MIKE VRABEL: And I would add to that, in a virtual setting, to start the program. You know, I think that that's challenging and I have to weigh my time in a team meeting and obviously we have special teams meetings, but how much time do I give the coaches as a defensive unit and offensive unit and then also, positionally. You know, we only get so much time with them right now virtually. So that's been something that I've had to probably sacrifice a little bit of now is my time with them as a team and be able to transfer that time to positional and unit meetings, and so I think you start there. We've been breaking these guys up into groups so you'd have maybe two or three D-linemen, a couple linebackers and a couple defensive backs and they kind of go and they work on what we call virtual classroom and they work through the screens obviously with the coaches that are giving them calls, looking at formations and that's something that we are trying to do. We are just trying to recreate what they would do in a walk through on the field so they are hearing each other talk and voices. That's the first step. The next step would be in-person meetings and walk throughs when we can do that and ultimately phase three and OTAs and then training camp. But you have to put the time in and hear the guy's voice and play off of the guy in front of you and work with the guy next to you, and that takes practice.

**Q. Most of your picks on the first two days were defense and you add a couple more today. Do you feel like you got a nice blend of players who can both start and then also contribute as role players?**

JON ROBINSON: I think that's what we try to do is put all of that together. The players that are on our roster after the season's over, the ones that we add in free agency, and then how we attack the Draft. You're trying to blend all that together with various roles on the defensive side of the football, various spots in their careers. But I feel like we've got a good mix of a lot of that on the defensive side.

**Q. Given what you have with Derrick Henry, how much was size and ability and willingness to block a consideration when looking at wide receivers from this group?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, that's a great question, and I think both the guys that we added today, they are not afraid to go stick their face in there and dig out a safety or go stalk a corner and try to drive them out of bounds. You know, that toughness component. And when we talked to some of these receivers, some we liked and weren't able to take them, that's huge for our football team. That's part of our identity is to go in there and block for whoever we hand the ball to. Much like when we asked the running backs to block in pass protection, when they are trying to get open and catch a football. They have to do their job in the run game and the running backs do their job in the pass game so that they can get open and catch.

**Q. Potentially you talk about the roster not being done. With the cap situation what it is, could we perhaps see some rubbing? Tannehill out there, but could that open up more room to fill tight end or other needs?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, that's something that we are working through is taking stock of the Draft and the picks and how those resources are going to allocate into the cap figure. Seeing which players, it might be viable to do that to give us a little bit of room. I've said this before at the start of free agency, you have to kind of have your emergency roster needs set aside. You've got to put that in a savings account for lack of a better term so that you can field positions as injuries happen, knock-on-wood that we don't have that many. But yeah, that's something that we are certainly working through is contracts and players to restructure to maybe give us a little bit more room there.

**Q. Jayon (Brown) had 6 sacks in 2018, having him back, the addition of Rice, that inside linebacker position and then Weaver, can you move guys around maybe to have more depth or to find more sacks this year from guys that are not traditional sacking positions?**

MIKE VRABEL: I think we had some secondary sacks. If you look back, and again, it doesn't mean anything from one year to the next, but we had a bunch of secondary sacks from corner, nickel, safety. We have to affect the quarterback, and whether that's bringing four, you start there, and if you can bring four and cover, and if not, you have to keep adding pieces into the rush. Jayon (Brown) has certainly proven to be somebody that has versatility. I think he's gotten better every year in his ball production and has come up with some huge turnovers for us. Some, either he's tipped or punched the ball out -- and other guys you mentioned, the younger players. We'll start off with those younger guys at a position and give them more as they can handle, that's fine.

**Q. With two final picks, obviously we mentioned McMath there but going with some guys that can bring a lot in terms of special teams, with Brady Breeze, what did you see out of him out of Oregon and were you familiar with the fact that he knew of Elijah Molden and they are like really good friends, childhood friends, I believe?**

JON ROBINSON: I think they certainly play stylistically similarly. They drove themselves around. He was a fun guy to watch on defense. He was a fun guy to watch in the kicking game. He's one of the first ones down on kicking units. He's instinctive. He finds the football on special teams much like he does on defense and he's a good tackler. He was a highly rated special teams guy for us in our stacks, and we were stoked to add him there late in the sixth.

**Q. This follows up my question from Thursday, but now you have three of these draft picks who have played a combined one game since 2019. Just wondering why after such a weird year that's not an issue? And how does that change or impact their development?**

JON ROBINSON: I think their development will be dependent upon them. They are certainly going to get coached and going to get pushed. They are going to come in here and work hard in how quickly they progress and improve will ultimately be on them. I think that's one of the things that we had to work through this season was with the opt-out guys. You can't just take guys, every guy that played this year when you start to look at the skillsets of players and how

they stack up, certainly vertically within their position group and horizontally with other positions, you have to go with the film that you have and get to know them on the Zoom calls and make those decisions.

**Q. Looking at your receiver group, I don't know that there's specifically a defined slot receiver. How do you feel about that group and is that something that you would like to address?**

MIKE VRABEL: We feel like we have slots there. I'm not sure if our evaluations of our receiving group are the same but we've got guys that played in the slot for us and we'll keep working guys around and giving them opportunities.

**Q. Following up, with the addition of the guys you got today in the later rounds at wide receiver and Josh Reynolds, do you feel like you're pretty well set at the wide receiver position in terms of what departed there, or is there still a need to supplement given the departure of some of those guys?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, like I said earlier, we'll continue to evaluate players that are available. Players that are on the street that don't have jobs or players that do have jobs on other teams that may become available. That's part of my job. That's part of our job is to constantly evaluate the pool of players, the supply of players that you can add to your football team and then make the decisions that's best for the team.

**Q. Decision on Rashaan Evans and his fifth-year option?**

JON ROBINSON: Still working through that. I think we've got till Monday to kind of come to some finality there.

**Q. Is a Steve Gostkowski return a possibility?**

JON ROBINSON: Right now, we have Tucker McCann the team and like of those other questions, we continue to look at the players that are out there and have discussions and kind of see where they are at. It's similar to the MyCole Pruitt conversation. At the end of the day, we have to make the best decision for the football team and the player.

**Q. I guess for both of you, but Jon, you brought up wanting to make this draft process a little more inclusive under the circumstances of everything being virtual. How do you feel like you went about accomplishing that, and is it just as simple as having more people on the Zoom calls or in these meetings.**

JON ROBINSON: I think that that's probably it, is just having more people in the Zoom meetings, in the Zoom sessions, interacting with the players, if they are not interacting with the player, they are at least listening to whoever is interacting with the player and taking notes and looking for various things throughout the Zoom call to try to get an evaluation on how the player might fit.

MIKE VRABEL: I would add, I want to express my, I think, gratitude to Jon (Robinson) and his staff. I know that those scouts, it's tough to be able to have to go out there and try to get information during the time that we're in, the coaching staff for the amount of time that they put in to bring all that information back to Jon and I for us to digest and go through and watch and stack them and put them all together. It's never going to be perfect because everybody is going to have a slightly different opinion. But we got a lot of great information from everybody that was involved. We'd just like to thank all those people that helped us bring these players in.

**Q. You picked a lot of players that had participated in the Senior Bowl. Is that something that weighed in more heavily in the decision-making this year or was that just coincidence? What's behind that?**

JON ROBINSON: Yeah, talked a little about that earlier but that was certainly a great exposure for these players to go down there and see those guys live, interview every single player at the Senior Bowl, have an actual face-to-face conversation with those players. That was really, really good for us to get the information firsthand down there.

**Q. Did Weaver add or subtract point for getting a sack against BC?**

MIKE VRABEL: This is a smart player and I'm going to tell you the conversation I had with Tyler (Vrabel). I said, 'If you want to play in this league, you're going to need to play against players like this and compare yourself against players in the National Football League and Rashad (Weaver) is one of those players,' and that's what I told Tyler. Tyler had his opportunity eventually. But this is about us bringing in guys that we enjoy watching and that we think are going to make great additions to our football team.

**Q. Mike, as you look at the pieces that have now been added on defense, is there a characteristic that you kind of see that jumps out of this group and how eager are you to get working with them on the field?**

MIKE VRABEL: Very eager. We are eager to coach. We are eager to develop and try to teach players. That's what we are in this business for, outside of winning championships. So we'll have to find out when that's going to occur. We have a time set for rookie minicamp. But as far as for whatever identity it may be, that has to be built through time in the meetings and the practice field and in games. That has to be developed. We are excited but those are all things that have to be work on every day.

## **TITANS SELECT VIRGINIA TECH CB CALEB FARLEY IN FIRST ROUND OF THE NFL DRAFT**

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected Virginia Tech cornerback Caleb Farley in the first round of Thursday night's NFL Draft.

Farley was taken with the 22nd overall pick.

Heading into the draft, Farley was regarded as a top pick, but a back injury put him in a position to land with the Titans, who snatched him up.

"I think it would be a home-run hit, and the reason he is there is because of the back (injury)," NFL Network draft analyst Charles Davis said of Farley, and the Titans, leading up to the draft. "If there is no back surgery, I think he is already gone. He may even be the first corner off the board.

"If (Farley) somehow gets down to 22, and the Titans, with a history of having some patience with big-time players, witness Jeffery Simmons, that makes sense to me. And I don't think you'll to wait as long with him. To get an elite guy at 22, who could easily be a top 10 pick, would be great for (the Titans)."

NFL Network draft analyst Daniel Jeremiah rated Farley as one of the top five players in the draft, but thought he'd slide a bit. Jeremiah pointed out "the Titans were rewarded for stopping Jeffery Simmons' slide a couple years ago (because of an injury), and things could play out similarly in this scenario" with Farley.

In 23 games over two seasons at Virginia Tech, the 6-foot-2, 206-pound Farley had six interceptions. But he's had two back surgeries, and he also suffered a knee injury while in college.

Farley initially suffered the back injury during workouts leading up to the 2019 season. He played through the injury and earned first team All-ACC honors with four interceptions and 12 pass breakups, but was forced to sit out Tech's final two games. He also suffered a torn ACL in 2017.

"If you are comfortable with him medically -- he was like my fifth or sixth player in the draft. He's a freak show," Jeremiah said of Farley. "If they give you the okay and he passes, shoot, that would be a home run pick if he shows up and he's healthy. ... He's got rare movement and skills for a big corner like that. I think he's the most talented corner in the whole draft."

The Titans are scheduled to make eight more picks over the next two days of the draft, including three on Friday night – pick No.53 overall (2nd round), and picks 85 and 100 in the third round.

NASHVILLE – Leading up the NFL Draft, Virginia Tech's Caleb Farley faced countless questions about his troublesome back, which ultimately caused him to slide back in the first round.

After initially planning to attend the draft in person in Cleveland, the talented cornerback had to cancel his trip after testing positive for COVID-19. Farley said he tested negative on Thursday, however, and believes it could have been a false positive.

On Thursday night, Farley had a big smile on his face, and so did the Titans.

Farley has a new home, in Tennessee.

"This process has been absolutely bizarre for me, but landing in Tennessee has been great," said Farley, who was wearing a Titans cap on a zoom conference call with reporters. "I thank God. I thank Jesus Christ and my parents. I am just extremely excited to get to Tennessee, and to get to work.

"I am going to give the Tennessee Titans all I've got."

The Titans selected Farley in the first round of Thursday night's NFL Draft.

Farley, taken with the 22nd overall pick, said he hopes his late mother "is smiling down on me from the sky" because "she always believed in me."

Heading into the draft, Farley was regarded as a top pick, but the back injury – and a pair of surgeries -- put him in a position to land with the Titans, who snatched him up.

At least two draft analysts – Charles Davis and Daniel Jeremiah of NFL Network – called Farley a "home run" pick for the Titans while saying he might've been the top cornerback in the draft if not for questions about the back. Jeremiah called Farley a "freak show" because of his athletic ability.

Titans General Manager Jon Robinson said the team had a lot of meetings with Farley, and the team's medical staff felt comfortable with where he is from a physical standpoint. The Titans will continue to monitor his health and work to get him on the field "as soon as possible."

Robinson called Farley a "premium player" on the team's draft board.

"We are super stoked to have him as a part of our football team," Robinson said. "He was a fun guy to evaluate on film, extremely competitive. He has excellent size and speed for the position. We talked to several of his coaches at Virginia Tech, who raved about him as a person. ... He really checked every box for us. He's going to help our football team."

Titans head coach Mike Vrabel said the team is getting an athletic and talented player in Farley.

"The think what stood out to me was the athleticism," Vrabel said of Farley. "He's a former receiver who has learned how to play corner and will continue to improve. There's a certain level of athleticism, smoothness and a lot of fluidity. That is really what stood out, the athleticism."

In 23 games over two seasons at Virginia Tech, the 6-foot-2, 208-pound Farley had six interceptions. Farley opted out of the 2020 season.

Farley said he was frustrated by all the skepticism, and questions about his back. He said he feels "great" and is excited to get to Tennessee on Friday.

"I have always had a huge chip on my shoulder, and I'll stay motivated

until I hang up the cleats," Farley said. "Looking back, I just smile, and I thank God, because I never let me get the devil get me down one time during the process. This season I am going to reap the benefits of that."

Farley believes he's the best cornerback in the draft, and he wants to "dominate" in the NFL.

Farley, known for his ability to play physical in man coverage, plans to be ready for training camp.

"I feel great, and I can't wait to get back on the field," Farley said. "I am a Tennessee Titan, I am in good health, and I am extremely excited about the upcoming season.

"When coach called me to tell me I was going to be a Tennessee Titan, the first thing I said was: When can I get the playbook? I am extremely excited to get back on the field and rep these colors. I am so ecstatic and excited to be a Tennessee Titan. Let's go!"

Farley arrived with little sleep. After a whirlwind of a night while watching the draft at his father's house with family in Hickory, North Carolina, Farley spent time in bed in Google, searching for information on Nashville, his new home.

He woke up early, and then he hit the ground running.

"This is my first time in Nashville," Farley said on Friday. "I think it's gorgeous, similar to where I am from in North Carolina and how the terrain looks. I know it's an exciting place, beautiful. I am hearing a lot of good things about the city and getting to view the stadium and the facilities. So far, everything has been amazing.

"It has been going great. I couldn't ask for anything better."

Farley traveled to Nashville with his father on Titans controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk's private jet.

On Friday morning, he toured the team's facility, which is currently under construction.

He spent time with Titans coach Mike Vrabel and his staff, and General Manager Jon Robinson. He also met with other team officials. Defensive backs coach Anthony Midget surprised him by wearing a Virginia Tech sweatshirt. Like Farley, Midget also was a star player for the Hokies.

Farley then visited Nissan Stadium, where he'll play on Sundays.

"It feels special here," Farley said. "I can tell coach believes in me, and they all believe in me. And that is special to me."

In 23 games over two seasons at Virginia Tech, the 6-foot-2, 197-pound Farley had six interceptions. In 2019, Farley led the ACC in passes defended, and he was tied for second in the league with four interceptions. Farley opted out of the 2020 season, and he is currently recovering from his second back surgery.

He's looking forward to what's ahead in Nashville, with the Titans.

On Friday night, Farley will fly back home, and then begin to imagine what's next in his NFL career, and life.

"The past 24 hours have been a roller coaster ride of adrenalin, emotions, and pure joy and happiness," Farley said. "I didn't sleep much last night – I was still wired up, like I was ready to play a football game.

"But this truly has been the most special moment of my life. I hope to be here long-term, and I hope we win a whole lot of football games."

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected North Dakota State tackle Dillon Radunz in the second round of Friday night's NFL Draft.

Radunz, taken with the 53rd overall pick, is ready to get dirty.

"I love it," Radunz said of landing with the Titans. "I hope I can come in and contribute to the successful program that they have. I know Taylor Lewan is kind of the staple lineman there. ... I hope I can emulate what he brings to the Titans and play that aggressive style of football on that offensive line. I am super happy with this pick."

He's also excited about the thought of blocking for running back Derrick Henry.

"Blocking for Derrick Henry, that's going to be awesome," Radunz said on a video conference call with reporters. "He got (2,027) yards last year and ... whatever I can do to help. He is an awesome running back and it's an awesome offensive line, and I am just excited to contribute."

A first team FCS All-American, Radunz allowed zero sacks in his last two seasons while protecting quarterback Trey Lance's blindside. Lance was the third overall pick, by the 49ers, in the NFL Draft.

During his college career, Radunz played in 33 career games with 32 starts. He was part of four Missouri Valley Football Conference championship teams and three NCAA Division I football national championships and was a two-time FCS All-American.

Radunz (6-6, 301) was named the top overall practice player of the week at the 2021 Senior Bowl in Mobile.

Radunz chatted with Titans General Manager Jon Robinson and coach Mike Vrabel after being picked. He watched the draft with family and friends in the Minneapolis area.

"I saw the phone ring from the Tennessee area code, and it said Tennessee on it, and I said, 'Well guys, I guess I am going to be a Titan,' Radunz said. 'Everybody was like, 'Wait, what?' And I was like, 'Yeah, they're calling me right now.'"

"Tears were shed, tears of joy and lots of hugs. This is a moment my family has been waiting for for a long time. I am super excited to be where I am. ... I was trying to hold back tears as I talked to (Jon and Mike). It was a great conversation, and I can't wait to get down there."

The Titans signed former Browns tackle Kendall Lamm in free agency while also re-signing Ty Sambrailo. Earlier this offseason, the team parted ways with Dennis Kelly, the team's starting right tackle.

Radunz is expected to compete for a starting spot opposite Lewan.

Radunz played primarily at left tackle at North Dakota State, but he's worked to strengthen his game on both sides of the offensive line in recent months.

"I am definitely going to want to be thrown in that starting five – that is the competitor in me," Radunz said, "and if not, I want to help this team win a lot of games. Just getting into the organization is going to be the next step."

"I am very excited," Rice said. "I've been waiting on this moment since I was a kid, and it's special. I am blessed and I am going to come to work every day and live right on and off the field, and do whatever I can to help the team win."

Rice was one of five finalists for the Butkus Award, which recognizes the nation's best linebacker, in 2020. He was a starter at LB in eight of 10 games, when he was in on 49 tackles, and four tackles for a loss.

"You need your linebackers to really be able to run and cover," NFL Network Draft analyst Daniel Jeremiah said of Rice after the pick was made. "Monty Rice ended up running a 4.57. He has outstanding instincts as an inside linebacker, which is absolutely necessary ... He is very aware in coverage. He is so quick and athletic."

Rice started all 14 games for the Bulldogs in 2019, when he racked up 89 tackles, and three tackles for a loss.

Rice was second team All-SEC in 2019, when he was the co-winner of the Vince Dooley Defensive MVP. He earned first team All-SEC accolades in 2020.

"I can call the defense, I can run, I can hit, I can cover," Rice said. "I can do what a three-down linebacker needs to do. In today's NFL you have to be able to run and hit at linebacker, and I think I do a pretty good job at that. But you can always get better."

"Even from the jump, I told my parents and my fiancée I had a feeling I'd end up a Titan, and sure enough. ... It's crazy it worked out the way it did. I know God has a plan for me, and I am looking forward to being in Tennessee."

Molden (5-10, 195) earned second team All Pac-12 Conference honors in 2020. He was also named second-team All-American by Pro Football Focus, which also named him Pac-12 Player of the Year. He was in on 26 tackles and he also tallied an interception in 2020.

Molden, who played in the slot and in the safety in college, was named first team All Pac-12 in 2019 after recording 79 tackles, 5 ½ tackles for a loss, 17 passes defensed, four interceptions and three forced fumbles.

Molden's father, Alex, played at Oregon, and he was the 11th overall pick of the New Orleans Saints in 1996. Alex Molden played eight seasons in the NFL with the Saints, Chargers and Lions.

Molden made it clear he is happy with his landing spot.

"From the outside looking in, the Titans were always a team that did it the right way," Molden said. "They're a gritty, tough-nosed team and front office and they play tough-nosed football. And honestly, too, Tennessee is not a bad place to live. I am super grateful to be a part of this organization, and ready to get to work."

The Titans are scheduled to make six picks in rounds 4-7 on the final day of the draft on Saturday.

NASHVILLE – The Titans are looking for more playmakers on offense, and they believe they've found one in Louisville receiver Dez Fitzpatrick.

On Saturday, the Titans traded up to select Fitzpatrick in the fourth round (109th overall) of the NFL Draft.

"I was super excited to get the call, and see the Nashville area code pop up (on my phone)," Fitzpatrick said after being picked. "The conversation with the coaches, I definitely felt wanted. I can't wait to be a Titan. ... I feel like I fit into what they are trying to do in Nashville. I am just so happy to be a Titan."

Fitzpatrick (6-2, 210) recorded 154 receptions (ninth all-time) for 2,589 yards (sixth all-time) and 21 touchdowns during his career at Louisville. He averaged 16.8 yards a reception for his career, and he also recorded 21 career touchdown catches. He finished his career tied for 10th with eight 100-yard receiving games.

In 2020, Fitzpatrick appeared in 11 games, finishing with 43 catches for 833 yards and three touchdowns.

Fitzpatrick has been a big-time playmaker in recent years, averaging 19.8 yards per catch in 2020, and 18.1 yards per catch in 2019.

"I feel like I am a complete receiver, and not one-dimensional," Fitzpatrick said. "(The Titans) like how I move, a big size, thicker frame."

Titans quarterback Ryan Tannehill texted Fitzpatrick on Saturday, and welcomed him to the team.

"When I got drafted, and everything calmed down, Tannehill congratulated me and said he's excited for me to come down, and he felt like that was a good pick for them. He likes my game and (thinks) I can be a weapon for the offense," Fitzpatrick said. "I said, 'I can't wait to come down and work, and compete, and learn how to be a Titan. I told him I can't wait to work with him. I told him I am ready to learn, and earn my stripes, and do everything I have to do.'"

Fitzpatrick was selected with the 109th overall pick after a trade with the Panthers.

The Titans received pick No. 109, and traded picks 126 (4th), 166 (5th) and 232 (7th) to the Panthers.

"We watched a lot of film on him and we like his size," Titans General Manager Jon Robinson said of Fitzpatrick. "We like his speed. We like his length. He's got good route running skills. He's got some things he's got to clean up. I love his toughness. I love his tenacity as a blocker. He's good in traffic catching the football. One of the things as we continue to visit with him and talk to the staff there at Louisville about him is how tireless his work ethic was. That's one thing we talked about is get ready to bring your work ethic here to Nashville."

The Titans said goodbye to former receiver Corey Davis earlier this offseason after he signed in free agency with the Jets. The Titans signed former Rams receiver Josh Reynolds in free agency.

Fitzpatrick and Reynolds will join a group of returning receivers led by A.J. Brown.

"I love to learn new stuff, from guys who have been doing it well in the league, and I can't wait to (work) with (A.J.), and talk ball," Fitzpatrick said. "I am definitely familiar with the team, since Corey Davis was drafted there. I have been keeping up. I get to learn more about their offense, and I can't wait until the playbook comes and I can dive

more into it. I can't wait to go down there and work hard."

NASHVILLE – Rashad Weaver busted it to put himself in a position to make his mark in the NFL.

Now, the Pittsburgh edge rusher is ready to bust loose with the Titans after being selected in the fourth round of Saturday's NFL Draft.

"When I got on the phone, I felt like they got the biggest steal of the draft," Weaver said of the Titans. "I thought I'd be going on Day 2, honestly, but some things just change. But at this point now I have been drafted, and people dream of this. I am so thankful for it. For them to pick me, I am excited. I think they got a great value pick in me, and I am ready to prove that to them.

"(The Titans) put the faith in me to pick me, and I'll be ready to come in there and make plays and work and do whatever I am asked."

Weaver, selected with the 135th overall pick, missed the entire 2019 season due to injury.

But Weaver said he learned a lot of patience, and a lot about himself, while recovering from an ACL injury. And he exploded back on the scene in 2020 while earning consensus All-America status last season with the Panthers from four of the NCAA's recognized selectors: Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Walter Camp Football Foundation.

"When my time did come, I wanted to be ready," he said. "I want to help the defense every play and cause havoc for offenses."

Weaver (6-4, 259) was a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award (presented to the national defensive player of the year) after starting in nine games at defensive end. In 2020, Weaver totaled 35 tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He led the ACC in sacks per game (0.83 avg.) and tackles for loss per game (1.61 avg.).

In 2018, Weaver started all 14 games at defensive end and compiled 47 tackles, 14 TFLs, 6.5 sacks, four pass breakups, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles.

Titans General Manager Jon Robinson likes what the team is getting in Wallace.

"I think that he's a tough player, he's a team captain and they speak very highly of him," Robinson said. "He's got good length. He's got good strength in the position, you know, so much so that they even kicked him down at the Senior Bowl and you can see him play down some over the guard in there and he held his own. He's a high motor player. He's a fun player to watch. I think he's a disruptive player in both the run and the pass game, and excited for him to come in here and compete and work."

With the Titans, Wallace will look to wreak havoc with former Pittsburgh Steelers edge rusher Bud Dupree, who signed with the Titans earlier this offseason in free agency. Weaver said he's also looking forward to being teammates with Titans edge rusher Harold Landry.

It turns out, Dupree and Weaver are already friendly.

"Just from him being a Steeler, I was always watching him and T.J. (Watt), because they are great pass rushers," Weaver said. "And actually, when I was out in Arizona training, I got connected with Bud – me and him have the same financial advisor now, and I have been out with him a few times, and we text. We've had dinner.

"So, me and him are already a little bit acquainted, and I'll definitely be trying to learn from him and pick his mind."

**TITANS SELECT LSU  
RECEIVER RACEY  
MCMATH IN SIXTH  
ROUND**

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected LSU receiver Racey McMath in the sixth round of Saturday's NFL Draft.

McMath (6-3, 224), selected with the 205th overall pick, adds speed, tenacity, and a lot of potential.

"They want me to come in and just really learn the game and develop and be a great receiver," McMath said. "They see the potential in me and know I have the work ethic to be a great receiver. So that is what they are looking for me to do when I get to the team."

**MEET WR RACEY MCMATH**

A four-year letterman, McMath played in 34 games with six starts during his four years at LSU. He caught 33 passes for 522 yards and four touchdowns for the Tigers. He also served as a key contributor on special teams, where he had six special teams tackles and forced a fumble.

In 2020, McMath started all six games that he appeared in and caught 14 passes for 195 yards and a touchdown.

"He is a big, fast receiver," Titans General Manager Jon Robinson said of McMath. "He plays the game with toughness and a physicality component that's easy to see on film. And then his contributions in the kicking game, you know, certainly had him pushed up there for us and we had him really highly rated for what he's been able to do on special teams."

McMath was timed with a 4.34-second 40-yard dash at LSU's Pro Day.

"He plays with a lot of speed and violence and is willing to put his body on the line for his football team, and we'll continue to develop him and work with him on route craft and details and coverage recognition and all those things that go into improving as a wide receiver," Titans Coach Mike Vrabel said of McMath. "But just enjoy his demeanor, his play demeanor and how fast and how physical he plays."

McMath was roommates at LSU with cornerback Kristian Fulton, who was drafted by the Titans in the 2020 NFL Draft.

He wants to be a fast learner, and a fast player, for the Titans.

"I have a lot of other things I can always get better at," McMath said. "But my strong suit is definitely going to be speed."

"I know me becoming a better receiver is just me getting in and out of my routes and making every route look the same. Once I get that down to a T, the sky is the limit from there."

SAFETY BRADY BREEZE

NASHVILLE – The Titans selected Oregon safety Brady Breeze in the sixth round of Saturday's NFL Draft.

Breeze, selected with the 215th overall pick, hopes to help bolster the special teams until from the get-go, and possibly more.

"I had a lot of good Zoom interviews with some of the (Titans) coaches through the draft process and stuff, breaking down film, breaking down special teams as well defense, everything. I definitely had a great feeling about the Titans," Breeze said after being picked. "I really had a good connection with those coaches, and I feel like they knew – know that I took pride in special teams and I took pride in defense and stuff like that. So, I feel like yeah, for sure there's definitely a connection, and man, my family and I, we couldn't be more happy and more blessed to say that I'm a Titan. So, feeling very excited."

**MEET S BRADY BREEZE**

Breeze (6-0, 196) played in 38 career games with the Ducks, including all 14 games during his final season in 2019. Breeze tallied 95 tackles, three interceptions and five passes defensed in his final season. He opted out of the 2020 season.

Breeze was the 2020 Rose Bowl Defensive MVP after career-high 11 tackles, a forced fumble and fumble record for a TD. He was one of eight FBS players since 2000 with two fumble returns for a TD and a pick-6 in the same season. He tied for the most defensive TDs (3) in the nation during the 2019 season.

"He was a fun guy to watch on defense," Titans General Manager

Jon Robinson said of Breeze. "He was a fun guy to watch in the kicking game. He's one of the first ones down on kicking units. He's instinctive. He finds the football on special teams much like he does on defense and he's a good tackler. He was a highly rated special teams guy for us in our stacks, and we were stoked to add him there late in the sixth."

## **HOW DID THE TITANS FARE IN THE NFL DRAFT? A LOOK AT THE DRAFT GRADES**

NASHVILLE – The draft picks are in, eight in all.

And now, so are the draft grades.

Here's a look at how some of the analysts graded the 2021 NFL Draft for the Titans:

Sports Illustrated (Conor Orr)

Grade: B+

Round 1 (22) - Caleb Farley, CB, Virginia Tech

Round 2 (53) - Dillon Radunz, OT, North Dakota State

Round 3 (92) - Monty Rice, LB, Georgia

Round 3 (100) - Elijah Molden, CB, Washington

Round 4 (109) - Dez Fitzpatrick, WR, Louisville

Round 4 (135) - Rashad Weaver, DE, Pittsburgh

Round 6 (205) - Racey McMath, WR, LSU

Round 6 (215) - Brady Breeze, S, Oregon

Let's be honest with ourselves. Part of this process involves teams stringing together a handful of players that we've heard a great deal about during the process, and the Titans' draft seems to stand out in that we heard the term "first rounder" attached to more than one of their picks. More name recognition often results in a higher grade. I put this in a different category given the Titans took a calculated risk. Caleb Farley may end up being the best cornerback in this class, but dropped due to recent

back surgeries. GM Jon Robinson said after the draft their medical vetting process was rigorous.

The Titans were always going to go cornerback here and did a great deal of homework on the rest of the class. Their need at the position suggests that they would not take a flier on Farley if they weren't confident in the return.

Dillon Radunz is a promising offensive lineman who will step in and audition for the role left behind by Isaiah Wilson. But it may end up being Rashad Weaver who emerges as the darling of this class. The Titans secured the former Pitt star in the fourth round and, with so much uncertainty on the edge, could end up working his way into a regular role.

Yahoo Sports! (Thor Nystrom)

Grade: A-

I have a reputation of being a hard grader. But every year, there's one team that I randomly end up grading higher than anyone else. This year my guess is it'll be the Titans. I heard a lot of people saying Farley was reach. I disagree. You have to embrace the risk to get the sticker price discount. The Titans know a thing or two about that don't they? This pick reminded me so much of the Jeffery Simmons selection. Only Simmons was seen as even riskier at the time, coming off an ACL injury and arriving with character concerns. Steal of a pick if Farley's back doesn't derail his career. I was surprised Tennessee took Radunz, an athletic tackle on the leaner side, only because just last year they selected his polar-opposite with a decade-plan for him in the elephantine Isaiah Wilson. But I love Radunz -- had him just outside R1. Loved the value on Elijah Molden later on. I assume the Titans are going to get criticized for reaching on Rice; even though I rank him a little lower than he went, I was a big fan of his game. I ranked Rice LB9 in my first crop of rankings -- he would have ended up 10 or so slots below where Tennessee picked him -- before

dropping him to LB11 in my second and final update. But I'm a big fan of his. I think that's a pick where you were trying to hit a single and that's what you're going to get. I don't think it's going to take that kid long to crack the lineup. He brings his lunch pail.

NFL.com (Chad Reuter)

Grade: B+

Day 1 grade: B+

Day 2 grade: A

Day 3 grade: B

Analysis: Farley's injury history is troubling and will bear watching, but he has the ability to become a real playmaker on the outside if he can stay on the field. Radunz is a work in progress but was picked at the right point of the draft and fills a large need at right tackle, given the unceremonious departure of 2020 first-round pick Isaiah Wilson. Rice fits the Titans' system well, and Molden was one of the steals of Day 2 -- he'll be a playmaker.

At his best, Fitzpatrick is worthy of an early fourth-round pick. Other available receivers may have provided better value, but addressing the position was essential for them, and there's certainly a chance Fitzpatrick maximizes his potential. Depth on the edge was a crucial need for Tennessee, and Weaver looked like a likely mid-round pick throughout the 2020 season. McMath's also an inconsistent receiver, but his special teams acumen (like sixth-rounder Breeze) will allow him to stick around for years. The Titans could have used help at tight end in this draft, though it looks like they've already secured some undrafted rookies.

The Ringer (Danny Kelly)

Grade: B

Farley was set to be a top-10 pick before he suffered an injury and had recent back surgery. If the Virginia Tech star can return to form and

remain healthy, he'll go down as one of the biggest steals in this draft. The Radunz pick makes a ton of sense considering the Titans' 2020 draft miss on Isaiah Wilson, while Molden represents incredible value in the third round. He's an instinctive slot corner with excellent ball skills.

USA Today (Nate Davis)

Grade: B+

They don't seem to be garnering much national attention despite arguably procuring the draft's top cornerback late in Round 1 (Caleb Farley, who is recovering from back surgery), its top slot corner in Round 3 (Elijah Molden) while presumably – finally – stopping a revolving door at right tackle by getting Dillon Radunz in Round 2 a year after losing All-Pro Jack Conklin in free agency and then blowing a first-round choice on now former Titan Isaiah Wilson.

ESPN (Mel Kiper)

Grade: B-

The Titans parted ways this offseason with cornerbacks Adoree' Jackson, Desmond King II and Malcolm Butler, all of whom played a lot of snaps for them last season. They brought in Janoris Jenkins, but cornerback was still their biggest need. They got a great one in Caleb Farley (22), who is the best man-to-man cover guy in this class but dropped out of the top 20 because of a couple back injuries. Tennessee clearly felt OK with his medical re-checks, and he has a chance to be elite if he can stay healthy. But his career will make or break this class. I also liked the team taking Elijah Molden (100) in Round 3 because the 5-foot-9 corner could play as the nickelback early. He had five interceptions in 2019.

Pro Football Focus

Grade: A

Day 1: If Farley had a clean medical report, he would have gone within the first 10 picks. He suffered a torn

ACL in 2017, had a back operation in 2019 and then had another surgery in late March. That makes this a risky bet, but if he stays healthy, this is a huge steal. His 6-foot-2, 207-pound frame with 33 ¾-inch arms is ideal for an NFL corner. Farley is also capable of running a sub-4.3-second 40-yard dash and boasts the production to back those traits up. He earned a 90.5 coverage grade in his final college season in 2019.

Day 2: Tennessee's last swing at an offensive tackle was a disaster, as 2020 first-round pick Isaiah Wilson played just three snaps on offense — all kneel-downs — before he ran himself out of town. Dillon Radunz is a little undersized and underweight but has exceptional movement skills and the tools to be an elite pass-blocker, even if it could take a period of time to get there.

Monty Rice has been flying around finding the football between the hedges for as long we can remember, but he lost his starting spot to Nakobe Dean this past season. He'll need to figure out what's happening in front of him at a much higher level in the NFL, but at least he has the athleticism to work with at the pro level. He's a great tackler, but he just needs to read the game better.

Molden can come in and be an excellent slot cornerback, especially on a team looking to rebuild its defensive backfield. Molden, who was the highest-graded slot corner of the PFF College era, was a borderline first-round talent and falls to the bottom of the third. There's no doubt that this is a great pick, and now Molden and Caleb Farley could change the outlook of the Titans' season. Molden is a playmaker and a great tackler — he has so much value at this pick it's incredible.

Day 3: The Titans got exceptional value here by selecting Rashad Weaver, PFF's EDGE10 and the 63rd-ranked prospect in this class. He has power, ideal size/length and technical refinement, but he's not going to impress from an athletic

standpoint. He is also on the older side. Still, he has an incredibly high floor and should be able to make an impact right away. After coming off a torn ACL, Weaver posted a 90.0 pass-rush grade this past year.

NBC Sports (Nick Goss)

Grade: B

Virginia Tech's Caleb Farley was worth the gamble at No. 22 in the first round, despite his durability concerns. He has the potential to be a star cornerback. Getting a really good left tackle in North Dakota State's Dillon Radunz in the second round was a nice pickup for Tennessee, too.

Sporting News (Vinnie Iyer)

Grade: B+

GM Jon Robinson got plenty of the cornerback and wide receiver reinforcements his team needed after getting gutted there in free agency. Radunz can start right away at right tackle. Fitzpatrick is a good replacement for Corey Davis. Rice will be active for Mike Vrabel.

New York Post (Ryan Dunleavy)

Grade: B-

Key Picks: Caleb Farley (CB, Virginia Tech), Dillon Radunz (OT, North Dakota State), Monty Rice (LB, Georgia), Elijah Molden (CB, Washington)

Analysis: Farley is boom-or-bust. He was the top-ranked CB until a second back surgery since he last played a game in 2019. Evaluations on Radunz were all over the place, too. Molden is a relatively safe pick in a new-look secondary.
