PRO: The Titans drafted Carnell Tate with the fourth overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-2-inch, 192-pounder is a crafty route runner and proven downfield threat who possesses a large catch radius and elite body control. The Chicago, Ill., native played three seasons (2023-25) at Ohio State where he tallied 121 receptions for 1,872 yards with 14 touchdowns.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Tate tragically lost his mother, Ashley Griggs, in 2023 due to a drive-by shooting. Tate has honored his mom every step of the way since losing the woman closest to him. In college, he would blow kisses to the sky whenever he scored to honor her. In 2025, Tate took time out to meet a young Ohio State fan who had also lost his mother to a drive-by shooting and offered advice and support on handling grief. During the Combine, Tate wore a necklace with his mom's name on it as he completed the on-field drills. On draft night, Tate had his mother's name inscribed on his suit jacket.
- Tate has a love for Legos and video games, including his current favorite Call of Duty.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Chicago, Ill., native was selected by the Titans in the first round (fourth overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

COLLEGE:

- Saw action in 39 games with 27 starts over three seasons (2023-25) at Ohio State. Finished his career with 121 receptions for 1,872 yards and 14 touchdowns. Had a reception in 37 of 39 games in which he played.

AS A JUNIOR (2025), appeared in 11 games and recorded 51 receptions for 875 yards, a 17.2 yards per reception average with nine touchdowns. Had four 100-yard receiving games. Named a first-team All-Big Ten by both coaches and media. Was named a first-team Academic All-American by the College Sports Communicators. Four major organizations – the American Football Coaches Association, The Sporting News, Associated Press and On3 – named him a second-team All-American as a junior.

- Against Ohio (9/13), had five receptions for 101 yards and one touchdown.
- Against Minnesota (10/4), totaled a career-high 183 receiving yards off a career-best nine catches.
- At Wisconsin (10/18), recorded six receptions for 111 yards with two touchdowns.
- Against Penn State (11/1), totaled five receptions for 124 yards with one touchdown.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2024), started in 15 games and caught 52 passes for 733 yards with four touchdowns during the Ohio State national championship run.

- Against Nebraska (10/26), tallied four receptions for 102 yards with one touchdown. It marked his first 100-yard receiving game.
- Against Northwestern (11/16), had a memorable and personal homecoming in the Northwestern game at Wrigley Field with four catches for 52 yards with two touchdowns.
- Against Texas (1/10), recorded seven receptions for 87 yards in the College Football Playoff game.
- Against Notre Dame (1/20), recorded two receptions for 35 yards in the National Championship Game.

AS A FRESHMAN (2023), appeared in 13 games with one start and recorded 18 receptions for 264 yards with one touchdown. His freshman season totals eclipsed the freshman year totals of recent Ohio State greats: Chris Olave (12 receptions in 2018), Marvin Harrison Jr. (11 in 2021), Curtis Samuel (11 in 2014) and Jaxon Smith-Njigba (10 in 2020).

- Against Indiana (9/2), caught a pass in his first game as a Buckeye.
- Against Western Kentucky (9/16), scored his first touchdown on a 28-yard reception.
- At Purdue (10/14), had three receptions for 79 yards.
- Set to graduate in May with a degree in Sports Industries from Ohio State.

PERSONAL:

- Attended Marist (Ill.) High School for his freshman and sophomore seasons before finishing his high school career at IMG Academy.
- Was named a four-star prospect and the No. 25 player nationally regardless of position by 247Sports as a senior.
- As a senior (2022), averaged 20.3 yards per catch as a senior. Totaled 750 yards receiving and eight touchdowns over eight games.
- As a freshman (2019), became one of the first freshmen to play varsity games at the coveted Catholic college prep school, Marist, finishing his freshman year with 28 receptions for 444 yards with five touchdowns.
- Son of LeSean Tate and the late Ashley Griggs.
- Has four siblings: A'Kayla, Re'Niyah, Re'Asia and LeSean Tate Jr.

PRO: The Titans traded back into the first round to select Keldric Faulk with the 31st overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-5-inch, 274-pounder is powerful, athletic pass rusher that can set the edge on the defensive front. The Highland Home, Ala., native played three seasons (2023-25) at Auburn where he tallied 109 tackles, 10 sacks, 19.5 stops for loss, six passes defended, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Faulk's father was the late Russell Eric Faulk, who passed away in a car accident in November 2008 when Keldric was three years old. Russell was a former football player who inspired Keldric and his brother, J.J., to play the sport.
- Faulk and his brother, J.J., were teammates at Auburn during the 2025 season. The brothers have hosted a turkey drive the last two Thanksgivings in their hometown of Highland Home, Ala.
- Faulk registered his first career collegiate sack at Nissan Stadium in the 2023 Music City Bowl.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Highland Home, Ala., native was selected by the Titans in the first round (31st overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

COLLEGE:

- Saw action in 37 games with 32 starts over three seasons (2023-25) at Auburn and registered 109 tackles, 10 sacks, 19.5 stops for loss, six passes defended, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. Named third team All-SEC in his final collegiate campaign.

AS A JUNIOR (2025), started on the edge in all 12 games and totaled 29 tackles, including two sacks and five stops for loss. Named a team captain and selected All-SEC third team. Made 32 consecutive starts dating back to 2023. Tied for the team lead with four passes defended and added a fumble recovery.

- At Baylor (8/29), began the season with four tackles, including a sack, to go along with a pass defended.
- At Oklahoma (9/20), made two tackles with a sack and a pass defended.
- Against Missouri (10/18), totaled four tackles with a stop for loss.
- Against Kentucky (11/1), recorded a season-high five tackles with a stop for loss.
- Against Alabama (11/29), posted three tackles and a pass defended.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2024), started all 12 games and recorded 45 tackles, seven sacks, 11 stops for loss, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass defended.

- Against California (9/7), registered a career-best eight tackles, including two sacks and another stop for loss.
- At Georgia (10/5), posted seven tackles, including two sacks.
- At Kentucky (10/26), named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after tallying three tackles with two sacks.
- At Alabama (11/30), recorded six tackles, two stops for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Iron Bowl.

AS A FRESHMAN (2023), played in all 13 games with eight starts and registered 35 tackles, a sack, 3.5 stops for loss and a pass defended. Named to the SEC all-freshman team.

- Against Ole Miss (10/21), posted a season-best six tackles, including a stop for loss.

- Against Alabama (11/25), notched four tackles in the Iron Bowl.
- Against Maryland (12/30), posted three tackles, including his first career collegiate sack in Music City Bowl.
- Graduated with a degree in interdisciplinary studies from Auburn.

- Attended Highland Home (Ala.) High School and led the Flying Squadron to a 13-2 overall record and the semifinals of the 2022 AHSAA 2A state playoffs.

PRO: The Titans selected Anthony Hill Jr. in the second round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-2-inch, 238-pounder brings an impressive mix of size and speed to the linebacker position. The Denton, Texas native played three seasons (2023-25) at Texas where he tallied 249 tackles, 31.5 tackles for loss, 17 sacks, eight forced fumbles and three interceptions.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Hill is a big gamer and enjoys playing Madden, NBA 2K, Fortnite and Call of Duty. Hill has hopes to start a program to give kids in need gaming systems in order to connect with them and offer encouragement through hard times.
- Hill was born in Wichita, Kan. at the same hospital as Hall of Fame running back Barry Sanders.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Denton, Texas, native was selected by the Titans in the second round (60th overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

COLLEGE:

- Saw action in 40 games with 32 starts over three seasons (2023-25) at Texas. Finished his career with 249 tackles, 31.5 tackles for loss, 17 sacks, eight forced fumbles and three interceptions.

AS A JUNIOR (2025), started 10 games and recorded 69 tackles, seven tackles for loss, four sacks, two interceptions, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Named a second-team All-American by the Associated Press, AFCA and FWAA. Was a finalist for the Butkus Award and a semifinalist for the Chuck Bednarik Award. Selected to the coaches' All-SEC second team.

- Against San Jose State (9/6), notched six tackles and recorded a career-high two forced fumbles.
- At Florida (10/4), recorded 14 total tackles as well as a fumble recovery.
- At Kentucky (10/18), registered 12 tackles and an interception.
- At Mississippi (10/25), notched 10 tackles and 2.5 sacks for 18 yards as well as a forced fumble.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2024), started all 16 games and led the team with 113 tackles and 16.5 tackles for loss. Also tallied eight sacks, one interceptions, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Registered three double-digit tackle performances. Named a second-team All-American by the Associated Press, AFCA, Sporting News and Walter Camp.

- Against Louisiana Monroe (9/21), recorded an interception.
- Against Oklahoma (10/12), tallied 11 tackles, two sacks, 3.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Named SEC co-defensive Player of the Week and Lott IMPACT National Player of the Week for his performance.
- Against Kentucky (11/23), set a season-high with four tackles for loss.
- Against Georgia (12/7), had a fumble recovery that he returned 25 yards.
- Against Ohio State (1/10), tallied six tackles and half a sack in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl at the CFP Semifinal.

AS A FRESHMAN (2023), appeared in all 14 games with six starts and totaled 66 tackles, eight tackles for loss, five sacks, one forced fumble, four quarterback hurries and two pass breakups. His five sacks are tied for fourth-most by a Longhorn freshman and are the third-most by a Texas

true freshman. Named co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year and honorable mention All-Big 12.

- At Alabama (9/9), had six tackles including two for a loss and two sacks. Earned Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Week and 247Sports True Freshman of the Week for his performance.
- Against Oklahoma (10/7), registered a then career-high eight tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss, one sack and one pass breakup in the Red River Rivalry game.
- Against Brigham Young (10/28), earned his first career start and tallied five tackles, one tackle for loss and one pass breakup.
- Against Texas Tech (11/24), tallied four tackles and a sack.
- Against Oklahoma State (12/2), had six tackles, one tackle for loss, one sack and a forced fumble in the Big 12 Championship Game victory.
- Majored in Communications & Leadership at Texas.

PERSONAL:

- Attended Denton Ryan (Texas) High School and recorded 303 tackles, 13 sacks and nine forced fumbles, while also rushing for 378 yards and 13 touchdowns over three years at Ryan. Named an All-American and all-state honoree as a member of the state championship team.
- Rated No. 18 nationally, No. 2 among outside linebackers and No. 4 overall in the state of Texas by ESPN.
- As a senior (2022), despite being limited to six games as a senior due to injury, still totaled 67 tackles, two sacks and five forced fumbles. Part of a defense that allowed 19.3 points per game in his six games, including a shutout against Saginaw.
- As a junior (2021), selected first-team 5A All-State by Texas Sports Writers Association. Tabbed first-team MaxPreps Junior All-American. Named unanimous MVP of District 1 and first-team all-district. Registered 131 total tackles, 18 tackles for loss, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Also rushed for 176 yards and seven touchdowns. Helped Ryan to a 12-2 overall record, including an 8-0 district mark and title and an appearance in the 5A Division 1 quarterfinals.
- As a sophomore (2020), tabbed honorable mention 5A All-State by the Texas Sports Writers Association in 2020. Named first-team MaxPreps Sophomore All-American. Chosen Defensive Newcomer of the Year of District 5-5A Division 1 and first-team all-district. Tallied 105 tackles, 11 tackles for loss, three sacks and two forced fumbles as a sophomore. Part of a defense that allowed just 15.8 points per game, including six games of 10 points or fewer. Helped Ryan to a 15-0 overall record, including a 7-0 district mark and title, and the 5A Division 1 state championship in 2020.

PRO: The Titans selected Fernando Carmona Jr. in the fifth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-5-inch, 316-pounder is an athletic, versatile offensive lineman with a strong competitive nature. The Las Vegas, Nev., native spent three seasons (2021-23) at San Jose State before transferring to Arkansas for his final two collegiate seasons. Carmona finished his college career with 49 consecutive starts.

TITANS TIDBITS:

• Despite growing up the son of a football coach, Carmona never played tackle football growing up. It wasn't until his junior year of high school his older brother convinced him to give football a try. In high school, Carmona lined up at tight end, but transitioned to offensive line upon arriving at San Jose State.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

• The Las Vegas, Nev., native was selected by the Titans in the fifth round (142nd overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

COLLEGE:

• Started 49 of 50 college games over three seasons (2021-23) at San Jose State and two seasons (2024-25) at Arkansas. Started 37 games at left tackle before making the transition to left guard where he started the final 12 games of his college career.

AS A SENIOR (2025), made the transition to left guard and started all 12 games. Helped pave the way for six games with 500-plus yards of total offense. Named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

AS A JUNIOR (2024), started all 13 games at left tackle for the Razorbacks. Helped Arkansas average 495.5 yards of total offense per game which ranked 10th nationally while pass blocking for an aerial attack that ranked 18th nationally with an average of 274.7 yards per game. Named to the All-SEC third team by the conference coaches.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2023), started all 12 games at left tackle to help guide San Jose State to a co-regular season Mountain West Championship. Played a total of 765 snaps and finished the season with an overall grade of 81.5 per PFF. Logged a pass block grade of 81.0 and a run block grade of 78.9. Allowed just two sacks in 424 pass blocking snaps. Named honorable mention All-Mountain West. Transferred to Arkansas following the season.

AS A FRESHMAN (2022), started all 12 games at left tackle. Recorded 809 offensive snaps. Allowed just three sacks in 569 pass blocking snaps. Earned his first collegiate start against Portland State (9/1). Earned Academic All-Mountain West honors.

AS A REDSHIRT FRESHMAN (2021), appeared in one game before redshirting.

PRO: The Titans selected Nick Singleton in the fifth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot, 219-pounder is powerful, athletic ball carrier that also excels as a receiver out of the backfield and as a kick returner on special teams. The Shillington, Pa., native played four seasons (2022-25) at Penn State where he finished his collegiate career as the Nittany Lions' all-time record holder with 55 career touchdowns, 45 career rushing scores and 5,586 career all-purpose yards.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Singleton enjoys giving back to his community. He volunteered for the Governor Mifflin midget football program, took part in Mifflin's elementary school literacy outreach program and given his time to numerous community clean-up events.
- Singleton was teammates with Titans safety Kevin Winston Jr. at Penn State.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Shillington, Pa., native was selected by the Titans in the fifth round (165th overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft.

COLLEGE:

• Saw action in 53 games with 31 starts over four seasons (2022-25) at Penn State and registered 622 carries for 3,461 yards with 45 rushing touchdowns and 102 receptions for 987 yards with nine receiving scores. Set the all-time Penn State records with 55 career touchdowns, 45 career rushing touchdowns and 5,586 career all-purpose yards. Became first Big Ten player with 5,000-plus career all-purpose yards and 50-plus touchdowns since Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor (2017-19) and joined Saquon Barkley as the only Nittany Lions to do so.

AS A SENIOR (2025), selected All-Big Ten honorable mention (coaches and media - return specialist) and All-Big Ten honorable mention (media - running back). Played in 12 games with four starts and rushed 123 times for 549 yards with 13 touchdowns. Added 24 catches for 219 yards with a receiving score and seven kick returns for 145 yards.

- Against Florida International (9/6), ran the ball 13 times for 76 yards with a five-yard touchdown. Surpassed the 3,000 career rushing yards mark.
- Against Indiana (11/8), collected 143 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns. Recorded 10 rushes for 71 yards, including two touchdowns and a season-long 59-yard run. Tallied three receptions for 22 yards with a receiving score.
- At Rutgers (11/29), rushed nine times for 86 yards with two touchdowns. Broke the Penn State career touchdowns and career rushing touchdowns records.

AS A JUNIOR (2024), named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media as a running back and a return specialist. Appeared in 15 games with 12 starts and recorded 172 carries for 1,099 yards with 12 touchdowns on the ground, while adding 41 catches for 375 yards with five receiving scores. Posted 14 kickoff returns for 331 yards with a long return of 66 yards. Led the Big Ten in all-purpose yardage (1,805; 7th nationally), while finishing third in yards from scrimmage (1,474; 19th), fourth in yards per carry (6.3), tied for fifth in rushing touchdowns (12) and sixth in rushing yardage (1,099).
