TITANS-PANTHERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

LEVIS, YOUNG MEET FOR FIRST TIME IN NFL: Sunday's Titans-Panthers contest features two of the top four quarterbacks selected in the 2023 NFL Draft. The Panthers used the first-overall selection to draft Alabama's **Bryce Young**, and 32 picks later, the Titans chose Kentucky's **Will Levis** with the 33rd overall pick.

While Young was inserted as his team's starter since the beginning of the season and has been in the lineup for all but one contest, Levis is four starts into his career. In the past four games, Levis has completed 73 of 124 passes for 857 yards and six touchdowns with two interceptions.

The two former Southeastern Conference signal callers never faced each other in college, as their respective teams did not meet during Levis' time in Lexington from 2021 to 2022.

Last week at Jacksonville, Levis tossed a 43-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins**. It was the rookie quarterback's fourth touchdown pass in as many games that went for 30-plus yards.

From Week 8 to Week 11, Miami's Tua Tagovailoa was the only other NFL quarterback with four completed touchdown passes of 30-plus yards.

<u>SIMMONS JOINS LIST TOPPED BY VRABEL:</u> During last week's game at Jacksonville, Titans defensive tackle <u>Jeffery Simmons</u> played two snaps on offense in short-yardage situations, bringing his season total to four such plays. Those snaps have resulted in three touchdowns and one additional fourth-down conversion.

Against the Jaguars, Simmons' first offensive snap, a fourth-and-one rushing attempt by **Derrick Henry**, resulted in five yards and a first down. On Simmons' next chance on offense, he recorded his first career touchdown on a two-yard pass from **Will Levis**.

Simmons became the NFL's first defensive lineman with a touchdown reception since Miami's **Christian Wilkins** against the New York Jets on Dec. 19, 2021

Additionally, he joined a list of 10 other players with a touchdown reception and at least 25 career sacks since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982. Titans head coach **Mike Vrabel**, who had 57 career sacks during his playing days with the Pittsburgh Steelers, New England Patriots and Kansas City Chiefs, is at the top of the grouping with 10 touchdown receptions. Vrabel had two additional touchdown grabs in postseason play.

HOPKINS AN ASSET FOR ROOKIE QUARTERBACKS: DeAndre Hopkins caught a 43-yard touchdown pass from Will Levis last week. It was the fourth time in as many games that Hopkins was on the receiving end of a touchdown pass from the rookie quarterback.

In the four weeks Levis has been the Titans' starter, Hopkins' four touchdown receptions are tied for the highest total in the NFL. Houston's **Tank Dell** and Dallas' **CeeDee Lamb** are the only other players with that many. Also during that span, Hopkins ranks sixth in the league with an average of 18.3 yards per reception (15 for 274 yards).

This is the second time in his career in which Hopkins has contributed touchdowns to a teammate's rookie campaign as a starting quarterback. In 2017, he was a veteran with the Houston Texans when **Deshaun Watson** appeared in seven contests for the team as a rookie. Hopkins was on the receiving end of seven touchdown passes that season by Watson.

In the 11 seasons since Hopkins entered the NFL in 2013, his total of 11 touchdown receptions on passes thrown by rookie quarterbacks ranks second in the NFL. Only current New England Patriots tight end **Hunter Henry** has more (14).

On the opposite sideline from the Titans this week, Panthers wide receiver **DJ Chark Jr.** will have an opportunity to increase his career total of 10 touchdowns on passes from rookie signal callers. He has 10 such scores, including two this season from Panthers rookie starter **Bryce Young**.

Additionally, Hopkins can accomplish the following this week against Carolina:

- > He needs 52 receiving yards (currently 11,948) to become the 29th player in NFL history to reach 12,000 career receiving yards.
- > With five receptions (currently 895), he will become the 25th player in NFL history to reach 900 career receptions.
- He can become the fifth NFL player to record 900 receptions (currently 895), 12,000 receiving yards (11,948) and 75 receiving touchdowns (75) within his first 11 seasons, joining Marvin Harrison, Jerry Rice, Brandon Marshall and Larry Fitzgerald. Only 16 previous players have reached all three numbers within their entire careers, regardless of number of seasons accumulated. Hopkins would be the only active player on that list.
- One reception will extend his active streak to 156 consecutive games with a reception—every game he has played since he entered the NFL. It is the longest active streak in the NFL. Hopkins' streak is the fourth-longest in NFL history to begin a career behind only Marvin Harrison (190 consecutive games), Keyshawn Johnson (167) and Marshall Faulk (158).
- He can register his 42nd career 100-yard receiving game and his third 100-yard game as a member of the Titans.
- One touchdown reception will give him eight career seasons with at least five touchdown catches.

VRABEL TO PASS PHILLIPS IN GAMES AS HEAD COACH: Following this week's game against the Carolina Panthers, **Mike Vrabel** will be behind only **Jeff Fisher** for the most career games as head coach in franchise history. Vrabel (53-44) enters the week with 97 games on the Titans sideline, including postseason. He is currently in a tie with **Bum Phillips** (53-44).

Fisher totaled a franchise-record 273 games (147-126) with the organization from 1994 to 2010.

Vrabel's 97 career games rank 13th among all active NFL head coaches.
