At Michigan ... four-year letterman ... appeared in 37 career games, including 33 contests at running back ... made 22 starting assignments in the backfield ... 2021 AFCA second-team All-American ... 2021 Associated Press All-American third team ... 2021 first-team All-Big Ten; earned honorable mention all-conference in 2019 and 2020 ... carried the ball 452 times for 2,324 yards and scored 30 rushing touchdowns ... had only 26 negative rushing yards his entire career ... had 10 career 100-yard rushing games ... rushed did not fumble in 452 rushing attempts ... 24th running back in school history to surpass 2,000 rushing yards ... caught 24 passes for 171 yards in his career.

Senior (2021) ... earned fourth varsity letter ... American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) All-American second team ... Associated Press All-American third team ... All-Big Ten first team (coaches and media) ... Michigan's Offensive Player of the Year ... voted by his teammates as the Toughest Player Award winner ... Doak Walker Award watch list ... started all 14 games at tailback ... carried the ball 270 times for 1,327 yards (4.9 avg.) and scored a school record 20 rushing touchdowns ... caught 18 passes for 131 (7.3 avg.) ... had four 150-yard rushing efforts and six overall games with more than 100 rushing yards ... had only six negative rushing yards all season ... No. 2-graded running back in the FBS by Pro Football Focus ... credited with 96 runs resulting in a first down (No. 1 in FBS) and 50 missed tackles forced ... finished 29th nationally in rushing yards per game (94.8 avg.) ... fourth in the NCAA in rushing TDs (20); broke former Wolverine Ron Johnson's school record of 19 which was set in 1968 ... totaled 70 yards on 13 carries with one touchdown vs. Western Michigan (Sept. 4) ... racked up a then career-high 155 rushing yards on 27 carries with one TD against Washington (Sept. 11) ... totaled 56 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries against Northern Illinois (Sept. 18) ... carried 12 times for 41 yards and scored two TDs vs. Rutgers (Sept. 25) ... carried 19 times at Wisconsin (Oct. 2), totaling 47 yards against the nation's top-ranked rushing defense with a six-yard reception ... racked up 123 rushing yards on 21 carries with two TDs at Nebraska (Oct. 9) ... led the team with 23 carries for 110 yards and two TDs against Northwestern (Oct. 23) ... had a team-high 59 yards rushing on 14 carries at Michigan State (Oct. 30) and caught two passes ... produced then career high numbers against Indiana (Nov. 6), with 27 carries for 168 yards and a touchdown; added a 20-yard catch ... gained over 200 all-purpose yards at Penn State (Nov. 13), rushing a career-high 31 times for 156 yards while adding 45 yards receiving ... produced two touchdowns and 78 yards on 20 carries at Maryland (Nov. 20) ... racked up a career-best 169 rushing yards on 28 carries and tied a Michigan record with five rushing TDs against Ohio State (Nov. 27) ... his five rushing scores against the Buckeyes are the most for any opponent against Ohio State ever ... named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against

OSU ... selected as the national player of the week by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Maxwell Football Club and the Rose Bowl for his record-setting performance against the Buckeyes ... carried 17 times for 56 yards and two touchdowns vs. Iowa in the Big Ten Championship Game (Dec. 4) ... added three receptions for 22 yards against the Hawkeyes ... carried nine times for 39 yards and had 15 yards in receptions against Georgia in the Capital One Orange Bowl/CFP Semifinal (Dec. 31).

Junior (2020) ... earned third varsity letter ... All-Big Ten honorable mention (coaches and media) ... team's leading rusher with 375 yards on 61 carries and a team-high six rushing scores ... led the team with two touchdowns and 82 rushing yards on six carries at Minnesota (Oct. 24); had a 66-yard run career long run ... had an eight-carry, 56-yard day with one rushing score against Michigan State (Oct. 31) ... totaled 19 yards on the ground at Indiana (Nov. 7) ... carried once for six yards against Wisconsin (Nov. 14) ... handled 25 carries and produced 109 yards with one touchdown at Rutgers (Nov. 21), his first starting assignment of the year ... started in the backfield against Penn State (Nov. 28), gaining 101 yards on 17 carries with a pair of two-yard rushing touchdowns ... produced back-to-back 100-yard rushing efforts.

Sophomore (2019) ... earned second varsity letter ... played in 13 games and started six contests at tailback ... Most Improved Player on offense ... All-Big Ten honorable mention (coaches and media) ... team's second-leading rusher with 121 carries for 622 yards (5.1 avg.) and four touchdowns ... caught six passes for 40 yards ... made his running back debut and carried the ball twice against Middle Tennessee State (Aug. 31) ... contributed on special teams vs. Army (Sept. 7) ... carried the ball once at Wisconsin (Sept. 21) ... earned nine carries and produced 45 yards against Rutgers (Sept. 28), and also played special teams ... gained 22 yards on two carries against Iowa (Oct. 5), playing running back while also contributing one special teams tackle ... ran for 125 yards on 12 carries at Illinois (Oct. 12) ... scored his first career touchdown on a 29-yard run to open the scoring against the Illini and had three 20-yard-plus runs in the contest (29, 28 and 24) ... totaled 28 yards on the ground at Penn State (Oct. 19) and made one special teams tackle ... made his first career start and racked up 149 yards on 20 carries against Notre Dame (Oct. 26); had a 49-yard long run ... started and produced 60 yards and one score on 13 carries at Maryland (Nov. 2) ... started and carried six times for 13 yards with a TD vs. Michigan State (Nov. 16) ... started and totaled 44 yards on 13 carries at Indiana (Nov. 23) ... gained 78 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown and added a nine-yard catch in start vs. Ohio State (Nov. 30) ... rushed 18 times for 61 yards and added a 19-yard career long reception in starting assignment vs. Alabama in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl (Jan. 1).

Freshman (2018) ... earned first varsity letter ... played in three contests ... spent time working with both the running backs and linebackers during the season ... made his career debut at Notre Dame (Sept. 1) ... saw special teams action against the Irish, Western Michigan (Sept. 8) and Florida in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Dec. 29).

Prep ... attended Eureka Senior High School (2018) coached by Jacob Sumner ... helped lead Eureka to the Missouri Class

6A State Semifinals in 2017 ... *Key Statistics* ... rushed 255 times for 2197 yards and 31 touchdowns as a senior, averaging 8.6 yards per carry ... ran for 100 yards or more in 12 of 13 contests, including five games with 200 yards rushing or more ... also caught 12 passes for 165 yards and two touchdowns and returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown ... added 25 tackles with nine sacks and two fumble recoveries on defense ... rushed 242 times for 1509 yards and 19 touchdowns as a junior; had nine 100-yard rushing efforts during the season including seven straight games ... caught 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns junior year ... registered 34 tackles and 12 sacks as a junior ... *Honors and Rankings* ... 247Sports three-star prospect, the No. 11 player overall in Missouri and the 70th-best running back in the nation ... 247Sports Composite ranking of No. 979 nationally, 49th-best running back and the No. 11 player in Missouri ... Rivals three-star recruit, the No. 12 player in the state of Missouri and the 40th-rated running back nationally ... ESPN three-star recruit, rated the No. 55 running back nationally and the 14th-best prospect in Missouri ... 2017 Missouri Football Coaches Association Class 6A Offensive Player of the Year as well as USA Today's Missouri Offensive Player of the Year ... listed as a 2017 Class 6A first-team all-state running back by the Missouri Football Coaches Association and Missouri Media ... two-time Suburban West American Offensive Player of the Year (2016, '17) ... 2017 St. Louis Dispatch All-Metro first team as a senior; earned second-team honors at running back as a junior ... two-time St. Louis All-American Large School Football Team (2016, '17).
