# TITANS-PATRIOTS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

TITANS LEADING NFL IN TACKLES FOR LOSS PER GAME: The Titans defense continues to drop opposing ball carriers in the backfield at a consistent rate. Last week at Detroit, the Titans totaled seven tackles for loss, including two apiece by outside linebacker Arden Key, defensive tackle Jeffery Simmons and cornerback Roger McCreary.

The Titans improved their season total to 46 tackles for loss in seven games, a rate of 6.6 per contest. They lead the NFL in tackles for loss per game, ahead of the division-rival Houston Texans at 6.5 per game.

The defense's performance in Detroit marked the Titans' seventh consecutive game to begin the season with six or more tackles for loss. From 2001 to 2023, the team never had six tackles for loss in each of a season's first five games. The team's longest season-opening streak during that stretch was four games in 2008.

With a minimum of six tackles for loss this week against the New England Patriots, the Titans will become the NFL's first team in the past 24 years to record six or more tackles for loss in each of their first eight games. The Titans' seven straight games places them in a tie with the 2015 Denver Broncos for the longest streak during that period.

**FEWEST SACKS ALLOWED SINCE WEEK 4:** From Week 4 through Week 8, the Titans have played four games, and during that time, the offense has allowed a total of five sacks. The Titans and Arizona Cardinals are tied for the fewest sacks allowed during that time.

The Titans have allowed a single sack two times (at Miami and at Detroit) and did not allow any sacks on one occasion (vs. Indianapolis) during that stretch. Their 1.3 sacks allowed per game ranks fourth over the season's past five weeks.

WESTBROOK-IKHINE MAKING MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITIES: Titans wide receiver Nick Westbrook-Ikhine enters this weekend's clash with the Patriots on a streak of three consecutive games with a touchdown reception. If he extends the streak to four games, it will mark the 14th occasion in franchise history that a player has registered four consecutive games with at least one touchdown reception. The most recent player to do so was A.J. Brown (five-game streak) in 2020.

Westbrook-Ikhine has three touchdowns on five total catches in 2024. His receptions include a nine-yard touchdown against Indianapolis (Oct. 13), a four-yard touchdown at Buffalo (Oct. 20), a six-yard reception for a first down at Buffalo, a 34-yard reception for a first down at Detroit (Oct. 27) and a five-yard touchdown at Detroit.

In the past 10 seasons (2015–2024), Westbrook-Ikhine is only the 10th NFL player—and the fifth wide receiver—to post three touchdown receptions within his first five overall catches in a season. The most recent case was tight end **Jimmy Graham** for the New Orleans Saints in 2023.

Westbrook-Ikhine is the first Titans/Oilers player to have three touchdowns within his first five catches of a season since wide receiver Willie Davis in 1996.
