TENNESSEE TITANS TRAINING CAMP PRESENTED BY SEATGEEK

All players to report by July 28, as Robert Saleh begins first training camp as head coach

NASHVILLE — All players are scheduled to report to Vanderbilt Health Football Center by Tuesday, July 28, for the start of 2026 Tennessee Titans Training Camp presented by SeatGeek. The first practice of camp is scheduled for 10:15 a.m. CT on Wednesday, July 29.

Robert Saleh is set to command his first training camp in Tennessee after being named the 22nd head coach in franchise history in January. He arrives with 21 seasons of NFL coaching experience, most recently as defensive coordinator with the San Francisco 49ers (2017-20, 2025) and as head coach with the New York Jets (2021-24).

The Titans enter their second training camp with **Mike Borgonzi** as general manager. He has assembled a 91-man camp roster that includes eight 2026 draftees and over 30 new veterans acquired through free agency, trades and waivers. Additionally, the entire nine-member draft class from 2025, headlined by quarterback **Cam Ward**, returns for its second year.



THE BASICS

The recently rebranded Vanderbilt Health Football Center (460 Great Circle Road) is the site of training camp for the 27th time. The club's headquarters, which opened at the conclusion of training camp in 1999, is located in MetroCenter, just north of downtown Nashville. In 2022, a renovation of the existing building and a 60,000-square-foot addition was completed at the facility.

Publicly-available tickets for seven open practices at Vanderbilt Health Football Center were claimed earlier in July. No tickets to attend practice are available on site for walk-up guests.

Additionally, the Titans will open Nissan Stadium for all fans on Friday, Aug. 7, for the Blue & White Stadium Scrimmage, presented by Pinnacle Financial Partners. Free tickets to the intrasquad scrimmage are available now at [TennesseeTitans.com/TrainingCamp](https://tennesseetitans.com/trainingcamp). Stadium gates open at 5 p.m., with practice scheduled to start at approximately 6:30 p.m.

Camp news and information is updated continuously at [TennesseeTitans.com](https://tennesseetitans.com), the Titans mobile app and on official team social channels.

PRESEASON GAMES AND JOINT PRACTICES

The Titans are scheduled for three preseason contests this August—all against NFC playoff clubs from 2025. In each case, the two teams will conduct a joint workout two days before the game, marking the first training camp in Titans history with combined practices against three different teams.

After reporting for camp, the Titans have two weeks to prepare for a joint practice with the San Francisco 49ers at SAP Performance Facility (Santa Clara, Calif.) on Tuesday, Aug. 11. Two days later, the Titans and 49ers square off in a preseason contest at Levi's Stadium (8 p.m. CT on Aug. 13).

The Titans return home for their final two preseason outings. The reigning Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks arrive at Vanderbilt Health Football Center for a joint practice on Friday, Aug. 21. On Sunday, Aug. 23, the Titans

host the Seahawks at Nissan Stadium in a nationally-televised preseason clash (7 p.m. on FOX).

The preseason concludes on Saturday, Aug. 29, as the Titans host the Chicago Bears (5 p.m.) to cap a week that also includes a Titans-Bears practice on Thursday, Aug. 27.

Since 1999, the Titans have traveled for joint practices in 2000 (with St. Louis in Macomb, Ill.), 2012 (with Atlanta in Dalton, Ga.), 2014 (Atlanta), 2021 (Tampa Bay), 2023 (Minnesota) and 2025 (Tampa Bay and Atlanta). During



the same time period, the Titans have hosted joint workouts at Vanderbilt Health Football Center in 2001 (Indianapolis), 2002 (Miami), 2003 (Miami), 2004 (Atlanta), 2008 (St. Louis), 2010 (Arizona), 2017 (Carolina), 2018 (Tampa Bay), 2019 (New England), 2022 (Tampa Bay and Arizona) and 2024 (Seattle).

The preseason games at San Francisco and against Chicago will air on WKRN News 2 in Nashville, as well as several regional affiliates. Titans Radio, including Nashville Flagship 104.5 The Zone, carries every Titans contest throughout the Mid-South.

On Sunday, Sept. 13, the Titans will launch their regular season with a home contest against the New York Jets.

ROSTER LIMITS

At the beginning of camp, NFL teams are permitted to carry up to 90 players on the roster—or 91 if the club is using an exemption for a player in the league's international pathway program, such as current Titans defensive end **David Ebuka Agoha**. This year there will be only one NFL-mandated roster cutdown, and it will occur on Aug. 30—one day after the preseason finale against the Bears. All teams must reach the 53-player active limit by 5 p.m. CT.

Players placed on reserve lists such as reserve/injured, reserve/physically unable to perform, and reserve/non-football injury or illness do not count towards the 53-man active roster limit. Each club may place two players on an applicable reserve list at the roster reduction to 53 players with the designation to return at a later date (minimum of four games elapsed). The two players will immediately count as two of the club's maximum of eight DFR designations during the regular season.

On Aug. 31, teams are permitted to establish practice squads with a maximum of 17 players, including one international player exemption.

ROSTER CONSTRUCTION

Borgonzi's 18-month tenure as GM has seen significant roster turnover. Entering training camp in 2026, only 17 of the 91 players on the team (as of July 26) were with the club before he was named GM in January 2025. During the 2026 offseason alone, 46 new players have arrived via the draft, free agency, trades or waivers.

The additions include eight members of the 2026 NFL Draft class. Borgonzi took wide receiver **Carnell Tate** with the fourth overall pick, and on the same night, he traded back into the first round to draft defensive end **Keldric Faulk** at No. 31. It marked only the second time in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999 to present) that the team had multiple first-rounders. The draftees also included linebacker **Anthony Hill Jr.** (Round 2), guard **Fernando Carmona Jr.** (5), running back **Nick Singleton** (5), defensive tackle **Jackie Marshall** (6), center **Pat Coogan** (6) and tight end **Jaren Kanak** (7).

Prior to the draft, the Titans targeted several key veterans in free agency. The haul included wide receiver **Wan'Dale Robinson** (formerly of the New York Giants), tight end **Daniel Bellinger** (Giants), punter **Tommy Townsend** (Houston Texans), defensive lineman **John Franklin-Myers** (Denver Broncos) and cornerbacks **Alontae Taylor** (New Orleans Saints) and **Cor'Dale Flott** (Giants). Two additional veterans—defensive end **Jermaine Johnson II** (New York Jets) and defensive tackle **Solomon Thomas** (Dallas Cowboys)—were acquired in trades.

Borgonzi saw his initial Titans draft class gain invaluable experience

as rookies in 2025. Each of the nine picks appeared in at least six games, and six members of the group started at least five games. The Titans draft class accumulated 64 combined starts, which ranked second in the NFL (75 by Cleveland) and was the largest total for the franchise in its "Titans era," which began in 1999.

Ward, the first overall pick, started all 17 games, and his 3,169 passing yards eclipsed **Marcus Mariota's** previous franchise rookie record (2,818 passing yards in 2015). With 15 touchdowns and seven interceptions on 323-of-540 passing, Ward's 1.3 percent interception rate was the best single-season mark in franchise history by all qualifying quarterbacks, breaking **Ryan Tannehill's** franchise mark of 1.5 percent in 2020. Over the final nine games of the season, Ward threw only one interception with 10 touchdown passes.

Another draft pick, wide receiver **Chimere Dike**, was named to the Pro Bowl as a returner and added first-team Associated Press All-Pro honors as a punt returner. Dike led the NFL with 2,427 all-purpose yards, which ranked third all-time for the franchise and first all-time among all NFL rookies. His 17.3-yard punt return average broke **Billy "White Shoes" Johnson's** franchise record (15.4) that stood since 1977, and he also posted a franchise-best 1,588 kickoff return yards. He scored six total touchdowns—four as a receiver and two as a punt returner.

Borgonzi's 2025 draft choices also featured second-round defensive end **Oluwafemi Oladejo** (six games, two starts), third-round safety **Kevin Winston Jr.** (10 games, six starts), fourth-round tight end **Gunnar Helm** (16 games, 10 starts), fourth-round wide receiver **Elic Ayomanor** (16 games, 14 starts), fifth-round guard **Jackson Slater** (12 games), sixth-round cornerback **Marcus Harris** (14 games, five starts) and sixth-round running back **Kalel Mullings** (nine games). All return to the squad in 2026.

Dike was one of two first-team All-Pros for the Titans, along with defensive tackle **Jeffery Simmons**, who also earned his fourth Pro Bowl berth and his third consecutive Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nomination. The veteran leader, who returns in 2026 for his eighth NFL campaign, paced all NFL interior defensive linemen in 2025 in solo tackles (39), tackles for loss (17), sacks (11), sack yards (79), quarterback pressures (60), pressure rate (14.5 percent) and forced fumbles (tied - three). His sacks, sack yards, tackles for loss and forced fumbles all set career highs. Borgonzi helped keep Simmons in Tennessee for the foreseeable future, rewarding him with a contract extension during the 2026 offseason.

PARKING AND MEDIA WORKROOM AT VANDERBILT HEALTH FOOTBALL CENTER: Parking at Vanderbilt Health Football Center is extremely limited. Please make contact with Titans football communications prior to coming to practice to receive instructions. Media arriving at training camp without prearrangements through the football communications staff are likely to be denied parking.

The media workroom inside Vanderbilt Health Football Center is located on the second floor. The workroom will be open on days the media is invited to cover practice and/or a press conference. Food is provided but only available to the working media.

Stand-ups on the field are permitted following practice and media availability, but otherwise media members will be asked to clear the field and return to the media workroom. Access to the field at other times must be prearranged with the football communications staff.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2026

WHAT TO LOOK FOR – TEAM

- The Titans franchise (499 all-time wins) needs one win to reach 500 all-time wins, including the regular season and postseason.

WR ELIC AYOMANOR

- After tallying 41 receptions for 515 yards and four touchdowns as a rookie in 2025, he can join **A.J. Brown** (2019-20), **Jerry Levias** (1969-70), **Bill Groman** (1960-61) and **Charlie Hennigan** (1960-61) as the only players in franchise history to reach 40 receptions, 500 receiving yards and four touchdown catches in each of his first two NFL seasons.

LS MORGAN COX

- Enters 2026 ranked sixth in the NFL in career games played among active players (250 entering 2026).
- Will reach 100 consecutive NFL games played by appearing in the team's first 10 games of the 2026 season.
- Enters 2026 with a team-best active streak of 85 consecutive games played.

WR CHIMERE DIKE

- After leading the NFL with a 17.3-yard punt return average in 2025, he can become the franchise's first player to lead the league in punt return average in consecutive seasons. The only other player in team annals to lead the NFL multiple times in punt returns is **Billy "White Shoes" Johnson** (1975 and 1977).
- Can become the franchise's first player since **Earl Campbell** (1978-79) to be named first-team Associated Press All-Pro in each of his first two NFL seasons.
- Can become the franchise's first player since **Chris Johnson** (2008-09) to be named to the Pro Bowl in each of his first two NFL seasons.

DL JOHN FRANKLIN-MYERS

- Can register his seventh consecutive season with at least 15 games played.
- Can notch his third consecutive campaign with at least seven sacks (7.0 in 2024 and 7.5 in 2025).

LB CEDRIC GRAY

- After totaling 160 tackles in 2025, he can become the franchise's first player in its "Titans era" (1999 to present) with 150 or more tackles in back-to-back seasons.

TE GUNNAR HELM

- After he had 44 receptions in 2025, which set a franchise record among rookie tight ends, Helm needs 45 receptions in 2026 to break **Ben Troupe's** franchise record (88) for the most receptions in a tight end's first two NFL seasons.

S AMANI HOOKER

- Needs three interceptions (12 entering 2026) to become the seventh player in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present) to reach 15 career interceptions.
- Will reach 100 career games played with four appearances in 2026.

T DAN MOORE JR.

- Can record 16 or more starts for the sixth consecutive season to begin his career.

RB TONY POLLARD

- Needs 218 rushing yards to reach 6,000 for his career (5,782 rushing yards entering 2026).
- Can notch his fifth consecutive season with at least 1,000 rushing yards.
- Joins **Derrick Henry** as the NFL's only players entering 2026 holding an active streak of four consecutive seasons with at least 1,000 rushing yards.
- Can notch his third consecutive season as a member of the Titans with at least 1,000 rushing yards. He would join **Chris Johnson** (six), **Eddie George** (five), **Earl Campbell** (four) and **Derrick Henry** (three) as the franchise's only players to accomplish the feat.
- Looks to extend his streak to six consecutive seasons with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards.
- Joins running backs **Derrick Henry** and **Saquon Barkley** and wide receiver **Amon-Ra St. Brown** as the NFL's only players entering 2026 holding an active streak of four consecutive seasons with at least 1,200 scrimmage yards.

WR CALVIN RIDLEY

- Enters the 2026 season with 405 receptions for 5,678 yards, averaging 14.0 yards per reception. He joins **Mike Evans**, **A.J. Brown**, **DK**

Metcalf, **Courtland Sutton** and **Justin Jefferson** as the NFL's only active players with at least 400 receptions and an average of at least 14.0 yards per catch.

- Needs 322 receiving yards to reach 6,000 for his career (5,678 entering 2025).
- Can record his fourth career 1,000-yard receiving season.

WR WAN'DALE ROBINSON

- Looks to register his third consecutive season with 90-plus receptions after a career-high 93 catches in 2024 and 92 catches in 2025. He was one of five players to reach the 90-reception mark in both 2024 and 2025, along with **Amon-Ra St. Brown**, **Ja'Marr Chase**, **Trey McBride** and **Jaxon Smith-Njigba**.
- Can log back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons after totaling a career-high 1,014 yards in 2025.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

- Enters the 2026 season with 42.5 career sacks. With 10 more sacks, he will move past **Jevon Kearse** (52.0) as the team's sack leader in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999 to present).
- With 10 sacks in 2026, he will join **Sean Jones** (1990-91) and **Jevon Kearse** (1999–2001) as the only Titans/Oilers players since 1982 to reach double-digit sacks in consecutive campaigns.
- Needs 7.5 sacks (42.5 entering 2025) to become the ninth player in franchise history to reach 50 career sacks and the seventh such player to do so since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982.
- Can record his sixth consecutive season with at least five sacks. He would join **Ray Childress** (nine consecutive seasons), **Jurrell Casey** (seven), **William Fuller** (six) and **Sean Jones** (six) as the only Titans/Oilers players to do so since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982.
- Will reach 100 career games played with his first appearance of 2026.
- His 99 career games played with the Titans are the most among all current players on the team entering 2026.

G PETER SKORONSKI

- Enters 2026 with a team-best active streak of 47 consecutive starts.
- Can notch his third consecutive season without missing an offensive snap.

K JOEY SLYE

- Slye connected on 28 field goals in 2025, his first season in Tennessee. If he reaches the number again in 2026, he will join **Rob Bironas** (2007-08) as the only players in franchise history with 28 or more field goals in back-to-back campaigns.
- Can log his third consecutive season and fifth total season with 100 or more points.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

- Shares with **Riq Woolen** a league-best active streak of four consecutive seasons with at least 11 passes defended entering 2026.
- Can appear in all 17 games for the fourth consecutive campaign.

P TOMMY TOWNSEND

- Enters 2026 as one of four active players who have averaged 47.0 yards per punt in each of the last five seasons, joining **Logan Cooke** (six consecutive seasons), **Bryan Anger** (five) and **AJ Cole** (five).
- Enters the 2026 season with a career net punting average of 42.8 yards, tying **Blake Gillikin** for fourth in NFL history (since 1976; minimum of 250 career punts) behind only **Logan Cooke** (43.4), **Jack Fox** (43.1) and **Michael Dickson** (42.9).
- Can notch his third consecutive season with at least 30 punts inside the 20. He is the NFL's only player with at least 30 punts inside the 20 in each of the past two campaigns.

QB CAM WARD

- Can record his second consecutive season with 3,000-plus passing yards. As a rookie in 2025, he became the first rookie in franchise history with 3,000 passing yards (3,169).
- Can join **Warren Moon** (1989-91), **Steve McNair** (2001-03), **George Blanda** (1963-64), **Marcus Mariota** (2016-17) and **Ryan Tannehill** (2020-21) as the only quarterbacks in franchise history with 3,000 passing yards in consecutive seasons.
- Enters 2026 with one interception and 10 touchdown passes in his past nine games.

SEASON NOTES

- **FAREWELL SEASON:** With the opening of the new Nissan Stadium set for 2027, this season will mark the farewell season at the current Nissan Stadium. The Titans will open the campaign with a home game against the New York Jets in Week 1, and the team will close out its final regular season in the current building in Week 17 against the Pittsburgh Steelers. The Titans have already played more games at Nissan Stadium than any other venue in the franchise's history entering 2026. Including regular season and postseason games, the team has appeared 224 times at Nissan Stadium (119-105), one more than the 223 total contests at the Astrodome (116-105-2) from 1968 to 1996.
- **PLAYOFF OPPONENTS:** The Titans have six total games against four playoff teams from last season. They have home games against Houston, Jacksonville, Philadelphia and Pittsburgh and road contests at Houston and Jacksonville. Four of those games are against 2025 division winners: Jaguars twice (AFC South), Pittsburgh (AFC North) and Philadelphia (NFC East). This is the third consecutive year in which the Titans will have six games against reigning playoff clubs.
- **TV BREAKDOWN:** Excluding their Week 18 matchup at Houston, which has yet to be assigned a broadcasting network, the Titans are currently scheduled for 10 games on CBS and six games on FOX. Due to the NFL's flex scheduling, some contests could be moved to a different network from the one appearing on the initial schedule.
- **TOP DRAFT PICKS:** The Titans selected Carnell Tate with the fourth overall pick in this year's draft. The team is slated to face seven of the top-11 players selected in this year's draft, including Fernando Mendoza (first overall – Las Vegas), David Bailey (second overall – N.Y. Jets), Arvell Reese (fifth overall – N.Y. Giants), Sonny Styles (seventh overall – Washington), Spencer Fano (ninth overall – Cleveland), Francis Mauigoa (10th overall – N.Y. Giants) and Caleb Downs (11th overall – Dallas). Tate, Reese, Styles and Downs were teammates at Ohio State University.
- **HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE:** Robert Saleh was one of 10 NFL head coaches who were hired by their teams this offseason, and the Titans will face five of the others: New York Giants' John Harbaugh, Baltimore's Jesse Minter, Cleveland's Todd Monken, Las Vegas' Klint

Kubiak and Pittsburgh's Mike McCarthy. It is the first time since 2022 the Titans will face five-or-more head coaches in their first season with their team.

- **THREE GAMES BASED UPON 2025 FINISH:** Every NFL team has two intraconference games and one interconference matchup based on the previous year's standings. As a result of the Titans' fourth-place AFC South finish in 2025, they host the AFC East's fourth-place New York Jets, and they visit the AFC West's fourth-place Las Vegas Raiders and the NFC North's fourth-place Detroit Lions. Overall, the Titans' strength of schedule is .476 (137-151-1) based upon their opponents' combined 2025 record, the eighth lowest out of 32 NFL teams.
- **NEW YORK TIES:** The Titans will face off against both the New York Jets and Giants this season with multiple ties to each franchise. Head coach Robert Saleh was the head coach of the Jets from 2021-24, while offensive coordinator Brian Daboll was head coach of the Giants from 2022-25. In addition to Saleh and Daboll, several current Titans players and coaches have also spent time with the New York franchises.
- **OFFENSIVE LEADERS:** The revamped Titans defense under head coach Robert Saleh will face two of the top-five offenses from last season in the Dallas Cowboys (second – 391.9 yards per game) and Detroit Lions (fifth – 373.2).
- **TIME (ZONE) TRAVEL:** The Titans will stay in the Central time zone for 10 matchups in 2026, including every home game and their two trips to Texas against the Cowboys and the Texans. They will double their trips to the Eastern time zone from three in 2025 to six in 2026 (at N.Y. Giants, Baltimore, Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Jacksonville and Detroit). Outside of a preseason visit to San Francisco, the farthest Tennessee will fly is to Las Vegas, their second trip to Nevada in two seasons after never playing there before 2025. The Titans will not play in the Mountain time zone.

WEEK-BY-WEEK SCHEDULE NOTES

- **WEEK 1 vs. NEW YORK JETS:** The Titans open the farewell season at Nissan Stadium against the New York Jets. On Sept. 13, two of the charter American Football League members will meet for the second time in three seasons and for the 47th time in the series (including postseason). Founded in 1960, the New York franchise was originally

known as the "Titans" until becoming the Jets in 1963. Tennessee owns a 24-21-1 regular season lead in the series, with a win in the lone postseason matchup between the clubs. Head coach Robert Saleh served as the Jets' head coach from 2021 to 2024. Other former Jets and current Titans include newly-acquired defensive end Jermaine Johnson II, safety Tony Adams and defensive linemen John Franklin-Myers and Solomon Thomas.

- **WEEK 2 vs. PHILADELPHIA EAGLES:** Tennessee is 3-0 in matchups against Philadelphia at Nissan Stadium, where the teams will meet on Sept. 20. The last time the Eagles migrated to Nashville was 2018, a 26-23 overtime Titans win that included Tennessee converting two fourth downs on a drive for the deciding touchdown. This will be the first visit to Nissan Stadium for Eagles coach Nick Sirianni, who has helped the team to 65 wins (including postseason) and two Super Bowl berths (2022, 2024) since arriving in 2021. The Eagles have an 8-5 series edge over the Titans in their regular season contests.
- **WEEK 3 at NEW YORK GIANTS:** On Sept. 27, the Titans will travel to the Meadowlands to take on the Giants, who have never beaten Tennessee at MetLife Stadium (0-2). The Giants hold a 7-5 all-time series lead on the Titans. The previous meeting between the clubs was in Week 1 of the 2022 season, a 21-20 Giants comeback win. The series has also provided a memorable Titans comeback, when Tennessee rallied from a 21-point deficit in the fourth quarter to defeat New York 24-21 in 2006. Titans offensive coordinator Brian Daboll spent the previous four seasons (2022-25) as the head coach of the Giants. Other first-year Titans coaches who spent the 2025 season on the Giants staff include Carmen Bricillo, Marquand Manuel and Shea Tierney. The Titans also signed former Giants' players Daniel Bellinger, Cor'Dale Flott, Wan'Dale Robinson and Austin Schlottmann during the 2026 offseason. Giants passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach Brian Callahan and defensive coordinator Dennard Wilson formerly served as Titans head coach and defensive coordinator, respectively.
- **WEEK 4 at BALTIMORE RAVENS:** The Titans will travel to Baltimore for the first time since 2020 and face off against running back Derrick Henry, who joined the Ravens in 2024 after an eight-year career with the Titans. Henry ranks second in Titans/Oilers history in rushing yards (9,502) and attempts (2,030) while holding a franchise record with 90 career rushing touchdowns. The Titans and Ravens have developed a heated rivalry over the course of 27 all-time meetings since the series originated in 1996, highlighted by five postseason contests — most recently a 20-13 Ravens Wild Card victory on Jan. 10, 2021.
- **WEEK 5 (H) & WEEK 18 (A) vs. HOUSTON TEXANS:** The Titans and Texans rivalry enters its 25th season. The two teams have split the season series in six of the last nine years. The Titans will look to take the lead in the series as it currently sits tied at 24 wins apiece. Head coach DeMeco Ryans and quarterback C.J. Stroud enter their fourth year together. The Texans have reached the playoffs the previous three seasons but have fallen short in the divisional round each year.
- **WEEK 6 (A) & WEEK 15 (H) vs. INDIANAPOLIS COLTS:** The Titans look to end the Colts' six-game winning streak in the rivalry. Prior to the Colts' streak, the Titans won five consecutive matchups in the series from 2020-22. Titans' defensive coordinator, Gus Bradley, spent three seasons as the Colts defensive coordinator from 2022-24, including two years under current Colts head coach Shane Steichen. The two coaches spent four years together (2017-20) with the Chargers as Steichen climbed the ranks from offensive quality control to quarterbacks coach to offensive coordinator while Bradley served as defensive coordinator.
- **WEEK 7 vs. CLEVELAND BROWNS:** Cleveland visits Nissan Stadium for the first time since Dec. 6, 2020, when the Browns left with a 41-25 victory. Overall, Cleveland holds a 37-33 lead in the all-time series dating back to 1970. Last season, the Titans captured a victory at Cleveland while Tony Pollard rushed for a career-high 161 yards, Jeffery Simmons totaled 1.5 sacks and James Williams Sr. blocked a punt.
- **WEEK 8 at CINCINNATI BENGALS:** The Titans lead the all-time series against the Bengals, 41-38-1. From 2021 to 2024, the Bengals visited Nissan Stadium every year and claimed three out of the four matchups, including the 2021 divisional playoff game. This will be the first time the Titans travel to Cincinnati since 2020. The Bengals are led by seventh-year quarterback Joe Burrow and eight-year head coach Zac Taylor.

- **WEEK 9 (BYE):** This season marks the first time since 2014 the Titans have had a Week 9 bye. It comes one week earlier than the Week 10 bye the Titans had in 2025.
- **WEEK 10 (H) & WEEK 12 (A) vs. JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS:** The Titans and Jaguars will play two games in a three-week span, as the Jaguars defend their divisional crown. In 2025, the Jaguars went 13-4 to win the AFC South for the first time since 2022. The Titans, who lead the series 34-28 including the postseason, look to regain the momentum in the series after being swept the past two seasons. Titans defensive coordinator Gus Bradley served as head coach of the Jaguars from 2013-16. During that time, Titans head coach Robert Saleh was the linebackers coach.
- **WEEK 11 at DALLAS COWBOYS:** In Week 11, the Titans and Cowboys will meet for the 17th time as the Titans travel to AT&T Stadium for the first time since a 28-14 Monday Night Football victory in November 2018. Tennessee has won both of its regular season games at the site, which opened in 2009. Of the 14 new additions to the Titans coaching staff in 2026, three (Dave Borgetti, Tanel Smart and Aaron Whitecotton) coached for Dallas in 2025. Special teams coordinator John "Bones" Fassel joined the Titans in 2024 after five years with the Cowboys. The Titans also acquired defensive lineman Solomon Thomas in a trade with Dallas in March.
- **WEEK 13 vs. WASHINGTON COMMANDERS:** The Titans will face the Commanders in Week 13. In 2024, the teams also met in Week 13 in the nation's capital. The Titans lead the all-time series, 8-7, and have won two of the last three meetings. Washington coach Dan Quinn succeeded Titans defensive coordinator Gus Bradley as defensive coordinator of the Seahawks in 2013 after Bradley was hired to be the head coach of the Jaguars. Head coach Robert Saleh served as quality control coach under both Bradley and Quinn in Seattle from 2011-13, ending the 2013 season with a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII.
- **WEEK 14 at DETROIT LIONS:** For the second time since 2024, the Titans will make the trip to Detroit to take on the Lions, and they look to win their seventh game against Detroit in eight matchups. The Titans currently hold a 10-4 lead in the all-time series. Head coach Robert Saleh is a native of Dearborn, Mich., a suburb of Detroit. This will be his first time visiting Detroit as a head coach. Since the Lions hired Dan Campbell as head coach in 2022, their 45 regular season wins are the fourth-most in the NFL.
- **WEEK 16 at LAS VEGAS RAIDERS:** For the second consecutive year, the Titans will travel to Las Vegas to take on the Raiders. This year, the contest could feature the top overall pick from the last two drafts in Titans quarterback Cam Ward and Raiders quarterback Fernando Mendoza, who the Raiders took first overall in 2026. The Titans, who trail in the series 22-31, look to regain momentum after dropping last year's contest in their first ever trip to Allegiant Stadium. Former Titans interim coach Mike McCoy currently serves as the assistant head coach of the Raiders, while former offensive coordinator Nick Holz is the offensive pass game coordinator.
- **WEEK 17 vs. PITTSBURGH STEELERS:** In the final regular season game at the current Nissan Stadium, the Titans will face off against the Steelers, who are led by new head coach Mike McCarthy. It will be Pittsburgh's first visit to Nissan Stadium since 2020. McCarthy takes over the reins in Pittsburgh following former head coach Mike Tomlin's resignation following 19 seasons at the helm. The Titans look to snap a five-game losing streak against the Steelers dating back to 2014. In franchise history, the Titans/Oilers have played the Steelers more than any other opponent.

Mike Borgonzi was named the 15th general manager in franchise history on Jan. 17, 2025.

Borgonzi arrived in Tennessee after 16 years with the Kansas City Chiefs, helping to build the franchise into a perennial contender and three-time Super Bowl winner. During his final four seasons in Kansas City, Borgonzi served as Assistant General Manager.

Tasked with building a foundation for sustained success in Tennessee, Borgonzi directed a significant overhaul of the Titans roster from the time he arrived through the end of his second offseason on the job. Entering training camp in 2026, only 17 of the 91 players on the team (as of July 15) were with the club before he was named GM.

The additions included an eight-man class from the 2026 NFL Draft. Borgonzi took wide receiver **Carnell Tate** with the fourth overall pick, and on the same night, he traded back into the first round to draft defensive end **Keldric Faulk** at No. 31. It marked only the second time in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999 to present) that the team had multiple first-rounders. The class also included linebacker **Anthony Hill Jr.** in the second round and five more players on Day 3: guard **Fernando Carmona Jr.** (Round 5), running back **Nick Singleton** (5), defensive tackle **Jackie Marshall** (6), center **Pat Coogan** (6) and tight end **Jaren Kanak** (7).

The 2026 draft followed an active period of signings and trades, when the Titans targeted several key veterans to raise the talent level and provide leadership. From the day the NFL's unrestricted free agent signing period began to the start of the draft, a total of 21 free agents joined the Titans. The haul included wide receiver **Wan'Dale Robinson** (formerly of the New York Giants), tight end **Daniel Bellinger** (Giants), punter **Tommy Townsend** (Houston Texans), defensive lineman **John Franklin-Myers** (Denver Broncos) and cornerbacks **Alontae Taylor** (New Orleans Saints) and **Cor'Dale Flott** (Giants). Two additional veterans—defensive end **Jermaine Johnson II** (New York Jets) and defensive tackle **Solomon Thomas** (Dallas Cowboys)—were acquired in trades.

Borgonzi capped the 2026 offseason by awarding defensive tackle **Jeffery Simmons** with a multi-year contract extension, securing the four-time Pro Bowler's tenure in Tennessee for the foreseeable future.

The Titans' first Borgonzi-led draft in 2025 featured nine selections, including quarterback **Cam Ward** with the first-overall selection. All nine of the draftees appeared in at least six games as rookies, and six members of the group started at least five games. The Titans draft class accumulated 64 combined starts in 2025, which ranked second in the NFL (75 by Cleveland) and was the largest total for the franchise in the Titans era.

Ward, who was voted a team captain as a rookie, started all 17 games, and his 3,169 passing yards eclipsed **Marcus Mariota's** previous franchise rookie record (2,818 passing yards in 2015). With 15 touchdowns and seven interceptions on 323-of-540 passing, Ward's 1.3 percent interception rate was the best single-season mark in franchise history by all qualifying quarterbacks, breaking **Ryan Tannehill's** franchise mark of 1.5 percent in 2020.

Another draft pick, fourth-round wide receiver **Chimere Dike**, was named to the Pro Bowl as a returner and added first-team Associated Press All-Pro honors as a punt returner. Dike led the NFL with 2,427 all-purpose yards, which ranked third all-time for the franchise and first all-time among all NFL rookies. His 17.3-yard punt return average broke **Billy "White Shoes" Johnson's** franchise record (15.4) that stood since 1977, and he also posted a franchise-best 1,588 kickoff return yards.

During Borgonzi's time in Kansas City, he contributed to 12 playoff seasons (2010, 2013, 2015-24) and 10 AFC West titles (2010, 2016-24). Borgonzi helped construct a roster over a five-season span that won the AFC five times (2019-20, 2022-24) and captured three Super Bowl championships (2019, 2022-23).

In his final eight seasons in Kansas City (2017-24), Borgonzi worked under Chiefs General Manager **Brett Veach**. As the Assistant General

Manager from 2021 through 2024, he supervised and directed the college and professional scouting operations while closely supporting and advising Veach with the club's roster management and player acquisition via the NFL Draft, free agency, waiver claims and trades. During his four seasons as Assistant General Manager, the Chiefs built a league-best 52-16 regular-season record (.765). In the same four-year span, 10 different Kansas City players earned a combined 23 Pro Bowl selections: tackle **Orlando Brown Jr.** (2021-22), wide receiver **Tyreek Hill** (2021), center **Creed Humphrey** (2022-24), defensive tackle **Chris Jones** (2021-24), tight end **Travis Kelce** (2021-24), quarterback **Patrick Mahomes** (2021-23), safety **Tyrann Mathieu** (2021), guard **Trey Smith** (2024), guard **Joe Thuney** (2022-24) and Townsend (2022).

In 2024, the Chiefs captured their ninth consecutive AFC West crown. They tied the Detroit Lions for the NFL's best record at 15-2, setting a franchise record for wins in a regular season and securing the AFC's top seed. Twenty original Chiefs draft picks started at least six games for the team during the 2024 regular season. Kansas City had five players voted to the Pro Bowl, marking the seventh consecutive year in which it had at least five players earn the honor.

Prior to his promotion to Assistant General Manager, Borgonzi served as Director of Football Operations (2018-20), Director of Player Personnel (2017), Co-Director of Player Personnel (2015-16), Assistant Director of Pro Scouting (2013-14), Pro Personnel Scout (2011-12) and Manager of Football Operations (2010). He joined the Chiefs in 2009 as the club's College Scouting Administrator.

Before landing in the NFL with the Chiefs, Borgonzi spent the 2007 and 2008 seasons at Boston College, where he was the Assistant Recruiting Coordinator. He also coached tight ends at Amherst College in 2002 before working in the financial sector in Boston for several years.

A native of Everett, Mass., Borgonzi graduated from Brown University, where he was a four-year starter at fullback and was a three-time All-Ivy League selection.

TITANS HEAD COACH ROBERT SALEH

The Tennessee Titans have hired **Robert Saleh** as the 22nd head coach in franchise history on Jan. 22, 2026.

Saleh arrives in Tennessee with 21 seasons of NFL coaching experience: six seasons with the Houston Texans (2005-10), three with the Seattle Seahawks (2011-13), three with the Jacksonville Jaguars (2014-16), five total seasons over two stints with the San Francisco 49ers (2017-20, 2025), and four campaigns as the head coach of the New York Jets (2021-24). During his time in the NFL, he has been a part of nine top-10 defenses, and in his nine seasons as a defensive coordinator or head coach, his team has finished in the top five in total defense on five occasions.

In 2025, Saleh returned to the San Francisco 49ers for his second stint as defensive coordinator under head coach **Kyle Shanahan**. With the roster decimated by injuries, including season-ending injuries to All-Pro defensive lineman **Nick Bosa** and All-Pro linebacker **Fred Warner**, the 49ers went 12-5 during the regular season and progressed to the Divisional Round of the playoffs.

As the head coach of the Jets, Saleh guided four different players in their first four years in the NFL to Associated Press First-Team All-Pro honors (cornerback **Sauce Gardner**, defensive lineman **Quinnen Williams** and returner **Braxton Berrios**) and/or Pro Bowl appearances (Gardner, Williams and linebacker **Jermaine Johnson II**). The Jets defense finished in the top 10 in multiple categories over the 2022 and 2023 seasons, including first in passing yards allowed per game (178.9) and opponent yards per play (4.7), second in total defense (301.7), and sixth in opponent yards per rush (4.1). The unit also tallied 93 sacks and 29 interceptions during that time, tied for the eighth and 10th-most, respectively, in the NFL.

The 2023 Jets featured a pair of first-team Associated Press All-Pros in Gardner and linebacker **Quincy Williams**, as well as three Pro Bowl selections in Gardner, Johnson II and Quinnen Williams. The Jets also won four games after trailing in the fourth quarter, tying for the second-most such victories in the NFL. Defensively, the Jets finished in a tie for first place in opponent yards per play (4.6) and ranked second in passing yards allowed per game (168.3), third in total defense (292.3) and tied for eighth in takeaways (27). The Jets held opponents to seven points or less in 10 of their 17 games, which was tied for the most such games in the NFL. Meanwhile, the Jets offense gained 4,566 total yards in 2023, with 64.1 percent of those yards coming from rookie and second-year players, the second-most in the NFL. Saleh saw second-year running back **Breece Hall** register career highs in rushing yards (994), receiving yards (591), yards from scrimmage (1,585) and total touchdowns (nine).

In 2022, Saleh led a roster that featured two first-team AP All-Pro selections (Gardner and Quinnen Williams), a second-team All-Pro (linebacker **C.J. Mosley**) and four Pro Bowl selections (special teamer



Justin Hardee, Gardner, Mosley and Quinnen Williams). He also oversaw the development of the NFL's Offensive and Defensive Rookies of the Year in wide receiver **Garrett Wilson** and Gardner, making the Jets the third team in NFL history to have both rookie players win the honor. Wilson led all rookie wide receivers in receptions (83) and receiving yards (1,103), while Gardner led the NFL in passes defended (20). The Jets improved their win total by three games, which marked the sixth-largest win improvement in the NFL in 2022. The club boasted a defense that tied for first in opponent yards per play (4.8) and finished third in passing defense (189.4), fourth in scoring defense (316) and fourth in total defense (311.1).

In his first year as head coach of the Jets, the 2021 team was led by rookie quarterback **Zach Wilson** (2,519 passing yards), rookie running back **Michael Carter** (639 rushing yards) and rookie wide receiver **Elijah Moore** (538 receiving yards). The Jets were just the second team since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to be led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards.

Before taking the helm in New York, Saleh logged four seasons (2017-20) in his first stint as the defensive coordinator for the 49ers. During that span, the 49ers defense ranked third in passing yards allowed per game (211.4), fourth in total defense (323.6) and opponent yards per play (5.1) and sixth in opponent yards per rush (4.1).

In 2020, despite injuries to key players throughout the year, the 49ers defense held top-five marks in passing yards allowed per game (207.9, fourth), third-down defense (35.5 percent, fourth), total defense (314.4, fifth) and opponent yards per play (5.0, tied for fifth). The unit also ranked tied for sixth in opponent yards per rush (4.0) and seventh in opponent rushing yards per game (106.4). The defense was led by Warner, who earned first-team AP All-Pro honors and a Pro Bowl selection after registering a team-high 125 tackles to go along with a sack, two interceptions, six passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

In 2019, Saleh was named Coordinator of the Year by Sporting News after leading the 49ers defense to a second-place finish in total defense – 281.8 yards allowed per game – which was the fewest total yards allowed per game by the team since 1997 (250.8). San Francisco placed first in the NFL in passing yards allowed per game (169.2), the fewest passing yards allowed per game in the NFL since 2009 (153.7 by the Jets). It marked the first time San Francisco led the NFL in passing defense since 1987 (165.6). The 49ers tied for second in the NFL in third-down percentage allowed (33.3) and tied for fifth in the NFL in sacks (48), the most by the team in a single season since 1998 (51). San Francisco also ranked seventh in opponent completion percentage (61.3) and opponent quarterback rating (83.0).

Bosa, a rookie in 2019, played in all 16 games (14 starts) and registered 47 tackles, nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and two passes defended. He was named Defensive Rookie of the Year by the Associated Press and the PFWA, and Rookie of the Year by Sporting News and PFWA, as well as the NFL's Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Year. He was also named to the PFWA All-Rookie Team and was named a starter in the Pro Bowl. With defensive linemen **Arik Armstead** (10.0), Bosa (nine), **DeForest Buckner** (7.5) and **Dee Ford** (6.5), the 49ers were the only team in the NFL to have four or more players with at least 6.5

sacks in 2019. Rookie linebacker **Dre Greenlaw** was named to the PFWA All-Rookie team. The secondary was led by cornerback **Richard Sherman**, who registered three interceptions (one returned for a touchdown) and was named second-team All-Pro.

In 2018, the 49ers defense registered 37 sacks, the most by the team in a single season at the time since 2013 (38). The defense ranked among the top dozen teams in the league in rushing yards per play allowed (4.09, seventh), opponent completion percentage (63.5, 10th), yards per play allowed (5.42, 11th) and net passing yards per game allowed (233.3, 11th). San Francisco was one of six teams (Baltimore Ravens, Buffalo Bills, Detroit Lions, Indianapolis Colts & New England Patriots) to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game than in 2017. The 2018 San Francisco defense was anchored by Buckner, who led the team with a career-high 12 sacks and was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career. His 12 sacks were the most by a 49ers defender since 2012 (19.5 by **Aldon Smith**). Warner started all 16 games as a rookie and led the team with 123 tackles, ranking 12th in the NFL and third among all rookies.

In 2017, Saleh spearheaded a 49ers defensive unit that allowed 5.28 yards per play, which was a 0.62 yards-per-play improvement from 2016 and the third-largest improvement in the NFL from 2016 to 2017 behind Cleveland (0.76) and the Jets (0.72). The defense also held its opponents under 100 yards rushing seven times. From Weeks 12-16, the 49ers' streak of holding each of their five opponents under 100 yards rushing was tied for the longest streak in the NFL over that span (Arizona). The 49ers defense was among the league leaders at getting into the opponent's backfield on running plays, finishing tied for fifth in the NFL by forcing 53 rushes for negative yardage. Over the final eight weeks of the year, San Francisco ranked second in the NFL in rushing yards allowed (640) and tied for fourth in yards per carry allowed (3.62).

Saleh joined San Francisco after three years (2014-16) as the linebackers coach of the Jaguars. In 2016, Saleh's linebackers helped the Jacksonville defense rank fifth in passing yards allowed (215.3) and sixth in opponent rushing average (3.82). Team captain **Paul Posluszny** started all 16 games at middle linebacker and led the club in tackles for the second consecutive season. According to Jaguars team statistics, linebacker **Telvin Smith Sr.** registered 118 tackles while starting all 16 games at outside linebacker for the first time in his career. Smith's 350 career tackles from 2014 through 2016 were the most by a Jaguars player in his first three NFL seasons.

In 2015, the Jaguars defense allowed 3.68 yards per rushing attempt,

which was the fifth-lowest rushing average allowed in the NFL. Posluszny led the squad and ranked fifth in the NFL with 133 tackles, according to GSIS statistics, while tying with Smith for the team lead with 13 tackles for loss.

Under Saleh's guidance, Smith stepped into the starting lineup in 2014 and ranked third among all rookies with 99 tackles. Smith led the team with two fumble recoveries while ranking second with nine tackles for loss. After a season-ending injury to Posluszny midway through the year, **J.T. Thomas** stepped in and set a career high in tackles along with two interceptions.

Prior to Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons (2011-13) as a defensive quality control coach for the Seahawks. During that period, he was responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers. Working under linebackers coach **Ken Norton Jr.**, Saleh aided in the development of **K.J. Wright**, **Bobby Wagner** and Super Bowl XLVIII MVP **Malcolm Smith**.

Before joining the Seahawks, Saleh totaled six seasons with the Texans, serving as a coaching intern (2005), defensive assistant (2006-08) and assistant linebackers coach (2009-10). While there, Saleh oversaw the growth of the Texans linebackers, including AP Defensive Rookie of the Year performances by **DeMeco Ryans** (2006) and **Brian Cushing** (2009). In 2009, the Pro Bowl duo of Ryans and Cushing were the only teammates to each rank among the league's top 10 tacklers.

Saleh's coaching career began with three seasons in the collegiate ranks. He launched his career at Michigan State University as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach (2002) and defensive assistant/defensive line coach (2003). He then spent one season (2004) as a defensive assistant/defensive line coach at Central Michigan University before a brief stint at the University of Georgia as a defensive assistant/linebackers coach (2005).

A native of Dearborn, Mich., Saleh attended Northern Michigan University, where he was a four-year starter at tight end.

He and his wife, Sanaa, have eight children: sons Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, Jacob and Robert Jr., and daughters Mila and Ella.

On March 12, 2026, the Tennessee Titans revealed new logos and uniforms, marking an exciting moment for the organization that honors the team's deep roots and celebrates its home in Nashville and the state of Tennessee.

More than just a new look, the uniform and logo embody the spirit of the organization – its rich history dating back to 1960, heritage, and home. The design was inspired by the voices and passion of Titans fans, players, alumni, and neighbors.

"We are incredibly proud to unveil this new look for the Tennessee Titans," said Titans controlling owner **Amy Adams Strunk**. "Our uniforms and logo represent the strength of our history, the passion of our fans, and the bold future we're building together. Today is about honoring over 65 years of our organization while confidently stepping into the next chapter, and I couldn't be more excited for our players, our city, and our fans to wear this identity with pride."

The team's new primary logo, The Shield, remains true to the Titans identity, featuring strong colors of Titans blue, white, and red, and the team's familiar tri-stars. A secondary mark, The Football, gives a cultural nod to city and state and offers fans a fresh way to show their Titans pride. The letters "T" and "N" are blended in a vertical arrangement commemorating both the state's postal abbreviation and the city of Nashville, TN. An array of other marks, including a handcrafted script wordmark, also adorn the team's new logo slick.

The team uniform features some of the organization's most iconic aspects of its heritage and brings them into its present and future.

- At home in Nashville, the Titans primary jerseys will don the distinctive Titans blue, with "TITANS" emblazoned across the chest. The chest font draws inspiration from traditional woodblock printmaking – a tribute to the city's creative spirit – while the numbers echo classic collegiate design.



- On the road, white jerseys will carry the "TENNESSEE" name, ensuring the team represents the state everywhere they play.
- The Tennessee Tri-Star can be found in navy in the tab at the back of the uniform and on the side panel underneath the arm.
- Inside every jersey, a simple "WE" tag is stitched, a rallying cry for the team that emphasizes a "we over me" mentality.
- The iconic stripe of the team's past was infused with Nashville's deep roots in music and is now the 6-String Stripe, represented on the pants, sleeve, and helmet.
