# TITANS-GIANTS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

**GOING FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT WIN AGAINST THE NFC:** The Titans are looking for their fifth consecutive win against an NFC foe this week. They won their final four interconference matchups in 2021—at Seattle, at the Los Angeles Rams, against New Orleans and against San Francisco—after dropping their initial opportunity against Arizona in Week 1.

Since **Mike Vrabel** arrived as head coach in 2018, the Titans are tied for the second best interconference winning percentage in the NFL. The Titans are 13-4 against the NFC under Vrabel for a winning percentage of .765. That puts them in a tie with the Green Bay Packers and Baltimore Ravens, one game behind the Kansas City Chiefs (14-3, .824).

TANNEHILL AND TRIPLE-DIGIT PASSER RATINGS: Ryan Tannehill enters his fourth season with the Titans and his third season opener as the team's starting quarterback.

Tannehill took command as the team's starter in Week 7 of the 2019 campaign, and since that time, he has been in the lineup for all 43 contests the team has played during the regular season. In those opportunities, he has finished with a passer rating of at least 100.0 on 25 occasions.

Among all NFL signal callers, only Green Bay's **Aaron Rodgers** has more games with a 100-plus passer rating during the time Tannehill has been the Titans' starter. Rodgers, who has won the last two league MVP awards, has 28 such performances.

## Additionally, Tannehill can accomplish the following this week against the Giants:

- With a start this week, which will be his 44th with the club, he will break a tie with **Steve McNair** for the most consecutive starts in Titans/Oilers history by a quarterback. McNair started 43 consecutive games from 2001 to 2003.
- > He can extend his career-best streak to 16 consecutive games with at least one passing or rushing touchdown. Among active quarterbacks entering the 2022 season, only **Kirk Cousins** (30), **Justin Herbert** (21) and **Matthew Stafford** (18) have a longer current streak than Tannehill (15), who is tied with **Jimmy Garoppolo** (15).
- > A ninth 300-yard passing game since joining the Titans (25th career) would move Tannehill ahead of **Marcus Mariota** (eight) for the fourth-most in franchise history.
- Tannehill needs one touchdown pass to reach 200 for his career.
- With his next touchdown pass, he will take sole possession of fifth place on the franchise's passing touchdowns list. He has 76 in a Titans uniform, which is tied with Mariota's total behind **Warren Moon** (196), **George Blanda** (165), **Steve McNair** (156) and **Dan Pastorini** (96).

HENRY CLOSES IN ON 70 TOUCHDOWNS: Titans running back Derrick Henry enters the 2022 season with 68 career touchdowns since he was selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft. His total is made up of 65 rushing touchdowns and three receiving touchdowns.

With two more trips to the end zone, he will become the third player in franchise history to reach the 70-touchdown plateau and move closer to the franchise's all-time leaders. **Eddie George** set the team record with 74 touchdowns, one ahead of the previous record holder, Pro Football Hall of Famer **Earl Campbell**.

Since Henry's arrival in the NFL, his total of 68 touchdowns is tied for the third-highest mark among all players. He is even with New Orleans Saints **Alvin Kamara** and Dallas Cowboys running back **Ezekiel Elliott**, one behind the 69 touchdowns by Las Vegas Raiders wideout **Davante Adams** and former Los Angeles Rams/Atlanta Falcons running back **Todd Gurley II**.

**ROOKIES READY TO CONTRIBUTE:** The Titans enter their Week 1 matchup with the Giants with 11 rookies on the 53-man roster (as of Sept. 7). The total includes eight draft picks and three undrafted rookies.

If 10 or more Titans rookies take the field against the Giants, it will be their most in a Week 1 game in the franchise's "Titans era," which began in 1999. The nine rookies who took part in the 2004 opener—a win at Miami (Sept. 11)—established the current mark.

In 2021, the Titans had five rookies play in the season opener: running back **Mekhi Sargent**, wide receiver **Racey McMath**, linebacker **Monty Rice** and cornerbacks **Caleb Farley** and **Elijah Molden**.

Since 1999, 19 total rookies have started Week 1 games for the Titans. That includes a pair of Week 1 rookie starters since head coach **Mike Vrabel** arrived in 2018: wide receiver **A.J. Brown** in 2019 and defensive back **Chris Jackson** in 2020.

**ROSTER TURNOVER:** Since the conclusion of the 2021 season, the Titans have added 21 new players who earned spots on the 53-man roster (as of Sept. 7). That number, which does not count players on the current practice squad or reserve lists, includes eight 2022 draft picks, eight free-agent signees, two waiver claims and three players acquired via trade.

The list of new additions to the 2022 Titans include the following players (roster as of Sept. 7):

The 39.6 percent roster turnover is up from 2021, when executive vice president/general manager **Jon Robinson** added 18 new players—34.0 percent—to the opening day 53-man roster. The Titans have not had 21 or more new players on the Week 1 roster since they had 22 newcomers in 2016, which was Robinson's first year with the team. In Robinson's tenure, the Titans average 17.9 new roster additions per season for a rate of 33.8 percent.

Left tackle Taylor Lewan is the only member of the 53-man roster who was with the club before Robinson arrived.
