TITANS TRAVEL TO BUFFALO TO FACE THE BILLS

Tennessee Titans (1-4) at Buffalo Bills (3-2*)

Sunday, Oct. 20, 2024 • 1 p.m. EDT/Noon CDT • Highmark Stadium • Orchard Park, N.Y. • TV: CBS

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans (1-4) play the first of two consecutive road games this week, traveling to Buffalo to face the Bills (3-2*). Kickoff at Highmark Stadium (71,621) is scheduled for 1 p.m. EDT/noon CDT on Sunday, Oct. 20.

Two of the eight original American Football League franchises are set for their 51st all-time meeting. The Titans lead the series by a 30-20 margin. They won consecutive home games against the Bills in 2020 and 2021 before the Bills took the most recent clash at Highmark Stadium on Sept. 19, 2022.

THE BROADCAST

This week's game will be regionally televised on CBS, including Nashville affiliate WTVF NewsChannel 5, as well as on Paramount+ in the Nashville market. The broadcast team includes play-by-play announcer **Andrew Catalon**, analysts **Tiki Barber** and **Jason McCourty**, and reporter **AJ Ross**.

Fans in Nashville can stream live Titans games on mobile devices with NFL+, which offers access to local games and all primetime games on phones and tablets. Out of market, fans can watch every Sunday afternoon game with <u>Sunday Ticket</u>. More information on ways to watch NFL games can be found at <u>nfl.com/ways-to-watch</u>.

The Titans Radio Network and Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone carry all Titans action across the Mid-South with the "Voice of the Titans" **Mike Keith**, analyst **Dave McGinnis**, sideline reporter **Ramon Foster**, executive producer/gameday host **Rhett Bryan** and co-host **Amie Wells**.

LAST WEEK AGAINST THE COLTS

Following their Week 5 bye, the Titans hosted the division rival Indianapolis Colts at Nissan Stadium last week. The Titans took a 17-10 lead into the fourth guarter, but the Colts scored the game's final 10 points to escape with a 20-17 win.

Starting quarterback **Will Levis** was back in the lineup after missing most of the previous contest at Miami with a right shoulder injury. He passed for 95 yards and completed a nine-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** in the first quarter.

The Titans' second touchdown against the Colts came courtesy of running back **Tony Pollard**. During the opening drive of the second half, with the Titans facing a third-and-19, Pollard found the end zone on a 23-yard rushing attempt. He finished the contest with 93 rushing yards, and through five contests he leads the team with 339 rushing yards and 421 total scrimmage yards (82 receiving).

On the defensive side, safety **Amani Hooker** registered his first interception of 2024 and the eighth interception of his six-year career. He set up the team's first touchdown with a 30-yard return.

Through six weeks of the NFL season, the Titans rank first in total defense, allowing opposing offenses an average of only 248.8 yards per game. They rank second in the league in passing defense, yielding only 137.0 passing yards per contest.

THE BILLS

Led by head coach **Sean McDermott**, the Bills carry a streak of five consecutive playoff seasons and four straight AFC East titles into 2024. They won their first three contests of 2024 before dropping consecutive games at Baltimore and at Houston. Their Week 6 matchup is scheduled for Monday night, Oct. 14, at the New York Jets.

Bills quarterback **Josh Allen** is in his seventh NFL season since he was selected in the first round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of the University of Wyoming. Allen and **Patrick Mahomes** are the NFL's only quarterbacks who have passed for more than 4,000 yards in each of the past four campaigns.

SERIES HISTORY

The Titans and Bills rivalry brings together two of the original teams of the American Football League, founded by two of the visionaries who helped set in motion one of the most significant eras in football history. It was in 1960 that **K.S. "Bud" Adams, Jr.'s** then-Houston Oilers and **Ralph Wilson, Jr.'s** Bills became two of the eight teams that began play in the newly-formed league. Adams, Wilson and the other original AFL owners were dubbed the "Foolish Club" for their choice to accept the seemingly-impossible task of competing with the National Football League. Ten seasons later, the burgeoning league's success was more than apparent, as the AFL and NFL completed a historic merger.

In the regular season and postseason, the Titans and Bills have met a total of 50 times. The Titans hold a 30-20 advantage in the series, dating back to the inaugural AFL season.

The momentum in the series has swung back and forth. From 1967 until 1978, the Oilers had a 10-game winning streak over the Bills, the longest streak in the series. From 1983–94, Buffalo controlled most of the results, going 8-3. Tennessee then won eight out of nine, including five consecutive matchups from 2003-12, before the Bills won the next three games.

The Titans took the last two meetings at Nissan Stadium. Most recently, on Monday night, Oct. 18, 2021, they hosted the Bills and won 34-31. **Derrick Henry** rushed for three touchdowns, including a 76-yarder.

The last time the Titans and Bills met at Highmark Stadium was Sept. 19, 2022. In front of a Monday Night Football audience, Allen completed four touchdown passes—three to **Stefon Diggs**—to lift the Bills to a 41-7 win. It was the largest margin of victory by either team in the historic series.

The franchises have met three times in the playoffs, with Buffalo holding a 2-1 advantage. The last playoff matchup between the two teams was in 1999, when the Titans defeated the Bills 22-16 in an AFC wild card game. In a play known as the "Music City Miracle," **Kevin Dyson** returned a **Frank Wycheck** lateral on a kickoff return 75 yards for a touchdown with only 16 seconds left in the game, giving Tennessee the win. The Titans went on to beat Indianapolis and Jacksonville before falling to St. Louis in Super Bowl XXXIV.

In a 1992 wild card game, the Bills achieved a similarly miraculous win. Trailing 35-3 in the third quarter, the Bills rallied to score 35 consecutive points and eventually won 41-38 in overtime.

On Jan. 1, 1989, the Bills hosted the Oilers in a wild card game and won 17-10.

Marcus Mariota is sacked five times by Bills defenders, including three sacks by defensive tackle Jordan Phillips, while the Titans record four sacks of Allen.

Following a 16-day gap between games due to a COVID-19 outbreak, the Titans play the NFL's second Tuesday game since 1946 and the first since 2010 ... The Titans score 21 points off three turnovers by the Bills, sparked by cornerback Malcolm Butler's two interceptions off Josh Allen and 97 total return yards ... Ryan Tannehill completes three touchdown passes, including two to Jonnu Smith, and also rushes for a score Derrick Henry adds two touchdown runs ... In the Titans' first game of 2020 that is opened to fans on a limited basis, the announced attendance is 8,403.

2021 Week 6 • Oct. 18, 2021 • Bills 31 at TITANS 34

In the Monday night game's final minute, Bills quarterback Josh Allen is stopped by Jeffery Simmons on a fourth-and-one quarterback sneak at Tennessee's three-yard line ... Derrick Henry rushes for 143 yards and three touchdowns on 20 carries, including a 76-yard touchdown ... Ryan Tannehill rushes for the Titans' other touchdown and completes all nine of his passes in the fourth quarter to help the Titans score the final 10 points of a game that featured seven lead changes ... Harold Landry III registers two sacks, and Kevin Byard sets up a touchdown with an interception ... Allen passes for 353 yards and three touchdowns for the Bills.

2022 Week 2 • Sept. 19, 2022 • Titans 7 at BILLS 41

On Monday Night Football, the Bills score the game's final 34 points to hand the Titans their first 0-2 start since 2012 ... The Titans commit four turnovers, including two interceptions and two fumbles ... Bills quarterback Josh Allen passes for 317 yards and four touchdowns, including three scoring strikes to Stefon Diggs (12 catches for 148 yards) ... The Bills defense limits Derrick Henry to 25 yards on 13 carries ... Henry scores the Titans' only touchdown on a two-yard run to make the score 7-7 in the first quarter ... Bills linebacker Matt Milano returns an interception 43 yards for a touchdown.

2022 Week 2: Titans 7, Bills 41 Monday, Sept. 19, 2022 • 7:15 p.m. ET • Highmark Stadium

In Week 2 of the 2022 season, the Titans traveled to Buffalo to face the Bills on Monday Night Football and fell by a score of 41-7.

Buffalo got on the board first on their opening drive as Bills QB Josh Allen guided his team on a 75-yard scoring drive that culminated in an 11-yard touchdown pass to Bills FB Reggie Gilliam, 7-0 Buffalo. The Titans responded on their opening drive with a touchdown of their own to tie the score. QB Ryan Tannehill connected with WR Treylon Burks for a 14-yard first down, with TE Austin Hooper for a 19-yard first down, and WR Nick Westbrook-Ikhine for a 13-yard pass. Facing a fourth-and-one at the Buffalo two-yard line, RB Derrick Henry took the handoff and plunged into the end zone for a two-yard score, 7-7.

In the second quarter, Buffalo strung together two scoring drives on consecutive possessions to make it a to make it a 17-7 score heading into halftime. First, the Tennessee defense forced Buffalo to settle for a field goal as Bills K Tyler Bass converted a 49-yard kick, 10-7. Then, facing a fourth-and-one at the Tennessee four-yard line, Allen connected with Bills WR Stefon Diggs for a four-yard score to make it 17-7.

On their first drive of the second half, Allen found Diggs in the end zone for a 46-yard touchdown to extend the lead, 24-7. Buffalo then added three more scores to put the game out of reach. After the Titans defense forced the Bills to punt, WR Kyle Philips muffed the punt return and it was recovered by Bills LB Tyrel Dodson to give Buffalo possession at the Tennessee 20-yard line. Buffalo capitalized on the turnover with a 37yard field goal, 27-7. On the ensuing Titans possession, Tannehill's pass was tipped and intercepted by Bills S Jordan Poyer and the turnover gave Buffalo possession at the 50-yard line. Allen found Diggs in the end zone for the third time as a 14-yard touchdown made it a 34-7 game.

On the ensuing Tennessee possession, Tannehill threw a pick six to Bills LB Matt Milano, who returned the ball 43 yards for a score to make it 41-7. The deficit proved too large for the Titans to overcome as Tennessee fell on the road to Buffalo.

WR TYLER BOYD

On 11/20/16 against Buffalo, Boyd led the Bengals with six receptions for 54 yards and scored his first career touchdown on a three-yard catch.

K NICK FOLK

- On 10/8/07 at Buffalo, Folk went a perfect four-for-four on field goals including the game-winning 53-yarder for the Cowboys. Also converted both extra point attempts. Was named NFC Special Teams player of the Week for his performance.
- On 9/9/12 against Buffalo, Folk tied a career-high with six extra points made. He also added two field goals in the win for the Jets.

S AMANI HOOKER

On 10/18/21 against Buffalo, Hooker started at safety and registered nine tackles with a forced fumble.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- In four career regular season games against Buffalo, Hopkins has 22 receptions for 342 yards and four touchdowns—one touchdown in every game he has played against the Bills.
- On 11/15/20 against Buffalo, Hopkins had seven receptions for 127 yards and one touchdown for the Cardinals. The touchdown came on a 43-yard game-winning Hail Mary touchdown with just two seconds remaining in regulation. The play earned Bridgestone Clutch Performance Play of the Year and the "Best Play" award at the 2021 ESPYS for the "Hail Murray." Marked his fourth-career game-winning touchdown catch in the fourth quarter/overtime and the first to come with under a minute left on the clock. Earned NFL Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

- In four career games against Buffalo, Landry has totaled 19 tackles and four sacks.
- On 10/18/21 against Buffalo, Landry tied then-career-highs with eight tackles and two sacks, to go along with another stop for loss and two quarterback pressures. Became Tennessee's first player since Kyle Vanden Bosch in 2005 with two or more sacks in consecutive games.

CB ROGER McCREARY

On 9/19/22 at Buffalo, McCreary started at cornerback and led the team with a career-best 11 tackles.

CB L'JARIUS SNEED

In six career games against Buffalo, including three playoff games, Sneed has recorded 36 tackles, one sack, three tackles for loss and five passes defensed.

TE NICK VANNETT

On 11/25/21 against Buffalo, Vannett hauled in an 11-yard touchdown catch from Trevor Siemian with the Saints.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

TITANS DEFENSE

If the Titans defense holds its opponent under 200 net passing yards for the sixth consecutive game, it will be the team's first time doing so in each of the first six games of the season since 1975.

S QUANDRE DIGGS

- Enters the game with a streak of 72 consecutive games started, which trails only Kevin Byard (127), Patrick Queen (73) and Daron Payne (73) for the NFL's longest active streak among defensive players.
- Needs one interception to join seven other active NFL players to reach 25 for his career. Diggs is tied with Jordan Poyer (24) for the eighthmost interceptions among active players.

K NICK FOLK

- Enters the game with an all-time NFL-record streak of 79 consecutive field goals made on attempts from less than 40 yards.
- With 390 career field goals, he needs three more to surpass Stephen Gostkowski (392) for 16h place in NFL history.
- Enters the game with a streak of 17 consecutive field goals made since Nov. 12, 2023, which is the fifth-longest streak of his career. The franchise record for consecutive field goals made is 20, accomplished on five different occasions, including once by Folk in 2023.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- With 79 touchdown receptions entering the contest, he can become the 33rd player in NFL history to reach 80 career touchdown receptions.
- Can extend his active streak to 168 consecutive games with a reception—every game he has played since he entered the NFL. He would move ahead of **Keyshawn Johnson** (167) for the secondlongest such streak to begin a career in NFL history behind only **Marvin Harrison** (190 consecutive games).
- Can register his 43rd career 100-yard receiving game and his fourth 100-yard game as a member of the Titans.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

- Enters the game with 45.5 career sacks, which ranks ninth in franchise history. He needs 2.5 sacks to tie **Robert Brazile** (48.0) for eighth place on the list. Landry owns the third-highest sack total for the team in its "Titans era" (1999–present), trailing only **Jevon Kearse** (52) and **Jurrell Casey** (51).
- > Enters the contest with 9.5 sacks in his last 11 games.

LB KENNETH MURRAY JR.

- Can record his fifth consecutive game with at least eight tackles. It would mark the longest such streak of his career. He previously had four consecutive performances with at least eight tackles in 2023.
- Can record his fifth consecutive game with at least one tackle for loss. He would become the first Titans player since Harold Landry III in 2021 to accomplish the feat. His current streak of four games is the longest of his career.

TE CHIG OKONKWO

Needs three receptions to reach 100 for his career (97 entering the game).

RB TONY POLLARD

- Needs 40 rushing yards to reach 4,000 for his career (3,960 entering the game).
- Can record his third consecutive game with at least one rushing touchdown, which would tie for the longest streak of his career (Nov. 19-30, 2023).

P RYAN STONEHOUSE

Can record his 13th consecutive game with at least one punt of 55-plus yards. Currently at 12 games, he holds the NFL's longest such active streak, which is also tied for the longest streak of his career (2022).

TE NICK VANNETT

Scheduled to appear in his 100th NFL regular season game.

> Sean McDermott was named head coach of the Buffalo Bills in January 2017 after spending six seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Carolina Panthers.

> After joining a franchise that had not earned a postseason berth since 1999, McDermott has led Buffalo to six playoff appearances, four division titles and an AFC Championship game appearance in his first seven seasons at the helm. He ranks second in Bills head coaching history with 81 wins, including postseason.

> Since McDermott took the reigns in 2017, the Bills defense has given up the league's fewest total yards per game (314.9), passing yards per game (201.2) and yards per play (5.1).

> The Bills also rank in the top-10 in both passing and rushing touchdowns since 2017. McDermott has helped develop 2018 first-round pick Josh Allen. Since he was drafted, Allen has accounted for 231 total touchdowns, ranking second in the NFL during that span, trailing only Patrick Mahomes (237).

> In 2023, Buffalo went 11-6, locking up their fourth-straight AFC East crown. Buffalo's .639 regular season winning percentage since 2017 ranks third in the NFL and they've finished with at least nine wins and a postseason berth in six of seven full seasons

> In 2020, the Bills went 13-3 and captured their first division title and their first playoff win since 1995. The 13 wins tied for the most in team history. McDermott finished second in voting for the NFL's Coach of the Year honors and the Bills qualified for the AFC Championship Game

> In his first year in Buffalo (2017), McDermott led the Bills to their first playoff berth since 1999 with a 9-7 record. He became the third coach in Bills history to earn a playoff berth in his first season at the helm (Joe Collier and Wade Phillips)

> While in Carolina. McDermott developed a top-10 defense in four of his six seasons. During his time in Carolina, McDermott helped the Panthers to three division titles and a trip to Super Bowl 50.

> McDermott arrived in Carolina following 12 seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (1998-2010). He spent his last two seasons in Philadelphia as defensive coordinator, helping the Eagles to the playoffs in each of those seasons (2009-10). McDermott coached the secondary and linebackers before becoming defensive coordinator. learning under the late Jim Johnson (2004-08).

> McDermott worked as Philadelphia's assistant defensive backs coach in 2003 and as the defensive assistant/quality control coach from 2001-02, assisting with linebackers. He joined the organization in 1998 as a scouting administrative coordinator before being promoted to assistant to the head coach in 1999.

> An All-Atlantic 10 Conference choice at safety for William & Mary as a senior in 1997, McDermott graduated with a degree in finance and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1998.

McDermott is a native of Omaha, Neb.

In Week 6 of the 2024 NFL season, the Titans hosted division rival Indianapolis and lost by a score of 20-17 to fall to 1-4 on the season.

Indianapolis scored on the opening possession of the game as QB Joe Flacco led the Colts 70 yards down field on 10 plays and capped it with a 22-yard touchdown pass to WR Josh Downs to take an early 7-0 lead.

The Titans offense was held to a three-and-out and forced to punt on the next possession. The Colts took over at their own 36-yard line. Two plays later, S Amani Hooker intercepted a Flacco pass and returned it 30 yards to bring the Titans to the Indianapolis 27-yard line

QB Will Levis found WR Tyler Boyd for a quick eight-yard gain before RB Tony Pollard broke off for 10 yards to bring Tennessee to the Indianapolis nine-yard line. Levis then found WR Nick Westbrook-Ikhine in the end zone for the score on Westbrook-Ikhine's first reception of the season to tie the game at 7-7.

The Colts punted on their next possession and the Titans took over at their own 18-yard line. Levis then constructed a 15-play, 56-yard drive that ran 9:02 off the clock and was capped off by a K Nick Folk 44-yard field goal. The drive featured nine combined rushes from RB Tony Pollard and RB Tyjae Spears.

Both teams then traded punts before Indianapolis got the ball at their own 29-yard line with 3:39 left in the half. Two penalties by the Titans helped bring the Colts to the Titans 15yard line before K Matt Gay tied the game with a 26-yard field goal to make it 10-10 at the half.

The Titans came out of the half with a 14-play, 70-yard touchdown drive to retake the lead. The drive featured three third-down conversions, including the 23-yard touchdown run by Pollard which came on third-and-19. The drive took 8:41 off the clock, making it the longest touchdown drive in time of possession for the Titans this season.

The Colts answered with a long drive of their own. After marching down to the Tennessee two-yard line on 13 plays, Indianapolis was facing third-and-two when OLB Harold Landry III and Hooker combined to stuff RB Trey Sermon for a two-yard loss that forced another Gay field goal, this time from 22 yards out to make it 17-13 with 14:57 left in the fourth quarter.

TEAM NOTES

- The Titans out-rushed the Colts 146 yards to 80 yards. Their 66-yard differential in rushing was their best of the season through five games.
- For the third time in 2024, the Titans won the time-of-possession battle. They held the ball against the Colts for 30 minutes and 32 seconds, compared to 29 minutes and 28 seconds by the Colts.
- The Titans offense did not allow a sack against the Colts. It was the team's first time not allowing a sack since Oct. 18, 2021 against the Buffalo Bills.
- For the second consecutive game, the Titans offense did not allow a sack in the first half.
- The Titans offense opened the second half with a 14-play, 70-yard touchdown drive that consumed 8 minutes and 41 seconds. It was the team's longest touchdown drive in time of possession since Dec. 24, 2023 against Seattle, when a touchdown drive took 8 minutes and 49 seconds.
- The Titans' touchdown to open the third quarter marked their first time scoring a touchdown on their opening drive of the second half since they did so in the 2023 season finale against Jacksonville (Jan. 7, 2024).

TEAM NOTES – DEFENSE

- The Titans went into their game against the Colts ranked first in total defense. They allowed 269 yards by the Colts, bringing their season average to 248.8 opponent yards per game. That is the best number for the team through its first five games of a season since 1976, when Oilers opponents averaged 208.2 yards per game through five contests.
- The Titans defense kept the Colts to 189 net passing yards, marking the fifth consecutive game to begin the season in which their opponent did not reach 200 net passing yards. It is team's first time doing so in each of the first five games of a season since 1986.
- Through five games in 2024, the Titans have not allowed a player from an opposing team to pass for 300 yards, rush for 100 yards, or post a 100-yard receiving game. This is the seventh time in franchise history the club has started the season without allowing any such performances in its first five games. The last time was 2000. The Titans and Los Angeles Chargers entered Week 6 as the only NFL teams that had not allowed a 300-yard passing game, 100-yard rushing game or 100-yard receiving game in 2024.



- The defense's streak of not allowing an individual 300-yard passing performance reached 10 games. The last time they had a streak of 10 such games was a 12-game stretch from November 2018 to September 2019.
- The Colts offense averaged only 5.0 yards per pass attempt, marking the fourth time in five games that the Titans defense kept their opponent under 6.0 yards per attempt. Through the early afternoon games of Oct. 13, the Titans defense averaged an NFL-best 5.5 passing yards per attempt in 2024.

WR TYLER BOYD

Caught three passes for 19 yards.

S MIKE BROWN

Led the team with two special teams tackles.

CB JARVIS BROWNLEE JR.

- Started for the second consecutive game.
- Registered two tackles and a team-high two passes defensed.

WR TREYLON BURKS

Converted a fourth-and-one with a 10-yard reception in the third quarter.

S QUANDRE DIGGS

- Totaled six tackles.
- Registered his 72nd consecutive game started. He entered the contest with the fourth-longest such streak among NFL defensive players behind Kevin Byard (126), Patrick Queen (72) and Daron Payne (72).

K NICK FOLK

- Made a 44-yard field goal in the second quarter and also connected on both extra point attempts.
- Increased his streak to 17 consecutive made field goals, a streak that began on Nov. 12, 2023. His current streak is the ninth-longest in franchise history and the fifth-longest of his career.
- His 390 career field goals rank 17th in NFL history.

S AMANI HOOKER

- Totaled one interception, six tackles and one tackle for loss.
- Intercepted a Joe Flacco pass in the first quarter. He notched his eighth career interception (first of 2024) and returned the ball 30 yards to set up a Titans touchdown on the ensuing drive.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Led the team with four receptions and 54 receiving yards.
- Caught a 23-yard pass from Will Levis in the second quarter.
- Registered his 111th career game with at least four receptions and 50 receiving yards.
- Extended his active streak to 167 consecutive games with a reception—every game he has played since he entered the NFL. He tied Keyshawn Johnson (167) for the second-longest such streak to begin a career in NFL history behind only Marvin Harrison (190 consecutive games).

LB ERNEST JONES IV

- Led the defense with 10 tackles.
- Registered his third game in 2024 in which he led the team in tackles.

HEAD COACH BRIAN CALLAHAN

All right. Injury-wise, (Tyjae) Spears left with a hamstring, did not return. He's the only significant injury that did not return to the game at any point. So we'll monitor that and see where he's at next week.

Story of the game; kind of penalties at critical times. Had to get off the field in some of those spots to create some plays and we weren't able to. We had a three-and-out on offense or two, had too many. We had a couple really nice drives and a couple of ones that didn't do much. We didn't really eliminate the chunk plays. They had a few that we were trying to get rid of. Positive side, ran the ball well. The run defense was good. First interception we got in the game, we went down and scored seven points. So, we flipped it on that one, which was good to see. And then, we had two really, really good drives on offense, but not enough. At the end of the day, just didn't make enough plays when we had to make plays, particularly down the stretch in the fourth quarter when we needed something to happen, and we couldn't get anything going. So, frustrating. I still think we're better than what our record says we are, but we also aren't making enough plays to win tight games, and we got to find a way to do that, and I got to find a way to help us get there because right now, losing games in our one score games is tough. We're in the mix and we're fighting, and guys play hard as hell, but right now we're not doing enough to win the games and that's why we've only won one.

Can you walk us through the decision to punt on the fourth-and-seven there at the end of the game?

The fourth-and-seven at the end of the game. We were going to turbo punt and try to see-it was only a three-point game. So, we tried to turbo punt,

get the ball back. If you get a stop, then you're going to have a little bit of time left to try to manage a field goal drive out of it. So that was the thought. Fourth-and-seven would have been a tough conversion for us. And then we thought if we could-our defense would be able to put us in decent position to get the ball back and try to get into field goal range. That was the rationale behind it.

You targeted Calvin Ridley eight times, he didn't catch a single ball today. Can you win without him being involved in the offense?

No, we can't. We can't win like that. I'm sure he'll be the first one to tell you that that was disappointing. But he's one of our best players and he's-we look to him to try to make a play or two and we didn't get it done at the end of the game. We got to be better all the way around, offensively. We just don't have enough consistency from series to series. We do a lot of things well and then we stall, and then we do some more things well, and then we stall. And so, I got to figure out the best way to get us out of those slumps, to get us a little more consistent so we can put together more scoring drives because again, 17 points a game is not going to win you many games in the NFL at this point.

What's happened specifically with him (Calvin Ridley)?

I can't comment on anything specific. I mean, there's nothing that would have let me believe that he would have had no catches in the game or whatever it ended up being or eight targets. I don't know the stats off the top of my head. But yeah, I wouldn't have expected that. So, there's nothing I can point to at this point.

On the pick, did the ball just end up hanging up there for too long?

Yeah, the ball hung. We had a little bit of pressure, but I thought that if we got it up a touch quicker, we would've had a shot. I knew they were going to be in a man coverage on that get-back-on-track spot-it's what they had done earlier-and try to take a shot to (Calvin) Ridley. Just wasn't timed

out right, and then the ball kind of hung up. Again, didn't kill us, but it lost us time. It wasn't a scoring play or anything like that. But it didn't give us a chance to try to go win the game. We lost some time off that drive.

With the lack of success in the passing game, how much does that force you to be a little more conservative? How can you get out of that and find a way to get Will Levis going?

Yeah, that's my job. I got to figure that out because right now we're notwe're running the ball well. But as you can see, even running the ball well doesn't give you enough. You got to be able to throw it and throw it with some efficiency, and we've not done a good enough job of that. And that ultimately is on me. That's my job. I got to find ways to put guys in better position, got to find things that we can execute better than we have, and that's really all there is to it. You got to throw the ball in the NFL to win, and that's the bottom line. I mean, you can run the ball really well and we do. We do that well. But we got to find ways, when the game is tight and we got to throw it, to make enough plays to give us a chance to win the game.

So you admit that the struggles passing the ball has forced you to be a bit more conservative?

Yeah, I think we try to lean into our strength, which right now is running the football. We did a lot of that throughout the course of the game. We ran the ball well, tried to do what we do well and then try to pick our spots to go throw it. And as of right now, again, we're a one-win football team. Nothing really is good enough at this point.

Was it something more that the Colts were doing or was it by design? It seemed like all the throws until you got desperate there on the last drives at the end were shorter by design. There weren't very many intermediate throws that could maybe move the chains.

We had a couple. I called a couple deeper shots. They pressured a few of them. But yeah, I mixed it up relatively well. I try to make sure we were trying to get the ball in guy's hands. They do—it is what it is. I mean, I called quite a bit of different things and some of them work, some didn't.

For Will Levis, do you still remain committed to him?

I do. Yeah, I thought, outside of that turnover, I thought he did a nice job with the game. I thought we needed more help around him. Guys need to make more plays for him when he puts the ball in certain spots. And I think we just didn't do a good enough job of that today.

Dennard Wilson said this week that L'Jarius Sneed is the best cornerback in the league. Do you feel like he looked like the best

cornerback in the league today?

I don't need to comment on that. I think L'Jarius (Sneed) is really a good football player and I'm glad we have him. (Alec Pierce) has beat a lot of guys on go-balls so far this season. That one—there was one jump ball, and it was one down the sideline that got called for PI. But I'm glad we have him. He's a really good football player.

Nick Westbrook-Ikhine caught a touchdown with his only target for the game. Is there a way you would like to get him more involved in the offense to put those weapons that you mentioned around Will Levis?

Yeah. I mean, he's a consistent player. There's room for him to get some action. He plays quite a bit but there are some passes called that may not go to him and all that. But yeah, I mean he can help us for sure. So anyway, they can help us, I'm all for.

The lack of plays, do you put that on what the defenses are doing? What you're not doing as an offense? How much is it hurting you when you have to put together long drives?

Yeah, it's not really an overall sustainable way to play. I mean, it's not for lack of effort. There's plays that are called that take advantage of deep shots and sometimes you don't have them. But we got to find ways to be more explosive in the passing game in general because it's all the same thing. The explosive plays is what wins in this league, and we're not doing a good enough job of finding them, hitting them, calling them, however you want to say it. It doesn't really matter where the blame is placed. We just have to do a better job of it, and it's ultimately on me to do.

What's the sense of urgency like at 1-4? How much do you feel like you've got to get things fixed?

I don't think our sense of urgency has dipped at all. I mean, we—our team's competitive. They play hard, and we've got to find ways to make plays when it matters to win the game, which through the Chicago game, through this Indy game, through the Jets game, we didn't make the plays in any part of the game to give us a chance to actually win the football game. And so, our urgency has been high since we started. I don't think I've ever felt the dip in it, and we just had to keep going. I mean, we got a lot of games to play and then we got to keep rolling. The next one's coming right at us again. So, we got to go play some good football teams and we've got to find ways to get better.

We saw you talking to the sideline judge after the no-call on DeAndre Hopkins. What was the explanation there?

You guys know that I can't—I didn't agree with a lot of the things that got called in this game.

But what's the explanation they gave you?

They don't give a lot of explanation. They just said, 'He didn't see it the way I saw it,' and that's what it is. So, there's nothing I can do about those, and I can't really comment on them, even though I'd like to, but I can't.

Are guys getting enough separation in the past game for the quarterback to be able to make on-target throws?

I think so. I think at times—again, probably nothing that we're doing is probably at the level it needs to be. So yeah, I think there's times when it is. I mean, we try to help guys get open and try to manufacture separation and do all the things to help them keep find ways to do that. But yeah, I don't feel like we lack separation necessarily. I just don't think we've had enough plays made.

Who is responsible for the illegal formation on the kickoff and how is that penalty humanly possible?

I'll be honest with you, I didn't see where the penalty was. I didn't see a replay or anything like that. And then the picture didn't look like there was a penalty. So, again, I don't know. That's ultimately my responsibility. So, that was surprising.

What were they doing to get Josh Downs open effectively beside the fact that he's a very good player?

Yeah, he's a very good player. Dennard (Wilson) does a good job mixing the coverage schemes and they just found every which way they could to get him the ball because he's great with it. So, they found some bubbles

and they found some underneath stuff. And that's sort of what he does. And he's really good after catch and with the ball in his hands. So, he just had a—felt like a high volume of targets with quick throws that over time add up a little bit.

QUARTERBACK WILL LEVIS

What were some of the reasons do you think the last several drives did not have much production for you guys?

I think just across the board, we just need all of us to play at a higher level. I think at all position groups, we can step up and say and admit of things we could have done better on that drive. I could have been a little more accurate in a couple of those throws to Hop (DeAndre Hopkins). He knows he can make those plays. The O line can get a little more push on that Duo call in third-and-short. And those guys who had opportunities, they know they can make those plays. So, it's just, I mean—I've got to look internally at what I can do better. But everyone has to do the same. And we know that we can be better than what we put out there.

The offensive line kept you pretty clean for most of the game. Was it easier for you to operate with that kind of time?

I felt good, yeah. I felt like I had the time to see things through. Another thing to critique myself, I'd say there were a couple of times where I got out, got a few yards, protect myself, get down. But if I were to just trust the protection and get to that backside of the progression, I had a couple of completions there. So, they did a great job giving me time. Did I get sacked?

No. So, that's awesome. I was able to play on time, see things clearly. They did a good job mixing up the coverages and giving us different looks. But at the end of the day, we just got to make more plays, and we know that's a game we can win.

How frustrating is it that these games are there to be had and guys not being able to make plays when you need to?

I mean, that's the NFL. That's how it's going to be. It's just about giving your team a chance to win in the last 5 percent of the game. And we've had three of those games and we haven't won any of them. So, we've got to start figuring out how to score some points in the fourth quarter. And it starts with all of us. You can't point any fingers, and we've got to just look inside and what we can do better to put ourselves in a better position. But we can't have the performances we've had in the fourth quarter if we expect to be a playoff football team.

Why has it been so hard for you and Calvin Ridley to get on the same page consistently? There's a rough day all around for him today, zero for eight.

We just got to keep working. I trust him. We've gotten so far from where we started, and I have great feel for where he's going to be. He knows he can make a couple of those plays. I know I can put the ball in a little better spot and make it easier on him. But yeah, I got to do what I can do to get him better and he just got to stay positive and trust that this relationship's going to continue to develop because I know it will. And I know it's been aggravating and frustrating. And it's been one of those things where, like, 'When's it going to happen? When's it going to happen?' And that's just kind of the feel of the whole team right now. Like we thought this was a moment for us to kind of flip that switch and get it started. And obviously, you're going to have to keep fighting. But that's all we can do is just keep working and trusting, loving each other.

On the pick, did you feel like maybe you just wanted to put too much air under it on that?

I think I could have given myself some more depth away. Peter (Skoronski) came up, told me he got a little push, but I can't let that be the reason for a pick. But that was one of the throws today where I kind of felt the lack of arm strength or whatever, where I feel like on a healthier day, I'm putting a better ball on it, on more of a line. So, it's frustrating. We were able to get the ball back and still make an opportunity after that. We didn't make it work. But yes, that's a throw I'd like to have back for sure.

On the shorter throws, is that just where the offense is taking you, as

opposed to intermediate throws?

I'm just throwing the ball to who I think it should be thrown to. There's no quick game emphasis. There's no 'Hey, we're just trying to get the ball out here.' We have plays dialed up and I'm just throwing it to who I feel like is the right one to throw it to. And there were a couple of times today where I did have a couple of those quicker throws that I just took and we went back and looked at it and if I would have progressed backside, we would have had something. But the first time you bypass that first throw and get back to that, then it's a sack and why don't you take the first one, you know? So, it's playing that game. There's times to know when we can really hunt up something in the second, third, fourth part of a progression. But I'm just trusting what I see, trying to make the throws when they're there.

On the touchdown pass, did you check out of a run or another pass to get there?

Yeah, we're just trying to dress it up a little bit. Obviously, Nick (Westbrook-Ikhine) out there does a lot of great stuff for us, and we like to use him in different ways, and he gets rewarded with stuff like that. So yeah, that was part of the play call. Just dressing it up a little bit, trying to show that bubble. That was pretty sweet, dial it up just how we thought it would be.

It looked like there may have been PI on the one pass to DeAndre Hopkins, what did you see there?

I thought he got pulled down a little bit. Yeah, but we can't point fingers at the refs. And I think everyone in the stadium had some frustrations about the officiating, but it's never something that we can blame, and we can only look at what we can do better ourselves. Would have loved to have the call, but can't do anything about it.

It seems like the team's highs are very high and the lows very low, what are the ways you as the quarterback can manage and rally the team more?

I think the biggest thing now is just keep coming to work, being the same person. We can't allow the mistakes of the past affect our work ethic and our mental. I had to look at myself the last couple of weeks. Coming off that Monday night game with the injury, I had a slight dip in my behavior, I'd say, or just had to pick myself back up. And just having that just kind of bring yourself back to reality, what it takes. We got at least 13 straight more weeks of this stuff. We can't let up at all if we want to have a chance to win these games. So, we have to have the right mindset. I'm going to come in tomorrow the same person as I would have if we won today and everyone else got to the same thing.

Did you get to the point where you felt good in the week? Felt 100 percent today or is there still work to do to build back up?

I'm still working. I'm not 100 percent physically, but just working to get there eventually. But I know, based on my performance today, that I'm able to go out and win games even though we didn't win today. But I know I can play quarterback in this state.

The play calling is trying to gear you into a game manager, situational manager type of role. How do you feel that transition is going, and do you feel like it's making it tough for you to play the position?

No, I think it's made me better at the position. I think I'm seeing things well. I think the more that I get reps in this offense, the more I'll know when I can see when those bigger plays are there, where I can start bypassing some of those first or second reads. And that just comes with reps and that comes with trusting the coverage that you see and the space that you see. And yeah, I just hope to get there in these next few weeks once we get into the meat of the season and hopefully, we can just get this thing rolling here pretty soon.

SAFETY AMANI HOOKER

Did your eyes just light up when you saw that ball? What did you see there?

I just saw him overthrow it, and I had to make sure I collected it, and caught it, and then try to get as much as I can.

What was the moment like with the defense where that was the first interception of the year for you guys?

We didn't make enough plays, had opportunities, had the ball, enough time. We just didn't make enough plays.

What can you do to move the needle when it seems like so many times you guys are that close?

Just execute. Got to make a play when your number's called and just details. We've got to be at our best.

What do you think goes into your connection with Will (Levis) and some of the plays you were able to make, especially in the second half? What works well about it?

Well, we didn't make enough plays. So, we got to work on that connection. But it's not just me and Will (Levis), it's everybody, it's offensive line, it's running backs, other receivers. We made plays at times; we just didn't execute like we should have.

How do you move toward trying to play complementary football on a consistent basis? I know it's something we've talked about before.

You just got to keep going. It's a long season, our first division game. So, it's not like we're out the division or everybody need to panic. So got a tough team next week, so we've got to go back to the drawing board.

LINEBACKER ERNEST JONES IV

How frustrating was that last long touchdown drive that they were able to get?

It's frustrating, I mean we got them there and let that one slip through our hands. We just have to be better. It's frustrating though.

L'Jarius Sneed looked like he had pretty good coverage on Michael Pittman, but that's kind of what Pittman does, isn't it?

Yeah, they get paid, too. They get paid good money too, so they have to make plays on their side, and he has to do the same thing. And we know, the majority of the time, (L'Jarius) Sneed is going to come through, and today they made a play, and that's all it is. We've got to move on and go out there and stop them like we did on the drives after.

1-4, is obviously not where you want to be. A couple of rough road games coming up. How do you guys kind of circle the wagons and just kind of stay with it mentally?

You've got to. Because I mean, 1-4 is bad, and 1-5, is even worse. So, you've got to figure this shit out. We've got to figure out what we can do to

On your one PI call, you had your hand up to block the ball, did you not?

Yeah, I pulled down. That's on me. I've got to be better on that. I think if we eliminate that, as a defense, it'll be a different story. So, we've got to be better on defense, and it starts with myself. I take accountability for that play.

You did have several long drives against you. You guys just need to get off the field sooner?

I think that the penalties, that's what extended. I mean, my penalty extended us. We got a stop, field goal, we had a PI on one, we had an interception that was a PI. So, it's like, we're shooting ourselves in the foot. We've just got to look at ourselves as a defense and be better. Be more disciplined. If we're more discipline, that's a whole different game, I really, truly believe. You know, those penalties don't happen, and it's a different game. We've just got to be better on defense, starting with myself. Got to look myself in the mirror.

You guys are 1-4, right now, going to Buffalo, and to going to Detroit. How precarious is the situation for you right now?

Such a great word. Precarious. I like that word. Honestly, I think we're still hungry. We're still ready to go. We have all the pieces here. We have so many great pieces here, and so many great players here. And I don't think, even though the record doesn't look good, I don't think we're satisfied. We're going to continue to get better and continue to hone in on little things. And right now, it's truly just little things. Like Jeff Simmons said early in the locker room, it's just the little things, the details, the penalties. Those five penalties, again I'm going to reiterate, those five penalties don't happen, those three penalties—I don't know the number—it's a whole different ball game. So, again, I'm going to look myself in the mirror. I got to be better, and we just have to be better as a defense to not get those penalties and get off the field. We get off the field and it'd probably be a different game.

The activation was always a blessing. Have been working nonstop with all of the guys. Not a good day right now, definitely don't like to lose.

How tough is it to come out here and play your butts off, what you did for four quarters and come up short today?

It just hurts because we know how good of a team we are as a whole. We know how much how hard we work and how much we know we can really shock this league because we can do a lot of things. So, it hurts a lot to not get it done. We've been in a lot of close games, and it hurts not to get it done.

Those last couple drives, did any do Indy do anything defensively that you guys weren't expecting?

No, they did a phenomenal job. Their front is exactly where we thought it was. They're a great group, a lot of energy and a lot of pressure, but we just didn't execute on offense, didn't make the plays.



SEASON NOTES

- PLAYOFF OPPONENTS: The Titans have six total games against five playoff teams from last season. They have home games against Green Bay and Houston and road contests at Miami, Buffalo, Detroit and Houston. Four of those six games are against 2023 division winners: Houston twice (AFC South), Buffalo (AFC East) and Detroit (NFC North). The six games against reigning playoff clubs are the fewest for the Titans since they had five such games entering the 2020 campaign.
- TV BREAKDOWN: Excluding their Week 18 matchup with the Texans, which has yet to be assigned a broadcasting network, the Titans are currently scheduled for nine contests on CBS, six games on FOX, and one game on ESPN. Due to the NFL's flex scheduling, some contests could be moved to a different network from the one appearing on the initial schedule.
- TIME (ZONE) TRAVEL: Besides a trip to Los Angeles to face the Chargers in Week 10, the Titans stay in either the central time zone (10 games) or eastern time zone (six) for the duration of 2024, including the preseason. Other than Los Angeles, the farthest west they travel is Houston.
- HIGH NOON: During the regular season, 14 of the Titans' 16 games prior to Week 18 are scheduled for Sundays at noon CT.
- FIRST-YEAR COACHES: Brian Callahan is one of eight NFL head coaches in their first season with their current team. He and the Titans face three of the others, all within a five-week span: Jerod Mayo's New England Patriots, Jim Harbaugh's Los Angeles Chargers, and Dan Quinn's Washington Commanders. Additionally, the Titans go against the Seattle Seahawks and new head coach Mike Macdonald in the second week of the preseason.
- QUARTERBACKS 1-2-3: The 2024 NFL Draft featured quarterbacks in the top three selections, beginning with Caleb Williams going first to Chicago, followed by Jayden Daniels to Washington and Drake Maye to New England. The Titans face each of those teams this season, in addition to the Minnesota Vikings, who drafted J.J. McCarthy with the 11th overall selection.
- DIVISIONAL WAITING GAMES: The Titans must wait until Week 6 against Indianapolis to play their first AFC South matchup of 2024. It is their longest wait for a divisional game since 2010 (Week 6 at Jacksonville). However, the Titans conclude 2024 with divisional games in five of the final seven weeks, including three consecutive division battles to conclude the schedule.
- THREE GAMES BASED UPON 2023 FINISH: Every NFL team has two intraconference games and one interconference matchup based on the previous year's standings. As a result of the Titans' fourth-place finish in 2023, they host the AFC North's fourth-place Bengals, and they visit the fourth-place Chargers from the AFC West and the Washington Commanders from the NFC East. Overall, the Titans' strength of schedule is .491 (142-147) based upon their opponents' combined 2023 record, which is tied for the 21st most difficult schedule out of 32 NFL teams.
- FACING TOP OFFENSES AND DEFENSES: The Titans face four of the NFL's top 10 offenses from last season: Miami (No. 1 overall offense), Buffalo (No. 4), Detroit (No. 3) and Minnesota (No. 10). They also contend with four of the top 10 defenses from 2023: the New York Jets (No. 3 overall defense), Miami (No. 10), Buffalo (No. 9) and New England (No. 7).

WEEK-BY-WEEK NOTES

- WEEK 7 at BUFFALO: Two original AFL rivals meet for the sixth time in a seven-year span ... In 50 previous all-time meetings with the Bills, including playoffs, the Titans own a 30-20 record ... The Titans won consecutive home games against the Bills in 2020 and 2021 before the Bills took the most recent matchup at Highmark Stadium on Sept. 19, 2022 ... Buffalo carries a streak of five consecutive playoff seasons and four straight AFC East titles into 2024 ... Bills quarterback Josh Allen enters his seventh NFL season and is one of only two NFL quarterbacks (Patrick Mahomes) who have passed for more than 4,000 yards in each of the past four campaigns.
- WEEK 8 at DETROIT: The Titans make their third all-time appearance at Ford Field, where they are 2-0 with wins in 2008 and 2016 ... The Titans are 10-3 all-time against Detroit, and their current six-game winning streak against the Lions is their longest active winning streak against any opponent. Most recently, the Titans won 46-25 at Nissan Stadium on Dec. 20, 2020 ... New Titans head coach Brian Callahan was the quarterbacks coach for the Lions in 2016 and 2017 ... Led by head coach Dan Campbell and quarterback Jared Goff, the Lions won the NFC North in 2023, marking the organization's first division title since 1993. They advanced to their first NFC Championship game since 1991, ultimately falling to the San Francisco 49ers.
- WEEK 9 vs. NEW ENGLAND: Led by new head coach Jerod Mayo, who attended the University of Tennessee from 2004 through 2007, the Patriots make their first visit to Nissan Stadium in the regular season since Nov. 11, 2018, a game won by the Titans 34-10 ... Mayo takes over the reins in New England after playing and coaching under previous head coach Bill Belichick ... Patriots rookie and former North Carolina Tar Heels quarterback Drake Maye was the third-overall draft pick in 2024 ... Titans quarterback and Madison, Conn., native Will Levis could make his first career appearance against the Patriots.
- WEEK 10 at LOS ANGELES CHARGERS: The Titans and Chargers meet for the third consecutive season ... In their only previous encounter at SoFi Stadium, the Chargers defeated the Titans 17-14 on Dec. 18, 2022 ... Most recently, Tennessee won 27-24 in overtime at Nissan Stadium on Sept. 17, 2023 ... Head coach Jim Harbaugh is in his first season with the Chargers after leading the University of Michigan to a national title in 2023. Harbaugh was the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers from 2011 to 2014 prior to coaching at Michigan. His father, Jack Harbaugh, was the head coach at Western Kentucky University from 1989 to 2002 ... The Titans look for their first road victory against the Chargers since 1990.

Then-rookie Vikings wide receiver Justin Jefferson recorded his first career start, touchdown and 100-yard game, but the Titans won 31-30 ... In the 2024 NFL Draft, the Vikings selected Michigan quarterback J.J. McCarthy with the 11th overall pick.
- WEEKS 12 & 18 vs. HOUSTON: The Texans and Titans collectively feature a pair of top quarterbacks from the 2023 rookie class: C.J. Stroud (first round, second overall) and Will Levis (second round, 33rd overall), respectively ... Stroud won the 2023 AP Offensive Rookie of the Year Award, and his teammate, defensive end Will Anderson, was named the AP Defensive Rookie of the Year ... During the 2024 offseason, the Texans signed former Titans defensive end Denico Autry and linebacker Azeez Al-Shaair as unrestricted free agents ... The Titans, who lead the all-time series 23-21 heading into 2024, look to end the Texans' three-game winning streak in the rivalry ... Week 18 marks the fourth time in a six-year span the two rivals conclude the regular season against each other.
- WEEK 13 at WASHINGTON COMMANDERS: The Titans and Commanders clash in 2024 as a result of their respective divisional finishes in 2023 ... The Titans have won the past two contests in the series, including most recently a 21-17 victory at Washington on Oct. 9, 2022 ... During the 2024 offseason, the Commanders hired a new general manager, Adam Peters, and a new head coach, Dan Quinn ... Peters and Titans executive vice president/general manager Ran Carthon previously worked together at the San Francisco 49ers ... Quinn, who was the head coach of the Atlanta Falcons from 2015 to 2020, arrives in Washington following his role as the defensive coordinator of the Dallas Cowboys.
- WEEKS 14 & 17 vs. JACKSONVILLE: The annual Titans-Jaguars series heads into its 30th season since the Jaguars' inaugural 1995 campaign ... The two rivals face each other twice in the month of December ... The Titans won the most recent contest, a 28-20 victory in the 2023 season finale at Nissan Stadium ... During the 2024 offseason, former Jaguars wide receiver Calvin Ridley was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent. In 2023, during his only season with the Jaguars, Ridley started every contest and caught 76 passes for 1,016 yards and eight touchdowns ... New Titans offensive coordinator Nick Holz also arrives from Jacksonville, where he was the Jaguars' passing game coordinator.
- WEEK 15 vs. CINCINNATI: Early in the 2024 offseason, the Titans made Brian Callahan the 20th head coach in franchise history after he spent the previous five campaigns as Cincinnati's offensive coordinator. During his tenure in Cincinnati, Callahan served under head coach Zac Taylor, helping the Bengals to two AFC North titles, two AFC Championship appearances and a Super Bowl berth ... Wide receiver Tyler Boyd spent the first eight seasons of his career with the Bengals before signing with the Titans as a free agent in 2024 ... This is the fourth consecutive season in which the Bengals have visited Tennessee in either the postseason (2021) or regular season (2022-24) ... The Titans took last year's contest on Oct. 1 by a final score of 27-3.

HEAD COACH BRIAN CALLAHAN

> Begins his tenure as the 20th head coach in franchise history.

S JAMAL ADAMS

Needs 3.5 sacks in 2024 (21.5 entering 2024) to reach 25 career sacks. He would become the sixth defensive back to reach the mark since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982, joining Rodney Harrison (30.5), Ronde Barber (28), Brian Dawkins (26), Adrian Wilson (25.5) and Carnell Lake (25).

WR TYLER BOYD

Can record his seventh consecutive season with at least 50 receptions and 500 receiving yards. He is tied for the NFL's seventh-longest such active streak entering 2024.

LS MORGAN COX

- Enters 2024 ranked 10th in the NFL in career games played among active players (216 entering 2024).
- By appearing in all 17 contests in 2024, which would give him 233 career games, Cox would rank fourth in career NFL games among all players from the University of Tennessee. He would trail only Jason Witten (271), Peyton Manning (266) and Dustin Colquitt (255).

S QUANDRE DIGGS

Enters 2024 as the NFL's only player with an active streak of 17 starts and at least one interception in three consecutive seasons.

K NICK FOLK

- Enters 2024 ranked seventh in the NFL in career games played among active players (228 entering 2024).
- Needs 18 field goals to reach 400 for his career. Entering 2024, only 13 players in NFL history previously reached the mark. His 382 career field goals through 2023 ranked 19th in NFL annals.
- Goes into 2024 with an NFL-record streak of 78 consecutive field goals made from under 40 yards. His last miss in that range was a 31-yarder against New England on Oct. 5, 2017, when he played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Enters 2024 with more receptions (928) and receiving yards (12,355) than any other player since he entered the NFL in 2013.
- Needs 72 receptions to reach 1,000 in his first 12 seasons. Only Jerry Rice (1,050), Marvin Harrison (1,042), Larry Fitzgerald (1,018) and Andre Johnson (1,012) have previously reached the mark in their first 12 seasons. Hopkins recorded 928 receptions in his first 11 seasons. Through 2023, only 14 total players in NFL history had reached the 1,000 career reception plateau.
- A 72-reception season also would make Hopkins the second player in NFL history with 1,000 receptions prior to his 33rd birthday, joining Larry Fitzgerald. Hopkins will turn 33 on June 6, 2025.
- Needs 72 receptions, 645 receiving yards and seven touchdown catches in 2024 to become the ninth player in NFL history to total at least 1,000 receptions, 13,000 receiving yards and 85 touchdown catches during his career. Hopkins would join Jerry Rice, Marvin Harrison and Larry Fitzgerald as the only players to reach all three marks within their first 12 NFL seasons.
- Has at least one reception in every game he has played during his

career—162 consecutive games entering 2024. With a reception in his first six games of 2024, he will pass **Keyshawn Johnson** (167) for the NFL's second-longest catch streak to begin a career during the Super Bowl era (1966–present). Hopkins' streak of games with a reception to begin his career ranks third behind only Johnson and **Marvin Harrison** (190).

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

- Enters the 2024 season ranked 11th in franchise history with 41.5 career sacks. With 8.5 sacks in 2024, he would become only the eighth defender in franchise annals to be credited with 50 sacks.
- With 11 sacks in 2024 (41.5 entering the season), Landry will pass Jevon Kearse (52) for the most sacks by a player in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present).

QB WILL LEVIS

- Can become the third player in franchise history to start at least nine games in each of his first two NFL seasons, joining Vince Young and Marcus Mariota.
- Can become the third player in franchise history to average at least 12.0 yards per completion in each of his first two NFL seasons, joining Warren Moon and Marcus Mariota.

TE CHIG OKONKWO

- Can join Frank Wycheck (six consecutive seasons) and Delanie Walker (five) as the only tight ends in franchise history to record consecutive seasons with at least 50 receptions and 500 receiving yards.
- Can become the franchise's first tight end to begin his NFL career with three consecutive seasons in which he posted at least 30 receptions and 400 receiving yards.

RB TONY POLLARD

- Needs 60 scrimmage yards in 2024 to reach 5,000 for his career (3,621 rushing yards and 1,319 receiving yards entering 2024).
- Can notch his third consecutive season with at least 1,000 rushing yards.
- Looks to extend his streak to four consecutive seasons with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards.

WR CALVIN RIDLEY

- Needs 642 receiving yards in 2024 to reach 5,000 for his career (4,358 entering 2024).
- Needs 76 receptions in 2024 to reach 400 for his career (324 entering 2024).

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

- Needs 3.5 sacks in 2024 to reach 30 career sacks (26.5 entering 2024).
 He would be the franchise's 10th player to do so since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982, as well as the organization's sixth player in its "Titans era" (1999–present) to reach 30 sacks.
- Enters 2024 on a streak of three consecutive seasons with at least 5.5 sacks. With 5.5 or more sacks in 2024, he would become the franchise's first player to reach the number in four consecutive seasons since Ray Childress (eight consecutive seasons from 1987–1994).

CB L'JARIUS SNEED

- Can record his fifth consecutive season to begin his career with at least two interceptions.
- Can become the NFL's only player since the beginning of the 2008 season to register three consecutive seasons with at least 11 passes defensed and five tackles for loss. In that span, only Sneed, Chris Harris (2013–2014), Troy Polamalu (2010–2011) and Charles Woodson (2009–2010) have recorded two such consecutive campaigns.

P RYAN STONEHOUSE

- Can become the first player since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to lead the league in gross punting average for three consecutive seasons.
- After averaging an NFL-record 53.1-yards per punt as a rookie in 2022 and then averaging 53.1 yards per attempt in 2023, Stonehouse can become the first player since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to record three career seasons with an average of 50.0 yards per punt. AJ Cole (Las Vegas) could also accomplish the feat in 2023.

<u>GM Ran Carthon Motivated to Turn Titans Around.</u> and Prove Ownership Right

Video: Ran Carthon Introduced as Titans GM

Ran Carthon was named the 14th general manager in franchise history on Jan. 18, 2023. He joined the Titans after spending six seasons with the San Francisco 49ers, including the last two as the team's director of player personnel.

A year after initially joining the franchise, Carthon was promoted to executive vice president/general manager. His duties expanded to include all areas that impact the football team: roster control, team activities and personnel decisions including draft and free agency acquisitions, oversight of head coach **Brian Callahan** and his coaching staff, scouting, sports medicine, and player engagement.

"Over the past year, Ran has impressed me and our staff with his innovative approach to roster building," said Titans controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk upon Carthon's promotion in 2024. "Ran's exceptional reputation around the league as a talent evaluator and culture builder was a clear competitive advantage during last year's free agency and draft process, as well as our recent search for a head coach. Simply put, Ran Carthon makes the Tennessee Titans a destination for the league's top talent. By expanding his role to include full roster control and oversight of the coaching staff, our organization will now benefit more completely from Ran's unique ability to build and lead a championship-caliber football team."

Shortly after receiving his promotion, Carthon and his staff embarked upon the 2024 offseason. Their efforts resulted in several notable signings in free agency: cornerback **Chidobe Awuzie**, linebacker **Kenneth Murray Jr.**, defensive lineman **Sebastian Joseph-Day**, center **Lloyd Cushenberry III**, running back **Tony Pollard**, quarterback **Mason Rudolph** and wide receiver **Calvin Ridley**. The Titans then used a trade to acquire former Kansas City Chiefs cornerback **L'Jarius Sneed** before circling back in free agency to add wide receiver **Tyler Boyd** and safety **Jamal Adams**. Prior to the start of the 2024 season, another trade brought linebacker **Ernest Jones IV** to the Titans from the Los Angeles Rams.

During the 2024 NFL Draft, Carthon orchestrated the selection of seven total players. With the seventh overall pick in the first round, the Titans chose Alabama tackle **JC Latham**, and at No. 38 in the second round, they took Texas nose tackle **T'Vondre Sweat**.

In his first year with the Titans, Carthon re-worked the roster with several veteran additions who would become key starters for the team in 2023, including wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins**, outside linebacker **Arden Key**, linebacker **Azeez Al-Shaair**, cornerback **Sean Murphy-Bunting** and offensive lineman **Daniel Brunskill** in free agency. In his first draft, offensive lineman **Peter Skoronski**, quarterback **Will Levis** and running back **Tyjae Spears** were selected in the first three rounds, respectively. Carthon also used a trade to acquire kicker **Nick Folk**.

Carthon arrived in Tennessee with a range of experience from multiple teams. In San Francisco, he was the 49ers director of pro personnel for four seasons (2017-20) and then promoted to director of player personnel in 2021, serving in that capacity until joining the Titans. In his role as director of player personnel, Carthon was responsible for evaluating the top college prospects and assisting in the construction of the pro free agent board and evaluations. He joined the 49ers when head coach **Kyle Shanahan** and general manager **John Lynch** took over in 2017 and played a part in the team's three playoff appearances, two division titles and an NFC championship in 2019. Additionally, the 49ers had nine players account for 13 total Pro Bowl selections from 2021 (seven selections) to 2022 (six selections)–evidence of the talented roster the personnel staff amassed.

Before joining San Francisco, Carthon spent five seasons (2012-16) with the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams as their director of pro personnel. He entered the NFL scouting world as a pro scout with the Atlanta Falcons for four years (2008-11).

As a player, Carthon spent three seasons in the NFL (2004-06) primarily with the Indianapolis Colts, after entering the league as an

undrafted college free agent. At the University of Florida, he tallied 1,353 career rushing yards over four seasons and was part of the Gators' 2000 SEC Championship team.

Carthon was raised in an NFL family with his father, Maurice Carthon, having a distinguished playing and coaching career. Maurice Carthon played for the Colts and New York Giants, and he coached for New England, the New York Jets, Detroit, Dallas, Cleveland, Arizona and Kansas City.

Following his playing career, Ran Carthon received his bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Florida in 2008. As a member of the Rams (2013) and 49ers (2018) he was selected to participate in the NFL Career Development Symposium at the Wharton School of Business, and in 2022, he took part in the inaugural NFL coach and front office accelerator program.

Born Arandic Kornell Carthon in February of 1981, in Osceola, Ark., he attended Key West High School in Key West, Fla.

He also helped guide guarterback Joe Burrow from the No. 1 overall draft pick in 2020 to multiple singleseason franchise records by his second year and Pro Bowl honors within three years.

Over Callahan's final three seasons in Cincinnati (2021-23), the Bengals offense ranked in the NFL's top 10 in several categories: sixth in scoring (24.9), seventh in passing (250.8 yards per game), seventh in redzone efficiency (61.5 percent), 10th in third-down percentage (41.0) and sixth in time of possession (31:00).

From the time Burrow entered the NFL in 2020 through the 2023 campaign, he recorded the league's seventh-best passer rating (98.6) and tied for the third-best completion percentage (68.0). His 270.8 passing yards per game in that period ranked fifth.

Additionally, Cincinnati's offense under Callahan featured a trio of 1,000-yard wide receivers in Ja'Marr Chase (2021-23), Tee Higgins (2021-22) and Tyler Boyd (2019). Chase quickly emerged as one of the NFL's top wide receivers after being drafted in the first round in 2021. He earned three consecutive Pro Bowl nods and became the eighth player in NFL history to reach 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first three career seasons, including 1,216 yards on a career-high 100 receptions in 2023. Boyd's statistical highlights included 1,046 receiving yards in 2019, while Higgins contributed 1,091 yards in 2021 and 1,029 yards in 2022.

Bengals running back Joe Mixon exceeded 1,000 scrimmage yards four times in five seasons with Callahan as his offensive coordinator. From 2019 through 2023, he joined Christian McCaffrey and Aaron Jones as the NFL's only players with at least 4,500 rushing yards (4,618) and 1,500 receiving yards (1,556). Mixon was named to the Pro Bowl in 2021.

In 2023, Burrow was limited to 10 total games due to multiple injuries. Backup Jake Browning stepped into the lineup, and in the first action of his career, he registered a season passer rating of 98.4-qualifying as the seventh-best number in the NFL.

In 2022, the Bengals ranked seventh in the NFL in points per game (26.1), eighth in total offense (360.5 yards per game) and fifth in passing offense (265.0). Burrow earned his first career Pro Bowl selection while setting single-season franchise records for completions (414) and touchdown passes (35). The third-year signal caller also placed fifth in the NFL with 4,475 passing yards. The team's new-look offensive line came together during the season and did not allow more than two sacks in any of the final eight games of the regular season.

En route to an appearance in Super Bowl LVI, the 2021 Bengals ranked seventh in passing offense (259.0 yards per game) and tied for seventh in points per game (27.1). Burrow, after returning from a knee injury suffered in 2020, led the NFL in completion percentage (70.4) and established single-season Bengals records for passing yards (4,611) and passer rating (108.3). Chase was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year after posting a team-record 1,455 receiving yards, while Mixon placed

third in the NFL in rushing yards (1,205).

In 2020, Callahan helped develop Burrow as a rookie despite facing the challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, including the cancellation of all in-person NFL offseason programs. Before a knee injury ended his rookie campaign in Week 11, Burrow's 264 completions were the most ever by an NFL quarterback through his first 10 career games, while his 2,688 passing yards were fifth.

Callahan joined the Bengals after spending 2018 as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. Under his tutelage, Raiders quarterback Derek Carr passed for a then-career-high 4,049 yards and led the AFC with a 68.9 completion percentage.

From 2016 to 2017, Callahan was the quarterbacks coach for the Detroit Lions. Working with Matthew Stafford, he helped the veteran finish third in passing yards (4,446) and fourth in passing touchdowns (29) in 2017, while posting a then-career-best 99.3 passer rating. In 2016, Stafford's eight game-winning drives were the most by a guarterback in a season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

Callahan broke into the NFL with the Denver Broncos in 2010 and served in multiple roles for the franchise through 2015. He began as a coaching assistant (2010) before transitioning to offensive quality control coach (2011-12), offensive assistant coach (2013-14) and finally offensive assistant/quarterbacks coach (2015). In 2013, Broncos quarterback Peyton Manning won the Associated Press NFL MVP award after completing a league-record 55 touchdown passes. Callahan's tenure in Denver was capped by the team's victory in Super Bowl 50 following the 2015 campaign. Before reaching the NFL, Callahan spent time at his alma mater, UCLA, as a graduate assistant in 2006 and 2007. He then spent two years (2008-09) as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Junipero Serra High School in San Mateo, Calif.

As a former walk-on guarterback at UCLA, he appeared in 13 games as a holder on PATs. He earned a bachelor's degree in sociology in 2006 and added a master's in education in 2008.

Born in Champaign, Ill., Callahan attended De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif., where he was a part of the school's national-record 151game winning streak and a No. 1 national ranking.

He and his wife, Allyson, have a son, Ronan, and a daughter, Norah. He is the son of longtime NFL coach Bill Callahan, the current Titans offensive line coach.





- In 2023, Outten's work with the Titans running backs helped Derrick Henry finish second in the NFL with 1,167 rushing yards. - Prior to rejoining the Titans, Rocker spent three seasons as the defensive line coach for the Philadelphia Eagles (2021-23). In that period, the Eagles tied for third in the NFL with 142 total sacks and earned three consecutive postseason berths.
- In 2023, Rocker was part of an Eagles playoff team that ranked 10th in the league in rushing defense (103.4 opponent yards per game), while defensive end Josh Sweat registered his third consecutive season with at least 6.5 sacks. He also played in NFL Europe for the Frankfurt Galaxy (2007). Woodfin started at linebacker for the Galaxy and helped lead the team to the 2007 World Bowl.
- > In 2006, he got his start in the strength and conditioning field as an intern at UAB and then worked as a volunteer at the University of Alabama (2007) before becoming a performance specialist for three years at Athletes' Performance (2007-10), based in Los Angeles.
- > Woodfin graduated from UAB in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science and a concentration in fitness leadership. He is certified by the NSCA and USAW.

"The new stadium will host the world's largest events, as well as serve as a community hub for our local neighbors. We're excited to have a partner like Nissan embark on this journey with us as we look towards the future."

The partnership will feature dedicated areas in the new stadium for brand experiences and displays, innovative technology integration, and involvement in Titans broadcast platforms. Nissan also will support a to-bedetermined program in the Titans' ONE Community philanthropic platform, which reaches Nashville's most underrepresented and marginalized communities with a focus on three areas - Opportunity, Neighborhoods and Education

"Nissan Stadium is a centerpiece of the Nashville skyline and has become a household name in Middle Tennessee. 



Quarterback **Will Levis** was selected by the Titans in the second round (33rd overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft. He was the fourth quarterback chosen in the draft after the Titans traded up in the second round to select him.



In his debut season, Levis recorded starts in all nine games in which he appeared, becoming the

third rookie quarterback in franchise history to start at least nine games. Only **Vince Young** (13 starts in 2006) and **Marcus Mariota** (12 starts in 2015) preceded him in the accomplishment. Levis' rookie passing totals included 255 attempts, 149 completions, 1,808 yards, eight touchdowns and four interceptions. His 84.2 passer rating was the second best in franchise history by a rookie quarterback (91.5 by Mariota in 2015), and the number also ranked first in NFL history among second-round quarterbacks in their rookie season (minimum 200 attempts). Levis had an additional 57 yards and a touchdown rushing.

Prior to entering the NFL, Levis spent two seasons at the University of Kentucky after transferring from Penn State. In four combined college seasons, he appeared in 39 games with 26 starts. He completed 479 of his 738 passes (64.9 percent) for 5,876 yards with 46 touchdowns and 25 interceptions. He also rushed for 742 yards and 17 touchdowns.

At Kentucky, Levis went 17-7 as a starter, tying Terry Wilson for the second-most quarterback wins since 1993. The two-time team captain completed 418 of 636 passes for 5,233 yards with 43 passing touchdowns and 11 rushing scores for the Wildcats. His six 300-yard passing games were the fourth-most in school history.

As a senior in 2022, he started 11 games at quarterback and connected on 185 of 283 passes for 2,406 yards with 19 passing scores, while ranking fourth in the SEC in pass efficiency (151.9). He finished fifth in the SEC with 19 passing scores.

As a junior in 2021, he transferred from Penn State to Kentucky and started in all 13 games, helping to lead UK to 10 wins for the fourth time in school history. He totaled 3,203 yards total offense, becoming the seventh player in school history to reach 3,000 yards of total offense in a season. He was 233-of-353 passing for 2,826 yards and 24 touchdowns, and he also registered 107 rushes for 376 yards and a team-high tying nine rushing touchdowns.

He is a native of Madison, Conn.

2024 Game Notes:

> At Chicago (9/8), in his first Week 1 start and his 10th career start, completed 19 of 32 passes for 127 yards and a touchdown with two interceptions. He added 36 rushing yards on four carries. In the second quarter, he converted a third-and-15 with a 22-yard pass to Calvin Ridley and tossed a 17-yard touchdown pass to Chig Okonkwo. It was his ninth career touchdown pass.

> Against the New York Jets (9/15), completed 19 of 28 passes for 192 yards with one touchdown and one interception (84.2 passer rating). His 67.9 completion percentage set a career high (min. 20 attempts). He added a career-high 38 rushing yards on four attempts, marking the second consecutive week he posted a career high in rushing. In the first half, he completed 11 of 13 passes, and his 84.6 first-half completion percentage was the second-highest mark of his career (88.9 against Houston, Dec. 17, 2023) through 11 starts. In the second quarter, he converted a third-and-three with a 22-yard pass to Tony Pollard. In the third quarter, his career

long 21-yard rushing attempt converted a third-and-one. Also in the third quarter, he completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Calvin Ridley for his second touchdown pass of the season.

> Against Green Bay (9/22), completed 26 of 34 passes for 260 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His 26 completions were a career high, and his 76.5 completion percentage established a new career high (minimum of 20 pass attempts). His completion percentage also tied Ken Stabler (Sept. 28, 1980 at Cincinnati) for fourth place in franchise history in a game in which a quarterback attempted at least 34 passes behind only Steve McNair (79.4 against Jacksonville on Nov. 4, 2001), Warren Moon (78.9 against Detroit on Nov. 5, 1989) and Neil O'Donnell (77.5 against Cleveland on Sept. 19, 1999). His 92.8 passer rating ranked second in his career in a game with at least 20 attempts. Levis tallied his third career game with two or more touchdown passes. On the team's opening offensive series, he completed a 23-yard pass to Josh Whyle on the first play of the game, added a 20-yard pass to Tyler Boyd, and completed a one-yard touchdown pass to Nick Vannett. In the third quarter, he completed a screen pass for 29 yards to Tyjae Spears, and later on the same drive, he completed an 11-yard touchdown pass to DeAndre Hopkins. > At Miami (9/30), completed three of four passes for 25 yards with one interception before leaving the game in the first quarter with a right shoulder injury. He added five yards on two rushing attempts.

> Against Indianapolis (10/13), completed 16 of 27 passes for 95 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and he added three rushing attempts for 15 yards. In the first quarter, he tossed a nine-yard touchdown pass to Nick Westbrook-Ikhine to register his 13th career touchdown pass (fifth in 2024). He found DeAndre Hopkins for a 23-yard gain in the second quarter.

SECOND-ROUND QUARTERBACKS

From the first common draft in 1967 to 2023, there were 63 quarterbacks selected in the second round of the NFL Draft. Among those with at least 200 passing attempts in their rookie season, Titans quarterback **Will Levis** delivered the highest passer rating. Levis was 149-of-255 passing for 1,808 yards with eight touchdowns and four interceptions, amounting to an 84.2 passer rating. The previous leader was **Charlie Batch**, who had an 83.5 passer rating as a rookie with the Detroit Lions in 1998.

Levis' 58.4 completion percentage also ranked as the best of any second-rounder in his rookie campaign. Former Cincinnati Bengals quarterback **Andy Dalton** previously held the top spot with a 58.1 completion percentage as a rookie in 2011.

Mason Rudolph is in his seventh NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans. He was signed as an unrestricted free agent on March 15, 2024.

Rudolph joined the Titans after spending his first six seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In 21 games during his time in Pittsburgh, he started at

13 times, throwing for 3,085 yards and 19 touchdowns with a completion percentage of 63.5.

In 2023, Rudolph started three games during the regular season, passing for 719 yards and three touchdowns. He also started Pittsburgh's playoff game at Buffalo.

In 2019, in relief of the injured Ben Roethlisberger, he went 5-3 as Pittsburgh's starter while throwing for 1,765 yards and 13 touchdowns in 10 total games played.

Rudolph was originally drafted by the Steelers in the third round (76th overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft.

In four seasons at Oklahoma State (2014-17), led the Cowboys to a 32-9 record as a starter to become the winningest quarterback in school history. His 13,618 career passing yards ranked fourth in Big-12 history and he was the recipient of the 2017 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, awarded to the top upperclassmen quarterback in the country.

Running back Tony Pollard is in his sixth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans. The Memphis native was signed as an unrestricted free agent on March 14, 2024.

Prior to joining the Titans, Pollard spent five seasons (2019-23) with the Dallas Cowboys, who selected him in the fourth round (128th overall) of the

2019 NFL Draft. During his time in Dallas, he appeared in 79 games with 23 starts, totaling 3,621 rushing yards and 23 touchdowns on 762 carries. With an additional 176 receptions for 1,319 yards and five receiving touchdowns, he reached 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of his final three years in Dallas while also returning 63 kickoffs for 1,500 yards, including one return for a score.

In 2023, his first season as the lead running back in Dallas, Pollard started all 17 games for the first time in his career and led the team with 1,005 rushing yards on a career-high 252 carries (4.0 avg.) with six touchdowns.

In 2022, he set career marks with 193 carries for 1,007 yards and nine scores, averaging 5.2 yards-per-carry to rank third in the NFL and earn his first Pro Bowl nod.

At the University of Memphis, he played in 40 games at running back and wide receiver, amassing 2,233 yards and 18 touchdowns on offense. He also averaged 30.1 yards per kickoff return and tied an NCAA record with seven kickoff returns for touchdowns.

2024 Game Notes:

> At Chicago (9/8), started in his Titans debut and led the team with 82 rushing yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. He added 12 yards on three receptions to give him 94 scrimmage yards in the contest. In the first quarter, he rushed for a 14-yard gain, and later during the same drive, he crossed the goal line on a 26-yard run. It was his 24th career touchdown run and his 30th total career touchdown (five receiving, one kickoff return). He totaled 54 yards on four carries during the scoring drive. > At Miami (9/30), led the team with 108 scrimmage yards, including 88 rushing yards on 22 carries and 20 yards on a pair of receptions. It was his 18th career game with a minimum of 100 scrimmage yards. His 22 carries tied for the third-highest total of his career. In the fourth quarter, he scored his 25th career rushing touchdown (second of 2024) on a four-yard run. In the third quarter, he rushed for a 41-yard gain to help set up a touchdown on the ensuing play. It was his eighth career carry of 40-plus yards. He added a 16-yard reception in the second guarter.

> Against Indianapolis (10/13), led the offense with 93 yards and one score on 17 rushing attempts. On third-and-19 in the second quarter, he scored a touchdown on a 23-yard run. He became the third NFL player in 2024 with two (or more) rushing touchdowns of 20-plus yards, joining Derrick Henry and Kenneth Walker III.

#2 • RB TYJAE SPEARS

5-11, 195, 2nd Year/2nd with Titans, Tulane Click for complete bio

Running back Tyjae Spears was selected by the Titans in the third round (81st overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft.

As a rookie, Spears did not miss a game and registered one start. He carried the ball 100 times for 453 yards and two touchdowns, and he added 52 receptions for 385 yards and one score. His 838



scrimmage yards ranked seventh in franchise history among rookie running backs, and the total also placed fourth among rookie running backs in 2023 behind Atlanta's Bijan Robinson, Detroit's Jahmyr Gibbs and Miami's De'Von Achane. Spears became the franchise's first rookie running back with at least 50 receptions since Sid Blanks in 1964 (56).

Spears spent four years at Tulane (2019-22) prior to entering the NFL. He appeared in 33 games with 20 starts at running back for the Green Wave, totaling 2,910 yards and 31 touchdowns on 427 carries with an additional 48 receptions for 564 yards and three scores. He ended his career as the school's all-time leader in yards per carry (6.8), tied for second in 100-yard rushing games (15), tied for third in rushing touchdowns (31), fourth in rushing yards per game (85.6) and sixth in rushing yards (2,910) and total touchdowns (34). His 6.8 yards per carry from 2019 to 2022 ranked second in the FBS behind only Alabama-Birmingham running back DeWayne McBride's 7.3-yard average (minimum 400 attempts).

As a junior in 2022, he started all 14 games for the Green Wave, totaling 1,581 yards and 19 touchdowns on 229 rushing attempts and adding 22 receptions for 256 yards and two touchdowns. He tied for the national lead with 21 total touchdowns and tied for third in the country with 19 rushing touchdowns, a total that ranked second in Tulane single-season history. His 1,581 rushing yards led the conference and made up the Green Wave's all-time second-highest single-season total. His nine 100-yard rushing games included eight consecutive such efforts to finish the season. He was named the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year and also earned first-team All-AAC honors. His efforts helped Tulane earn a 12-2 record and win an American Athletic Conference title.

He is a native of Ponchatoula, La.

> At Chicago (9/8), totaled 21 yards on four rushing attempts and added 11 yards on a team-high four receptions.

> Against the N.Y. Jets (9/15), rushed for 20 yards on six carries and added 11 yards on a pair of receptions before leaving the game late in the second quarter. He also returned one kickoff for 22 yards.

#85 • TE CHIG OKONKWO

6-3, 238, 3rd Year/3rd with Titans, Maryland Click for complete bio

Tight end Chig Okonkwo (pronounced "CHIGG oh-KAHN-kwoh") is in his third NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the fourth round (143rd overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft.



In his first two campaigns, Okonkwo did not miss a game and totaled 19 starts. His two-year statistics included 86 receptions for 978 yards and

four touchdowns. His 11.4-yard receiving average tied for sixth among all NFL tight ends from 2022 to 2023.

Okonkwo started 11 games in 2023 and finished the season with 54 receptions for 528 yards and one touchdown. He ranked second on the team in receptions and receiving yards.

During his rookie season, Okonkwo appeared in all 17 games with eight starts and totaled 32 receptions for 450 yards (14.1 avg.) and three touchdowns. His yardage total ranked second on the team. He also tied for fifth on the team with seven special teams tackles. He was named to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie team.

Okonkwo's 450 receiving yards in 2022 established a new record for franchise rookie tight ends, surpassing Ben Troupe's 329 yards in 2004. Okonkwo tied Chris Dressel (32 receptions in 1983) for the third-best reception total among all Titans/Oilers rookie tight ends, trailing only Bo Scaife (37 in 2005) and Troupe (33 in 2004), and he became the second rookie tight end in franchise history with at least three touchdown catches, joining Dressel (four in 1983).

The Powder Springs, Ga., native appeared in 37 games with 20 starts over four seasons (2018-21) at Maryland and caught 77 passes for 717 yards and eight touchdowns. He added three carries for 72 yards and three touchdowns, including a career-long rush of 54 yards.

As a senior in 2021, he started all 13 games and posted career-high marks with 52 catches for 447 yards and a team-leading five touchdowns. His 52 receptions ranked second in Terrapins history for a single season by a tight end, behind only former Titans tight end Frank Wycheck (58 in 1990). Okonkwo's 447 receiving yards were the most by a Terps tight end in a season since Vernon Davis (871 in 2005).

He sat out the 2020 season with myocarditis due to COVID-19. Prior to then, he saw action in 12 games (four starts) as a freshman and 12 games (three starts) as a sophomore.

> At Chicago (9/8), started and caught two passes for 15 yards and a touchdown. He hauled in a 17-yard touchdown pass from Will Levis in the second quarter for his fifth career touchdown reception.

> Against the N.Y. Jets (9/15), totaled 16 yards on three receptions. He reached the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career (1,009), becoming the franchise's 15th tight end to reach the plateau.



Tight end **Josh Whyle** (pronounced "WHYlee") is in his second NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the fifth round (147th overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft.



As a rookie in 2023, Whyle appeared in 11 games with three starts. He totaled nine receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown and added a special teams tackle. He was placed on injured reserve on Dec. 30, 2023.

6-2, 203, 9th Year/1st with Titans, Pittsburgh Click for complete bio

Wide receiver **Tyler Boyd** is in his ninth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was signed as an unrestricted free agent on May 14, 2024.



Prior to joining the Titans, Boyd spent the first eight seasons of his career with the Cincinnati Bengals. He was originally selected by the Bengals in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft.

During his time in Cincinnati, he played in 120 games with 77 starts, plus an additional seven postseason contests with six starts. His production at the Bengals included 513 career receptions for 6,000 yards and 31 touchdowns, and he departed Cincinnati ranked fourth in franchise history in receptions and seventh in receiving yards.

From 2016 through 2023, Boyd ranked first in the NFL in receptions (390), receiving yards (4,813) and first downs (233) among wide receivers from the slot formation, per Next Gen Stats.

During his final campaign in Cincinnati in 2023, Boyd ranked second on Cincinnati's offense with 67 receptions and 667 receiving yards, including two touchdown grabs. It was his sixth consecutive season with a minimum of 58 receptions and 667 receiving yards, and he was one of only nine NFL players to do so each year from 2018 through 2023. Boyd appeared in all but four contests during that six-year stretch.

In 2019, Boyd achieved career highs with 15 starts, 90 receptions and 1,046 receiving yards during his fourth NFL season.

#16 • WR TREYLON BURKS

6-2, 225, 3rd Year/3rd with Titans, Arkansas Click for complete bio

Wide receiver **TreyIon Burks** is in his third NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the first round (18th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft.

Through his first two seasons, Burks totaled 49 receptions for 665 yards and one touchdown in 22 games (15 starts). That included 16 catches for 221 yards in 2023.

As a rookie, Burks appeared in 11 games with six starts, totaling 33 receptions for 444 yards and one touchdown. His reception total tied for third place on the team, while his yardage total tied for third on the squad. Among NFL rookies in 2022, Burks' 444 receiving yards ranked ninth.

In three seasons (2019-21) at the University of Arkansas, Burks appeared in 32 career games with 30 starts. He totaled 146 receptions for 2,399 yards and 18 touchdowns to go along with 32 rushing attempts for 222 yards and one score. He returned 13 punts for 134 yards (10.3-yard average) and returned 11 kickoff returns for 226 yards (20.5 avg.).

At the conclusion of his collegiate career, he ranked sixth in Razorbacks history in career receptions and receiving yards, and his touchdown reception total tied for fifth all-time. He set an Arkansas record with 10 career 100-yard receiving games, including a school-record six 100-yard receiving performances in his final year.

Burks earned All-SEC honors in each of his three seasons: in 2019, second-team All-SEC as a returner and All-Freshman as a receiver; second-team All-SEC in 2020; and first-team All-SEC in 2021.

The Warren, Ark., native was drafted with the highest pick of any Arkansas player since **Darren McFadden** was taken fourth overall in 2008, and Burks was the first Arkansas wide receiver to be selected in the first round since **Matt Jones** was taken 21st overall by Jacksonville in 2006.

As a junior in 2021, Burks was named first-team All-SEC after totaling 66 receptions (seventh in the SEC) for 1,104 yards (fourth) and 11 touchdowns (fourth). His 92.0 receiving yards per game ranked third in the SEC behind only **Jameson Williams** (104.8) and **Wan'Dale Robinson** (102.6).

As a sophomore in 2020, he was named second-team All-SEC after contributing 51 receptions for 820 yards and seven touchdowns. His 91.1 receiving yards per game ranked third in the SEC behind only **Elijah Moore** (149.1) and **DeVonta Smith** (142.8).

#10 • WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

6-1, 212, 12th Year/2nd with Titans, Clemson *Click for complete bio*

Wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins** is in his 12th NFL season and his second campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the team prior to training camp in 2023.

Hopkins entered the league as the 27th overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft out of Clemson and spent his first seven seasons with the Houston Texans before being traded to the Arizona Cardinals in 2020.

Over NFL 11 seasons, Hopkins established himself as one of the premier receivers in NFL history. Among all players during that 11-year period, he ranked first in receptions (928), first in first-down receptions (642), first in receiving yards (12,355), third in receiving touchdowns (78), and first in receptions of 25-plus yards (113). He has been named to five Pro Bowls (2015, 2017-20) and received AP All-Pro honors four times—first-team All-Pro from 2017 to 2019 and second-team All-Pro in 2020.

From 2013 through 2023, Hopkins surpassed 100 receptions four times, had seven seasons reaching 1,000 receiving yards, recorded three seasons with at least 10 touchdowns, and posted 100 or more receiving yards in a game 42 times. Hopkins was the only NFL player to have 100-plus receptions every season between from 2018 to 2020.

Hopkins became one of 17 players in NFL history to reach 900 receptions, 12,000 receiving yards and 75 touchdown catches during a career. Only five players—Hopkins, **Marvin Harrison**, **Jerry Rice**, **Brandon Marshall** and **Larry Fitzgerald**—reached all three milestones within their first 11 NFL seasons.

He concluded the 2023 season tied with **Antonio Brown** for 21st place in NFL history with 928 career receptions. His 12,355 career receiving yards ranked 23rd all-time, and his 78 touchdown receptions were 35th in history.

Through 2023, he had at least one reception in all 162 career games he played during the regular season. That represents the longest active streak in the NFL at the conclusion of 2023 and the third-longest streak in NFL history to begin a career behind only **Marvin Harrison** (190 consecutive games) and **Keyshawn Johnson** (167).

During the 2022 campaign with the Cardinals, Hopkins finished with a team-high 64 receptions for 717 yards (second on the team) and three touchdowns despite being limited to nine contests. His average of 7.1 receptions per game ranked fourth in the NFL among all players. His three games with 10-plus receptions matched the second most in franchise annals behind **Larry Fitzgerald's** four such performances in 2017.

At the conclusion of his tenure with the Texans (2013-19), Hopkins owned several franchise records, including franchise marks for career receiving average (13.6), receptions in a season (115 in 2018; tied Andre Johnson, 2008), receiving touchdowns in a season (13 in 2017) and receiving first downs in a season (83 in 2015). When he left Houston, he ranked second on the franchise's all-time career charts in receptions (632), receiving yards (8,602) and touchdown catches (54), trailing only **Andre Johnson** in each category.

The Central, S.C., native appeared in 39 games with 32 starts over three seasons (2010-12) at Clemson and totaled 206 receptions for 3,020 yards and 27 touchdowns. He left Clemson ranked first in school history in receiving yards, first in receiving touchdowns, first in 100-yard receiving games (12) and second in receptions. As a junior (2012), he led the team with 82 receptions for 1,405 yards and 18 touchdowns.

Wide receiver **Calvin Ridley** is in his sixth NFL season and his first season with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 15, 2024.



Prior to joining the Titans, Ridley appeared in 66 NFL games with 52 starts. He was originally drafted by the Atlanta Falcons with the 26th overall

pick of the 2018 NFL Draft and was traded to the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2022. His statistical totals with the Falcons and Jaguars included 324 receptions for 4,358 yards and 36 touchdowns.

In 2023, Ridley started a career-high 17 games for the Jaguars and led the team with 1,016 yards and eight receiving touchdowns on 76 catches.

From 2018 through 2020, no member of the 2018 draft class had more receptions or touchdown catches than Ridley, who totaled 217 grabs and 26 scores for the Falcons during that span. His 3,061 receiving yards ranked second in his draft class behind only DJ Moore's 3,156. Ridley's 90 receptions and 1,374 yards in 2020 were career highs.

As a rookie in 2018, Ridley played in all 16 games and accumulated 64 receptions. He led all rookie receivers in the NFL with 821 receiving yards and a team-high 10 receiving touchdowns, including an NFL-rookie record six receiving scores in the team's first four games. He was named to the All-Rookie team by the Professional Football Writers of America.

A native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Ridley attended the University of Alabama, where he played in 44 games over three seasons (2015-17. he finished his career second in Crimson Tide history with 224 receptions and 19 receiving touchdowns. He also ranked third with 2,781 receiving yards, while totaling eight career 100-yard receiving games to tie for third in the Alabama record books.

2024 Game Notes:

> At Chicago (9/8), started in his Titans debut and led the offense with 50 receiving yards on three caches. He converted a third-and-15 with a 22-yard reception in the second quarter.

> Against the N.Y. Jets (9/15), led the team with 77 receiving yards on four catches, including a touchdown, and added a rushing touchdown. On a drive in the first quarter, he converted a third-and-five with a 15-yard catch and capped the series with his first career rushing touchdown on a 10-yard run. He became the first Titans wide receiver with a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown in the same game since Nate Washington accomplished the feat against Indianapolis on Oct. 30, 2011. It was his 10th consecutive game with at least three receptions.



Wide receiver Nick Westbrook-Ikhine is in his fifth NFL season in 2024. He was originally signed by the Titans as a rookie free agent on May 7, 2020.



From the beginning of his second year in the NFL (2021) through 2023, Westbrook-Ikhine led the Titans in receptions (91), receiving yards (1,243), touchdown catches (10) and receptions for first downs (59).

The 2023 campaign was the third consecutive season for Westbrook-Ikhine with at least 25 receptions, 370 receiving yards and three touchdowns. He registered 28 catches for 370 yards and three scores in 14 games (nine starts) before finishing the season on injured reserve.

In 2022, Westbrook-Ikhine appeared in all 17 games with a careerhigh 13 starts. He posted 25 catches for 397 yards and three touchdowns.

Nicholas Petit-Frere (pronounced "puh-TEET FRAIR") is in his third NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans with the 69th overall pick in the third round of the 2022 NFL Draft.



In 2023, Petit-Frere was limited to three games and two starts. He started one game at right tackle and one contest at left tackle before he was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 11.

As a rookie, Petit-Frere started 16 games at right tackle. He joined **Michael Roos** (2005), **Chance Warmack** (2013) and **Jack Conklin** (2016) as the only offensive linemen in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present) to start at least 16 games as a rookie. Petit-Frere helped running back **Derrick Henry** rush for 1,538 yards, which ranked second in the NFL.

In four seasons at Ohio State, Petit-Frere saw action in 35 career games with 20 starts. He was a member of three consecutive Big Ten Conference championship teams (2018-20) and was a part of two Ohio State teams that qualified for the College Football Playoffs (2019-2020).

As a junior in 2021, he was named first team All-Big Ten by both the coaches and media after starting all 12 games at left tackle, helping Ohio State lead the nation in total offense and scoring offense. He added first-team All-American honors by the Football Writers Association of America and CBS Sports.

As a sophomore in 2020, he received second-team All-Big Ten honors after starting seven games at right tackle for the eighth-ranked rushing attack in the country. He was an Academic All-Big Ten selection. Petit-Frere is a native of Tampa, Fla.

Dillon Radunz (pronounced "RAY-dinz") is in his fourth NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans with the 53rd overall pick in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft.



In 2023, he returned from a season-ending knee injury during the previous season to record career highs with 16 games played and 11 starts.

He logged starts at four different offensive line positions: seven starts at right tackle, two starts at left guard, one start at left tackle and one start at right guard. Radunz was voted by his teammates as the Ed Block Courage Award winner for the Titans in 2023.

In 2022, he appeared in 11 games, including four starts. He started two games at left guard and two games at right guard. His season came to an end on Dec. 21 when he was placed on injured reserve.

As a rookie in 2021, he appeared in 12 games with one start at left tackle.

A native of Becker, Minn., Radunz declared for the NFL Draft after North Dakota State's lone fall game his senior season, choosing to forego the Bisons' spring football schedule.

Peter Skoronski was selected by the Titans with the 11th overall pick in the first round of the 2023 NFL Draft.



As a rookie in 2023, Skoronski started 14 games at left guard and helped running back **Derrick Henry** finish second in the NFL with 1,167 rushing yards. He was one of nine NFL rookie offensive linemen

in 2023 to register 14 or more starts, and he joined **Nicholas Petit-Frere** (2022), **Jack Conklin** (2016), **Chance Warmack** (2013), **Michael Roos** (2005) and **Jacob Bell** (2004) as the only rookie offensive linemen to record at least 14 starts for the franchise during its "Titans era" (1999–present).

During a three-year career at Northwestern University, Skoronski started all 33 games at left tackle without missing a game. He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a freshman and first-team recognition in each of the next two seasons. He became the first offensive lineman in program history to earn two All-Big Ten first-team awards.

As a junior in 2022, he was named the Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year—the first ever by a Northwestern lineman—after starting all 12 games at left tackle. He was the first player in school history to become a unanimous first-team All-American and was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches and media. He finished as a finalist for the 2022 Outland Trophy.

When the Titans drafted Skoronski, he became Northwestern's highest draft selection since guard **Chris Hinton** went to Denver with the fourth pick in 1983, and he was the 11th player in program history to be picked in the first round.

His grandfather, **Bob Skoronski Sr.**, was a left tackle for the Green Bay Packers, playing nine total seasons with the franchise. He was a permanent offensive captain for the Packers under **Vince Lombardi** and

> In his first season in Tennessee, Brunskill started 14 games at right guard. He helped running back Derrick Henry finish second in the NFL with 1,167 rushing yards.



> He joined the Titans after spending four seasons (2019-22) with the San Francisco 49ers. In San

Francisco, he appeared in 61 games and totaled 42 starts, including starts at every offensive line position: one at left tackle, one at left guard, eight at center, 28 at right guard and four at right tackle. During his four years with San Francisco, the 49ers ranked fifth in the NFL in rushing yards (8,7720) and third in rushing touchdowns (84).

> Brunskill also arrived in Tennessee with nine games of postseason experience, including a Super Bowl appearance during the 2019 season.

Defensive lineman **Sebastian Joseph-Day** is in his sixth NFL season and his first season with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 20, 2024.

In 2023, Joseph-Day started the first 14 games of the season with the Chargers and collected 32 tackles, three sacks and 25 quarterback pressures. After being released by the Chargers, he was signed by the 49ers as a free agent on Dec. 27 and saw action as a reserve in the final two regular season contests, amassing five tackles. He then appeared as a reserve in all three of the 49ers' postseason contests and registered three tackles, including a tackle in Super Bowl LVIII.

Joseph-Day originally entered the NFL as a sixth-round pick (195th overall) of the Rams in 2018. After not seeing game action his entire rookie campaign, he totaled 38 starts and six sacks over the next three seasons with the Rams, culminating with an appearance in the Rams' Super Bowl LVI victory. He then joined the Chargers during the 2022 offseason and played in 30 regular season games with the club before heading to San Francisco.

The Stroudsburg, Pa., native played five seasons at Rutgers, where he amassed 90 total tackles, 3.5 sacks, two passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

2024 Game Notes:

At Chicago (9/8), started in his Titans debut and totaled three tackles, one sack, two quarterback pressures, two tackles for loss and one pass defensed. He became the first Titans defender to reach each of those marks in a game since Denico Autry accomplished the feat against the Houston Texans on Dec. 24, 2022. Joseph-Day was credited with a 19-yard sack of Caleb Williams in the first quarter. The 19 sack yards on the play were the most yards on a single sack by a Titans player since Dec. 1, 2021, when Derick Roberson sacked Jacksonville's Trevor Lawrence for a 20-yard loss.

#98 • DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

6-4, 305, 6th Year/6th with Titans, Mississippi State Click for complete bio

Defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** is in his sixth NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the first round (19th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft.



During his first five seasons, Simmons appeared in 68 games with 66 starts and earned two Pro Bowl berths. The three-time team captain (2021-

23) accumulated 240 tackles, 26.5 sacks, 20 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. He was third on the defense in sacks during that span behind only **Harold Landry III** (37) and **Denico Autry** (28.5).

In 2023, although he was limited to 12 games and finished the season on injured reserve, he managed to register 5.5 sacks, marking his third consecutive season to reach that number or higher. He added 44 tackles, 38 quarterback pressures, 11 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one pass defensed. For the first time in his career, he received the honor of the team's nomination for the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award.

In 2022, Simmons appeared in 15 games and anchored a unit that ranked first in the NFL in rushing defense (76.9 opponent rushing yards per game). En route to his second consecutive Pro Bowl appearance, he totaled 53 tackles, 7.5 sacks, 43 quarterback pressures, nine tackles for loss, one forced fumble and a career-high seven passes defensed, which tied for the fourth-best mark among all NFL defensive linemen. Simmons and Arizona's **J.J. Watt** were the NFL's only players in 2022 with at least seven sacks and seven passes defensed.

Before the start of the 2021 season, Simmons was named a team captain for the first time in his career, and he went on to become one of six players on the roster to start all 17 games. He was named to his first career Pro Bowl and added Associated Press second-team All-Pro honors after setting career highs in several categories, including sacks (8.5), tackles (54), quarterback pressures (58), tackles for loss (12) and passes defensed (six). He led the squad in pressures and placed third in sacks. Among all defensive tackles in the NFL, his 8.5 sacks ranked sixth. In the divisional playoffs, he set a franchise postseason record with three sacks.

In 2020, Simmons appeared and started in 15 games. With three defensive fumble recoveries, he tied Chase Young for the most in the NFL in 2020 and was the first Titans defender with three fumble recoveries in a season since 2005, when linebacker Brad Kassell accomplished the feat. Simmons ranked second on the team with 19 guarterback pressures and added 49 tackles, three sacks, three tackles for loss, five passes defensed and one forced fumble. In the franchise's "Titans era" (since 1999), he became the first player to post at least three fumble recoveries, three sacks and five passes defensed in the same season. He also had three tackles and a tackle for loss in one playoff contest.

Simmons began his rookie season on the non-football injury list due to a knee injury he suffered during training in February 2019. He missed the first six games of the season before joining the 53-man roster in Week 7.

His rookie totals included 40 tackles, two sacks, two tackles for loss, 14 quarterback pressures and one pass defensed in nine games (seven starts). He added four tackles, three quarterback pressures and a fumble recovery in three playoff contests.

During a three-year career as a defensive tackle at Mississippi State, Simmons appeared in 38 contests with 28 starts. He finished his career ranked sixth in school history with 32.5 tackles for loss. He also tied for sixth in MSU annals with five forced fumbles and tied for fourth with three blocked kicks. His totals also included 163 tackles, seven sacks, seven passes defensed and two defensive touchdowns.

He was a first-team All-SEC selection as a sophomore and junior and was one of two players in the nation to be named a Bednarik Award Semifinalist in both 2017 and 2018.

As a junior in 2018, Simmons was named second-team All-American after totaling 63 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and two sacks. His 17 tackles for loss led the team, ranked fourth in the SEC and were the third-most in single-season school history.

During his sophomore season (2017), he set a career high with five sacks and added 12 tackles for loss. With three total blocked kicks and punts, he became the first SEC player since 2004 to lead the nation in the category.

Simmons is a native of Macon, Miss.

Defensive tackle **T'Vondre Sweat** was selected by the Titans in the second round (38th overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft.



During his five-year career at the University of Texas, Sweat appeared in 62 games with 17 starts. He finished his collegiate career with 128 tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss, five sacks, 14 passes defensed,

one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and one blocked extra point.

In 2023, Sweat's final collegiate campaign, he played in all 14 games with eight starts. Linebacker Ernest Jones IV is in his fourth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was acquired in a trade with the Los Angeles Rams on Aug. 28, 2024.



Jones spent his first three NFL seasons with the Rams after he was selected in the third round (103rd overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft. In 47 games

with the club, he totaled 33 starts, 316 tackles, 5.5 sacks, 19 tackles for loss, three interceptions, 12 passes defensed and one forced fumble. Among members of the 2021 draft class, only Kansas City's Nick Bolton (352) has more tackles than Jones over the past three campaigns.



#58 • OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

6-2, 252, 7th Year/7th with Titans, Boston College <u>Click for complete bio</u>

Outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** is in his seventh NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the second round (41st overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft after the Titans traded up 16 spots in the second round (57 to 41) in order to take the former Boston College standout.



In 2023, Landry played in all 17 games (10 starts) after missing the entire 2022 campaign due to injury. He ranked second on the team with 10.5 sacks, producing his second-best career total (12 sacks in 2021). In doing so, he became the NFL's third veteran player since 1982 to miss an entire NFL season and come back the next year to record at least 10 sacks. The only previous players to do so were a pair of New Orleans Saints: **Joe Johnson** in 2000 (12 sacks) and **Charlie Clemons** in 2001 (13.5 sacks). Landry's 14 tackles for loss led the defense and matched his career high, and his 48 quarterback pressures were third on the squad and were one off his career high in 2021 (49). His statistics also included 70 tackles.

Landry was placed on injured reserve on Sept. 2, 2022, ending his fifth NFL season before Week 1. Prior to the injury, he recorded 64 consecutive games played and 52 consecutive starts.

From the start of his rookie campaign through 2021, Landry's 31 total sacks led the Titans. Other than **Jevon Kearse** (37), Landry produced the highest sack total by a Titans/Oilers player in his first four NFL seasons since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982.

From 2018 to 2021, Landry joined Pittsburgh's **Cameron Heyward** as the NFL's only players to be credited with at least 250 tackles (press box statistics), 30 sacks and two interceptions.

In 2021, Landry was named to his first Pro Bowl after starting all 17 games. He registered his third consecutive season to start every contest, extending his streaks to 64 consecutive games played and 52 consecutive starts. At the conclusion of 2021, his starting streak was the sixth-longest active streak in the NFL among all defensive players.

Landry's 12 sacks in 2021 led the Titans, ranked 10th in the NFL and established a career high. He became the first Titans player to record double-digit sacks in a season since **Brian Orakpo** (10.5) in 2016 and the first Titans player with 12 sacks in a season since **Jason Babin** (12.5) in 2010. Landry tied for second on the squad with 75 tackles, ranked second with a career-high 49 quarterback pressures, led the team with 14 tackles for loss, and added a forced fumble. He joined **Micah Parsons**, **Aaron Donald** and Heyward as the only NFL players in 2021 to post at least 75 tackles and 10 sacks.

Then, in the team's 2021 divisional playoff contest, he recorded 1.5 sacks. He improved his postseason career total to 4.5 sacks, becoming the organization's first player with at least four career postseason sacks since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

In 2020, Landry recorded 16 starts for the second consecutive season. He led the team with 5.5 sacks, a then-career-high 32 quarterback

pressures and a then-career-high 10 tackles for loss. He totaled 69 tackles and added one interception and a career-high five passes defensed. In one playoff contest, he led the team with 10 tackles and two sacks.

Landry started all 16 games in 2019 and led the Titans with nine sacks. His 28 quarterback pressures ranked second, and he added 81 tackles, four tackles for loss, one pass defensed, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. He also started all three postseason games and registered a sack and a team-high eight quarterback pressures.

As a rookie in 2018, he played in 15 games with three starts. His 4.5 sacks tied for third place on the team, and he also tied for second on the defense with 18 quarterback pressures.

In 46 career games playing defensive end for Boston College, Landry totaled 160 tackles, 26 sacks, 47.5 tackles for loss, seven passes defensed, 10 forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception. His 26 career sacks were exceeded in school history by only **Mathias Kiwanuka** (37.5 from 2002-05).

As a senior in 2017, Landry played and started eight games before a season-ending ankle injury ended his year. He finished second on the team with five sacks and totaled 38 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and two passes defensed.

In 2016, Landry set the school's single-season record with 16.5 sacks, which led the nation. He added seven forced fumbles, which also led the country, while his 22 tackles for loss ranked fifth nationally and ranked second all-time for the Eagles. His numerous honors included Walter Camp second-team All-America, AP second-team All-America and second-team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association and the league's head coaches.

He is a native of Spring Lake, N.C.

In improving his career total to 44.5 sacks, he tied Derrick Morgan for 10th place on the franchise's all-time sack list. He also tied Morgan for the third-highest sack total for the team in its "Titans era" (1999–present), trailing only Jevon Kearse (52) and Jurrell Casey (51). Landry became the first Titans player to total three or more sacks through the first two games of a season since Derrick Morgan accomplished the feat (three sacks) in 2015. > Against Green Bay (9/22), tallied four tackles and two quarterback pressures.

At Miami (9/30), totaled five tackles, including a sack. In the first quarter, he ended a Dolphins drive by sacking Tyler Huntley for an eight-yard loss on third down. By increasing his career total to 45.5 sacks, he moved ahead of Derrick Morgan (44.5) and Ted Washington (45.0) for ninth place in franchise history. He surpassed Morgan for the third-highest sack total for the team in its "Titans era" (1999–present), trailing only Jevon Kearse (52) and Jurrell Casey (51). The sack gave him 9.5 total over a 10-game stretch. He also reached 10 sacks during his career in primetime games, becoming the franchise's third player to reach double digits in sacks in primetime games since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982, joining Ray Childress (15.5) and William Fuller (15.5).

> Against Indianapolis (10/13), registered seven tackles, including a team-high two tackles for loss, and tied for the team lead with three quarterback pressures. He logged his 14th career game with two or more tackles for loss, including twice in 2024.

Cornerback **Chidobe Awuzie** is in his eighth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 14, 2024.



Awuzie arrived in Tennessee with seven years of experience and 86 total games with the Dallas

Cowboys (2017-20) and Cincinnati Bengals (2021-23). His totals during that time included 74 starts, 369 tackles, six interceptions, 62 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

In his three seasons with the Bengals, Awuzie recorded two interceptions and broke up 25 passes, including six passes defensed in 15 games during the 2023 campaign.

Awuzie was a member of the 2021 Bengals squad that won the AFC and advanced to Super Bowl LVI. After recording a career-high two interceptions and tying his career high with 14 passes defensed during the regular season, he added an interception in the Super Bowl.

Cornerback **Roger McCreary** is in his third NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the second round (35th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft.

In his first two seasons, McCreary's totals included two interceptions and 170 tackles in 32 games (28 starts). His 170 tackles from 2022 to 2023 made up the NFL's third-highest total among

cornerbacks, trailing Buffalo's **Taron Johnson** (187) and former Chiefs cornerback and current Titan **L'Jarius Sneed** (186).

In 2023, McCreary ranked third on the team and led all Titans defensive backs with 86 tackles. Among all NFL cornerbacks, his 86 tackles tied Las Vegas' **Nate Hobbs** for the third-highest total behind Johnson (98) and Indianapolis' **Kenny Moore II** (93). McCreary added one interception, six passes defensed, two sacks, four quarterback pressures, seven tackles for loss and one forced fumble.

As a rookie, McCreary was one of three players on the team to start all 17 games (Kevin Byard, Aaron Brewer), and he became the first Titans rookie cornerback since Adoree' Jackson in 2017 to start every game. Only two other rookie cornerbacks in the NFL—Seattle's Tariq Woolen and the New York Jets' Sauce Gardner—started all 17 games in 2022. McCreary finished third on the Titans defense with 85 tackles, ranked second on the defense with eight passes defensed, and added one interception, two tackles for loss and one quarterback pressure.

During four seasons at Auburn (2018-21), McCreary appeared in 43 games with 23 starts and posted 135 tackles, five interceptions, 35 passes defensed, 10 stops for loss, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

As a senior in 2021, McCreary started 12 games at cornerback for the Tigers and collected a career-best 49 tackles, an interception, a sack, two



stops for loss and a team-best 16 passes defensed. He was a first-team All-America selection by The Athletic, Associated Press, ESPN and Reese's Senior Bowl.

As a junior in 2020, he established career highs with three interceptions and seven tackles for loss.

McCreary is a native of Mobile, Ala.

Cornerback **L'Jarius Sneed** is in his fifth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was acquired by the Titans in a trade with the Kansas City Chiefs on April 1, 2024.

Sneed spent four seasons with the Chiefs after they selected him in the fourth round (138th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft. During that time, he tallied

10 interceptions, 40 passes defensed and 6.5 sacks in 57 games. He and Harrison Smith were the only two NFL players from 2020 to 2023 to record at least 10 interceptions and 6.5 sacks.

Sneed also arrived in Tennessee with 13 games of postseason experience. He helped the Chiefs win two Super Bowls (LVII, LVIII), and his seven passes defensed tied for third in the postseason from 2020 to 2023. Three-time Pro Bowl safety Quandre Diggs is in his 10th NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as a free agent on Aug. 6, 2024.

Prior to arriving in Tennessee, Diggs totaled nine seasons between his time with the Detroit Lions (2015-19) and Seattle Seahawks (2019-23). He was

originally drafted by the Lions in the sixth round (200th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft and later traded to the Seahawks during the 2019 campaign. His career totals with the Lions and Seahawks included 137 games played, 112 starts, 24 interceptions, 56 passes defensed, 574 tackles, one sack, five forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He was named to three consecutive Pro Bowls from 2020 to 2022.

In 2023, Diggs started every game for the Seahawks for the fourth consecutive season. He totaled a career-high 95 tackles to go along with one interception and five passes defensed.

From 2017 through 2022, Diggs was the NFL's only player to record at least three interceptions every season. He set a career benchmark with five interceptions in 2020 and matched the number in 2021.



Safety **Amani Hooker** is in his sixth NFL season in 2024. He was selected by the Titans in the fourth round (116th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft.

Hooker appeared in 12 games in 2021 with a career-high 12 starts. He totaled a career-best 62 tackles, one tackle for loss, one interception, four passes defensed and one forced fumble. He added seven tackles and an interception in the team's divisional playoff contest.

In 2020, Hooker played 16 games with three starts. He tied **Malcolm Butler** for the team lead with four interceptions and ranked fourth on the team with seven special teams tackles. Additionally, he totaled one tackle for loss and eight passes defensed.

As a rookie in 2019, Hooker played as a reserve safety in all 16 games and collected 13 tackles while ranking third on the team with eight special teams tackles.

Long snapper **Morgan Cox** is in his 15th NFL season and his fourth campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 19, 2021.



In 2023, Cox handled all of the team's long snapping duties for the third consecutive season. With 51 consecutive games played in his first three

seasons with the Titans, he finished the 2023 campaign with the longest active streak of games played for the team. His efforts helped kicker **Nick Folk** lead the NFL in field goal accuracy (96.7 percent) and helped punter **Ryan Stonehouse** lead the NFL for a second consecutive season in gross punting average (53.1). He was also a finalist in 2023 for the NFL's Bart Starr Award.

In 2022, Cox was named to his fifth career Pro Bowl. He has more Pro Bowl appearances than any other player at his position since the league began naming long snappers to the Pro Bowl in 2004.

His steady play in 2022 helped Stonehouse, a rookie, lead the league and set a new NFL record with a 53.1-yard gross punting average. Stonehouse also finished fourth in the NFL and set a rookie record with a 44.0-yard net average. Meanwhile, kicker **Randy Bullock** made 17 of 20 field goals (85.0 percent) and made all 28 extra point attempts.

In 2021, Cox handled all of the team's long snapping duties in 17 regular season games and one postseason game. He helped Bullock finish ninth in franchise history with 120 points in a single season, including three game-winning field goals (Sept. 19 at Seattle, Oct. 31 at Indianapolis and Dec. 23 against San Francisco). He also snapped for punter **Brett Kern**, who had the league's third-best ratio of punts inside the 20 to touchbacks (18:1).

In his first 11 seasons, Cox appeared in 165 regular season games for the Baltimore Ravens, serving as the team's primary long snapper after entering the NFL as an undrafted free agent in 2010. He was selected to four Pro Bowls and was a part of five playoff teams in Baltimore, totaling 10 postseason games played.

In 2020, he earned his fourth career Pro Bowl selection. He helped kicker **Justin Tucker** record his fifth consecutive season with at least 130 points, tying the NFL record of consecutive seasons with 130-plus points. Tucker connected on 26 of 29 field goals (89.7 percent) and was 52 of 53 on extra points (98.1 percent). Cox also snapped on all 51 of **Sam Koch's** 51 punts, as Koch was the NFL's only punter to place at least 20 punts (22) inside in the 20-yard line and have no more than one touchback.

A native of Collierville, Tenn., Cox played 38 games in three seasons (2007-09) as the primary long snapper at the University of Tennessee.

Kicker Nick Folk is in his 17th NFL season and his second campaign with the Titans in 2024. He was acquired by the Titans in a trade with the New England Patriots on Aug. 29, 2023.



At the conclusion of the 2023 season, Folk's 382 career field goals ranked fourth among all active kickers behind only Matt Prater (401), Mason

Crosby (400) and Justin Tucker (395), and Folk's number also ranked 19th in NFL history. His 1,632 total points scored ranked 23rd in league annals. Among all active NFL players at the conclusion of 2023, Folk's 228 career games ranked 10th.

Through 2023, Folk carried an all-time NFL-record streak of 78 consecutive field goals from under 40 yards-a streak going back to 2017. Tucker previously owned the record with 70 straight under-40-yarders from 2016 to 2020.

In his first season in Tennessee, Folk appeared in all 17 games and made 29 field goals on 30 attempts. His career-best 96.7 percent accuracy on field goals led the NFL and tied for the 14th-best single-season mark in NFL history. It also established a new franchise record for a single season, breaking the record of 92.3 percent by AI Del Greco (1998) and Rob Bironas (2010). Folk's initial season with the Titans also included 28 extra points on 30 attempts. His 115 total points tied for the 13th-best singleseason total in franchise history.

In his first 15 NFL seasons prior to joining the Titans, Folk spent time with the Dallas Cowboys (2007-09), New York Jets (2010-2016), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2017) and Patriots (2019-22). During that time, he connected on 82.9 percent (353 of 426) of his field goal attempts and 96.8 percent of his extra point attempts (458 of 473). He had 10 seasons with at least 100 points, including a league-leading 150 points in 2021 with the Patriots. He registered 11 game-winning field goals in the regular season and one in postseason play.

Over his four years with New England, Folk made 108 of his 121 field goal attempts (89.3 percent) in 57 games. He departed the Patriots in fifth place on the New England all-time field goal list and tied for seventh place on the franchise's all-time scoring list with 440 total points.

In 2022, he played in all 17 games for New England and totaled 128 points on 32-of-37 field goal attempts. He was also 32-of-35 on extra points. Folk became one of six all-time NFL players to have at least five seasons with 30 field goals, joining Tucker (eight), Stephen Gostkowski (five), Robbie Gould (five), John Carney (five) and David Akers (five).

Folk established the NFL record for consecutive field goals made under 50 yards with a streak of 64 such kicks from Oct. 5, 2017 to Oct. 16, 2022. He broke the record (56 consecutive) set by Ryan Succop of the Titans from 2014 to 2017.

While with the Patriots, he also set the franchise mark for consecutive field goals made (36) during a streak that spanned from 2020 to 2021 and posted the third-highest field goal percentage for a season by a Patriot in 2020 (92.9).

Folk entered the NFL as a sixth-round selection by the Dallas in the 2007 NFL Draft. As a rookie for the Cowboys, he earned a Pro Bowl selection and all-rookie honors.

A native of Sherman Oaks, Calif., Folk attended the University of Arizona, where he earned All-PAC 10 accolades in his final season.

> At Chicago (9/8), made his only field goal attempt, a 40-yarder in the second quarter, and made both of his extra point attempts.

> Against the N.Y. Jets (9/15), made a 41-yard field goal as time expired in the first half and also connected on both of his extra point attempts. With his 384th career field goal, he surpassed Nick Lowery (383) for 18th place in NFL history.

least two field goals of 50-plus yards and his first time accomplishing the feat since Oct. 10, 2021 at Houston, when he was a member of the New England Patriots. He increased his career total to 44 career field goals from 50-plus yards on 67 career attempts (65.7 percent). He logged his 52nd career game with three or more field goals. He improved his active streak to 16 consecutive made field goals, including his first seven attempts of 2024. He also increased his all-time NFL-record streak to 79 consecutive field goals made on attempts from less than 40 yards. In finishing the contest with 389 field goals, he surpassed David Akers (386) for 17th place in NFL history for career field goals. He also set a career high with seven touchbacks on kickoffs.

> Against Indianapolis (10/13), made a 44-yard field goal in the second quarter and also connected on both extra point attempts. He increased his streak to 17 consecutive made field goals, which began on Nov. 12, 2023, ranking as the ninth-longest in franchise history and the fifth-longest of his career.

After joining the Titans in a trade on Aug. 29, 2023, **Nick Folk** made his first 20 field goals he attempted before his first miss from 51 yards at Tampa Bay on Nov. 12, 2023. Titans kicker **Nick Folk** has continued a streak that began six years ago by making more than 70 field goals from under 40 yards. His last miss in that range was a 31-yarder against New England on Oct. 5, 2017, when he played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

On Nov. 2 at Pittsburgh, Folk broke the NFL record for most consecutive field goals made from under 40 yards. Baltimore's **Justin Tucker** previously owned the record with 70 straight under-40-yarders from 2016 to 2020.

Punter **Ryan Stonehouse** is in his third NFL season in 2024. He was signed by the Titans as a rookie free agent on May 13, 2022.



In only two NFL seasons, Stonehouse recorded the top two single-season gross punting averages in NFL history, and he also recorded two of the top three single-season net averages in franchise

history. He became the first punter in NFL annals to lead the league in gross punting average in each of his first two seasons.

In 2023, he appeared in the first 12 games of the season before missing the final five contests on injured reserve. Despite his missed time, he averaged a league-high 53.06 yards per punt, grossing 2,812 yards on 53 attempts. The average qualified as the second-highest figure in NFL history behind his own record-setting 53.10 yards per punt as a rookie in 2022. He also finished sixth in the NFL with a 43.87-yard net punting average, which ranked third in franchise history.

In 2022, Stonehouse finished the season with a gross average of 53.10 yards per punt on 90 total punts (4,779 total yards). In doing so, he broke **Sammy Baugh's** single-season NFL record of 51.40 yards per punt, which was established in 1940 and was never matched among qualifiers (2.5 punts per team game) until Stonehouse's rookie campaign. Stonehouse's mark also surpassed **Brett Kern's** franchise record of 49.7 yards per punt in 2017.

With a net punting average of 44.0 yards per punt in 2022, Stonehouse also established a new NFL record for the highest net average by a rookie punter. He broke the record set by Indianapolis' **Rigoberto Sanchez**, who averaged 42.64 net yards per punt as a rookie in 2017. Stonehouse finished fourth in the NFL in net punting behind veterans **Tommy Townsend** (45.6),

Michael Dickson (44.5) and **Johnny Hekker** (44.1). In franchise history, his net average ranked second for a single season, trailing only Kern's 44.6 net average in 2017.

Stonehouse's 90 punts in 2022 made up the NFL's second-highest total. Only Denver's **Corliss Waitman** (96) had more. The 90 punts by Stonehouse tied **Craig Hentrich's** 1999 number for the fourth-highest total in team annals behind **Rich Camarillo** (96 punts in 1994) and **Cliff Parsley** (93 in 1979; 91 in 1978).

Stonehouse appeared in 53 games over five seasons at Colorado State (2017-21) and set an NCAA career record with a 47.8-yard gross punting average. His career totals included 244 punts for 11,656 yards with 91 punts inside the 20. He totaled 106 punts of 50-plus yards and became the first player in Colorado State history to log 11,000 punting yards in a career.

During his final college season in 2021, Stonehouse appeared in 12 games and averaged 50.9 yards per attempt on 58 punts, including a careerlong 81-yard punt. He placed 27 punts inside the 20-yard line and totaled 32 punts of 50-plus yards en route to being named a second-team All-Mountain West selection and a Ray Guy Award semifinalist.

He is a native of La Verne, Calif.

> At Chicago (9/8), played in the regular season for the first time since suffering a season-ending knee injury on Dec. 3, 2023. He averaged 53.6 yards on five punts (34.0 net) with one punt placed inside the 20 and one punt blocked.

> Against the N.Y. Jets (9/15), averaged 56.5 yards on four punts (38.2 net) with one punt placed inside the 20 and one punt blocked. His 56.5-yard gross average was the fifth-best of his career in a game with four or more punts. He booted a 63-yard punt in the third quarter, and his 59-yarder in the fourth quarter pinned the Jets inside the 20.

> Against Green Bay (9/22), averaged 46.8 yards (43.0 net) on four punts with one punt placed inside the 20. In the fourth quarter, he launched a 57-yard punt.

Stonehouse's previous long punt was 74 yards (twice, last at Cleveland on Sept. 24, 2023). He notched his 12th consecutive game with at least one punt of 55-plus yards, extending the NFL's longest such active streak.

NFL RECORD: SINGLE-SEASON AVERAGE

In 1940, Washington's **Sammy Baugh** punted 35 times for 1,799 yards, averaging 51.40 yards per punt. Eighty-two seasons later, the mark still stood as the best qualifying single-season punting average in NFL history, until Titans rookie punter **Ryan Stonehouse** broke the record in 2022.

Stonehouse, an undrafted rookie from Colorado State University, averaged 53.10 yards per attempt on 90 total punts—1.70 yards per punt ahead of Baugh's number.

Then, in his second season, Stonehouse averaged an NFL-high 53.06 yards per punt. His 53 attempts (2,812 yards) qualified him for the single-season charts, and as a result, he owns the top two numbers of all-time in his first two NFL seasons.

Prior to Stonehouse's rookie campaign, Baugh's mark was one of the NFL's longest-held records. In the 2022 NFL Record & Fact Book, only three single-season individual records predated Baugh's punting mark, and all three of those were later tied: most safeties in a season (two by Green Bay's **Tom Nash** in 1932 and subsequently tied 18 times), most fumbles returned for a touchdown in a season (two by Boston's **Harold McPhail** in 1934 and tied 44 times), and most opponent fumbles returned for a touchdown in a season (two by McPhail in 1934 and tied 41 times).

To qualify for the single-season average record, a punter needs a minimum of 2.5 attempts per team game.

> Lynch's middle name, Husker, was given to him by his father, Tim, who played linebacker at Nebraska.

88 - TE DAVID MARTIN-ROBINSON

> Martin-Robinson spent 2022 spring break in Rome as part of Temple University's Study Abroad program.

His nickname is "DMR."

Martin-Robinson was a three-sport athlete at Hempfield (Landisville, Pa.) High School playing football, baseball and track and field.

21 - CB ROGER McCREARY

McCreary's pregame ritual in college was eating two plates of baked beans with sugar the night before a game. The tradition started when he got to Auburn and he says Bush's baked beans are his favorite.

His uncle, Angelo James, was a defensive back for the Philadelphia Eagles.

42 - OLB CALEB MURPHY

> Murphy became the first DII player ever to win the Ted Hendricks Award, given to the nation's top defensive end.

Murphy was a two-time National Champion with the Ferris State Bulldogs.

56 - LB KENNETH MURRAY JR.

Murray's family adopted three special needs children when he was 10 years old, and he has used his love for them and his family to motivate his success on the gridiron.

Murray is a certified scuba diver.

> In the summer of 2019, Murray performed CPR to revive an unresponsive woman on a street corner in Norman, Okla.

89 - TE THOMAS ODUKOYA

> Odukoya joined the Titans in 2022 as part of the NFL's International Player Pathway program. He was born in the Netherlands to a Dutch mother and Nigerian father.

> A play made by Odukoya in the Titans' final game of the 2024 preseason at New Orleans garnered national attention. He made a touchdown-saving tackle at the end the first half, forcing Samson Nacua out of bounds at the three-yard line following a 106-yard return of a missed field goal. Odukoya ran a total of 163 yards before making the stop. In the Next Gen Stats player-tracking era

(since 2016), it was the longest distance covered to make a tackle by any player in any preseason, regular season or postseason game.

85 - TE CHIG OKONKWO

> Okonkwo's father, Charlton, passed away of a heart attack when Okonkwo was 15. According to his mother, Isioma, who emigrated from Nigeria, "In our culture, the boys, even if they're young or not, they're always considered more important. When my husband passed, the people who came let him know that he's the man and now he has the responsibility to take care of his mom and his sisters." According to Okonkwo, "In our culture, [being] the man in the house is a really big deal. As the only male, I was the one giving my mom support."

- Okonkwo sat out the 2020 season with myocarditis due to COVID.
- Okonkwo is a cat lover and has a feline named Sage. In his free time, Okonkwo enjoys watching anime.

78 - OL NICHOLAS PETIT-FRERE

> Petit-Frere was about 270 pounds when he arrived at Ohio State, and it took him a while to get to his current weight of around 315 pounds. During the COVID-19 pandemic, he learned how to cook to help him continue his weight progress. He still enjoys cooking to this day, especially a lot of pastas, but says he can cook anything. He really enjoys trying out new recipes.

Petit-Frere is trying to learn how to play the piano after playing the cello in middle school.

> He worked for Metropolitan Ministries in high school and would like to continue to be involved in education and causes to help underprivileged children and victims of domestic violence.

> Pollard's family owns Pollard's Bar-B-Q restaurant in his hometown of Memphis. Starting from humble beginnings, Pollard's was first established as a mobile catering business in 1995. In 2011, Pollard's answered the overwhelming demands of its growing customer base by becoming a dine-in restaurant. With the new expansion came bigger and better things, such as an expanded menu and an upscale renovation by Food Network's Robert Irvine from Restaurant Impossible.

> Pollard was a dynamic kickoff returner at the collegiate level, tying a FBS record with seven career kickoff returns for touchdowns during his Memphis career.

75 - OL DILLON RADUNZ

▶ Radunz has a long history with the jersey number 75. At Becker (Minn.) High School, No. 75 was passed down from the previous player of the year to him. After he won the player of the year award, he passed it on to the next winner. Then he was issued the number at North Dakota State and later passed it on to his younger brother, Nick.

> The community fellowship program Alcoholics Anonymous has a special place in Radunz's life due to his father's struggles with alcoholism. His father, Jeff, passed away at the age of 45 in an alcohol-related incident when Dillon was 12.

He was voted by his teammates as the Ed Block Courage Award winner for the Titans in 2023 after coming back from a knee injury that he suffered in 2022.

41 - LB OTIS REESE IV

> Reese played safety during his college career, but made the transition to linebacker once he arrived with the Titans.

> When asked what he would be if not an NFL player, Reese said he never considered a plan B. "If I didn't make it, I was going to keep trying until I did."

0 - WR CALVIN RIDLEY

Ridley and his younger brothers spent parts of their childhood growing up in foster homes in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He says that's when football saved his life. The Ridley brothers were moved to SOS Children's Village in Coconut Creek, Fla., a small complex with 10 houses and around 150 apartments. He used to wake up in the morning and bang on all the doors, rounding up everybody to play football. At that time, he realized if he had football, he would be all right.

> When he was younger, Ridley played Pop Warner football in the same league as Baltimore Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson, Kansas City Chiefs wide receiver Marquise Brown and Ravens cornerback Trayvon Mullen, in the Pompano Beach area of Florida just four miles from the high school he would attend.

> His younger brother, Riley, played college football at Georgia and was

drafted by the Chicago Bears in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft.

11 - QB MASON RUDOLPH

➢ Rudolph comes from an athletic family. His mother, Jamie, ran track at Liberty University and his dad, Brett, played football at the University of North Carolina. His younger brother, Logan, played on the defensive line at Clemson from 2017-19.

➢ Rudolph has a strong connection to 2024 first-round quarterback Drake Maye. In the mid-1980s, Drake's father, Mark, was the starting quarterback at North Carolina and his roommate was Mason's dad, Brett, a linebacker on the Tar Heels. The two fathers have stayed close in the years since college, and their children grew up together. When the Rudolphs lived in Virginia, the families would go on vacation together once or twice each year. After the Rudolphs moved to Rock Hill, S.C., when Mason was in middle school, they were a 45-minute drive from the Mayes' home in Huntersville, N.C. The boys went to each other's basketball and football games.

76 - OL ANDREW RUPCICH

Rupcich was the only NAIA player to play in the 2022 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl Game. The game was held at the Rose Bowl, which holds a very special place in his heart because it was where he "watched his first-ever live football game... so it was amazing to see it come full circle." Rupcich was also the only NAIA player to participate in the NFL Combine that year.

98 - DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

> In 2023, Simmons was named the Titans nominee for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award that recognizes a player for outstanding community service, as well as excellence on the field. "To be in a position to be able to give back, it means a lot. I want to be a light in the community."

➤ In July 2023, Simmons paid homage to his hometown of Macon, Miss., with his first 'Community Fun Day,' which included local food vendors, games, inflatables and fireworks. He was then honored by city officials with a key to the city. He also holds an annual youth football camp in Mississippi.

> In July 2022, the official ribbon cutting was held at the Jeffery B. Simmons Field House at Noxubee County High School in Macon, Miss. Simmons donated more than \$50,000 to upgrade his former high school's athletic facilities. During the same week, he donated \$75,000 to Starkville (Miss.) Parks and Recreation to be used for a new turf field at the Starkville Sportsplex. The field was also named in his honor.

> Simmons' brother, Dylan Bradley, played football at Southern Miss and then spent time with the Minnesota Vikings. His uncle, Jason Hatcher, played 10 total seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and Washington Commanders.

Away from football, Simmons enjoys fishing and spending time outdoors.

77 - G PETER SKORONSKI

His grandfather, Bob Skoronski, was a left tackle for the Green Bay Packers, playing nine total seasons with the franchise. He missed two seasons while serving in the U.S. Air Force. He was a permanent offensive captain for the Packers under Vince Lombardi from 1964 to 1968 and played on five NFL championship teams. In 1976, he was inducted into the Packers Hall of Fame. Among all offensive linemen at the 2023 NFL Scouting Combine, Skoronski placed second in the vertical jump (34.50 inches), second in the broad jump (9 feet 7 inches), fifth in the bench press (30 reps) and ninth in the 10-yard split (1.75 seconds).

- Minored in history in college and considers himself a "history nerd."
- Has a black lab named Slim.

38 - CB L'JARIUS SNEED

> After playing wide receiver at Minden (La.) High School, Sneed converted to cornerback at Louisiana Tech and saw playing time in his true freshman season. His initial collegiate campaign was highlighted by an interception return touchdown against Western Kentucky in the Conference USA Championship Game.

> Sneed's brother, T.Q. Mims, played football at Arkansas-Pine Bluff from 2010 to 2013.

2 - RB TYJAE SPEARS

> In the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft, the Titans selected one of Spears' best friends and his former college roommate, Tulane wide receiver Jha'Quan Jackson. Spears was with Jackson when he received the phone call from general manager Ran Carthon during the draft.

Spears has worked with a non-profit organization in New Orleans called Son of a Saint, which provides "mentorship, education, recreation, camaraderie, cultural enrichment, emotional support and helping to fill the void for dozens of fatherless young men." > His first job as a teenager was working at Walmart.

4 - P RYAN STONEHOUSE

> Stonehouse comes from a lineage of punters. His father, Paul, was an All-American punter for Stanford. His uncle, John Stonehouse was an All-American punter at Southern California and was signed by the New York Giants as a rookie free agent in 1996. His uncle, Jeff Banks, was a punter at Washington State. His younger cousin, Jack, is a punter at Missouri.

Stonehouse's father, Paul, and uncle, John, used to teach punting at their camp, The Kicking Game, and through private lessons. The camp's website houses testimonials from coaches Bill Walsh, John Robinson, Paul Pasqualoni and Mike Price.

> As a craftsman, Stonehouse built an outdoor kitchen in his home, that is owned by his grandmother, and it is complete with two different cooking areas, a sink, granite countertops, it is made out of wood and brick and is even wired for lighting.

- Watson is a talented musician who excels at playing the piano.

➢ As an avid dog lover, Westbrook-Ikhine took care of dogs while in college through the popular app "Rover." Westbrook-Ikhine joined Rover the summer before his senior year at Indiana, and he would set his rate \$10-15 lower than the average price to ensure he was selected as a dog-sitter. Westbrook-Ikhine would bring the dogs everywhere with him, even to Indiana's indoor field, and would let the dogs run around on the turf. He has his own rescue dog now named Winston.

> In 2021, Westbrook-Ikhine was named the team's Ed Block Courage Award recipient.

> Westbrook-Ikhine and his wife have become involved with Destiny Rescue, a "global, faith-based organization that rescues children out of sexual exploitation and human trafficking and most importantly helps them stay free." He chose to represent the organization through the NFL's My Cause My Cleats initiative.

A limited number of ethernet lines also are available. Accessing the wireless network works the same in the Nissan Stadium press box as it does in most areas with free connectivity. Titans staff may be able to assist in a limited manner, but you should first contact your company's I.T. department with any questions.

FROM NISSAN STADIUM PRESS BOX TO INTERVIEW ROOMS

Take the press box elevator (Level 3) to field level (Level 1). The Titans interview room is immediately on the right. Turn left and continue straight along the concourse to reach the visiting team's interview room (white line).

POSTGAME POLICIES

Reporters with press box credentials will not be allowed on the field during pre-game activities or during the game itself. Press box credentials do NOT provide access to the field at the two-minute warning in the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to gather in the Titans interview room to watch the end of the game or remain in the press box to make the short walk down to the field level at the conclusion of the game. Interviews with Titans players are not permitted on the field following the game. The press conference will begin approximately 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game and will be held in the interview room across from the Titans locker room. Key players also will be brought to the interview room. Simultaneously, the locker room will open to credentialed media members with a working function. The press conference audio will be played live over the press box speakers.

POSTGAME QUOTES

Quotes from each team's head coach and key players will be transcribed and distributed throughout the Nissan Stadium press box following the game. The quotes also will be available at www.TennesseeTitans.com/media.

POOL REPORTS

Pool reporters are assigned by the Pro Football Writers of America. Requests for pool reports with game officials must be made in advance through the home team's media relations. Interviews will be conducted virtually. Pool reports will be recorded, transcribed and then distributed in the press box.

EXITING NISSAN STADIUM

FROM NISSAN STADIUM PRESS BOX TO STADIUM EXIT: Cross the press box catwalk to the third floor lobby. Take the stairs or elevator one floor down to Level 2. Exit through the doors and walk right to get to the "M" lot.

FROM NISSAN STADIUM TO AIRPORT (APPROXIMATELY 15 MINUTES): Take I-24 East toward Chattanooga to I-40 East toward Knoxville. The airport is at Exit 216A.

The media will call window and media entrance are located in the northwest corner of Nissan Stadium near Gate 6. The media will call window opens three hours prior to kickoff. Photographers' vests can be picked up near the entrance to the press box on Level 3.
