TITANS-CHARGERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

HENRY RECORDS ANOTHER GAME WITH 100 SCRIMMAGE YARDS: In last week's season opener at New Orleans, Titans running back Derrick Henry led the team with 119 scrimmage yards, including 63 rushing yards and 56 receiving yards. His receiving total included a 46-yard gain on a screen play.

Henry registered the 43rd game of his career in which he reached 100 scrimmage yards, which ranks fourth in franchise history. Only Eddie George (54), Chris Johnson (46) and Earl Campbell (45) have more.

Since the beginning of last season, Henry has had more 100-yard scrimmage performances than any other player. Including last Sunday and the 12 such outings he produced in 2022, his 13 total are more than the second-place Nick Chubb and Christian McCaffrey, each of whom have 12.

HOPKINS AND SEVEN-CATCH GAMES: Wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins made his Titans debut last week at New Orleans and led the team with seven receptions and 65 receiving yards. It was the 58th game of his career with seven or more receptions. He was the first Titans player with seven or more receptions in a contest since TreyIon Burks (seven) at Green Bay on Nov. 17, 2022.

Hopkins' 58 career games with seven-plus receptions leads all active NFL players. Las Vegas Raiders wide receiver Davante Adams ranks second among active players with 56 such games. Chargers wide receiver Keenan Allen, who the Titans are scheduled to face this week, is tied for fourth place on the list with 50 career seven-catch performances.

KEY IMPACTFUL IN TITANS DEBUT: The Titans signed outside linebacker **Arden Key** as an unrestricted free agent from the Jacksonville Jaguars early in the 2023 offseason. In his first game with his new team, Key tied **Denico Autry** for the team lead and tied his career high with 1.5 sacks. He also tallied four total tackles, one pass defensed and 11 quarterback pressures.

Key's 11 quarterback pressures, measured by Next Gen Stats, set a new career benchmark and were the most by any NFL player in Week 1. Additionally, his total tied for the NFL's second-best tally since the start of the 2022 campaign. San Francisco's **Nick Bosa** had a league-high 12 pressures against the Los Angeles Rams on Oct. 3, 2022. Immediately behind Bosa on the list are Key, Buffalo's **Ed Oliver** (11 against Minnesota on Nov. 13, 2022) and Seattle's **Uchenna Nwosu** (11 at the Los Angeles Chargers on Oct. 23, 2022).

Within the Titans defense, Key's pass-rushing performance was one of the best in the past five seasons. Since the beginning of the 2019 campaign, only outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** has turned in more quarterback pressures in a game for the Titans than Key. Landry had 12 quarterback pressures against Indianapolis on Sept. 26, 2021.

HOOKER AND BYARD SHINE AMONG SAFETY TANDEMS: Last week at New Orleans, Titans safety Amani Hooker created two turnovers. He registered the team's first interception of 2023 in addition to forcing and recovering a fumble on the game's opening kickoff.

Hooker became the sixth NFL player over a five-season span (2019–2023) and the first player in 2023 with an interception, a forced fumble (defense or special teams) and a fumble recovery (defense or special teams) in the same game. The others on the list are **Cory Littleton** (Rams at Panthers, Sept. 8, 2019), **Cameron Dantzler** (Vikings vs. Jaguars, Dec. 6, 2020), **Marcus Peters** (Ravens at Patriots, Sept. 25, 2022), **Jack Jones** (Patriots at Packers, Oct. 2, 2022) and **Tony Fields** (Browns at Texans, Dec. 4, 2022).

Hooker roams the defensive backfield alongside fellow safety **Kevin Byard**, who tied for the team lead at New Orleans with eight tackles and has led the Titans in interceptions in five of his seven previous NFL seasons.

Since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, Byard has a team-best 10 interceptions, while Hooker ranks second on the team with seven interceptions. Among all current NFL safety tandems, Byard and Hooker make up one of two duos with seven or more interceptions apiece in that span. The other such tandem resides in Buffalo, where Bills safeties **Jordan Poyer** (11) and **Taylor Rapp** (seven as a member of the Rams) have accomplished the feat. Bills safety **Micah Hyde** has an additional six interceptions for his team in the same time frame.
