TITANS-LIONS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

LANDRY'S STEADY, PRODUCTIVE PRESENCE ON DEFENSE: During last week's game at Buffalo, Titans outside linebacker **Harold Landry III's** statistics included a tackle for loss, a pass defended and four tackles.

Landry's performance increased his season totals to 29 tackles, four sacks and seven tackles for loss. Since the beginning of the 2008 season, no Titans player other than Landry has contributed at least 25 tackles, four sacks and seven tackles for loss through the team's first six games of a campaign. Landry now has done it three times in seven NFL seasons: 2024, 2021 (36 tackles, 6.5 sacks and seven tackles for loss) and 2019 (29 tackles, four sacks and seven tackles for loss).

In 2024, Landry is one of three NFL players that currently has at least 25 tackles, seven tackles for loss and four sacks. The other players on the list are Pittsburgh Steelers outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** (26 total tackles, 4.5 sacks, eight tackles for loss) and Denver Broncos defensive end **Zach Allen** (32 total tackles, four sacks, nine tackles for loss).

TITANS DEFENSE FORCING THREE-AND-OUTS AT SECOND-BEST RATE: The Titans defense goes into Week 8 with the NFL's top-ranked overall defense. The unit has allowed a league-low 272.2 yards per game by opposing offenses.

Last week against the Bills, the Titans defense began the game by forcing three consecutive three-and-outs, and they totaled four three-and-outs in the contest.

The Titans have forced a total of 20 three-and-outs in 2024 in 65 drives. Their rate of 30.8 percent ranks second in the NFL, trailing only the 31.4 percent posted by the Miami Dolphins defense.

WESTBROOK-IKHINE NEARS 100-RECEPTION MARK: Titans wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** has produced a touchdown reception in each of the last two games, achieving back-to-back touchdown games for the first time in his five-year career.

Westbrook-Ikhine joined the Titans in 2020 as an undrafted free agent from Indiana University. Since then, he has appeared in 67 games with 30 starts and caught 97 passes for 1,295 yards and 12 touchdowns.

With three more catches, Westbrook-Ikhine can become the fourth undrafted player in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present) to produce 100 receptions for the team. The group includes wide receivers **Nate Washington** (307 receptions with the Titans) and **Drew Bennett** (273) and tight end **Anthony Firkser** (106). Westbrook-Ikhine would join Bennett as the only members of the quartet who initially entered the NFL with the Titans. Washington (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Firkser (New York Jets and Kansas City Chiefs) were on other rosters prior to signing with the Titans.

Westbrook-Ikhine's 12 touchdown grabs also rank third among undrafted players for the Titans since 1999.

Among active NFL wide receivers, Westbrook-Ikhine has a chance to join six others who reached the NFL as undrafted free agents and have at least 100 receptions and 12 touchdown catches. One of the current members of the group is Detroit Lions wideout **Tim Patrick**, who has 153 receptions for 2,174 yards and 12 scores since originally entering the league as a rookie free agent with the Baltimore Ravens in 2018.

BAKER ARRIVES IN TENNESSEE: The Titans completed a trade with the Seattle Seahawks to acquire linebacker **Jerome Baker** and a fourth-round draft choice in exchange for linebacker **Ernest Jones IV**.

In acquiring Baker, the Titans receive a 27-year-old player with 99 games of NFL experience with Seattle (2024) and the Miami Dolphins (2018-23). During his time in the league, the seventh-year veteran has accumulated 618 total tackles, 23.5 sacks and five interceptions—including two interception returns for touchdowns.

Since the beginning of Baker's rookie season in 2018, he is one of only two NFL players with at least 600 tackles, 20 sacks and five interceptions. He joins Baltimore's **Roquan Smith** (924 tackles, 10 interceptions and 20 sacks) as the lone players to achieve the feat.
