TITANS-CHARGERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

LANDRY TRAILS ONLY JONES AND KEARSE THROUGH FIRST 90 GAMES: Titans outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** is slated to play in his 90th career game this Sunday against the Chargers. Last week against the Patriots, he registered his team-leading fifth sack of the season. It is his fifth consecutive season with at least five sacks.

Landry increased his career sack total to 46.5. Since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982, only two players have had more sacks in their first 90 games with the franchise: **Sean Jones** and **Jevon Kearse**. Jones' first 90 games with the Oilers yielded 54.5 sacks, and Kearse, who appeared in 88 games for the Titans, totaled 52 sacks.

LEAGUE LEADERS IN YARDS PER TOUCH OVER FOUR SEASONS: Last week against New England, Titans running back **Tony Pollard** totaled 154 scrimmage yards—his best total of the season through eight games. He rushed for a season-high 128 yards on 28 carries and added 26 receiving yards on three catches. It was his second consecutive game topping 100 scrimmage yards and his fourth such performance of the season.

In the past two weeks, only New Orleans' **Alvin Kamara** (337) and Philadelphia's **Saquon Barkley** (310) have more scrimmage yards than Pollard, whose 271 scrimmage yards in that span includes 222 yards on the ground along with 49 yards receiving.

Pollard has proven to be a reliable offensive weapon in his first season in Tennessee, continuing the success he previously found at his first NFL stop with the Dallas Cowboys. Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Pollard's third year, he has produced 3,353 rushing yards on 717 attempts and 1,154 receiving yards on 157 catches. His 874 total touches have resulted in 4,507 scrimmage yards, or an average of 5.16 yards per offensive touch.

In the past four seasons, a total of 14 NFL players have totaled at least 800 touches on offense. Within that group, only **Christian McCaffrey** (5.83), **Austin Ekeler** (5.39), **Aaron Jones** (5.39) and **Jonathan Taylor** (5.22) have averaged more yards per touch than Pollard.

WESTBROOK-IKHINE TRIES FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT WITH A TOUCHDOWN: Titans wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** enters this weekend's game at Los Angeles with a career-best streak of four games with a touchdown reception. He owns the NFL's second-longest active streak, trailing only Detroit's **Amon-Ra St. Brown**, who has a touchdown catch in six consecutive outings.

With a touchdown reception against the Chargers, Westbrook-Ikhine will own one of seven streaks in franchise history in which a player has caught a touchdown pass in five straight contests. The most recent occasion was a five-game streak by **A.J. Brown** in 2020.

TITANS DEFENSIVE NUMBERS THROUGH EIGHT GAMES: The Titans cross the midpoint of their season this week as they play their ninth of 17 games in 2024. They enter the contest against the Chargers with the NFL's top ranked overall defense at 269.1 opponent yards per game, and they also rank first in the league in passing defense with an average of 155.8 passing yards allowed.

In the franchise's "Titans era," which began in 1999, the current team's average yards allowed per game is its best number through the first eight games of a season, topping the 2007 squad's 270.8 average yards allowed through eight games.

Similarly, the Titans defense is allowing its fewest passing yards per contest through the first eight games of any season since 1999. The unit's first downs allowed (16.4), opponent yards per play (4.7) and third-down percentage (31.3) also place in the team's top five in the same span.

FOLK TO BECOME FRANCHISE’S FOURTH AGE 40 PLAYER: Titans kicker **Nick Folk** has made all 11 field goals and all 15 extra points he has attempted this season, which is his 17th NFL campaign since he was selected by the Dallas Cowboys in the sixth round of the 2007 NFL Draft.

Folk celebrated his 40th birthday on Tuesday, Nov. 5. This week at Los Angeles, he can become the franchise’s fourth player to appear in a game after his 40th birthday and the first since kicker **Gary Anderson** in 2004. The other players who have done so for the franchise are offensive lineman **Bruce Matthews** and quarterback **Dave Krieg**.

Three other NFL players have logged games this season in their 40s: Jets quarterback **Aaron Rodgers**, Bears tight end **Marcedes Lewis** and Arizona kicker **Matt Prater**.

Folk enters this week’s game one field goal from setting the franchise’s all-time record for consecutive field goals made. With a pair of field goals last week against the Patriots, he tied the record of 20. The mark was reached on five prior occasions, including Folk’s separate streak of 20 made field goals in 2023. **Al Del Greco** established the record from 1998 to 1999, and **Rob Bironas** later matched it on three different occasions.
