# TITANS HOLD 22ND OVERALL PICK, NINE TOTAL SELECTIONS IN 2021 NFL DRAFT

Draft set for April 29-May 1

NASHVILLE — The Titans are scheduled to have the 22nd overall selection and nine total picks in the 86th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting, beginning April 29 in Cleveland, Ohio.

The draft opens with the first round on Thursday, April 29 at 7 p.m. CT. Rounds 2 and 3 are set for the following evening, beginning at 6 p.m. CT, and the draft concludes with Rounds 4-7 on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT.

Multiple locations in Cleveland will be used during the festivities, including FirstEnergy Stadium, the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and the Great Lakes Science Center.

The NFL will welcome a select number of draft prospects to the draft stage in Cleveland with NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell**, while others will participate remotely from their homes. Last year the entire draft was conducted in virtual format due to the COVID-19 pandemic after originally being planned for Las Vegas.

Titans personnel involved in the selection process, including executive vice president/general manager **Jon Robinson** and head coach **Mike Vrabel**, will be stationed together and following appropriate protocols in a temporary draft room in Nashville's MetroCenter as Saint Thomas Sports Park undergoes major renovations this offseason.

The last time the NFL had an in-person draft was 2019, when Nashville hosted the festivities for the first time. A record 600,000 fans attended the three-day affair, which is the premier event on the NFL's offseason calendar. The television audience in 2019 reached 47.5 million viewers.

#### **DRAFT BROADCASTS**

All three days of the 2021 NFL Draft will be televised on NFL Network, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and ABC, including Nashville affiliate WKRN News 2.

ESPN and ABC will provide distinct prime-time presentations on Day 1 and Day 2. ESPN will offer a traditional draft telecast, while ABC broadcast will cover the event with an emphasis on the individual journeys of NFL Draft prospects. On Day 3, the ESPN coverage will be simulcast on ABC.

Coverage will be streamed live via NFL and ESPN digital properties across devices (phone, PC, tablet and connected TVs). NFL Network or ESPN authentication may be required.

The Titans Radio Network, including Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone, will carry draft programming across the Mid-South with **Mike Keith**, **Dave McGinnis**, **Amie Wells** and **Rhett Bryan**.

National radio coverage will be provided by SiriusXM NFL Radio, Westwood One and ESPN Radio.

Meanwhile, draft information will be updated continuously at <a href="TennesseeTitans.com">TennesseeTitans.com</a>, the Titans mobile app and on all official team social channels.

#### **NINE PICKS**

The Titans' nine total picks are comprised of six of their seven original selections, one compensatory pick, plus two choices acquired in trades.

For the first time since 2013, the Titans were awarded a compensatory selection as a result of net losses in unrestricted free agency last year. The extra third-round pick is the 100th overall selection. Teams are permitted to trade compensatory picks.

The Titans added a sixth-round pick for 2021 (215th overall) from the Kansas City Chiefs as a result of dealing a seventh-rounder to the Chiefs during the 2020 draft.

In the seventh round, the Titans hold the 232nd overall pick as a result of a trade that sent offensive lineman **Isaiah Wilson** to the Miami Dolphins.

Tennessee's original seventh-round pick was packaged with outside linebacker **Kamalei Correa** and sent to the Jacksonville Jaguars during the 2020 campaign in exchange for a sixth-rounder in 2021. That same sixth-round pick was subsequently used by the Titans to trade for Los Angeles Chargers cornerback **Desmond King II**.

The Titans have not drafted more than six players in any year since 2017, when they had nine selections. They picked four players in 2018 and six players in both 2019 and 2020.

#### THE 22ND PICK

In determining draft order, non-playoff clubs select first through 18th, according to the reverse order of their standing (i.e., the team with the lowest winning percentage receives the first pick, the team with the second-lowest winning percentage receives the second pick, etc.). Playoff teams select 19th through 32nd based on their level of advancement in the postseason.

The Titans finished 11-5 during the 2020 regular season and advanced to the wild card round. The Indianapolis Colts did the same, and as a result the two division rivals will rotate picks 21 and 22 in each round. Based on the 2020 strength-of-schedule tiebreaker (.475 for the Titans; .443 for the Colts), the Colts will pick ahead of the Titans in Round 1, the Titans will pick in front of the Colts in the second round, etc.

There have been two prior drafts in franchise history in which the team used the 22nd overall pick. In 1988, the Oilers used the pick on Michigan State running back **Lorenzo White**. Over the next seven seasons, White appeared in 95 games for the Oilers, rushing for 4,079 yards and 29 touchdowns and adding 184 receptions for 1,674 yards and six scores. He was a Pro Bowl selection in 1992.

More recently, the Titans traded up to the 22nd slot (from 25) to select Alabama linebacker **Rashaan Evans** in 2018. Evans has started every game for the team for the past two seasons. He led the team with 139 tackles in 2019 and ranked third with 96 stops in 2020.

One year ago the 22nd pick was Louisiana State wide receiver **Justin Jefferson**, who was taken by the Minnesota Vikings. Jefferson made the Pro Bowl as a rookie after totaling 88 receptions for 1,400 yards and seven touchdowns.

In 54 drafts since 1967, when the NFL and AFL agreed to a "common draft," there have been 10 total No. 22 overall picks (18.5 percent) that have made at least one Pro Bowl: White, linebacker Jack Reynolds (selected in 1970 by the Los Angeles Rams), defensive back Hanford Dixon (1981, Cleveland Browns), defensive back Gill Byrd (1983, San Diego Chargers), tackle Harris Barton (1987, San Francisco 49ers), wide receiver Andre Rison (1989, Indianapolis Colts), wide receiver Percy Harvin (2009, Minnesota Vikings), wide receiver Demaryius Thomas (2010, Denver Broncos), defensive back Desmond Trufant (2013, Atlanta Falcons) and Jefferson.

The Titans own the 53rd overall pick in the second round, and their initial pick in the third round is 85th overall. The latter is one spot sooner than would otherwise be the case due to the New England Patriots' forfeiture of their third-round pick.

WHAT: 86th Annual National Football League Player

Selection Meeting

**WHEN:** 7 p.m. CDT, Thursday, April 29 (Round 1)

6 p.m. CDT, Friday, April 30 (Rounds 2-3) 11 a.m. CDT, Saturday, May 1 (Rounds 4-7)

**TIMING:** The first round will conclude on Thursday by approximately 11 p.m. CT. In 2020, the first round consumed three hours and 54 minutes. The second and third rounds will conclude on Friday by approximately 11 p.m. CT. The second and third rounds took a combined four hours and 49 minutes in 2020. The draft will conclude by approximately 6 p.m. CT on Saturday with the final four rounds. Rounds 4 through 7 took six hours and 47 minutes in 2020.

**SEVEN ROUNDS:** Seven Rounds – Round 1 on Thursday, April 29; Rounds 2 through 3 on Friday, April 30; and Rounds 4 through 7 on Saturday, May 1.

There will be 259 total selections, including 36 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 17 teams. A total of 32 compensatory picks are awarded to teams for losing more or better compensatory free agents than it acquires in the previous year. The picks are positioned within the third through sixth rounds based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost and are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. Tennessee was awarded a third-round compensatory pick (100th overall) this year. Teams are permitted under NFL bylaws to trade compensatory picks.

In addition to the 32 compensatory selections awarded under the net loss formula, four special compensatory selections were awarded to four clubs (San Francisco 49ers, Los Angeles Rams, Baltimore Ravens and New Orleans Saints) under an amendment to the NFL's Collective Bargaining Agreement to promote equal employment opportunities and an inclusive workforce within NFL clubs. The initiative provides that the prior employer-club of a minority employee who has been hired by another club as its head coach or primary football executive (general manager) will receive compensation in the form of a special compensatory draft selection in the third round of each of the next two drafts, or in each of the next three drafts if two minority employees from the employer-club are hired for these positions by another club or clubs.

Three clubs possess two choices in the first round: the Jacksonville Jaguars (1, 25), New York Jets (2, 23) and Miami Dolphins (6, 18). Three

teams do not have a pick in the opening round: the Houston Texans, Los Angeles Rams and Seattle Seahawks.

**TIME LIMITS:** Round 1: 10 minutes per selection. Round 2: Seven minutes per selection. Rounds 3 through 6, including compensatory picks: Five minutes per selection. Round 7, including compensatory picks: Four minutes per selection.

**TELEVISION DETAILS:** The draft will be televised on NFL Network, ESPN, ABC and ESPN Deportes.

For the third consecutive year, ESPN and ABC will provide distinct primetime presentations on Day 1 and 2. ESPN will again offer the traditional draft telecast – a combination of X's and O's analysis, player highlights and storytelling – while ABC, featuring the eleven-time Sports Emmy Awardwinning College GameDay Built by The Home Depot crew, will cover the event with an emphasis on the individual journeys of NFL Draft prospects.

On ESPN, **Mike Greenberg** will debut as host on Day 1 and 2 with senior NFL Draft analyst **Mel Kiper Jr.** and NFL analysts **Louis Riddick** and **Booger McFarland**. ESPN's event coverage will also feature Senior NFL Insiders **Chris Mortensen** and **Adam Schefter** and NFL host **Suzy Kolber**.

On ABC, Rece Davis and Maria Taylor will co-host the broadcasts on Day 1 and 2. Davis will cover the event with college football analysts Kirk Herbstreit and Desmond Howard and senior NFL Draft analyst Todd McShay. From a nearby set, Taylor will anchor with college football analyst Jesse Palmer. College football analyst David Pollack will also provide insights alongside his College GameDay teammates.

On Day 3, Davis will host the 2021 NFL Draft on ESPN and ABC with Kiper, McShay, Riddick, Mortensen and Schefter.

ESPN Deportes will provide exclusive Spanish-language coverage. Commentators include Monday Night Football voices **Eduardo Varela** and **Pablo Viruega**. In addition, ESPNDeportes.com will have a team dedicated to covering the draft

Details of NFL Network's coverage of the draft will be announced in the near future.

**LIVE STREAMING:** NFL Network's telecast will stream across devices through the NFL digital properties, including the NFL app and NFL.com. The ESPN and ESPN Deportes broadcasts will stream live through their respective apps. Fans can also access the draft at ABC.go.com.

Authentication may be required.

**RADIO:** Titans Radio Network will carry programming throughout the draft with **Mike Keith**, **Dave McGinnis**, **Amie Wells** and **Rhett Bryan**. The Titans Radio flagship station is 104.5 The Zone in Nashville.

# 17 GAMES IN 2021

The Titans' opponents for 2021 are set under the NFL's new scheduling formula

For the first time, each team will play 17 regular season games and three preseason games this season. It is the first change to the season structure since 1978, when the league went to 16 regular season games and four preseason contests.

As always, the Titans will have home and road games against each of the AFC South rival Houston Texans, Indianapolis Colts and Jacksonville Jaguars.

Based upon the NFL's preexisting schedule rotation, the Titans also will face every team from the AFC East. They will host the Buffalo Bills and Miami Dolphins and travel to meet the New England Patriots and New York Jets.

Additionally, the Titans will square off against the NFC West. They will have dates at Nissan Stadium against the Arizona Cardinals and San Francisco 49ers and road games versus the Los Angeles Rams and Seattle Seahawks. It will be their first appearance at SoFi Stadium in Los Angeles.

Every team plays two intraconference games that are determined by order of finish within its division. The Titans won the AFC South, resulting in a 2021 home matchup with the AFC West's equivalent finisher, the first-place Kansas City Chiefs. The Titans will go on the road to meet the AFC North's equivalent finisher from 2020, the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Similarly, the new 17th game will feature interconference matchups based on the previous year's divisional standings. The AFC was determined to be the home conference for the 17th game in 2021. As a result, the Titans will host the champions of the NFC South, the New Orleans Saints.

The official 2021 schedule, with playing dates and times, will be announced by the NFL on Wednesday, May 12.

NFL Kickoff Weekend will begin Thursday night, Sept. 9, and the regular season will end Sunday, Jan. 9, 2022.

# NFL DRAFT-A-THON

The 2021 NFL Draft will again host Draft-a-Thon, a fundraiser that drives awareness and action to close critical gaps at the intersection of pandemic recovery and our hardest hit communities. Draft-a-Thon will raise funds on behalf of four national nonprofit organizations that are supporting underserved communities in these areas: The Digital Divide in education, health disparities, food insecurity and mental health.

"It's imperative to help those in need as we navigate toward recovery from the pandemic. Through Draft-a-Thon, the NFL Draft will serve as a platform to create action and change," said NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell**. "We're proud to partner with the CDC Foundation, The Education Trust, Feeding America, and Mental Health America in helping generate awareness and driving assistance to aid those who have been critically underserved throughout the last year."

Similar to last year, the Draft-a-Thon will be featured across the live Draft coverage on ABC, ESPN, ESPN Deportes, ESPN Radio and NFL Network April 29-May 1 and will showcase the efforts of the four nonprofit organizations that support pandemic recovery in these areas:

- Health Disparities CDC Foundation: Communities of color, indigenous communities, older and rural Americans have long faced health disparities. This has been exacerbated by the pandemic, where COVID-19 has disproportionately impacted those already experiencing health disparities. Through Draft-a-Thon, the CDC Foundation will drive awareness of the cause of health inequities and promote vital community conditions, including meeting the basic needs for health, nutrition, safety, housing, education, and meaningful work.
- The Digital Divide The Education Trust: Over this past year, the digital divide a growing chasm between those who have access to computers and reliable, high-speed Internet and those who do not has widened due to the pandemic when students needed to work from home without proper resources to do so. More than 16 million students lack the necessary Internet access at home to complete their homework, according to Future Ready Schools, a project of the Alliance for Excellent Education. This year's Draft-a-Thon will support The Education Trust in their work to close opportunity gaps that disproportionately affect students of color and students from low-income families.
- Food Insecurity Feeding America: Feeding America estimates nearly 42 million people, including 13 million children, could face food insecurity in 2021 due to the ongoing economic fallout from COVID-19. This equates to 1 in 8 people and 1 in 6 children. Feeding America's mission is to feed people facing food insecurity through a nationwide network of member food banks and engage our country in the fight to end hunger. Draft-a-Thon will provide an opportunity to inform fans that we all have neighbors that need our help putting food on the table, especially as we work towards pandemic recovery, and we can all help by spreading the word, donating and volunteering.
- Mental Health Mental Health America: Throughout the ongoing pandemic, 4 out of 5 people who took an anxiety or depression screening with Mental Health America reported moderate to severe symptoms. The pandemic has made it clear to everyone that there is a huge need for more mental health services and support, especially in our hardest hit communities. Mental Health America is the nation's leading community-based nonprofit dedicated to addressing the needs of those living with mental illness and to promote mental health. Drafta-Thon will raise awareness and understanding that prioritizing our mental health is a key part of recovering from the pandemic.

Draft-a-Thon will simultaneously come to life via Draft-a-Thon LIVE, a social livestream, hosted by NFL Network's **Kay Adams**. During the first two days of the 2021 NFL Draft, NFL players, Legends, celebrities, and additional guests will help rally NFL fans to raise awareness and funds for the four organizations the NFL is supporting on the path to pandemic recovery. Draft-a-Thon LIVE will stream across NFL social and digital platforms including Twitter, Facebook, TikTok, Youtube, Twitch, Reddit, and nfl.com/DraftaThon. JDRF Event a Success, with Help of Titans GM Jon Robinson

**Jon Robinson** was hired as Titans general manager on Jan. 14, 2016 after spending two years as director of player personnel for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Nearly one year later, on Jan. 5, 2017, he was promoted to executive vice president/general manager.

In his first five years on the job, the Titans finished with four consecutive 9-7 seasons followed by an 11-5 mark in 2020. It marked the first time the organization produced at least five consecutive winning seasons since a seven-year run of winning records from 1987–1993. The Titans, Seattle Seahawks and Kansas City Chiefs were the only NFL teams without a losing season from 2016 to 2020.

Robinson became only the second general manager in franchise history whose first five teams finished above the .500 mark, joining **Mike Holovak** (1989-93).

Robinson's work helped the team go from three wins in the season prior to his arrival (2015) to a divisional round playoff finish following the 2017 campaign. He became the fifth general manager in franchise history to have the team in the playoffs within his first two full seasons.


Then, in 2019, the team he constructed advanced to the AFC Championship game. It was the organization's first appearance in the conference title game in 17 seasons (2002).

In 2020, Robinson and the Titans clinched the 2020 AFC South title with an 11-5 record in the regular season, claiming their best record and first division title since going 13-3 in 2008. They did so while navigating the challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

In five drafts as general manager from 2016 to 2020, Robinson selected 35 total players, and 19 of those players remained with the club at the end of 2020. During that same time period (through January 2021), he engineered 22 trades and made 11 waiver claims.

2021: After the NFL's new league year began in March, the Titans struck several deals with veterans in the initial days of free agency. The incoming players included Pittsburgh Steelers outside linebackers Bud Dupree and Ola Adeniyi, New Orleans Saints cornerback Janoris Jenkins, Indianapolis Colts defensive lineman Denico Autry, Cleveland Browns cornerback Kevin Johnson, New York Jets safety Matthias Farley, Los Angeles Rams wide receiver Josh Reynolds, Browns tackle Kendall Lamm and Baltimore Ravens long snapper Morgan Cox.

The Titans also re-signed several of their own free agents: tight ends

Anthony Firkser and Geoff Swaim, tackle Ty Sambrailo and inside linebacker Jayon Brown.

**2020:** Early in 2020, the Titans reached an agreement on a multi-year contract to keep quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** in Tennessee. The Titans also re-signed tackle **Dennis Kelly**, who would go on to start all 16 games at right tackle.

After initially placing the franchise tag on running back **Derrick Henry**, the Titans and Henry were able to come to an agreement on a multi-year contract extension in July 2020.

Tannehill responded with 16 starts for the first time since 2015 and produced one of the best seasons of any quarterback in franchise history. He finished in the top five of several of the organization's single-season record lists with 40 total touchdowns (first), a 106.5 passer rating (second), 3,819 passing yards (third) and 33 touchdown passes (tied for second).

Robinson acquired Tannehill for the Titans in a 2019 trade with the Miami Dolphins, and in the quarterback's first two seasons with the team, he led the Titans to two playoff appearances. From the time he took over as the Titans' starter in Week 7 of 2019 through the end of 2020, Tannehill's 111.3 passer rating ranked third in the NFL behind only **Drew Brees'** 112.3 and **Aaron Rodgers'** 111.7. Tannehill's 2020 successes followed a 2019 season in which he led the NFL and set franchise records with a 117.5 passer rating and a 9.6-yard passing average. In addition to being named to his first Pro Bowl, he earned the 2019 Associated Press Comeback Player of the Year Award.

After securing his multi-year extension, Henry produced one of the greatest seasons in NFL history by a running back. He led the NFL in rushing for the second consecutive season with 2,027 rushing yards, which was only the eighth 2,000-yard rushing season in league annals, and also paced the league with 17 rushing touchdowns. He was recognized with the Associated Press Offensive Player of the Year Award.

Henry, a second-round pick by Robinson in 2016, led the Titans in rushing every season from 2017 through 2020, during which time he also led the NFL with 5,370 total rushing yards. In 2019, he won his first of two consecutive NFL rushing crowns with 1,540 yards and tied for the NFL lead with 16 rushing touchdowns.

In the 2020 NFL Draft, the Titans had six total picks, including Louisiana State cornerback **Kristian Fulton** in the second round (61st overall) and Appalachian State running back **Darrynton Evans** in the third round (93rd overall).

2019: Near the beginning of the 2019 free agent signing period, Robinson worked quickly to add several veterans from other teams who played key roles, including Tannehill and former Rams guard Rodger Saffold. Robinson also worked to re-sign safety Kenny Vaccaro and punter Brett Kern

Then, in the 2019 NFL Draft, Robinson directed the selection of six total players, including Mississippi State defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** in the first round (19th overall), Ole Miss wide receiver **A.J. Brown** in the second round (51st overall) and Charlotte offensive lineman **Nate Davis** in the third round (82nd overall).

In his first two seasons, Brown led the Titans in every major receiving category, totaling 122 catches for 2,126 yards and 19 touchdowns. He became the 11th NFL player to reach 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first two NFL seasons and the first player to do so since **Michael Thomas** (2016-17). From 1970 through 2020, Brown and **Randy Moss** were the only players to post at least 120 receptions and 19 touchdown catches while averaging 17.0 yards per reception in their first two seasons. He was named to the Pro Bowl in 2020 after totaling 70 receptions for 1,075 yards and 11 touchdowns.

As a rookie, Brown ranked first among rookies in receiving yards (1,051), tied for the rookie lead in touchdown receptions (eight) and placed fifth in receptions (52). Among all NFL players in 2019—rookies and veterans—Brown finished second in receiving average (20.2), behind only the Los Angeles Chargers' **Mike Williams** (20.4).

**2018:** The Titans' 2018 free agent class included Pro Bowl cornerback **Malcolm Butler**. In his three seasons in Tennessee, Butler played in 41 games (36 starts) and totaled nine interceptions. In early August 2018, the Titans signed Vaccaro, who went on to start 42 games over his three seasons with the club.

Robinson's 2018 draft class was comprised of four players after he used multiple trades to go up and get his targets. It included first-round linebacker **Rashaan Evans** from Alabama (22nd overall pick) and second-

round outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** from Boston College (41st overall). Evans started all 32 games from 2019 to 2020, and in 2019 he led the team with 139 tackles. Landry appeared in 47 games (35 starts) in his first three seasons, and his 19.0 sacks from 2018–2020 (nine in 2019) ranked first on the team.

**2017:** During the 2017 offseason, Robinson used free agency to address needs on defense and special teams. Most notably, he spearheaded deals for cornerback **Logan Ryan** (New England) and special teams contributor and 2017 Pro Bowler **Brynden Trawick** (Oakland).

In the 2017 NFL Draft, Robinson spent first-round picks on wide receiver Corey Davis (fifth overall) and cornerback Adoree' Jackson (18th overall). It marked the first time the franchise had a pair of first-round draft selections since 1987. The Titans' 2017 draft haul also featured tight end Jonnu Smith in the third round and linebacker Jayon Brown in the fifth round.

The 2017 Titans advanced to the playoffs for the first time since 2008. Robinson became the fifth general manager in franchise history to have the team in the postseason within his first two full seasons.

**2016:** In his first year as an NFL general manager, Robinson's leadership and decision-making helped the Titans triple their win total from the previous season, finishing 9-7 in 2016 after a 3-13 finish in 2015. The sixwin improvement tied for the most in franchise history (1967 and 1974) and doubled the previous club benchmark for the most wins in the first year under a new general manager (three by **Bum Phillips** in 1975).

Within the first four months at his post, Robinson pulled the trigger on several key personnel decisions. On March 9, 2016, he made his first major acquisition, swapping fourth-round draft picks with the Philadelphia Eagles in exchange for running back **DeMarco Murray**. The trade provided major dividends in 2016, as Murray led the AFC and ranked third in the NFL with 1,287 rushing yards.

Around the same time, Robinson began to work the free agent market. Center **Ben Jones** and wide receiver **Rishard Matthews** highlighted the haul, and both were instrumental in helping to transform the Titans offense into the 11th-ranked unit in the NFL.

On April 14, 2016, two weeks before the NFL Draft, Robinson and the Titans dealt the first overall pick to the Los Angeles Rams in one of the biggest trades in recent NFL history. The Titans gave up the No. 1 pick and a fourth-rounder in order to receive the 15th overall pick, two second-rounders and a third-rounder in 2016, plus the Rams' first- and third-round picks in 2017. From 1990–2015, there were seven trades involving the No. 1 overall pick, but this was the first since 2004, when the San Diego Chargers selected **Eli Manning** with the first pick and dealt his rights to the New York Giants.

The Titans had their hands at one point or another on 17 selections in the 2016 draft due to five different trades (including one trade in 2015), and in the end, they ended up with a class of 10 players, including four of the top 45 picks. Robinson swung a draft-day trade with the Cleveland Browns to move back up to the eighth slot to choose Michigan State tackle **Jack Conklin**.

All 10 members of Robinson's first draft class played in at least one game in 2016. They accumulated a total of 110 games played and 38 starts, including 16 starts at right tackle by Conklin. The eighth-overall pick capped his successful rookie campaign by being named first-team All-Pro by Associated Press.

Third-round safety **Kevin Byard** earned first-team All-Pro honors in his second campaign. He ranked second in the NFL from 2017–2020 with 18 total interceptions also was named to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

**PRIOR HISTORY:** Robinson arrived in Tennessee with a wide range of experience from working his way up on the personnel side of the NFL. From 2014–2015, he served as director of player personnel for the Buccaneers and oversaw both college and pro departments as the team rebuilt its roster. The 2015 Buccaneers draft class made a significant impact, including four rookie starters: quarterback **Jameis Winston**, tackle **Donovan Smith**, guard **Ali Marpet** and linebacker **Kwon Alexander**.

Prior to joining Tampa Bay, Robinson spent 12 years with the New England Patriots, including his last five years (2009-13) as the director of college scouting. In the five years heading up their college scouting, the Patriots added a number of key components to their roster that won the Super Bowl in 2014, including wide receiver **Julian Edelman**, defensive back **Devin McCourty**, tight end **Rob Gronkowski**, tackle **Nate Solder** and defensive end **Chandler Jones**. He joined the Patriots as an area scout in 2002, a role he served for four seasons. Robinson then spent two years (2006-07) as a regional scout, before being promoted to assistant

director of college scouting in 2008 and then director of college scouting in 2009. In his time scouting for the Patriots the team won 10 division titles, four conference titles and two Super Bowls (2003, 2004).

Robinson played three years at Southeast Missouri State as a defensive lineman after starting his college career at the Air Force Academy. Following his college career as a player, he spent one season (1998) coaching at his alma mater and three years (1999-2001) coaching at Nicholls State.

A native of Union City, Tenn., Robinson and his wife, Jaimie, have two daughters, Taylor and Bailey.

# FIVE YEARS, THREE PLAYOFF BERTHS

**Jon Robinson** constructed a roster that produced five consecutive winning seasons in Robinson's first five years on the job, including 2020. The club went 9-7 in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 with postseason berths following the 2017 and 2019 campaigns. Then, in 2020, the Titans finished the regular season 11-5 and won the team's first division championship since 2008.

Robinson is only the second general manager in franchise history whose first five teams finished above the .500 mark, joining **Mike Holovak** (1989-93).

He is also the second general manager in team annals who has helped guide the club to three playoff berths in his first five seasons. Holovak did so in each of his first five years.

# FIRST-ROUND PICKS BY POSITION

Since the team's initial draft as a charter member of the American Football League in 1960, the Titans have made 57 first-round selections, using that pick on an offensive player 33 times and on defense 24 times.

On offense, running backs lead the list, having been chosen eight times in the first round, three of which were Heisman Trophy winners: **Billy Cannon** (1960), **Earl Campbell** (1978) and **Eddie George** (1996). The most recent was **Chris Johnson**, the 24th overall selection in 2008 who went on to rush for 1,228 yards as a rookie and eclipse 2,000 yards in his second season.

On the defensive side of the ball, linebackers have been selected the most—eight times—by the Titans in the first round. Robert Brazile (1975), Lamar Lathon (1990) and Keith Bulluck (2000) headline the linebackers chosen. Most recently, the Titans selected linebacker Rashaan Evans with their first-round pick in 2018.

During the franchise's "Titans era" (since 1999), Tennessee has chosen an offensive player with its initial pick 12 times and a defensive player 10 times (including second-round picks in years without a first-round selection).

### **ALL-TIME DRAFT PICKS BY POSITION**

In 61 drafts in the history of the franchise, the team has drafted more offensive linemen than any other position. There have been a total of 194 tackles, guards and centers drafted, 78 more than the next highest drafted position, running back/fullback, which has had 116 players drafted by the Titans.

For the past 12 years, more defensive backs (cornerbacks and safeties) have been drafted into the NFL than any other position. Among the entire 255-member 2020 NFL draft class, there were 49 defensive backs selected, two more than the 47 offensive linemen chosen. The last time another position group out-numbered the defensive backs was 2006, when 50 offensive linemen were chosen, versus 49 corners/safeties.

# THE TITANS AND FIRST-ROUND TRADES

More often than not in recent history, the Titans' draft is altered by at least one trade. The 2007 and 2011 drafts were the only selection processes in the last 18 years in which the Titans did not deal or acquire picks via trade.

Heading into the 2021 NFL Draft, the Titans already have dealt one draft pick and acquired two draft picks in trades.

In 2020, general manager **Jon Robinson** made four total trades, including one trade during the draft. In the seventh round, he traded a seventh-round pick (237th overall) to the Kansas City Chiefs in exchange for a sixth-round pick in 2021 (215th overall).

Robinson has been more likely to trade in the first round than other recent Titans general managers. The team was not involved in a first-round trade from 2005 through 2015. Then, in Robinson's first year, the Titans made one of the biggest trades in franchise history. Originally the owners of the No. 1 pick, the Titans dealt the selection to the Los Angeles Rams along with a fourth-round pick (113th overall) and a sixth-rounder (177th overall). In exchange, the Titans received the 15th overall pick in the first round, two second-rounders (43rd and 45th overall), a third-rounder (76th overall) and first- and third-round picks in 2017.

In 2018, Robinson traded up three spots in the first round (25th to 22nd) in order to select linebacker **Rashaan Evans**.

# PICKS BY COLLEGE CONFERENCE

Since 1994, the first year of the current seven-round draft format, the Titans have picked 44 players from the Southeastern Conference, more than any other conference. The Big Ten is second on the list, having sent 34 players to the organization, followed by the Pacific 12 Conference (30; formerly the Pac-10) and the Atlantic Coast Conference (23).

In 2020, the Titans selected two players from the SEC, taking Georgia tackle **Isaiah Wilson** in the first round and Louisiana State cornerback **Kristian Fulton** in the second round. The remaining four players came from the Sun Belt Conference (Appalachian State running back **Darrynton Evans**, third round), the Atlantic Coast Conference (North Carolina State defensive tackle **Larrell Murchison**, fifth round), the Mountain West Conference (Hawaii quarterback **Cole McDonald**, seventh round) and Conference USA (Marshall defensive back **Chris Jackson**, seventh round).

#### UNDRAFTED TALENT

At the conclusion of Round 7 of the draft, the Titans personnel department remains at work. At that point, general manager **Jon Robinson** and his staff along with head coach **Mike Vrabel** and his assistants begin the process of contacting undrafted players the team hopes to sign as free agents.

In 2020, the Titans signed 14 rookie free agents in the days following the draft. They finished the season with a total of three of those players on either the 53-man roster or the reserve/COVID-19 list: wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine**, guard/center **Aaron Brewer** (reserve/COVID-19) and defensive tackle **Teair Tart** (reserve/COVID-19). Additionally, one undrafted rookie—tackle **Anthony McKinney**—was on the reserve/opt-out list for the duration of the campaign.

The Titans finished the 2020 season with 17 players on the 53-man roster who entered the NFL as rookie free agents. That also included two members of their 2019 undrafted rookie class (cornerback Kareem Orr and outside linebacker Derick Roberson) and three of their 2018 undrafted class (wide receiver Cameron Batson, defensive end Matt Dickerson and defensive back Joshua Kalu).

There are several more players with the Titans who were initially signed as undrafted free agents with other teams, including the following: punter **Brett Kern**, tight end **Anthony Firkser**, fullback **Khari Blasingame**, defensive tackle **Denico Autry**, safety **Matthias Farley**, tackle **Kendall Lamm** and long snapper **Morgan Cox**.

**Mike Vrabel** was named head coach of the Titans on Jan. 20, 2018, becoming the 19th head coach in franchise history.


In 2020, the Titans made their second consecutive playoff appearance under Vrabel, who finished his third season with the organization with 31 total wins and a .596 winning percentage (31-21), including the regular season and postseason. His win total and winning percentage each tied **Jack Pardee** (31-21 from 1990 to 1992) for the best in franchise history over a head coach's first three seasons.

The Titans won the 2020 AFC South title with an 11-5 record in the regular season, claiming their best record and first division title since going 13-3 in 2008. They finished with a 5-1 record within the division and a 6-2 mark in road games, all while navigating the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Titans led the NFL in 2020 with a plus-11 turnover differential. Their 23 takeaways ranked seventh in the NFL, while their 12 turnovers were the second-fewest in the league in 2020 and tied for the ninth-lowest number since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

In 2020, the Tennessee offense continued its ascent into the NFL's upper echelon. The Titans tied for second place in total offense (396.4 yards per game) and ranked fourth in scoring offense (30.7 points per game). They became the first team in NFL history to generate at least 2,500 rushing yards (2,690) and 3,500 net passing yards (3,653) while surrendering 25 or fewer sacks (25). Their 6,343 total yards and 381 first downs established franchise records, while their 491 points amounted to the organization's second-best total.

The 2020 Titans joined the 1997 Detroit Lions as the only teams in NFL history to feature a 2,000-yard rusher, a 3,000-yard passer and a 1,000-yard receiver. **Derrick Henry** led the NFL in rushing for the second consecutive



Situationally, Vrabel's teams fared well among the NFL leaders in his first three seasons as head coach. From 2018 to 2020, their .935 winning percentage (29-2) in regular season games in which they had a fourth-quarter lead ranked second in the NFL behind the New Orleans Saints (.974). In the same time period, the Titans had a .643 winning percentage in three-point games (9-5), good for fifth in the league. The Titans and Saints were the only clubs to win at least three overtime contests in the regular season from 2018 to 2020, and neither suffered a loss.

The Titans were called for 267 penalties from 2018 through 2020, which was the second-fewest total in the NFL. Only the New England Patriots (249) fared better.

Also from 2018 to 2020, the Titans were a top-10 team in scoring defense. They allowed opponents to score 22.4 points per game during that time period, the eighth-lowest average in the NFL.

#### Titans to AFC Championship Game in Vrabel's Second Season

In 2019, Vrabel became the first head coach in the organization's history to win multiple playoff games within his first two seasons. The Titans won a pair of road games—at New England in the wild card round and at Baltimore in the divisional round—to advance to the 2019 AFC championship game, falling at Kansas City to the eventual Super Bowl champion Chiefs.

The Titans began the 2019 campaign with two wins in their first six games but rallied to win seven of their final 10 games in the regular season. From the time the NFL went to its current playoff format in 1990 through 2019, 345 teams went 2-4 or worse in their first six games of a season. From that group, the Titans became only the third team to advance to a conference championship game, joining the 2002 Titans (2-4) and the 1996 Jacksonville Jaguars (2-4).

The 2019 Titans ranked in the NFL's top 10 in scoring margin (eighth, +71), turnover margin (sixth, +6), offensive yards per play (fourth, 6.12), rushing offense (third, 138.9 yards per game), red zone efficiency (first, 75.6 percent), total touchdowns (tied for third, 54) and third-down defense (eighth, 36.3 percent).

In his first season as head coach, Vrabel directed the Titans to a 9-7 record. His nine wins tied for the fourth-highest total in franchise history by a first-year head coach.

With only 82 penalties enforced against the Titans in 2018, Vrabel's team led the NFL and set a franchise record (16-game season) for fewest penalties in a season. The 2018 Titans also placed third in points allowed (18.9 per game), eighth in total defense (333.4 yards per game), sixth in passing defense (216.9), second in red zone defense (44.7 percent touchdown rate) and seventh in rushing offense (126.4) in the league rankings.

#### Background as a Player and Coach

Vrabel arrived in Tennessee with 18 years of NFL experience, including four seasons as a coach and 14 seasons as a player. His distinguished playing career included three Super Bowl wins (2001, 2003 and 2004), one Pro Bowl selection (2007) and an All-Pro honor (2007). Vrabel played in 206 NFL games and totaled 57 sacks, 496 tackles, 11 interceptions, 20 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries and 10 touchdown receptions. Additionally,

his teams advanced to the playoffs eight times (20 postseason games), with Vrabel recording eight postseason sacks and two postseason touchdown receptions

Vrabel joined the Titans after four seasons with the Houston Texans, spending the first three seasons (2014-16) coaching linebackers and one year (2017) as the team's defensive coordinator. During his time in Houston, the Texans built one of the best defenses in the NFL and experienced tremendous success as a team – earning two division titles (2015, 2016).

Between 2014-16, the Texans defense ranked third in the NFL in yards allowed per game (319.9) and net passing yards (218.4). Houston also ranked first in third-down defense (33.6), fourth in opponent completion percentage (59.5) and sixth in points allowed per game (19.8). The 2016 defense ranked number one in the NFL, for the first time in franchise history, in yards allowed (301.3).

In 2017, his first year as a defensive coordinator, the Texans finished the campaign with 19 players on injured reserve. Despite the injuries, Vrabel led the defense to the fifth-best third-down percentage in the NFL and a franchise-record 3.97 yards per carry by opponents. Houston also had 18 different players record at least half a sack last year and 26 players tally at least one tackle for loss.

Vrabel spent his career playing and coaching with accomplished leaders, including Bill Belichick, Bill Cowher, Romeo Crennel, Urban Meyer, Bill O'Brien and Todd Haley.

As the Texans linebackers coach from 2014-16, Vrabel developed several players into top-notch performers, including **Jadeveon Clowney** (Pro Bowl, 2016), **Whitney Mercilus**, **Benardrick McKinney** (second-team All-Pro, 2016) and **Brian Cushing**. The 2015 Texans defense had the top third-down defense in the NFL (28.5 percent), which was the lowest percentage in franchise history and the lowest by any NFL team since the 2003 Titans (27.7 percent). The 2015 defense also set a franchise mark for sacks in a season with 45 - 22.5 coming from Vrabel's linebacking corps.

Prior to joining the NFL coaching ranks, Vrabel transitioned immediately from an NFL player to college coach. He started as the linebacker coach at Ohio State in 2011 and coached the defensive line from 2012–2013. The 2012 Buckeyes finished the season undefeated at 12-0. He also was named Big Ten Recruiter of the Year by ESPN.com in 2012.

Vrabel was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the third round (91st overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft, after his playing career at Ohio State, where he earned All-America honors and Big Ten Conference Defensive Lineman of the Year in both 1995 and 1996.

A native of Akron, Ohio, Vrabel attended Walsh Jesuit High School. He and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons: Tyler and Carter.

### MOST WINS IN FIRST THREE SEASONS

In the 2020 regular season finale at Houston, **Mike Vrabel** earned his 31st win in the regular season and postseason since taking over as Titans head coach in 2018. He finished the campaign with a three-year record of 31-21, including a 2-2 mark in the playoffs.

His 31 victories tied for the three-year franchise record originally established by former Oilers coach **Jack Pardee** from 1990 to 1992.

Vrabel, Pardee and **Jerry Glanville** (1986–1988) are the only head coaches in team annals to preside over at least two playoff squads in their initial three seasons. All three of Pardee's first three teams made the postseason, while Glanville's Oilers advanced to the postseason in his second and third years.

With a 31-21 record, Vrabel's winning percentage of .596 tied Pardee for the highest mark of any head coach in franchise history who has been with the organization at least three years.

When Vrabel was hired in 2018, he joined six other head coaches who joined (or rejoined) their respective clubs in the same offseason: Jon Gruden (Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders), Matt Nagy (Chicago Bears), Matt Patricia (Detroit Lions), Frank Reich (Indianapolis Colts), Pat Shurmur (New York Giants) and Steve Wilks (Arizona Cardinals). Of those seven coaches, Vrabel had the most wins from 2018 to 2020.

Vrabel, Reich and Nagy each led their respective teams to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons.

# VRABEL LEADS TITANS TO AFC TITLE GAME,

Titans head coach Mike Vrabel became the franchise's sixth head coach in franchise annals to have the team in the playoffs within his first two full seasons.

Vrabel is the fourth head coach in Titans/Oilers history to win at least one playoff game in his first two full seasons, joining Mike Mularkey (2017 playoff victory), Jack Pardee (1991) and Lou Rymkus (1960 and 1961). He is the first head coach in the team's history to win multiple playoff games within his first two seasons.

- > Bowen was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2021 after spending his first three seasons with the Titans as outside linebackers coach.
- In 2020, he added defensive play-caller to his responsibilities. The Titans defense ranked seventh in the NFL with 23 takeaways, which tied for the most by a Titans defense since 2013 (25).

The Titans also tallied 15 interceptions, which ranked seventh in the NFL and the most by the Titans since 2012 (19).

- In 2019, Harold Landry III (nine sacks) and Kamalei Correa (five) achieved career highs in sacks, while undrafted rookie Derick Roberson added three sacks.
- ➤ Bowen joined the Titans in 2018 after spending two seasons (2016-17) as a defensive assistant for the Houston Texans. He arrived with nine years of coaching experience.
- In 2016, Bowen was part of a Texans staff that produced the NFL's number one defense (yards allowed) for the first time in franchise history. In 2017, the defense ranked fifth in third-down defense and set a franchise record for yards per carry by opponents (3.97).
- > He also served at Kennesaw State as linebackers coach (2013-15), at Ohio State as a defensive graduate assistant (2012). He began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgia Tech (2009-11).
- A native of Pickerington, Ohio, Bowen was a three-year letter winner at Georgia Tech as an outside linebacker.

- > Downing was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2021 after initially joining the Titans in 2019 as tight ends coach. He came to the team with 18 years of previous NFL coaching experience.
- From 2019 to 2020, the Titans tight ends' 21 touchdowns tied for the third-highest total in the NFL among tight end groups. Over those two
  - seasons the Titans tight ends also produced the league's seventh-best receiving yardage total (1,915) and tied for the eighth-best reception total
- > Among their peers in 2020, the Titans tight end corps ranked second in total touchdowns (14), third in touchdown receptions (12), sixth in receptions (94) and ninth in receiving yards (967). Jonnu Smith tied the franchise single-season record for tight ends with eight touchdown catches, which also tied for third place in the NFL in 2020.
- > In his first season with the Titans (2019), Downing helped Smith set thencareer highs in receptions (35) and yards (439), while Anthony Firkser (15 games) and MyCole Pruitt (10 starts) emerged as steady contributors.




