TITANS-JAGUARS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

POLLARD'S CONSISTENT PRODUCTION: In last week's game at Indianapolis, running back **Tony Pollard** reached the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the third consecutive season and for the first time as a member of the Titans. His season statistics include 238 rushing attempts for a career-high 1,017 yards and five touchdowns.

Additionally, Pollard has 41 receptions for 238 yards, giving him 1,255 total scrimmage yards with two games remaining.

This is the third consecutive season in which Pollard has accounted for at least 1,200 scrimmage yards and at least five scrimmage touchdowns. He did so in each of his final two seasons with the Dallas Cowboys prior to signing with the Titans as an unrestricted free agent.

Pollard is one of only five NFL running backs with 1,200 scrimmage yards and five scrimmage touchdowns in 2022, 2023 and 2024. The others on the list are Baltimore's **Derrick Henry**, Houston's **Joe Mixon**, Philadelphia's **Saquon Barkley** and Pittsburgh's **Najee Harris**.

If Pollard adds 45 scrimmage yards and one scrimmage touchdown to his current totals, he would join Henry as the only running backs with 1,300 scrimmage yards and six scrimmage touchdowns in all three seasons from 2022 to 2024.

Pollard can also accomplish the following this week:

- He needs two more rushing touchdowns to reach 30 for his career.
- He needs one rushing touchdown to record his third consecutive season with at least six rushing touchdowns (nine in 2022 and six in 2023).
- He needs 124 more scrimmage yards to set a new career high for a season (1,378 scrimmage yards in 2022).
- With 238 rushing attempts in 2024, he needs 15 more to set a career high (252 in 2023).

OKONKWO'S PROLIFIC STRETCH: Titans third-year tight end **Chig Okonkwo** has set career highs in receptions in each of the past two games. He tallied eight catches for 59 yards two weeks ago against Cincinnati and followed that performance with nine catches for 81 yards at Indianapolis. His 81 yards against the Colts also established a career high.

With 17 total receptions in two games, Okonkwo tied **Jared Cook** for the second-largest total by a franchise tight end in any two-game span since 1970. Only **Delanie Walker**, with 18 receptions in two games in 2015, had a more productive two games.

With six receptions this week at Jacksonville, which would give Okonkwo a three-game total of 23 receptions, Okonkwo will set the franchise record (since 1970) for most receptions by a tight end over three games. Walker owns the current record with 22 receptions over three games in 2015. Okonkwo's current three-game total of 20 receptions, which also includes a three-catch outing against the Jaguars on Dec. 8, ranks sixth on the list.

Okonkwo can also accomplish the following this week:

- He needs seven receptions to match his career high of 54 receptions in 2023.
- With three receptions and 63 receiving yards, he will join **Frank Wycheck** (six consecutive seasons) and **Delanie Walker** (five) as the only tight ends in franchise history to record consecutive seasons with at least 50 receptions and 500 receiving yards. He enters the game with 47 receptions for 437 yards in 2024. In 2023, he produced 54 receptions for 528 yards.
- Okonkwo can join **Travis Kelce**, **Cade Otton** and **Brock Bowers** as the NFL's only tight ends in 2024 with eight or more receptions in three consecutive games.
- He can become the franchise's third overall player and first tight end with eight or more receptions in three consecutive games since 1970, joining running back **Butch Woolfolk** (three games in 1985) and wide receiver **Drew Hill** (three in 1991).

WESTBROOK-IKHINE CLOSERS IN ON 20 CAREER TOUCHDOWN CATCHES: Wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** leads the Titans with a career-best nine touchdown receptions in 2024, including a six-yard touchdown grab last week at Indianapolis. He has needed only 25 receptions to get to nine touchdowns, and his statistics also include 410 receiving yards for an average of 16.4 yards per reception.

Through the NFL games of Wednesday, Dec. 25, Westbrook-Ikhine and Jaguars rookie wide receiver **Brian Thomas Jr.** are tied with **Mike Evans** for sixth place on the NFL leaderboard for touchdown receptions.

Westbrook-Ikhine has increased his career totals to 119 receptions for 1,686 yards and 19 touchdowns since being signed by the Titans in 2020 as a rookie free agent from Indiana University. One more touchdown reception will make him not only the 16th overall player in franchise history to reach 20 career touchdown catches but also the sixth undrafted player in team annals to achieve the feat.

Among all active NFL players, Westbrook-Ikhine can become the fifth undrafted player to reach 20 touchdown receptions. He can join a group that already includes wide receivers **Adam Thielen** (62 touchdown receptions) of Carolina, **Allen Lazard** (26) of the New York Jets and **Kendrick Bourne** (22) of New England, as well as Washington running back **Austin Ekeler** (30).

COX SET TO MATCH WHITE ON GAMES PLAYED LIST: Long snapper **Morgan Cox** is in his 15th NFL season, and since entering the league, he has appeared in 231 total games with the Titans (2021 to present) and Baltimore Ravens (2010 to 2020). He has not missed a game since joining the Titans.

The Memphis native was the primary long snapper for the University of Tennessee from 2007 to 2009, appearing in 39 games for the Volunteers. He then began his NFL career as a rookie free agent with the Ravens in 2010.

With his next game, Cox will tie former defensive end **Reggie White** for fourth place in NFL history for games played by a University of Tennessee product. White totaled 232 games during his Pro Football Hall of Fame career with the Philadelphia Eagles (1985–1992), Green Bay Packers (1993–1998) and Carolina Panthers (2000).

In addition to White, the only Volunteers with more NFL game appearances than Cox are tight end **Jason Witten** (271 NFL games), quarterback **Peyton Manning** (266) and punter **Dustin Colquitt** (255).
