## TITANS-RAIDERS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

TITANS 4-0 UNDER VRABEL FOLLOWING MONDAY NIGHT GAMES: The Titans enter this week's matchup with the Las Vegas Raiders on a short week following their Monday night game at Buffalo. It will be the fifth time under head coach **Mike Vrabel** they have played a Sunday game after appearing on Monday Night Football, and in the previous four instances, they are 4-0.

Since Vrabel was hired as head coach in 2018, the Titans are one of seven teams that have not lost following a Monday night game, along with the Baltimore Ravens (5-0), New England Patriots (4-0), Green Bay Packers (3-0), Indianapolis Colts (2-0), Houston Texans (2-0) and Los Angeles Chargers (1-0). Only the Titans, Ravens and Patriots have an unblemished mark with at least four such games under their belts.

In all games on short rest, defined as anything less than the "normal" six days between games (e.g., Sunday-to-Sunday games), the Titans are 8-2 in 10 opportunities under Vrabel.

HENRY NEARS 7,000 RUSHING YARDS, 70 TOUCHDOWNS: Titans running back Derrick Henry socred his 69th career touchdown last week at Buffalo on a two-yard run in the first quarter. He now has 66 rushing touchdowns to go along with three touchdown catches since he was selected by the Titans in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

With one more touchdown, Henry will become the third Titans/Oilers player to reach the end zone 70 times with the franchise. **Eddie George** holds the team record with 74 touchdowns (64 rushing, 10 receiving), and **Earl Campbell** had 73 total touchdowns with the organization (73 rushing).

Additionally, Henry's career rushing total is now at 6,904 yards—96 yards from making him the fourth player in franchise history to reach 7,000. The group currently consists of George (10,009), Campbell (8,574) and **Chris Johnson** (7,965).

Henry has a chance to do something only Campbell has done with the organization—reach 70 total touchdowns and 7,000 rushing yards within his first seven NFL seasons. He would become the 16th NFL player to do so and the first since **Adrian Peterson** in 2013. Henry is on the verge of reaching the feat despite starting only two games in each of his first two campaigns. He did not become the club's full-time starter at running back until 2018.

**BYARD SET TO APPEAR IN 100TH GAME:** This week against the Raiders, Titans safety **Kevin Byard** is scheduled to appear in his 100th regular-season game for the team since he was selected in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft. He has not missed a game during his career and has

Byard enters the week with 23 career interceptions through 99 games. Among all Oilers/Titans players since 1970, he is tied for the third-highest interception total in a player's first 100 NFL games. He has matched former cornerbacks **Samari Rolle** and **Darryll Lewis** and sits behind only cornerback **Cris Dishman** (26 interceptions through 100 games) and safety **Mike Reinfeldt** (25).

started each of the past 90 contests.

McCREARY TALLIES 11 TACKLES: Titans second-round pick Roger McCreary has started each of the team's first two games at cornerback, and in Week 2 at Buffalo, he led the team with 11 total tackles. All 11 of his tackles were awarded as solo stops.

McCreary's 11 tackles at Buffalo tied for the most by any NFL rookie this season through two weeks, matching Jaguars linebacker **Devin Lloyd's** 11 stops at Washington in Week 1.

Since the beginning of the 2000 season, McCreary tied for the second-highest tackle total in a game by a Titans defensive back, according to press box statistics. Cornerback **Alterraun Verner** established the benchmark during that span with 12 tackles against Indianapolis on Dec. 9, 2010.

**BIG START FOR STONEHOUSE:** In his first two NFL games, Titans punter **Ryan Stonehouse** became the 13th player in NFL history and the first player in franchise history to record back-to-back games with a gross punting average of 55.0 yards or more (minimum of two punts each game). The undrafted rookie from Colorado State debuted in Week 1 against the Giants with a 57.0-yard average, and last week at Buffalo, he averaged 55.5 yards per punt. In each game he had six attempts.

With another average this week of at least 55.0 yards, Stonehouse will become the first punter in NFL history to average at least 55.0 yards per punt in three consecutive games.

Prior to Stonehouse, Raiders punter **A.J. Cole** was the most recent player to record two consecutive games with a 55.0-yard average on at least two punts, having done so Oct. 10, 2021 against Chicago (56.0) and Oct. 17, 2021 at Denver (57.0). Washington's **Tress Way** is the only previous rookie to accomplish the feat.
