## TITANS-JAGUARS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

**POLLARD HITS 1,000 SCRIMMAGE YARDS IN 12 GAMES:** In last week's game at Washington, Titans running back **Tony Pollard** went over the 1,000-yard scrimmage mark, continuing his successful first season in Tennessee. It is the fourth consecutive season in which Pollard has reached 1,000 scrimmage yards after doing so in his final three campaigns with the Dallas Cowboys. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent during the offseason.

Pollard, whose 2024 totals include a team-high 835 rushing yards and an additional 211 receiving yards, is averaging 87.2 scrimmage yards per game. That is the highest average of his career, surpassing the 86.1 scrimmage yards per game he averaged with the Cowboys in 2022. His current pace projects to a career-high 1,481 scrimmage yards.

Pollard became the sixth player in franchise history to record 1,000 scrimmage yards in the first 12 games after joining the team. He was added to a list that includes wide receiver, **Bill Groman** (1,222 scrimmage yards in 1960) and four running backs: **Earl Campbell** (1,308 in 1978), **Eddie George** (1,124 in 1996), **Chris Johnson** (1,185 in 2008) and **DeMarco Murray** (1,352 in 2016).

**WESTBROOK-IKHINE CONTINUES HOT STREAK:** Last week at Washington, Titans wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** caught three passes for 61 yards and tied his career high with a pair of touchdowns. He reached the end zone on catches of 27 yards and 17 yards.

Westbrook-Ikhine improved his season totals to 20 receptions, 365 receiving yards and eight touchdowns. He has scored touchdowns on 40.0 percent of his catches.

Among the 9,040 players with 20 or more receptions in a season since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger, Westbrook-Ikhine's touchdown rate of 40.0 percent is tied for first. His current numbers match those of former Kansas City Chiefs wide receiver **Marc Boerigter**, who finished the 2002 campaign with eight touchdowns on 20 total receptions.

All eight of Westbrook-Ikhine's touchdowns in 2024 have come in the past eight games. If he adds a touchdown reception this week against Jacksonville, he would become the franchise's third player since 1970 to record at least nine touchdown catches in a nine-game span within a season. He would join **Drew Bennett** (2004) and **Drew Hill** (1988) in doing so.

**FOLK APPROACHES 30TH GAME WITH TITANS:** Titans kicker **Nick Folk** was acquired in a trade with the New England Patriots prior to the 2023 season. He is in his 17th NFL campaign, and last week, he passed **Mason Crosby** (400) for 14th place in NFL history with his 401st career field goal.

This Sunday at Nissan Stadium, Folk is expected to appear in his 30th contest as a member the Titans. In his first 29 games with the club, he made 48 of his 50 field goal attempts. At his current rate of 96.0 percent, he would become the NFL's leader since 1970 in field goal percentage in a player's first 30 games with a team (minimum 30 games and 30 attempts). He would exceed the mark established by **Robbie Gould**, who made 95.8 percent of his attempts (68 of 71) in his first 30 contests with the San Francisco 49ers.

Within the same list, Folk already ranks 10th due to his 90.3 percent accuracy in his first 30 games with the New England Patriots (56 of 62).

The highest percentage on field goals in a player's first 30 games with the Titans/Oilers is held by **Ryan Succop**, who made 86.5 percent of his attempts (32 of 37) at the beginning of his tenure in Tennessee from 2014 to 2015.

**WORLEY MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT:** Less than a month after joining the team, defensive back **Daryl Worley** recorded his second start at safety for the Titans last week at Washington. In starts at Houston and Washington, he was on the field for a combined 127 of the defense's 131 snaps, including 76 of 77 snaps against the Commanders. His 76 defensive snaps tied his career high (Sept. 24, 2023 vs. Indianapolis).

Worley led the defense and set a career high with 17 tackles at Washington. His previous high of 12 tackles in a game was as a rookie in 2016 with the Carolina Panthers (Nov. 27, 2016 at Oakland).

Worley joined three other NFL players in 2024—and became the first defensive back this season—to be credited with 17 or more tackles in a game, along with Indianapolis Colts linebacker **Grant Stuard** (18 vs. Miami, Oct. 20), Baltimore Ravens linebacker **Roquan Smith** (18 at Tampa Bay, Oct. 21) and New York Jets linebacker **Jamien Sherwood** (17 at Arizona, Nov. 10).
