CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• After making the Jets roster as an undrafted rookie in 2022, Adams became a regular starter in his second year, logging 15 starts at safety in 2023. He was one of six safeties with at least 80 tackles, three interceptions and five quarterback pressures during that season.

PRO: The Titans signed Tony Adams during the 2026 free agency period to add experience and physicality to the secondary. The 5-foot-11-inch, 210-pound safety saw action in 53 games with 36 starts in his first four NFL seasons while playing for the New York Jets. The Illinois product is a sure tackler in space and an elite communicator in the defensive backfield. Prior to his arrival with the Titans, Adams posted 227 tackles, 11 tackles for loss, two sacks, 16 passes defended, four interceptions, 12 quarterback pressures, and five tackles on special teams.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Adams credits his mother for helping him develop a strong work ethic and mindset. "For my mother, ambition, hard work, and if you really want something – you have to go and get it," said Adams. "I see my mother work really hard. I'd seen her work late nights, sometimes overnight, and she'd always tell me if you want something in this world – you have to go get it."
- Adams' favorite game from his college career was a win over Wisconsin in Illinois' homecoming in 2019. Adams' interception late in the fourth quarter set up the Fighting Illini's final drive to take the lead. A game-winning field goal on the ensuing possession as time expired gave Illinois the 24-23 victory over the sixth-ranked Badgers, the school's first win over a ranked opponent since 2011.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Centreville, Ill., native was signed by the N.Y. Jets as a rookie free agent on May 6, 2022.
- Signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 17, 2026.

SEASON RECAPS:

2026 (2/0 - Tennessee):

- Against N.Y. Jets (9/13), made his Titans debut as a reserve at safety and posted two tackles.
- Against Philadelphia (9/20), played as a reserve on special teams.

2025 (12/9 - N.Y. Jets): Appeared in 12 games with nine starts at safety and logged 48 tackles, three stops for loss, a sack and five passes defended. Was inactive for two contests. Placed on injured reserve on Dec. 18 and missed the final three games of the season.

- Against Dallas (10/5), started at safety and recorded five tackles, a stop for loss and a pass defended.
- Against Cleveland (11/9), led the team with a season-high nine tackles. Added a stop for loss and a pass defended.
- Against Atlanta (11/30), recorded five tackles including a stop for loss. Added his first sack of the season, flying into the pocket to bring down Kirk Cousins for a loss of eight yards on third-and-six.

2024 (15/11 - N.Y. Jets): Played in 15 games with 11 starts at safety. Registered 82 tackles (tying his career-high), two stops for loss, a sack, an interception, five quarterback pressures and a career-best six passes defended. Helped the Jets finish third in total defense (313.8 yards allowed per game). Was one of six safeties to log at least 82 tackles, an interception, a sack, six passes defended and five quarterback pressures. Was inactive for two games.

- At San Francisco (9/9), opened the season by leading the team with a season-high 12 tackles against the 49ers. Sacked Brock Purdy and added a pass defended. He was the only player in the NFL to record 12 tackles, a sack and a pass defended in Week 1 and it marked one of seven such performances during the 2024 season.
- At Tennessee (9/15), notched three tackles and tied a career-high with two passes defended. His second pass breakup was on fourth down in the final

stanza to secure the Jets victory.

- Against L.A. Rams (12/22), nabbed his first interception of the season, picking off a Matthew Stafford pass in the second quarter. Added five tackles.

2023 (15/15 - N.Y. Jets): Started at safety in 15 games while establishing career-highs with 82 tackles, six tackles for loss and three interceptions.

Adams joined Mike Hilton as the only undrafted players with at least five tackles for loss on rush plays in 2023. Was inactive for two contests.

- Against Philadelphia (10/15), intercepted a Jalen Hurts pass and returned it 45 yards to set up the Jets' offense to score the game-winning touchdown. Also credited with seven tackles and a stop for loss.
- At N.Y. Giants (10/29), recorded a season-high 10 tackles, including a stop for loss in the win.
- Against Washington (12/24), nabbed his second interception of the season, picking off a deflected pass on the second play of the game from scrimmage. He also made five tackles in the Jets' victory.
- At New England (1/7), recorded a season-high two passes defended, including his third interception of the year to mark a career-high for a season. Added two tackles.

2022 (11/1 - N.Y. Jets): Saw action in 11 games as a rookie after making the 53-man roster as an undrafted free agent. Made his NFL debut against Baltimore (9/11) and made his first start at Miami (1/8). Also contributed heavily on special teams. Registered 15 tackles and two special teams tackles. Was inactive for six contests.

- Against Baltimore (9/11), made his NFL debut, playing primarily as a reserve on special teams.
- At Miami (1/8), logged his first career start and registered six tackles.

COLLEGE:

- Played in 41 games with 36 starts in five seasons at Illinois (2017-21) and collected 204 tackles, 11 stops for loss, three sacks, 11 passes defended and six interceptions. Began his career as a cornerback before logging starts at safety and as a hybrid defensive back as an upperclassman.
- As a graduate (2021), started 11 of the 12 games he appeared in and ranked third on the team with 63 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, a sack, five passes defended and an interception.
- As a senior (2020), started all six games he played and totaled 51 tackles and a pass defended.
- As a junior (2019), started 10 games and logged 39 tackles, three stops for loss and two interceptions. Against No. 6 Wisconsin, nabbed an interception with 2:32 left to set up the game-winning field goal as time expired. It was Illinois' first win over a ranked opponent since 2011.
- As a sophomore (2018), recorded seven starts (five at safety, two at cornerback) in eight games played. Finished with 43 tackles, 3.5 stops for loss, a sack, four pass breakups and an interception. Also notched a pick-six at Purdue for his first career touchdown. Named Academic All-Big Ten.
- As a freshman (2017), played in five games with two starts at cornerback and recorded eight tackles, a stop for loss, a sack and an interception.
- Graduated from Illinois with a bachelor's degree in political science in Dec. 2020.

PERSONAL:

- Attended St. Louis University (Mo.) High School and was a three-star recruit according to 247Sports, Rivals, ESPN and Scout.
- Played wide receiver and defensive back for coach Gary Kornfeld and was ranked the No. 6 overall recruit in the state of Missouri.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• Ayomanor became the sixth rookie in franchise history to reach 40 receptions, 500 receiving yards and four receiving touchdowns, joining Bill Groman (1960), Charlie Hennigan (1960), Jerry LeVias (1969), Kendall Wright (2012) and A.J. Brown (2019).

PRO: The Titans traded up in the fourth round of the 2025 NFL Draft to select wide receiver Elic Ayomanor. The 6-foot-2-inch, 206-pounder is a fast, physical receiver that possesses a large catch radius. The Medicine Hat, Alberta, Canada, native played two seasons (2023-2024) at Stanford where he led the Cardinal in receptions and receiving yards both campaigns with totals of 125 receptions for 1,844 yards with 12 touchdowns. As a rookie, Ayomanor started in 14 games and recorded 41 receptions for 515 yards with four touchdowns.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Ayomanor was born in Medicine Hat, Alberta, Canada. He lived in Kincaid, a town of less than 200 people.
- Ayomanor was a computer science major at Stanford. He interned as an analyst at Altamont Capital Partners private equity firm following his sophomore year.
- Ayomanor was forced to grow up fast in high school. After his freshman season in Canada, he moved away from home to attend boarding school in New Jersey and then Massachusetts. "It wasn't so much adversity as much a great opportunity that taught me a lot about living."
- Ayomanor's mother, Pam Weiterman, gained a reputation as an arm wrestler. She grew up on a farm, where arm wrestling was a big tradition, and she excelled at it.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Medicine Hat, Alberta, Canada, native was selected by the Titans in the fourth round (136th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft.

SEASON RECAPS:

2026 (2/1): Has led the team in receiving yards once in 2026 (vs. PHI).
• Against N.Y. Jets (9/13), played as a reserve at wide receiver and snared an 11-yard touchdown reception. Got open in the end zone and hauled in an 11-yard score late in the fourth quarter.
• Against Philadelphia (9/20), started at wide receiver and led the team with 69 receiving yards on two catches. Extended the Titans' scoring drive late in the first half with a 28-yard grab on third-and-13. Snared a career-log 41-yard catch and hurdled an Eagles defender during the Titans' scoring drive late in the final stanza.

2025 (16/14): Played in 16 games with 14 starts at wide receiver as a rookie and tied for the team lead with four receiving touchdowns. Ranked second on the squad with 515 receiving yards and fifth on the team with 41 receptions. Was inactive for one contest. Tied for the team lead in receptions three times in 2025 (vs. LAR, vs. LAC, vs. NO). Led the team in receiving yards four times in 2025 (at HST, vs. LAC, vs. KC, at JAX). Made his NFL debut and first career NFL start at Denver (9/7).

- Ayomanor played two seasons at Stanford and amassed 125 receptions for 1,844 yards with 12 touchdowns. He led the Cardinal in receptions and receiving yards in both campaigns and set the program record for receiving yards in a game (294) at Colorado as a redshirt freshman in 2023.
- As a sophomore (2024), started all 12 games and was named second team All-ACC from the coaches after leading all Stanford receivers with 63 receptions for 831 yards. CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2025, Barton tied for second on the Titans with 81 tackles, while posting career-highs with 11 passes defended and three interceptions, including one he returned for a score.
- In Week 7 of 2024, at New Orleans on Thursday Night Football, Barton earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after an eight-tackle performance that included a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Barton notched his first NFL score by returning a strip sack 52 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter of a 33-10 primetime victory.
- While with the Seahawks in 2020, Barton's 16 tackles on special teams ranked first in the NFC and second in the NFL.

PRO: The Titans signed Cody Barton during the 2025 offseason to upgrade the inside linebacker position and add to the veteran leadership on defense. The 6-foot-2-inch, 237-pounder was selected in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Seattle Seahawks. Barton started all 17 games in his first season with the Titans and led the team with 11 passes defended and three interceptions, including one he returned for a score. Prior to his arrival in Tennessee, the University of Utah product recorded 419 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, five interceptions, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in six pro seasons with the Seahawks, the Washington Commanders and Denver Broncos.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Barton comes from a family of University of Utah athletes. His mother, Mikki, played basketball and volleyball for the school and is a member of the Utes Hall of Fame. His father, Paul, was also a two-sport Utah athlete, playing football and baseball. Barton was college teammates with his older brother, Jackson, who played offensive line from 2015-18. His sister Dani played Utah volleyball as well. The youngest Barton, Lander, played linebacker at Utah and was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Los Angeles Chargers this offseason.
- The Barton family also owns a 300-acre ranch in Duchesne, Utah, about 90 miles southeast of Park City where Cody and his siblings grew up. At the Barton ranch, the family tends cows, horses and other animals. Cody returns to the ranch in his time away from football and enjoys horseback riding, fishing and hunting in his native Utah

PRO: The Titans selected Fernando Carmona Jr. in the fifth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-5-inch, 316-pounder is an athletic, versatile offensive lineman with a strong competitive nature. The Las Vegas, Nev., native spent three seasons (2021-23) at San Jose State before transferring to Arkansas for his final two collegiate seasons. Carmona finished his college career with 49 consecutive starts.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

PRO: The Titans signed John Franklin-Myers early in the 2026 free agency period to add physicality and aggression to the defensive front. The 6-foot-4-inch, 288-pound defensive lineman prides himself on violence and wreaking havoc among opponents' offensive trenches. Franklin-Myers was originally selected by the L.A. Rams in the fourth round of the 2018 NFL Draft and spent his rookie NFL campaign with the club. He was claimed off waivers by the N.Y. Jets in 2019 and spent the next five seasons with the organization. The Stephen F. Austin product joined the Denver Broncos via trade in 2024 and played two seasons with the team. Prior to his arrival in Tennessee, he appeared in 114 games with 83 starts and amassed 200 tackles, 34 sacks, 251 quarterback pressures, an interception, seven passes defended, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Franklin-Myers is familiar with the middle Tennessee area. His future in-laws live in Charlotte, Tenn., located just north of Dickson, about 40 miles west of Nashville. The family happened to buy five acres of land there not too long ago, and Franklin-Myers visited often with his fiancée – after first making stops at Prince's Hot Chicken, of course.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- During the 2025 season, Gray led the team and ranked fifth in the NFL with 160 tackles, tying for the second-most tackles by a Titans defender since 2000 (GSIS tackle statistics). He tallied three games with 16 or more tackles, becoming the first Titans player to have multiple games in a season with at least 16 tackles.
- Gray had a standout performance at Indianapolis during his rookie season. With 11 tackles on defense and four stops on special teams, he became the second player since 2000 with at least 10 tackles on defense and at least four tackles on special teams in the same game.

PRO: The Titans selected Cedric Gray in the fourth round of the 2024 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-2-inch, 240-pounder brings a versatile skill set as a defender and is a sideline-to-sideline talent with speed and athleticism. The Charlotte, N.C., native took on the starting linebacker role during his sophomore campaign and started 16 games while tallying 160 tackles after playing in only seven games as a rookie. At North Carolina, Gray was a two-time All-ACC selection and recorded 369 tackles, 30 stops for loss, 8.5 sacks and five interceptions in 51 games with the Tar Heels.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Gray originally envisioned himself as a wide receiver prior to attending North Carolina, but he went from playing with Drake Maye in youth 7-on-7 camps to practicing against him in college. When he arrived on the Chapel Hill campus from Ardrey Kell High School, he exchanged his 11 jersey number he wore throughout his life — an ode to his favorite player Julio Jones — for No. 33.
- Gray has two older brothers, Devon and Michael Jr., who were “definitely hard on me, definitely rough on me, put a chip on my shoulder, made me tougher. So, I’m appreciative of them, and they definitely attributed to helping to make me who I am.”

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Charlotte, N.C., native was selected by the Titans in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft.

2026 (1/0 - Tennessee):

- Against N.Y. Jets (9/13), was inactive.
- Against Philadelphia (9/20), made his season debut as a reserve at linebacker and compiled four tackles with a stop for loss. Stonewalled Tank Bigsby for a two-yard loss on a short pass in the first quarter.

2025 (16/16): Started 16 games at linebacker. Led the team and ranked fifth in the NFL with 160 tackles, tying for the second-most tackles by a Titans defender since 2000 (GSIS tackle statistics). Added 15 quarterback pressures, seven tackles for loss, a sack, four passes defended and a fumble recovery. Collected four special teams stops and a fumble recovery on coverage units. Posted double-digit tackles in nine games in 2025. Was inactive for one contest. Led or tied for the team lead in tackles 12 times in 2025 (at HST, at ARZ, at LV, vs. NE, at IND, vs. LAC, vs. HST, vs. JAX, at CLE, at SF, vs. NO, at JAX). Led the team in passes defended once in 2025 (at LV). Tied for the team lead in special teams tackles twice in 2025 (vs. LAR, at LV).

- At Denver (9/7), made his first career NFL start at linebacker and tallied seven tackles with a quarterback pressure. Collected a special teams stop on coverage units.
- At Houston (9/28), started at linebacker and led the team with a career-best 17 tackles with a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure.
- At Las Vegas (10/12), started at linebacker and led the team with 11 tackles and a career-best two passes defended. Added a special teams tackle on coverage units. Defended a pass intended for Alex Cappa in the end zone in the second stanza.
- Against L.A. Chargers (11/2), started at linebacker and led the team with 16 tackles, including a sack and a quarterback pressure. Became the first Titans player to have multiple games in a season with at least 16 tackles. Dropped Justin Herbert for a seven-yard sack in the fourth quarter, marking his first career sack.
- At Cleveland (12/7), started at linebacker and led the team with 10 tackles to go along with two quarterback pressures and a fumble recovery.

Recovered a Dylan Sampson fumble that was forced by Marcus Harris and returned it 19 yards to the Browns’ eight-yard line which set up a Titans’ touchdown in the fourth quarter. Recovered a loose ball during the Browns’ initial two-point conversion attempt in the fourth quarter.

- At San Francisco (12/14), started at linebacker and led the team with 16 tackles with two quarterback pressures before leaving the game in the fourth quarter with an injury. His 11 tackles in the first half were the most by a Titans defender since at least the 2000 season (GSIS tackle statistics).
- At Jacksonville (1/4), started at linebacker and led the team with eight tackles to go along with a quarterback pressure. Logged his 12th game of the season with at least eight tackles.

2024 (7/0): Appeared as a reserve in seven games as a rookie and notched 14 tackles. Ranked third on the squad with eight special teams tackles. Was inactive for three contests. Led the team in tackles once in 2024 (at IND). Led or tied for the team lead in special teams tackles twice in 2024 (at IND, vs. HST). Placed on injured reserve on Aug. 29 and missed the first seven games of the season before being designated to return on Oct. 28. Made his NFL debut at Houston (11/24/24).

- At Houston (11/24), saw action as a reserve on special teams in his first career NFL contest and notched a special teams tackle on coverage units.
- At Indianapolis (12/22), played as a reserve at linebacker and led the team with a career-best 11 tackles. Registered a team-best four special teams tackles on coverage units. Became the NFL’s second player since the start of the 2000 season with at least 10 tackles on defense and at least four tackles on special teams in the same game. Combined with Jarvis Brownlee Jr. to stop Jonathan Taylor for no gain on a rush up the middle in the second quarter. Teamed with Daryl Worley to stuff Taylor for no gain on a carry up the middle in the third stanza.

COLLEGE:

- Played in 51 games with 37 starts over four seasons at North Carolina and recorded 369 tackles, 30 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks, five interceptions, 13 passes defended, six forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries. Was a two-time first team All-ACC selection and a 2023 Butkus Award semifinalist.
- As a senior (2023), started all 12 games he appeared in and posted a team-best 121 tackles, five sacks, 11 stops for loss, seven quarterback pressures, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and four passes defended. Named first-team All-ACC by the league and the Associated Press. Recorded five double-digit tackle games and ranked second in the ACC with 121 tackles.
- As a junior (2022), started all 14 games at linebacker and tallied a team-best 145 tackles, a sack, 12 stops for loss, two interceptions, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Pollard and Derrick Henry are the NFL's only running backs to rush for 1,000 yards every season from 2022 to 2025.
- In 2025, Pollard led the Titans with a career-best 1,082 rushing yards to go along with five rushing scores.
- In 2024, Pollard started 16 games and ranked third in the AFC with 1,079 rushing yards on a career-high 260 carries.
- In 2023, Pollard started all 17 games for the first time in his career and led the Cowboys with 1,005 rushing yards on a career-high 252 carries with six touchdowns.
- In 2022, Pollard was selected to his first career Pro Bowl after rushing 193 times for 1,007 yards and nine scores, while averaging 5.2 yards-per-carry to rank third in the NFL.
- Pollard had a memorable 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against the Las Vegas Raiders on Thanksgiving Day in 2021.

PRO: The Titans signed Tony Pollard early in the 2024 offseason to add experience and a playmaking threat to the offensive backfield. The 6-foot, 209-pounder entered the NFL as a fourth-round pick of the Dallas Cowboys in 2019. The Memphis product served primarily as a backup during his first three seasons with the Cowboys before enjoying a breakout 2022 campaign with 1,007 rushing yards and 12 total touchdowns which led to his first career Pro Bowl nod. Dallas used the franchise tag on Pollard heading into the 2023 season, and he responded with 1,005 yards on the ground and six scores. In his two seasons with the Titans, Pollard registered back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Pollard's family owns Pollard's Bar-B-Q restaurant in his hometown of Memphis. Starting from humble beginnings, Pollard's was first established as a mobile catering business in 1995. As the demand for their unique southern style of Memphis BBQ grew, Pollard's reopened in the fall of 1996 as a small carry-out catering business. In 2011, Pollard's answered the overwhelming demands of its growing customer base by becoming a dine-in restaurant. With the new expansion came bigger and better things, such as an expanded menu and an upscale renovation by Food Network's Robert Irvine from Restaurant Impossible.
- Pollard was a dynamic kickoff returner at the collegiate level, tying a FBS record with seven career kickoff returns for touchdowns during his Memphis career.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Memphis, Tenn., native was selected by the Dallas Cowboys in the fourth round (128th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft.
- Designated by the Cowboys as the non-exclusive franchise player on March 6, 2023 and signed the franchise tag tender on March 23, 2023.
- Signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 14, 2024.

SEASON RECAPS:

2026 (2/2 - Tennessee): Has 13 career 100-yard rushing games. Has led the team in rushing yards twice in 2026 (vs. NYJ, vs. PHI).

- Against N.Y. Jets (9/13), started at running back and led the team with 35 rushing yards on seven carries. Snared one reception out of the backfield.
- Against Philadelphia (9/20), started at running back and led the team with 64 rushing yards on 14 carries. Added a reception out of the backfield.

2025 (17/17 - Tennessee): Started all 17 games at running back. Led the team with a career-best 1,082 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns. Grabbed 33 receptions for 206 yards. Led the offense with 1,288 scrimmage yards. It was his fourth consecutive campaign to reach 1,200 scrimmage yards. Became the fourth player in Titans/Oilers history to rush for 1,000 yards in each of his first two seasons with the club, joining Earl Campbell (1978-81), Eddie George (1996-00) and Chris Johnson (2008-13). With 1,082 rushing yards in 2025, he recorded his fourth consecutive 1,000-yard season. Pollard and Derrick Henry are the NFL's only running backs to rush for 1,000 yards every season from 2022 to 2025. Posted a career-high 161 rushing yards at Cleveland (12/7/25). Led the team in rushing yards 13 times in 2025 (at DEN, vs. LAR, vs. IND, at HST, at ARZ, at LV, vs. LAC, vs. JAX, at CLE, at SF, vs. KC, vs. NO, at JAX). Led the team in receptions twice in

2025 (at HST, vs. NE). Led the team in receiving yards once in 2025 (at DEN). Selected as a team captain by his teammates.

- Against L.A. Rams (9/14), led the team with 92 rushing yards on 20 carries.
- At Arizona (10/5), started at running back in his 100th career regular season game and rushed 14 times for 67 yards with a touchdown. Registered the 30th rushing touchdown of his career. In the third quarter, reached the 5,000-yard career rushing mark. Snared three receptions for 11 yards. Cut the Cardinals' lead to 21-12 with a one-yard touchdown plunge in the fourth quarter. Set up Joey Slye's game-winning field goal with an 11-yard run down to the Cardinals' four-yard line late in the fourth quarter.
- At Cleveland (12/7), led the team with a career-high 161 rushing yards on 25 carries with two touchdowns. Increased the Titans' lead to 14-3 with a 65-yard touchdown run late in the opening quarter. Gave the Titans a 21-17 advantage with a 32-yard touchdown run off left tackle late in the third quarter.
- At San Francisco (12/14), led the team with 104 rushing yards on 14 carries with a touchdown. After the previous week's 161 rushing yards, he produced back-to-back 100-yard rushing performances for the second time in his career. Set up the Titans' opening field goal with a 22-yard scamper down to the 49ers' 16-yard line in the first quarter. Cut the 49ers' lead to 34-24 with a six-yard touchdown run in the final stanza.
- Against Kansas City (12/21), led the team with 102 rushing yards on 21 carries. It marked the first time in his career with 100 rushing yards in three consecutive games.
- Against New Orleans (12/28), carried the ball 18 times for 85 yards. Hauled in two receptions for 10 yards. On a 25-yard run in the third quarter, he reached the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the fourth consecutive season.

2024 (16/16 - Tennessee): Started 16 games at running back in his first season with the Titans and ranked third in the AFC with a career-best 1,079 rushing yards on 260 carries. Led the squad with five rushing touchdowns and 1,317 scrimmage yards. Ranked third on the team with 41 receptions for 238 yards. Registered his fourth consecutive season with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards. Was inactive for one contest. Has 10 career 100-yard rushing games, including three in 2024 (vs. NE, at HST, vs. JAX). Led the team in rushing yards 14 times in 2024 (at CHI, vs. NYJ, vs. GB, at MIA, vs. IND, at BUF, at DET, vs. NE, at HST, at WAS, vs. JAX, vs. CIN, at IND, vs. HST). Led or tied for the team lead in receptions three times in 2024 (vs. NYJ, at MIA, at WAS).

- At Chicago (9/8), made his Titans debut as the starter at running back and led the team with 82 rushing yards on 16 carries with a touchdown. Snared three receptions for 12 yards out of the backfield. Gave the Titans an early 7-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown jaunt off left guard late in the first quarter.
- Against N.Y. Jets (9/15), carried the ball 17 times for a team-high 62 yards. Led the team with five receptions for 40 yards.
- At Miami (9/30), led the team with 88 rushing yards on 22 carries with a touchdown. Tied for the team lead with two receptions for 20 yards. Registered his 18th career game with at least 100 scrimmage yards. Setup the Titans' first touchdown with a 41-yard jaunt off left tackle to the Dolphins' seven-yard line in the third quarter. Sealed the victory with a four-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-goal late in the final stanza.



- Against Indianapolis (10/13), rushed 17 times for a team-high 93 yards with a touchdown. Snared three receptions out of the backfield. Gave the Titans a 17-10 advantage with a 23-yard touchdown scamper on third-and-19 in the third stanza.
- At Buffalo (10/20), led the team with 61 rushing yards on 16 carries and in the process reached 4,000 rushing yards for his career.
- At Detroit (10/27), led the team with 94 rushing yards on 20 carries. Caught three passes for 23 yards.
- Against New England (11/3), rushed a career-high 28 times for a season-best 128 yards. Hauled in three receptions for 26 yards. His 154 scrimmage yards were the second-best scrimmage yard total of his career. Set up the Titans' opening touchdown with a 32-yard rumble down to the Patriots' nine-yard line in the first quarter. Extended the Titans' game-winning drive with a nine-yard run up the middle on third-and-three in overtime.
- At Houston (11/24), started at running back and led the team with 119 rushing yards on 24 carries with a touchdown. Hauled in three passes for 10 yards out of the backfield. Increased the Titans lead to 17-7 with a 10-yard touchdown jaunt in the second quarter.
- Against Jacksonville (12/8), carried the ball 21 times for 102 yards. Grabbed two receptions for 22 yards out of the backfield.

2023 (17/17, 1/1 - Dallas): Started all 17 games for the first time in his career and led the team with 1,005 rushing yards on a career-high 252 carries with six touchdowns. Also finished third on the offense with a career-best 55 receptions for 311 yards (fifth). Combined with his 1,007 rushing yards in 2022, became the sixth running back in team history to have consecutive 1,000-yard seasons, joining Calvin Hill, Tony Dorsett, Emmitt Smith, DeMarco Murray and Ezekiel Elliott. Started the postseason contest and carried the ball 15 times for 56 yards to go along with seven receptions for 29 yards.

- At N.Y. Giants (9/10), rushed for 70 yards on 14 carries and totaled two touchdowns on the ground, his fourth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- Against N.Y. Jets (9/17), tallied a career-high 25 carries for 72 yards and caught seven passes for 37 yards for a career-high 32 total touches.
- At Arizona (9/24), carried the ball 23 times for a season-best 122 yards (5.3 avg.) - third-most rushing yards in a game of his career. It also marked his seventh career 100-yard rushing game and his first since he had 115 yards at Green Bay (11/13/22).
- At L.A. Chargers (10/16), finished with 110 scrimmage yards (30 rushing; 80 receiving), his third game of the season - 15th of his career - with 100-plus scrimmage yards. Had a 60-yard reception - second-longest catch of his career.
- Against Washington (11/23), recorded 13 carries for 79 yards and a touchdown while catching six passes for 24 yards, his fourth game with 100 scrimmage yards in 2023 and 16th of his career.
- Against Seattle (11/30), notched 20 carries for 68 yards and a touchdown. Marked his third consecutive game with a rushing touchdown, a career-long touchdown streak.
- At Washington (1/7), recorded 17 carries for 70 yards and a score, adding two catches for 16 yards. Eclipsed 1,000 rushing yards on the season (1,005) to become the sixth running back in team history to have consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.
- Against Green Bay (1/14), made his first career postseason start in the Wild Card Playoff Game and rushed 15 times for 56 yards and a touchdown while catching seven passes for 29 yards. His seven receptions tied for the second-most by a running back in a postseason game in team history.

2022 (16/4, 2/0 - Dallas): Earned his first Pro Bowl nod after seeing action in 16 games with four starts at running back. Set the tone for the Dallas rushing attack, toting the rock 193 times for 1,007 yards - his first career 1,000-yard season - and nine scores, averaging 5.2 yards-per-carry to rank third in the NFL. Also caught a then career-high tying 39 passes for a career-best 371 yards and three scores. Combining his rushing and receiving average, he led the NFL with 5.94 yards-per-touch. Was inactive for one contest. Appeared as a reserve in both postseason games and amassed 21 carries for 99 yards while adding five catches for 23 yards.

- At N.Y. Giants (9/26), led the team with 105 yards on 13 carries.
- At L.A. Rams (10/9), provided 86 yards on eight carries with a 57-yard rushing score - the second-longest rushing score of his career.
- Against Chicago (10/30), carried the ball 14 times for 131 yards and a career-best three rushing scores - the first Cowboy with three rushing scores since Dak Prescott had three at Atlanta (9/20/20).
- At Green Bay (11/13), toted the rock a then career-high 22 times for 115 yards and a score, topping 3,000 career scrimmage yards in the process.
- At Minnesota (11/20), finished with a career-high 189 scrimmage yards (109 receiving; 80 rushing) and two receiving scores. Became the fourth NFL player since 1990 with at least 75 rushing yards, 100 receiving yards and two touchdowns in a game, joining Joey Galloway, Todd Gurley and LaDainian Tomlinson.

- At Jacksonville (12/14), led the offense with 19 carries for 75 yards and caught four passes for 31 yards - his seventh game with 100 scrimmage yards.
- At Washington (1/8/23), rushed seven times for 19 yards to surpass 1,000 yards on the ground for the first time in his career.
- At Tampa Bay (1/26), led all rushers with 77 yards on 15 carries in the Wild Card Game.

2021 (15/0, 1/0 - Dallas): Appeared as a reserve in 15 games and rushed for 719 yards and two touchdowns on 130 carries. Caught 39 passes for 337 yards. Also recorded 17 kick returns for 481 yards with a touchdown while tying for second on the team with five special teams tackles. Was inactive for two contests. Saw action in his first career playoff contest and rushed four times for 14 yards and added two receptions for 12 yards.

- At L.A. Chargers (9/19), collected 109 yards and a score on 13 carries and caught three balls for 31 yards in the win.
- Against N.Y. Giants (10/10), produced 14 carries for 75 yards as he teamed with Ezekiel Elliott to give Dallas 200 total rushing yards for the second consecutive game.
- Against Las Vegas (11/25), posted his first career kick return for a touchdown, taking a return back 100 yards. Finished the Thanksgiving Day game with three returns for 129 yards, 10 rushes for 36 yards, four receptions for 32 yards and two special teams tackles.
- At New Orleans (12/2), had a career-long 58-yard scoring jaunt, finishing with 71 yards on seven carries, catching two passes for three yards and returning one kick for 22 yards.
- At N.Y. Giants (12/19), led the team with 74 yards on 12 rushes and caught three passes for 13 yards.
- Against Arizona (1/2), produced nine rushing yards and 49 receiving yards, topping 1,000 scrimmage yards for the season - his first career 1,000-scrimmage yard campaign.

- Against Atlanta (9/20), logged his first career start as Dallas opened the game with two running backs. Topped 100 kickoff return yards for the first time in his career.
- At Washington (10/15), notched a season-long kickoff return of 67 yards.
- At Philadelphia (11/1), rushed seven times for 40 yards, caught two passes for 24 yards and returned three kicks for 49 yards.
- At Minnesota (11/22), rushed five times for 60 yards with a 42-yard touchdown.
- At Baltimore (12/8), posted a season-high 126 kickoff return yards.

2019 (15/0 - Dallas): Saw action as a reserve in 15 games as a rookie and rushed 86 times for 455 yards with two touchdowns. Added 15 catches for 107 yards with a score. Returned 14 kickoffs for 245 yards. Was inactive for one contest.

- Against N.Y. Giants (9/8), made his NFL debut in the opener and had 24 yards on 13 carries.
- Against Miami (9/22), tallied his first career 100-yard outing and touchdown, finishing the game with 103 rushing yards and a score. Teamed with Ezekiel Elliott (125) to mark the fourth time in franchise history the Cowboys had a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game.
- At Detroit (11/17), posted his first career receiving touchdown on a 21-yard pass from Dak Prescott. Along with Ezekiel Elliott's receiving score, it marked the first time since 2001 Dallas had two running backs each with a receiving touchdown.
- Against the L.A. Rams (12/15), collected a season-high 131 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown. Scored on a 44-yard scamper late in the fourth quarter.

COLLEGE:

- In three playing seasons at Memphis (2016-18), Pollard played in 40 games and totaled 139 carries for 973 yards with nine rushing touchdowns and added 1,292 yards on 104 career receptions with nine receiving scores. He was considered one of the best kickoff return specialists in college football, tying a FBS record with seven career kick-return touchdowns, 87 kickoff returns (second in school history), 2,616 kickoff return yards (second in school history), 30.1 kick-return average (school record). He finished his career ranked second in school history with 4,680 all-purpose yards.
- As a junior (2018), saw action in 14 games and set career-bests with 78 rush attempts for 552 yards and six touchdowns, while adding 39 catches for 458 yards and three touchdowns through the air. Returned 27 kickoffs for 667 yards with a touchdown.
- As a sophomore (2017), played in all 13 games and registered 22 kick returns for 881 yards, 30 rushes for 230 yards, 36 receptions for 536 yards and one punt return for two yards. Logged a team-high 1,649 all-purpose yards which was the fourth-most for a season in school history. Led the



nation in kick-return average at 40.0 yards per return and tied for FBS lead with four kick returns for touchdowns. Finished as the team's second-leading receiver with 536 yards on 36 catches and the squad's third-leading rusher with 230 yards.

- As a redshirt freshman (2016), played in all 13 games and made seven starts at running back. Made an immediate impact in his first collegiate season as one of college football's top kick returners. Ranked among FBS leaders in kick return total yards (2nd; 1,068), kick return average (8th; 28.1 ypr), kick return touchdowns (2nd; 2) and total kick returns (6th; 38). Rushed for 159 yards on 31 carries with a score. Ranked third on the squad with 29 catches for 298 yards and two touchdowns.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2024, Ridley led the Titans with 64 receptions and 1,017 receiving yards. He became the sixth player in franchise history to have 1,000 receiving yards in his first season with the franchise and became the ninth player in NFL history to have at least one 1,000-yard receiving season with three different teams.
- In 2023, Ridley started all 17 games for the first time in his career and led the Jaguars with 1,016 receiving yards on 76 catches with a team-best eight receiving scores.

PRO: The Titans signed Calvin Ridley as an unrestricted free agent early in the 2024 offseason. The 6-foot-1-inch, 190-pounder brings a veteran presence to the receiving corps and is considered by many as one of the best route runners in the NFL. The University of Alabama product has a knack for finding the end zone, having scored at least seven receiving touchdowns in four of the seven seasons he has played. Ridley entered the league as the 26th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft and spent his first four seasons with the Atlanta Falcons before being traded to the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2023.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Ridley and his younger brothers spent parts of their childhood growing up in foster homes in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He says that's when football saved his life. The Ridley brothers were moved to SOS Children's Village in Coconut Creek, Fla. — a small complex with 10 houses and around 150 apartments. He used to wake up in the morning and bang on all the doors, rounding up everybody to play football. At that time, he realized if he had football, he'd be alright.
- When he was younger, Ridley played Pop Warner football in the same league as Baltimore Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson, Philadelphia Eagles wide receiver Marquise Brown and former Ravens cornerback Trayvon Mullen, in the Pompano Beach area of Florida just four miles from the high school he would attend.
- Ridley's younger brother, Riley, played college football at Georgia and was drafted by the Chicago Bears in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft.

The 5-foot-8-inch, 185-pound wide receiver is comfortable lining up in multiple spots in the offensive formation and led all wide receivers with 622 receiving yards out of the slot in 2025. Robinson was originally selected by the N.Y. Giants in the second round of the 2022 NFL Draft and spent his first four NFL campaigns with the club. Prior to his arrival in Tennessee, he played in 54 NFL contests and tallied 268 catches for 2,465 yards with nine touchdowns.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2025, for the third consecutive year, Simmons was named the Titans nominee for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award that recognizes a player for outstanding community service, as well as excellence on the field.
- In 2025, Simmons was named an Associated Press first-team All-Pro defensive tackle and selected as a starter in his fourth career Pro Bowl. He led the team with a career-high 11 sacks, a career-best 60 quarterback pressures and a career-high 17 stops for loss.
- Simmons' 11 sacks in 2025 also broke Jurrell Casey's mark (10.5 sacks in 2013) for the most sacks in a season by a Titans defensive tackle in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999 to present).
- In 2022, he earned Pro Bowl and second-team All-Pro honors for the second consecutive campaign, anchoring a unit that ranked first in the NFL in rushing defense (76.9 opponent rushing yards per game). Simmons posted 7.5 sacks and 43 quarterback pressures and added a career-high seven passes defended, which tied for the fourth-best mark among all NFL defensive linemen. Simmons and Arizona's J.J. Watt were the NFL's only players in 2022 with at least seven sacks and seven passes defended.
- In 2021, Simmons was named a team captain for the first time in his career, and he went on to become one of six players on the roster to start all 17 games. He was named to his first career Pro Bowl and added Associated Press second-team All-Pro honors after setting career highs in several categories, including sacks (8.5), tackles (54), quarterback pressures (58), tackles for loss (12) and passes defended (six). Among all defensive tackles in the NFL, his 8.5 sacks ranked sixth.
- In a divisional playoff game against Cincinnati on Jan. 22, 2022, he set a franchise postseason record with three sacks.

PRO: The Titans selected Jeffery Simmons with the 19th overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. In seven NFL seasons, he has been named a team captain the last five years, selected to the Pro Bowl four times (2021, 2022, 2024, 2025), named first team All-Pro (2025) and is a two-time second team All-Pro honoree (2021, 2022). He was rewarded with a multi-year contract extension during the 2023 offseason. The 6-foot-4-inch, 305-pound defensive lineman provides a rare blend of size, power and quickness, making him a disruptive force in the middle of the defense.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- In 2025, Simmons launched the "Sacks for Sports Equity" initiative aimed at eliminating the financial and logistical barriers to sports participation for students in Nashville experiencing housing instability. Simmons pledged a \$980 donation per sack to support the initiative. After recording a career-high 11 sacks, Simmons' foundation, Give Em a Reason, donated a total of \$12,000 which helped provide brand new pads and helmets to a local high school, ensure three middle school baseball teams were fully equipped for the season, and gave dozens of students the gear they needed to participate in sports. One student was even given a gas and food gift card so that they could travel to a state-level track meet they otherwise would have had to forfeit.
- In July 2023, Simmons paid homage to his hometown of Macon, Miss., with his first 'Community Fun Day,' which included local food vendors, games, inflatables and fireworks. He was then honored by city officials with a key to the city. Simmons has continued the tradition each year and in 2025, Jelly Roll made a special appearance to perform at the 'Community Fun Day.'
- In July 2022, the official ribbon cutting was held at the Jeffery B. Simmons Field House at Noxubee County High School in Macon, Miss. Simmons donated more than \$50,000 to upgrade his former high school's athletic facilities. During the same week, he donated \$75,000 to Starkville (Miss.) Parks and Recreation to be used for a new turf field at the Starkville Sportsplex. The field was also named in his honor.
- During college, Simmons was a two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- Simmons' brother, Dylan Bradley, played football at Southern Miss and then spent time with the Minnesota Vikings. His uncle, Jason Hatcher, played 10 total seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and Washington Commanders.
- Away from football, Simmons enjoys fishing and spending time outdoors.
- Simmons holds an annual youth football camp in Mississippi.

PRO: The Titans selected Nick Singleton in the fifth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The 6-foot, 219-pounder is a powerful, athletic ball carrier that also excels as a receiver out of the backfield and as a kick returner on special teams. The Shillington, Pa., native played four seasons (2022-25) at Penn State where he finished his collegiate career as the Nittany Lions' all-time record holder with 55 career touchdowns, 45 career rushing scores and 5,586 career all-purpose yards.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- As a rookie in 2023, Spears carried the ball 100 times for 453 yards and two touchdowns, and he added 52 receptions for 385 yards and one score. His 838 scrimmage yards ranked seventh in franchise history among rookie running backs, and the total also placed fourth among rookie running backs in 2023 behind Atlanta's Bijan Robinson, Detroit's Jahmyr Gibbs and Miami's De'Von Achane.
- Spears' 20 total third-down conversions in 2023, which included 11 receptions and nine rushing attempts, led all NFL running backs, including rookies and veterans.
- With 52 receptions in 2023, Spears became the franchise's first rookie running back with at least 50 receptions since Sid Blanks in 1964 (56).

PRO: The Titans selected Tyjae Spears in the third round of the 2023 NFL Draft. The 5-foot-11-inch, 200-pounder is a dynamic and explosive running back with superb instincts and the ability to play on all downs on offense and contribute in the return game. Over his first three NFL seasons, Spears has appeared in 42 games with three starts and his totals include 1,048 yards on the ground with eight touchdowns and 873 receiving yards and two scores as a receiver. The Ponchatoula, La., native spent four years at Tulane (2019-22) prior to entering the NFL. Chosen by the Titans with the 81st overall draft pick, he became the highest pick from Tulane since running back Matt Forte in 2008 (44th overall by Chicago).

TITANS TIDBITS:

- In the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft, the Titans selected one of Spears' best friends and his former college roommate, Tulane wide receiver Jha'Quan Jackson. Spears was with Jackson when he received the phone call from the Titans during the draft.
- Spears has worked with a non-profit organization in New Orleans called Son of a Saint, which provides "mentorship, education, recreation, camaraderie, cultural enrichment, emotional support and helping to fill the void for dozens of fatherless young men."
- Growing up in the New Orleans area, his favorite player was former Saints running back Reggie Bush.
- Spears is one of nine children in his family (five brothers and three sisters).
- His first job as a teenager was working at Walmart.

- The Ponchatoula, La., native was selected by the Titans in the third round (81st overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Placed on injured reserve designated for return on Aug. 25, 2025.

Grabbed a 27-yard pass during the Titans' scoring drive late in the first half. Converted a key third-and-22 with a 27-yard scamper down the left sideline late in the fourth quarter.

- At Miami (9/30), played as a reserve at running back and rushed 15 times for 39 yards with a touchdown. Caught two passes out of the backfield. Increased the Titans' lead to 16-6 with a seven-yard touchdown run off a direct snap in the third quarter.

He totaled 2,910 yards and 31 touchdowns on 427 carries and added 48 receptions for 564 yards and three scores. He ended his career as the school's all-time leader in yards per carry (6.8), tied for second in 100-yard rushing games (15), tied for third in rushing touchdowns (31), fourth in rushing yards per game (85.6) and sixth in rushing yards (2,910) and total touchdowns (34). His 6.8 yards per carry from 2019 to 2022 ranked second in the FBS behind only Alabama-Birmingham running back DeWayne McBride's 7.3-yard average (minimum 400 attempts).
- As a junior (2022), started all 14 games for the Green Wave, totaling 1,581 yards and 19 touchdowns on 229 rushing attempts and adding 22 receptions for 256 yards and two touchdowns. His 1,581 rushing yards led the conference and made up the Green Wave's all-time second-highest single-season total. Tallied nine 100-yard rushing games, including eight consecutive such efforts to finish the season. Helped the Olive and Blue earn a 12-2 record and win an American Athletic Conference title. The team's ninth-overall ranking was the second-best finish in program history.

- Against Southern California in the Cotton Bowl (1/2/23), rushed 17 times for 205 yards and a career-high four touchdowns, winning Most Outstanding Offensive Player in Tulane's 46-45 victory.

Rushed for over 100 yards in four of the last five games of the season, including at Memphis (11/27), when he recorded a career-high 264 rushing yards with two touchdowns. His 264 rushing yards tied for the fifth-highest total by a player in the nation in 2021. It was the fourth most in school history and the most by any player other than Matt Forte.

PRO: The Titans claimed Nazir Stackhouse off waivers prior to the start of the 2026 regular season to add depth to the defensive front. The 6-foot-4-inch, 327-pounder was signed by the Green Bay Packers as a rookie free agent in 2025 and appeared in 13 games with a start at defensive tackle as a rookie.

- Nazir's cousin, Jerry Stackhouse, played 18 seasons (1995-2013) in the NBA and was the former men's basketball coach at Vanderbilt.

There's no cure for narcolepsy, but Stackhouse has worked hard to find the right prescription medication and he began using a CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure) machine while he slept.

The 6-foot-1-inch, 199-pound cornerback was selected by the New Orleans Saints in the second round of the 2022 NFL Draft and saw action in 64 games with 53 starts with the club. Prior to his arrival in Tennessee, the University of Tennessee product collected 292 tackles, four interceptions, seven sacks, 21 stops for loss, three forced fumbles and 52 passes defended in his first four pro campaigns. His 52 pass breakups from 2022-25 rank fourth in the NFL.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

• In 2023, Thomas played in all 17 games with three starts for the Jets and recorded 31 tackles, a career-high five sacks and 17 quarterback pressures.

PRO: The Titans traded for Solomon Thomas early in the 2026 offseason to add physicality and versatility to the defensive line. The 6-foot-2-inch, 285-pounder is an experienced veteran who can contribute across the entire defensive front. Thomas was originally selected by the San Francisco 49ers in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft and spent his initial four campaigns with the club. He joined the Las Vegas Raiders for one season in 2021 before a three-year stint with the N.Y. Jets. In 2025, the Stanford product suited up for the Dallas Cowboys. Prior to his arrival in Tennessee, he appeared in 131 games with 36 starts and posted 239 tackles, 18.5 sacks, 138 quarterback pressures, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Thomas and his parents founded The Defensive Line, a nonprofit working to destigmatize mental health and end youth suicide. Solomon's sister, Ella Elizabeth Thomas, died by suicide at the age of 24. Their mission is to end the epidemic of youth suicide—particularly among young people of color—by revolutionizing the way we talk about, understand, and support mental health. The foundation is committed to creating safe, inclusive, and culturally responsive spaces that foster connection, resilience, and healing through honest conversations, community engagement, and systemic change.
- In 2018-19, Thomas walked to raise money for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. "I lost one of the most important people in my world to suicide," said Thomas. "I will be walking for her and for everyone who suffers from the pain she felt. Ella was my sister. Ella was my best friend. She loved harder than she could breathe. She taught me to be myself, to make everyone feel loved, to appreciate everything in front of me, and so much more. She was so perceptive and so compassionate. I will live every day for my amazing sister."
- Thomas was the Cowboys' 2025 Walter Payton Man of the Year club winner, showcasing exemplary philanthropic work and a strong impact for the community off the field. He was the Jets' nominee in all three of his previous seasons in New York (2022-24).
- Thomas was born in Chicago, Ill., but spent part of his childhood living in Australia. His father, Chris, was an international sales manager for Proctor & Gamble and he was stationed there. Thomas grew up learning to surf and enjoyed playing on the beach and eating fish and chips. He didn't begin playing football until he moved to Coppel, Texas.
- Thomas comes from an athletic family. His father, Chris, and mother, Martha, each attended the College of Wooster (Ohio) where Chris played basketball and Martha ran track. Solomon's uncle, Jon Thomas, ran track at Indiana University where he was a four-time Big Ten 400m hurdles champion.

• In 2018, Trubisky was named to the Pro Bowl after starting 14 games and compiling an 11-3 record as a starter. He completed 289 of 434 passes for 3,223 yards with 24 touchdowns.

PRO: The Titans signed Mitchell Trubisky early in the 2026 free agency period to add veteran leadership and experience to the quarterback room. The 6-foot-3-inch, 222-pounder was originally selected by the Chicago Bears in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft and spent his first four NFL campaigns with the club (2017-20). The University of North Carolina product has also spent time with the Buffalo Bills (2021, 2024-25) and the Pittsburgh Steelers (2022-23). CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Ward was invited to New York City as one of four Heisman Trophy finalists in 2024.
- Named winner of 2024 Davey O'Brien Award, recognizing the nation's top quarterback. Was named ACC Player of the Year and ACC Offensive Player of the Year and was a first team All-ACC honoree while being named a consensus first team All-American.
- Set Miami's single-season record for passing yards (4,313) and touchdowns (39) and completion percentage (67.2 percent 305-for-454).
- Became the all-time Division I combined touchdown leader after throwing three touchdown passes in the Pop-Tarts Bowl to surpass Case Keenum with 158 career touchdown passes.
- Ward set multiple rookie team records throughout his first season including most games started by a rookie (17), passes attempted by a rookie (540), passing yards by a rookie (3,169) and became the first rookie to throw for over 3,000 yards in team annals. PRO: The Titans selected Cameron Ward in the first round (first overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. The 6-foot-2-inch, 219-pounder is a crafty playmaker who operates well under pressure, throws with accuracy and velocity and commands the offense. As a rookie in 2025, Ward was the No. 1 overall pick and started all 17 games while throwing for 3,169 yards with 15 touchdowns. A native of West Columbia, Texas, he began his college career with two seasons at Incarnate Word before transferring to Washington State where he also spent two seasons. For his graduate year, he took his talents to the University of Miami, where he set multiple program records and became a Heisman finalist while leading the Hurricanes to their first 10-win season since 2017.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Ward was a zero-star recruit coming out of high school. The only Division I program to offer Ward a scholarship was Incarnate Word where he spent his first two college seasons. As a sophomore, he led the program to its first 10-win season and playoff run. He led the FCS in passing touchdowns in both of his first two seasons.
- Ward became the franchise's third player to be drafted with the first overall pick. In 1973, the Oilers selected defensive end John Matuszak with the top pick, and in 1978, they traded up to select running back Earl Campbell with the first selection.
- Ward is the third Miami product to be taken by the franchise in the first round joining Kenny Holmes (1997 - 18th overall) and Alonzo Highsmith (197 - 3rd overall). He is also the third Hurricane ever taken with the first overall pick joining Russell Maryland (1991- Dallas) and Vinny Testaverde (1987 - Tampa Bay).
- Ward is cousins with former Titans safety and 10-year NFL veteran, Quandre Diggs, as well as Quentin Jammer, who played cornerback for 12 seasons in the NFL.
- During his rookie season, Ward participated in Netflix's Quarterback, becoming the first rookie to be featured on the show. Cameras went behind-the-scenes to capture his journey both on and off the field throughout his first campaign.

Evened the score at 13-13 with a four-yard touchdown pass to Van Jefferson with less than two minutes remaining in the contest. During a 95-yard, game-tying drive, he completed six of eight passes for 63 yards and also scrambled for 20 yards.
- Against Seattle (11/23), connected on 28 of 42 passes for 256 yards with a touchdown for a 91.0 passer rating. Rushed six times for a career-best 37 rushing yards with his first career rushing score. Four of his rushing attempts resulted in first downs. Posted his first career rushing touchdown on a six-yard jaunt late in the third stanza. Cut the Seahawks' lead to 30-24 with a one-yard touchdown toss to Chimere Dike late in the final stanza.
