NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (1-0) AT TENNESSEE TITANS (1-0)

Saturday, Aug. 17, 2019 • Nissan Stadium (69,143) • 7:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will be on the road for the second consecutive week and will conduct joint practices with their preseason opponent. Last week the Patriots conducted three practices with the Detroit Lions prior to the 2019 preseason opener at Ford Field, a 31-3 New England win.

The Patriots will travel to Tennessee on Tuesday and practice with the Titans at their facility on Wednesday and Thursday prior to the game on Saturday night. The team has never held two sets of joint practices on the road under Bill Belichick.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by the Patriots Preseason Television Network and can be seen in every New England state, as well as Alaska and Hawaii. The preseason network's flagship station is **WBZ-TV CBS** in Boston. **Bob Socci** provides the play-by-play and is joined by former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak** in the broadcast booth. Former Patriots linebacker **Rob Ninkovich** will provide sideline analysis along with WBZ's **Steve Burton**.

PATRIOTS LOOK TO KICK OFF ANOTHER SUCCESSFULL SEASON

The 2019 New England Patriots have a chance to set or tie several NFL team records, including:

- The Patriots enter the 2019 season with 113 regular-season wins this decade (2010-present) and need three regular-season wins to move past the Indianapolis Colts record of 115 wins from 2000-09 for the most regular-season wins in a decade.
- New England has won at least 10 regular-season games for 16 consecutive seasons (2003-18), tying San Francisco (1983-98) for the most consecutive seasons with at least 10 victories and need one more in 2019 to set a new NFL mark.
- The Patriots enter the 2019 season tied with San Francisco with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh.
- New England tied the Pittsburgh Steelers with their sixth Super Bowl title last season and look to surpass the Steelers with a seventh Super Bowl title in 2019.

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and Tennessee Titans (formerly the Houston Oilers) will square off in the preseason for the first time since 2007 and for the seventh time in the teams' preseason series. The Titans are one of just four NFL teams that the Patriots have faced in the preseason (0-6) but have never defeated (also Baltimore, 0-1; Houston, 0-1 and Indianapolis,

The teams have played 43 times in regular season and postseason play since the two charter members of the American Football League began play in 1960. The Patriots and Oilers played twice each year from 1960-1969 in the AFL, and have played 23 times since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970. In those 23 post-merger games, the Patriots have a 15-8 record, including a 2-1 mark in playoff games.

New England leads the overall regular season and postseason series, 25-16-1, and own a 13-4 record against the Titans franchise since 1981. The last game between the clubs came last season when the Patriots traveled to Tennessee and lost 34-10 on Nov. 11, 2018.

Brian Hoyer started at quarterback and played until midway through the second quarter. He finished 12-of-14 for 147 yards with two touchdown passes for a 150.0 quarterback rating. Hoyer culminated a first quarter touchdown drive with a 14-yard touchdown pass to WR Maurice Harris. He culminated a second quarter drive with a 3-yard touchdown pass to undrafted rookie WR Jakobi Meyers. Hoyer's highest career quarterback rating in a regular-season game was 127.1 on Sept. 21, 2014, vs. Baltimore while playing for Cleveland.

POSITIVE RETURNS

RB Brandon Bolden, LB Jamie Collins Sr. and TE Ben Watson returned to the Patriots this offseason after beginning their careers in New England and saw action in the game.

DEFENSE DELIVERS WITH NINE SACKS

The Patriots defense finished with nine sacks. Last season, the highest sack total in a game for the Patriots was five sacks at Miami on Dec. 9, 2018. DL Derek Rivers led the team with two sacks and rookie DL Chase Winovich finished with 1½ sacks. The last time the Patriots had nine sacks in a regular-season game was on Nov. 4, 2001, at Atlanta. The Patriots have recorded nine sacks in a game five times. The single-game team record is 11 at Oakland on Sept. 22, 1963.

PATRIOTS DEFENSE SUFFOCATES LIONS IN 2019 DEBUT

The Patriots defense held Detroit to just eight first downs. Last season, the fewest first downs allowed was 11 vs. Miami on Sept. 30. The Patriots have held their opponent under 100 total yards three times in regular-season play.

SEVEN DRAFT PICKS SEE ACTION

Seven of the 10 Patriots 2019 draft picks played in the game. First-round pick WR N'Keal Harry, second-round pick DB Joejuan Williams, third-round pick DL Chase Winovich, fourth-round pick OL Hjalte Froholdt, fourth-round pick QB Jarrett Stidham, fifth-round pick DL Byron Cowart and fifth-round pick P Jake Bailey all saw action

HARRY CATCHES ON EARLY

2019 first-round draft pick WR N'Keal Harry caught an 11-yard pass from QB Brian Hoyer on a third-and-10 in the first quarter on his first play from scrimmage. He also had a 25-yard reception later in the frame.

FOUR ROOKIES IN STARTING LINEUP

Four rookies were in the starting lineup against the Lions. Second-round pick DB Joejuan Williams started at cornerback, fourth-round pick OL Hjalte Froholdt started at left guard, undrafted rookie WR Jakobi Meyers started at wide receiver and undrafted rookie OL Tyree St. Louis started at right tackle.

BIRTHDAY BOY MAKES NFL DEBUT

2019 fourth-round draft pick QB Jarrett Stidham entered the game in the second quarter and completed his first NFL pass on a 13-yard gain to TE Matt LaCosse. Later in the series, he threw his first touchdown pass on a 5-yard reception to WR Jakobi Meyers. Stidham played in his first NFL game on what is his 23rd birthday. Stidham finished 14-of-24 for 179 yards with one touchdown.

ETLING SEES ACTION ON OFFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

Danny Etling was drafted by the Patriots in the seventh-round of the 2018 NFL Draft as a quarterback. He saw action on the opening kickoff as well as other special teams units. He also entered the game at wide receiver in the fourth quarter.

MYERS MAKES THE MOST OF IT

Undrafted rookie WR Jakobi Meyers was in the starting lineup and caught a 3-yard touchdown pass from QB Brain Hoyer in the second quarter and a 5-yard touchdown pass from QB Jarrett Stidham later in the second quarter. He finished with six receptions for 69 yards and the two touchdowns.

BERRIOS MAKES IMPACT

Second-year WR Braxton Berrios, who spent the 2018 season in injured reserve, returned four punts for 35 yards. He also caught three passes for 45 yards.

JOHN SIMON PICKS LIONS POCKET

DL John Simon intercepted a Detroit pass deep in Lions territory in the second quarter. He has one interception during the regular season in his career, returning a pick 26 yards for a touchdown at Tennessee on October 16, 2017, when he played for Indianapolis.

BROSSETTE PROVIDES BOOST IN RELIEF

Undrafted rookie RB Nick Brossette scored on a 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and then added a two-point conversion. He finished with 22 carries for 66 yards.

ROBERT KRAFT CHAIRMAN 8 CEO

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 25 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success



rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (18), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (22) and have the fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 25 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 20 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2018, Kraft earned his 22nd winning season in 25 years of owning the franchise.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

- Kraft enters 2019 with 33 postseason victories, third-most in NFL history for any ownership group. He sits one playoff win behind the Green Bay Packers (34) and three behind Pittsburgh's Rooney family (36) for most postseason wins by an ownership group. The Rooney Family founded the Steelers in 1933, while the Packers were founded in 1919.
- The Patriots have won six Super Bowls under Kraft's ownership, tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for most Super Bowl championships in NFL history. The Patriots seek an NFL-record seventh Super Bowl under Kraft's guidance in 2019.

DYNASTY VS. DYNASTY

Of all of the great teams throughout the Super Bowl era, the New England Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers have set a standard of extended excellence above all of the others. The 49ers run of success spanned two decades, while New England's streak is still in progress.

A WINNING TRADITION

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Mr. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. Al Davis of Oakland accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 312 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 312-135 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 26 times in their 59-year history. Twenty of those playoff berths have come in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 21 division crowns, including 16 in the last 18 seasons and 18 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

TEAM - WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- The Patriots set an NFL record by reaching eight straight conference title games (2011-18). If they qualify for the playoffs in 2019, they will look to add to that record.
- The Patriots enter the 2019 season tied with San Francisco with 15 conference championship game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh.
- New England enters the 2019 season with 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. If the team qualifies for the postseason in 2019, they will look to add to that number. Pittsburgh is second with 36 playoff wins all-time.



- If Brady throws 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2019, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in at least eight seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (10).
- Brady is tied with Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Aaron Rodgers with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2019 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns, for the most in NFL history.
- Brady has passed for 4,000 yards 10 times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2019, he will be the third player to reach 11 seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12).
- Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, the fourth time he led the NFL in touchdown passes. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.
- Brady has 237 career victories (regular season and playoffs combined), the most wins all-time by an NFL player and will look to add to that number in 2019.
- Brady enters the 2019 season with 70,514 career passing yards, fourth in NFL history. He needs 1,325 passing yards this season to move past Brett Favre into third place for all-time NFL passing yards.
- Brady has 87 300-yard passing games and needs three more to become the third NFL player with 90 300-yard games, joining Drew Brees (115) and Peyton Manning (93).
- Brady is tied with eight other NFL players with two games with six or more touchdowns and needs one more game with six or more touchdowns to tie Peyton Manning, who had three games with six or more touchdowns.
- Brady needs six touchdown passes to tie and seven to pass George Blanda (1970) for most touchdown passes for a QB past his 42nd birthday.
- Tom Brady owns the NFL record with 30 Player of the Week awards and 10 Player of the Month honors.
- Brady has the NFL record with 57 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions.
- Brady has played in 269 NFL games entering the 2019 season, which is third all-time among NFL quarterbacks, behind George Blanda (340) and Brett Favre (302).
- Brady has started every game in 15 seasons, third all-time for a quarterbacks, behind the 16 seasons by Peyton Manning and 17 seasons by Brett Favre.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019 (CONT.)

- Brady is entering his 20th season with the Patriots in 2019. He will
 join Darrell Green (20 Washington), Jackie Slater (20 L.A. Rams)
 and Jason Hanson (21 Detroit) as the only players with at least 20
 NFL seasons played with one team.
- Brady at age 42 looks to become the oldest quarterback to start on opening day. Warren Moon currently holds the record after starting opening day for Seattle in in 1998 at age 41. The most touchdown passes by a an NFL quarterback past his 42nd birthday is six by George Blanda in 1970.
- Brady (14) needs one more Pro Bowl berth to move past Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14) and Merlin Olsen (14) for the most Pro Bowl berths.



He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much

he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is "

FATHERLY ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told The Boston Herald. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."EDELMAN playoff notes

PRO BOWL RECORD



Slater has earned seven Pro Bowl invitations (2011-17) as a special teams player to match Steve Tasker (1987, 1990-95) for the most special teams Pro Bowl honors in NFL history. Slater is the only special teams player to earn seven consecutive Pro Bowls.

ALL-STAR COMBINATION

Slater was voted to the Pro Bowl for seven straight seasons, matching the seven that his father was voted to with the L.A. Rams. The Slater family's 14 combined Pro Bowls are the second-most among father-son contingents to have been voted to at least one Pro Bowl each.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater was named to seven straight Pro Bowls (2011-17) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the eighth straight season in 2018.

The special teams ace shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eightman rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

OL JOE THUNEY

SUPER BOWL RECORD SETTER

OL Joe Thuney became the first player in NFL history to start in the Super Bowl in each of his first three seasons in the NFL.

BACK TO SCHOOL

Along with teammate Ted Karras, Joe Thuney has taken advantage of an NFLPA program that assists its players in earning college degrees. After earning his degree in accounting while also studying international studies at N.C. State, Thuney is now pursuing his MBA through Indiana University's Kelley School of Business.

RB JAMES WHITE

- James White has 19 career touchdown receptions, second in Patriots all-time history among running backs behind the 26 by Larry Garron.

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, and I wanted whatever was best for the team," Butler told The Tennessean. "Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

DB Nate Ebner led the Patriots in 2018 with 13 special teams tackles. 

LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER



WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play

as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number"

WINNER ON MULTIPLE LEVELS

Dont'a Hightower (three Super Bowl championships and two national titles at Alabama) and Russell Maryland (two national championships at Miami and three Super Bowl Championships with Dallas) are the only two players in NFL history with at least two national championships and two Super Bowl wins.

DB DEVIN McCOURTY

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

- Devin McCourty enters 2019 tied with Ty Law for second most Pro Bowls as a Patriots defensive back with four. Only CB Mike Haynes had more Pro Bowl invites as a Patriots DB with six.
- Devin and Jason McCourty are one of five teams that feature teammate brothers this season, joining Pittsburgh (Terrell and Trey Edmunds), the L.A. Rams (Cooper and Ketner Kupp), the N.Y. Jets (C.J. and Jamey Mosely, and Seattle (Shaquem and Shaquill Griffin).

McCOUR-TD

DB Devin McCourty's 84-yard interception return for a touchdown in the win at Buffalo on Oct. 29, 2018 was his first career interception returned for a touchdown and the ninth-longest in team history. The picksix was McCourty's second career score. His first touchdown came on a 104-yard kickoff return vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 21, 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots in the 2018 offseason. The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louis-ville Colonels. Shaquill and Shaquem Griffin of the Seattle Seahawks also accomplished this unique occurrence on Kickoff Weekend. New England also had twins on the team in 2017, with TE Jacob Hollister on the roster and WR Cody Hollister on the practice squad. Jacob was on the roster again in 2018 and Cody was on the non-football/injury list.



Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and was a year behind his brother in eligibility. Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. McCourty was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN IN PATRIOTS HISTORY

IN GOOD COMPANY

McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

BROTHERS IN ARMS

Devin and twin brother Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.

LB KYLE VAN NOY

VAN NOY SCORES TWICE IN 2018

LB Kyle Van Noy recovered a fumble and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown in the regular-season finale win over N.Y. Jets (12/30/18). It marked his second touchdown of the season. He returned a blocked punt 29-yards for a touchdown at Chicago (10/21/18), becoming the first Patriots player with two non-offensive touchdowns in a season since DB Kyle Arrington scored two touchdowns in 2014.



K STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

- If Stephen Gostkowski leads the NFL in scoring in 2019, he will set the NFL mark for most seasons leading the NFL in scoring with six, moving past Don Hutson (five) and Gino Cappelletti (five in the AFL). Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in 2008, 2012-14 and 2015.
- In 2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points. He added his fifth season of 150 or more points in 2017 and can add to that number in 2019.



- Gostkowski (5) needs one more 30-field goal season in 2019 to tie Justin Tucker (6) for the most seasons with 30 or more field goals.
- Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008 and 13-14) and if he leads the NFL in field goals in 2019, he will join Lou Groza (five), Jack Manders (four), Ward Cuff (four) and Mark Moseley (four) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons
- Gostkowski (1,743) enters the 2019 season 12th on the NFL's all-time scoring list.
- Gostkowski (205) is second all-time in postseason points, behind Adam Vinatieri (238) and will look to add to those numbers in 2019.
- Gostkowski is tied for second with David Akers on the NFL's all-time postseason list with 39 field goals behind Adam Vinatieri (56).
- · Gostkowski (367) is 15th on the NFL's all-time field goal list.
- Gostkowski is tied with Mike Lodish for second all-time with six Super Bowls played, behind the nine Super Bowls by Tom Brady.
- Gostkowski is third all-time with 33 points in the Super Bowl, behind the 48 by Jerry Rice and the 34 by Adam Vinatieri.
- Gostkowski has played in 28 career postseason games, fourth alltime behind Tom Brady (40), Adam Vinatieri (32) and Jerry Rice (29).
- Gostkowski is tied with Adam Vinatieri for the most field goals in Super Bowl history with seven.

- Rob Gronkowski caught a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.
- After the Patriots defense forced a three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- On the Bears first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown that gave the Patriots a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular-season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).

ALL-TIME PLAYOFF RESULTS

The Patriots have compiled a 37-20 record in their 57 playoff games and their .649 playoff winning percentage is the best in NFL history among teams that have played at least 15 playoff games.

New England has qualified for the playoffs 26 times in its 59-year history. The Patriots have earned 20 of those playoff berths in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 21 division crowns overall (20 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976).



The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.

ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT
