# **CAROLINA** vs **BUFFALO**

• The Panthers will play their first home game of the 2019 preseason Friday night, as they host the Buffalo Bills at Bank of America Stadium.

• There are numerous connections between the two clubs, most notably Bills general manager Brandon Beane and head coach Sean McDermott. Both Beane and McDermott spent significant time with the Panthers prior to joining Buffalo in 2017.

• Carolina is 4-2 all-time against Buffalo in the preseason, and 2-5 in the regular season. The clubs last met in the preseason opener last year in Buffalo (8/9/18), when the Panthers defeated the Bills 28-23.

• The Panthers enter the second week of the preseason following a Week 1 victory at Chicago where they defeated the Bears, 23-13. Last week, Buffalo hosted Indianapolis and the Bills topped the Colts, 24-16.

# **SPIDER-BURNS**

Brian Burns wasted no time making an impact in his first NFL game last week at Chicago. The Panthers' 2019 firstround pick finished with 2.0 sacks after playing just 10 snaps in the game.

# HOLYFIELD FINDS PAYDIRT TWICE

In his first ever NFL game, undrafted rookie running back Elijah Holyfield scored **each of the Panthers' two touchdowns**.

His first score came in the third quarter, as he caught a pass from WIII Grier and beat the defense to the corner of the end zone for a **seven-yard touchdown**.

His second score came on Carolina's final drive of the game, taking a handoff and bouncing it around the left end for an **11-yard touchdown**.



# **RETURN SUCCESS**

Carolina averaged **18.7 yards per punt return** in the first week of the preseason. The team finished with seven returns for 131 yards, highlighted by a **57-yard return** by rookie wide receiver Terry Godwin.

In 2018, Carolina averaged 6.9 yards per punt return.

# 100% IN DEBUT



The Panthers signed kicker Joey Slye one week before the preseason opening game at Chicago.

In his first ever NFL game, Slye nailed each of his three field goal attempts (**42 yards, 55 yards and 29 yards**) as well as each of his two extra point attempts.

# SACK PARTY

Rookie LB/DE **Brian Burns** was the star of the night, racking up 2.0 sacks on just 10 total snaps played.

Lining up opposite of Burns was LB/DE Marquis Haynes, who added 2.0 sacks of his own.

Burns and Haynes combined for 6 tackles, 5 tackles for loss, **4.0 sacks**, **30 sack yards** and 6 hits on the quarterback.



# **QUARTERBACK PLAY**

With Cam Newton not playing in the first preseason game, second-year quarterback Kyle Allen got the start behind center. Rookie Will Grier and veteran Taylor Heinicke split time with Allen. Below are the quarterbacks' stats:

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011. In eight seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

Rivera inherited a 2-14 Carolina team as a rookie head coach in 2011 and guided it back to relevance with four playoffs appearances since 2013, the second-most playoff berths in the NFC over that six-year period. In that span, the Panthers recorded 58 wins, tied for the most in any six-year period in franchise history, and fifth-most in the NFL.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts.

Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, the Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008. Before joining the Panthers, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004- 06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999- 2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992- 94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970). A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at California (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif. He and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Head Coach Defensive Coordinator Inside Linebackers Defensive Coordinator Linebackers Defensive Quality Control Sean McDermott was named Buffalo's 19th head coach on January 11, 2017. He enters his third season as Buffalo's head coach and his 21st season in the NFL ranks.

McDermott joined the Bills after spending six seasons as the defensive coordinator of the Carolina Panthers. In his first year in Buffalo, McDermott led the Bills to their first playoff berth since 1999 with a 9-7 record.

He became the third coach in Bills history to earn a playoff berth in his first season at the helm, joining Joe Collier (1966) and Wade Phillips (1998).

The Bills finished 7th in the NFL turnover differential (+9), 10th in the NFL in fewest penalties (98), and 7th in special teams statistics. The 2017 Bills also won six home games for the first time since 1999.

In his second year in Buffalo, McDermott led the Bills to a 6-10 record and the NFL's second-ranked defense.

An All-Atlantic 10 Conference choice at safety for William & Mary as a senior in 1997, McDermott graduated with a degree in finance and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1998.

Born on March 21, 1974. He and his wife, Jamie, have three children.

# **MILESTONES IN REACH IN 2019**



Carolina needs 10 wins to reach 200 regular season wins in franchise history. Dating back to the Panthers' first season in 1995, the team has an overall record of 190-193-1 during the regular season.



**Ron Rivera** needs three wins in the regular season to pass John Fox (73 wins; 2002-10) as the winningest coach in franchise history. Rivera's career record is 71-56-1 (.559) in the regular season.





**Cam Newton** needs 121 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham (4,928) for the second-most rushing yards by a quarterback in league history. Cam Newton has totaled 4,808 rushing yards in his career. Newton can also become the first quarterback to ever rush for 700+ yards in four seasons.



**Christian McCaffrey** needs 292 yards from scrimmage to break the franchise record for scrimmage yards by any Panther through his first three seasons. His 3,051 yards only trail DeAngelo Williams (3,342 yards; 2006-08).

**Greg Olsen** can move into sixth place all-time in touchdowns by a tight end in NFL history by scoring six times. Olsen currently has 57 touchdowns, trailing Vernon Davis and Shannon Sharpe, who are tied for sixth with 62 touchdown catches.





According to press box stats, Luke Kuechly (948) needs 52 tackles in 2019 to hit 1,000 career tackles. He also needs just 19 tackles to pass Brian Urlacher (966) for the most through a player's first eight seasons in NFL history.



Mario Addison (45.5 sacks) needs 10 sacks in 2019 to tie Mike Rucker (55.5 sacks) for the third-most sacks in franchise history.



**J.J. Jansen** has played in 160 career games with Carolina, the fifth most by any Panther player. He can tie Thomas Davis (176; 2005-18) for the third-most games played in franchise history by playing in 16 games this season.

# **A RUNNING HISTORY**

Newton is the **only player** to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (182) and career rushing touchdowns (58). Newton is the **first quarterback** in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 39 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the **most in NFL history**.







#### **TOTAL YARDS**

Newton ranks **third in NFL history** for the most combined yards through a quarterback's first eight seasons. He tallied 3,883 total yards in 2018 (3,395 passing, 488 rushing).

Newton is **one of just two players in NFL history**, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first eight seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

## **GAME-WINNING DRIVES**

Newton has led **17 career game-winning drives** (defined as a drive that puts the team ahead for good in the fourth quarter or overtime).

Jake Delhomme owns the franchise record with 21 game-winning drives.

# CHRISTIAN McCAFFREY

Running back Christian McCaffrey racked up a **franchise-record 1,965 yards** from scrimmage in his sophomore season in 2018.

He finished the season ranked sixth in the NFL in rushing yards (1,098) and ninth in rushing average (5.01 yards per carry).

# **MOORE LIFE**

Wide receiver DJ Moore had a standout rookie season in 2018. He posted the **most scrimmage yards** (960) and secondmost receiving yards (788) by **any rookie wide receiver** in the NFL. He also had the second-most scrimmage yards by a rookie wide receiver in franchise history (Kelvin Benjamin, 1,008 - 2014).

Moore led all wide receivers on the team with 55 receptions and 788 receiving yards, averaging 14.3 yards per catch. He also averaged 7.7 yards after the catch, which **topped the league** among qualifying receivers.

A dual threat, Moore also racked up 172 yards on the ground, the second most among all NFL wide receivers.

Kuechly ranks fourth in career tackles among all currently active players in the NFL.

Kuechly has the most tackles (press box) over any player's first seven seasons played. His 9.3 tackles per game (press box) rank as the **second-highest average** (Zach Thomas - 9.8) in **NFL history** (min. 50 games played).

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 1,086 career tackles, second-most in team history.

He is the **only player in franchise history** with more than 100 tackles in each of his first seven seasons as a Panther, including a team-record 205 stops (coaches' film) as a rookie in 2012.

## **SUPER MARIO**

Addison started as an undrafted free agent out of Troy, signing with the Chicago Bears in 2011 and landing on the Panthers in 2012.

He has 45.5 career sacks which ranks **third in the NFL** among active players that were undrafted free agents. Addison now ranks **fourth in franchise history** in sacks.

## **ACTION JACKSON**

Jackson finished his rookie campaign tied for seventh in the NFL with four interceptions. This marked the **second most interceptions** by a rookie in team history, only trailing Chris Gamble's six picks in 2004.



On Monday Night Football in Week 15 last season vs New Orleans, Jackson picked off a pass on a two-point conversion attempt and returned it the length of the field for two points, giving Carolina its first ever two-point defensive return.

# SHORT STANDS TALL

Since the start of 2015, Kawann Short has 27.5 sacks, tied for **third in the NFL** by a defensive tackle over the past four seasons. Carolina selected Miller in the fourth round after he played four years at Alabama. In his final season with the Crimson Tide, he tallied 36 tackles, including **11.5** for loss, **8.5** sacks and a team-high 12 quarterback hurries.

## ROUND 5 • 16TH PICK (154TH OVERALL)

Scarlett played three years with Florida prior to being the Panthers' fifth round draft selection. In his three years with the Gators, he racked up **1,846** yards and **12** touchdowns.

## ROUND 6 • 40TH PICK (212TH OVERALL)
