## STEELERS HEAD WEST

- Pittsburgh will travel to the Pacific time zone for the second consecutive year. The Steelers played at Oakland in 2018.
- Pittsburgh owns a 19-39 (.328) all-time record against teams that comprise the Pacific time zone (Los Angeles Rams, Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders, San Diego Chargers, San Francisco 49ers and Seattle Seahawks).
- The Steelers are 5-5 (.500) all-time at San Francisco.

## STEELERS NAME FOUR TEAM CAPTAINS

- The Steelers selected four players to serve as team captains for the 2019 season, the team announced through a vote of their teammates.
- QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **C Maurkice Pouncey** will serve as the offensive captains, **DT Cameron Heyward** will serve as the defensive captain and **FB Roosevelt Nix** will serve as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 11th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-18). This marks Heyward's fifth consecutive year as a captain (2015-19), and the third time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-19).
- Nix was named a captain for the first time in his career.

## SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Steelers are slated to appear in five nationally-televised primetime games, including two Monday Night Football games at Heinz Field, during the NFL's 2019 regular season, it was announced this spring when the NFL unveiled its 2019 regular season schedule.
- Pittsburgh kicked off its 2019 regular season on Sunday Night Football at the New England Patriots in Week 1 on Sunday, Sept. 8 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.). The Steelers will host the Seattle Seahawks in Week 2 of the 2019 regular season at Heinz Field for their home opener on Sunday, Sept. 15 (FOX, 1 p.m.).
- The Steelers will host the Cincinnati Bengals and Miami Dolphins on Monday Night Football at Heinz Field in 2019, in Weeks 4 and 8 (ESPN, 8:15 p.m.), respectively. Pittsburgh's two other nationally televised primetime games are scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Los Angeles Chargers in Week 6 on Oct. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.) and a Thursday Night Football game at the Cleveland Browns in Week 11 on Nov. 14 (FOX/NFL Network/Amazon, 8:20 p.m.).
- The Steelers' bye week will be on Oct. 20 (Week 7).

- The Steelers traded for DB **Minkah Fitzpatrick** from the Miami Dolphins in exchange for draft picks in the upcoming NFL Drafts. As part of the trade, the Steelers acquire Fitzpatrick along with the Dolphins fourth-round selection in the 2020 NFL Draft and their seventh-round pick in the 2021 NFL Draft. In exchange, the Steelers have given up their first-round and fifth-round picks in the 2020 NFL Draft and their sixth-round pick in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- In 2018 Fitzpatrick was one of just eight rookies with 50+ tackles and an interception, and one of just seven with 50+ tackles and 5+ passes defended.
- Fitzpatrick played three different positions – safety, boundary corner and slot corner – for the Dolphins defense.
- Fitzpatrick's 79 tackles in 2018 were 10th among rookies while his seven passes defended were tied for sixth.
- Fitzpatrick was selected by the Dolphins in the first round of the 2018 NFL Draft, the 11th pick overall.
- Fitzpatrick had five tackles in the Dolphins season opener against Baltimore and added six tackles against New England last week, with a forced fumble and fumble recovery.
- A three-year starter at Alabama, he played in 42 games, starting 38. He had 171 tackles, including 109 solo stops, four and a half sacks, nine interceptions, 35 pass defenses and two forced fumbles. He won the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back his final season and became the third player in NCAA history to win both the Chuck Bednarik and Jim Thorpe Awards, joining Charles Woodson and Patrick Peterson with that honor. He was also a unanimous first-team All-American in 2017.

### TOMLIN GOING FOR TWO

- Pittsburgh failed to convert its first two-point play of the 2019 season -- **QB Mason Rudolph** was unable to convert on a pass play vs. Seattle on Sept. 15.
- **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **RB James Conner** on a two-point attempt in Week 2 vs. Kansas City and in Week 4 vs. Baltimore, one with **WR JuJu Smith Schuster** in Week 6 at Cincinnati and one with WR Eli Rogers in Week 16 in 2018.
- Pittsburgh converted two of its four two-point attempts in 2017, and three of its nine tries in 2016, its first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).
- The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015, which set an NFL record for the most conversions in a season.

### TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.
- Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in his 157th career regular-season game, which marked the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark (**Chuck Noll**, 158; **Bill Cowher**, 163).
- Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (**Bill Cowher**, 1992-2001, 99; **Chuck Noll**, 1976-78, 88).
- Tomlin also joined an elite NFL head coach fraternity by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season,
- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

## CONNER STRONG

- **RB James Conner** became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 TDs in the team's first eight games of a season (2018), and scored at least one TD in five straight games (Games 5-9).
- Conner rushed for a touchdown vs. Seattle on Sept. 15. It marked the seventh time in the last 11 games that he has registered a touchdown.
- Conner has 13 rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks fourth in the NFL:

- Conner recorded three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs in three consecutive games in 2018 (Games 5-7), becoming the first player in Steelers history - and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) - to tally three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs.
- Conner rushed for nine TDs in the first eight games of 2018, tied for the most by a Steeler through the first eight games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage were the second-most through eight games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 1,086; 2014).

- Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), TDs (2 rushing), receptions (5), receiving yards (57) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland.
- Conner's 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards were the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.
- The second-year running back totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing TD and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a 1-yard run, in Week 2 against Kansas City.
- In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with two rushing TDs. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and two rushing TDs in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

### CONNER'S HONORS

- **RB James Conner** earned 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week 8) and 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.
- In Week 8 of 2018, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing TDs (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week Eight's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.
- Conner led the AFC in rushing TDs (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and two TDs in each of his three October games — becoming the first player in Steelers history with a three-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and two rushing TDs and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.
- This marked the second time that Conner has taken home AFC honors in 2018 (Offensive Player of the Week: Week 8).

### MCDONALD'S CAREER YEAR

- **TE Vance McDonald**, who recorded single-season career bests in receptions (50) and receiving yards (610) in 2018, set a single-game career high, and registered the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL regular season career, with 112 receiving yards on four catches in Week 3 of 2018 at Tampa Bay on Monday Night Football.
- McDonald became the second Steelers tight end since 1960, to record at least 100 receiving yards in the first half of a game (Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991, 118 yards).
- McDonald scored a touchdown on a 75-yard pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the first quarter, matching a career-long reception (75-yard TD while with San Francisco) in 2016 (Sept. 18 at Carolina).
- In Week 6 at Cincinnati, McDonald set a single-game career best with seven catches (6, Nov. 29, 2015 vs. Arizona, while with San Francisco) for 68 yards.
- McDonald registered his first career multi-TD receiving game vs. Seattle on Sept. 15. He also equaled his career-high of seven catches.
- McDonald has recorded 14 career receiving TDs.

### NO DAYS OFF

- **OL Alejandro Villanueva** extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 66, which is tied for the fourth-longest active streak among active NFL offensive tackles:

**WATT'S 2018 CAMPAIGN**

- With a 2.0 sack outing at Jacksonville in Week 11 of 2018, **LB T.J. Watt** became the first Steelers linebacker with at least 10.0 sacks in a season since 2010 (James Harrison and LaMarr Woodley).
- Along with 7.0 sacks in his 2017 rookie campaign, Watt is the first Steelers linebacker since 2013-14 (Jason Worilds) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 7.0 sacks.
- Watt finished Week 1 in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 1 outing, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week 6) to receive the honor.
- Watt posted his second career and second game of 2018 with 3.0 sacks in Week 5 vs. Atlanta, the third multi-sack game of his NFL career. He forced a fumble on his third sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan, in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by LB L.J. Fort in the Falcons' end zone for a touchdown.
- In the Steelers' regular-season finale vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field, Watt totaled 7 tackles (4 solo) and two defensive forced fumbles on Cincinnati QB Jeff Driskel, including a strip-sack of Driskel (minus 6 yards) at the Bengals' 12-yard line in the third quarter. His defensive forced fumbles marked the fifth and sixth defensive forced fumbles of his 2018 season and increased his career total to seven to become the first Steeler with at least six defensive forced fumbles in a season since 2010 (James Harrison: 6).





## WATT THE NINTH WITH 20.0 SACKS IN FIRST TWO NFL SEASONS

- **LB T.J. Watt** recorded 20.0 quarterback sacks over his first two seasons in the NFL. He became the ninth linebacker with at least 20.0 sacks in a player's first two campaigns since the statistic became official in 1982.

## WATT IN 2017 ROOKIE YEAR

- **LB T.J. Watt** - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.
- Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (Kendrell Bell, 2001: 9.0):

- Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982, finishing with 6 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.
- With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became the third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

## HEYWARD SACK NOTES

- **DT Cameron Heyward** recorded 8.0 sacks in 2018, tied for the sixth-most among all NFL defensive tackles.
- Heyward recorded at least a half-sack in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12), and recovered a fumble forced by **LB T.J. Watt** on a sack of Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles on the final play of regulation in the team's 20-16 win in Week 11.

## HARGRAVE AT THE NOSE

- **NT Javon Hargrave** finished 12th among all NFL defensive tackles with 6.5 sacks in 2018.
- Hargrave produced the first multi-sack game of his NFL career, bringing down Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles (minus five and eight yards) twice in the second quarter in Week 11.
- Hargrave extended his single-season career high to 6.5 sacks in 2018 with a sack in Week 13 vs. Los Angeles, (2016 and 2017: 2.0), and his career quarterback takedown total to 10.5.

## WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

- **LB Vince Williams** led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week 1 of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City).
- In Week 6 at Cincinnati, Williams led the Steelers with 7 total tackles (6 solo) and tallied his first sack of the season.
- In Week 10 vs. Carolina, Williams totaled 4 tackles (3 solo), including a sack of eight yards of Carolina QB Cam Newton. He picked off Newton in the first quarter, his second career interception, and returned it 17 yards for a TD to mark the first pick-six of his NFL career.
- Williams finished second on the Steelers' defense with 76 total tackles (50 solo) in 2018, and added 4.5 sacks and 8 tackles for losses, 10 quarterback hits, two passes defended and an interception returned for a touchdown.

## HADEN BREAKING IT UP

- **CB Joe Haden** hauled in his third interception as a Steeler, picking off New England QB Tom Brady in the fourth quarter at the Steelers' 4-yard line in Week 15, his 22nd interception of his NFL career and his second in 2018. Haden led all defenders in the game with a game high 12 total tackles (8 solo), two passes defended to go along with his interception.
- Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half — his first sack with the Steelers — third of his NFL career — and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland).
- In Week 7 vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.
- Since entering the NFL in 2010, Haden has recorded 120 passes defended — the second-most among all NFL defenders:

- The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 108-of-117 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 459 tackles (374 solo), 22 interceptions, 120 passes defended, five forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

## DAVIS: LAST MAN OF 'D'

- **S Sean Davis**, who missed the season opener at New England, led the Steelers' defense for the second consecutive year in 2018, tallying 79 tackles (58 solo), to go along with an interception, seven passes defended and a quarterback hit, in his first season at the free safety position.
- In Week 16 at New Orleans in 2018, Davis picked off New Orleans QB Taysom Hill in Pittsburgh's end zone in the first quarter, the fifth interception of his NFL career and his first of 2018.
- Davis has recorded at least 8 total tackles in eight career regular-season games, including a 9 tackle (6 solo) outing in the Week 13 vs. Los Angeles in 2018.
- The third-year defensive back recorded the first double-digit tackle games of his NFL career with 10 vs. New England in Week 15 of 2017, and tallied a career high 12 vs. Baltimore in Week 14 of 2017.
- In the 2017 Week 17 regular season finale vs. Cleveland, Davis posted his sole sack of the season, and hauled in his third interception of the year.

## HILTON MAGIC

- **CB Mike Hilton** led Pittsburgh's defense with 8 total tackles (6 solo), 2 tackles for losses and a quarterback hit, along with a sack and defensive fumble recovery in Week 14 of 2018 at Oakland. He recorded a sack of Oakland QB Derek Carr (minus 6 yards) in the second quarter, his first quarterback takedown of 2018 and the fifth of his NFL career, and recovered a fumble off of a team sack in the third quarter.
- He picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week 3 Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's 6-yard line — his first interception of 2018 — and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.
- Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

## DEFENSIVE ADDITIONS'

- Pittsburgh signed two key additions to the defense this offseason, adding from **CB Steven Nelson** the Chiefs and **LB Mark Barron** from the Rams.
- In his five-year NFL career, four with Kansas City, Nelson has started 39-of-53 regular-season games. He also started four-of-six postseason games with the Chiefs. His career totals include 177 tackles (151 solo), four interceptions, 35 passes defended, 8 tackles for losses, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.
- In 104 regular-season games (93 starts) starts with Tampa Bay (2012-14) and the Los Angeles Rams (2014-18), Barron, the University of Alabama product has career totals including 630 tackles (485 solo), 9.0 sacks, eight interceptions, 39 passes defended, 17 quarterback hits, 44 tackles for losses, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

**WIZARD OF BOZ**

- Since joining the Steelers in 2015, **K Chris Boswell** is 101-of-118 overall on field goal attempts (85.6%), including 35-of-45 (77.8%) between 40-49 yards.
- Boswell connected on a pair of field goals vs. Seattle on Sept. 15.
- Boswell converted a 48-yard field goal with 2:30 remaining in regulation, increasing the Steelers' lead to 17-10, in Week 16 against New England in 2018.
- Boswell's 85.6 field goal percent ranks second in Steelers history among kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts:

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers fought back late, but weren't able to stop the Seahawks on their final drive, falling, 28-26, in the team's home opener at Heinz Field. The loss dropped the Steelers to 0-2.

The Steelers got back in the game late when **Devin Bush** picked up the loose ball at the 14-yard line on an aborted play, and returned it to the three-yard line, where he went out of bounds. **Mason Rudolph** hit **Vance McDonald** for a three-yard touchdown, cutting the lead to 28-26 after **Chris Boswell's** extra point.

The Seahawks achieved some much-needed separation in a back-and-forth affair on a 28-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Russell Wilson to wide receiver DK Metcalf with 7:15 left in the fourth quarter.

A successful challenge of a non-call for defensive pass interference on strong safety **Terrell Edmunds** turned an incompletion and an impending third-and-20 into a first-and-10 at the Steelers' 35-yard line.

Wilson found Metcalf three snaps later.

Kicker Jason Myers' extra point gave Seattle a 28-19 lead.

The Seahawks took the ball away early in the third quarter and then took the lead.

Wilson connected with tight end Will Dissly on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 12-yard line for a touchdown with 9:49 left in the third quarter. Dissly got behind inside linebacker Bush and caught the ball in front of free safety **Sean Davis**. Myers' extra point made it 14-10 Seahawks.

The scoring drive began at the Steelers' 40 after a pass from quarterback Rudolph bounced off wide receiver **Donte Moncrief** and was intercepted by Seahawks free safety Bradley McDougald.

Rudolph had replaced starting quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** (right elbow) on the Steelers' first possession of the second half.

The Steelers countered the Seahawks' third-quarter touchdown with a 33-yard field goal by kicker Boswell that cut the Seattle advantage to 14-13. The big play on their seven-play, 60-yard drive in 3:28 was a 45-yard flea flicker, a pitch from running back **James Conner** back to Rudolph, who then found wide receiver **JuJu Smith Schuster** for a gain to the Seattle 16-yard line.

Seattle countered with a 37-yard burst for a touchdown by running back Rashaad Penny on third-and-2 with 3:04 left in the third quarter.

The Steelers' next possession ended on an 8-yard touchdown pass from Rudolph to McDonald that capped a 12-play, 75-yard march in 6:40. Rudolph's pass to Smith-Schuster for a two-point conversion was intercepted and the Seahawks retained the lead at 21-19 with 11:16 left in regulation.

A 41-yard field goal by Boswell had snapped a 7-7 tie with 2:28 remaining in the second quarter.

The Steelers had taken over following a punt at their 28 with 5:54 left prior to halftime. The Seahawks were guilty of defensive holding on the first snap of the drive. Roethlisberger then connected on three straight passes, one to Smith-Schuster, one to wide receiver **James Washington** and another to Smith-Schuster, for a combined 39 yards to the Seahawks' 28. The drive stalled thanks in part to an offensive pass interference penalty against McDonald on third-and-4 from the Seahawks' 22.

Seattle had tied the game at 7-7 on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to tight end Dissly, who caught the ball in the end zone behind Bush and in front of Davis. The Seahawks had kicked a field goal on fourth-and-3 from the Steelers' 28, but Steelers defensive tackle **Dan McCullers** was called for unnecessary roughness and that set Seattle up with a first down at the Steelers' 14.

A penalty had also negated the Steelers' first touchdown.

Inside linebacker **Mark Barron** recovered a fumble created by outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** late in the first quarter and returned the ball 34 yards for a score, but Davis was called for an illegal block behind Barron as Barron was running into the end zone.

The Steelers took over at the Seahawks' 22 and attained a first-and-goal at the Seattle 1 after outside linebacker Mychal Kendricks was called for pass interference on a fade to running back **Jaylen Samuels** at the end zone pylon. Conner followed with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Steelers sacked Wilson four times in the first half.

**PITTSBURGH** — QB **Ben Roethlisberger** threw three touchdowns and RB DeAngelo Williams rushed for three touchdowns as the Steelers beat the 49ers, 43-18, in the 2015 home opener in front of a record-setting crowd (66,472) at Heinz Field.

Roethlisberger threw a two-yard score to TE Heath Miller late in the first quarter, and then threw a two-point conversion to WR Antonio Brown to give Pittsburgh an 8-0 lead. San Francisco K Phil Dawson connected on a 47-yard field goal early in the second quarter to cut the lead 8-3, but it would be the closest the 49ers would get the rest of the game.

The Steelers scored three straight touchdowns, the first of which was a Williams two-yard run. Roethlisberger then connected with WR Darrius Heyward-Bey for a 35-yard touchdown. Williams scored on a nother two-yard run to give

Pittsburgh a 29-3 lead at halftime.

QB Colin Kaepernick threw a 14-yard touchdown to WR Anquan Boldin early in the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 29-10, but Williams scored his third rushing touchdown of the game on the Steelers' ensuing drive to make it 36-10. Kaepernick threw a 75-yard touchdown to WR Torrey Smith on the 49ers next drive, but it was countered by a Roethlisberger seven-yard touchdown pass to Brown.

Pittsburgh's offense finished a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone, and the Steelers' defense recorded five sacks. LB **Ryan Shazier** led the team with 15 tackles.
