DIGGING UP NUGGETS FOR SAN FRANCISCO'S WEEK 6 GAME AT THE LOS ANGELES RAMS



DYNAMIC DUO

With 17 tackles, 3.0 sacks, 2 FFs, 1 FR and 1 PD in 2019, DL **DeForest Buckner** is 1 of 2 players in the NFL with at least 15 tackles, 3.0 sacks, 2 FFs and 1 FR on the season (Khalil Mack, 🙋 Chi.).

With at least 1.0 sack and 1 FF vs. LAR (10/13/19). Buckner would become the first member of the 49ers with 1.0-or-more sacks and 1-or-more FFs in 3-consecutive games since DE Roy Barker accomplished the feat in Weeks 12-14 of 1996.

Buckner also looks for his 4th-consecutive game with at least 1.0 sack. In doing so, he would become the first member of the 49ers with 1.0-or-more sacks in at least 4-consecutive

> games since LB Aldon Smith in Weeks 7-14 (Week 9 Bye) of the 2012 season.

> > · DL Nick Bosa comes in this week as the reigning NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 5 performance vs. Cle. (10/7/19) where he registered 4 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 1 FF and 1 FR. Bosa became the first 49ers rookie since LB Chris Borland (2014 Week 11) to win NFC Defensive Player of the Week.

The 49ers have registered 27 runs that have gone for 10-or-more yds., tied for the most in the NFL (Min. - 27).

The 49ers have picked up 38 rushing 1st downs this season, tied for the 5th-most in the NFL (Bal. - 56; Ind. - 47; Dal. - 43; Oak. - 39; Buf. - 38).

San Francisco's 800 rushing yds. through 4 games are the most by the team in games 1-4 since 1959 (826) and the 4th-most in franchise history. The Niners are averaging 9.5 rushing 1st

GOLDEN NUGGETS

- San Francisco has allowed just 6 total TDs in 2019, the 2nd-fewest in the NFL this season (NE - 4). In addition, the 49ers are the only team in the NFL to not allow a rushing TD this season.
- The Niners have scored 42 pts. off of takeaways, the 2nd-most in the NFL this season (TB - 52).
- The 49ers have a +70 point differential in 2019, ranking 2nd in the NFL (NE - +121).
