#### GIANTS AT PATRIOTS

The New York Giants travel to New England to play the defending Super Bowl Champion Patriots in Week 6 on Thursday, Oct. 10. Kickoff is 8:20pm in Gillette Stadium. This is the first Thursday Night Football meeting between the Giants and the Patriots.

This week's game marks the 11th regular-season meeting between the two teams. A win on Thursday would improve the Giants' alltime record against the Patriots to 5-6. A victory would also improve the Giants' road record vs. New England to 4-2.

The teams last met on Nov. 15, 2015, when the Patriots beat the Giants, 27-26, in MetLife Stadium. The teams last met in Gillette Stadium on Nov. 6, 2011, when the Giants beat the Patriots, 24-20.

The undefeated Patriots are 5-0 after a 33-7 win over the Washington Redskins in Week 5.

## COACH OF THE WEEK: RICH TUERO





The New York Giants and Gatorade have selected Rich Tuero of Lyndhurst High School as the Lou Rettino High School Coach of the Week for Week 4 of the 2019 season.

The Lou Rettino High School Football Coach of the Week Award is part of the Giants' continuing effort to support local youth football programs. The Gignts elected to name the award in memory of former Union High School (NJ) coach Lou Rettino for his fine commitment to the game of football, his community and the betterment of his athletes' lives. Each week during the high school football season, the Giants select one area high school head coach as the Coach of the Week winner. The selection is based on the coach's continuing commitment towards promoting youth football, developing motivated student-athletes and his overall community involvement.

Coach Tuero is in his 6th year as the head coach at his alma mater, Lyndhurst High School. During his tenure, Coach Tuero has guided the Golden Bears to four state playoff appearances. The Golden Bears continue to improve year in and year out and have become one of the more respected programs in the NJIC. In 2018, the Golden Bears returned to the state championship game for the first time since 1983.

Coach Tuero was named the NJIC Liberty Coach of the Year and the NorthJerseySports.com Coach of the year in 2018. The Lyndhurst Golden Bear community was honored by NorthJerseySports.com as "Fans of the Year" in 2018.

"Rich is a great coach who takes pride in his program and community," commented Jeff Radigan, the Lyndhurst Supervisor of Athletics. "In my six years working with him, I have seen him go above and beyond for the kids on a regular basis. He preaches family and teaches life lessons to our student athletes. He uses football as an avenue to help kids develop the core values that are needed in life."

#### SPECIAL OLYMPICS





On Tuesday, Oct.1, the New York Giants hosted 100 young athletes with the Special Olympics of New Jersey at MetLife Stadium. Evan Engram, Jake Carlock, Freedom Akinmoladun, and Austin Walker each coached stations and taught the children how to catch a pass, run routes, make a correct tackle, and kick a field goal. This Play 60 event encouraged the children to be active for at least 60 minutes a day. The event concluded with lunch in the MetLife 50 Club.





Since 2009, the NFL has partnered with the American Cancer Society to save lives from cancer through fundraising, education, and awareness initiatives. In honor of the NFL's Crucial Catch month, members of the Giants organization who have experienced cancer in their family spent Monday, Sept. 30, serving dinner and spending time with patients at the American Cancer Society's Hope Lodge Jerome L. Greene Family Center in New York City. Darius Slayton, Chad Slade, Nick Gates, Dalvin Tomlinson, and Garrett Dickerson were among the players that visited the patients.

Hope Lodge provides a free home away from home for cancer patients and caregivers. It is a nurturing community that offers a supportive and homelike environment near cancer treatment centers. There are 30 Hope Lodge locations around the United States and Puerto Rico. The New York City location opened in 2007, and has 60 guest rooms for patients undergoing cancer treatments.








A 32-year coaching veteran, Shula is in his 28th season as an NFL assistant, he also served four years as the head coach of the University of Alabama (2003-2006).

2018 SEASON: In Bettcher's first year with the team in 2018, the defense improved across the board in the NFL rankings in yardage allowed, including total yards (31st to 24th), rushing yards (27th to 20th), and passing yards (31st to 23rd), The unit also registered 30 sacks, three more than the previous season, and the Giants' 21 takeaways and 16 interceptions were also higher than the team's 2018 totals.
