


CAROLINA PANTHERS (1-1) AT NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (2-0)

CAROLINA vs NEW ENGLAND

- The Panthers travel to face off with the defending Super Bowl Champion New England Patriots in their third game of the preseason Thursday night.
- Carolina enters the game with a 1-1 preseason record after beating Chicago in their first preseason game, followed by a loss to the Buffalo Bills last week, 27-14.
- New England has a 2-0 preseason record after defeating Detroit and Tennessee.
- This week will mark the 11th preseason meeting between the Panthers and Patriots, and the fifth matchup since 2014. New England leads the preseason series over the Panthers with a 7-3 record against Carolina, while the Panthers lead the regular season and postseason series with a 4-3 record.

BILLS TOP PANTHERS

Carolina fell to Buffalo in the second game of the preseason. Carolina's defense allowed 10 points to the Bills' first-team offense.

The Panthers' 14 points came from two Joey Slye field goals (40 yards and 54 yards) and a nine-yard touchdown catch by WR Rashad Ross from QB Taylor Heinicke. RB Reggie Bonnafon followed the touchdown with a successful rushing score on the two-point attempt.

A majority of the players in the normal starting lineups for both teams saw game action, but the Panthers did not play five key starters:

GROUND ATTACK

Carolina averaged 4.9 yards per rushing attempt against a Buffalo and ecsliped the 100-yard mark in the process. The team finished with 103 rushing yards on 21 attempts.

Rookie RB Jordan Scarlett led the team with 35 yards on 8 attempts (4.4 avg). Carolina's top three rushers from the Buffalo game are below:



SACKS

On Buffalo's opening drive of the game, CB **Corn Elder** and LB/DE **Mario Addison** combined to bring down Bills QB Josh Allen for a sack.

The Panthers have tallied 3.0 sacks through the preseason which ties the team's overall mark from the entire 2018 preseason.

Carolina's 2019 first-round draft pick LB/DE **Brian Burns** leads the team with 2.0 sacks through the team's first two games.



FIRST INTERCEPTION

CB Lorenzo Doss recorded the first interception by a Panther this preseason.

On the Bills' final drive of the third quarter, Buffalo QB Tyree Jackson threw a deep ball intended for WR Victor Bolden Jr. Doss ran under the ball in the endzone and leaped for the interception, resulting in a touchback.



LEADING SCORER



The Panthers signed kicker Joey Slye one week before the preseason opening game at Chicago. Through two games, Slye has made all 5 field goals and converted each of his 2 PAT attempts.

His 17 points scored this preseason are the most on the team.

HEINICKE LEADS OFFENSE

Fourth-year QB **Taylor Heinicke** led the Panthers with a 112.5 passer rating against the Bills.

Heinicke finished the game with 78 yards and 1 touchdown while completing 9-of-12 attempts. His nine-yard passing touchdown to WR Rashad Ross was Carolina's only touchdown on the night.

- Panthers WR Chris Hogan played for the Patriots from 2015-17. During his time there, he played in three Super Bowls and won two.
- Panthers DT Kyle Love was signed by New England as an undrafted free agent and played for the Patriots from 2010-13.
- Panthers QB Taylor Heinicke spent the spent 2016 on the New England practice squad and was active for three games, serving as the backup quarterback and seeing action in one game.

- Panthers DE Bryan Cox Jr.'s father played for the Patriots in 2001.

Patriots from 2015-17. During his time there, he played

in three Super Bowls and won two.

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011. In eight seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

Rivera inherited a 2-14 Carolina team as a rookie head coach in 2011 and guided it back to relevance with four playoffs appearances since 2013, the second-most playoff berths in the NFC over that six-year period. In that span, the Panthers recorded 58 wins, tied for the most in any six-year period in franchise history, and fifth-most in the NFL.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts.

Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, the Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008. Before joining the Panthers, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970). A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at California (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif. He and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Head Coach Defensive Coordinator Inside Linebackers Defensive Coordinator Linebackers Defensive Quality Control Bill Belichick is in his 45th season as an NFL coach and his 20th season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Belichick has led the Patriots to 18 consecutive winning seasons (2001-18).

Through 19 seasons with New England, Belichick has delivered six Super Bowl championships, nine conference titles, 16 division crowns and 30 playoff victories, while posting an overall record of 255-89.

Belichick won his sixth Super Bowl title in 2018 with the Patriots 13-3 victory over the Los Angeles Rams. He joined George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only coaches with six NFL championships and owns the record for most Super Bowl titles, two ahead of Chuck Noll, who is in second with four Super Bowl titles.

Belichick has recorded 292 career wins as a head coach, which is third in NFL history. He owns a career winning percentage of .685, which is first all-time in NFL history. Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003), XXXIX (2004), XLIX (2014), LI (2016) and LIII (2018), and in 2007 he became the first NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular-season record.

His 16 division titles are the most among any coach. He also is the first NFL head coach to lead his team to 10 straight division crowns (2009-18). Belichick helped the Patriots become the first franchise in NFL history to score 500 or more points in four seasons (2007-589, 2010-518, 2011-513 and 2012-557).

Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win at least 14 regular-season games in five separate seasons. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive victories, including the postseason (21 from 2003-04) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Over a 100-game span from 2003-09, he directed the Patriots to an 81 wins — the most in NFL history by a head coach.

Belichick's recent accomplishments are the latest triumphs in a career during which he has helped produce eight Super Bowl titles, 12 conference championships and 23 division titles since entering the NFL in 1975.

Belichick's career record is 292-134.

Belichick was a center/tight end at Wesleyan 1971-74.

Carolina needs 10 wins to reach 200 regular season wins in franchise history. Dating back to the Panthers' first season in 1995, the team has an overall record of 190-193-1 during the regular season.



Ron Rivera needs three wins in the regular season to pass John Fox (73 wins; 2002-10) as the winningest coach in franchise history. Rivera's career record is 71-56-1 (.559) in the regular season.

QB Cam Newton needs 121 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham (4,928) for the second-most rushing yards by a quarterback in league history. Cam Newton has totaled 4,808 rushing yards in his career. Newton can also become the first quarterback to ever rush for 700+yards in four seasons.

RB Christian McCaffrey needs 292 yards from scrimmage to break the franchise record for scrimmage yards by any Panther through his first three seasons. His 3,051 yards only trail DeAngelo Williams (3,342 yards; 2006-08).



TE Greg Olsen can move into sixth place all-time in touchdowns by a tight end in NFL history by scoring six times. Olsen currently has 57 touchdowns, trailing Vernon Davis and Shannon Sharpe, who are tied for sixth with 62 touchdown catches

According to press box stats, **LB Luke Kuechly** (948) needs 52 tackles in 2019 to hit 1,000 career tackles. He also needs just 19 tackles to pass Brian Urlacher (966) for the most through a player's first eight seasons in NFL history.



LB/DE Mario Addison (45.5 sacks) needs 10 sacks in 2019 to tie Mike Rucker (55.5 sacks) for the third-most sacks in franchise history.



LS J.J. Jansen has played in 160 career games with Carolina, the fifth most by any Panther player. He can tie Thomas Davis (176; 2005-18) for the third-most games played in franchise history by playing in 16 games this

A RUNNING HISTORY

Carolina has boasted a top-10 rushing offense in seven of the last eight seasons, including ranking fourth in 2018. Under Ron Rivera, the Panthers have gone 64-36-1 when rushing for over 100 yards in a game in the regular season.



Newton is the **only player** to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (182) and career rushing touchdowns (58). Newton is the **first quarterback** in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 39 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the **most in NFL history**.







TOTAL YARDS

Newton ranks **third in NFL history** for the most combined yards through a quarterback's first eight seasons. He tallied 3,883 total yards in 2018 (3,395 passing, 488 rushing).

Newton is **one of just two players in NFL history**, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first eight seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

GAME-WINNING DRIVES

Newton has led **17 career game-winning drives** (defined as a drive that puts the team ahead for good in the fourth quarter or overtime).

Jake Delhomme owns the franchise record with 21 game-winning drives.




Running back Christian McCaffrey racked up a **franchise-record 1,965 yards** from scrimmage in his sophomore season in 2018.

MOORE LIFE

Wide receiver DJ Moore had a standout rookie season in 2018. He posted the **most scrimmage yards** (960) and second-most receiving yards (788) by **any rookie wide receiver** in the NFL. He also had the second-most scrimmage yards by a rookie wide receiver in franchise history (Kelvin Benjamin, 1,008 - 2014).

Moore led all wide receivers on the team with 55 receptions and 788 receiving yards, averaging 14.3 yards per catch. He also averaged 7.7 yards after the catch, which **topped the league** among qualifying receivers.

A dual threat, Moore also racked up 172 yards on the ground, the second most among all NFL wide receivers.


Kuechly ranks fourth in career tackles among all currently active players in the NFL.

Kuechly has the most tackles (press box) over any player's first seven seasons played. His 9.3 tackles per game (press box) rank as the **second-highest average** (Zach Thomas - 9.8) in **NFL history** (min. 50 games played).

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 1,086 career tackles, second-most in team history.

Addison started as an undrafted free agent out of Troy, signing with the Chicago Bears in 2011 and landing on the Panthers in 2012.

He has 45.5 career sacks which ranks third in the NFL among active players that were undrafted free agents. Addison now ranks fourth in franchise history in sacks.

ACTION JACKSON

Jackson finished his rookie campaign tied for seventh in the NFL with four interceptions. This marked the **second most interceptions** by a rookie in team history, only trailing Chris Gamble's six picks in 2004.



On Monday Night Football in Week 15 last season vs New Orleans, Jackson picked off a pass on a two-point conversion attempt and returned it the length of the field for two points, giving Carolina its first ever two-point defensive return.

SHORT STANDS TALL

Since the start of 2015, Kawann Short has 27.5 sacks, tied for **third in the NFL** by a defensive tackle over the past four seasons. ROUND 1 • 16TH PICK (16TH OVERALL)

The Panthers' 2019 first round selection finished his collegiate career **ranked fifth in school history** with **24.0** sacks. In his final season at Florida State, Burns was named to Phil Steele's All-America team, All-ACC First Team and Bednarik Award semifinalist

ROUND 2 • 5TH PICK (37TH OVERALL)

Little was a three-year player at Ole Miss with 29 career starts at left tackle, including all 24 in his sophomore (2017) and junior seasons (2018). According to Pro Football Focus, Little allowed just **26 total pressures** and three sacks in **993 pass-blocking** snaps over his final two seasons

ROUND 3 · 37TH PICK (100TH OVERALL)

Though he only played two seasons at West Virginia, Grier finished career with **71** touchdown passes and **7,354** career passing yards with the Mountaineers, ranking second and third in both categories in program history. He finished the 2018 season as the **NCAA active leader in passing yards per game** (305.6) and ranked fifth in the NCAA in career pass efficiency (165.1).

ROUND 4 • 13TH PICK (115TH OVERALL)

Carolina selected Miller in the fourth round after he played four years at Alabama. In his final season with the Crimson Tide, he tallied 36 tackles, including 11.5 for loss, 8.5 sacks and a team-high 12 quarterback hurries.

ROUND 5 • 16TH PICK (154TH OVERALL)

Scarlett played three years with Florida prior to being the Panthers' fifth round draft selection. In his three years with the Gators, he racked up 1,846 yards and 12 touchdowns.

ROUND 6 · 40TH PICK (212TH OVERALL)

Daley played two seasons at South Carolina after transferring from Georgia Military College. He started **23** of the last **24** games with the Gamebooks. Daley played left tackle in 2018 and the second half of 2017 after beginning season at guard.
