NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (10-1) AT HOUSTON TEXANS (7-4)

Sunday, Dec. 1 • NRG Stadium (71,995) • 8:20 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots improved to 10-1 following a win over Dallas and have now won at least 10 games for an NFL record 17 straight seasons (2003-19).

This week, the Patriots travel to face the AFC South-leading Houston Texans, a team the Patriots have beat in each of the last four regular seasons. New England last traveled to Houston to play the Texans in 2015, with each of the last three meetings taking place at Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots will try to extend their NFL record to 10 straight seasons with at least 11 wins with a victory over the Texans this week.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by **NBC** and can be seen locally on **NBC 10 Boston**. **AI Michaels** will handle play-by-play duties with **Cris Collinsworth** as the color analyst. **Michael Tafoya** will work from the sidelines. NATIONAL RADIO: Sunday's game will be broadcast to a national audience on **Westwood One. Kevin Kugler** will call the with game with **Jason Taylor** providing analysis.

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots will face Houston for the fifth straight year in the regular season and for the first time at Houston since a 27-6 New England win on Dec. 13, 2015, which was also played on Sunday Night Football.

Last season, the Patriots opened the year with a 27-20 win vs. Houston on Sept. 9. 2018. at Gillette Stadium.

In 2016, the Patriots and Texans played twice with New England taking a 27-0 victory on in the regular season and a 34-16 win in the Divisional Playoffs. Both games were played at Gillette Stadium.

Overall, the Patriots have played the Texans 11 times and hold a 10-1 advantage, including 8-1 in the regular season and 2-0 in the postseason.

The Patriots are 3-1 against the Texans when playing in Houston.

New England's only loss against Houston was in the final game of the 2009 regular season when Houston defeated the Patriots, 34-27. The Patriots had already clinched the division prior to that game and Tom Brady was relieved for portions of that game by then backup QB Brian Hoyer.

Before the Texans joined the league, the Patriots and the Houston Oilers were foes dating back to the days of the American Football League, playing twice a year from 1960-69 and 33 times overall before the Oilers moved to Tennessee following the 1996 season. The Houston Texans inaugural season was 2002.

NEAR-RECORD PICK PACE

CB Stephon Gilmore second quarter interception was the Patriots 20th pick of the season. It is the 8th time under Bill Belichick that the Patriots have recorded at least 20 interceptions in a season. The 2019 Patriots are on pace to finish with 29 interceptions. The most interceptions in the Belichick era was 29 by the 2003 Patriots.

PATS TIE BLOCKED PUNT RECORD

Matthew Slater blocked a first-quarter punt that was recovered by DB Nate Ebner at the Dallas 12-yard line to help set up the Patriots first touchdown. It is the third blocked punt by the Patriots in 2019, tying the team record. The Patriots also blocked three punts in 1986. The Patriots returned their first two blocked punts this season for touchdowns. Rookie DL Chase Winovich returned a first quarter blocked punt by RB Brandon Bolden 6 yards for a touchdown vs. NY Giants on Oct. 10. In the win at Buffalo on Sept. 29, Slater returned a blocked punt by J.C. Jackson 11 yards for a touchdown.

PILING UP SCORELESS QUARTERS

The Patriots have held teams scoreless in 26-of-44 quarters. The most scoreless quarters by a defense since 1970 is 40 by the Baltimore Ravens in 2000.

UNBEATEN AGAINST NFC EAST

The Patriots improved to a 4-0 record in NFC play, all against the NFC East. They won 33-7 at Washington, 35-14 vs. N.Y. Giants, 17-10 at Philadelphia and 13-9 over Dallas.

PATS EXTEND WIN STREAK OVER COWBOYS

The Patriots won their sixth straight game against Dallas. The Patriots lost the first seven times the two teams played and have now won the last six meetings.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

ANOTHER DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN SEASON FOR BELICHICK

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 17 straight seasons with 10 or more wins, adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. George Seifert has the second most consecutive 10-win seasons with eight from 1989-1996 for San Francisco.

BRADY REMAINS UNBLEMISHED AGAINST DALLAS

Tom Brady remains undefeated against the Dallas Cowboys with a 5-0 record. Brady is undefeated against five teams — Atlanta (5-0), Chicago (5-0), Dallas (5-0), Minnesota (5-0) and Tampa Bay (4-0).

BRADY EXTENDS TD MARK

Brady has thrown a touchdown pass to 75 different players in the regular season, extending his record for most touchdown targets by an NFL quarterback after a 10-yard touchdown pass to WR N'Keal Harry in the first quarter.

CAREER PACE FOR EDELMAN

Through the first 11 games of the 2019 season, WR Julian Edelman has 76 receptions for 809 yards and is on pace for 110 receptions for 1,176 yards, which would be a career best. He posted career highs with 105 receptions in 2013 and 1,106 yards receiving in 2016. He has surpassed his 2018 totals of 74 receptions and needs 41 yards to move past his 2018 total of 850 yards receiving. Edelman caught eight passes for 93 yards against the Cowboys.



INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM NOTES



ROBERT KRAFT CHAIRMAN 8 CEO

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 26 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success



rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (18), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (23) and have the fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 26 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 20 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. Kraft earned his 23rd winning season in 26 years of owning the franchise in 2019.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

- Kraft entered 2019 with 33 postseason victories, third-most in NFL history for any ownership group. He sits one playoff win behind the Green Bay Packers (34) and three behind Pittsburgh's Rooney family (36) for most postseason wins by an ownership group. The Rooney Family founded the Steelers in 1933, while the Packers were founded in 1919.
- The Patriots have won six Super Bowls under Kraft's ownership, tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for most Super Bowl championships in NFL history.

DYNASTY VS. DYNASTY

Of all of the great teams throughout the Super Bowl era, the New England Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers have set a standard of extended excellence above all of the others. The 49ers run of success spanned two decades, while New England's streak is still in progress.

A WINNING TRADITION

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. Al Davis of Oakland accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

A WINNING TRADITION

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.703) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason) with one team. He is one of just four owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 322 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 321-136 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 26 times in their 59-year history. Twenty of those playoff berths have come in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 21 division crowns, including 16 in the last 18 seasons and 18 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

TEAM - WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- The Patriots set an NFL record by reaching eight consecutive conference title games (2011-18).
- The Patriots entered the 2019 season tied with San Francisco with 15 conference championship game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh.
- New England entered the 2019 season with 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Pittsburgh is second with 36 playoff wins alltime.
- The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs for 10 straight seasons (2009-18), the most in NFL history. Dallas and Indianapolis are tied for second with nine consecutive seasons with a playoff berth.
- The Patriots extended their NFL record with 10 straight division titles last year (2009-18).
- The Patriots set an NFL record for most consecutive seasons with at least one playoff win with eight straight (2011-18 – 16 total playoff wins). If they qualify for the postseason in 2019, the team will look to extend that streak to nine.
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds and need one more to tie San Francisco (8) and Denver (8) for the most since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since the current playoff format was instituted in 1990. Pittsburgh is second with nine byes since 1990. The Patriots are the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have won 16 postseason games this decade (2010-present), the most postseason wins in a decade in NFL history.
- The Patriots enter the 2019 season with nine straight home playoff wins, third in NFL history to the 13 by Green Bay (1939-2001) and the 11 by New England (1996-08).
- The Patriots have played in 57 postseason games and need to play in three more postseason games in 2019 to become the third NFL team to play in 60 postseason games, joining Dallas (63) and Pittsburgh (61).
- The Patriots (2010-18) entered 2019 with an NFL record nine consecutive seasons with at least 11 wins. Indianapolis is second with seven (2003-09).
- The Patriots are tied with Dallas with a dozen 12-win seasons since 1970 and need one more to tie San Francisco for the most with 13 12-win seasons.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with nine.
- The Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
 New England has 27 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Indianapolis is second with 17 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 138 wins in this decade (regular season and playoffs combined), the most wins in a decade in NFL history, and look to add to that number.

- New England has 17 straight home regular-season wins, the third longest home streak in team history to the 20 (2008-11) and 18 (2002-05).
- The Patriots finished the 2018 season with 436 points and have reached 400 or more points in 12 straight seasons (2007-18), extending their NFL record. The San Diego Chargers previously held the record by scoring at least 400 points in eight straight seasons from 2004-11. The New Orleans Saints have the second-longest active streak after scoring 400 points for the eighth straight season in 2018.

2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The Patriots (121) won their 116th regular-season game this decade (2010-present) vs. N.Y. Jets on Sept. 22, 2019, moving out of a tie with Indianapolis (2000-09) for the most regular-season wins in a decade.
- The Patriots have achieved 19 straight seasons with a record of .500 or better, second all-time behind the 21 seasons by Dallas (1965-85) after improving to 8-0 with the win vs. Cleveland on Oct. 27, 2019.
- With their ninth win of the season, the Patriots secured their 34th winning season in 2019 to move out of a tie with Dallas into second all-time behind the 36 winning seasons by Pittsburgh.
- The Patriots have posted a winning record for 19 straight seasons (2001-19), the most since the 1970 merger and the second-most alltime, behind Dallas with 20 straight winning seasons (1966-85).
- The Patriots have won at least 10 games for 17 consecutive seasons (2003-19), moving past San Francisco (16 - 1983-98) for the most consecutive seasons with at least 10 victories.
- CB Stephon Gilmore was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for October for his performance in helping lead the team to a 4-0 record. Gilmore had 11 tackles, seven passes defensed and two interceptions as part of a defense that held its opponents to just three touchdowns for the entire month. He had a career-high five passes defensed and one interception in the 35-14 win over the New York Giants on Oct 10
- DB Devin McCourty was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for September after he intercepted a pass in each of the first four games of the season, tying a team record for most consecutive games with an interception. McCourty became the first player in the NFL to record an interception in each of his team's first four games of the season since Minnesota's Brian Russell in 2003 and the first Patriots player ever to achieve the feat.
- LB Kyle Van Noy was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week following a Week 4 win at Buffalo. Van Noy led the team with eight tackles, two sacks, three quarterback hits and two forced fumbles. Late in the game with the Patriots holding a 16-10 lead and the Buffalo offense at the New England 39-yard line, Van Noy hit Buffalo QB Matt Barkley, forcing a pass that was intercepted by LB Jamie Collins to secure the victory.
- P Jake Bailey has earned two AFC Special Teams Player of the Week Awards after a Week 3 win over the Jets and a Week 11 win at Philadelphia. Bailey is the first rookie to be awarded two Special Teams Player of the Week honors in the same season since Kansas City Chiefs K Harrison Butker in 2017. Bailey and San Francisco DE Nick Bosa are the only NFL rookies with multiple Player of the Week honors in 2019.

His 45 consecutive years as an NFL coach are tied for first in NFL history with the 45 by Dick LeBeau. CAREER NOTES

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 217 of his 278 career regular-season starts, compiling a .781 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady's 155 career wins in his first 200 starts were the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 career starts.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

- Tom Brady (532) currently sits second all-time with in career touchdown passes, behind Peyton Manning (539). Drew Brees is third with 531 career touchdown passes.
- If Brady throws 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2019, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in at least eight seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (10).
- Brady is tied with Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Aaron Rodgers with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2019 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns, for the most in NFL history.
- Brady has passed for 4,000 yards 10 times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards again in 2019, he will be the third player to reach 4,000 yards 11 times, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12).
- Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, the fourth time he led the NFL in that category. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.
- Brady has 247 career victories (regular season and playoffs combined), the most wins all-time by an NFL player.
- Brady is tied with eight other NFL players with two games with six or more touchdowns and needs one more game with six or more touchdowns to tie Peyton Manning, who had three games with six or more touchdowns.
- Tom Brady owns the NFL record with 30 Player of the Week awards and 10 Player of the Month honors.
- Brady has the NFL record with 58 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions.
- Brady has played in 280 NFL games, which is third all-time among NFL quarterbacks, behind George Blanda (340) and Brett Favre (302).
- Brady has started every game in 15 seasons, third all-time for a quarterback, behind the 16 seasons by Peyton Manning and 17 seasons by Brett Favre. If he starts every game in 2019, he will tie Manning.
- Brady (14) needs one more Pro Bowl berth to move past Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14) and Merlin Olsen (14) for the most Pro Bowl berths.

2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 Brady is playing his 20th season with the Patriots in 2019, joining Darrell Green (20 - Washington), Jackie Slater (20 - L.A. Rams) and Jason Hanson (21 - Detroit) as the only players with at least 20 NFL seasons played with one team.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State, where as a senior, he completed 56 percent of his passes (153-of-275 for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the team's leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver,

outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

FATHERLY ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told the Boston Herald. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater was named to seven straight Pro Bowls (2011-17) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the ninth straight season in 2019.

The special teams ace shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eightman rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

SLATER SCORES FIRST CAREER TOUCHDOWN

On Nov. 10, 2007, in the third quarter of UCLA's 24-20 loss to Arizona State, Matthew Slater returned a kickoff 89 yards for the final touchdown of his collegiate career. In Patriots 16-10 win over Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019, DB J.C. Jackson blocked a punt, which Slater returned 11 yards for his first NFL touchdown, nearly 12 years after his last touchdown.

OL JOE THUNEY

DL ADAM BUTLER

2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Adam Butler has set a new single-season career-high in 2019 with 5½ sacks. The third-year defensive lineman's previous best was three sacks in 2018.

CAREER-DEFINING CONTEST

Adam Butler arrived at Vanderbilt as an accomplished high school offensive lineman and spent his freshman season redshirting as a backup at center and guard. During his first offseason, Butler entered a rib eating contest, which judges ruled his team had lost. Butler disagreed and began arguing with the judges. Then Commodore defensive coordinator Bob Shoop was in attendance and witnessed Butler's demeanor and was impressed with his competitive attitude. Shoop convinced then head coach James Franklin to ask Butler to transition to defense.

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, and I wanted whatever was best for the team," Butler told The Tennessean. "Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

LB JAMIE COLLINS SR.

2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Jamie Collins Sr. has set a new career single-season mark with six sacks so far in 2019. Now playing in his seventh season, his previous career high was $5\frac{1}{2}$ sacks in 2015 with New England.
- Collins Sr. has three interceptions so far in 2019, a single-season career high. He had recorded two interceptions twice in his career (2014 and 2016).

PATH TO THE NFL

The road to the NFL was anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins Sr. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Quentin, Miss., Collins Sr. lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters. Collins Sr. turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times.

"It means a lot. It's my living," Collins Sr. told the *Boston Herald*. "It kept me on track." Collins Sr.'s resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots teammate Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend.

"What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the Herald. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and still finds a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and done a pretty good job as a rookie."

DB NATE EBNER

SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLING MACHINE

DB Nate Ebner led the Patriots in 2018 with 13 special teams tackles. Ebner has now tallied at least 10 special teams tackles every season in his seven-year career, with the exception of 2017 when he was limited to nine games due to injury and finished with eight special teams tackles. He posted a career-high 19 special teams tackles in 2016.

WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this num-

ber," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER'S SECOND SCORE

Hightower returned a fumble recovery 26 yards for a touchdown vs. Cleveland, his 94th regular-season game as a Patriot (109th including playoffs), the second touchdown of his career. His first touchdown was scored in his first NFL game on Sept. 9, 2012 at Tennessee.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN 2019

 The Patriots with Devin and Jason McCourty and the Seahawks with Shaquem and Shaquil Griffin are the only NFL teams to feature twins on their roster this season. Trey and Terrell Edmunds (brothers) are also teammates on the Steelers.

2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- McCourty moved past Asante Samuel for sole possession of 10th alltime on the franchise interception list and now has 26 career interceptions.
- McCourty had one interception in each of the first four games of the 2019 season, tying a team record for most consecutive games with at least one interception. Mike Haynes set the original mark with a pick in four straight games in 1976. McCourty is the first player to record an interception in each of his team's first four games of the season since Minnesota's Brian Russell in 2003. McCourty is the first Patriots player to achieve the feat.

PICK LEADER

Devin McCourty is tied for the NFL lead with five interceptions this season, his third career season with five-plus interceptions. That mark is tied with Marcus Peters and Earl Thomas for most seasons with 5-plus interception seasons since 2010. Additionally, McCourty's 26 regular-season interceptions since he entered the league in 2010 are tied for fourth-most in the NFL

DB Devin McCourty's 84-yard interception return for a touchdown in the win at Buffalo on Oct. 29, 2018 was his first career interception returned for a touchdown and the ninth-longest in team history. The pick-six was McCourty's second career score. His first touchdown came on a 104-yard kickoff return vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 21, 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots last year. The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels. Shaquill and Shaquem Griffin of the Seattle Seahawks also accomplished this unique occurrence on Kickoff Weekend. New England also had twins on the team in 2017, with TE Jacob Hollister on the roster and WR Cody Hollister on the practice squad.



Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and was a year behind his brother in eligibility. Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. McCourty was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

IN GOOD COMPANY

Devin McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

BROTHERS IN ARMS

Devin and Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.

VAN NOY SCORES TWICE IN 2018

Van Noy recovered a fumble and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown in the regular-season finale win over N.Y. Jets (12/30/18). It marked his second touchdown of the season. He returned a blocked punt 29-yards for a touchdown at Chicago (10/21/18), becoming the first Patriots player with two non-offensive touchdowns in a season since DB Kyle Arrington scored two touchdowns in 2014.

- On the Bears first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown that gave the Patriots a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular-season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).

New England has qualified for the playoffs 26 times in its 59-year history. The Patriots have earned 20 of those playoff berths in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 21 division crowns overall (20 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976).



The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.

A DECADE OF DOMINANCE (2000-09)

When Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that just 18 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. A DECADE OF DOMINANCE (2010-19)

The New England Patriots have earned more wins (139) in the past decade (2010-2019) than any other team in the NFL has over any 10-year span with 115 regular-season victories and 16 playoffs wins. They also own the highest winning percentage (.703) of any team in professional sports since 1994. The Patriots also won a league-leading three Super Bowls in the 2010s, increasing their total to six and tying them with the Pittsburgh Steelers for most all-time. The Patriots won more conference championships (5), appeared in more conference championship games (8) and won more division titles (9) than any other NFL team. This landmark decade comes on the heels of another dominant decade, as the Patriots also led the NFL in Super Bowl victories, conference championships, conference championship game appearances and division titles in the 2000s.
