## WEEK IS ATL AT S.F.

### FALCONS HEAD WEST

For Week 15, the Falcons travel west to face the San Francisco 49ers at Levi's Stadium. These two franchises have faced each other 77 times, with the 49ers leading the series 46-30-1.

Their last matchup was on Dec. 18, 2016, as the Falcons defeated the 49ers, 41-13, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. Devonta Freeman ran for 139 yards and three rushing touchdowns while Matt Ryan threw for 286 yards and two touchdowns in the victory.

In Week 14, the Falcons defeated the Panthers, 40-20, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. All three phases came together for the win as the Falcons won the turnover margin with two interceptions and two fumble recoveries, the offense totaled 461 yards and special teams produced four field goals and one fumble recovery.

Matt Ryan completed 20-for-34 passes for 313 vards, including two touchdowns, for a 109.1 passer rating. Ryan's second touchdown of the day, a 93-yard pass to Olamide Zaccheaus, is the longest pass of his career. Ryan also surpassed 50,000 yards in his 186th game, becoming the second-fastest player in the NFL to do so.

Julio Jones posted five receptions for 66 yards, surpassing 1,000 yards for the sixth-consecutive year. The nine-year vet has tied the franchise record for most consecutive seasons with 1,000 receiving vards, set by Roddy White (2007-2012).

Damontae Kazee had a day with two tackles, two interceptions and a forced fumble on special teams. The third-year pro has totaled three interceptions against the Panthers this season, the most in franchise history since Ray Buchanan (3) in 2000.



#### Man Behind the Curtain

Since acquiring the Falcons in 2002, Owner & Chairman Arthur M. Blank has raised the bar and level of expectations for the Falcons in constructing a talented and creative team to lead his club both on and off the field.

Since Blank purchased the team, Atlanta has posted a 150-132-1 record, which is tied for the sixth-best in the NFC over that span. In the last nine seasons, the Falcons have gone 106-82, becoming one of 12 teams with 100 wins since 2008.

Under Blank, the Falcons have earned eight postseason berths, including trips to the NFC Championship Game in 2004, 2012 and 2016, three NFC South Division crowns and a trip to Super Bowl LI. In 2010 & 2012, the Falcons posted an NFC-best 13-3 record. In 2016, the Falcons made their second - first under Blank - Super Bowl appearance.



In May 2014, Blank and the Falcons broke ground on Mercedes-Benz Stadium, which opened in 2017 and named the Sports Business Journal Sports Facility of the Year in 2019. In addition to being the home for the Falcons, the stadium is also home to Atlanta United FC, the Major League Soccer team that was awarded to Blank in April 2014 and began play in 2017, winning the MLS Cup in only its second season and being named the 2019 Sports Business Journal Sports Team of the Year. The facility also hosts other premier sports and entertainment events throughout the year.

Mercedes-Benz Stadium and the city of Atlanta hosted Super Bowl LIII in February of 2019. This was the first time the city of Atlanta hosted a Super Bowl since 2000.

On top of Super Bowl LIII, Mercedes-Benz Stadium has attracted several marquee events to the city of Atlanta, such as the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship, the 2020 NCAA Final Four and many others events, including the National Semifinals of the College Football Playoff, Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Game, SEC Championship Game and the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

#### QUICK SLANT

Winning Team Off the Field and in the Community. One of the hallmarks of Blank's philosophy is giving back to the community. The Falcons' community outreach efforts are led by the Atlanta Falcons Youth Foundation (AFYF), the largest team-funded foundation in the NFL. Since 2002, the foundation has awarded more than \$16 million in grants to more than 700 non-profit organizations.



## THOMAS DIMITROFF General Manager

#### MAN WITH A PLAN

One of the longest-tenured general managers in the NFL, Thomas Dimitroff has held his post since 2008. A two-time Executive of the Year honoree by Sporting News (2008 & 2010), Dimitroff has been the architect of the most successful run in franchise history. During his tenure, the Falcons have posted a 102-74 regular-season record and the eighth-best winning percentage in the NFL over that span. Atlanta is one of seven teams in the league with 100-or-more wins between 2008-2018.

Over the last four seasons, Dimitroff and Head Coach Dan Quinn have crafted a roster focused on fast, physical, and urgent athletes. This team-building approach spurred the Falcons to playoff wins in consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history, including an NFC title and Super Bowl appearance for the second time in club annals.

A Week 15 win in 2018 over the Arizona Cardinals marked the 100th win for Matt Ryan and Dimitroff. They are just the sixth GM-QB duo who have reached 100 wins for the same team together.


