CHARGERS at PATRIOTS

The Los Angeles Chargers (12-4) head to New England for the Divisional Round against the Patriots (11-5). The two teams will meet on Sunday, Jan. 13, with kickoff scheduled for 10:05 a.m. PT at Gillette Stadium. Jim Nantz, Tony Romo, Tracy Wolfson and Jay Feely have the call on CBS while Matt "Money" Smith, Daniel Jeremiah and Shannon Farren will bring the action on KFI-AM 640. Mario Solis and Jorge Villanueva will present the game in Spanish on KFVB-AM 980.

The Chargers are coming off their first playoff win since Jan. 5, 2014 after downing the Ravens in Baltimore, 23-17. Melvin Ingram tallied two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while Adrian Phillips added an interception and a fumble recovery. Michael Badgley drilled a franchise postseason record five field goals to tally 15 of the 23 points on the day.

The Bolts are making their 11th appearance in the Divisional Round and hold a 4-6 mark in those games. The last Divisional playoff victory for the Chargers was at Indianapolis on Jan. 13, 2008, against the Colts. Billy Volek came in for an injured Philip Rivers and scored the game-winner on a 1-yard run to give the Bolts the 28-24 victory.

The Chargers and Patriots have met 41 times with New England holding a 24-15-2 all-time advantage. The Patriots won the last meeting, 21-13, in New England on Oct. 29, 2017. The two franchises have met three times in the playoffs with the Patriots holding a 2-1 advantage. The Patriots downed the Chargers 21-12 in the AFC Championship Game in 2008 and 24-21 in the Divisional Round in 2007. The Bolts won the AFL Championship on Jan. 5, 1964 by defeating the Boston Patriots, 51-10.

The Patriots enter the playoffs fresh off earning their 10th straight division title. New England is 8-0 at home in 2018 and have won eight straight playoff games in Foxborough. Offensively the Patriots rank fourth in the NFL in scoring at 27.3 ppg and fifth in yards per game (393.4). Defensively, New England ranks seventh in scoring defense and 21st in yards allowed.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 12** The Chargers posted a 12-4 record, their best mark since 2009. The Bolts are making their first playoff appearance since 2013. It is the sixth time in history that the Chargers reached 12 regular-season wins (13 in 2009, 14 in 2007, 12 in 2004, 12 in 1979 and 12 in 1961).
- 5** Michael Badgley converted five field goals at Baltimore to set a Chargers postseason record. The five field goals are tied for the second most made in a single playoff contest in NFL history. Badgley set the franchise record during the regular season with a 93.8 percentage.
- 7** The Chargers led the NFL with seven Pro Bowl selections. Traveling to Orlando to represent the AFC are WR Keenan Allen, RB Melvin Gordon, DE Melvin Ingram, S Derwin James, S Adrian Phillips, C Mike Pouncey and QB Philip Rivers. James was voted a starter at safety while Phillips got the starting nod on special teams.
- 8** The Chargers have won eight straight games away from Los Angeles and are 9-1 in all games played away from Dignity Health Sports Park this season.
- 6** The Chargers converted six two-point conversions during the regular season. The six conversions are tied for the second most in NFL history.

BREAKING DOWN THE 2018 SCHEDULE

The Chargers opponents posted a **102-104-2** regular season record in 2018. Four of the teams on the schedule made the postseason and seven of the teams had a .500 or better record. The Chargers finished second in the AFC West and were 4-2 against divisional foes. The Bolts were strong on the road, finishing 7-1, including six straight to finish the regular season.

THE HEAD COACHES



Anthony Lynn is in his second season as a head coach in the National Football League after serving as Buffalo's interim in Week 17 of the 2016 season. Lynn comes in with 83 games of playing experience under his belt, as well as two world championships on his résumé as a running back for the back-to-back Super Bowl champion Denver

Broncos (XXXII and XXXIII). Lynn has always had a passion for teaching the game. Immediately following his last season in 1999, Lynn assumed the role of offensive assistant and assistant to special teams in Denver in 2000. Lynn spent 12 years as a running backs coach for the Jaguars, Cowboys, Browns, Jets and Bills. He then landed his first assistant head coaching position in New York with the Jets, while also coaching the running backs, and assumed the same position the following two seasons in Buffalo. The two seasons Lynn spent in Buffalo, the Bills led the NFL in both rushing yards (2,630 in 2016, and 2,432 in 2015) and rushing touchdowns (29 in 2016, and 19, tie in 2015). During his last two coaching stops (New York and Buffalo), Lynn's offenses combined for a total 18,218 rushing yards during that span (2009-2016), the most combined yards in the NFL over that period. In his first season at the helm in Los Angeles Lynn rallied the team after an 0-4 start to win nine of the final 12 games, including six of the last seven contests. The Chargers finished 9-7 and just missed out on a playoff berth due to a tiebreaker. The nine wins over the 12-game span was the best mark since the team won the last 11 games of the 2009 season. The five-straight home wins were also the best run on home turf since that 2009 season.



Bill Belichick completed his 43rd season as an NFL coach in 2017 and is in his 19th season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win five Super Bowl titles. In 2017, Belichick won a division title for the ninth consecutive season and won an eighth conference championship as

a head coach, extending his NFL record in both categories. Belichick won 13 regular season games for an NFL-record seventh time and secured his 15th AFC East Division title as Patriots head coach, the most in NFL history. Belichick entered 2018 with the most wins among all active coaches and is currently third all-time with 278 total victories as a head coach. Belichick's winning percentage of .683 ranks first in NFL history among coaches with 150 or more wins. He has led the Patriots to a winning record for 17 consecutive seasons (2001-17), trailing only Tom Landry, who recorded 20 consecutive winning seasons from 1966-85. Belichick has also notched 28 postseason wins in his career, most by a head coach in NFL history. Belichick, who was hired by Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft on Jan. 27, 2000, is in his 19th season with the Patriots. In 18 seasons, Belichick has so far delivered five Super Bowl championships, eight conference titles, 15 division crowns and 27 playoff victories. The Patriots have won 10 consecutive division championships, besting the seven won by the L.A. Rams (1973-79). Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003), XXXIX (2004), XLIX (2014) and LI (2016).

Team captains for the Chargers were No. 17 **QB Philip Rivers**, No. 23 **S Rayshawn Jenkins**, No. 53 **C Mike Pouncey**, No. 54 **DE Melvin Ingram III**, No. 76 **LT Russell Okung** and No. 85 **TE Antonio Gates**.

Los Angeles allowed 229 yards of offense, the fewest allowed in a postseason game in Chargers history. The defense allowed 139 yards passing, good for the fourth-best single-game mark in team postseason annals.

The Bolts defense allowed just 69 total net yards in the first half, the fewest allowed in the first half of a postseason game in team history and the fewest allowed in an opening half of a playoff game since Indianapolis allowed 16 yards against Kansas City in the AFC Wild Card of the 2006 postseason.

With seven sacks on the day, the Chargers defense tied a team mark for the most single-game sacks in the postseason since the 1992 postseason (seven in a 17-0 victory in AFC Wild Card vs. Kansas City).

PLAYER NOTES

DE Melvin Ingram III punched the ball free for a fumble on Baltimore's second offensive drive for his first career postseason forced fumble. The ball was recovered by **S Adrian Phillips** to give the offense starting field position at the Ravens 15-yard line, setting up a field goal by **K Michael Badgley**.

Ingram posted another sack in the fourth quarter, giving him the most sacks by a Chargers defender in a postseason game since **DE Raylee Johnson** had two sacks in Super Bowl XXIX against San Francisco. He finished with seven total tackles, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, becoming the sixth player in NFL postseason history to have two sacks, a forced fumble and a recovery in a game, and the first since **Kony Ealy** did so in Super Bowl 50.

Phillips picked off a pass that was deflected by **CB Casey Hayward Jr.** in the second quarter, becoming the first Charger in postseason history with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game. It was the first time that any player did so in the postseason since Atlanta **CB Robert Alford** in Super Bowl LI against New England.

With a made 53-yard attempt late in the first quarter, **Badgley** recorded the second-longest field goal in team postseason annals. He finished the game with five made field goals and 15 points, setting a team record for the most single-game makes and points scored in Chargers postseason history. **Badgley's** 15 points brought him past **Kaeding** (five points in 2004 AFC Wild Card vs. New York Jets) for the most points by a Chargers rookie kicker in a single postseason game.

TE Antonio Gates posted 26 yards on three catches, bringing him to 490 career postseason receiving yards to pass **Russ Francis** (474) and **Jason Witten** (486) for the 10th-most by a tight end in NFL postseason history. **Gates** also reached 46 career postseason catches, passing **Witten** for No. 8 among tight ends in postseason annals.

In the first quarter, **DE Joey Bosa** recorded the first postseason sack of his career with a six-yard takedown to force a Baltimore punt. **CB Desmond King II** returned the ensuing punt 33 yards, good for the longest postseason punt return in team annals.

King returned the opening kickoff of the second half 72 yards, good for the second-longest in Chargers postseason history to only trail a 98-yarder for a touchdown by **WR Andre Coleman** in Super Bowl XXIX against San Francisco.

On the first defensive possession of the second half, **DT Justin Jones** and **Ingram** had back-to-back sacks, both the first of their postseason careers.

LB Uchenna Nwosu had a strip-sack to seal the game in the fourth quarter, giving him and **Jones** gave him the most postseason sacks by a Chargers rookie in history, passing **LB Shaun Phillips** (0.5 sacks in 2004 postseason).

RB Melvin Gordon III returned from a knee injury to punch in a one-yard rushing score in the fourth quarter for the game's first touchdown.

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

- **Jahleel Addae** set a then-career high with eight tackles, including six solo stops and forced his first career fumble in his first game against the Patriots.
- **Antonio Gates** registered his fourth career 100-yard receiving game in his first appearance against the Patriots. **Gates** caught six passes for 108 yards and averaged 18 yards per catch.
- During his career, **Antonio Gates** has totaled 36 catches for 407 yards and three touchdowns against the Patriots in nine games.
- In the two postseason matchups, **Gates** hauled in eight passes for 78 yards.
- **Melvin Ingram** tallied a career-high three tackles for loss, including a sack in his first appearance against the Patriots.
- Playing for Seattle, **Brandon Mebane** had three quarterback hits and one sack against the Patriots on Dec. 7, 2008.
- **Mebane** equaled his career high in tackles when he recorded seven against New England on Oct. 14, 2012.
- **Philip Rivers** has faced the Patriots eight times during his career and had three games with more than three hundred yards passing. **Rivers** is 170-for-279 for 2,041 yards and 10 touchdowns.
- In the 30-10 victory over the Patriots on Oct. 12, 2008, **Rivers** was 18-for-27 for 306 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions. Rivers posted a rating of 141.9. For his effort, he was named the FedEx Air NFL Player of the Week.
- In one of the gutsiest performances, **Rivers**, playing on a torn ACL, and less than a week after getting his knee scoped, attempted 37 passes and threw for 211 yards in the Conference Championship Game on Jan. 20, 2008.
- **Melvin Gordon** broke an 87-yard run for a score to tie a franchise record in his lone appearance against the Patriots. Gordon finished with 132 yards and the ground and averaged 9.4 yards per carry.
- **Adrian Phillips** set a career high with 12 total tackles in the 2017 matchup.

WR Keenan Allen

- Posted seven 100-yard receiving games last year, good for No. 2 in the NFL in 2017, trailing Antonio Brown (eight).
- With 102 catches last season, ranked No. 4 in the NFL and second in the AFC in 2017.
- Posted 11 catches at Dallas on Thanksgiving last year, tying for the third-most receptions ever in a Thanksgiving game.
- Named Comeback Player of the Year by The Associated Press, the third-ever Charger to win the award.

DE Joey Bosa

- Ranked No. 7 in the NFL and second in the AFC last year with 12.5 sacks.
- With 23.0 sacks over his first two pro seasons, ranks fourth in the NFL in sacks over that span.

RB Melvin Gordon

- Became the third player in team annals to record 1,200 scrimmage yards and 10 total touchdowns in three-consecutive seasons, joining HOF RB LaDainian Tomlinson (eight-straight seasons) and HOF WR Lance Alworth (four-consecutive seasons).
- Posted two 100-yard rushing games last year, tied for ninth in the NFL in 2017.
- With 72 points scored in 2017, ranked No. 4 in the NFL and No. 2 in the AFC last year among non-kickers.

CB Casey Hayward

QB Philip Rivers

- Ranks No. 5 among active passers w/ 1,000-plus career pass attempts with a career passer rating of 95.6 (trails Rodgers – 103.1; Wilson – 100.3; Brees – 97.7; Brady – 97.6).
- Passed HOF QB John Elway (51,475) for eighth in career passing yards in NFL history against San Francisco in Week 4 (09/30/18).
- In the season-opener, Rivers broke a tie with HOF QB Fran Tarkenton (342) for sole possession of No. 6 on the all-time touchdown list.
- With his 4,000 passing yards this year, Rivers joined Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12) as the only players in NFL history with 10-plus seasons with at least 4,000 passing yards.
- Had two of the 10 best passing performances in the league last season: 27-of-33 passing (81.8 pct.) for 434 yards and three TDs at Dallas...28-of-37 passing (75.7 pct.) for 387 yards and three TDs vs. Oakland.
- Posted six 300-yard passing games last year, tied for the most in the NFL in 2017 with Brady and Winston.
- Over the past 11 seasons (2008-18), ranks second in passing yards (47,968), third in completions (3,940) and touchdowns (330) and fourth in attempts (6,050).
- Since the start of 2015, ranks sixth in completions (1,493), third in passing yards (18,001) and fourth in touchdown passes (122) in the NFL.
- Leads the NFL over the past two-plus seasons with 93 touchdown passes.
- *Equalled a career-high with his 105.5 passer rating in 2018.*
- *Registered a 68.3 completion percentage in 2018 which was the second best of his career.*

WHAT THE CHARGERS RETURN

The Chargers bring back a roster that made a combined 256 starts for the Bolts last year. Eight of those players (S Jahleel Addae, DE Joey Bosa, RB Melvin Gordon III, CB Casey Hayward Jr., DE Melvin Ingram III, NT Brandon Mebane and QB Philip Rivers) started all 16 contests for the Chargers last season. Rivers' 16 starts last year increased his mark to 192-straight starts in the regular season, the NFL's longest active streak.

The Bolts return 1,492 yards and 10 touchdowns in production from the ground game from 2017, including 1,105 yards and eight scores from Gordon. The 1,492 yards represents 93.5 percent of the team's 2017 production.

Through the air, the Chargers return 85.5 percent of the team's 2017 production, bringing back 3,889 receiving yards. 1,393 of those yards rested in the hands of consensus Comeback Player of the Year Keenan Allen. Of 28 total touchdown catches from last year, the Bolts bring back 24 of those scores with six coming courtesy of No. 13.

The Chargers return 36 sacks of the squad's 43 from last year. Even more impressively, the Bolts return 12 of the team's 18 interceptions, including one returned by CB Desmond King for a 90-yard pick-six at Dallas on Thanksgiving.

CHARGERS IN THE LAST 12 GAMES OF 2017

The Chargers finished the 2017 season in impressive fashion, winning nine of their last 12 games. The offense flourished over that span from Week 5 on. The Bolts ranked fourth in total offense, passing and first downs in the NFL. The Chargers outscored their opponents 283-179 over that span, threw for 3,444 yards and 22 TDs to only seven INTs and rushed for 1,325 yards and seven scores. Defensively, Los Angeles ranked third in points per game allowed with 14.9 over those weeks and paced the NFL with 17 interceptions.

DIAMONDS IN THE ROUGH

In 14 of the past 16 seasons, at least one undrafted rookie has made the initial 53-man roster after final roster reductions. Eight of those players appeared in all 16 regular-season contests, 12 made at least one start and nine started multiple times as a rookie. Week 1 of 2018 featured, WR JJ Jones, RB Detrez Newsome and CB Brandon Facyson on the roster.

THE ROOKIE IMPACT IN 2018

The Chargers drafted defensive players with their first four selections of the 2018 draft. Those picks are paying dividends in 2018. First-round selection Derwin James has been used all over the field and his versatility has shown. The Florida State standout is first on the team with 105 combined tackles, 3.5 sacks, three interceptions and 13 passes defended. Uchenna Nwosu has posted 3.5 sacks while Kyzir White has totaled 16 tackles, an interception and as two passes defended before going on IR. Justin Jones has worked his way onto the field to register 16 total tackles and half a sack. On top of the defensive youth, RB Justin Jackson has rushed for 206 yards on 50 carries with two touchdowns. *(Press box totals were used)*

HANDS TEAM

In the Week 4 victory over San Francisco, Austin Ekeler hauled in the fifth TD pass of his career. The five receiving scores over his first two years made him the first undrafted RB to do so in his first two seasons since 1966. Ekeler added a sixth TD reception in Week 5. - Rivers has started a franchise-record 208 consecutive regular-season games. It's the NFL's longest active streak.
- Rivers has posted a 118-90 (.567) regular-season record. He became the fifth active quarterback to reach 100 regular-season wins after the victory against the Broncos on Oct. 22, 2017. Including postseason, Rivers' 121 wins overall ranks No. 5 among active quarterbacks.
- Rivers has posted a passer rating of 120 or higher 47 times during his career. The Chargers are 42-5 (.894) in those games. He has also posted a rating of 130.0 or higher 28 times and the Chargers are 28-0 in those games.
- Rivers is 44-34 (.564) as a starter in regular-season AFC West games. In 78 division games as a starter, he's completed 1,606 of 2,551 (63.0 pct.) for 19,595 yards with 126 touchdowns and 78 interceptions for a 90.3 passer rating.
- Rivers is one of the NFL's top late-season quarterbacks. Since taking over as the Bolts' starting quarterback in 2006, he has guided the Chargers to a record of 43-20 (.683) in regular-season games played in December and January.
- Rivers is not only great in December and January, but in the second half of the season overall. Throughout his career, Rivers is 72-42 (.632) as a starter in games played after Nov. 1.
- Rivers is a 10-time AFC Offensive Player of the Week. His 10 AFC POW awards rank tied for first in team history to LaDainian Tomlinson's 10.
- Rivers is a 15-time FedEx Air NFL Player of the Week during his career.
- Since 2012, Rivers has posted the fourth most offensive plays (7,329) in the NFL.

Rivers' **25 consecutive completions** are the most by a quarterback in a single game in **NFL history** and are tied with RYAN TANNERHILL (25 consecutive completions from Weeks 6-7 in 2015) for the most consecutive passes completed at any point in league history. Washington's MARK BRUNELL previously held the record for the most consecutive completions to begin a game, completing his first 22 passes against Houston on September 24, 2006.

Rivers' **96.6 completion percentage** is the highest by a quarterback in a single game in league annals (minimum 20 attempts), surpassing the previous high of 92.3 percent (24 of 26 passing) set by Pro Football Hall of Famer KURT WARNER against Jacksonville on September 20, 2009.





• **Antonio Gates** surpassed Tony Gonzalez's mark for the most touchdown catches in NFL history by a tight end when he snagged his 112th during the Chargers' 2017 home opener against Miami. Gates moved into sixth all-time in touchdown catches among all players. Gates is the Chargers' all-time leader in receptions (955), receiving yards (11,841) and touchdown catches (116). All-time among tight ends, Gates, ranks third in catches and yards. Gates' 116 touchdown catches since he came into the NFL in 2003 are the most in the NFL over that span (2003-present).

HEAD COACH ANTHONY LYNN

On Jan. 13, 2017, the Los Angeles Chargers named Anthony Lynn the 16th head coach in franchise history and the first African-American head coach in team annals. Lynn joined the Chargers after spending the 2015-16 seasons as the assistant head coach and running backs coach for the Buffalo Bills.

In his first season at the helm in Los Angeles Lynn rallied the team after an 0-4 start to win nine of the final 12 games, including six of the last seven contests. The Chargers finished 9-7 and just missed out on a playoff berth due to a tiebreaker. The nine wins over the 12-game span was the best mark since the team won the last 11 games of the 2009 season. The five-straight home wins were also the best run on home turf since that 2009 season.

Lynn put his imprint on the team in year one. The Bolts turned the ball over just 15 times in 2017 to rank tied for fourth in the NFL after a season in which they were dead last with 35 turnovers. The offensive line led the league in the least amount of sacks allowed with 18. The Chargers haven't led the league in the least amount of sacks allowed since in the AFL in 1968.

A native of Celina, Texas, some 40 miles north of Dallas, Lynn was an All-Southwest Conference running back as a collegian at Texas Tech, where he rushed for 1,911 yards and 17 touchdowns on 481 carries. That helped him earn a ticket to the NFL where he signed with the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent in 1992. After being released by the Giants, Lynn signed with Denver in 1993 and appeared in 13 games for the Broncos. In 1994, he suffered a broken leg and spent the year on injured reserve. Lynn moved on to the Bay Area in 1995, spending two seasons with the San Francisco 49ers (1995-96) before concluding his career in Denver (1997-99) where he won back-to-back Super Bowl championships (XXXII and XXXIII) with the Broncos. Lynn hung up his cleats after the '99 season, having played in 83 career games.

Lynn jumped right into the coaching ranks in 2000, spending three seasons (2000-02) with the Broncos as an offensive assistant and assistant to special teams. In 2003, he landed his first full-time position gig as the running backs coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2003-04). That was followed by similar positions with the Dallas Cowboys (2005-06), Cleveland Browns (2007-08), New York Jets (2009-14) and Bills (2015-16). Lynn carried the additional title of assistant head coach in New York in 2014 and with the Bills for his two seasons there.

Lynn spent the last two seasons (2015-16) with the Bills, including the final 14 games of the 2016 season as their offensive coordinator and the final game of the year as their interim head coach. The Bills led the NFL in both of Lynn's seasons in both rushing yards (2,630 in 2016 and 2,432 in 2015) and rushing touchdowns (29 in 2016 and 19, tie in 2015). The Bills also led the League in average yards per carry (5.3 in 2016 and 4.8, tie in 2015) in each of his two seasons in Upstate New

York. More impressively, at his last two coaching stops (New York and Buffalo), his teams combined to rush for 18,218 yards during that span (2009-16), the most combined yards in the NFL over that time period. In Week 16 of the 2016 season, as Offensive Coordinator for the Bills, Lynn led the offense to a franchise-record 589 total yards.

The fact that Lynn is coaching today is a miracle in and of itself. Back in 2005, early in Lynn's first season with the Cowboys, he was hit by a drunk driver while crossing a street. The impact was so violent that it's a miracle he survived. The accident happened as Lynn was leaving a restaurant following dinner with several Cowboys coaches. The impact threw him an estimated 40-50 feet and he landed on top of a parked Volkswagen. The force of the impact totaled the car. Pittsburgh Steelers Offensive Coordinator Todd Haley was with Lynn at the time. He narrowly avoided being hit himself and was the first to render aid to Lynn. The damage tally was extensive – two collapsed lungs, three broken ribs, major facial and shoulder damage that required four surgeries and temporary paralysis – yet despite it all, Lynn walked out of the hospital in less than two weeks.

Lynn was raised in Texas by a single mom, Betty Jackson, a former all-state basketball player who had coaching aspirations herself. Lynn's maternal grandfather, Tommy Lynn, a farmer and former baseball catcher, helped raise Anthony. Mother and grandfather helped instill a tireless work ethic in Lynn at an early age. By 13, he was working 40-60 hour weeks doing construction in the summertime. He worked his way up the construction ladder and had become a foreman by the time he was in high school. One of his responsibilities was driving his crew to job sites for a company that built shopping malls and custom homes. It spurned an interest in interior design and Lynn initially studied interior fashion design in college.

Lynn has since reconnected with his father, Donald Wilson, a Los Angeles native who once tried out for the Dodgers as a left-handed pitcher. Wilson now resides in Corona.

Lynn is married to Stacey Bell Lynn. He has two children, son, D'Anton, and daughter, Danielle. Stacey is a news anchor at WNBC in New York City. D'Anton played football collegiately at Penn State and professionally with the New York Jets and the Canadian Football League's Hamilton Tiger-Cats and currently is the assistant defensive backs coach for the Houston Texans. Danielle studied at the University of Oklahoma and is currently in graduate school at the University of North Texas.

In the spring of 2018, Lynn completed his college degree after leaving school for the NFL 26 years ago. Despite being in his first year as a head coach, Lynn received his degree in interdisciplinary studies from UNLV.

GENERAL MANAGER TOM TELESKO

With a keen eye for acquiring talented players, Tom Telesco serves his sixth season as General Manager of the Chargers in 2018.

Telesco was hired by the Chargers in January 2013. Forty years old at the time of his hiring, he became the youngest general manager in team history. Telesco immediately helped the Chargers return to the playoffs in 2013 with a roster that featured 25 players who joined the team prior to or during the season.

His first draft featured 2013 Pepsi Next NFL Rookie of the Year Keenan Allen. In 2017, Allen went on to break the Chargers' single-season receptions record and posted the second most receiving yards in team history en route to being named the NFL Comeback Player of the Year and earning his first Pro Bowl nod.

Over his five years with the organization, Telesco has drafted three pro bowlers in the first round in Jason Verrett, Melvin Gordon and Joey Bosa.

Telesco also has a proven track record with undrafted free agents. His finds have been highlighted by deep-threat and 1,000-yard receiver Tyrell Williams out of Western Oregon, special teams stalwart Nick Dzubnar from Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, running back Austin Ekeler out of Western State and Central Michigan safety Jahleel Addae.

On top of his draft choices, Telesco has brought in some of the top free agent talents in the NFL. Casey Hayward has blossomed into one of the top corners in the league, making back-to-back Pro Bowls in 2016-17 while offensive tackle Russell Okung made the Pro Bowl in his first season with the team in 2017. His signings also include defensive tackle Brandon Mebane, wide receiver/punt returner Travis Benjamin and his latest being three-time Pro Bowl center Mike Pouncey in 2018.

A native of Buffalo, N.Y., Telesco prepped at St. Francis High School in Athol Springs, N.Y. Days prior to Super Bowl XLVIII in January 2014, which was co-hosted by New York and New Jersey, Telesco was recognized for his accomplishments on the floor of the New York State Senate by Senator Timothy Kennedy.

After graduating from St. Francis, Telesco played wide receiver at John Carroll University in Ohio. He was a starter on the Blue Streaks' 1994 Ohio Athletic Conference Championship team, and two of his teammates at John Carroll were Chris and Brian Polian, sons of Bill Polian, a 2015 inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

While attending John Carroll, Telesco spent four summers (1991-94) as a training camp intern with the Buffalo Bills. At that time, the elder Polian was the Bills' general manager. Polian left Buffalo for Carolina in 1994 and after Telesco graduated from John Carroll with a degree in business management in 1995, Polian hired him to work in the Panthers' scouting department. In 1998, Telesco and Polian moved on to Indianapolis, where Telesco would spend his next 15 NFL seasons as a college scout, pro scout, director of pro scouting, director of player personnel and vice president of football operations. He worked in Indianapolis during Peyton Manning's entire career with the Colts and later part of the team that brought Andrew Luck to the Colts with the first pick of the 2012 NFL Draft. Telesco also was involved in Colts drafts that featured four-time Pro Bowl running back Edgerrin James, five-time Pro Bowl wide receiver Reggie Wayne, Dwight Freeney, a seven-time Pro Bowler as a Colt and two-time Pro Bowl selection and Defensive Player of the Year Bob Sanders.

Telesco's tenure in Indianapolis was one of the most successful eras in Colts history. They played in two Super Bowls, including a victory over Chicago in Super Bowl XLI. From 1998-2012, the Colts won 154 regular-season games, eight division titles and they appeared in the playoffs 12 times. Indianapolis set an NFL record with 12 or more wins in seven consecutive seasons and they won an NFL-record 23 straight regular-season games during the 2008-09 seasons. Their 115 regular-season wins from 2000-09 set an NFL record for wins in a decade.

In 2015 and this year in 2018, Telesco was invited to be a speaker at the NFL's Career Development Symposium in Arizona. The program, attended by nearly 70 coaches and front office executives, was designed to engage aspiring head coach and general manager candidates. Telesco was one of only two active general managers invited to address participants at the symposium. He is also the co-chairman of the NFL General Manager Advisory Committee.

Telesco and his wife, Larah, have a daughter, Elena, and two sons, Thomas and Nicholas.

WEEK 1 RECAP - CHIEFS 38, CHARGERS 28

The Los Angeles Chargers dropped their season opener to the Kansas City Chiefs 38-28 Sunday from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center.

Running backs Melvin Gordon and Austin Ekeler combined for 292 total yards and a touchdown, but it wasn't enough to make up for the explosiveness of wide receiver Tyreek Hill and the rest of the Chiefs' high-powered offense. Kansas City has now won its last nine games over the Chargers.

After a three-and-out by the Chargers offense to begin the game, Hill returned a punt 91 yards for a touchdown to make the score 7-0 after a Harrison Butker extra point.

Los Angeles responded with an eight-play, 48-yard drive that ended with Caleb Sturgis converting a 45-yard field goal - his first with the Chargers. Kansas City led 7-3, but Hill wasn't done adding to the visitors' lead.

On the fifth play of the Chiefs' next possession, quarterback Patrick Mahomes found Hill over the middle for a 58-yard touchdown - 46 of those yards came after the catch. Hill touched the ball three times in the first quarter, scored two touchdowns and gained 179 all-purpose yards. Kansas City led 14-6 after the first quarter.

The Chargers found their rhythm on offense early in the second quarter. Gordon and Ekeler combined for 75 total yards on a 12-play, 96-yard drive that was capped off by a

13-yard Ekeler touchdown reception from Philip Rivers. A failed two-point conversion cut Kansas City's lead to 14-12.

The Chiefs added a 46-yard Butker field goal to extend their advantage to 17-12 at halftime.

Kansas City opened the second half with an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. A one-yard reception from Mahomes to wide receiver De'Anthony Thomas made the score 24-12 after another Butker extra point. Mahomes would later hit fullback Anthony Sherman for a 36-yard touchdown, giving the Chiefs a 31-12 advantage after three quarters.

Rivers found wide receiver Keenan Allen for a 20-yard touchdown reception to open the fourth quarter, cutting Kansas City's lead to 31-20 after Antonio Gates caught the two-point conversion.

Rivers finished the game 34-of-51 for 424 yards, three touchdowns and an interception. Allen caught eight balls for 108 yards and a touchdown. Gordon finished with 166 total yards and added a two-point conversion. Ekeler had 126 total yards and a receiving touchdown.

WEEK 2 RECAP - CHARGERS 31, BILLS 20

The Los Angeles Chargers beat the Buffalo Bills 31-20 on Sunday at New Era Field for their first win of the 2018 season.

Running back Melvin Gordon scored three touchdowns – all in the first half – while Philip Rivers spread the ball to six different receivers and finished an efficient 23-of-27 for 256 yards and three touchdowns. The Chargers' defense was credited with five sacks. They hit rookie quarterback Josh Allen eight times and picked him off twice.

A pair of Chargers defensive rookies set the early tone for a dominant first half. On Buffalo's first possession, Allen – while trying to avoid a blitzing Derwin James – was sacked by linebacker Uchenna Nwosu. James added a tackle for loss later in the first quarter.

Both defensive plays were key in setting up the Chargers' first two scores of the day. Wide receiver Mike Williams caught his first career touchdown – a 10-yard pass from Rivers – to give L.A. a 7-0 lead. It capped a three-play, 38-yard drive which also included a 25-yard reception by tight end Virgil Green.

On the Bolts' next offensive possession, Gordon finished a six-play, 61-yard drive with a 20-yard touchdown run. Los Angeles led 14-0 after the first quarter – and Gordon wasn't done.

After a Buffalo field goal, the Chargers marched down the field again courtesy of two Austin Ekeler rushes (22 and 16 yards) and a 23-yard reception by Green. This time, Gordon scored on a nine-yard reception from Rivers.

The hat trick for No. 28 came on a two-yard touchdown reception from Rivers with two minutes remaining in the second quarter. Los Angeles led 28-6 at halftime. Gordon finished the game with 66 total yards.

Ekeler rushed for a career-high 77 yards on 11 carries. Defensive end Melvin Ingram notched 1.5 sacks and three quarterback hits. James had six total tackles – two for loss – and a sack. Safety Adrian Phillips and rookie linebacker Kyzir White added two second-half interceptions of Allen.

Dating back to last season, Los Angeles has outscored Buffalo 85-44 in two meetings.

WEEK 3 RECAP - RAMS 35, CHARGERS 23

The Rams defeated the Chargers 35-23 Sunday at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

Wide receiver Mike Williams caught two touchdown passes from Philip Rivers and running back Melvin Gordon added a score, but it wasn't enough to overcome 33 first downs and 521 yards of total offense by the Rams.

The Chargers defense prevented Rams points on the opening possession of the game when cornerback Desmond King recovered a Todd Gurley fumble -- forced by defensive tackle Brandon Mebane -- at the Bolts' 24-yard line. The Chargers offense went three-and-out, though, and the Rams didn't make the same mistake on their next possession.

Gurley capped off an 11-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run. The Rams led 7-0, but only for 92 seconds.

Gordon opened the Chargers' next possession with a 20-yard rush that included an acrobatic leap over Rams safety Lamarcus Joyner. Two plays later, Rivers found Williams, who beat cornerback Marcus Peters for a 42-yard touchdown reception. Caleb Sturgis missed the extra point, which made the score 7-6.

The Rams closed the first quarter with a three-yard touchdown pass from Jared Goff to Robert Woods. It was all part of a seven-play, 75-yard drive that put the Rams up 14-6.

With the Rams threatening to score again, rookie safety Derwin James picked off Goff in the end zone for his first career interception. The Chargers offense took over at their own one-yard line, but quickly went three-and-out. On fourth down, Drew Kaser's punt was blocked by linebacker Cory Littleton and recovered by Blake Countess in the end zone for a Rams touchdown. A Sam Ficken extra point increased the lead to 21-6.

Down two scores, the Chargers then drove down the field in ten plays. Gordon's 11-yard touchdown rush -- aided by a key block by fullback Derek Watt -- cut the Rams' lead to 21-13. That score would stay true after Ficken missed a 46-yard field goal to close the first half. A Keenan Allen fumble on the opening drive of the second half set the Rams offense up at their own 45-yard line. Three plays later, Goff found wide receiver Cooper Kupp for a 53-yard touchdown reception.

Williams' big day continued on the Bolts' next possession. On a crucial 4th-and-2, Rivers found the second-year receiver for a 20-yard touchdown strike. The Chargers shaved the lead to 28-20, but stopping the Rams explosive offense proved to be too much.

Woods caught 10 of his 11 targets for 92 yards. His second touchdown -- a six-yard reception in the third quarter -- put the Rams up two scores.

Rivers finished the game 18-of-30 for 226 yards and two touchdowns. Gordon rushed for 80 yards on 15 carries.

WEEK 4 RECAP - CHARGERS 29, 49ERS 27

The Los Angeles Chargers rallied from 14 points down in the first quarter to beat the San Francisco 49ers 29-27 Sunday from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center.

Philip Rivers threw for 250 yards and three touchdowns on a day when he also passed John Elway for the eighth-most passing yards in league history. Running back Melvin Gordon racked up 159 total yards, caught seven passes and scored his fifth touchdown of the season. The game was put on ice in the fourth quarter after rookie safety Derwin James hit 49ers quarterback C.J. Beathard, causing him to make an errant throw that was intercepted by defensive end Isaac Rochell.

Los Angeles improved to 2-2 on the season and secured their first home win of 2018 despite an inauspicious start.

Less than one minute into the game, Rivers was intercepted by 49ers cornerback Antone Exum Jr., who returned the ball 32 yards for a touchdown. A Robbie Gould extra point gave San Francisco an early 7-0 lead.

The Chargers went three-and-out on their second offensive possession, and the third resulted in a 54-yard missed field goal by Caleb Sturgis. San Francisco capitalized on its field position with a six-play, 56-yard drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown pass from Beathard to wide receiver Kendrick Bourne.

Down two scores early, the Chargers offense marched 75 yards in seven plays. Rivers found tight end Antonio Gates for a five-yard touchdown, but Sturgis missed the extra point. It was 14-6 San Francisco after the first quarter. The Rivers-to-Gates touchdown was

the 88th of their career.

After a 49ers field goal, Rivers threw his second touchdown in as many drives – this time connecting with running back Austin Ekeler for a 22-yard strike. Rivers then hit Gordon for the two-point conversion to tighten San Francisco's lead to 17-14.

With 30 seconds remaining in the second quarter, cornerback Desmond King returned a Bradley Pinion punt 56 yards to San Francisco's 33-yard line. Two plays later, Sturgis' 48-yard field goal tied the game 17-17 at halftime.

James' third sack of the season set the tone for the second half. San Francisco was again forced to punt to King, whose 21-yard return put the Chargers at their own 49-yard line. Six plays later, Gordon caught a six-yard touchdown pass from Rivers to put Los Angeles up 23-17 after Sturgis' second missed extra point of the day.

The 49ers – aided by a pair of roughing-the-passer penalties – were threatening to score at Los Angeles' eight-yard line until a Beathard pass bounced off the chest of Garrett Celek and into the arms of cornerback Trevor Williams. Williams returned the ball 86 yards to San Francisco's 12-yard line.

A Sturgis 25-yard field goal would increase Los Angeles' lead to 26-17 but it didn't hold for long. Later in the quarter, Beathard hooked up with tight end George Kittle for an 82-yard touchdown. It was 26-24 Chargers after the third quarter.

Both teams traded field goals in the fourth quarter before Rochell's interception sealed the win.

WEEK 6 RECAP - CHARGERS 38, BROWNS 14

The Los Angeles Chargers beat the Cleveland Browns 38-14 Sunday at FirstEnergy Stadium for their third straight win.

Los Angeles' high-powered offense was paced by running back Melvin Gordon, who scored three touchdowns on 150 total yards, 132 of which came on the ground (7.3 yards per carry). Gordon now has nine total touchdowns on the season. As a team, the Chargers rushed for 246 yards.

Wide receiver Tyrell Williams caught three passes for 118 yards and two touchdowns from Philip Rivers in the span of less than seven minutes in the second quarter. The Chargers manufactured 449 yards of total offense.

Cleveland was overmatched on both sides of the ball. Browns quarterback Baker Mayfield went 22-of-46 for 238 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions -- both by cornerback Desmond King. Mayfield was also sacked five times.

The Browns offense stalled on the game's first series after safety Rayshawn Jenkins and defensive tackle Corey Liuget split a sack on Mayfield. Cornerback Desmond King's 32-yard punt return put Los Angeles' offense at its own 43-yard line.

In five plays, the Chargers went 57 yards for their first opening drive touchdown in 22

games. Gordon's four-yard score put Los Angeles up 7-0 after new kicker Michael Badgley made the extra point.

Mayfield was sacked three times in the first quarter -- 1.5 of them by defensive tackle Damion Square on back-to-back plays. The Browns got on the board at the start of the second quarter with a 33-yard field goal by Greg Joseph to make the score 7-3.

Williams' explosive second quarter started with a 44-yard reception from Rivers. On the next play, Williams -- surrounded by three defenders -- hauled in a 45-yard touchdown. The two-play, 89-yard drive extended Los Angeles' lead to 14-3.

With 57 seconds remaining in the half, Rivers found Williams again -- this time for a 29-yard touchdown on 3rd-and-6. Los Angeles led 21-6 at halftime.

The first of King's two interceptions came with 12:05 remaining in the third quarter. His 33-yard return put Los Angeles at the Browns' 10-yard line. On the next play, Gordon punched it in from 10 yards out to increase the lead to 28-6.

Rivers finished the game 11-of-20 for 207 yards, two touchdowns and an interception before giving way to Geno Smith. Badgley made all five of his extra points and added a 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter.

WEEK 7 RECAP - CHARGERS 20, TITANS 19

The Chargers improved to 5-2 Sunday after beating the Tennessee Titans 20-19 at Wembley Stadium in London.

The game was decided when safety Adrian Phillips tipped Titans quarterback Marcus Mariota's pass on a two-point conversion attempt after tight end Luke Stocker scored a touchdown with 35 seconds remaining.

Quarterback Philip Rivers went 19-of-26 for 306 yards and two long touchdown passes to a pair of Williams. Tyrell Williams had 118 receiving yards for the second straight game, while Mike Williams added 55 receiving yards on his fourth touchdown of the season.

Running back Austin Ekeler had 68 total yards on 17 touches in place of Melvin Gordon, who was inactive with a hamstring injury.

Tennessee struck first on an 11-play, 55-yard drive to open the game. Ryan Succop's 28-yard field goal gave the Titans an early 3-0 lead.

It didn't take long for Los Angeles to respond, though. On the offense's first play from scrimmage, Rivers hooked up with wide receiver Tyrell Williams for a 75-yard touchdown. Michael Badgley's extra point made it 7-3 Chargers.

After a three-and-out which included a sack by defensive tackle Darius Philon, the

Chargers' offense put together a 10-play drive ending in a 29-yard Badgley field goal. Los Angeles led 10-3 after the first quarter.

The Titans added another field goal and were threatening to score again before the half. With 39 seconds remaining, linebacker Denzel Perryman picked off a Melvin Ingram-deflected Mariota pass at Los Angeles' four-yard line and returned it 16 yards. The Chargers entered halftime with a 10-6 lead.

Los Angeles' quick-strike offense opened the second half with a three-play, 75-yard drive. This time, Rivers went deep to wide receiver Mike Williams for a 55-yard touchdown to make the score 17-6.

A 37-yard kick return by Darius Jennings coupled with an unnecessary roughness penalty by safety Rayshawn Jenkins set Tennessee up at the Chargers' 42-yard line on its next possession. Seven plays later, running back Derrick Henry scored from one-yard out to close the gap to 17-13.

The Chargers added another Badgley field goal -- this one from 28 yards out -- to increase their lead to 20-13. In two games, Badgley has been perfect on field goals (3-of-3) and extra points (7-of-7).

WEEK 9 RECAP - CHARGERS 25, SEAHAWKS 17

The Los Angeles Chargers beat the Seattle Seahawks 25-17 Sunday at CenturyLink Field for their fifth straight win.

In perhaps the most difficult place in the NFL to play as the opponent, the Chargers improved to 6-2 – their best start since 2006. Quarterback Philip Rivers went 13-of-26 for 228 yards and two touchdowns in his 200th consecutive start.

Running back Melvin Gordon rushed for 113 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries after missing Los Angeles' last game with a hamstring injury. Wide receiver Keenan Allen had a season-high 124 receiving yards on six receptions.

Down eight in the fourth quarter, the Seahawks had the ball at the Chargers' one-yard line with one untimed down remaining before Seattle was called for a false start. On the final play, a Russell Wilson pass to wide receiver David Moore was incomplete in the end zone.

Seattle opened the game with a 13-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that took up over eight minutes of the clock. After nine rushes in 12 plays, Wilson's 10-yard strike to wide receiver Jaron Brown gave the Seahawks an early 7-0 lead.

Los Angeles responded with a 10-play, 94-yard touchdown drive that began with a

28-yard rush by Allen. On the last play of the first quarter, Rivers found wide receiver Tyrell Williams for a 12-yard score, but kicker Caleb Sturgis missed the extra point.

Seattle led 7-6 entering the second quarter. For Williams, it was his fourth touchdown in the last three games. For the Chargers, it was their third straight game with an opening drive touchdown.

After forcing a three-and-out, Los Angeles needed just four plays to get back in the end zone. Gordon's 34-yard rushing touchdown – set up by a 54-yard Allen reception from Rivers – put the Chargers up 12-7. Their two-point conversion attempt was no good.

Later in the quarter, Rivers orchestrated the Bolts' third touchdown drive of the half. This time, he found wide receiver Mike Williams, who tightroped the sideline 30 yards for his fifth touchdown of the season.

The Chargers led 19-10 at halftime. Their final two touchdown drives of the first half took up just 1:59 of the clock combined.

In the fourth quarter, cornerback Desmond King intercepted Wilson and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown to put the Chargers up 25-10.

WEEK 10 RECAP - CHARGERS 20, RAIDERS 6

The Los Angeles Chargers improved to 7-2 Sunday after beating the Raiders 20-6 at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum.

It was Los Angeles' sixth-straight win and capped off a 4-0 record since Week 5, which was the team's last game from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center. Running back Melvin Gordon had 165 total yards, including a 66-yard touchdown reception on the opening possession of the second half. Gordon has at least 120 total yards and a touchdown in his last five games -- all Chargers wins.

Philip Rivers finished 18-of-26 for 223 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. The defense held Oakland out of the end zone and sacked quarterback Derek Carr four times.

The Raiders executed a successful fake punt on the game's opening possession when punter Johnny Townsend raced 42 yards to Los Angeles' 21-yard line. Faced with a fourth-and-goal at the one-yard line, safety Derwin James stopped wide receiver Dwayne Harris on a jet sweep and the Chargers' took over on downs.

Los Angeles went three-and out on its only two possessions of the first quarter. A 46-yard field goal by Raiders kicker Daniel Carlson put Oakland up 3-0 after one.

With the Raiders threatening to increase their lead at the Chargers' 21-yard line, defensive end Melvin Ingram sacked Derek Carr, who fumbled. The ball was scooped up by defensive tackle Corey Liuget and he returned it 24 yards to Oakland's 40-yard line. The turnover resulted in a 27-yard Michael Badgley field goal, which tied the game 3-3.

After forcing a three-and-out on Oakland's next possession, the Chargers continued their domination in the second quarter. A nine-play, 81-yard drive ending in an 11-yard touchdown reception by wide receiver Keenan Allen put Los Angeles up 10-3 at halftime. The Chargers have outscored their opponents 89-34 in the second quarter this season.

Gordon's touchdown was the only score in the third quarter. Los Angeles went up 20-6 in the fourth quarter on a 41-yard field goal by Badgley, who set a team record for most points (24) without a missed kick through three games.

Defensive end Isaac Rochell notched 1.5 sacks. He now has 4.5 sacks in his last five games. Allen caught six balls for 57 yards and scored his first touchdown since Week 1.

WEEK 11 RECAP - BRONCOS 23, CHARGERS 22

In the first game from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center since Week 5, the Chargers fell 23-22 Sunday to the Denver Broncos.

Broncos kicker Brandon McManus made a 34-yard field goal as time expired to end the Chargers' six-game winning streak.

Running back Melvin Gordon totaled 156 yards – his sixth-straight game with at least 120 yards from scrimmage. Quarterback Philip Rivers finished 28-of-43 for 401 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Rivers has thrown at least two touchdowns in every game this season. It wasn't enough, though, to overcome two turnovers and 14 penalties.

Defensive end Joey Bosa added a quarterback hit and a tackle in his 2018 debut.

After forcing a three-and-out to start the game, the Chargers' offense put together a 13-play, 49-yard drive that included a pair of third-down catches by wide receiver Keenan Allen. Michael Badgley's 46-yard field goal gave Los Angeles an early 3-0 lead.

The Bolts' defense forced another fourth down when Bosa chased down quarterback Case Keenum, causing him to throw an incomplete pass while running out of bounds. Denver held the ball for just 4:09 of the opening quarter.

Rivers connected with five different receivers for 121 yards in the first quarter, but the Chargers committed seven penalties for 50 yards. They led 6-0 after Badgley's second field goal of the day – this one from 45-yards out.

The Broncos took the lead when undrafted rookie running back Phillip Lindsay raced 41 yards for the team's first score of the day. The touchdown was aided by a fake punt that kept Denver's drive alive.

The Broncos responded with 13 unanswered points. Their first score was set up by a Von Miller interception and a 42-yard return to the Chargers' 18-yard line. A three-yard Royce Freeman touchdown cut Los Angeles' lead to 19-14.

Denver's second score of the half was set up by a 39-yard catch-and-run by rookie wide receiver Courtland Sutton. A two-yard touchdown rush by Lindsay gave the Broncos a 20-19 lead after their two-point conversion failed.

On its next possession, Los Angeles regained the lead 22-20 with an eight-play, 60-yard drive ending in a 30-yard Badgley field goal. The next score of the game would be McManus' game winner.

WEEK 12 RECAP - CHARGERS 45, CARDINALS 10

A record-setting performance by quarterback Philip Rivers propelled the Los Angeles Chargers to a 45-10 win over the Arizona Cardinals Sunday from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center.

Rivers set a single-game NFL record by completing his first 25 passes, most of which came during a stretch where the Chargers scored 45 unanswered points. He finished 28-of-29 for 259 yards and three touchdowns before giving way to Geno Smith in the fourth quarter.

Rivers has thrown multiple touchdown passes in all 11 games in 2018. Only quarterbacks Johnny Unitas, Peyton Manning and Aaron Rodgers have thrown at least two touchdown passes in their first 11 games to start a season.

Running back Melvin Gordon had 10 carries for 61 yards and two touchdowns before leaving the game in the third quarter with a knee injury. Wide receiver Mike Williams scored two touchdowns and Keenan Allen caught seven balls for 72 yards and a touchdown - his third consecutive game with a score.

The offensive explosion was complemented by a dominating defensive performance. Defensive end Joey Bosa notched his first two sacks of the season and safety Derwin James

nabbed his second interception of the year. Arizona was held to just 149 yards of total offense.

The Chargers improved to 8-3 on the season and finished 3-1 against the NFC West. They've outscored their opponents 124-41 in the second quarter this season.

Arizona struck first on its opening possession. A nine-play, 76-yard drive ended with a 25-yard touchdown pass from rookie quarterback Josh Rosen to future Hall of Fame wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald.

After a Chargers three-and-out, Arizona got the ball back at Los Angeles' 44-yard line thanks to a 26-yard punt return by rookie wide receiver Christian Kirk. Eight plays later, Phil Dawson kicked a 30-yard field goal to increase the Cardinals lead to 10-0.

Los Angeles, in need of an early spark, got it right away in the form of a 40-yard Desmond King kick return. Rivers finished the eight-play drive with a nine-yard touchdown pass to Williams to cut Arizona's lead to 10-7.

L.A.'s next two scores would come from its all-everything running back. Gordon had touchdown rushes of 26 and five yards - the latter set up by James' interception of Rosen. A Williams two-yard touchdown reception capped a 28-point second quarter for Los Angeles.

WEEK 13 RECAP - CHARGERS 33, STEELERS 30

The Los Angeles Chargers scored 26 second-half points to shock the Pittsburgh Steelers 33-30 Sunday night at Heinz Field.

Kicker Michael Badgley kicked a game-winning, 29-yard field goal with no time remaining. The Chargers are now 9-3 and have won eight of their last nine games.

Philip Rivers went 26-of-36 for 299 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Keenan Allen caught 14 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown, but contributions came from up and down the roster.

After trailing 23-7 at halftime, rookie running back Justin Jackson had 82 total yards and a touchdown, all in the second half. With a knack for the big play, cornerback Desmond King scored a second-half touchdown on a 73-yard punt return.

The Chargers opened the game with a promising drive that included three catches from Allen for 42 yards. On a fourth-and-one from Pittsburgh's 34-yard line, Badgley attempted a 52-yard field goal that was no good.

Starting at its own 42-yard line, Pittsburgh needed just four plays to get on the board. A 46-yard reception by Antonio Brown set up a one-yard touchdown rush by James Conner to give the Steelers an early 7-0 lead.

Los Angeles went three-and-out on its next possession, which set the Steelers up at the Chargers' 48-yard line. A six-play drive ended the same way their first did: a one-yard touchdown rush by Conner. A missed extra point made the score 13-0 Pittsburgh after one quarter.

Needing points in a hurry, Rivers went deep and found wide receiver Travis Benjamin, who raced down the right sideline for a 46-yard touchdown reception. For Benjamin, it was his first touchdown since Week 17 of last season. Pittsburgh led 13-7 after one quarter.

With Pittsburgh threatening to score on its third straight possession, Chargers rookie safety Derwin James picked off Ben Roethlisberger at Los Angeles' eight-yard line. It was James' third interception of the season, and second in as many games. His 36-yard return was negated by an illegal block penalty, though, and Los Angeles was eventually forced to punt.

The Chargers used a 13-play, 88-yard drive in the third quarter to cut into Pittsburgh's lead. In what in real time looked to be a Rivers interception in the end zone by Steelers cornerback Joe Haden turned into Haden colliding with teammate safety Sean Davis. The ball bounced off Haden and into the arms of Allen for a nine-yard touchdown. Rivers found Gates for the two-point conversion, which made the score 23-15.

A holding penalty coupled with a Joey Bosa sack of Roethlisberger forced Pittsburgh to punt on its next possession, which led to King's game-tying punt return touchdown.

Los Angeles forced the Steelers into another three-and-out on their next possession. With an opportunity to take the lead, the Bolts leaned on their rookie ball carrier. Jackson had an 18-yard rush, a 19-yard reception and a go-ahead 18-yard rushing touchdown that made the score 30-23 Los Angeles.

WEEK 14 RECAP - CHARGERS 26, BENGALS 21

The Los Angeles Chargers beat the Cincinnati Bengals 26-21 on Sunday from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center to secure the franchise's first double-digit-win season since 2009.

With 1:50 remaining in the game, the Bengals attempted a game-tying, two-point conversion after a one-yard touchdown rush by running back Joe Mixon. Defensive tackle Darius Philon sacked quarterback Jeff Driskel to keep the Chargers ahead for good.

The difference in the five-point win, though, was the foot of Michael Badgley. The rookie kicker made four field goals including a 59-yarder, the longest in franchise history. Running back Austin Ekeler had 94 total yards and a touchdown while wide receiver Keenan Allen hauled in five catches for 78 yards and a score – his fifth in as many games.

Quarterback Philip Rivers finished the game 19-of-29 for 220 yards and a touchdown. Defensive end Joey Bosa made six tackles and notched a sack – his fourth of the season. Rookie safety Derwin James had seven tackles.

Los Angeles opened the game with a six-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that included a mix of everything – including a five-yard run by Rivers. After rushes of 15 and 18 yards by Ekeler – and a 19-yard catch by wide receiver Mike Williams – Rivers found Allen for a 14-yard touchdown reception to give Los Angeles an early 7-0 lead.

The Chargers answered a 47-yard Bengals field goal by kicker Randy Bullock with another touchdown. A 13-play, 85-yard L.A. drive ended with a five-yard touchdown rush by Ekeler to put Los Angeles up 14-3 with 14:51 remaining in the half.

Cincinnati's next two scoring drives would start in Chargers territory. On the first, Driskel came up inches short on a touchdown rush. On fourth-and-goal from inside the one, the Bengals committed a false start penalty and had to settle for a 23-yard Bullock field goal, which cut the Chargers lead to 14-6.

The Bengals' next score was a touchdown. Driskel connected with wide receiver John Ross for a six-yard score, but Cincinnati failed to convert the two-point conversion.

With 10 seconds remaining in the half, the Chargers used a pair of 11-yard receptions and a five-yard offside penalty to set up Badgley's 59-yard field goal attempt, which was good. Los Angeles led 17-12 at halftime.

The only scores for Los Angeles in the second half were three Badgley field goals (31, 32 and 45 yards).

WEEK 15 RECAP - CHARGERS 29, CHIEFS 28

Mike Williams scored a one-yard touchdown reception and the go-ahead two-point conversion with four seconds remaining as the Los Angeles Chargers shocked the Kansas City Chiefs 29-28 Thursday night at Arrowhead Stadium.

Philip Rivers finished 26-of-38 for 313 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Rivers was down a target when wide receiver Keenan Allen left the game in the first half with a hip injury. In Allen's absence, Mike Williams caught seven passes for 76 yards and scored three total touchdowns while Tyrell Williams added 71 yards on six catches.

Running back Justin Jackson started the game in place of Melvin Gordon and rushed for 58 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. Detrez Newsome added 53 total yards. Safety Adrian Phillips led the Chargers with nine tackles and defensive end Melvin Ingram was credited with 1.5 sacks.

The win snaps a nine-game losing streak to the Chiefs and clinched a playoff spot.

Rivers was intercepted by cornerback Steven Nelson on the second play of the game. Starting at the Chargers' 49-yard line, the Chiefs closed a 10-play drive with a five-yard touchdown reception from Patrick Mahomes to wide receiver Demarcus Robinson.

Kansas City possessed the ball for nearly 10 minutes in the first quarter. On its second

possession, Mahomes found running back Darrel Williams for an 11-yard touchdown reception. The Chiefs led 14-0 after one.

Los Angeles got on the board with a 10-play drive that started with a 38-yard reception by Mike Williams. It ended with a three-yard touchdown from Rivers to Williams that cut Kansas City's lead seven points.

Late in the second quarter with the Chargers at Kansas City's 11-yard line, Rivers threw an interception to cornerback Kendall Fuller in the end zone. It was Rivers' second pick of the game, and it kept the score 14-7 Chiefs at halftime.

Kansas City opened the second half with a seven-play, 74-yard touchdown drive. Running back Damien Williams punched in a two-yard score to increase the Chiefs lead to 21-7.

A much-needed response from the Chargers came in the form of an 11-play, 76-yard scoring drive of their own. Mike Williams scored his second touchdown of the game on a 19-yard rush. He has nine total touchdowns on the season.

Damien Williams' second rushing touchdown of the night put Kansas City up 28-14 with 8:20 remaining in the game. Los Angeles answered with a three-yard touchdown rush by Jackson before Mike Williams' score and go-ahead two-point conversion.

WEEK 16 RECAP - RAVENS 22, CHARGERS 10

The Baltimore Ravens defeated the Los Angeles Chargers 22-10 on Saturday night from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center.

Los Angeles' offense was held to 198 total yards and under 20 points for the first time this season. Quarterback Philip Rivers finished 23-of-37 for 181 and two interceptions. Running back Melvin Gordon had 41 rushing yards on 12 carries and a touchdown after a three-game absence.

Down 16-10 with 2:54 remaining, Rivers found tight end Antonio Gates for an 11-yard gain, but he fumbled. The ball was scooped up by cornerback Tavon Young, who raced 62 yards for a touchdown that put the game out of reach.

On the first play of the game, Ravens cornerback Brandon Carr intercepted Rivers on a ball intended for wide receiver Mike Williams. Baltimore immediately capitalized with a 43-yard rush by rookie running back Gus Edwards, which set up a 24-yard field goal by Justin Tucker.

Baltimore had 81 rushing yards in the first quarter (7.4 yards per carry) with momentum entering the second. Threatening to score on a fourth-and-goal from the Chargers' two-yard

line, Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson threw an incomplete pass in the end zone to wide receiver Michael Crabtree.

Los Angeles had four offensive possessions after Rivers' interception on the game's opening play. Three ended in punts; the final was a nine-play, 65-yard drive ending with a 38-yard Michael Badgley field goal to make the score 6-3 Baltimore at halftime. The Ravens' offense held the ball for 19:54 in the first half.

The Ravens started the second half the same way the Chargers began the first: with a turnover. A Kenneth Dixon fumble – forced by defensive tackle Darius Philon – was recovered at Baltimore's 17-yard line by defensive end Melvin Ingram. Three plays later, Gordon punched in a one-yard touchdown run that gave L.A. a 10-6 lead.

It took two plays for a Baltimore response. Jackson connected with tight end Mark Andrews for a 68-yard touchdown to retake the lead. Tucker would later add to the Ravens' advantage in the third quarter with a 56-yard field goal. The final score of the game was Young's defensive touchdown.

WEEK 17 RECAP - CHARGERS 23, BRONCOS 9

The Los Angeles Chargers used a season-high four forced turnovers to beat the Denver Broncos 23-9 in Sunday's regular season finale from Broncos Stadium at Mile High.

Los Angeles finished 8-1 away from ROKiT Field at StubHub Center and 12-4 overall. The victory also clinched the franchise's sixth season with at least 12 wins.

Now, the postseason awaits. The Chargers will travel to face the Baltimore Ravens next week in the first round of the AFC Playoffs.

Philip Rivers threw two interceptions in a first quarter that featured five combined punts and zero points. The game remained scoreless with 5:44 remaining in the second quarter until Chargers linebacker Kyle Emanuel scooped up a fumble for an 18-yard touchdown.

With the Broncos threatening to score before the half, quarterback Case Keenum was intercepted by Chargers safety Jahleel Addae in the end zone. On the return, Addae attempted a backward lateral that was recovered by Denver at Los Angeles' 20-yard line. Seven plays later, Brandon McManus kicked a 28-yard field goal to make the score 7-3 Chargers at halftime.

Los Angeles increased its lead in the third quarter after another Broncos turnover.

Defensive end Joey Bosa recovered a Tim Patrick fumble – forced by Adrian Phillips – at the Broncos' 16-yard line. Four plays later, Rivers connected with wide receiver Mike Williams for a four-yard touchdown reception.

Denver cut the lead to 14-9 in the fourth quarter with a 20-yard touchdown reception by fullback Andy Janovich. The two-point conversion attempt was intercepted in the end zone by cornerback Casey Hayward and returned for two Chargers points. Suddenly, what could have been a three-point game flipped to seven.

Austin Ekeler's one-yard touchdown rush with 5:48 remaining in the game sealed the win for Los Angeles. Ekeler led the Chargers with 58 rushing yards on eight carries.

Rivers finished the game 14-of-24 for 176 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions before giving way to Geno Smith in the fourth quarter. Mike Williams and Keenan Allen combined for nine catches for 129 yards and a touchdown. Los Angeles committed a season-high four turnovers of their own.

Bosa notched a sack and ended the regular season with 5.5 in seven games. Phillips led the defense with 12 tackles.

WILD CARD RECAP - CHARGERS 23, RAVENS 17

Threes and D.

That's what the Los Angeles Chargers used to defeat the Baltimore Ravens 23-17 in Sunday's AFC Wild Card Round from M&T Bank Stadium.

Rookie kicker Michael Badgley converted on five field goals, while Los Angeles' defense forced two turnovers, sacked quarterback Lamar Jackson seven times and held Baltimore to 229 yards of total offense -- the fewest allowed in postseason team history. Badgley set a single-game postseason team record for made field goals and points.

Down 23-3, the Ravens scored 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter with an opportunity to win the game down six. With 28 seconds remaining, linebacker Uchenna Nwosu sacked Jackson, who fumbled. Defensive end Melvin Ingram recovered the ball to end the game.

The Chargers won time of possession 33:40 to 26:20. Quarterback Philip Rivers finished the game 22-of-32 for 160 yards while spreading the ball to nine different receivers. Running back Melvin Gordon rushed for 40 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries.

Chargers Defensive Coordinator Gus Bradley featured seven defensive backs on the field for much of the game. In the first quarter, Ingram forced a Jackson fumble, which was recovered by safety Adrian Phillips. The turnover set up a 21-yard Badgley field goal that gave Los Angeles an early 3-0 lead.

Later in the quarter, the rookie kicker converted from 53 yards out to increase the Chargers' lead to 6-0. Badgley added his third field goal in the second quarter, a 40-yarder off a Phillips interception of Jackson. His fourth was a 34-yarder as time expired in the second quarter to put Los Angeles up 12-0 at halftime.

In a drive that began late in the third quarter and ended in the fourth, Gordon's one-yard touchdown rush -- L.A.'s lone TD of the game -- capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive. Wide receiver Mike Williams' two-point conversion put Los Angeles up 20-3. Badgley's 47-yard field goal in the fourth quarter was L.A.'s final score of the game.

Ingram had two sacks while defensive ends Joey Bosa and Isaac Rochell, defensive tackle Justin Jones, defensive back Desmond King and Nwosu each chipped in with one apiece.
