RAMS FACE PATS IN SUPER BOWL XXXVI REMATCH





Los Angeles, Calif. – The Los Angeles Rams (13-3, 2-0) will face the New England Patriots (11-5, 2-0) in Super Bowl LIII played in Atlanta, the host city of the franchise's most recent Super Bowl victory. This marks the Rams' fourth Super Bowl appearance.

The Rams are led by second-year Head Coach Sean McVay, who will become the youngest head coach to ever lead a team in a Super Bowl (33 years old). If the Rams are victorious, McVay would become the youngest head coach to ever win a World Championship, a record currently held by Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin, who was 36 years old when he guided Pittsburgh to a Super Bowl XLIII title.

QB Jared Goff, who was seven years old when Patriots QB Tom Brady made his Super Bowl debut, is the first QB in NFL History selected No. 1 overall to reach the Super Bowl within three seasons of being drafted There is a 17-year-age gap between Goff (24) and Brady (41), marking the largest age differential between opposing starting quarterbacks in Super Bowl history.

The Rams won the NFC Championship off the foot of K Greg Zuerlein, who booted a 57-yard game-winning field goal in the Rams' first possession of overtime. The 57-yarder was the longest game-winning field goal in NFL playoff history.

The Los Angeles Rams have a do-it-all athlete in P Johnny Hekker. Hekker has 22 punts within or at the opponents' 20-yard line, three rushing yards, has completed three-of-five passing attempts for 31 yards and a 77.9 QB rating, including the postseason this season. All three completions were successful fourth-down conversions. Hekker also filled in for K Greg Zuerlein in a Week 2 win over Arizona. In that game, Hekker went one-of-one on point after attempts, one-of-one field goal attempts (20 yarder) and added six kickoffs with two touchbacks. Hekker is the first player in almost 40 years (1979), and one of only five players in the entire Super Bowl era to have at least one PAT, FG, rushing attempt and pass completion within a season.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR



With a win in Super Bowl LIII, Head Coach Sean McVay (33) would become the youngest head coach to ever win a Super Bowl. Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin holds the current record at 36 years old when Pittsburgh defeated Arizona on Feb. 1, 2009. With his next postseason win, McVay (2-1) would become one of only six head coaches in Rams history to record three postseason victories. John Robinson holds the franchise record with four playoff victories

- between 1983-91.

 QB Jared Goff (742) needs 203 passing yards to crack the top five on the Rams postseason passing leaders list. Marc Bulger (944 passing yards) and Bob Waterfield (965) currently rank fifth and fourth, respectively. With a 300-yard postseason passing performance, Goff will become only the fifth quarterback in franchise history to achieve the feat. Only two signal-callers Kurt Warner (4) and Marc Bulger (2) – have reached the 300-yard mark two or more times in franchise ostseason history.
- RB **Todd Gurley II** (226) needs three yards to pass former RB Tyler Wendell (228) for sixth - RB Todd Gurley II (226) needs three yards to pass former RB Tyler Wendell (228) for sixth place on the franchise's postseason rushing list. With 97 rushing yards on Sunday, Gurley would pass Greg Bell (322) for fifth place. With his next 100-yard rushing performance, Gurley will become only the third running back in franchise history to have accomplished the feat three times, joining Eric Dickerson and Lawrence McCutcheon. Gurley (242) can crack the top 10 on the Rams all-time postseason yards from scrimmage list with 138 yards from scrimmage on Sunday. Former RB Greg Bell currently holds 10th place with 379 yards from scrimmage in the postseason. Gurley and RB C.J. Anderson (12) each need six points to move into a four-way tie for 10th place on the Rams all-time postseason scoring list. Dick Hoerner, Preston Dennard and Fric Dickerson all are tied with 18 postseason points Eric Dickerson all are tied with 18 postseason points.
- Eric Dickerson all are tied with 18 postseason points.

 WR Robert Woods (21) currently tied with Harold Jackson and Az-Zahir Hakim needs one reception to take sole possession of sixth place on the franchise's top-10 list for playoff receptions. With eight receptions in Super Bowl LIII, Woods would pass Tom Fears and Henry Ellard (28) for fourth place. Woods (244) needs 41 yards to pass Az-Zahir Hakim (284 yards receiving) for ninth place in franchise history in playoff receiving yards. Woods could also pass Ron Jessie and Preston Dennard (314) for seventh place with 71 receiving yards on Sunday. Woods (250) can crack the top 10 on the Rams all-time postseason yards from scrimmage list with 130 yards from scrimmage on Sunday. Former RB Greg Bell currently holds 10th place with 379 yards from scrimmage in the postseason. With their next 100-yard receiving performance, Woods and/or WR Brandin Cooks would become only the sixth receiver in franchise history to have accomplished the feat twice. Only two receivers Isaac Bruce (4) and 70m Fears (3) have accomplished the feat twice. Only two receivers – Isaac Bruce (4) and Tom Fears (3) – have reached the 100-yard mark at least three times in the franchise postseason history.
- WR Brandin Cooks (11) needs seven receptions in Super Bowl LIII to crack the franchise's - WR Brandin Cooks (11) needs seven receptions in Super Bowl Lili to crack the franchise's top 10 list for postseason receptions. Lawrence McCutcheon currently holds 10th place with 17 postseason receiving yardage in franchise history. Kevin Curtis currently ranks 10th on the list with 235 career playoff receiving yards.

 - OLB Dante Fowler Jr. and DT Ndamukong Suh (1.5) each need 0.5 sacks to move into an eight-way tie for sixth place on the Rams all-time postseason sack leaders list (since 1982).
- Kevin Greene holds the franchise best with 7.0 career postseason sacks dating back to 1982.

 K Greg Zuerlein (26) needs five points to pass Tom Fears and Frank Corral (30) for fourth
- place on the Rams all-time postseason scoring list. Jeff Wilkins (77 points) holds the franchise
- P Johnny Hekker (6) needs to place one punt inside the 20-yard line to pass John Baker (6) for the second-most punts pinned inside the 20-yard line in the franchise's postseason history.

There are **4** players on the Rams active roster that have played in a Super Bowl – RB C.J. Anderson (50), WR Brandin Cooks (LII), CB Sam Shields (XLV) and CB Aqib Talib (50). Three of the four have won a Lombardi Trophy.

With a win, the 2018 Rams would tie the franchise-best mark for wins in a single season with **16**. Both the 1999 Rams (13-3) and 2001 Rams (14-2) posted 16 wins on their way to Super Bowl appearances during their respective seasons.

Rams RB John Kelly (**22** years, 122 days) could become the youngest player in Rams history to win a Super Bowl. Former WR Az-Zahir Hakim holds the current record at **22** years and 242 days when the Rams won SB XXXVI on Jan. 30, 2000.

In Super Bowl 50, now Rams RB C.J. Anderson rushed for 90 yards and a fourth-quarter touchdown, aiding the Broncos and current teammate, CB Aqib Talib, to a 24-10 victory.

COACHES' CORNER





On January 12, 2017, Los Angeles Rams Owner/ Chairman E. Stanley Kroenke named Sean McVay the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history. McVay became the youngest coach in modern NFL history.

In his first season guiding the Rams, McVay completed one of the greatest offensive turnarounds in NFL history. He helped the Rams move from the 32nd-ranked scoring offense in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017, marking the first time in league history a team has gone from last to first in scoring. The first-year head coach led the Rams to an 11-5 record and their first NFC West title since the 2003 season, earning the team's first playoff berth since 2004.

Following his first season in L.A., McVay was named The Associated Press Coach of the Year, becoming the youngest head coach to ever win the award. RB Todd Gurley II brought home Offensive Player of the Year honors, while DT Aaron Donald was named the Defensive Player of the Year, marking the first time in the 45-year history of the awards there was a sweep of three of the league's top awards. The Rams placed eight players in the 2018 Pro Bowl, the most in a single season by the franchise since the 1999 campaign.

Under McVay's guidance in 2017, second-year QB Jared Goff flourished. Goff completed 296-of-477 (62.1 percent) of his passes for 3,804 yards with 28 touchdowns and seven interceptions posting a 100.5 QB rating on the season. Gurley led the league in scrimmage yards finishing the year with 2,093 yards, including 1,305 rushing yards and 788 receiving yards. Additionally, Gurley was the league's highest scoring non-kicker posting 19 total touchdowns on the season.

The Rams defense posted the fourth-most sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished the 2017 campaign fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in

In his first season as head coach, the Rams special teams unit played an integral part in the team's success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl. The L.A. special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings.

McVay completed his third season as the Redskins' offensive coordinator in 2016 after initially being promoted to the position on January 15, 2014. Prior to his promotion during the 2014 offseason, McVay spent three seasons as the team's tight ends coach and one as an offensive assistant.

The 2016 Redskins' offensive unit broke many franchise records and ranked in the top three in a number of statistical categories. The Washington offense became the first unit in franchise history to average over 400 yards per game (403.4) and notched a franchise record 6,545 total net yards. Quarterback Kirk Cousins finished the year with single-season team records in completions (406) and passing yards (4,917) and matched his team record for 300-yard passing games (seven). His 4,917 passing yards ranked third in the NFL in 2016 and are the 15th-most in a season in NFL history. Cousins closed out the season ranked second in the NFL in passing yards per game (297.4), passing yards per play (7.84) and yards per play (6.4), in addition to being the league's third ranked offensive team, averaging 403.4 yards per game. yards per game.

From 2015-16, Cousins threw for 9,083 yards, the fourth highest output by a quarterback trailing only Drew Brees (10,078), Matt Ryan (9,535) and Philip Rivers (9,178). The Redskins offense had eight players finish the season with at least 500 yards from scrimmage (DeSean Jackson, Pierre Garcon, Jamison Crowder, Rob Kelley, Chris Thompson, Jordan Reed, Vernon Davis and Matt Jones), tying the 2011 New Orleans Saints for the most in a single season in NFL history.

McVay's group posted a breakout campaign in his second year as offensive coordinator in 2015, including record-setting performances by quarterback Kirk Cousins and tight end Jordan Reed. McVay's scheme and tutelage helped Cousins break Redskins records for attempts (543), completions (379), passing yards (4,166) and 300-yard passing games (seven) in a single season.

Collectively, McVay's 2015 offense recorded top-10 rankings in third down percentage (43.5, fifth in the NFL), red zone scoring percentage (61.2, eighth), yards per play (5.6, 10th) and points per game (24.3, 10th). The Redskins also led the NFL with a team-record 69.5 completion percentage in 2015, leading the league in the category for the 11th time in team history and the first time since 1970.

In his first season as offensive coordinator in 2014, McVay helped the offense to a Top 10 league ranking in yards per play (5.7) despite starting three different quarterbacks. His work with the three passers was instrumental in setting a team record for completion percentage (66.5 percent, later broken in 2015) and helping facilitate the explosive debut season of wide receiver DeSean Jackson.

In 2013, McVay played a crucial role in Reed's development, as the then-rookie compiled 45 receptions for 499 yards – both Redskins' single-season rookie tight end records – despite Reed playing in only nine games.

During Washington's NFC East championship season in 2012, McVay's unit was productive despite losing starting tight end Fred Davis to a torn Achilles tendon in Week 7. Davis had led the team in both receptions (24) and receiving yards (325) through seven games before being placed on the Reserve/Injured list.

In 2011, McVay played an integral role in Davis' emergence, as the then fourth-year tight end surpassed his previous career highs despite playing in only 12 games. Davis caught 59 passes for 796 yards, the second-highest total on the team in both

McVay served as an offensive assistant to the Redskins in 2010 in addition to working with the tight ends during the final four weeks of the season following coach Jon Embree's departure. McVay joined the Redskins prior to the 2010 season after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League (UFL). The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UFL's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the National Football League as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2008.

McVay graduated from Miami University (Ohio) where he played wide receiver from 2004-07, earning Miami's Scholar-Athlete Award in 2007. His grandfather, John, served in various roles – including vice president/director of football operations from 1983-94 – for the San Francisco 49ers from 1979-95, overseeing five Super Bowl championship squads and earning induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.

Bill Belichick completed his 43rd season as an NFL coach in 2017 and is in his 19th season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win fve Super Bowl titles. In 2017, Belichick won a division title for the ninth consecutive season and won an eighth conference championship as a head coach, extending his NFL record in both categories. Belichick won 13 regularseason games for an NFL-record seventh time and secured his 15th AFC East Division title as Patriots head coach, the most in NFL history.

Belichick enters 2018 with the most wins among all active coaches and is currently third all-time with Belichick enters 2018 with the most wins among all active coaches and is currently third all-time with 278 total victories as a head coach. Belichick's winning percentage of .683 ranks frst in NFL history among coaches with 150 or more wins. He has led the Patriots to a winning record for 17 consecutive seasons (2001-17), trailing only Tom Landry, who recorded 20 consecutive winning seasons from 1966-85. Belichick has also notched 28 postseason wins in his career, most by a head coach in NFL history

coach in NFL history.



Belichick, who was hired by Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft on Jan. 27, 2000, is in his 19th season with the Patriots. In 18 seasons, Belichick has so far delivered five Super Bowl championships, eight conference titles, 15 division crowns and 27 playoff victories, while posting an overall record of 241-84. Entering 2018, the Patriots have won nine consecutive division championships, besting the seven won by the L.A. Rams (1973-79). Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVII (2001), XXXVIII (2003), XXXIX (2004), XLIX (2014) and LI (2016), and in 2007 he became the only NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season. From 2003 to 2004, Belichick directed the Patriots to a winning streak of 21 consecutive games, including the postseason.

Despite an NFL system designed to ensure parity, Belichick's program has produced a remarkable run of sustained on-feld success. From 2000-17, the Patriots won 74.3 percent of their regular-season games (214-74), among the highest winning percentages of any major American professional sports team over that span. Over a 100-game stretch from 2003-09, Belichick directed the team to 81 wins, the most in NFL history by a head coach. Additionally, the Patriots enter 2018 with 115 wins (regular and postseason) in this decade and need 11 wins overall this season to tie the 2000-09 Patriots for the NFL record with 126 wins in a decade. Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record in each of the last 17 seasons. From 2011-17, Belichick's teams won the AFC East title and advanced in the playoffs, with the Patriots' seven straight years of playoff advancement setting a new NFL record, passing Dallas (1991-96) for the longest streak in NFL history. Additionally, New England is the only franchise in the NFL to qualify for the playoffs in each of the last nine seasons (2009-17).

Belichick's 28 career playoff wins are the most all-time among head coaches, while New England's 14 playoff victories from 2000-09 are tied for the most in any decade in NFL history. New England enters 2018 with 13 postseason victories from 2010-17. He has compiled a career playoff record of 28-11, with his .718 playoff winning percentage placing him third in NFL history.

Belichick's Patriots have rarely been rattled, able to consistently maintain leads and bounce back following losses. Since the beginning of the 2003 season, New England is 45-6 (.882) in regular-season games following a loss, dropping back-to-back regular-season contests just six times over that span.

In addition, the Patriots have consistently maintained their focus throughout the year and have played their best football late in the season. Since 2001, the Patriots lead the league with a 105-29 (.784) overall record in games played on Thanksgiving or later in the NFL season, including playoffs. As the season wears on, the Patriots have only gotten better, posting an NFL-best 44-15 (.746) mark since 2001 in games played on Christmas or later in the NFL season and have gone an NFL-best 62-11 (.849) in the month of December. Since becoming Patriots head coach in 2000, Belichick is 64-13 (.831) in December, the best record in December among head coaches with one team in NFL history (min. 25 games). George Seifert is second (27-6, 818). Additionally, Belichick is the first head coach in NFL history to lead a team to three straight 500-point seasons (2010-12) and the Patriots are the first franchise in NFL history to score 500 or more points in four seasons (2007-589, 2010-518, 2011-513 and 2012-557.).

Belichick began his coaching career after graduating from Wesleyan University and accepting a staff assistant position with the Baltimore Colts in 1975. At the age of 23, he was named special assistant to Head Coach Ted Marchibroda. In 1976, Belichick joined Rick Forzano's staff with the Detroit Lions as an assistant special teams coach. The following year, he was given his first positional coaching assignment as the Lions' tight ends and receivers coach. In 1978, Denver Broncos Head Coach Red Miller hired Belichick as the assistant special teams coach and assistant to defensive coordinator. Jee Collier assistant to defensive coordinator Joe Collier

Belichick then spent 12 seasons with the New York Giants (1979-1990) before becoming head coach of the Cleveland Browns (1991-95). He later joined Bill Parcells for several seasons as assistant head coach/secondary with New England (1996) and assistant head coach/secondary with the N.Y. Jets (1997-99) before returning to Foxborough.

Belichick returned to the Patriots as head coach after three seasons with the Belichick returned to the Patriots as head coach after three seasons with the New York Jets as the team's assistant head coach/secondary coach, holding the responsibility of calling the team's defensive plays. In 1998, the Jets surrendered just 266 points, propelling the team to its first division title. After finishing the regular season with a franchise-best 12-4 overall record, the Jets advanced to the AFC Championship Game. In his first season with the Jets in 1997, his defense surrendered just 287 points, an average of 17.9 points per game, marking a significant 10.5-point per-game improvement from 1996.

Belichick lettered in football, lacrosse and squash while attending college at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Conn. He earned three letters in football while competing at center and tight end. As a senior, he was named captain of his lacrosse team. He was inducted into the Wesleyan University Athletics Hall of Fame as part of its inaugural class in 2008.

Bill Belichick was born April 16, 1952, in Nashville, Tenn., and raised in Annapolis, Md. His father, Steve, played fullback for the Detroit Lions in 1941 and coached for 33 years at the Naval Academy. Bill was a standout prep athlete at Annapolis High, where he has since been inducted into the school's Hall of Fame. He attended Phillips Academy in Andover, Mass., before enrolling at Wesleyan, where he earned his bachelor's degree in economics in 1975.

- WR Josh Reynolds Second-year pro has played in 32 regular season games with nine starts and appeared in three playoff contests with one start. During the 2018 regular season, posted career highs in receptions (29) and receiving yards (402), while averaging 13.9 yards/reception, with five touchdowns. The Texas A&M product has rushed the ball twice for a total of eight yards in 2018. In his career, Reynolds has posted 506 yards on 40 receptions with six total touchdowns.
- TE Tyler Higbee Played in 48 career regular season games with 39 starts in addition to starting all three playoff contests. Posted 24 receptions for 292 yards and two touchdowns in 16 games played during the 2018 campaign. Has caught 60 passes for 672 yards with four touchdowns in his career. Posted a career-best 98 yards receiving on four receptions against the Seahawks in a 2017 Week 5 contest.
- LT Andrew Whitworth 13th-year pro has started 195-of-199 career regular season games played and started all nine postseason games he has played in. Named the team's Walter Payton Man of the Year candidate for his work in the community. Voted a team captain by his peers for the second-consecutive season with the Rams. Named to his fourth-career Pro Bowl following the 2017 campaign
- LG Rodger Saffold III Ninth-year pro has started 111-of-114 career regular season games played, including all 16 games of the 2018 campaign at LG. Has started at four different positions in 111 career starts 55 at LG, 38 at LT, 13 at RG, and five at RT. Made his postseason debut starting at LG in the Wild Card round against Atlanta in the 2017 Wild Card Game. Started at LG in the 2018 NFC Divisional Round, helping the Rams rush for a postseason franchise-best 273 yards, started his first NFC Championship game, third-career playoff contest.
- C John Sullivan Started 125-of-153 career regular season games played, all at the center position. Paved the way for RB Todd Gurley II to amass 1,251 rushing yards during the 2018 regular season, the third-best rushing total this season. Has appeared in seven playoff games with five starts, including two NFC Championships in the Superdome.
- RG Austin Blythe Third-year pro has appeared in 40 regular season games with 18 starts, including all 16 games of the 2018 campaign at the right guard position. Earned his first postseason start in his second-career playoff game in 2018 NFC Divisional Round contest and the NFC Championship. Joined the team via waivers from the Indianapolis Colts prior to the 2017 campaign. Committed only one penalty and allowed only one sack in 16 starts during the 2018 regular season.
- RT Rob Havenstein Fourth-year pro, started all 59 career regular season games played and all three playoff contests. Has committed only 11 penalties in 59 regular season games. A second-round selection (No. 57 overall) by the Rams in the 2015 NFL Draft, signed a contract extension prior to the 2018 campaign.
- WR Brandin Cooks Acquired by the Rams via a trade that sent the Rams 2018 first-round pick to the Patriots. Signed a five-year contract extension prior to reporting to training camp. Fifth-year pro has played in 74 regular season games with 63 starts. Finished second on the team with 80 receptions and receiving yards (1,204) with a 15.1 yards per reception average in 2018. Posted at least 1,000 yards receiving in each of the last four seasons. Became the first player in NFL history to record three-straight 1,000-yard receiving seasons on three different teams. Recorded 360 career receptions for 5,147 yards and 32 touchdowns. Started all five playoff contests in his career and is making his second-straight Super Bowl appearance. Super Bowl appearance.
- WR Robert Woods The USC product has played in 85 regular season games with 75 starts through the 2018 regular season. Led the team with 86 receptions for 1,219 which are both new single-season career high during the 2018 regular season. Led the team in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (142) against the Falcons in the 2017 NFC Wild Card game. Woods' 142 receiving yards were the fourth-highest output in a single postseason game in Rams history and is the fourth receiver in franchise history to post 100-plus receiving yards in their postseason debut with the Rams.
- QB Jared Goff Started all 38 regular season games he has played in as a professional and all three playoff contests. During the 2018 regular season, completed 364-of-561 passing attempts for 4,688 yards, 32 touchdowns, 12 interceptions and a 101.1 QB rating. Recorded three-straight games with over 350 yards while completing at least 75 percent of his passes, the longest streak in league history (Weeks 2-4). Established a career-best 465 yards passing vs. Minnesota in Week 4 win with a career-high 158.3 QB rating, the most passing attempts by a QB with a perfect QB rating in league history.
- RB Todd Gurley II Fourth-year pro has started 57-of-58 career regular season games played. Recorded his first-career 200-plus yard rushing game against Denver (10/14/18), totaling 208 yards on 28 attempts with two rushing touchdowns. Posted 1,251 yards rushing on 256 attempts (4.9 yards/rush) with 17 touchdowns on the ground and caught 59 passes for 580 yards and four receiving touchdowns and 1,831 yards from scrimmage in 2018. Rushed 14 times for 101 yards in his playoff debut against Atlanta, becoming the first Rams running back to notch a 100-plus yard game in his postseason debut since 1945. Posted over 100 yards rushing in back-to-back playoff games in 2017 Wildcard and 2018 Divisional Round.

- TE Gerald Everett Second-year pro has played in all 32 regular season games with two start, in addition to one postseason start in three playoff contests. Posted a career-best 320 yards and three touchdowns on 33 receptions during the 2018 regular season, including a 40-yard game-winning score against the Chiefs in Week 11. In his career, totaled 564 yards receiving on 49 receptions.
- RB C.J. Anderson Sixth-year pro has played in all 69 regular season games with 39 starts in addition seven postseason games played with two starts. Will make his third Super Bowl appearance. Joined the Ram via free agency heading into team's week 16 game at Arizona. Started final two games of the 2018 regular season and posted back-to-back 130-plus yard rushing games with two touchdowns. He and Gurley became the first duo to each rush for over 100 yards in a playoff game in franchise history. Started Super Bowl 50 for the Broncos, helping the team win a world championship. Rushed 23 times for 90 yards in his Super Bowl start in a 24-10 Broncos win over the Panthers in Super Bowl 50.

- **DE Michael Brockers** The seventh-year pro started 105-of-107 career regular season games played and both playoff contests. Tallied the Rams first sack of the 2018 season in Week 1 at Oakland. The LSU product has 20.0 career sacks, eight passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Finished seventh on the team with 54 tackles (33 solo) during the 2018 regular season. Started his playoff debut, a 2017 Wild Card contest against the Falcons, recorded 0.5 sack in 2017 Wild Card contest, a sack split with DT Aaron Donald.
- NT Ndamukong Suh Ninth-year pro has started all 142 career regular season games played, including 115-consecutive starts, the longest by an active defensive lineman in addition to five postseason starts in five playoff games. Posted 1.5 sacks in NFC Championship. Recorded two tackles in Rams debut. Totalled 56.0 career sacks resulting in 364.5 yards lost. Recorded his first sack as a Ram in a Week 3 win over the Chargers, posted a sack in three-consecutive games from Weeks 3-5. A five-time Pro Bowler, has been named first-team All-Pro three times and second-team All-Pro twice.
- **DT**Aaron Donald Five-time Pro Bowler has started 74-of-78 regular season games played in addition to all three playoff games. Posted first 2.0 sacks of 2018, his eighth career multi-sack game, in a Week 4 win over Minnesota, tallied at least 1.0 sack in 10 of the final 13 games of the 2018 regular season, including a careerbest 4.0 sacks in a Week 7 win at San Francisco. Posted seven multi-sack games in 2018, finishing with 20.5 sacks on the season, a new career-best and the most in a single season by a Rams defender. Has 59.5 career sacks.
- OLB Samson Ebukam Second-year pro out of Eastern Washington played in 32 regular season games with 16 starts through his first two seasons as a pro, in addition to three playoff games with one postseason start. Posted his first sack of 2018 (third career) in Week 2 win over Arizona. Forced a fumble in back-to-back games, at Denver, at San Francisco (Weeks 5-6) and his third of the season at New Orleans in a Week 9 contest. Tallied 39 tackles (24 solo) and 3.0 sacks during the 2018 regular season. Became the first player to record a sack, an interception and two touchdowns since sacks became an official stat in 1982.
- OLB Dante Fowler Jr. Fourth-year pro has played in 47 regular season games with seven starts through the 2018 campaign, including six starts as a Ram. Joined the Rams via a trade before the 2018 trade deadline. Has 27 career QB hits, 18 tackles for loss, 16.0 sacks, four forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. Posted his first sack as a Ram, a strip sack, of Seahawks QB Russell Wilson setting up a touchdown in a 2018 Week 10 game. Recorded the Rams first sack of the 2018 postseason in his first postseason start in the NFC Divisional Round. Started the NFC Championship and pressured the QB in OT, forcing an interception.
- LB Cory Littleton Third-year pro has played in all 48 regular season games and three playoff games since joining the team as an undrafted free agent following the 2016 NFL Draft. Earned 21 career regular season starts, including all 16 in 2018. In 2018 Week 1 contest, recorded 13 total tackles and one interception. Led the team with 125 total tackles this season (90 solo). Tallied 17 passes defensed, seven quarterback hits, 11 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, four interceptions and 5.0 sacks in his career. Blocked a punt vs. Chargers in Week 3 and at San Francisco Week 7, deflected a punt in a Week 5 win at Seattle in 2018. His 125 tackles were tied for the 10th-most in the NFL during the 2018 campaign.
- LB Mark Barron Seventh-year pro out of Alabama started 93-of-104 career regular season games played and started three playoff games. Transitioned from a pure safety to a hybrid linebacker role, before settling in as a true linebacker under Defensive Coordinator Wade Phillips' 3-4 defense. Made his 2018 debut in Week 5 at Seattle and led the team with nine total tackles (five solo). On the season, totaled 60 total tackles (43 solo). In the team's 2017 Week 5 contest with the Seahawks, registered a team-high 18 total tackles.
- CB Aqib Talib 11th-year professional, acquired via trade during 2018 offseason. Played in 143 regular season games with 129 starts. Recorded a 103-yard interception returned for a touchdown in 2017. Has 10 career pick-sixes, two short of matching the all-time NFL record for interceptions returned for touchdowns (12) set by Rod Woodson. Tallied his first interception as a Ram in a Week 15 loss to the Eagles. Started all 10 postseason games he has appeared in, including Super Bowl 50, as a member of the Denver Broncos playing for Wade Phillips. Five-time Pro Bowler, most recently following the 2016 season.
- CB Marcus Peters Fourth-year pro joined the Rams via a trade with the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2018 offseason. Recorded a pick-six in Rams debut, intercepting Raiders QB Derek Carr and returned it 50 yards for a TD. Since entering the league in 2015, has recorded 22 interceptions, most in the NFL during that span. Started all 61 career regular season games played, including all 16 this season in addition to starting all six playoff games he's appeared in. Named to consecutive Pro Bowls following the 2015 and 2016 seasons.
- FS Lamarcus Joyner Fifth-year pro has started 42-of-67 career regular season games played, snared four interceptions and posted 5.0 sacks in his career. Posted 78 total tackles during the 2018 season, which ranked third on the team. Tallied first-career INT and returned it 29 yards for a TD in 2017 Week 1 win over the Colts, recorded a game-clinching interception in 2018 Week 11 win over the Chiefs. Recorded 61 total tackles during the 2017 campaign, including 32 solo tackles, seven passes defensed and one forced fumble. Led the team with 11 total tackles, including 10 solo stops in his playoff debut against the Falcons a season ago.
- SS John Johnson III Second-year pro out of Boston College played in all 32 regular season games for the Rams with 27 starts through the 2018 regular season. Posted Rams first interception of 2018 in season opener at Oakland, led the team with four interceptions on the season. Earned first-career start in team's 2017 Week 5 game against the Seahawks, recorded first-career interception and returned it 69 yards setting up a FG in his first start. Finished second on the team with 118 total tackles (81 solo) during the 2018 regular season. Started all three postseason games played.

CB Nickell Robey-Coleman – Fifth-year CB earned first start as a Ram in 2017 Week 2 contest. Played in 95 regular season games with 20 starts in his career. Tallied 35 total tackles (24 solo) in 2018 regular season. Posted six career interceptions and two returned for touchdowns. Registered 50 total tackles, including 36 solo with two interceptions and nine passes defensed in 2017.

COORDINATORS' CORNER



RUN AND PASS GAME COORDINATORS

<u>Aaron Kromer, Run Game Coordinator:</u> Aaron Kromer is in his second season with the Los Angeles Rams, his first season serving as the team's run game coordinator. With the help of Kromer's offensive line, Rams RB Todd Gurley II finished amongst the best in the NFL in scoring (132 points, 5th), rushing yards (1,251, 3rd), rushing touchdowns (17, 1st), scrimmage touchdowns (21, 1st) and scrimmage yards (1,831, 4th) despite only playing in 14 games during the 2018 regular season.

In his first season with the Rams, Kromer served as the offensive line coach overseeing the most stable offensive line unit in the NFL during the 2017 season. Under Kromer's guidance, the offensive line blocked Gurley II, who was named The Associated Press Offensive Player of the Year after leading the league in scrimmage yards (2,093) and total touchdowns (19).

A veteran of more than 17 years as an offensive line coach, Kromer came to Los Angeles prior to the 2017 season after serving the past two seasons in the same capacity with the Buffalo Bills. In his 18 years as an NFL offensive line coach or coordinator, Kromer has helped 16 players earn a total of 23 Pro Bowl appearances.

Shane Waldron, Pass Game Coordinator: Waldron is in his seventh NFL season, second with the Los Angeles Rams and his first season serving as the team's passing game coordinator. With Waldron as pass game coordinator, QB Jared Goff went three consecutive games throwing for over 350 yards while completing at least 75 percent of his passes, the longest streak in league history.


Under Waldron's guidance in 2017, the tight end duo of Tyler Higbee and Gerald Everett combined for 539 yards, three touchdowns and averaged 13.1 yards per reception.

Previously, Waldron served as the Washington Redskins offensive quality control coach for the 2016 season. That season, Washington's offense broke the franchise record for total net yards in a single season (6,454), surpassing the previous team record set in 1989.

FASSEL'S FLYERS

The Rams have developed a reputation for delivering the unexpected in the kicking game, and special teams coordinator John Fassel is at the helm of the trickery that has helped the Rams become one of the NFL's best when it comes to special teams and developed a knack for blocking punts.

In 2017, the special teams unit played an integral part in the Rams success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl in PR/KR Pharoh Cooper, P Johnny Hekker, LS Jake McQuaide and K Greg Zuerlein. Zuerlein led the league in Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel scoring (158 points), despite playing



in only 14 games before being placed on season-ending injured reserved.

The Rams special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings. There were only 11 punts blocked league-wide on the season, and the Rams had three of them. LB Cory Littleton was the only player in the NFL to block two punts. In total, the Rams blocked a total of five kicks in 2017.

In addition to his special teams duties. Fassel served as interim head coach for the final three games of the 2016 season.

PHILLIPS' PHILOSOPHIES

Wade Phillips, who is in his 49th year of coaching, enters his second season with the Rams as defensive coordinator on Head Coach Sean McVay's staff.

A veteran coach entering his 41st NFL season, Phillips owns 36 years of experience as a defensive coordinator or head coach. Phillips continued his streak of helping teams to the playoffs in his first season with the organization when the Rams clinched the NFC West, marking the eighth-straight team that has made the postseason in Phillips' first year with the organization.

In his first season with the Rams in 2017, he guided a defense that finished fourth in sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in the NFL.

DT Aaron Donald was named AP Defensive Player of the Year for his efforts, becoming the first player in Rams history to ever earn DPOY. In 2017, Donald racked up 52 tackles, 31 solo (according to coaches' stats), 11.0 sacks for 95 yards, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two passes defensed, despite playing in only 14 games. Donald had team highs in sacks (11.0), quarterback hits (27) and forced fumbles (5).

Prior to joining the Rams, Phillips served as defensive coordinator for the Denver Broncos (2015-16), which was his second stint with the club after serving the same role from 1989-92, and also as head coach from 1993-94.

Phillips has been a part of 21 different top-10 defensive units during his NFL career and has coached a total of 31 Pro Bowlers. He is one of three individuals in NFL history to be named Assistant Coach of the Year multiple times by the Pro Football Writers of America, being honored with that distinction in 2011 with Houston and in 2015 with Denver. Phillips also received the Paul "Dr. Z" Zimmerman Award from the PFWA in 2016 (lifetime achievement as an NFL assistant coach).



DOMINATING THE DIVISION

Under Head Coach Sean McVay, the Rams are 10-2 against NFC West opponents, including a perfect 4-0 against the Arizona Cardinals and have outscored the Cardinals 130-25. L.A. has outscored NFC West foes, 392-225, through McVay's first 12 divisional games. The Rams finished 6-0 in the NFC West during the 2018 season. The last time an NFC West team accomplished the feat was the Cardinals in 2008. It marked the first time the Rams swept the NFC West since 1999.

After defeating the Seahawks at CenturyLink Field on Oct. 7, 2018 the 49ers at Levi's stadium two weeks later and the Cardinals in Week 16, the Rams improved to 6-0 in NFC West road contests and a perfect 2-0 under McVay at CenturyLink Field, State Farm Stadium and Levi's Stadium. The Kams swept the Seahawks in 2018, marking the first time since 2015 L.A. has swept the Seahawks.

The Rams entered Week 17 of the 2017 season with a twogame lead in the NFC West and an 11-4 record when they decided to rest their starters against the 49ers.

The Rams outscored their divisional opponents 171-112 during the 2017 season, which was a 59 point differential. It was the highest positive point differential in the division for the Rams since the 2001 when the Rams outscored their divisional opponents 274-160 for a 114 point differential. The 2001 Rams played in a five team division and therefore had eight divisional games that season.

The Rams also posted 30-plus points against all three of their divisional opponents last season. The 2002 Rams were the last team to accomplish that feat.

NO FIRST, AND 10

The 2018 NFL Draft marked the 82nd draft for the Rams franchise dating back to the second-ever NFL draft in 1937. The team has not had a first-round selection in only nine of those drafts, most recently in 2018.

The season following a draft in which the team didn't make a selection in the first round, the Rams went on to win at least 10 games on six different occasions (1967, 1968, 1973, 1984, 2017, Ž018), including four seasons where the Rams claimed the NFC West title (1967, 1973, 2017, 2018).

Additionally, five of the franchise's 21 ties have come the season following a draft that the Rams didn't make a first-round selection.

In total, the Rams are 85-41-5 (.649) all-time the season after not selecting in the first round of that year's draft.

TOP-SCORING TEAMS



The Rams have scored 30-plus points 21 times since the start of the 2017 regular season, a feat the franchise achieved only three times during the 2015 and 2016 seasons combined. The Rams have scored 1,005 points since the start of the 2017 season and are 19-2 when scoring at least 30 points under McVay.

In 2018, the Rams scored 30 or more points in 12 of their 16 games, finished second in the NFL in points scored (527) and points per game average (32.9), trailing the only Chiefs.

Rams Head Coach Sean McVay immediately fixed the team's scoring issues, surpassing the 224 points scored in 2016 in only eight games in 2017 and seven games in 2018. The Rams not only improved, they went from worst to first in total scoring and points per game from the 2016 to the 2017 season with 478 points scored and averaged 29.9 points per game.

HONOR ROLL

In his first game of the 2018 season, K Greg Zuerlein connected on four-of-five field goal attempts, including a 55-yarder from the dirt to earn the first player of the week honors for the Rams during the 2018 season. Two weeks later, DB Blake Countess was named the Special Teams Player of the Week for his Week 3 efforts in which he returned a blocked punt for a touchdown and returned two kickoffs for 51 yards (25.5 yards/return).

QB Jared Goff earned his second-career NFC Player of the Week accolades after posting career numbers against the Vikings in a Week 4 game. Two days later, Goff was named the NFC's Offensive Player of the Month for September.

RB Todd Gurley II received his first 2018 Player of the Week accolades following a Week 6 performance at Denver which featured him rushing a career-high 208 yards and two touchdowns. Gurley went on to win Offensive Player of the Month for October. Gurley was named NFC POW for a Week 13 effort.

DT Aaron Donald received his first Player of the Week Accolades since the 2016 season, after establishing a career-high 4.0 sacks against the 49ers in a Week 7 win. Donald earned his first-career Player of the Month accolades for October 2018 and again for December 2018. OLB Samson Ebukam earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week accolades following his 1.0 sack, one interception and two touchdown game against the Chiefs in Week 11. Donald was named Week 16 POW for a 3.0-sack performance against the Cardinals.

There were five Rams honored 10 times during the 2017 campaign with two NFC Special Teams Players of the Week, four NFC Offensive Players of the Week, one NFC Defensive Player of the Week, two NFC Offensive Players of the Month and two Special Teams Players of the Month. Gurley's six touchdowns led the NFC and were tied for first in the NFL in the opening month of the 2017 season. A week after being named NFC Player of the Month for the first three games of the 2017 season, Gurley led the team in rushing (121 yards) and receiving (94 yards) to account for a then career-best 215 yards from scrimmage.

Zuerlein booted his way into the Rams history books in the 2017 Week 4 win over Dallas with a 7-of-7 showing on field goal attempts, establishing a new franchise record for single-game made field goals and posting 23 points. Zuerlein was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October 2017, his first-career player of the month accolades. Rams Head Coach Sean McVay took over a team that was coming off of a 4-12 season and ranked 32nd in scoring and helped transform it into the No. 1 scoring team in the league and helped secure the franchise's first NFC West title since 2003.

Due to his excellent first season and his instrumental part in revamping the Rams offense, McVay was chosen as the Associated Press Coach of the Year for 2017. He is the fourth head coach in franchise history to achieve this honor.

The last Rams head coach to win the award was Dick Vermeil in 1999.

Vermeil helped guide the Rams to a 13-3 record, winning the NFC West and culminating with the franchise's lone Super Bowl victory over the Titans, 23-16, in Super Bowl XXXIV. Chuck Knox was the only other rookie head coach in franchise history to win the award.

The first Rams head coach to ever win the AP Coach of the Year was George Allen in 1967. Allen guided the Rams to an 11-1-2 record in his second year as head coach. Allen's Rams would eventually lose to the Green Bay Packers, 28-7, in the Divisional Round.

McVay became the youngest coach in NFL history to win the Associated Press Coach of the Year award. McVay was 31 years old during the team's final game of the season. Previously, Don Shula (34 years old) was the youngest coach to win the award



AGE IS JUST A NUMBER

According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in 2017 Rams Head Coach Sean McVay became the youngest coach to win his division (since 1970), win the NFC West and youngest head coach to ever make the NFL playoffs a season ago. McVay was just 31 years old in his first season as head coach of the Rams. At 32 years old, in 2018, became the youngest head coach to win a playoff game when the Rams defeated the Cowboys in the NFC Divisional Round.

Below is a look at the previous youngest head coaches in the aforementioned categories.



win NFC West: Dick Nolan, San Francisco, 1970 – 38 years, 269 days old on last day of regular season.

Previous youngest head coach to win his division (since 1970): John Madden, Oakland, 1970 - 34 years, 254 days old on last day of regular season. Madden was also the previous youngest to win a playoff game at 33 years old when he won his first game with the Raiders in 1969.

Previous youngest head coach to appear in a postseason game: Ray Flaherty, Dec. 13, 1936: 33 years, 103 days old.

McVay, who is the youngest head coach to ever lead a team in a Super Bowl (33 years old). If the Rams are victorious, McVay would become the youngest head coach to ever win a World Championship, a record held by Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin, who was 36 years old when he guided Pittsburgh to a Super Bowl title.

MAKING THE BEST OF IT



The Los Angeles Rams are only the second team in NFL history to host a playoff game in a temporary stadium and the first team in NFL history to win a playoff game in a temporary stadium, in addition to being the first team to host a playoff game in back-toback seasons in a temporary venue. The Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum is a venue the franchise is calling home until their new stadium is completed for the start of the 2020 NFL season.

The Rams posted a 13-3 record in 2018, the third-of-four seasons at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, and won the NFC West, earning the No. 2 seed in the 2019 NFC Playoffs.

L.A. finished the 2017 season with an 11-5 record and won the NFC West. The Rams hosted the defending NFC Champion Atlanta Falcons in last year's Wild Card Round at the Coliseum and fell by a score of 26-13.

In 2015, the Minnesota Vikings finished their second season of a two-year stint at TCF Bank Stadium on the campus of the University of Minnesota. The Vikings hosted the Seattle Seahawks in the third-coldest game in NFL history, a game Minnesota lost by a score of 10-9.

Last year's Wild Card game marked the Rams' first playoff game at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since Jan. 7, 1979, when the Rams lost to the Dallas Cowboys in the NFC Championship Game.

A season after being an MVP candidate and earning Offensive Player of the Year accolades, Rams RB Todd Gurley II continued his dominance into the 2018 season.

Gurley finished amongst the best in the NFL in essentially every major rushing category including rushing yards (1,251, 3rd), rush yards per game (89.4. 2nd) and 10-plus yard rushes (35, 2nd) during the 2018 regular season.

The former Georgia Bulldog also added 580 receiving yards and four receiving touchdowns. Gurley ranked fourth in the league in scrimmage yards (1,831), led the RB Todd Gurley II

Rams RB Todd Gurley II had a touchdown streak of 13-straight regular season games from 2017 Week 14 game against the Philadelphia Eagles to Week 10 of the 2018 regular season.

Gurley's streak is a franchise record for the longest consecutive regular season game stretch with a touchdown. In the team's Week 9 loss at New Orleans, Gurley passed Elroy 'Crazylegs' Hirsch who previously held the Rams franchise record for consecutive regular season games with a touchdown, when he went 11-straight games played with a touchdown spanning the 1950-51 seasons.

Hall of Fame RB LaDainian Tomlinson has the longest regularseason touchdown streak since 1970, going 18-straight regular season games with a touchdown from 10/3/04 to 10/16/05.

Additionally, former Bill O.J. Simpson had a 14-game touchdown streak and former Redskin John Riggins, Redskin George Rogers and 49er Jerry Rice all have had 13-game touchdown streaks since 1970.

Rams WR Brandin Cooks has been a consistent pass catcher since he entered the league in 2014 as a first-round draft pick by the New Orleans Saints.

Cooks posted his first 1,000-plus yard receiving season in 2015 (1,138 yards receiving) and is the only player in NFL history to post three consecutive 1,000-plus yards receiving on three different teams in a three-year span. Cooks has 5,050 career receiving yards on 352 receptions.

Since entering the league in 2014, Cooks ranks sixth in the NFL in 25-yard receptions, hauling in 55 catches of over 25

LINING THEM UP

This season the Rams used fourof-five returning starters from a season ago and started the same five offensive linemen for all 16 games of the 2018 regular season, the only team in the league to use the same five offensive linemen for every game this season.

During the 2018 season, L.A. allowed 33 sacks, tied for the eighth-fewest sacks allowed during the regular season.

Of L.A.'s 1,100 offensive snaps during the 2018 regular season, C John Sullivan all five starters played at least 90



percent of the time while two - Austin Blythe and Rob Havenstein played every regular season snap.

In 2017, four Rams offensive linemen cracked the top-10 for the most total snaps played by a lineman in a single season in franchise history, including former G Jamon Brown whose 1,127 snaps were the most by an offensive lineman in Rams history.

One of Head Coach Sean McVay's first tasks was shoring up the Rams offensive line - a unit that saw six different starting combinations during the 2016 campaign. The Rams were the only team in the NFL to use the same five starting offensive linemen in 15 of their contests last season before resting starters during Week 17.

THE LONGEST YARD



During the 2018 regular season, the Los Angeles Rams finished second in the league in scrimmage yards (6,961). The Rams also finished second in the league in scrimmage yards per game (435.1), scored the third-most scrimmage touchdowns (55) and were tied for the fourth-most in scrimmage yards per touch (8.4).

The Rams offense amassed over 500 yards of offense in consecutive weeks (Weeks 3-4), including 556 yards in the team's Week 4 win over the Vikings, in which they averaged over 10 yards per play. The two games with over 500 yards were the


first two 500-plus yard outings by the Rams since Head Coach Sean McVay took over in 2017.

Individually, RB Todd Gurley II finished fourth in the league in scrimmage yards (1,831), led the league in scrimmage touchdowns (21) and averaged 5.8 scrimmage yards per touch and 130.8 yards from scrimmage per game in his 14 games played during the 2018 campaign.

QB Jared Goff

QB Jared Goff became the first player in league history to pass for at least 350 yards while completing at least 75 percent of his passes in three consecutive games, capped off with one of the best performances by a quarterback in league history in the team's Week 4 win over the Minnesota Vikings.

Against the Vikings, Goff established career highs in passing yards (465), passing touchdowns (5) and quarterback rating (158.3). Goff attempted 33 passes, which are the most pass attempts by a QB with a perfect rating in NFL history.

During the 2018 regular season, Goff was amongst the best in the league in passing yards (4,688, 4th), yards per attempt (8.4, 4th), and QB rating (101.1, 8th). His 32 passing touchdowns were tied for the sixth-most with Drew Brees and Philip Rivers.

WRs Robert Woods and Cooper Kupp have emerged as Goff's favorite end zone targets. Kupp has caught 11 touchdowns from Goff in his first 23 NFL games before being place on IR.

Goff was one of only four quarterbacks to pass for over 300 yards with four passing touchdowns a season ago in the team's 51-17 win over the New York Giants.

In his first road start of his sophomore campaign, a Thursday Night game at San Francisco, the Cal product had what was then his most efficient day in the NFL, completing 22-of-28 passing attempts (79 percent) for 292 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions with a 145.8 QB rating, earning his first road victory.

Goff threw three touchdowns in the first half of his first-career road start as a rookie in a Week 12 matchup with the New Orleans Saints in 2016, becoming the third rookie to throw three touchdowns in their first-career road start over the past 20 years.



Since entering the league in 2016, QB Jared Goff has picked apart opponents' blitzes. He holds the fifth-highest passer rating among signal callers with at least 200 passing attempts against the blitz. Goff is one of only six QBs with a rating over 100.0 in that time.

The Rams quarterback has also benefited from avoiding negative plays. Goff has thrown only five interceptions (tied-sixth fewest) and his 24 sacks taken are the tenth-fewest during that span.

In 2018, Goff's 105.2 passer rating against the blitz ranked sixth among all quarterbacks with at least 50 attempts.



Suh recorded a career-best 21 TFL in 2014, the start of a three-year stretch in which he recorded double-digit tackles for loss. The Nebraska product has posted at least 11 TFL in five of his first nine NFL seasons. Suh posted 13 TFL as a rookie in 2010.

TALKING TACKLES FOR LOSS

Rams DT Aaron Donald has used an explosive first step to make a living in opponents' backfields since entering the league in 2014. Since the start of the 2014 season, Donald leads the league in tackles for loss, tallying 97 in 78 games played.

The Pitt product finished first in the NFL with 25 tackles for loss during the 2018 regular season. Donald posted 15 TFL in 14 games during the 2017 season. The 15 TFL was tied for the ninth-most last season and the most by an interior defensive lineman. Donald recorded a then career-high 22 tackles for loss in his second season DT Aaron Donald in the NFL in 2015.



ON THE MARK





LB Mark Barron made his 2018 debut in a Week 5 win at Seattle. Barron led the team with nine tackles (five solo) in his season debut. In the 12 games he played this season, Barron finished fourth on the team in total tackles (60), with two tackles for loss and a safety.

Barron recorded 135-plus tackles in back-to-back seasons in 2015-2016 and tallied 108 tackles in 2017 despite missing three games during the regular season. Barron finished second on the team during the 2017 regular season with 108 total tackles, including 80 solo stops which was the most on the team. Barron started all 16 contests of the 2016 campaign and finished second on the team with 147

tackles. He led or tied for the most tackles on the team in eight of the Rams' 2016 contests.

In the team's 2015 Week 7 win over Cleveland, Barron recorded a career-high 19 tackles, which is the most by any Ram in a game since 2001. In his career, Barron has recorded 44 TFL, 9.0 sacks, eight interceptions, forced five fumbles and added three fumble recoveries in 104 professional games as both a safety and a linebacker.

Littleton also posted 13 passes defensed this season, which was the most by a linebacker and tied for the 13th-most by any defender in 2018.

During the season finale against the 49ers, Littleton notched two interceptions of 49ers QB Nick Mullens, returning the latter 19 yards to the end zone for his first career



Littleton also recorded at least five LB Cory Littleton tackles and one pass defensed in five of L.A.'s first six games of 2018.

In his 48 career regular season games played, Littleton has 17 passes defensed, 11 tackles for loss, seven QB hits, 5.0 sacks, four interceptions and one forced fumble.

PUSH 'EM BACK, ALL (THE) TIME



In 2018, DT Aaron Donald broke former Giants DE Michael Strahan's NFL record for total defensive sack yards in a single season. With Donald's 20.5 sacks, the All-Pro defensive tackle was able to move offenses back a total of 183.5 yards and led the league in defensive sack yards by a player by 61.5 yards.

A LEG UP IN THE SCORING COLUMN

Against Buffalo in the Rams 2016 Week 5 contest, K Greg Zuerlein made his 100th career field goal. He now has connected on 177 field goals and 222 PATs in his seven-year NFL career.

Against the Cowboys in the 2017 Week 4 contest, Zuerlein booted the Rams to their third win of the season, accounting for 23 of the team's 35 points, connecting on 7-of-7 field goal attempts and 2-of-2 PATs. The seven made field goals established a franchise record for single-game field goals and his 23 points is the second-highest total for a Ram in a single game. Zuerlein ties Billy Cundiff



for the third-most points by a kicker in a single game in NFL history, falling three points short of Rob Bironas' 26-point effort on 10/21/07. On the season, Zuerlein was 36-of-38 on field goal attempts and 35-of-36 on PATs.

Zuerlein's 97.4 percent PAT success rate is the fourth-highest percentage in franchise history. Zuerlein is the only kicker in franchise history that has kicked PATs from the 2-yard line and the 15-yard line.

In his career, Zuerlein has scored 753 points and connected on 177-of-212 FG attempts and 222-of-228 PATs.

Zuerlein ranks third in franchise history with 753 career points, and posted a personal-best 158 points, which was the most points by anyone during the 2017 regular season.

GREG THE LEG

Rams K Greg "The Leg" Zuerlein is one of the most prolific long-distance kickers in NFL history and against the Bears in a 2018 Week14 contest, set the franchise record for 50-plus yard field goals, connecting on his 27th from at least 50 yards. In his career, Zuerlein has hit 28-of-48 field goals from long distance.

At Minnesota (11/8/15), he broke his own team record with a 61-yard field goal. In the process, he became just the second kicker in NFL history to make two 60-yard field goals in a career, joining Sebastian Janikowski. Coincidentally, Rams Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel held the same position with the Raiders when Janikowski accomplished his feat.

Zuerlein owns five of the six longest field goals made in Rams history, and his 61-yard kick in Minnesota was the longest in the NFL during the 2015 season.

Zuerlein has been one of the best deep ball kickers in the league since he arrived in 2012. With 28 career kicks from 50 yards or more, Zuerlein is tied for the most field goals of 50 yards or more in team history.

He passed Josh Brown during the 2017 season to move into second on the Rams all-time scoring list. He has the fifth-most 50-yard field goals in the NFL since 2012. Justin Tucker has connected on a league-best 36 field goals from 50-plus since 2012.

SPECIAL. SPECIAL TEAMS

Rams LB Cory Littleton blocked a punt in the 2018 Week 3 contest against the Los Angeles Chargers and against the 49ers in Week 7. His four blocked punts since the start of the 2017 season are the most in the NFL and is one of four players with four blocked punts since 2000.

During the 2017 season, Littleton was the first player to block multiple punts in a single season since 2014 when Tennessee's Jurrell Casey and Buffalo's Anthony Dixon each had two blocks.

DB Blake Countess returned a blocked punt for a touchdown vs. Philadelphia (12/10/17) and against the Los Angeles Chargers (9/23/18), becoming the first player to score on a blocked punt in consecutive seasons since Ed Reed returned three blocked punts for touchdowns during the 2002 and 2003 seasons.

The Rams were one-of-five teams in the NFL to block a punt during the 2017 season and they are the only team with multiple blocked punts, marking the 12th season in which a Rams team has blocked multiple punts in a single season. They are the first team to do so in franchise history since the 2003 Rams.

The 2017 Rams were the first team to block multiple punts and return them for touchdowns since 2014 when the Philadelphia Eagles (three) and Minnesota Vikings (two) achieved the feat. On the season, L.A. blocked three punts, one PAT and one field goal.

JOHNNY BE GOOD!



In the Rams' 2018 Week 2 win over the Arizona Cardinals, P Johnny Hekker had to step in as the place kicker for the injured K Greg Zuerlein in addition to his punting duties.

Hekker made his first career field goal, a 20-yard attempt, connected on a point after try, recorded five kickoffs, two of which went for touchbacks and punted twice with a 41.0 net average.

Hekker joins Cardinals K Phil Dawson as the only active players with at least one made field goal and a touchdown pass. P Johnny Hekker



In his career, Hekker has 542 punts with a 43.4 net average and 217 punts downed inside the 20-yard line, is one-of-one on field goal attempts and PATs and has completed 12-of-20 passing attempts for 168 yards, one touchdown and a 103.8 QB rating (including playoffs). Hekker recorded his first NFL rushing attempt on a fake field goal in a Week 9 game at New Orleans. Hekker gained three yards on the play and was marked just short of the line-to-gain.

FAKE IT 'TIL YOU MAKE IT

Rams Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel has been finding ways to scheme against opponents since joining the team in 2012. Fassel has attempted 20 fake plays (18 punts, one field goal, one PAT) and has successfully converted on 12 of them -10 fake punts, one field goal and one PAT. Since then, the Rams have a fake play success rate of 60 percent. Additionally, the special teams unit scored a touchdown in 2012 and a two-point conversion in 2014 off of fake play calls.

The Rams special teams have averaged over 15 yards per play on their 10 successful fake punts since 2012.

JOHNNY ON THE SPOT

Johnny Hekker posted the third-best net average in NFL history with a 44.3 net average during the 2017 regular season, the second-best average of Hekker's career. Tennessee punter Brett Kern led the league in 2017 with a 44.6-yard net average.

Hekker enjoyed a record-breaking 2016 season, recording the most punts downed inside opponents' 20-yard line in NFL history. Additionally, Hekker broke his own NFL single-season net punting average record (46.0). Hekker booted a then careerlong 75-yard punt against the Carolina Panthers in the Rams' 2016 Week 9 contest, and bested himself a week later with a 78-yarder against the New York Jets.

The Oregon State product finished the 2016 season with 98 punts, a 47.8-yard gross punting average, 51 punts inside opponents 20-yard line with only one touchback. As a unit, the Rams punt coverage team limited opponents to 152 return yards on 35 attempts and limited opponents to a league-best 4.3-yard average. With the outstanding coverage unit and directional punting, Hekker posted a 46.0-yard net average on the season, the best in NFL history.

Hekker led the NFL in 2015 in net average (43.7), gross average (47.9) and punts downed inside the opponents' 20 yard-line (41). Since the NFL began tracking punts inside 20 yard-line in 1976. Hekker is the first player to lead the league in gross, net and punts placed inside the 20-yard line in the same season.

FLIPPING FIELDS

P Johnny Hekker continues to be not only one of the most accurate punters in the NFL, but has developed into a complete special teams weapon at flipping the field.

Hekker became the first punter in the NFL to record a 75-plus yard punt in back-to-back games since Patriots' P Luke Prestridge in 1984.

The Oregon State product established a career-long 75-yard punt in the team's 2016 Week 9 contest against the Carolina Panthers, a record that stuck for a week before he booted a 78-yarder against the New York Jets in the Rams' Week 10 contest. On the season, Hekker had three punts over 75 yards.

There were only nine 70-plus yard punts during the 2016 NFL campaign, Hekker and Jaguars' Brad Norton each had a 78-yarder to their name. There had not been one 70-yard punt through the first three weeks of the 2017 season.

Hekker's 46.0-yard net average led the league in 2016, and ranks first in NFL history for a single season. Previously, the 16-game record was 44.2, a record Hekker himself set in 2013.

Since the NFL went to a 16-game season in 1978, the lowest opponent punt return average, with a minimum of 25 returns, is 2.6 yards, set by the Rams in 2013. The 2016 version of the Rams saw its opponents return 35 punts for just a 4.3 yards per return average.

P Johnny Hekker went on a 13-game streak without a touchback, the longest of his career. He had previously posted two separate nine-game streaks without a touchback.

In the team's 2016 Week 16 game against the San Francisco 49ers, Hekker recorded four punts inside the 20-yard line, moving him in to sole possession of the single-season record with 51 punts downed inside opponents' 20-yard line. The punts downed inside the 20 aided his 46.0 net yard average, the best in league history.

The record was previously held by Arizona punter Dave Zastudil, who



The Rams allowed their opponents 8.7 yards per punt return during the 2018 regular season on only 12 opponent punt returns. Hekker posted a net punting average of 43.0 yards in 2018.

Hekker and the Rams coverage units have backed opponents up deep in their own territory and limited opponents to average just 6.5 yards per punt return, which is the lowest average in the NFL since the start of the 2012 season.

The Rams special teams units have flourished since Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel took over prior to the 2012 season. During the 2017 regular season,

the Rams opponents averaged 6.1 yards per return, the ninthbest mark in the league, while P Johnny Hekker's 44.3 net yard average was the second-best total last season.
