TRAINING CAMP SUMMARY

Players Report to Training Camp on July 26; First Practice Set For July 27

The New England Patriots will open their annual training camp presented by Optum on Wed., July 26, when players report. The first scheduled practice will be on Thurs., July 27 in the 9 o'clock hour, on the practice fields behind Gillette Stadium. The daily practice schedule throughout training camp is tentative and subject to change. Fans planning to attend practice are encouraged to check www.patriots.com/trainingcamp for last-minute updates or call the training camp hotline at 508-549-0001. Parking, admission to practices, admission to Fan Walk and Play Football area and rosters are all free.

Gillette Stadium offers ample parking for the thousands of fans who attend training camp practices and enjoy the family-oriented entertainment. Bleacher seating, located on the west sideline of the practice fields, will provide seating for thousands of fans with overflow seating for thousands more on a hillside in the north end zone.



FAN WALK AND PLAY FOOTBALL AREA

Besides watching the team practice, we hope you explore all the fun-filled activities, games and photo opportunities along the Fan Walk and Play Football area. JOINT PRACTICES WITH JAGUARS AND TEXANS

The 2017 season marks the sixth straight year that the Patriots will hold joint practice sessions when they host the Jacksonville Jaguars on Mon., Aug. 7 and Tues., Aug. 8, prior to the preseason-opener on Thu., Aug. 10. The Patriots will also travel to West Virginia, the site of the Texans training camp, for joint sessions on Tues., Aug. 15 and Wed., Aug. 16 prior to traveling to Houston for their second preseason matchup. Those practice sessions will be open to the public.

Last season, the Patriots hosted joint sessions with New Orleans and Chicago prior to their respective preseason matchups.

In 2015, the Patriots traveled to West Virginia, the site of the Saints training camp, for joint sessions prior to traveling to New Orleans for the preseason opener.

In 2014, the Patriots held joint sessions with two different teams. The Patriots conducted joint sessions at Washington and at home against Philadelphia.

In 2013, the Patriots traveled to Philadelphia for joint practice sessions and then hosted Tampa Bay in joint sessions. In 2012, the Patriots held joint practice sessions with New Orleans prior to the first preseason game of the year and then traveled to the Buccaneers' headquarters for two joint practices prior to their preseason matchup that year.

PATRIOTS 2017 HALL OF FAME INDUCTION

The New England Patriots will host the team's 2017 Hall of Fame induction ceremony for **Raymond Clayborn** on Sat, July. 29, 2017, on the NRG Plaza outside The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon. The event will coincide with the conclusion of the team's practice session that morning.

MEDIA INFORMATION

GENERAL MEDIA TRAINING CAMP POLICY

Practices throughout training camp are open to the media. In your coverage of daily practice sessions, we ask for your cooperation in observing the following practice policies:

1. **Please do not report on strategy.** This includes describing formations, personnel groups, first-team/second-team groupings, positions and non-conventional plays.
2. **Please do not report on players who line up in positions different from the one listed on the roster.**
3. **Live streaming of any video to the Internet or any other social media platform while on team premises is prohibited.**
4. **Please do not quote, paraphrase or report the comments made by coaches or players during a practice session.**
5. **For practice sessions during training camp that are open to the public tweeting, blogging, etc. of events, such as VIP visitors to practice and exceptional plays by individual players is allowed.**

If there are any questions regarding these policies during a practice session, please ask for clarification from a Patriots media relations representative in advance. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

PRINT AND TV PHOTOGRAPHER POLICY

Still photographers and TV cameras will be allowed to shoot a portion of each practice session. Times will likely vary. A member of the Patriots media relations staff will notify all cameras when it is time to shut down. **Please do not use recordings of comments made by coaches during a practice session.** Photographer credentials will allow access to the paved walking paths surrounding the perimeter of the two practice fields and in front of the ropes. There will be no access to areas between the two fields or along the east sideline. We ask that you please adhere to the following guidelines at practice:

1. **Please be respectful of the fans who are seated behind you. On the west sideline, we request that all photographers kneel in the areas immediately in front of the bleacher seating to minimize the obstructed views for our fans.**
 2. **Please do not use photos showing personnel groupings or formations.**
- Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

MEDIA ENTRANCE

Media are welcome to enter through the "Blue Gate" entrance near the Patriots ProShop. The gate will be staffed approximately 30 minutes prior to practice. Media can park in Lot 3 or 4. To access the practice fields, proceed to the field entrance, stay on the north end zone warning track and take the field staircase at section 136 labeled Media Entrance. At the top of the steps proceed to the left along the west concourse and follow the signs to the field entrance and the media tent. Page 4 of this document contains a map for your convenience.

TRAINING CAMP CREDENTIALS

A non-event photo identification badge will be issued to all approved media who regularly cover the Patriots. This photo ID will be required for access to all media specific areas, including the media tent and press conference areas. All others must register for a visitor's media pass with a member of the Patriots media relations department at media check-in. To expedite the media check-in process, please remember to bring your outlet-issued photo ID. If you have been approved to attend practice on a regular basis and are in need of a photo ID, please send a headshot photo to Mark Robbins at Markr@patriots.com.

GAME CREDENTIALS

All credential requests must be submitted on the Patriots media website, located at <http://media.patriots.com>. Sports editors and sports directors are encouraged to submit all credential requests for their news affiliations. The credential page is password protected. You must register for use. Once approved, the credential tab is located just above the photo on the home page. The Patriots 2017 home and away opponents are listed on the page. Click on the boxes to the right of the games you would like to request. There is a button underneath the credential section that allows you to add other attendees from your affiliation. All entries must be submitted at least a week prior to the game. All approved credentials and parking passes must be picked up in person after signing the NFL's liability waiver. Credentials will begin being issued the week of each game.

MEDIA SEATING AREAS

A media tent will be available to any media wishing to escape the sun. The tent will be located atop the hillside in the north end zone between the VIP bleacher seating and the family tent area. Please show credentials for access to the tent. **Please Note: There is no media access to the VIP seating area or the family tent.**

MEDIA WORKROOM

The media will work in the workroom, which is located at field level in the north end of Gillette Stadium. Please proceed past the ProShop and Ticket Office to the blue gate at field level below the bridge in the north end zone. For those arriving without media credentials, please call Mark Robbins upon arrival at 508.431.7175.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews will be conducted on the practice fields following practice. All interview requests will be collected by members of the media relations department during the practice session. Immediately following practice, all media should proceed to the northeast corner of the practice field for access to the players, but please stay clear of the player egress route to the stairway. Any requests that will require additional time with a player or coach should be made well in advance so that we can make the appropriate arrangements. Please contact a Patriots media relations representative to facilitate all interview requests.

PRESS CONFERENCES

Regularly scheduled press conferences will take place in the media workroom. All press conferences can also be seen live or on-demand at Patriots.com. Full transcripts of all press conferences will also be available at Patriots.com.

CONFERENCE CALLS

The day after each preseason game, media can expect availability with Coach Belichick via a conference call. There will be no other media availability on those four days, as the players likely will be off. Times for the calls will be announced once confirmed.

MEDIA INFORMATION

All Patriots media information is available on the Patriots media website, located at media.patriots.com. Copies of materials will be available upon request.

RAIN POLICY

When the Patriots are forced to practice indoors due to inclement weather or poor field conditions, those practices will be closed to the public. For that reason, we stress the importance that fans and media visit Patriots.com or call the training camp hotline at 508-549-0001 prior to every practice for up-to-the-minute changes in the daily practice schedule.



MEDIA INFORMATION

ROSTER REDUCTION DATE

The NFL roster limit during training camp is 90 players. New in 2017, teams are only obligated to make one roster cut-down, eliminating the previous cut-down to 75 players, following their final preseason game. On Sat., Sept. 2, rosters must be reduced to the regular-season limit of 53 players.

PATRIOTS PROSHOP

The Patriots ProShop will be open daily on all days that the public has access to practice. The ProShop is located on the northeast corner of the stadium below The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon. Fans attending training camp and parked on the west side of the stadium may access the ProShop via the staircase on the north end of the stadium. Times will vary depending on the daily practice schedule, opening at least 45 minutes before or after each practice session.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

All fans entering the Patriots training camp facility with a view of the practice fields will be screened by metal detectors, as well as having any and all bags screened by security personnel. To ensure that all fans have a safe and enjoyable visit to Gillette Stadium for Patriots Training Camp, the following items are prohibited:

- Animals, except service animals assisting those with disabilities.
- Any alcoholic beverages
- Beach balls
- Bullhorns and air horns
- Coolers
- Fireworks or pyrotechnics
- Flags will be allowed, however flag poles over two feet in length will not be allowed.
- GoPro Cameras
- Helium balloons
- Illegal drugs or any other illegal substance
- Laser pens
- Noise makers
- Remotely Controlled Model Aircraft, Unmanned Aerial Vehicles and Drones
- Selfie sticks
- Video Cameras (no video recordings)
- Weapons of any kind (including knives)
- Any other item deemed inappropriate by stadium management

Fans are reminded to please leave all such items appropriately secured in their vehicles.

Individuals with possession of a prohibited item(s) may be denied admission to training camp, ejected, arrested and prosecuted. Prohibited items that are discovered at training camp will be confiscated.

CONCESSIONS

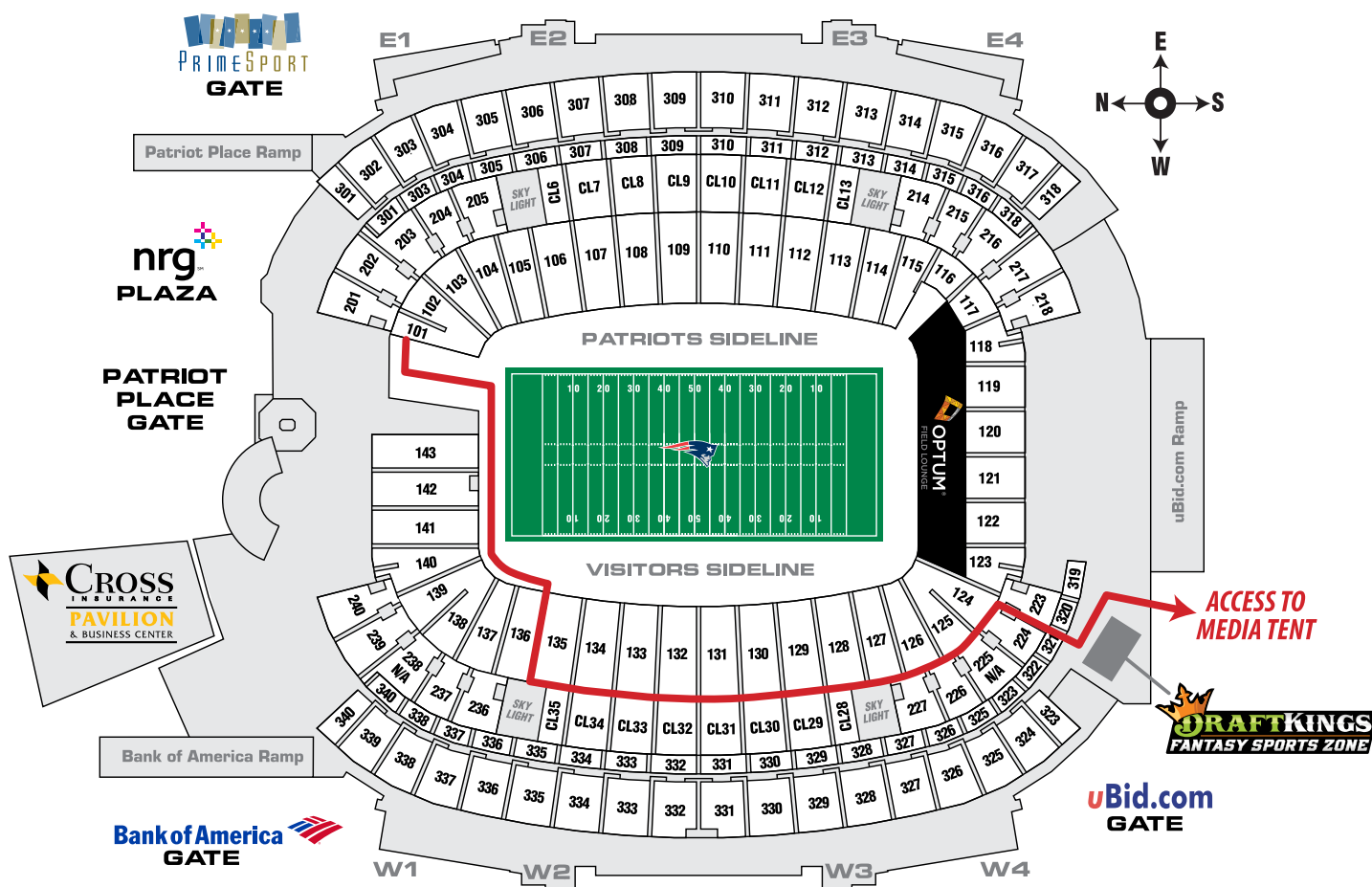
The concession stands at training camp offer fans a variety of food and drink options.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

2017

PATRIOTS

*The Patriots are tied with Dallas and San Francisco with five Super Bowl wins and need one more Super Bowl win to tie the Pittsburgh Steelers (6) for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history.

*The Patriots have played in the most Super Bowls in NFL history with nine.

*The Patriots set an NFL record with eight straight division titles (2009-16) and look to add to that number in 2017.

*The Patriots set an NFL record by reaching six straight conference title games (2011-16) and look to add to that total in 2017.

*The Patriots are tied with the Dallas Cowboys (1991-96 – 12 wins) for the most consecutive seasons with at least one playoff win (2011-16 – 11 wins) with six straight and look to set the NFL record with a playoff win in 2017.

*The Patriots have had a winning record for 16 straight seasons (2001-16), tied with San Francisco for the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 merger and need to have a winning record in 2017 to have the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 merger.

*The Patriots have made the playoffs for eight straight seasons (2009-16), tied with Green Bay (2009-16), Pittsburgh (1972-79), Los Angeles Rams (1973-80), Dallas (1966-73) and San Francisco (1983-90), and if they make the playoffs in 2017 they will tie Dallas (1975-83) and Indianapolis (2002-10) for the most in NFL history.

BILL BELICHICK

*Belichick has an NFL-best five Super Bowl championships as a head coach. If he wins one more championship he will join George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only NFL coaches with six championships since the league began postseason play in 1933.

*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula for the most postseason games as a head coach with 36 and needs to coach in one more postseason game to set the NFL record.

*Belichick set a postseason mark by leading his team to advancement in the playoffs for six straight seasons (2011-16) and looks to add to that mark in 2017.

*Belichick enters the 2017 season in fourth place with 263 career victories overall and needs eight victories in 2017 to move past Tom Landry (270) into third place all-time, behind Don Shula (347) and George Halas (324).

*Belichick will look to win back-to-back championships for a second time in his career (2003-04) – a feat so rare it's been achieved by only two other coaches in history. Chuck Noll did it with the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1970s (1974-75, 1978-79), and Vince Lombardi did it with the Green Bay Packers in the 1960s (1961-62, 1966-67).

TOM BRADY

*If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdown passes in 2017, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (9).

*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Aaron Rodgers with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2017 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns, for the most in NFL history.

*Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2017, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (11).

*Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdown passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in passing touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

*Brady has 183 regular-season wins and needs four more to move past Peyton Manning (186) and Brett Favre (186) for the most regular-season wins in NFL history.

*Brady has led the Patriots to eleven 12-win seasons, tied with Peyton Manning for the most 12-win seasons in NFL history and needs to lead the Patriots to a 12-win season in 2017 to set the NFL record.

*Tom Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with 27 Player of the Week awards and needs one more to set the NFL record for the most Player of the Week honors.

*Brady is tied with Joe Montana with nine games in the postseason with three or more touchdown passes and needs one more to set the NFL record.

*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with 51 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions. He needs one such game in 2017 to set the NFL record.

*The 2017 season will be Brady's 18th season with the Patriots and he will break a tie with John Brodie (San Francisco) and Dan Marino (Miami) for the most seasons with one team by any NFL quarterback.

*Brady has started 235 regular season games at quarterback. With six more starts in 2017 he will move into third all-time for most regular-season starts by a quarterback behind only Brett Favre (298) and Peyton Manning (265). He needs five starts to pass Fran Tarkenton (239) and six to pass Dan Marino (240).

*Brady has played in 237 NFL regular season games entering the 2017 season, which is seventh all-time among NFL quarterbacks. If he plays in all 16 games in 2017 he will move into fifth place all-time with 253 games played among NFL quarterbacks, behind George Blanda (340), Brett Favre (302), Peyton Manning (266) and Earl Morrall (255).

*Brady (12) needs one more Pro Bowl berth to join Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14), Ray Lewis (13), Jerry Rice (13) and Reggie White (13) as the only NFL players with at least 13 Pro Bowl berths.





WHAT TO WATCH FOR

2017

STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

*If Stephen Gostkowski leads the NFL in scoring in 2017, he will set the NFL mark for most seasons leading the NFL in scoring with six, moving past Don Hutson (5) and Gino Cappelletti (5). Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in 2008, 2012-14 and 2015.

*In 2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points and can add to that in 2017.

*Gostkowski (4) needs one more 30-field goal season to tie David Akers (5) and John Carney (5) for the most in NFL history with five seasons of 30 or more field goals.

*Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008, 2013 and 2014) and if he leads the NFL in field goals in 2017, he will join Lou Groza (5), Jack Manders (4), Ward Cuff (4) and Mark Moseley (4) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons.

*Gostkowski (1,457) enters the 2017 season 22nd in NFL history in total points scored and needs 19 points to reach the top 20.

*Gostkowski (160) is third all-time in postseason points, behind Adam Vinatieri (234) and David Akers (175) and will look to add to those numbers in 2017.

JULIAN EDELMAN

*Julian Edelman enters the 2017 season third in NFL history with 89 postseason receptions, behind Jerry Rice (151) and Reggie Wayne (93) and needs five postseason receptions to move past Wayne into second place all-time.

*Edelman is one of 14 NFL players with at least 1,000 postseason receiving yards and his 1,024 postseason receiving yards are ranked 13th in NFL history. He needs 39 postseason yards to move into the top 10.

*Edelman enters the 2016 season tied with Deion Branch for first in Patriots history with four postseason 100-yard games.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

*Gronkowski (3) needs one more 1,000-yard season to join Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten for the most 1,000-yard seasons by an NFL tight end with four.

*Gronkowski has an NFL-leading five seasons with 10 or more touchdowns by a tight end and can add to his record in 2017.

*Gronkowski enters the 2017 season with twenty-three 100-yard games, third in NFL history among tight ends behind Tony Gonzalez (31) and Kellen Winslow (24). His twenty-three 100-yard games are third in Patriots history, behind the 38 by Stanley Morgan and the 28 by Wes Welker.

*Gronkowski and Tom Brady have connected on 67 touchdown passes, second among all quarterback and tight end combinations to the 84 by Philip Rivers and Antonio Gates. The Brady to Gronkowski connection is tied with Peyton Manning-Reggie Wayne for sixth all-time.

*Gronkowski enters the 2017 season with 6,095 receiving yards, 15th all-time among NFL tight ends and needs 475 yards to move into the top 10 among all tight ends in NFL history.

*Gronkowski has 6,095 receiving yards and is third in Patriots history and needs 272 yards to move past Troy Brown (6,366) into third all-time.

*Gronkowski (68) enters the 2017 season third all-time among NFL tight ends with 68 receiving touchdowns, behind the 111 by Antonio Gates and Tony Gonzalez.

*Gronkowski enters the 2017 season first among all NFL tight ends with nine postseason touchdowns.

*Gronkowski is tied with Dallas Clark with three postseason 100-yard games and needs one more to tie Vernon Davis and Keith Jackson for the most 100-yard games by a tight end in postseason history with four.

*Gronkowski (3) needs one more 100-yard game in the postseason to tie Deion Branch and Julian Edelman for the most in New England postseason history with four.

*Gronkowski enters the 2017 season fourth all-time among NFL tight ends with 754 postseason receiving yards, behind Dallas Clark (847), Keith Jackson (834) and Shannon Sharpe (814).

*Gronkowski enters the 2017 season fifth all-time among NFL tight ends with 52 postseason receptions, behind Dallas Clark (64), Jay Novacek (62), Shannon Sharpe (62) and Brent Jones (60).

WR Chris Hogan caught two 40-yard passes (63 and 43) at Cleveland (10/9/16) to become the first Patriots player to do so in a game since Rob Gronkowski (50 and 49) at Washington (12/11/11).

3
James White finished third in the NFL among running backs with 60 receptions and 551 yards in 2016.

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick vs. Washington (11/08/15) and vs. Philadelphia (12/06/15). It was his third (Cleveland - 12/08/13) and the fourth in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

7
The Patriots became the first team in NFL history in 2014 to earn five straight first-round byes and extended that record with their seventh straight bye in 2016. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995 and Denver earned four straight from 2012-15.

8
The Patriots and Green Bay Packers are the only teams that has made the playoffs in each of the last eight seasons (2009-2016).

16
The Patriots have gone 16 straight seasons without being swept by a division opponent after beating each of the AFC East teams in 2016, extending the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger.

16
The Patriots have won nine or more games in 16 straight seasons, the most seasons of 9 or more wins since 2001 in the NFL.

17
The Patriots have held their opponent under 30 yards rushing a total of 17 times after holding Cleveland (10/9/16) to just 27 yards rushing.

17.9
The Patriots WR Chris Hogan finished tied for first in the NFL with Washington's DeSean Jackson with a 17.9 yard average in 2016.

19
Nate Ebner finished tied for first in the NFL with Miami's Michael Thomas (19) with a career-best 19 special teams tackles.

20
The Patriots have scored in the final possession of the first half and the opening possession of the second half 20 times since 2009, first in the NFL. New Orleans is second with 14 such scoring drives.

23
Following a 3-0 record in September and a 4-0 record in December in 2016, the Patriots now have 23 undefeated months since 2000, the most in the NFL. Indianapolis is second with 15.

24
The Patriots have won 24 straight home games against non-division AFC opponents. Their last loss to a non-division AFC team was a 33-10 loss vs. Pittsburgh on Nov. 30, 2008.

26
The Patriots have gone 26 straight games (regular season and postseason) without allowing an opponent to run for 100 or more yards. (last game - Nov. 29, 2015 at Denver).

67
Rob Gronkowski and Tom Brady have connected on 67 touchdown passes. It is the second-most connections between a quarterback and a tight end in NFL history and is sixth overall.

87
The Patriots have won 87 straight home regular season games when leading at halftime, adding to their NFL record. The last time the Patriots lost at home after leading at halftime was on Dec. 24, 2000, vs. Miami when they lost 27-24 after leading 21-17 at halftime.
