The New England Patriots will face their first AFC East opponent this week when they travel to face the New York Jets. It is the latest the Patriots have played against a division opponent since the 2005 season when they went the longest in team history by facing a division opponent in Week 8 in a game against Buffalo.

Last season, the Patriots finished with a 7-1 record against duraid. are an NFL-best 76-22 (.776) in regular season AFC East games since the 2001 season, compiling the best intra-division record of any team in the NFL.

The Patriots won all of their road games in 2016 and extended their road streak to 10 straight after winning their first two road games in 2017. The Patriots 10game road win streak is second in team history to their 12-game road streak (Dec. 24, 2006-Oct. 5, 2008).

BROADCAST INFORMA

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen on WBZ-TV Channel 4. Ian Eagle will handle play-by-play duties with Dan Fouts as the color analyst. Evan Washburn will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by Mark Wolff and directed by Bob Fishman.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on Sports USA. Larry Kahn and Hank Bauer will call the game.

RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 40 stations can be found in this press release. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by Marc Cappello.

SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 117th time, including three postseason games, since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. It will be the first of two 2017 meetings. The Patriots will host the Jets at Gillette Stadium on Dec. 31 in the regular-season-finale.

Last season, the Patriots swept the annual series with a 22-17 win at the Jets and a 41-3 victory in the rematch at Gillette Stadium. It was the Patriots 17th series sweep of the Jets.

The Patriots lead the series, 61-54-1 overall.

New England is 33-25-1 all-time against the Jets at home, including 1-1 at home in the postseason and 12-3 at Gillette Stadium in the regular season.

The Patriots are 28-29 all-time on the road against the Jets, including 4-3 at MetLife Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason three times – a 1985 Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets, 26-14, in 1985 at the Meadowlands on their way to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium and the Jets beat the Patriots, 28-21, in the 2010 Divisional playoff game.

New England is 32-16 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994.

New England's 61 overall victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only Buffalo with 70 all-time wins.

The New England Patriots overcame a 10-0 deficit in the second quarter and a 17-13 deficit in the fourth quarter to take a 22-17 win over the New York Jets. The win improved the Patriots to a 9-2 record and guaranteed a winning season for the 16th straight season.

QB Tom Brady tied Peyton Manning for the most wins by a quarterback in NFL history with his 200th by throwing the go-ahead touchdown pass to rookie WR Malcolm Mitchell with 1:56 left to play. It was the 50th time that Brady has led the Patriots to a win while facing a fourth-quarter deficit or tie.

Trailing 17-16 with 5:04 to play and the ball at their own 17-yard line. Brady helped lead the Patriots to the New York 8-yard line. After RB James White stretched over the marker for a first-down on a fourth-and-four situation, WR Chris Hogan caught a 25-yard pass to put the ball at the 8-yard line. Brady then zipped a pass to Mitchell in the end zone to give the Patriots the lead at 22-17. A two-point play by the Patriots was initially ruled good, but after a replay it was determined the ball never crossed the goal line.

The Jets started the ensuing drive at their own 25-yard line. On the second play, DL Chris Long forced a fumble on a sack of Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick, and DL Trey Flowers recovered for the Patriots with 1:43 to play.

RB LeGarrette Blount had a 23-yard run to the Jets 3-yard line where the Patriots ran off the final second to secure the victory.

The Jets engineered an 8-play, 41-yard drive that ended in a 51-yard field goal on their first drive of the game for a 3-0 first quarter lead. New York extended its lead to 10-0 with a 1-yard touchdown pass from Fitzpatrick to WR Brandon Marshall on the first play of the second quarter.

The Patriots answered with a 10-play, 65-yard drive that ended at the New York 10-yard line where K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 28-yard field goal to put the Patriots on the board.

CB Malcolm Butler forced and recovered a fumble after a short catch by WR Robby Anderson, allowing the Patriots to start a drive at midfield. The Patriots responded by moving to the New York 4-yard line where Brady connected with Mitchell for a 4-yard touchdown, the first of his two touchdowns on the day.

Both teams missed scoring opportunities before the end of the half. DL Alan Branch blocked a 54-yard Jets field goal, and the Patriots missed 39-yard field goal with six seconds to play in the half.

New England got its first lead of the game on its first possession in the second half, a 12-play, 58-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard Gostkowski field goal for a 13-10 lead.

The Jets took a 17-13 lead with 10:17 left when WR Quincy Enunwa leaped over a Patriots defensed for a 22-yard touchdown. A 41-yard field goal from Gostkowski with 7:02 left to play narrowed the Jets lead to 17-16.

Brady finished the day 30-of-50 for 286 yards with two touchdown passes.

The New England Patriots improved to a 13-2 record and inched one step closer to securing the top seed in the AFC playoff field. A win in the season-finale against Miami will give the Patriots the top seed.

QB Tom Brady threw three touchdown passes to help lead the Patriots to a 41-3 victory over the New York Jets for the Patriots 17th sweep in the annual series. The Patriots jumped to a 27-0 first half lead and held the Jets to just eight pass completions.

The Patriots defense forced four turnovers, with two interceptions by CB Malcolm Butler, one by DB Eric Rowe and a forced fumble by rookie LB Elandon Roberts that was recovered by Butler. The Patriots scored 24 points off the four turnovers. The Patriots defense was stellar on third down, holding the Jets to just one conversion on 11 attempts.

After stopping the Jets on three straight plays to start the game, the Patriots drove 42-yards in nine plays before settling for a 29-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski. Butler picked off Jets QB Bryce Petty on the ensuing series to give the Patriots the ball at midfield. A 22-yard pass from Brady to WR Chris Hogan on third down helped get in position for Brady's 5-yard touchdown pass to TE Martellus Bennett for a 10-0 first quarter lead.

The Patriots outscored the Jets, 17-0 in the second quarter. Roberts forced a fumble on a hit to Jets RB Khiry Robinson that was recovered by Butler at the Jets 28-yard line early in the second quarter. That helped lead to a 22-yard field goal and a 13-0 lead.

Rowe had his first interception of his Patriots career later in the quarter when he picked off a QB Ryan Fitzpatrick pass at the New England 46-yard line. Fitzpatrick was forced into the game following an injury to Petty. A 35-yard pass from Brady to WR Julian Edelman later in the series helped set up Brady's 18-yard touchdown pass to WR Matt Lengel, his first career reception. The Patriots got the ball back with 1:30 left and a 47-yard pass interference penalty moved the ball to the Jets 25-yard line to set up Brady's 25-yard touchdown pass to RB James White for a 27-0 halftime lead.

RB Legarrette Blount scored on back-to-back drives with a 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to make it 41-0.

The Jets finally got on the board with a field goal midway through the fourth quarter.

Quarterback Tom Brady threw for 303 yards and one touchdown and the Patriots defense made the plays they needed to make to stop the late-charging Tampa Bay Buccaneers in a 19-14 road win on Thursday Night Football..

The Patriots defense held on for a last play stop to secure the victory. Holding a 19-14 lead, Tampa Bay drove to the New England 19-yard line with three seconds to play, but QB Jameis Winston's pass to TE O.J. Howard fell incomplete to secure the win.

Brady tied Brett Favre and Peyton Manning for the NFL lead with his 186th regular season victory. Despite completing 30-of40 passes for 303 yards, Brady threw his first interception of the season, snapping a streak of 264 consecutive regular season passes without an interception dating back to the 2016 season. He also lost a fumble in the third quarter. Both times the defense was able to hold the Buccaneers without any points.

Tampa Bay kicker Nick Folk missed three field goals, including 31-yarder in the fourth quarter, while Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski was perfect on all four of his, including kicks of 45 and 48 yards.

New England's opening drive ended in an interception, marking the first time in 2017 that the Patriots did not score on the game's opening drive. Later in the first quarter, Brady led a 12-play, 89-yard drive that ended with a 27-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 3-0 lead.

A penalty on the Patriots defense allowed Tampa Bay to convert on a thirdand-20 on a drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by RB Doug Martin for a 7-3 lead. New England answered with a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a five-yard touchdown pass from Brady to WR Chris Hogan to give the Patriots a 10-7 second quarter lead.

After stopping the Buccaneers on the next series, a 40-yard punt return by WR Danny Amendola helped the Patriots get in position for s 23-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 13-7 lead at halftime.

The Patriots managed just a pair of Gostkowski field goals in the second half, including a 48-yarder with 59 seconds left to extend the Patriots lead to 19-14. That field goal came after Winston completed a 29-yard pass to WR DeSean Jackson on a third-and-one to keep a drive alive that ended with an 18-yard touchdown pass from Winston to TE Cameron Brate that cut the New England lead to 16-14.

Tampa Bay did not convert a third down until late in the third quarter and had just 180 total yards of offense heading into the final quarter. Despite the win, Winston ended up with 334 yards passing and the Buccaneers had 409 total yards on offense.

Hogan and Amendola each finished with eight receptions with Amendola gaining 77 yards and Hogan chalking up 74 yards, along with his touchdown catch.



A GAME OF FIRSTS

Besides Thanksgiving when the Patriots traveled to play on the road in 2000, 2002, 2010 and 2012, the game at Tampa Bay was the Patriots first road game on Thursday since Oct. 18, 1990. The game also was the first-ever visit for the Patriots to Raymond James Stadium for a regular season game and also the first time Bill Belichick and Tom Brady have played a regular season game at Tampa.

BOUNCING BACK

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 44-6 (.880) in regular season games following a loss. They have dropped back-to-back regular season games in 2006, 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2015 (twice). As a starter in his career, Tom Brady is 44-10 in games following a loss.

ROAD WIN STREAK EXTENDED

Last season, the Patriots finished the season with a perfect 8-0 road record. Brady was chosen as a captain for the 16th straight season. McCourty and Slater are captains for the seventh time. Gronkowski and Hightower were named captains for the second time, while Andrews and Harmon were elected captains for the first time.

BILL BELICHICK

*Belichick has an NFL-best five Super Bowl championships as a head coach. If he wins one more championship he will join George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only NFL coaches with six championships since the league began postseason play in 1933.

*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula for the most postseason games as a head coach with 36 and needs to coach in one more postseason game to set the NFL record.

*Belichick set a postseason mark by leading his team to advancement in the playoffs for six straight seasons (2011-16) and looks to add to that mark in 2017.

*Belichick is in fourth place with 266 career victories overall and needs five victories to move past Tom Landry (270) into third place all-time, behind Don Shula (347) and George Halas (324).

*Belichick will look to win back-to-back championships for a second time in his career (2003-04) – a feat so rare it's been achieved by only two other coaches in history. Chuck Noll did it with the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1970s (1974-75, 1978-79), and Vince Lombardi did it with the Green Bay Packers in the 1960s (1961-62, 1966-67).

Belichick (16 straight winning seasons) has the second-most consecutive winning seasons all time, trailing only Tom Landry with 20.

*If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2017, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (9).

*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Aaron Rodgers with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2017 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns, for the most in NFL history.

*Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2017, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (11).

*Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in passing touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

*Brady has 186 regular season wins and needs one more wins to move past Peyton Manning (186) and Brett Favre (186) for the most regular season wins in NFL history by an NFL starting quarterback.

* Brady has led the Patriots to eleven 12-win seasons, tied with Peyton Manning for the most 12-win seasons in NFL history and needs to lead the Patriots to a 12-win season in 2017 to set the NFL record.

*Tom Brady has 29 Player of the Week awards after winning the award in Week 2 and Week 3 of the 2017 season to move past Peyton Manning (27) for the most Player of the Week honors.

*Brady is tied with Joe Montana with nine games in the postseason with three or more touchdown passes and needs one more to set the NFL record.

*Brady moved past Peyton Manning (51) in the win at New Orleans (9/17) and now has an NFL record of 53 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions.

*The 2017 season is Brady's 18th season with the Patriots, the most seasons with one team by any NFI quarterback. He had been tied with John Brodie (San Francisco) and Dan Marino (Miami) with 17 seasons.

*Brady has started 240 regular season games at quarterback. With one more start in 2017 he will move into out of a tie with Dan Marino and into third all-time for most regular-season starts by a quarterback behind only Brett Favre (298) and Peyton Manning (265).

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 24th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to pring a championship to New Enbring a championship to New En-gland, a tall order considering the

team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patri-ots have won more division titles (16), conference crowns (8) and Su-per Bowl championships (5) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (20) and are tied for fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LI was the eighth Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 23 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 18 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2016, Kraft earned his 20th winning season in 23 years of owning the franchise.

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win five Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

A SAFETY FIRST

The Patriots recorded a safety in back-to-back games for the first time in team history in 2016. LB Dont'a Hightower dropped Cincinnati (10/16/16) QB Andy Dalton in the end zone for an 8-yard sack for a safety. At Cleveland (10/9/16) the previous week, Browns QB Cody Kessler fumbled the ball out of the end zone for a safety, forced by a strong rush by Dont'a Hightower. The Patriots recorded their team-record third safety of the 2016 season when DL Malcom Brown registered a tackle in the end zone vs. Baltimore on Dec. 12.

BLOCK PARTY

LB Shea McClellin blocked a first quarter field goal attempt vs. Baltimore on Dec. 12, 2016 for the Patriots third blocked kick of the 2016 season. McClellin blocked an extra point attempt vs. Seattle on Nov. 13 and DL Alan Branch blocked a field goal at the New York Jets on Nov. 27. The block was the first miss of the 2016 season by Baltimore K Justin Tucker. The Patriots three blocked kicks are the most blocked kicks New England has recorded since 2014 when the team recorded five on the year (4 field goals and 1 punt). The Patriots' record for most kicks blocked in a season sits at six in 1975 (2 extra points, 3 field goals and 1 punt), while they have tallied five in season on two occasions (2014 and 1973) and four in a season four times (1974, 1977, 1986, 2002).

DEFENSE NETS THIRD SAFETY

The Patriots set a new franchise mark with three safeties in 2016. The defense registered safeties sin back-to-back games – at Cleveland (10/9) when GB Cody Kessler fumbled out of the end zone and when LB Dont'a Hightower registered one in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/16) when he sacked QB Andy Dalton in the end zone. DL Malcom Brown then registered the third safety when he dropped Baltimore RB Kenneth Dixon in the end zone on Dec. 12, 2016. The Patriots had two safeties in a season six previous times (1963, 1965, 1967, 1969, 1978 and 1985). The NFL record for most safeties in a season is four by many teams.

The Patriots have scored on the final possession of the first half and the opening possession of the second half 20 times since 2009, first in the NFL. New Orleans is second with 16 such scoring drives.

23 Following a 3-0 record in September and a 4-0 record in December in 2016, the Patriots now have 23 undefeated months since 2000, the most in the NFL. Indianapolis is second with 15.

Tom Brady has guarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 186 of his 240 career regular season starts, compiling a .775 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady's 155 career wins in his first 200 starts are the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 career starts.

FOOTBALL FAMILY TRADITION

Bolden's grandfather, Frank Pitts, played 10 years in the NFL (1965-74) as a receiver for Kansas City, Cleveland and Oakland. He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being six years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

BOLDEN BLOCK PARTY

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the win at San Diego (12/7/14) to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.

RB REX BURKHEAD

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

As a junior at the University of Nebraska, Rex formed a close bond with a 5-year old fan of his, Jack Hoffman, who had been diagnosed with brain cancer. During that 2011 season, Rex wore a wristband with the phrase "Team Jack – Pray" which helped bring pediatric brain cancer into the national spotlight. Burkhead hosted Hoffman for a lunch, provided a personal tour of Memorial Stadium and has since joined the board of directors of the "Team Jack Foundation," which has raised more than \$4 million dollars to fight pediatric brain cancer since 2013. Rex recently hosted a fund raiser this past offseason at his high school alma mater that raised roughly \$45,000. In 2013, Jack Hoffman's touchdown run during Nebraska's spring football scrimmage went viral and earned him an ESPY award.

OL MARCUS CANNON

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round [138th overall] of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his seventh season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

WR BRANDIN COOKS

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

Brandin Cooks, the youngest of four children, lost his father to a heart attack at the age of six. His mother was forced to pick up a second job at an after school program on top of her regular 3:00 a.m. shift at a local warehouse in order to keep food on the table for the boys. Eager to take some of the burden of raising four boys off his mother, Brandin committed himself to athletics where he excelled at both track and field, as well as football, on his way to earning a scholar-ship to Oregon State University.

OB JIMMY GARAPPOLO

GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START

Jimmy Garoppolo became just the fifth quarterback in the last 31 years to make his first regular season start in a season opening night game (Sept. 11, 2016 vs. Cardinals). Aaron Rodgers was the last (2008, win vs. Minnesota), with Philip Rivers (2006), David Carr (2002) and Brian Griese (1999) before him. Garoppolo finished 24-of-33 for 264 yards with one touchdown.







TE ROB GRONKOWSKI

RECEIVING YARDS RECORD



Rob Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 1,327 receiving yards, surpassing San Diego's Kellen Winslow's 1980 record of 1,290 receiving yards for most receiving yards in a season by a tight end. Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine, but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

A noted sports fan and basketball enthusiast, Shaq's mother, Alicia McGuire, named him Shaquille Olajuwon Mason in 1993 after her two favorite NBA stars at the time, Shaquille O'Neal and Hakeem Olajuwon. ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to six straight Pro Bowls (2011-16) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the seven straight season in 2017.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by The Boston Globe. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice - putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. Most of the time, there's two guys out there fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts.'

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, ans I wanted whatever was best for the team. Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

WHAT'S IN A NAME

During his rookie season in 2014, Malcolm Butler was nicknamed "Strap" by former teammate Jamie Collins, alluding to his ability to so closely cover receivers on the field. In 2015, some teammates started calling him "Scrap" for his scrappy style of play, giving Butler two unique, albeit similar-sounding, nicknames.

MAKING THE OLYMPICS



Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro last August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the *Boston Globe*. "I would put my father-son relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

Gostkowski was 5-of-6 on 50 yard field goals in 2013, the most by a Patriots player in a single season and was 4-of-5 from 50 yards in 2015. The NFL record for most successful 50-yard field goals in a season is 10 by Blair Walsh in 2012 with Minnesota.

KICKING A CAREER HIGH

Stephen Gostkowski made five field goals vs. Cincinnati (10/5/14), setting a new single-game career high. Gostkowski's five field goals tied the second highest single-game total in Patriots history, trailing only Gino Cappelletti's six successful field goals on Oct. 4, 1964. The last time a Patriots player had five field goals in a game was on Nov.14, 2004, when Adam Vinatieri had five field goals vs. Buffalo.

TWO FROM 50-PLUS

Gostkowski drilled a 51-yard field goal and a 53-yarder vs. Arizona (9/16/12) and connected on two 53-yard field goals at Houston on (12/1/13). He is the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in the same game.

RYAN COMES UP BIG

P Ryan Allen had six of his seven punts downed inside the 20-yard line and helped hold Houston [9/22/16] to no punt return yards. He landed punts at the 11, 10, 10 14, 5 and 4. His only punt that did not land inside the 20, was downed at the 20-yard line. Ryan's previous best was five punts inside the 20-yard line on Oct. 6, 2013, at Cincinnati. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

HOW THE PATRIOTS SCORED THREE TOUCHDOWNS IN 57 SECONDS:

Rob Gronkowski got the scoring started by hauling in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.

After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.

On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 24 times in their 57-year history. PATRIOTS CLINCH PLAYOFF SPOT FOR 18th TIME IN KRAFT'S 23 YEARS OF OWNERSHIP

New England has qualified for the playoffs 24 times in its 57-year history. The Patriots have earned 18 of those playoff berths in the 23 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 19 division crowns overall (18 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16team tournament following a players' strike.



ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENTS

The Patriots won more than half of their games for the 16th straight year with a 14-2 record in 2016. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 16 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993.

The Patriots are the third team to win more than half of their games in 16 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85).

The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 20 of the 23 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.
