NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Browns host the New England Patriots at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 9. The Browns hold a 12-10 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including a 7-4 mark at home. The last time the teams played in Cleveland, the Browns captured a 34-14 win on Nov. 7, 2010.
- At Sunday's game the Cleveland Browns will recognize Breast Cancer Awareness with continued support for the American Cancer Society through the NFL's "A Crucial Catch: Annual Screening Saves Lives" platform. In addition to pink gear worn on the field, former RB **Ernie Green** (1962-68), a breast cancer survivor, will be honored.
- The Browns are leading the league in rushing yards (597) and rushing average (5.74). The Browns have rushed for 120 yards or more in four straight games for the first time since 2009. The team has also registered a rushing score in four straight games for the first time since 2012. RBs **Isaiah Crowell** (6.4) and **Duke Johnson Jr.** (6.2) are first and second in the NFL in rushing average. It marks the first time an NFL team had two running backs average at least 6.0 yards per carry (min. 25) since 1958, when Hall of Famers **Jim Brown** and **Bobby Mitchell** accomplished the feat for Cleveland.
- RB Isaiah Crowell rushed for 112 yards and a touchdown at Washington. He also added three receptions for 22 yards. Crowell is second in the NFL with 386 rushing yards this season, the most by a Brown through the first four games of a season since Hall of Famer Jim Brown recorded 476 in 1965. Crowell is also the first Browns player to record at least 60 rushing yards in each of the team's first four games since Earnest Byner in 1985. Crowell is tied for the NFL lead with 11 runs of 10-plus yards.
- WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. recorded five receptions for 46 yards and a touchdown at Washington. He leads the team this season with 19 receptions for 290 yards.
- LB Cam Johnson, who was signed off Arizona's practice squad one day prior, recorded his first two career sacks at Washington.
- Rookie DB **Briean Boddy-Calhoun** recorded his first career sack at Washington. One week earlier in his NFL debut, Boddy-Calhoun recorded an interception that he returned 27 yards for a touchdown at Miami. He became the first player in Browns history to record an INT-TD during his first NFL game.
- LT Joe Thomas has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers Jim Brown and Lou Groza for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 8-12, second season as head coach, first with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coach, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

New England -- Bill Belichick: 249-124, 22nd season as head coach, 17th season with the Patriots.

Hired on Jan. 27, 2000, Belichick has led the Patriots to 15 consecutive winning seasons (2001-15). Belichick has delivered four Super Bowl championships, six conference titles, 13 division crowns and 22 playoff victories. He entered the NFL in 1975 and won his first two Super Bowls as defensive coordinator for the New York Giants in 1986 and 1990. Belichick began his coaching career with the Baltimore Colts and continued as an assistant coach with Detroit (1976-77), Denver (1978) and the New York Giants (1979-1990). Belichick served as the Browns head coach from 1991-94. Prior to the Patriots, he spent three seasons with the New York Jets (1997-99).

- •Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** was the Browns head coach from 1991-95. He compiled a 36-44 record.
- •Patriots tight ends coach **Brian Daboll** was Cleveland's offensive coordinator from 2009-10.
- •Run game coordinator/running backs coach **Kirby Wilson** was the Patriots running backs coach from 1997-99.
- •Patriots LB **Barkevious Mingo** was originally drafted by the Browns in the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft. He appeared in 46 games with 16 starts. He logged 99 career tackles, seven sacks, one interception, 16 passes defensed and one fumble recovery. He was traded to the Patriots earlier this year.
- •Patriots DL **Jabaal Sheard** was a second-round pick by the Browns in 2011. He appeared in 61 games for the Browns from 2012-14 and logged 23.0 sacks.
- •Patriots assistant special teams coach **Ray Ventrone** played for the Browns from 2009-12, appearing in 56 games.
- Patriots DB Nate Ebner (Ohio State), WR Julian Edelman (Kent State), cornerbacks coach Josh Boyer (Muskingum College
 Ohio) and assistant quarterbacks coach Jerry Schuplinski (John Carroll) attended college in Ohio.
- •Patriots cornerbacks coach **Josh Boyer** (Heath) and offensive coordinator **Josh McDaniels** (Canton) are Ohio natives.
- •Patriots RB **Dion Lewis** was traded to the Browns in 2013 and spent one season with the club.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK-

With 120 rushing yards, the Browns offense will have rushed for 120 yards or more in five straight games for the first time since the team put six consecutive 120-plus yard games together to open the 1985 season.

With a rushing touchdown, the Browns will record their fifth straight game with a rushing score for the first time since 2012.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 60 or more rushing yards, Crowell would become the first Brown to have 60 or more rushing yards in the first five games of the season since Mike Pruitt in 1983.

With a 100-yard game, Crowell would become the first Browns running back to rush for 100 yards or more in consecutive games since Trent Richardson did it in Weeks 8-9 in 2012.

LB Cam Johnson

With two sacks, Johnson will be the first Browns player to record two or more sacks in back-to-back games since Jamir Miller did it in 2001.

DB Jamar Taylor

With an interception, Taylor would become the first Brown with an interception in three straight games since Tashaun Gipson did it in 2014.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 148 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 9,203 is the longest active stretch in the league.

2016 DRAFT -

During the 2016 NFL Draft, Cleveland bolstered its roster with 14 selections – the most among all teams and the most by the Browns since 1979. The Browns also acquired significant resources to continue to improve the team in future years with an additional first round pick in 2017 (Philadelphia), second round pick in 2017 (Tennessee) and second round pick in 2018 (Philadelphia). Twelve of the draft picks are on Cleveland's active roster and DB Trev Caldwell and LB Scooby Wright III are on the club's practice squad.

The Browns did not trail until 31 seconds remained in a 27-26 loss at the New England Patriots, who scored 13 points in the game's final 1:01 to claim the come-from-behind victory. Opening the game, QB Jason Campbell directed field-goal drives on two of the opening three series, allowing K Billy Cundiff to convert a 43-yard and 37-yard attempt for a 6-0 edge with 14:45 remaining in the second quarter. Campbell passed for a career-high 391 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 116.8 rating, Cleveland, which shut out the Patriots in the first two quarters by controlling the ball for 19:39, in the first half limited New England to 129 yards and Patriots QB Tom Brady to seven completions on 19 attempts (95 yards), including a first-quarter interception by LB D'Qwell Jackson that led to Cundiff's second field goal. Brady finished with 418 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. The Browns extended their lead to 12-0 on the first drive of the second half as Campbell connected with TE Gary Barnidge for a 40-yard TD with 10:15 to play in third quarter. One play after a Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski 33-yard field goal, Campbell threw a slant to Gordon, who stiff-armed a Patriots opponent and raced 80 yards for a touchdown, giving the Browns a 19-3 advantage with 1:25 left in the third quarter. New England responded with a three-play, 72-yard drive when RB Shane Vereen accounted for 66 receiving yards on two receptions and added a six-yard rushing touchdown, cutting the deficit to 19-11 following a two-point conversion (Brady to WR Julian Edelman). Gostkowski booted another field goal (50 yards), but Campbell found Cameron for a 4-yard touchdown to cap an eight-play, 80-yard series that provided Cleveland a 26-14 lead with 2:39 to go. The Patriots registered 13 unanswered points in the final minutes, scoring touchdowns on back-to-back possessions after recovering an onside kick. With only 31 seconds to play, The Browns surged to New England's 40-yard line on the final drive, but Cundiff's 58-yard

TEAM NOTES

HORTON RETURNS TO BROWNS

This season **Ray Horton** rejoined the Browns as defensive coordinator. Horton has been an NFL defensive coordinator the past five seasons, including the 2013 season when he served as the Browns defensive coordinator. Horton orchestrated one of the best defensive turnarounds in Cleveland history. After finishing 23rd in the league the previous year, the Browns ranked ninth in the league in total defense in 2013, marking the team's best finish since 1994. The Browns limited opponents to an average of 3.9 yards per carry, which ranked eighth in the NFL and marked Cleveland's best total in 18 years. The Browns defense also registered 40 sacks, their most since 2001. Horton has coached in the NFL the past 22 seasons following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. As a player and coach, he has made it to the Super Bowl five times, where he has three wins.

HAMILTON JOINS STAFF

Pep Hamilton joined the Browns as associate head coach – offense this season. He works closely with the quarterbacks. Hamilton spent 2013-14 and the first eight weeks of the 2015 season as the offensive coordinator for the Colts. In his two full seasons as coordinator, Indianapolis went 11-5 each year, won two AFC South division titles and advanced to the postseason each year, including a trip to the AFC Championship game in 2014. Prior to joining the Colts, Hamilton spent three seasons (2010-12) at Stanford, serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the final two years. Hamilton also served as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears from 2007-09.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME-

Earlier this year, **Kirby Wilson** was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator. He has 18 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #11, Adrian Peterson #17 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. Wilson's teams have won six division titles and advanced to the postseason eight times.

RB Isaiah Crowell rushed for 112 yards and a touchdown at Washington. He also added three receptions for 22 yards. Crowell is second in the NFL with 386 rushing yards this season, the most by a Brown through the first four games of a season since Hall of Famer Jim Brown recorded 476 in 1965. Crowell is also the first Browns player to record at least 60 rushing yards in each of the team's first four games since Earnest Byner in 1985. Crowell is tied for the NFL lead with 11 runs of 10-plus yards. In Week 2, he recorded an 85-yard touchdown, the second-longest run in Browns history and the longest run by any NFL player this season.

PRYOR DOES IT ALL—

WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. recorded five receptions for 46 yards and a touchdown at Washington. He hauled in a 9-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter for his first career receiving touchdown. He leads the team this season with 19 receptions for 290 yards. In Week 3, he set career highs in receptions (eight) and receiving yards (144) at Miami. He also completed three passes for 35 yards and rushed for 21 yards with a touchdown. He became the first player to have at least 120 receiving yards, 30 passing yards and 20 rushing yards in a single game since Pro Football Hall of Famer Frank Gifford on December 6, 1959. Pryor is the only non-RB in the NFL with a rushing and receiving touchdown this season.

LT **Joe Thomas** has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers **Jim Brown** and **Lou Groza** for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

LB **Cam Johnson**, who was signed off Arizona's practice squad one day prior, recorded his first two career sacks at Washington. Johnson appeared in one game with the Browns in 2015 and spent training camp with the team and was waived during final roster cuts. Johnson was the first Brown with two sacks in a game since LB **Nate Orchard** on Dec. 13, 2015.

BODDY-CALHOUN MAKES HISTORY—

Rookie DB **Briean Boddy-Calhoun** recorded his first career sack at Washington. One week earlier in this NFL debut, Boddy-Calhoun recorded an interception that he returned 27 yards for a touchdown at Miami. HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Owners Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He brings 29 years of coaching experience, including the last 15 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

Jackson has spent the past four seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent the past two seasons (2014-15) as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and

tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Foundation announces Radiothon grants

Last week, the Cleveland Browns Foundation announced four grant awards totaling more than \$275,000 to support qualified nonprofits and education-based organizations in Northeast Ohio that provide first class education and youth development opportunities in the region.

In September, Browns fans helped raise an event record of more than \$137,000 during the Third Annual Cleveland Browns Foundation Radiothon, hosted on Good Karma Brands' ESPN 850 WKNR. For the second time in as many years, Dee and Jimmy Haslam announced a dollar-for-dollar match, resulting in nearly \$275,000 total to help eliminate barriers so that all students have access to a high-quality education in Northeast Ohio.

It marked the third consecutive year that the fundraiser collected more than \$100,000 to benefit education and youth development in Cleveland. In the Radiothon's three years of existence, more than \$650,000 has been raised for local programs that support children from birth through college.

Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) – to support the "GET 2 SCHOOL, YOU CAN MAKE IT!" city wide attendance campaign, designed to help solve problems and remove barriers of students being chronically absent from school. The campaign promotes the importance of school attendance as research shows that chronically absent students have significant negative impact on student test scores and graduation rates.

Shoes and Clothes for Kids – to expand distribution of school uniforms, casual clothing and school supplies to Cleveland Metropolitan School District's (CMSD) most disadvantaged students to remove clothing as a barrier to school attendance.

Ginn Academy – to support Ginn Academy's Life Coach program, which provides each student with a 24/7 mentor in the areas of academics, behavior, attendance and social-emotional development to serve as a link between home and school. The Ginn Academy is the first all-male public high school in Ohio and 100 percent of its student body comes from low-income families.

The Centers for Families and Children – to support the implementation of the 2,000 Days Pledge initiative that engages parents, teachers and communities to make a child's first 2,000 days – the time when 90 percent of brain development occurs – as impactful as possible.



Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, Thankel Trick. Lagles Tookie QD Calson Wellz got out of itset as its let of a mine-play, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard gain. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

Despite a first quarter lead, the Ravens rallied back to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 25-20. The Browns started the game fast as QB Josh McCown led a nine-play, 75-yard opening drive that culminated in a 31-yard TD pass to rookie WR Corey Coleman, giving Cleveland a 7-0 advantage. After forcing a Baltimore punt, RB Isaiah Crowell broke free on the first play for an 85-yard TD rush on the Browns next possession. Cleveland extended its lead after an INT by DB Joe Haden - his first of two INTs in the game - gave the Browns the ball back in Ravens territory. McCown connected with Coleman once more for a 27-yard TD. The Browns could not convert on the ensuing PAT as K Patrick Murray's attempt was blocked and returned by the Ravens for the defensive two-point conversion, leaving Cleveland with a 20-2 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter. Late in the second quarter, Ravens' QB Joe Flacco marched Baltimore down the field with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Mike Wallace. After an interception by S Eric Weddle, Baltimore was able to score before the half as K Justin Tucker converted on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, cutting the Cleveland lead to 20-12. The Ravens got out to a fast start in the third quarter as Flacco led a six-play, 75-yard TD drive to start the second half, connecting with Wallace yet again on a 17-yard TD pass that left Baltimore trailing 19-20. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter as Tucker converted two more field goal attempts – the first from 49 yards away, and the second from 41 yards away to give the Ravens a 25-20 advantage. Despite a late push from the Browns offense, an INT by Baltimore LB C.J. Mosley with just 13 seconds remaining in the contest sealed the victory.

DOLPHINS 30 BROWNS 24 (OT)

Hard Rock Stadium, Miami Gardens, Fla.

The Dolphins defeated the Browns in overtime, 30-24, in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The Browns defense started strong as DB Jamar Taylor intercepted Dolphins' QB Ryan Tannehill on the second play of the game. Miami responded by forcing a turnover of their own as DL Cameron Wake strip-sacked Browns' rookie QB Cody Kessler. On their second possession, Tannehill led the Dolphins down the field on a five-play, 61-yard scoring drive including a 26-yard TD pass to WR DeVante Parker, giving Miami a 7-0 advantage. To open the second quarter, Browns' K Cody Parkey capped off a 10-play, 58-yard drive by connecting on a 46-yard field goal attempt, cutting the lead to 7-3. Later in the second, Cleveland DB Briean Boddy-Calhoun intercepted a Tannehill pass and returned it 27 yards for a Browns TD, giving Cleveland a 10-7 lead. The Dolphins were able to tie the game at 10 on their ensuing possession as K Andrew Franks split the uprights with a 37-yard field goal. Cleveland closed out the scoring in the first half as Parkey converted on a 48-yard field goal attempt and sent the Browns into halftime with a 13-10 advantage. Miami regained the lead in the third quarter as Tannehill connected with WR Jarvis Landry on a 42-yard TD pass. In the fourth quarter, the Dolphins stretched their margin when Tannehill found RB Damien Williams on a 10-yard TD pass, giving Miami a 24-13 edge. Cleveland responded, as WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. capped off a nine-play, 83-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush. Kessler found TE Gary Barnidge on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, cutting the lead to just three. The Browns were able to deadlock the contest at 24 with just over three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter as Parkey connected on his third field goal of the game, this time from 38 yards away. After a strip-sack by LB Corey Lemonier, Cleveland had a chance to win the game as time expired in the fourth quarter but could not convert a 46-yard field goal. In overtime, Landry set up the Dolphins' game-winning TD with a 32-yard reception along the sideline. On the next play, Miami RB Jay Ajayi found the endzone on an 11-yard TD rush to secure the Dolphins victory.

The Redskins pulled away from the Browns in the fourth quarter for a 31-20 victory at FedExField. Washington initiated the game's scoring as QB Kirk Cousins opened the day with a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive, including an 8-yard TD pass to TE Jordan Reed. On their next possession, Cousins led the Redskins down the field again, eventually capping off the eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 9-yard TD pass to Reed, giving Washington a 14-0 advantage. Cleveland cut into the Redskins' lead in the second quarter with a 12-play, 81-yard drive courtesy of a 2-yard TD rush by RB Isaiah Crowell. Following an interception by DB Jamar Taylor, Cleveland evened the score at 14-14 when rookie QB Cody Kessler connected with WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. on a 9-yard TD pass – Pryor's first career TD reception. Washington regained its edge later in the half when Redskins K Dustin Hopkins split the uprights on a 49-yard field goal attempt, but K Cody Parkey tied the game up once more with a 51-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter. Cleveland gained its first lead of the day on its opening possession of the third quarter when Parkey connected on another field goal – this time from 45 yards away – to take a 20-17 advantage. Washington stole momentum as the fourth quarter began, however, and capitalized following three different Cleveland turnovers. After forcing a fumble, Cousins found RB Chris Thompson on a 5-yard TD pass, giving the Redskins a 24-20 edge. The Browns defense bounced back and managed to keep Washington out of the end zone after another fumble, but an interception by Redskins DB Josh Norman set up a 1-yard TD rush by Redskins RB Matt Jones, giving Washington a 31-20 lead to seal the game.
