## GAME SUMMARY

#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (11-2) at DENVER BRONCOS (8-5) Sunday, Dec. 18, 2016 • Spots Authority Field at Mile High (76,125) • 4:25 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will play against the Denver Broncos this week in a rematch of the 2015 AFC Championship Game. The Patriots and Broncos will play in the regular season for the sixth year in a row. The Patriots are 4-1 in the previous five meetings. Last season, the Patriots lost, 30-24, at Denver in overtime on Nov. 29. The Patriots and Broncos then faced each other in the AFC Title Game with Denver winning, 20-18, on Jan. 24, 2016.

A victory over Denver will secure the Patriots an NFL-record eighth straight division title and a first-round playoff bye for the seventh consecutive season.

# BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Jim Nantz will handle play-by-play duties with Phil Simms as the color analyst. Tracy Wolfson will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by Lance Barrow and directed by Mike Arnold.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on ESPN Radio. Adam Amin and Bill Polian will call the game. Ian Fitzsimmons will work the sidelines.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. Produced by Marc Cappello.

#### PATS CAN CLINCH PLAYOFF BER

The New England Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.

The Patriots can clinch another AFC East Division and earn a first-round bye with a win in Denver on Sunday.

#### HISTOR EDIES



The New England Patriots and Denver Broncos will meet for the sixth straight year in the regular season this week when the Patriots travel to Denver. The Patriots are 4-1 in the previous five meetings.

Last season, the two teams played twice, one in the regular season and in the AFC Championship Game. Both games were played in Denver, and both games were won by the Broncos. The Patriots lost, 30-24, in overtime at Denver on Nov. 29, 2015, and fell, 20-18, in the AFC Championship Game on Jan. 24, 2015. 2016.

Derver leads the overall series by a 26-20 margin in the regular season and a 4-1 margin in the postseason. The Patriots and Broncos have played in the three divisional playoff games and

two AFC Championship Games. The Patriots are 9-21 overall in games played in Denver, including 0-4 in

postseason games.

New England has played more games against the Broncos than any other team that has never been in New England's division. The history between the teams dates back to the first days of the Ameri-can Football League in 1960. The Patriots played the Broncos in the inaugural game of each franchise, a 13-10 Denver win on Sept. 9, 1960, at BU Field. The teams squared off twice a year in the decade prior to the AFL-NFL merger, event for 1962. except for 1967 and 1969.

The Denver Broncos overcame a 21-7 fourth-quarter deficit to win, 30-24, in overtime and hand the visiting New England Patriots their first loss of the season in a snowy Sunday Night Football game in Denver. It was the Patriots first loss in the snow in the Bill Belichick era.

The Patriots were in front, 21-17, when Denver got the ball with 2:31 to play. Denver QB Brock Osweiler completed a 36-yard pass to WR Demaryius Thomas, his only reception of the night. Two plays later, Osweiler connected with WR Emmanuel Sanders on a 39-yard pass that helped get in position for Osweiler's 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Andre Caldwell for a 24-21 lead.

Tom Brady and the Patriots got the ball back with 1:09 to play and moved to the Denver 29-yard line to set up K Stephen Gostkowski's 47-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime.

The Patriots won the coin toss and elected to receive but were stopped on three straight plays. On Denver's second play from scrimmage, RB C.J. Anderson scored on a 48-yard run to power the Broncos to the win.

The Patriots opened the fourth quarter with a 63-yard touchdown pass from Brady to RB Brandon Bolden to go up 21-7. After stopping the Broncos on the ensuing drive, rookie WR Chris Harper muffed a punt that was recovered by Denver at the New England 36-yard line. Denver took advantage of the turnover when Osweiler connected on a 17-yard pass to Sanders followed by a 15-yard touchdown pass to Anderson to make it 21-14.

A holding call on the Patriots next possession nullified a 51-yard pass from Brady to WR Keshawn Martin on a third-and-11 play. New England failed to convert on third-and-20 following the penalty, and Denver's next possession resulted in a 21-yard field goal to make it 21-17.

New England got on the board first in the first quarter when they scored on their first possession. New England fielded a short punt of 25 yards to start their first drive at the Denver 47-yard line. That helped get set up a 23-yard touchdown pass from Brady to TE Rob Gronkowski.

The Patriots defense helped set up the second touchdown in the second quarter. DL Jabaal Sheard tipped a pass that was intercepted by DL Chandler Jones at the Denver 15-yard line. That helped set up a 9-yard touchdown pass from Brady to TE Scott Chandler for a 14-0 lead.

Denver got on the board before the end of the half when RB Ronnie Hillman concluded a 10-play, 77-yard drive with a 19-yard touchdown run to make it 14-7. The score remained 14-7 heading into the final quarter.

Brady's 63-yard touchdown pass to Bolden was his 420tth career touchdown, moving him into a third place tie with Dan Marino on the NFL's all-time touchdown list.

New England managed just 16 first downs and held the ball for only 25:57 against the top- ranked Denver defense.

Denver CB Brady Roby intercepted a 2-point pass attempt with 12 seconds remaining as the Broncos beat the Patriots, 20-18, to advance to the Super Bowl.

Denver drove 83 yards for a touchdown on their first possession of the game, capped by QB Peyton manning's 21-yard touchdown pass to TE Owen Daniels.

Late in the first quarter, LB Jonathan Freeny recovered a Manning lateral at the Broncos 22-yard line. RB Steven Jackson scored a few plays later, but K Stephen Gostkowski missed an extra point and the first quarter ended with Denver in front, 7-6.

Early in the second quarter LB Von Miller intercepted a pass and returned it four yards to the Patriots 16-yard line. Three players later, Manning again connected with Daniels, this time from 12 yards, to take a 14-6 lead. The Patriots responded with a field goal, but Denver K Brandon McManus made a 52-yard field goal just before halftime for a 17-9 lead.

New England forced a three-and-out to begin the second half, and a 31-yard pass from QB Tom Brady to TE Rob Gronkowski to set up a 38-yard field goal and close the Denver lead to 17-12.

Early in the fourth quarter, a 30-yard run by RB C.J. Johnson on third-and-1 led to a field goal for a 20-12 lead with 10:02 to play.

The Patriots drove to the Denver 9-yard line with 2:30 to play, but a false start penalty on third-and-one forced New England into a pair of passes on third and fourth down that both fell incomplete. The Patriots defense forced a three-and-out, and a 16-yard punt return by WR Julian Edelman gave Brady and the patriots the ball at midfield with 1:52 to play. After three incomplete passes, Brady connected with Gronkowski on a 40-yard pass with 57 seconds to play. On fourth-and-goal from the 4-yard line, Brady tossed a touchdown pass to Gronkowski with 12 seconds to play to make it 20-18. But, the Patriots 2-point play was intercepted in the end zone to secure the Broncos victory.

QB Tom Brady connected with WR Chris Hogan on a 79-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter to lead the Patriots to a 30-23 victory over the baltimore Ravens in a Monday Night Football matchup that improved the Patriots to an 11-2 record.

Brady threw for 406 yards and three touchdowns. RB LeGarrette Blount rushed for 72 yards to reach 1,000 yards for the second time in his career. His 1-yard touchdown run int he first quarter gave him 14 rushing touchdowns for the season to tie the franchise record with Pro Football Hall of Famer Curtis Martin (1995 and and 1996).

The Patriots jumped to a 23-3 lead in the third quarter before two special teams fumbles on back-to-back plays led to two Baltimore touchdowns to make it 23-17. First, rookie CB Cyrus Jones could not get out of the way after a Baltimore punt. It brushed off his foot, and Baltimore recovered at the New England 3-yard line. Two plays later, QB Joe Flacco connected on a 3-yard touchdown pass to narrow the lead to 23-10. Then on the ensuing kickoff, WR Matthew Slater fumbled the kickooff, and Baltimore took over at the New England 22-yard line. Four players, later, Flacco threw a touchdown pass to make it 23-17.

Later in the fourth quarter, with New England in front, 23-17, Baltimore reached the 12-yard line when DE Rob Ninkovich sacked Flacco on a third-down play to help force the Ravens to settle for a field goal. On the first play from scrimmage, Brady connected with Hogan for the 79-yard otuchdown to give the Patriots a 30-20 advanatge. The Ravens did score a field goal on their next drive but the Patriots recovered the onside kick attempt and ran off the final two minutes to secure the win.

The Patriots got off to a fast start, jumping to a 16-0 lead in the second quarter. After a punt was downed at the 1-yard line by Slater early in the first quarter, DT Malcom Brown busted through the line and tackled RB Kenneth Dixon in the end zone for a safety.

LB Shea McClellin blocked a Baltimore field goal and the Patriots took over and drove 74 yards on 10 plays before Blount scored on a 1-yard run for a 9-0 first quarter lead. The Patriots opened the second quarter with an 89-yard drive that ended when Brady connected with WR Malcolm Mithcell for a 6-yard touchdown and a 16-0 lead. A 19-yard touchdown pass from Brady to TE Martellus Bennett in the third quarter appeared toput the game out of reach as the Patriots took a 23-3 lead.



# 11-WIN SEASONS

The Patriots have won 11 games so far in 2016. It is the 18th time in team history that the team has won at least 11 games in a season and the seventh straight season with at least 11 wins. The Patriots have had 11 or more wins 14 times in Robert Kraft's 23 seasons of ownership after having only four 11-win seasons prior to Kraft purchasing the team (1976, 1978, 1985, 1986).

## **OFFENSE DROPS 30**

The Patriots scored 30 points against the top ranked Baltimore defense. The Ravens entered the game tied for first with the Patriots, allowing just 17.3 points per game.

## **DEFENSE NETS THIRD SAFETY**

DL Malcom Brown registered the Patriots third safety of the season when he dropped Baltimore RB Kenneth Dixon in the end zone in the first quarter. The Patriots three safeties in 2016 are a team mark. The Patriots registered safeties sin back-to-back games – at Cleveland (10/9) when QB Cody Kessler fumbled out of the end zone and when LB Dont'a Hightower registered one in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/16) when he sacked QB Andy Dalton in the end zone. The Patriots had two safeties in a season six previous times (1963, 1965, 1967, 1969, 1978 and 1985). The NFL record for most safeties in a season is 6 by the 1964 Buffalo Bills.

## STINGY DEFENSE

The Patriots defense has 10 seasons holding opponents under 20 points per game since 2001, including in each of the last two seasons. The Patriots have allowed 230 points in 13 games for an average of 17.7 points per game. The Patriots defense has held it opponent under 20 points in eight games in 2016. The Patriots held their opponents under 20 points 11 times in 2001 and 2006, the most under Bill Belichick.

He had a 68-yard reception in the 2015 regular-season finale at Miami on Jan. 3, 2016. It is the second 60-yard pass play for the Patriots in 2016. Chris Hogan had a 63-yard reception at Cleveland on Oct. 9, 2016.

# BRADY'S BIG DA

Brady connected with RB James White for a 61-yard gain and WR Chris Hogan for a 79-yard touchdown. It is the 11th time in his career that he has thrown at least two 50-yard passes in the same game. It is the second time in 2016 that he has had two 50-yard passes in the same game. He had a 53-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski and a 53-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Hogan at Buffalo on Oct. 30.

#### CHUNG PITCHES IN ON PUNT RETURNS

S Patrick Chung returned a third quarter punt for 7 yards. It is his second career punt return. He returned a punt for 4 yards at Denver on Nov. 29, 2015.

# BILL BELICHICK

\*Bill Belichick (6) needs to reach one more Super Bowl as a head coach to break a tie with Don Shula (6) for the most conference titles.

\*Belichick has four Super Bowl wins as a head coach to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most wins. With one more Super Bowl win, Belichick will have the most wins by a head coach in Super Bowl history.

\*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula with 13 division titles and needs one more division title to set the record for most among all head coaches.

\*Bill Belichick now has 234 regular seasons wins. He is behind Don Shula (328), George Halas (318) and Tom Landry (250).

\*Belichick's Patriots teams have twice recorded five straight years of playoff advancement (2003-07 and 2011-15), tying the NFL record. If the Patriots advance in 2016, they will set the NFL record. John Harbaugh (2008-12), Mike Holmgren (1993-97), John Madden (1973-77) and Andy Reid (2000-04) also won a playoff game in five consecutive seasons.

#### **TOM BRADY**

\*Tom Brady has 202 wins overall (180 in the regular season and 22 in the postseason) and passed Peyton Manning (200: 186 in the regular season and 14 in the postseason) to become the all-time leader for most wins by an NFL quarterback.

\* Brady (180) is just the third NFL quarterback with 180 career regular-season wins, joining Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (186).

\*If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2016, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (9).

\*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2016 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns to become the all-time leader in this category.

\* Brady became the fifth NFL quarter to reach 60,000 passing yards in the win at the NY Jets 911/27/16}. he now has 60,904 passing yards.

\*Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2016, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (10).

\*Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

\*Brady is in his 17th season in 2016 and became the longest tenured Patriots player, surpassing the 16 seasons by Steve Grogan (1975-90).

\*Brady's 17 seasons with one team are tied for the most by an NFL quarterback with John Brodie (San Francisco) and Dan Marino (Miami).

# STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

\*If Stephen Gostkowski leads the NFL in scoring in 2016, he will set the NFL mark for most seasons leading the NFL in scoring with six, moving past Don Hutson [5] and Gino Cappelletti (5). Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in 2008 and 2012-15.

\*Stephen Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in each of the last four seasons (2012-15). He can become just the second player to lead the NFL in scoring in five straight seasons in 2016, joining Don Hutson (1940-44).

 $^{*}$  In 2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points and can add to that in 2016.

\*Gostkowski has the second-best field goal percentage in NFL history from 50 yards or more (76.0 percent (19-of-25).

\*Gostkowski (4) needs one more 30-field goal season to tie David Akers and John Carney for the most in NFL history with five seasons of 30 or more field goals.

\*Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008, 2013 and 2014). If he leads the NFL in field goals in 2016, he will join Lou Groza (5), Jack Manders (4), Ward Cuff (4) and Mark Moseley (4) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons.

# INDIVIDUAL S. TEAM NOTES





Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall

order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2016, Kraft earned his 20th winning season in 23 years of owning the franchise.

# **MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT**

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

#### CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the second team (1970s Pittsburgh Steelers) in NFL history – and first in 35 years – to win four Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

# KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EV-ERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

The Patriots have 277 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 277-126 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.



# TIME

#### The Patriots and Broncos will meet in Denver this Sunday while some circumstances might look a bit similar to their 2011 meeting at Mile High.

The notion of a trip back in time typically points to alternate circumstances upon arrival in yesteryear. Flashback to the past and things are different than the present. However, if the New England Patriots were to choose a time machine as their method of transportation to this Sunday's game and traveled exactly five years in reverse, there would not be much confusion to arise.

The date would still be Sunday, Dec.18, and the Denver Broncos would still be on the schedule for an afternoon kickoff at Sports Authority Field at Mile High. Tom Brady and Co. would still take the field in the Week 15 matchup, and just like this Sunday, Peyton Manning would not be the opposing quarterback. This week's contest will mark the first time in five seasons the Patriots and Broncos have gone head to head without No.18 on Denver's active roster. To note the differences, it was Tim Tebow who held the signal-calling role for the orange and navy in 2011. Wes Welker still wore a Pats uniform at the time, having yet to relocate to the Mile-High-City. Since that date, the two teams have met on seven additional occasions - four of which have resulted in a New England win.

As time expired in the December 2011 showdown, the Patriots prevailed and took a 41-23 victory back to Foxborough. Returning home victorious will be at the top of the list of factors New England will look to keep constant five years later.

The Patriots then went on to capture its first world championship in thrilling fashion over the heavily favored Rams, as Super Bowl XXXVI was the first to ever be won on the game's final play.

## **BY THE NUMBERS**

The Patriots forced two fumbles on kickoffs in the 27-0 win vs. Houston on Sept. 22, 2016.

**E** WR Chris Hogan caught two 40-yard passes (63 and 43) at Cleveland (10/9/16) to become the first Patriots player to do so in a game since Rob Gronkowski (50 and 49) at Washington (12/11/11).

James White is fourth in the NFL among running backs with 50 receptions.  $\frac{4}{4}$ 

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick vs. Washington (11/08/15) and vs. Philadelphia (12/06/15). It was his third [Cleveland - 12/08/13 and the fourth in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

TE Martellus Bennett had his fifth career 100-yard game and his third of the 2016 season after finishing with 7 receptions for 102 yards vs. Seattle (11/13/16).

The Patriots became the first team in NFL history in 2014 to earn five straight first-round byes and extended that record with their sixth straight bye in 2015. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995 and Denver earned four straight from 2012-15.

The Patriots have scored on their opening offensive possession of the game in seven of 13 games so far in 2016,


On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



#### **GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START**

Jimmy Garoppolo became just the fifth quarterback in the last 30 years to make his first regular-season start in a season-opening night game (Sept. 11, 2016 vs. Cardinals). #### ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe.* "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

#### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



#### WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the Boston Globe. "I would put my father-son relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

#### WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

#### **CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO**

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

#### **CRAZY EIGHTS**

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16½, 1986, 9½ and 1987, 12½).

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

★ Rob Gronkowski got the scoring started by hauling in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.

★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.

★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

#### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).

#### PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
