NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-2) vs. NEW YORK JETS (4-10) Saturday, Dec. 24, 2016 • Gillette Stadium (66,829) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots secured their NFL-record eighth consecutive AFC East Title and a first-round bye for the seventh straight season following the 16-3 win at Denver last Sunday. The Patriots can clinch the first seed in the playoff field and home-field advantage throughout the playoffs if they win their last two games or if they win one of the last two games combined with a loss by the Oakland Raiders.

This Saturday, the Patriots will attempt to sweep the New York Jets for the 17th time and reach 13 wins for the sixth time in team history.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Ian Eagle will handle play-by-play duties with Dan Fouts as the color analyst. Evan Washburn will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by Mark Wolff and directed by Bob Fishman.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. Produced by Marc Cappello.

The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 116th time, including three postseason games, since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. It will be the second meeting of the 2016 season. The Patriots beat the Jets, 22-17 in the first meeting on Nov. 27, at MetLife Stadium. The Patriots will try for their 17th series sweep of the Jets this week.

Last season, the two teams split the series with the Patriots taking a 30-23 win at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 25, before losing 26-20 in overtime in the rematch at MetLife Stadium on Dec. 27.

The Patriots lead the series, 60-54-1 overall.

The Patriots are 32-25-1 all-time against the Jets at home, including 1-1 at home in the postseason.

The Patriots are 28-29 all-time on the road against the Jets, including 4-3 at MetLife Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason three times - a 1985 Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets, 26-14, in 1985 at the Meadowlands on their way to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium and the Jets beat the Patriots, 28-21, in the 2010 Divisional playoff game.

New England is 31-16 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994.

New England's 60 overall victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only Buffalo with 70 alltime wins

The New England Patriots overcame a 10-0 deficit in the second quarter and a 17-13 deficit in the fourth quarter to take a 22-17 win over the New York Jets. The win improved the Patriots to a 9-2 record and guaranteed a winning season for the 16th straight season.

QB Tom Brady tied Peyton Manning for the most wins by a quarterback in NFL history with his 200th by throwing the go-ahead touchdown pass to rookie WR Malcolm Mitchell with 1:56 left to play. It was the 50th time that Brady has led the Patriots to a win while facing a fourth-quarter deficit or tie.

Trailing 17-16 with 5:04 to play and the ball at their own 17-yard line. Brady helped lead the Patriots to the New York 8-yard line. After RB James White stretched over the marker for a first-down on a fourth-and-four situation, WR Chris Hogan caught a 25-yard pass to put the ball at the 8-yard line. Brady then zipped a pass to Mitchell in the end zone to give the Patriots the lead at 22-17. A two-point play by the Patriots was initially ruled good, but after a replay it was determined the ball never crossed the goal line.

The Jets started the ensuing drive at their own 25-yard line. On the second play, DL Chris Long forced a fumble on a sack of Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick, and DL Trey Flowers recovered for the Patriots with 1:43 to play.

RB LeGarrette Blount had a 23-yard run to the Jets 3-yard line where the Patriots ran off the final second to secure the victory.

The Jets engineered an 8-play, 41-yard drive that ended in a 51-yard field goal on their first drive of the game for a 3-0 first quarter lead. New York ex-tended its lead to 10-0 with a 1-yard touchdown pass from Fitzpatrick to WR Brandon Marshall on the first play of the second quarter. The Patriots answered with a 10-play, 65-yard drive that ended at the New

York 10-yard line where K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 28-yard field goal to put the Patriots on the board.

CB Malcolm Butler forced and recovered a fumble after a short catch by WR Robby Anderson, allowing the Patriots to start a drive at midfield. The Patriots responded by moving to the New York 4-yard line where Brady connected with Mitchell for a 4-yard touchdown, the first of his two touchdowns on the day.

Both teams missed scoring opportunities before the end of the half. DL Alan Branch blocked a 54-yard Jets field goal, and the Patriots missed 39-yard field goal with six seconds to play in the half.

New England got its first lead of the game on its first possession in the second half, a 12-play, 58-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard Gostkowski field goal for a 13-10 lead.

The Jets took a 17-13 lead with 10:17 left when WR Quincy Enunwa leaped over a Patriots defensed for a 22-yard touchdown. A 41-yard field goal from Bostkowski with 7:02 left to play narrowed the Jets lead to 17:16. Brady finished the day 30-of-50 for 286 yards with two touchdown passes.

The New England Patriots became the first team to win eight straight division titles after a 16-3 victory at Denver secured the AFC East crown and a first-round by for the seventh consecutive season.

The win helped the Patriots improve to a 12-2 record, their seventh straight year with at least 12 wins.

The Patriots defense was dominate in the second half, holding Denver to five straight series of three-and-out to begin the second half.

Despite QB Tom Brady being held to just 16 completions and zero touchdowns, the Patriots offense pounded out 136 rushing yards behind a career-high 95-yard effort by RB Dion Lewis against Denver's third-ranked defense.

The Patriots special teams units were a factor as well. K Stephen Gostkowski kicked three field goals, including a 45 and a 40-yarder. The special teams units helped set the tone in the first quarter when rookie DB Jonathan Jones recovered a muffed punt at the Denver 31-yard line to help set up a 45-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 3-0 lead. P Ryan Allen pinned the Broncos inside their own 20-yard line three times.

Denver tied the game later in the first quarter on a 33-yard field goal for Denver's only points of the day.

Denver reached the New England 14-yard line early in the second quarter when CB Logan Ryan picked off a QB Trevor Siemian pass at the 8-yard line and returned the ball 46 yards to the Denver 46-yard line. The Patriots took advantage of the turnover and marched 46 yards in 7-plays before RB LeGarrette Blount set the franchise record with his 15th rushing touchdown of the season for a 10-3 lead.

Denver was held without a first down and just 9 total yards in the third quarter, as the Patriots headed into the final quarter with a 13-3 lead.

WR Julian Edelman was on the receiving end of two third-down conversions during a third-quarter drive that ended with a 40-yard field goal by Gostkowski. A 21-yard field gal by Gostkowski in the fourth quarter extended the Patriots lead to 16-3 to help improve the Patriots to a 12-2 record.



PATS CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH FOR 18TH TIME

New England has now qualified for the playoffs 24 times in its 57-year history. The Patriots have earned 18 playoff berths in the 23 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths that the team earned in its first 34 years of existence.

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (238 pct.) and logaring the weat preceding the NE logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall

But under Kratt's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles [16], conference crowns (7] and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 23 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 18 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2016, Kraft earned his 20th winning season in 23 years of owning the franchise.

MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the second team (1970s Pittsburgh Steelers) in NFL history – and first in 35 years – to win four Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EV-ERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

The Patriots have 278 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 278-126 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.







The Patriots have taken the field in just five Christmas Eve games during their 56-year history with this Saturday's kickoff vs. the New York Jets marking the sixth.

In three of the team's past four December 24 contests, the Patriots have celebrated the holiday season victoriously. While this Saturday's matchup with the Jets will mark just the sixth game New England has played on Christmas Eve in its history, the Pats will look to keep that seasonal spirit alive once again as the 2016 postseason fast approaches. The team's most recent December 24 triumph came in Week 16 of the 2011 campaign to the tune of a 27-24 home win over the Miami Dolphins. The Pats took down the Jacksonville Jaguars, 24-21 on December 24, 2006 and before that, suffered a 27-24 loss to Miami on the eve of Christmas 2000. PATRIOTS ANNOUNCE SERIES OF INITIATIVES THROUGHOUT 2016 SEASON

The New England Patriots will introduce a series of initiatives throughout the 2016 season to celebrate the 15th anniversary of the 2001 Super Bowl Championship team. The season-long celebration kicked off with a special content series that gives fans the opportunity to relive that magical season. The weekly features will run throughout the 2016 season. It began with the Patriots, much to the surprise of the TV broadcasters, choosing to be introduced as a team rather than the traditional introduction of individual players. The Patriots then went on to capture its first world championship in thrilling fashion over the heavily favored Rams, as Super Bowl XXXVI was the first to ever be won on the game's final play.

A SAFETY FIRST

The Patriots recorded a safety in back-to-back games for the first time in team history. LB Dont'a Hightower dropped Cincinnati (10/16/16) QB Andy Dalton in the end zone for an 8-yard sack for a safety. At Cleveland (10/9/16) the previous week, Browns QB Cody Kessler fumbled the ball out of the end zone for a safety, forced by a strong rush by Dont'a Hightower. The Patriots recorded their team-record third safety of the 2016 season when DL Malcom Brown registered a tackle in the end zone vs. Baltimore on Dec. 12.

BLOCK PARTY

LB Shea McClellin blocked a first-quarter field goal attempt for the Patriots third blocked kick of the 2016 season. McClellin blocked an extra point attempt vs. Seattle on Nov. 13 and DL Alan Branch blocked a field goal at the New York Jets on Nov. 27. The block was the first miss of the 2016 season by Baltimore K Justin Tucker. The Patriots three blocked kicks are the most blocked kicks New England has recorded since 2014 when the team recorded five on the year (4 field goals and 1 punt) The Patriots' record for most kicks blocked in a season sits at six in 1975 (2 extra points, 3 field goals and 1 punt), while they have tallied five in season on two occasions (2014 and 1973) and four in a season four times (1974, 1977, 1986, 2002).

DEFENSE NETS THIRD SAFETY

DL Malcom Brown registered the Patriots third safety of the season when he dropped Baltimore RB Kenneth Dixon in the end zone in the first quarter. The Patriots three safeties in 2016 are a team mark. The Patriots registered safeties sin back-to-back games – at Cleveland (10/9) when QB Cody Kessler fumbled out of the end zone and when LB Dont'a Hightower registered one in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/16) when he sacked QB Andy Dalton in the end zone. 
On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edélman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL - covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender - he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

"My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START

As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season, joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the Boston Globe. "I would put my father-son relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, $16\frac{1}{2}$, 1986, $9\frac{1}{2}$ and 1987, $12\frac{1}{2}$).

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. ★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.

★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 24 times in their 57-year history. Eighteen of those playoff berths have come in the 23 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 19 division crowns, including 14 in the last 16 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
