STEELERS CLAIM THE NORTH

The Pittsburgh Steelers won seven consecutive regular-season games, finishing with a 11-5 regular-season record in 2016, and captured the AFC North division title with a 31-27 come-frombehind win against Baltimore at Heinz Field on Christmas Day in Week 16.

Pittsburgh secured the AFC North division title for the seventh time since NFL realignment in 2002 - the most among division teams (Pittsburgh: 7, Baltimore: 4 and Cincinnati: 4).

The Steelers are one of the most successful teams in NFL history. The team's 22 division titles, 29 playoff berths and 36 postseason wins are the most since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970:

STEELERS SUPER BOWL HISTORY

The Steelers are 34-24 (.607) in the postseason, including a 20-11 record at home, a 8-11 mark on the road and a 6-2 record at neutral sites (Super Bowls IX, X, XIII, XIV, XXX, XL, XLIII and XLV).

Pittsburgh has played in the Super Bowl three times since 2005 and the team's eight trips to the Super Bowl are tied for the most in NFL history with the Dallas Cowboys. The Steelers' six wins in the Super Bowl are the most in league history.

Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** is only the second coach in NFL history to reach two Super Bowls in his first four seasons as a head coach (Joe Gibbs - Washington Redskins).

The Steelers are 8-5 during the Mike Tomlin era in the postseason, with three of the five losses being by six points or less.

MISC. STEELERS POSTSEASON NOTES

- In 2005, the Steelers became the first No. 6 seed in NFL history to win the Super Bowl. Since then two other Wild Card teams have gone on to win the Super Bowl ('10 Green Bay, sixth seed and '07 Giants, fifth seed).
- Pittsburgh has played in 59 playoff games, which is second all-time behind Dallas (61).
- The Steelers have won 12 of their last 17 postseason games.
- Pittsburgh is 8-4 all-time in the postseason at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001, including winning five of their previous six.
- The Steelers won the AFC Central title a team-record six consecutive seasons from 1974-79. They also won four consecutive division titles from 1994-97.
- The Steelers won a team-record seven consecutive postseason games, including two Super Bowls (IX and X), from Dec. 22, 1974 through Dec. 19, 1976. They won six consecutive postseason games from Dec. 30, 1978 through Jan. 20, 1980, including victories in Super Bowls XIII and XIV.
- The Steelers have been shut out only once in the postseason, during the 1947 Eastern Division Playoff game, Dec. 21, 1947, versus the Philadelphia Eagles. The Steelers and Eagles finished that season with 8-4 records and tied for first place in the Eastern Division. In those days, there was only one NFL Championship Game, so the two Pennsylvania neighbors squared off for the right to face the Chicago Cardinals in the Championship Game. The Eagles won, 21-0, but lost in the Championship Game, 28-21, to the Cardinals, the same franchise the Steelers faced in Super Bowl XLIII.
- The Steelers record for fewest points allowed in a playoff game is five, during a 34-5 win in the 1978 AFC Championship Game versus the Houston Oilers at Three Rivers Stadium, on Jan. 7, 1979. The Steelers allowed a team-high 45 points during a 45-28 AFC Championship Game road loss to the Miami Dolphins on Jan. 6, 1985.
- Pittsburgh has faced 22 different teams in the postseason and has a winning record against 12 of those opponents. The Steelers have split their postseason contests with three teams and have a losing record versus seven teams.

The Steelers faced the Miami Dolphins and Kansas City Chiefs for a second time in 2016, when they defeated Miami 30-12 in the AFC Wild Card game and the Chiefs 18-16 in the Divisional Playoff Game. Pittsburgh will meet the New England Patriots for the second time this season on Sunday, Jan. 22 in the AFC Championship.

The Steelers would chip away, getting 10 points prior to halftime. **QB Landry Jones** threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to **WR Darrius Heyward-Bey**, and **K Chris Boswell** made a 32-yard field goal. New England led 14-10 at the break.

Boswell's 46-yard field goal midway through the third quarter got the Steelers within one point, but it would be the closest Pittsburgh would get the remainder of the game.

Brady threw a 36-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski to make it 20-13 midway through the third quarter. Boswell connected on a 44-yard field goal to cut the lead to 20-16 early in the fourth quarter.

But on the Patriots' next drive, Blount scored the game-sealing touchdown.

Mike Tomlin, the 10th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 30-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 14-8 on Sunday Night Football and 6-6 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victrory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

His 103 wins in his first 10 seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach in his first 10 campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances are second-most for the franchise for a coach in his first 10 seasons.

Tomlin's seven postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first 10 seasons with the Steelers and his five division titles are third-most.

TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 10 wins in his 10th season:

 He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (Patriots), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 90th regular-season victrory in Week 14 of 2015 at Cincinnati and closed out his ninth season with 92 wins following the team's Week 17 victory at Cleveland.

His 92 wins in his first nine seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first nine campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first nine seasons.

QB Ben Roethlisberger registered 3,819 passing yards in 2016, completing 328-of-509 passes with 29 touchdowns and 13 interceptions for a passer rating of 95.4 His 3,819 passing yards rank as the sixth-most of his NFL career and on the Steelers' single-season yardage chart, while his 29 touchdown passes are third-best behind his single-season franchise record of 32 (2007 and 2014).

Roethlisberger threw for 300 yards on 27 completions and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 112.4 in the team's Week One 38-16 win on Monday Night Football at Washington. The win gave him his 50th career road win as a starter and he joined Tom Brady (75) and Drew Brees (57) as the only active quarterbacks with at least 50 road wins.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Roethlisberger notched his fifth career regular-season game with at least five touchdown passes - becoming the sixth player in NFL history to accomplish the feat - completing 22-of-27 passes for 300 yards for a passer rating of 152.5.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns while completing 34-of-47 attempts for 380 yards for a passer rating of 124.4 in Week Five vs. New York at Heinz field.

In Week 10's game, Roethlisberger threw for 408 yards - his ninth career 400-yard game - while completing 37-of-46 passes with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 125.4. During the game, he reached the 45,000 yardage marker, in his 179th career game, the fifth-fewest to the milestone, and surpasses Warren Moon (290) for the 10th-most touchdown passes in NFL history.

Roethlisberger completed 14-of-20 passes for 221 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 146.0 in Week 12's 28-7 win at Indianapolis.

He led the Steelers to a fourth guarter comeback for the 35th time in his regular-season career against Baltimore on Christmas Day (31-27) to secure the team an AFC North title, completing 24-of-33 passes for 279 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions for a passer rating of 103.0.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranked third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (67-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

It was the fourth start of his NFL career, completing 24-of-37 passes for 277 yards with three touchdowns and an interception for a passer rating of 103.1. His three scoring strikes set a single-game high.

Jones made his first start of 2016 in Week Seven against New England, finishing 29-of-47 for 281 yards with one touchdown and one interception, in Week Seven against New England. He established single-game career highs in completions (29), attempts (47) and passing yards (281), and set a career high for passing yards in any half of a game with 179 in the opening half, surpassing his previous mark of 168 (Oct. 18, 2015 vs. Arizona, second half).

Bell totaled a game-high 137 scrimmage yards to go along with two touchdowns, his sixth career multi-touchdown game, in the team's AFC North division clinching 31-27 win vs. Baltimore in Week 16.

Bell rushed for a single-game Steelers record 236 yards in Week 14 at Buffalo while tying a team record with three rushing touchdowns and his 298 scrimmage yards marked the secondmost in team history.

He set a team record for the most 200-scrimmage yard games with his fourth in Week 11 at Cleveland, racking up 201 yards (146 rushing / 55 receiving) and adding a one-yard touchdown run.

Bell returned to the playing field in Week Four on Sunday Night Football against Kansas City and totaled up a game-high 144 rushing yards on 18 carries, to go along with 34 receiving yards on five catches, for a total of 178 scrimmage yards.

Bell totaled a game-high 154 yards from scrimmage (66 rushing and 88 receiving) in Week Five vs. New York.

Bell has eclipsed 200 yards from scrimmage five times in his career, most recently in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo.

His five 200-yard scrimmage games are the most in Steelers history, as he broke a tie with Willie Parker (three), and are the most in the NFL since he entered the League in 2013.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Steelers' defense got a splash play early in the second quarter. **DE Ricardo Mathews** applied pressure on QB Dan Orlovsky, and his ensuing throw was picked off by **CB Doran Grant**, who returned the interception 39 yards for a touchdown. Detroit K Matt Prater connected on a 29-yard field goal on the Lions' next possession for the team's first points of the game.

Pittsburgh responded on its next drive when **QB Landry Jones** threw a 29-yard touchdown to **WR Darrius Heyward-Bey** to give Pittsburgh a 14-3 advantage. Detroit cut the lead to 14-10 on its next possession when Orlovsky threw a 28-yard touchdown to WR Andre Roberts. Prater made a 31-yard field goal prior to halftime, and the Steelers held a 14-13 lead at the break.

Detroit K Devon Bell connected on a 42-yard field goal midway through the third quarter to give the Lions a 16-14 advantage. Steelers **K Chris Boswell** responded with a 37-yard field goal later in the quarter to give Pittsburgh a 17-16 lead.

Pittsburgh 30, Miami 12 January 8, 2017 Heinz Field (62,726)



PITTSBURGH - RB Le'Veon Bell recorded 167 rushing yards, helping lift the Steelers to a 30-12 victory over the Miami Dolphins in the AFC Wild Card Game.

Pittsburgh raced to an early lead thanks to two touchdown passes from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to **WR Antonio Brown**. The two connected on a 50-yard score and then on a 62-yard score to give the Steelers a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. K Dustin Franks got the Dolphins on the board late in the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter, Bell scored on a one-yard run to give Pittsburgh a 20-3 lead. Franks made a 47-yard field goal late in the second quarter, and the Steelers led 20-6 at the break.

The Steelers scored 10 points in the third quarter to seal the victory. **K Chris Boswell** made a 34-yard field goal, and Bell scored his second rushing touchdown of the game to make it 30-6. Miami got a late touchdown on QB Mat Moore's four-yard touchdown to RB Damien Williams.

Pittsburgh's defense forced three turnovers and recorded 5.0 sacks, which are tied for the most sacks in team history in a single game since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

KANSAS CITY - K Chris Boswell made an NFL singlegame postseason record six field goals, and **RB Le'Veon Bell** set the team's single postseason game rushing record, recording 170 yards, as they helped lift the Steelers to an 18-16 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs at Arrowhead Stadium.

Boswell's 22-yard field goal gave Pittsburgh the early 3-0 lead. Kansas City took its only lead of the game on QB Alex Smith's five yard touchdown pass to WR Albert Wilson.

Boswell made three field goals, 38 yards, 36 yards and 45 yards, to give Pittsburgh a 12-7 lead at halftime. Boswell's 43-yard field goal early in the third quarter increased Pittsburgh's lead to 15-7.

K Cairo Santos connected on a 43-yard field goal late in the third quarter to cut the Steelers' lead to 15-10. Boswell's final field goal of the game gave the Steelers an eight-point advantage, 18-10, early in the fourth quarter.

With less than three minutes remaining in the game, Chiefs' RB Spencer Ware scored on a one-yard run. Pittsburgh's defense stopped the Chiefs' two point try.

QB Ben Roethlisberger's first-down completion to **WR Antonio Brown** after the two-minute warning, sealed the victory for Pittsburgh.
