**THE MATCHUP**

After a 30-27 loss at the Baltimore Ravens on Thursday night at M&T Bank Stadium, the New Orleans Saints (0-1) will host the New England Patriots (0-1) on Saturday in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome to open their 2015 home pre-season slate.

New Orleans and New England will be familiar with each other by kickoff on Saturday after they are scheduled to participate in joint practices at The Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs, W.V. on Wednesday and Thursday. The two clubs have participated in joint practices in 2010 and 2012 and have faced each other in 10 exhibitions all-time, with New England leading the series, 6-4. The two clubs last met at Gillette Stadium on October 13, 2013 with the Patriots stealing a dramatic come-from-behind 30-27 victory.

New Orleans looks to rebound from Thursday's loss at Baltimore, while New England fell to the Green Bay Packers at home on Thursday.

While the Saints struggled initially against Baltimore, trailing 17-10 early in the second quarter, New Orleans finally got on the scoreboard midway through the period, when WR **Brandin Cooks** caught a pass from WR **Luke McCown** and eluded several defenders for a 28-yard touchdown.

Trailing 20-14 at the start of the third quarter, K **Zach Hocker** drilled 47- and 50-yard field goals to tie the score early in the fourth quarter. Later trailing 23-20 late in the fourth quarter, rookie RB **Marcus Murphy** took a pitch for a three-yard touchdown to help the Saints take a 27-23 lead.

Baltimore barely escaped following a touchdown with two seconds left. The game featured several notable individual performances by numerous Saints looking to earn a roster spot.

Saints signal callers completed 64.1% of their passes altogether on the evening. McCown completed seven-of-10 throws for 75 yards with the scoring pass and a 125.0 passer rating. **Ryan Griffin** executed on 10-of-17 throws for 112 yards, including a 21-yard toss to RB **Khiry Robinson**. Rookie Garrett Grayson in his NFL playing debut, completed eight-of-12 throws.

Six Saints combined for 100 yards on 23 carries combined. **Khiry Robinson** carried twice for 35 yards, in addition to recording three receptions for 37 yards.

In addition to Cooks and Robinson, TE **Josh Hill** paced the passing game with three receptions for a club-high 40 yards, including a 25-yard grab. WR **Willie Snead** also had two catches for 30 yards.

Defensively, LB **Ramon Humber** led New Orleans with eight tackles (six solo) and also added one special teams stop. CBs **Terrence Frederick** and **Damian Swann**, both competing for roster spots in the Saints secondary, each recorded one interception, with the picks leading to 10 points for the club.

There were other bright spots on special teams in addition to Hocker's two long field goals. All six kickoffs by Hocker and K **Dustin Hopkins**, competing for the placekicking spot, sailed into the end zone for touchbacks. Murphy also gave the kickoff return unit a spark, bringing back five kickoffs for 132 yards in the contest.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 80-48 regular season record and a 6-4 post-season mark, guiding the team to the postseason five times, to the NFC Championship game twice and the Super Bowl XLIV Championship. He's the club's lone head coach to open a season with 13 straight victories and post a 13-game winning streak and has the franchise's top winning percentage (.623). Payton's 43-21 (.672) home record and 37-27 (.578) mark away from the Mercedes-Benz Superdome are the club's top winning percentages in both categories. In his first season in 2006, he took the Saints to the NFC Championship game and was named NFL Coach of the Year by most major outlets. The Saints are the only team to finish in the top ten in net yards per game each season since 2006, including finishing first in 2014 for the fifth time during that period. Payton was hired as New Orleans' 14th head coach on Jan. 18, 2006, after serving on the Dallas Cowboys staff from 2003-05. Prior to joining the Cowboys, Payton served on the New York Giants staff from 1999-2002, including the final three seasons as offensive coordinator. His tenure was highlighted by a Super Bowl berth in his first full season as coordinator. Payton's prior NFL coaching experience came as quarterbacks coach for Philadelphia from 1997-98.

New England head coach **Bill Belichick** is in his 16th season as the head coach of the Patriots. He is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowls in four years, and has also delivered six conference titles, 12 divisions crowns and 22 playoff victories to the Patriots while delivering a career coaching record of 233-118. He is in his 41st season as an NFL coach and was hired by New England on January 27, 2000. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the NFL's first 16-0 regular season and is the only head coach in NFL history to win at least 13 regular-season games in five separate seasons. Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record in each of the last 14 seasons, the second longest stretch by a coach with one franchise (Tom Landry, 16 years, Cowboys, 1970-85). In 2014, he guided the Patriots to a 12-4 record, a division title and the Super Bowl XLIX championship.

SERIES HISTORY

New England has dominated the regular season series, 9-4, including a stretch where the Patriots won the first five games between the two clubs. New Orleans posted three-straight victories from 1989-95 – all on the road. The Saints broke a three-game losing streak with a 38-17 win over the Patriots on Monday, November 30, 2009, when they improved their record to 11-0. In the preseason, the Patriots lead the series 6-4.

Assistant Head Coach/Linebackers Joe Vitt - Son, Joey, is an area scout for New Orleans.

Senior Defensive Assistant Dennis Allen - Father, Grady, played for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003.

Defensive Coordinator Rob Ryan - Twin brother, Rex is head coach of the Buffalo Bills, and father, Buddy, was head coach in Philadelphia and Arizona and an assistant on Super Bowl Championship teams with the Jets and Chicago Bears.

Area Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is director of player personnel for the San Diego Chargers.

S Jairus Byrd - Father, Gill, played for the San Diego Chargers from 1983-92 and is a 12-year NFL coaching veteran, currently serving as cornerbacks coach of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers

CB Brian Dixon - Twin brother, Brandon, plays for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

G Mike Golic Jr. - Father, Mike Golic Sr., was an eight-year NFL veteran and uncle, Bob, was a defensive tackle who played 14 years in the NFL.

RB Mark Ingram - Father, Mark Ingram Sr., was a 10-year NFL veteran.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year career with Minnesota, with six Pro Bowl selections.

QB Luke McCown - Brother, Josh, plays QB for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

T Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six seasons in the NFL.

TE Alex Smith - Father, Edwin, played three seasons with the Denver Broncos.

S Vinnie Sunseri - Father, Gus, is currently the defensive line coach for the Oakland Raiders and previously served in the same position for the Carolina Panthers.

WR Nick Toon - Father, Al, played for the New York Jets from 1985-92 and was a three-time Pro Bowl receiver.

PRIME TIME POWER

Since 2006, the Saints have been dominant on prime time, posting a 25-11 record (.694), including a 3-2 mark, the second straight season they posted a winning record playing in front of the nation's TV sets. Since 2009, New Orleans has posted a 20-7 (.741) mark in these games. All-time, they've posted a 40-38 record in prime time.

PAYTON'S PLACE AMONG HEAD COACHES

Sean Payton has the highest winning percentage among the 16 head coaches in Saints history and ranks second in club record books in wins. Among current NFL head coaches since 2006, Payton's .623 winning percentage over that span is second in the NFC and fifth in the NFL.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

Of the 90 players on the current Saints roster, 49 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of the 2014 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes two trades, seven unrestricted free agents, nine veteran free agents, nine draft picks and 14 rookie free agents.

Of the 90 players, 56 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including eight players who are in their first training camp. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 15 years-1, 13 years-1, 11 years-1, 12 years-2, 10 years-4, 9 years-1, 8 years-3, 7 years-7, 6 years-6, 5 years-5, 4 years-3, 3 years-10, 2 years-13, 1 year-10, rookies-22.

HIGHER EDUCATION

65 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 90-man roster. Of that total, 18 are represented by multiple Saints, five from the University of Georgia, three from Clemson, Oregon State and Stanford and two apiece from the University of Alabama, the University of Arkansas, Florida State, Fresno State, North Texas, Northwestern, Oregon, Purdue, Rutgers, the University of Tennessee, Valdosta State, Virginia Tech, the University of Washington and West Texas A&M.

MY HOMETOWN

Saints players come from 30 different states, Washington D.C. and Germany. Of the 90 currently on the team's season-ending active roster, the state which claims the most members of the team is Texas with 12 (quarterbacks Drew Brees and Luke McCown, long snapper Justin Drescher,

cornerback Terrence Frederick, linebacker David Hawthorne, kicker Dustin Hopkins, tackle Antonio Johnson, guard Cyril Lemon, defensive tackle Ashaad Mabry, running back/return specialist Marcus Murphy, punter Thomas Morstead, fullback Toben Opurum, running back Khiry Robinson and safety Kenny Vaccaro).

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. The Saints had 12 players on their final 2014 53-man roster who moved up to their 53-man roster after being on NFL practice squads, 11 who spent time on the Saints practice roster before being promoted. Below is an overview of players on the training camp roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Running back **Edwin Baker** has played in six career games with two starts for New Orleans and the Cleveland Browns, carrying 44 times for 173 yards with two touchdowns and posting eight receptions for 57 yards. He's also been on the Saints, San Diego Chargers, Denver Broncos and Houston Texans practice squads. Spending the start of the 2015 offseason working at a mortgage originator to obtain management experience, Baker returns to New Orleans in 2015 to compete for a roster spot on offense and special teams.

Tackle **Nick Becton** played at Virginia Tech from 2009-12. After the 2013 NFL Draft he was signed by the San Diego Chargers for whom he alternated between their practice squad and active roster, appearing in one regular season game. After spending the first two months of the 2014 season on the New York Giants practice squad, Becton was signed to the Saints active roster in Week 10 to provide depth at both tackle positions.

Wide Receiver **Brandon Coleman** was signed by New Orleans out of Rutgers following the 2014 NFL Draft. Recording five receptions for 50 yards in the preseason, Coleman spent the majority of the regular season on the practice squad. As a reward for his hard work in both enhancing his body and technique and providing solid looks on the scout team for the club's defense, the 6-foot-6, 225-pound wideout was signed to the active roster for the 2014 regular season finale. Fully recovered from a nagging injury suffered as a redshirt junior in 2013, Coleman has taken advantage of his large frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program to compete for a roster spot in 2015 training camp.

Linebacker **Jerry Franklin's** appeared in 20 NFL contests for the Chicago Bears and Kansas City Chiefs and has recorded one solo tackle and 11 special teams stops. Franklin has also participated on the practice squads of the Carolina Panthers, Dallas Cowboys, Chicago Bears, Kansas City Chiefs and Saints. After being signed to the Saints practice roster at midseason in 2014, he was signed to the active roster for the season finale.

Cornerback **Terrence Frederick** has had tenures on the practice squads of the Saints, Cleveland Browns and the New York Giants. Originally a seventh round draft pick by the Pittsburgh Steelers out of Texas A&M in 2012, he first played in two games for the Giants in 2012 and posted two special teams stops. He was first signed by New Orleans off the Browns practice squad for the 2013 regular season finale and the playoffs and spent most of the 2014 season on the New Orleans practice roster before being elevated to the active roster in Week 12. Frederick started the last three games and recorded 17 tackles (14 solo).

Quarterback **Ryan Griffin** was originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Tulane in 2013. The Green Wave standout was elevated from the practice squad at midseason of his rookie year and served as the club's third quarterback. In the 2014 preseason, Griffin completed 44-of-78 passes (62.3%) for 530 yards with three touchdowns and a 90.3 passer rating. He spent the first 16 weeks on the team's practice squad before being activated for the season finale. In 2015, he is expected to compete for the club's backup signal-caller position behind starter Drew Brees with Luke McCown and Garrett Grayson.

Tackle **Bryce Harris** started his NFL career on the Falcons practice squad for the start of the 2012 season, before being signed to the New Orleans active roster in Week two. In three seasons, he's played in 34 games with two starts at right tackle and two at left tackle. Harris filled in at both left and right tackle in 2014 as the top backup off the bench on the outside behind Terron Armstead and Zach Strief, starting the last two contests at left tackle.

Kicker **Dustin Hopkins**, who departed Florida State as the NCAA's career scoring leader among kickers used a two week stint on the practice squad at the end of the 2014 season. In training camp, he will compete with Zach Hocker for placekicking duties in 2015.

A college teammate of defensive tackle tackle **Lawrence Virgil** at Valdosta State, wide receiver **Seantavius Jones**

was signed by New Orleans after the 2014 NFL Draft. After recording three receptions for 17 yards with a TD in the pre-season, the 6-3, 200-pound wideout snared a spot on the practice squad and was promoted to the active roster in Week 15.

After spending the majority of the 2013 season on the Saints practice squad, fullback **Austin Johnson** handled lead blocking duties for the first seven games of the 2014 campaign and also rushed for 22 yards, caught two passes for 15 yards with one touchdown and added four special teams tackles. Johnson and **Erik Lorig** are competing for lead blocking duties in the 2015 preseason.

Guard/center **Senio Kelemete** participated on the Saints practice squad in 2013 after spending 2012 on the Arizona Cardinals active roster. Through development, the lineman who can play either center, guard or tackle snagged a roster spot with the Saints based on his training camp play and appeared in 10 games in reserve and special teams duty.

Lorig spent two weeks of his rookie season on the Tampa Bay practice squad, after being selected in the seventh round of the 2010 NFL draft out of Stanford, converting from a defensive end, before being elevated to their active roster and serving as their lead blocker from 2010-13. He handled lead blocking duties in 10 games with seven starts in 2014 for the Black and Gold, making three rushes for four yards, nine receptions for 24 yards with one touchdown and blocking for **Mark Ingram** in four 100-yard rushing games.

A 5-9, 165 pound wide receiver, **Jalen Saunders** came to New Orleans from the Seattle practice squad after originally being selected by the New York Jets in the fourth round of the 2014 NFL Draft out of Oklahoma. Vs. Carolina, Dec. 7, he had 30- and 32-yard punt returns, providing a spark to the club's return game. Saunders then opened up the contest vs. Atlanta, Dec. 21 with a 99-yard kickoff return.

Signed as a free agent by New Orleans out of Valdosta State in 2014, Virgil earned a practice squad spot based on his performance in in the preseason, where he recorded a sack. Virgil was elevated to the active roster in Week 13 and provided depth on the interior.

Joining New Orleans as a free agent out of Jacksonville State in 2014, safety **Pierre Warren** posted 10 tackles, an interception, two passes defensed and a special teams stop in the preseason. Following stints on the Saints and Vikings practice squads, Warren was signed to the New Orleans active roster in Week 12 and in his debut vs. Baltimore, Nov. 24, made an immediate impact when he forced a fumble at the Saints one-yard line which he recovered. At Chicago, Dec. 15, Warren posted his first two interceptions. He opened all six games he played in and posted 35 tackles, two picks, four passes defensed, one forced fumble and a recovery, tying for the team lead with three takeaways.

BUCKING THE ODDS

Players whose names are not called in the NFL Draft each spring often face challenging odds in sticking on a team, with every snap or drill in OTAs, minicamps and training camp under evaluation. Yet the final 2014 53-man roster featured 23 undrafted players who bucked the odds, 12 of whom started at least one contest for the Black and Gold, as well as the club's long snapper and placekicker. Undrafted players on the current training camp roster with NFL experience include Becton, CB **Brandon Browner**, S **Rafael Bush**, Coleman, CB **Brian Dixon**, LS **Justin Drescher**, LB **Kasim Edeballi**, LB **Dannell Ellerbe**, Franklin, Griffin, LB **David Hawthorne**, TE **Josh Hill**, LB **Ramon Humber**, Jones, C **Tim Lelito**, RB **Khiry Robinson**, Virgil and Warren.

The 6-4, 221-pound Browner burst on the scene in Seattle in 2011 after four seasons in the Canadian Football League and made six picks, two returned for a touchdown and earned a Pro Bowl berth in his first NFL campaign. Originally signed by Denver undrafted out of Oregon State in 2005, Browner signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason after picking up Super Bowl rings as starter for Seattle and New England in 2013 and 2014 respectively.

Signed as an undrafted free agent by Atlanta in 2010 after a standout career at South Carolina state, Bush was acquired off of waivers from the Denver Broncos at the start of the 2012 season, following stints on both the active rosters and practice squads of the Atlanta Falcons and the Broncos. The Williston, South Carolina native has played in 45 career games with 13 starts and has recorded 132 career tackles (83 solo), one interception, 10 passes defended, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, 23 special teams stops and one special teams fumble recovery. In 2014, Bush appeared in 10 games with seven starts and made a career-high 73 tackles (45 solo), three passes defended and one special teams stop before suffering a season-ending ankle injury which he has fully recovered from.

Signed out of Northwest Missouri State, the speedy Dixon also showed true grit during the 2014 preseason as he beat out several veterans for a roster spot based on a performance where he posted seven tackles (five solo), one interception, two passes defended and one special teams stop, joining Kasim Edeballi as one of only two undrafted rookies in 2014 on the club's opening day active roster. He finished the season tied for third on the Saints special teams units with 12 coverage stops and added eight solo tackles, one pass defended and one forced fumble on defense.

Signed as an undrafted free agent out of the University of

Colorado in 2010 by the Atlanta Falcons and picked up by New Orleans at midseason, Drescher has since flawlessly handled long-snapping duties for 70 consecutive games for the Saints.

A Hamburg, Germany native who started playing football in middle school prior to further developing his skills in prep school in New Hampshire, Edeballi was signed by New Orleans following the 2014 NFL Draft out of Boston College and earned a roster spot after posting six tackles and two sacks in the preseason and then added 18 defensive stops (11 solo), two sacks, one forced fumble and 12 special teams tackles to tie for third on the club. In the club's win against Green Bay, October 26, 2014, Edeballi enjoyed a breakout performance with three solo tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble.

Signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens out of the University of Georgia in 2009, Ellerbe has played on both the interior and the outside for the Ravens and Miami Dolphins, appearing in 62 games with 30 starts, posting career totals of 293 tackles (210 solo), 6.5 sacks, three interceptions, 12 passes defended, three forced fumbles, 18 special teams stops and one coverage forced fumble. Ellerbe was acquired by New Orleans in the offseason from Miami in a trade at the start of the free agency period and will compete to crack the starting lineup either on the inside or outside after missing most of the 2014 campaign with a hip injury.

First signed as an undrafted free agent out of Texas Christian in 2008 by Seattle, Hawthorne has appeared in 100 career games with 78 starts, posting 619 tackles (390 solo), 12 sacks, eight interceptions, 21 passes defended, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. In 2014, despite missing three contests, Hawthorne again ranked among the club's defensive leaders with 112 tackles (65 solo), three sacks, one interception and six passes defended. The most established veteran in the linebacker corps, Hawthorne will again lend his helping hand to the youthful group in 2015.

A 2013 undrafted signing by New Orleans out of Idaho State, Hill has appeared in 30 career games with six starts and posted 20 receptions for 220 yards (11.0 avg.) with six touchdowns and 18 special teams tackles. In 2014, Hill posted 14 grabs for 176 yards (13.4 avg.) with five touchdowns and 15 special teams stops to rank first on the team. In 2015, Hill and Benjamin Watson will combine as a tandem to handle the tight end position. Hill picked up where he left off in 2014 in the 2015 preseason opener at Baltimore, August 13, picking up three receptions for a team-high 40 yards.

First joining Indianapolis in 2009 out of North Dakota State, Humber has appeared in 78 career games with 14 starts and posted 122 tackles (84 solo), 2.5 sacks, three passes defended and a forced fumble, excelling on special teams, where he has posted 66 career stops. Voted one of the club's two special teams captains for 2014, Humber appeared in 15 games with six starts, posting a career-high 51 tackles (42 solo), one pass defended, one sack and 13 special teams stops.

Signed as a free agent out of Grand Valley State in 2013, Lelito secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp and has started two games at right guard while appearing in 32 regular season contests and two playoff games, serving as club's top interior lineman backup at both center and guard. In 2014, he saw extensive action at center in substitute for an injured Jonathan Goodwin, including starting two games, where Ingram had rushed for at least 100 yards in consecutive contests.

Signed out of West Texas A&M, Robinson earned a roster spot in 2013 and ranked third on the club in rushing with 54 carries for 224 yards (4.1 avg.) with one touchdown and in the postseason, added 102 more yards (4.9 avg.) with one touchdown and a 13-yard reception. In 2014, he finished second on the club in rushing with 76 carries for 362 yards (4.8 avg.) with three touchdowns and eight receptions for 63 yards.

RESURGENT RUN GAME

After ranking 25th in the National Football League in rushing in 2013, a renewed emphasis on the run game in 2014 helped New Orleans improve in the league rankings to 13th, averaging 113.6 yards per game while ranking ninth in the league in yards per rush, averaging 4.48 yards per carry, an improvement from 26th in 2013. The rushing attack was led by running back **Mark Ingram**, who carried 226 times for 964 yards (4.3 avg.) with nine touchdowns, ranking 14th in the NFL in rushing and tied for third in rushing touchdowns, earning the first Pro Bowl selection of his four-year NFL career. In 2015, Ingram, who was re-signed to a four-year contract by the Saints, is expected to form a trio with **Khiry Robinson** and unrestricted free agent acquisition **C.J. Spiller**, who was also inked to a four-year deal. Robinson finished second in rushing for New Orleans in 2014, playing in 10 games with three starts and carrying 78 times for 362 yards (4.8 avg.) and three touchdowns. The explosive Spiller, who was a first round pick of the Buffalo Bills in 2010, has played in 70 career games with 36 starts and had rushed 668 times for 3,321 yards (5.0 avg.) with 12 touchdowns, caught 158 passes for 1,195 yards with six touchdowns and has also returned two kickoffs for scores, including a 102-yard runback in 2014.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2015 Saints offensive line:

Right Tackle Zach Strief - This 2006 seventh round pick out of Northwestern has appeared in 125 regular season games with 61 starts and played in 10 postseason contests, four of which he has opened. Re-signed to a five-year contract in 2014, the two-time offensive team captain once again anchored the right side of the offensive line for the NFL's top-ranked offense and opened all 16 contests for the first time in his nine-year NFL career.

Right Guard Jahri Evans - The 2006 fourth round draft choice made a rapid ascent from his small school roots at Bloomsburg into one of the NFL's top interior linemen and the top guard in team history. Evans's been named to six consecutive Pro Bowls since 2009, as well as being named an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro from 2009-12 and a second-team selection in 2013. Overall, Evans has started 142 contests at right guard for New Orleans. He opened up

all 16 contests for the NFL's top-ranked offense in 2014 and was selected to his sixth Pro Bowl.

Center Max Unger - This six-year NFL veteran was acquired by New Orleans in the offseason from the Seattle Seahawks to solidify the middle of the New Orleans offensive line. Originally a second round draft pick of the Seahawks in 2009, Unger has opened all 67 games he has played in for one of the National Football League's most physical and productive running attacks at both center and right guard, earning Pro Bowl selections in 2012 and 2013.

Left Guard Tim Lelito - Signed as an undrafted free agent out of Grand Valley State in 2013, this lineman proved the jump was not too big from Division II to the NFL as he's started two games at right guard and substituted at center in weeks three, five, seven and 14 as a substitute and starting for him in two others, where Pro Bowl running back **Mark Ingram** reached 100 yards rushing both times. In 2015, Lelito will compete for the starting left guard position in training camp, possessing the ability to play at all three interior spots.

Left Tackle Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. Overall, Armstead has opened up 16 regular season games and two postseason contests at left tackle for New Orleans, including the first 14 contests of 2014 for a rushing offense that was ranked ninth in the NFL through Week 15.

Tackle Bryce Harris - Harris started his NFL career on the Atlanta practice squad in 2012, before being signed to the Saints active roster following Week one. In three seasons with New Orleans, he has appeared in 34 regular season games with two starts at right tackle and two at left tackle. Harris saw action at both left tackle and right tackle in 2014, including starting the final two contests on the left side, appearing in all 16 games.

Tackle Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his final season in Palo Alto as a junior, Peat started all 13 games at left tackle for the Cardinal, anchoring the left side of an offensive line ranked 18th nationally in fewest tackles for loss allowed (4.62/game) and 42nd in fewest sacks allowed (1.77/game) as he blocked for a rushing offense that averaged 158.8 yards per game on the ground. Peat, who has started his NFL career at right tackle, was named a first-team All-American by ESPN.com, *The Sporting News* and SI.com and received second-team honors from the *Associated Press*. Peat made his NFL debut at Baltimore on Thursday night, seeing a team-high 51 snaps on the New Orleans offensive line at both tackle positions.

DEFENSIVE DRAFT

With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of these six players:

LB Stephone Anthony, Clemson (1b, 31) - Anthony was one of the nation's most productive defenders over the past two seasons with 221 tackles, 6.5 sacks, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

LB Hau'Oli Kikaha, Washington (2, 44) - Kikaha was the nation's leader with 19 sacks as a senior in 2014.

CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (3b, 78) - Williams was one of the nation's top corners, finishing his college career with 123 stops, four interceptions and 18 passes defended.

LB Davis Tull, Chattanooga (5a, 148) - Three-time Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year recorded 37 career sacks.

DT Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (5b, 154) - Played in 53 career games at Fresno State and made 28.5 stops for a loss and 14.5 sacks.

CB Damian Swann, Georgia (5c, 167) - This four-year letterman played in 50 games with 40 starts for the Bulldogs and made 180 stops, eight interceptions, 21 passes defended, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Made an interception in preseason opener at Baltimore.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Under the guidance of Special Teams Coordinator **Greg McMahon**, entering his 10th season on the New Orleans coaching staff and his eighth as coordinator in 2015, the Saints were once again among league leaders in several statistical categories in 2014.
- New Orleans was ranked first in the National Football League in opponent punt return average (4.1) in 2014 while facing several of the league's top returners on their schedule. Leading the way on the club's kickoff and punt coverage units was TE **Josh Hill** who led the Saints with 15 special teams tackles. Special teams captain LB **Ramon Hubbard** was also a significant contributor to this group with 13 special teams stops.
- P **Thomas Morstead**, another weapon in the field position game for New Orleans was ranked second in the NFL in net punting average (42.9).
- Rookie WR **Jalen Saunders** injected life into the club's kickoff and punt return games in 2014. The return specialist who was originally a fourth round draft pick of the New York Jets was signed to the New Orleans active roster off the Seattle practice squad in Week 12. Vs. Atlanta, Dec. 21, on the game's opening kickoff and his first career kickoff return, Saunders brought it back 99-yards for the longest non-touchdown kickoff return in franchise history. Vs. Carolina, Dec. 7, Saunders returned three punts for 68 yards, including a 32-yard runback that was the longest by a Saints returner since 2012. In 2015, Saunders, WR **Brandin Cooks**, RB/RS **Marcus Murphy** and RB **C.J. Spiller** will all compete in the preseason to handle kickoff and punt return duties for the Saints.
- In 2014, Brees once again enjoyed another standout season as the Saints' signal-caller, as he has completed 456-of-659 passes (69.2%) for 4,952 yards, 33 touchdown passes, 17 interceptions and a 97.0 passer rating. He finished the season ranked first in the National Football League in both completions and attempts, tied for first in passing yardage, ranked second in completion percentage, tied for fifth in touchdown passes and ranked sixth in passer rating.
- Few players in the modern day free agency era have made the impact that Brees has on the Saints, who is considered one of the most productive free agent signings in league history. Since 2006, he leads the National Football League with 43,685 passing yards, 316 touchdown passes, 5,649 attempts, 3,812 completions, a 67.5% completion percentage, 80 games with at least 300 yards passing, 11 with at least 400 yards passing, 331 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at fourth in the league with a 98.8 rating.
- Brees has been selected to play in a club-record eight Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints including 2014, with nine overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, twice as the conference's starting signal-caller. Brees is the only Saints quarterback to be selected to the All-Star game more than twice. His seven consecutive selections as a member of the Saints is tied for first in club record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle **William Roaf**
- Brees has posted an 87-56 regular season record in contests he's started since signing with the Saints in 2006. Including his six playoff victories, he's recorded 93 total wins in a Saints uniform, making him the winningest quarterback in franchise history. Overall, Brees' win total as a member of the Saints ranks fourth among National Football League signal-callers since first arriving in New Orleans in 2006.

- Since first signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from San Diego, Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards in his first nine seasons with the club, became the only quarterback to throw for 5,000 yards in four different seasons, set the league single-season yardage record in 2011 (broken by Peyton Manning in 2013) and ranked at or near the top in every passing category, both in single-seasons and over the nine-year period as a member of the Saints, breaking nearly every club record.
- In his 14-year National Football League career where he's appeared in 202 games, the last nine seasons which have taken place with the Saints, Brees has completed 4,937-of-7,458 passes (66.2%) for 56,033 yards, 396 touchdown throws and a 95.4 passer rating. He's the National Football League's all-time most accurate passer, is ranked fourth in completions, yardage and touchdown passes and seventh in rating.

Brees is only the second player in National Football League history to throw for 4,000 yards in nine straight seasons.

11 – The number of regular season contests where Brees has thrown for 400 yards, third all-time in National Football League records.

13 – The number of rushing touchdowns in Brees' career. With 13 300-yard passing games in 2011, Brees set the NFL single-season record, surpassing the one he previously tied with 10 in 2008.

18 – Franchise-record NFC Player of the Week awards won by Brees as a Saint and the most Conference Player of the Week honors since 2006. Overall including his tenure in San Diego, his 20 conference Player of the Week awards rank third all-time behind Peyton Manning (27) and

Brady (24).

25 – Number of successful drives in the fourth quarter or overtime engineered by Brees for a touchdown or field goal to lead the Saints to victory since joining the club in 2006, the NFL's fourth-highest total over this period.

Including his five-year tenure with San Diego from 2001-05, Brees has a total of 34 career regular season game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or overtime to his credit.

C.J. SPILLER

• In the 2015 offseason, C.J. Spiller was signed as an unrestricted free agent by New Orleans in Buffalo to share touches with Mark Ingram and Khiry Robinson. In 70 career games with 36 starts after being selected by the Bills with the ninth overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft, Spiller has carried 668 times for 3,321 yards (5.0 avg.) with 12 touchdowns and has added 158 receptions for 1,195 yards with six touchdowns. He's also brought back two kickoffs for touchdowns. He departed Buffalo as the club's all-time yards per carry leader. In 2014, Spiller played in nine games with five starts in a season interrupted by a collarbone injury and carried 78 times for 300 yards, recorded 19 receptions for 125 yards (8.1 avg.) and one touchdown and also brought back 10 kickoffs for 306 yards (30.6 avg.) with one touchdown.

MARK INGRAM

• A hard-nosed runner who punishes opposing defenses with a combination of power and speed, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner was chosen with a first round pick in 2011. Ingram's been an integral part of the rushing attack, leading the club in rushing twice. In his first full season as the club's featured back in 2014, he appeared in 13 games and carried 226 times for 964 yards (4.3 avg.) with nine touchdowns, setting career-highs in rushing yardage and rushing touchdowns. Ingram also added a career-high 29 receptions for 145 yards. Ingram was the first Saints running back to be selected to the Pro Bowl since 2003 (Deuce McAllister). He finished 14th in the NFL in rushing despite missing three games, tied for third in rushing TDs and ranked 31st with a career-high and team best 1,109 total

yards from scrimmage. Ingram's 74.2 rushing yards per game ranked seventh in the league. He also became the first Saint to have four 100-yard rushing games in a single season since McAllister in 2006.

• The former undrafted free agent followed up on a promising rookie season to rank second on the Saints in rushing with 76 carries for 362 yards (4.8 avg.) and three TDs.

BRANDIN COOKS

- The club's first round draft pick in 2014 out of Oregon State, Cooks has utilized athleticism, work ethic and character to make an impact in the Saints receiving corps. Cooks got off to an impressive start in his rookie season before suffering a season-ending thumb injury. He appeared in 10 games with seven starts and finished fourth on the team in receiving with 53 receptions for 550 yards with two touchdowns and also carried seven times for 73 yards with one touchdown.

NICK TOON

- The club's fourth round draft pick in 2012, the 6-4, 218-pound Toon continued to develop in 2014, as he set career-highs, appearing in eight games with two starts and posting 17 catches for 215 yards with one touchdown. Toon will compete for more extensive time in the club's receiver rotation in 2015.

TIGHT ENDS

BENJAMIN WATSON

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from the Cleveland Browns in 2013, Watson forms a strong combination at the tight end position with Josh Hill. The former University of Georgia standout, and 11-year NFL veteran who originally entered the NFL as a first round draft pick of the New England Patriots in 2004 has career totals of 360 receptions for 4,138 yards (11.5 avg.) with 32 touchdowns in 147 games with 104 starts.

- Watson appeared in all 16 games with nine starts in 2014, posting 20 receptions for 136 yards with two touchdowns, while also serving as an asset in the blocking game for a rushing offense that improved from 25th to 13th in the league rankings.

JOSH HILL

- Signed as an undrafted free agent from Idaho State following the 2013 NFL Draft, Hill's combination of hands, speed and special teams acumen secured him a roster spot where he appeared in 14 games with three starts, recording six grabs for 44 yards and one touchdown as a rookie.

- Hill's development as both a pass-catcher, blocker and in the kicking game continued in 2014, as he posted 14 receptions for 176 yards (12.6 avg.) with five touchdowns to

rank second on the club. He also finished first on the team with 15 special teams tackles on the club's coverage units.

DEFENSIVE ENDS

CAMERON JORDAN

- New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California came to the Saints after a productive college career where he was one of the nation's elite pass rushers. In 2014, Jordan started all 16 games and posted totals of 65 tackles (38 solo), 7.5 sacks, one interception, one fumble recovery and five passes defensed.

- Jordan has posted 29 sacks since he entered the NFL in 2011 and over the past three seasons is only one of three players to have 25 takedowns and 10 passes defensed. During this time, the Saints own a 17-5 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 5-0 mark when he tallies two or more sacks (career-high is three vs. Philadelphia on 11/5/12).

AKIEM HICKS

• Possessing the size and strength to handle double teams, the 6-5, 324-pound Hicks was the club's top draft pick in 2012. In 2014, his second season after transitioning from tackle to end, he ranked second on the defensive line with 58 stops (36 solo), two sacks and two passes defended.

PARYS HARALSON

• A student of the game, Haralson has played 3-4 line-backer his entire NFL career, joining New Orleans late in the 2013 preseason from San Francisco. A fifth-round draft pick of the 49ers in 2006, He entered the starting lineup in 2007 and has posted 28 sacks, including three in 2014.

• Haralson's dual ability to stop the run and rush the passer was once again an asset in 2014. Appearing in all 16 games with 12 starts in 2014, Haralson recorded 50 tackles (23 solo), three sacks to tie for third on the club, and one fumble recovery.

ANTHONY SPENCER

• An eight-year NFL veteran who was originally a first round draft pick of the Dallas Cowboys in 2007, Spencer has played in 104 career games with Dallas and posted 497 tackles (317 solo), 33 sacks, 17 passes defended, 12 forced fumbles and six fumble recoveries. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2015 offseason, Spencer continued his recovery from a knee injury suffered in 2013 and posted 25 stops (16 solo), 0.5 sack, one pass defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery and then added another sack and forced fumble in the postseason. He will compete for snaps in New Orleans' defensive line rotation.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

JOHN JENKINS

• With Jenkins' imposing size, tremendous strength and the ability to take on multiple blockers, he combines with fellow defensive tackle Kevin Williams to anchor the middle of the defensive line. In 2014, moving into the starting lineup following a season-ending injury to Brodrick Bunkley, he added 41 stops (24 solo) with one sack in 12 games, coming off of posting a total of 16 tackles in his last two contests that he played in

KEVIN WILLIAMS

• Originally a first round (ninth overall) selection in the 2003 NFL Draft by Minnesota, Williams joins the Saints as an unrestricted free agent following a one-year stint with Seattle. The 12-year veteran has appeared in 187 games with 179 starts and has posted career totals of 495 tackles (353 solo), 63 sacks, five interceptions, two returned for touchdowns, 68 passes defended, eight forced fumbles and 13 fumble recoveries. Williams has been selected to the Pro Bowl six times, is a five-time AP first-team All-Pro selection and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame Selection Committee's 2000s All-Decade team.

• Williams' impact with the Seahawks in 2014 was not done justice by his 29 tackles (17 solo), three sacks and two passes defended, as he played a key role in the interior of Seattle's defense in 2014, which was ranked first in the NFL and third against the run, after moving into the starting lineup at midseason.

LINEBACKERS

DAVID HAWTHORNE

- The seven-year NFL veteran emerged from being an undrafted special teams contributor into being the club's top tackler his final three seasons with Seattle, recording 100 or more stops three straight times. For the past three seasons, the former Texas Christian standout has brought that skillset to New Orleans, possessing the versatility to play both on the inside and outside. Hawthorne has played in 100 career games with 78 starts and totaled 608 tackles (386 solo), 12 sacks, eight interceptions, one for a touch-down, 21 passes defensed, five forced fumbles, three recoveries and 19 special teams stops.

- Despite missing four contests with ankle, knee and hand injuries in 2014, Hawthorne finished with 112 tackles (65 solo), one interception, three sacks and six passes defensed, while adding one special teams stop, reaching 100 -stop totals for the fifth time in his career and his second consecutive season as a Saint and second overall in the Black and Gold.

RAMON HUMBER

- Starting his National Football League career with the Indianapolis Colts as an undrafted free agent in 2009 and facing the Saints in Super Bowl XLIV, Humber joined New Orleans late in the 2010 season and has been both a special teams standout and a significant contributor on defense. Voted by his teammates as a special teams captain in 2014, the North Dakota State standout has appeared in 78 games with 14 starts, tallying 122 tackles (84 solo), 2.5 sacks, three passes defensed, a forced fumble and 66 special teams stops.

- In 2014, Humber was voted by his teammates as one of the club's two special teams captains for the first time and played in 15 contests with six starts and posted a career-high 51 tackles (42 solo), one sack, one pass defensed and 13 special teams stops, which ranked second on the club.

STEPHONE ANTHONY

- An athletic, rugged, powerful linebacker with size to fill holes and speed to chase ball-carriers, Anthony was one of the nation's most productive defenders over the past two seasons for one of the nation's elite defenses at Clemson, recording 221 tackles, 6.5 sacks, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. New Orleans' sec-

ond first round draft pick in 2015 (31st overall), in 52 career games with the Tigers, Anthony started 35 contests and recorded 330 tackles (210 solo), 9.5 sacks, three interceptions, 13 passes defensed, five forced fumbles and a fumble recovery

- As a senior in 2014, Anthony was an All-Atlantic Coast Conference first-team pick, leading the team with 90 stops (61 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception, four passes defensed and two forced fumbles. The stout run stopper will now compete for a starting spot on the interior of New Orleans' defense.

DANNELL ELLERBE

- Acquired in an offseason trade from the Miami Dolphins, this six-year National Football League veteran has played both on the inside and the outside in 3-4 and 4-3 defenses and possesses the speed to pursue on the outside and the size to stop the run on the interior. With both the Dolphins and Baltimore Ravens, he's appeared in 62 career regular-season contests with 30 starts and has posted 293 tackles (210 solo), 6.5 sacks, three interceptions, 12 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries, 18 special teams stops and one coverage forced fumble. The former University of Georgia standout will first work into the New Orleans defense on the outside.

KASIM EDEBALI

- This native of Hamburg, Germany did not pick up football until middle school, however he quickly made an impact on the New Orleans defense and special teams units. Signed by the Black and Gold as an undrafted free agent out of Boston College, Edebali made the club's 53-man roster out of training camp, played in all 16 games and posted 18 tackles (11 solo), two sacks, one forced fumble and 12 special teams stops.

HAU'OLI KIKAHA

- The nation's leader with 19 sacks in 2014 and the University of Washington's all-time leader with 36 career quarterback takedowns, Hau'oli Kikaha was just the fifth unanimous All-American in Huskies history and a finalist for five preseason awards. He played in 44 games at UW and in addition to his sack total added 206 tackles (140 solo), 51.5 tackles for loss, six passes defensed, seven forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Playing at both defensive end and linebacker, Kikaha's pass rush abilities and versatility will serve him well as he competes for significant snaps with several other players in training camp and the preseason games in 2015.

CORNERBACKS

KEENAN LEWIS

- Signed as a free agent from Pittsburgh, this New Orleans native returned home to join the Saints secondary in 2013. Over his six-year career, Lewis has appeared in 77 games with 49 starts, registering 188 tackles (156 solo), seven interceptions, 56 passes defended and one forced fumble.
- In 2014, Lewis posted 37 stops (29 solo), two interceptions to tie for the team lead and 13 passes defended to lead the team, as the only member of the Saints secondary to appear in all 16 games each of the last two seasons.

BRANDON BROWNER

- A member of two consecutive Super Bowl championship clubs (Seattle, 2013; New England, 2014), this tall, physical cornerback was added to the New Orleans secondary as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason to enhance competition. One of only five defensive players to ever emerge from the Canadian Football League and earn Pro Bowl status in the NFL, the six-foot-four, 221-pound defender has started all 45 regular season games he's appeared in and has registered career totals of 143 tackles (126 solo), 11 interception returns for 340 yards with two touchdowns, 46 passes defended, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.
- In 2014, Browner started all nine games he appeared in for the Super Bowl XLIX Champion Patriots in the regular season and posted 26 tackles (22 solo), one interception and six passes defended, adding seven stops (six solo) and one pass defended in the postseason run.

CANADIAN IMPORT

In 2011, Brandon Browner became just the fifth defensive player to emerge from the CFL to earn Pro Bowl status.

TERRENCE FREDERICK

- Frederick has had tenures on the practice squads of the Saints, Cleveland Browns and the New York Giants. Originally a seventh round draft pick by the Pittsburgh Steelers out of Texas A&M in 2012, he first played in the first two contests of his NFL career for the Giants in 2012 and posted two special teams stops. He was first signed by New Orleans off the Browns practice squad for the 2013 regular season finale and the playoffs and spent most of 2014 on the New Orleans practice roster before being elevated to the active roster in Week 12. Frederick started the last three games at cornerback and recorded 17 tackles (14 solo). In the 2015 preseason opener at Baltimore, Frederick recorded a fourth quarter interception.

DELVIN BREAUX

- Over eight years after suffering a serious neck injury in a high school football game for McDonogh 35, Breaux realized his dream when he signed a contract with his hometown team following a journey that took him through a minor football league, the Arena Football League and the Canadian Football League. The New Orleans native will compete for a roster spot after spending the past two seasons with the CFL's Hamilton Tiger-Cats, where he posted 62 tackles, one sack, an interception returned for a touchdown, 10 passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery, adding another pick in the 2014 Grey Cup. In 2014, he was a CFL All-Star with 33 stops, a career pick brought back for a TD, five passes defended and three forced fumbles.

STANLEY JEAN-BAPTISTE

- The club's second round draft pick out of Nebraska in 2014, Stanley Jean-Baptiste is a physical cornerback who aggressively battles wide receivers and tight ends, excels in run support and possesses solid ball skills. The 6-foot-three, 218-pound defender emerged as one of the top cornerbacks in the country as a senior in 2013, his third season playing the position, where he was a second-team All-Big Ten selection, posting 41 tackles (27 solo), one sack, four interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown and 12 passes defended.

- Jean-Baptiste spent most of his rookie campaign becoming integrated to the defensive system with the Saints, seeing action in four contests and recording one special teams tackle. He is expected to make a strong push for playing time in 2015, particularly in multiple defensive packages after making a strong showing early in training camp.

SAFETIES

KENNY VACCARO

• A first-team All-American selection at the University of Texas and one of the top-rated defensive backs in the 2013 NFL Draft, the club's first-round pick is a versatile defender who immediately became an asset on defense. A PFWA All-Rookie selection, who posted 93 tackles in 2013, the hard-hitting Vaccaro appeared in 15 contests with 14 starts in 2014 and led the New Orleans secondary with a career-high 113 tackles (63 solo), one sack, one interception and five passes defensed.

JAIRUS BYRD

• Byrd's a seventh-year safety from Oregon, who New Orleans signed as a free agent from the Buffalo Bills and has made an impact in the secondary. A second round draft pick (42nd overall) in 2009, Byrd became a starter at free safety as a rookie in week four and made an immediate impact, as he was named as a consensus All-Rookie selection who was named to the Pro Bowl, tying for the National Football League lead with a club rookie-record nine interceptions. Byrd has been selected to a total of three Pro Bowls and has appeared in 77 career games with 70 starts and has posted career totals of 381 tackles (277 solo), three sacks, 22 interceptions, 35 passes defensed, 12 forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries. His interception total since 2009 is ranked tied for fifth in the National Football League despite missing 12 games in 2014.

PLAYMAKER

New Orleans Saints safety Jairus Byrd's 22 interceptions since entering the National Football League in 2009, are still tied for fifth in the league over that period despite missing the last 12 games of the 2014 season with a knee injury that required surgery.

PIERRE WARREN

• Originally coming to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Jacksonville State, Warren posted 10 tackles, one interception, two passes defensed and a special teams stop in the preseason. Following stints on the Saints and Vikings practice squads, Warren was signed to the New Orleans roster in Week 12. He started all five games he played in and posted 35 tackles (24 solo), two interceptions, four passes defensed and one fumble recovery to tie for the club lead with three takeaways.

RAFAEL BUSH

• After first being claimed off of waivers by New Orleans from Denver at the conclusion of the 2012 preseason, this fourth-year safety immediately became a constant on the club's special teams units, while moving into more defensive packages. Featured in the club's three-safety packages initially in 2014 and elevated to the starting free safety position following a season-ending knee injury to Byrd before he suffered a season-ending ankle injury, Bush posted 73 tackles (45 solo), three passes defensed and one special teams stop in 2014.

VINNIE SUNSERI

• A fifth round draft pick of New Orleans in 2014 from Alabama, Sunseri played in nine games and posted one defensive stop and six special teams tackles before suffering a season-ending arm injury. In 2015, he's expected to contribute on both defense and special teams for the Saints.

KENNY PHILLIPS

• A first-round draft pick of the New York Giants in 2008, Phillips is a five-year NFL veteran who has played in 56 career games with 41 starts and has posted 265 tackles (191 solo), eight interceptions, 28 passes defensed, one forced fumble and three fumble recoveries. After spending the past two seasons out of football recovering from injuries, a spry Phillips has not missed a practice in attempting a courageous comeback.

JAMARCA SANFORD

• A six-year NFL veteran, Sanford's been a significant contributor on defense and special teams since coming into the league in 2009 as a seventh round draft pick of Minnesota. In 79 games with 46 starts, the former Mississippi standout has posted 313 tackles, a sack, two interceptions 15 passes defensed, eight forced fumbles, six recoveries and 48 special teams stops. In six games for the Saints in 2014, he made 15 stops and two special teams tackles.

P THOMAS MORSTEAD

• Morstead, the club's fifth round draft pick in 2009, was among the nation's top punters at Southern Methodist University and has continued that trend in his five seasons in a Saints uniform where he's posted a career club-best 47.0 gross and 41.0 net punting averages. In addition to being a weapon in the field position game as a punter, Morstead is also a threat to pin teams back on kickoffs. In six seasons, 242 of his 510 kickoffs have sailed into the end zone for touchbacks.

• In 2014, Morstead posted a 46.1 gross punting average and a 42.9 net average, ranked first in the NFC and second in the NFL, eighth all-time. A testament to his punting and the coverage units, opponents have only managed an average of 4.1 yards per return, the lowest total in the NFL. 40 of his 81 kickoffs went into the end zone for touchbacks.

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- With the 30-27 defeat to the Ravens, the Saints lost their preseason opener for the first time since a 27-24 loss at the New England Patriots on August 12, 2010. Their next preseason contest is on Saturday, August 22 when they host the New England Patriots at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome following two days of joint practices between the two clubs at the Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs, W.V. The game will be regionally televised through Raycom Media (FOX 8 locally in the New Orleans area) with a 6:30 p.m. kickoff.
- This is only the third time in 10 seasons since **Sean Payton** became head coach in 2006 that the Saints have lost their preseason opener. Payton is now 19-15 in the preseason overall.
- The Saints now have a 0-3 record against the Ravens in the preseason.
- New Orleans gained 366 total net yards, including 100 on the ground.
- New Orleans successfully converted seven of 14 (50 percent) of their third down attempts.
- QB **Drew Brees** did not play and **Luke McCown** started in his place, completing seven of 10 passes for 75 yards and one touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating.
- QB **Ryan Griffin** took over behind center for New Orleans' last drive in the second quarter and completed four of five passes for 61 yards, one touchdown and a 157.1 passer rating to start. Overall, the former Tulane standout completed 10 of 17 passes for 112 yards with one touchdown and a 98.2 passer rating.
- QB **Garrett Grayson** made his NFL debut and completed eight of 12 passes for 87 yards and helped lead the team on a go-ahead scoring drive late in the fourth quarter.
- RB **Mark Ingram** got the start and had four carries for 15 yards.
- **Khiry Robinson** entered the game after Ingram and led the team in rushing with two carries for 35 yards (17.5 avg.) and also added three receptions for 37 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown reception from Griffin. He had both a 29-yard rush and the touchdown reception on New Orleans' final offensive drive of the first half.
- In his first playing action since the 2011 regular season, RB **Tim Hightower** carried 12 times for 31 yards in the second half, including converting a key third quarter third-and-one situation.
- RB **Marcus Murphy**, in his NFL debut, scored on a three-yard pitch play while also fielding five kickoffs for 132 return yards (26.4 avg.).
- WR **Joseph Morgan** had three receptions for 17 yards.
- WR **Brandin Cooks** took a bubble screen 28 yards for a touchdown, and New Orleans' first points, in the second quarter.
- TE **Josh Hill** had three receptions for 40 yards
- LB **Stephone Anthony**, in his NFL playing debut, had six tackles (two solo) to lead the team in the first half.
- LB **Ramon Humber** led the team with eight defensive stops (six solo) and one special teams tackle.

- On the first play of Baltimore's first possession of the second half, also in his NFL playing debut, CB **Damian Swann** intercepted Ravens QB **Matt Schaub**. CB **Terrence Frederick** also made an interception in the fourth quarter against Ravens QB **Bryn Renner**
- After missing a 50-yard field goal attempt, K **Zach Hocker** drilled a subsequent 47-yard attempt in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, he kicked a 50-yard field goal to tie the score at 20-20.
