UPCOMING MILESTONES AND CURRENT NOTES

With the 2015 season underway for the Dallas Cowboys, the following information pertains to the most current notes and page location in the release for the remainder of the information, as well as upcoming milestones:

2015 DALLAS COWBOYS UPCOMING MILESTONES:

Jason Garrett - Head Coach

* With a victory in this week's game, Head Coach Jason Garrett (currently at 43-33) will earn his 44th career regular season win to tie Jimmy Johnson (44) for the second-most regular season head coaching wins in team history (**page 4**).

Mackenzey Bernadeau - G

* By playing against New England (10/11), Mackenzey Bernadeau will be participating in his 100th career game.

Greg Hardy - DE

* By playing against New England (10/11), Greg Hardy will be making his Dallas Cowboys debut.

Nick Hayden - DT

* With a start against New England (10/11), it will be the 50th career start for Nick Hayden.

Terrance Williams - WR

* Terrance Williams (currently at 93) needs seven receptions to reach 100 for his career.

Brandon Weeden - QB

* Brandon Weeden (currently at 28) needs to throw two touchdowns to reach 30 for his career.

Jason Witten - TE

* By starting against New England (10/11), Jason Witten will be making his 136th consecutive start (12/16/06-10/11/15) to break a tie with Bob Lilly (1965-74) and D.D. Lewis (1972-81) for sole possession of the third-longest streak in team history (**page 16**).

* Witten (59) needs two touchdown receptions to pass Jerry Smith (60) for fourth on the league's all-time receiving touchdowns list amongst tight ends.

2015 DALLAS COWBOYS MOST RECENT NOTES - TEAM:

* The Dallas Cowboys rushing attack accumulated 90 rush yards in the first half at New Orleans (10/4) to join the Washington Redskins as the only two teams to post two games with at least 90 rushing yards in the first half of a game this season (**page 21**).

* The Cowboys offense generated two big plays at New Orleans (10/4) on a 45-yard long run by Lance Dunbar in the first quarter and a 67-yard long pass from Brandon Weeden-to-Brice Butler in the third quarter. Collectively, it was only the third time since 1991, the furthest back the stat can be tracked, that the Cowboys have recorded at least a 45-yard rush and a 65-yard reception in the same game (**page 21**).

* The Dallas offense currently ranks sixth in the league with 92 total first downs, while their 55 first downs by pass places eighth (**page 21**).

* The Dallas defense wrangled three sacks at New Orleans (10/4) to mark the first multi-sack game of the 2015 season, and the first game since they harvested three at Washington (12/28/14) (**page 23**).

2015 DALLAS COWBOYS MOST RECENT NOTES - INDIVIDUAL:

Joseph Randle - RB

* Joseph Randle scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season at New Orleans (10/4) and is tied for third in that category amongst all NFL rushers (**page 22**).

* Randle's touchdown marked his second consecutive game with a score - the first time he has scored in back-to-back games in his career (**page 22**).

* In other league rushing categories, Randle is tied for 12th with 59 carries (59) and ranks 15th with 229 rushing yards (**page 22**).

Chris Jones - P

* Chris Jones is currently tied for second in the NFL with nine punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line (**page 24**).

Brandon Weeden - QB

* Brandon Weeden made his 23rd career start - third as a Cowboy - at New Orleans (10/4) and completed 16-of-26 passes for 246 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions. His 16 completions allowed him to surpass 500 career completions and give him 507 for his career (**page 13**).

* Weeden currently has the third-highest fourth quarter quarterback rating in the NFL - second in the NFC - with a 141.9 rating. He has completed 15-of-19 passes (78.9%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions during the final frame (**page 13**).

* In league rankings, Weeden is currently atop the league in completion percentage (76.3), is third in yards-per-pass (9.34) and is sixth in quarterback rating (108.8).

Jason Witten - TE

* Jason Witten is currently tied for 13th in the league with a team-best 25 receptions.

HEAD COACHES

JASON GARRETT (44-34, 5th Year)

Jason Garrett was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011. Garrett became the first former Dallas Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. As a backup quarterback during his playing career in Dallas, he started nine-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowl championships. Garrett guided the 2014 squad to an NFL-best tying 12-4 record, the club's 22nd Division title - 18th NFC East title - 31st postseason appearance and 34th playoff win. Along the way, the team had three players lead the league and establish single-season club records as DeMarco Murray rushed for 1,845 yards, Dez Bryant caught 16 touchdown passes and Tony Romo completed 69.9% of his passes and had a 113.2 quarterback rating. The Dallas offense as a whole was second in the league in rushing yards (2,354), it's highest finish since placing second in 2008. For the season, the Dallas offense totaled 6,138 yards for the second-highest figure in franchise history. The club also had eight players selected to the Pro Bowl, and following the season, Garrett was rewarded for the team's accomplishments with a five-year contract extension.

Garrett was elevated to the Cowboys top job after taking over as the team's interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish the season after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to an 8-8 record, narrowly missing the playoffs and an NFC East Division title in each his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-13). Since the 2007 season, when Garrett was brought on board as the Cowboys offensive coordinator, the unit finished among the NFL's top-10 in total offense in five of his seven years at the helm: 2013 (10th), 2012 (6th), 2010 (10th), 2009 (2nd) and 2007 (2nd). The team has set single-season records in a handful of categories, including topping 6,000 net yards for the first times in franchise history (2009 - 6,390 and 2011 - 6,008). Since his arrival in 2007, not only has the team set single-season records in numerous offensive categories, but the club's cumulative numbers for gross passing yards (33,247) and total points (3,250) represent the best totals over a eight-year span in the history of the organization while the club's 47,615 total net yards are second.

BILL BELICHICK (236-118, 16th Year)

Bill Belichick is in his 41st season as an NFL coach and his 16th season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Hired by Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft on Jan. 27, 2000, Belichick has led the Patriots to 14 consecutive winning seasons (2001-14). The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985). Through 15 seasons with New England, Belichick has delivered four Super Bowl championships, six conference titles, 12 division crowns and 21 playoff victories, while posting an overall record of 196-73. Belichick won his fourth Super Bowl title last season with the Patriots 28-24 victory over Seattle to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most Super Bowl wins by a head coach. He is one-of-five NFL head coaches to win four-or-more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. Belichick is the only one of those five to win three titles in a four-year span with Super Bowl wins in 2001 and back-to-back Super Bowl wins in 2003 and 2004. With the victory over Indianapolis in last season's AFC Championship Game, Belichick collected his 21st career postseason win, the most postseason wins by a head coach. He collected his 22nd postseason win in Super Bowl XLIX. The 2014 AFC Championship was Belichick's sixth conference championship as a head coach, tying him with Don Shula for the most in NFL history. New England's berth in Super Bowl XLIX was Belichick's ninth Super Bowl during his coaching career, the most among any head coach or assistant coach in NFL history. Belichick has recorded 236 career wins, which is fourth all-time in NFL history. He owns a career winning percentage of .664, which is third all-time, behind George Halas (.682) and Don Shula (.667). Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003), XXXIX (2004) and XLIX (2014), and in 2007 he became the first NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season. His 12 division titles are the most among any coach since the 1970 merger. Belichick's recent accomplishments are the latest triumphs in a career during which he has helped produce six Super Bowl titles, nine conference championships and 19 division titles since entering the NFL in 1975.

A WINNING TREND

The Dallas Cowboys entered the 2015 season as one-of-12 teams in the league with at least 475 regular season wins. At the end of Week 16 in 2014, Dallas became just the 12th team with 475 all-time wins with the win against Indianapolis (12/21). Dallas is currently 12th on the NFL's all-time wins list:

WINNING THE OPENING MONTH

Getting off to a strong start is an important part to a successful season. Over the past 10 years, Dallas is one-of-seven teams that has had a winning percentage of at least .600 through the season's first month, and is tied for the third-highest number during that span. Dallas finished the first month of the 2015 season with a record of 2-2.

WINNING HEAD COACH

Dallas Cowboys Head Coach Jason Garrett had his best season as a head coach by wrapping up the 2014 regular season with a record of 12-4 - the fifth coach to reach 12 wins-or-better in a season in team history. He also secured his first NFC East Division title as the head coach. Against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14), Garrett passed former head coaches Bill Parcells and Wade Phillips (both with 34) with his 35th regular season win as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys to place fourth in team history. He passed Barry Switzer (40) for third with his 41st victory at Washington (12/28/14).

After starting 2-2 in 2015, Garrett's current regular season record as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys stands at 43-33, good for third all-time in team history:

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

The Dallas Cowboys are finding a knack to win in close games under Head Coach Jason Garrett. Dallas opened the 2015 season with a comeback win against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), finishing the Giants off with a 27-26 decision.

The Cowboys found ways to finish and win games in 2014, especially the close ones. The team was 4-1 in games decided by seven-or-fewer points and 3-1 in games decided by three-or-fewer points. In 2015 the team is 1-1 in games decided by seven-or-fewer points and 1-0 in games decided by three-or-fewer points. Overall, the team is 25-20 in games decided by seven points-or-less, and 17-13 in games decided by three points-or-less, since Garrett took over the team:

DALLAS LAST GAME

The Dallas Cowboys dropped a closely contested game in overtime on Sunday night, evening their record at 2-2 and halting the longest consecutive road win streak in team history at 10 games. Similar to the previous week's contest, the Cowboys came out of the gates with a ferocity on the ground, gashing the Saints defense for runs of 19 and 45 yards on back-to-back plays on their first drive. The Cowboys offense bogged down in the red zone however, and were forced to settle for a 30-yard Dan Bailey field goal. The Saints then answered quickly, marching down the field on 11 plays capped by a Josh Hill three-yard hookup from Drew Brees. Dallas scored again on its next possession, capitalizing on several key Saints defensive penalties to cash in on a Joseph Randle one-yard dive into the end zone. Dallas finished the first half with 90 rushing yards, tying the Redskins as the only two teams to post two games with at least 90 rushing yards in the first half of a game this season.

The two teams traded field goals in the third quarter, with Dallas utilizing a 67-yard bomb from Brandon Weeden-to-Brice Butler to set up a 38-yard Bailey boot. Combined with the 45-yard rush in the first quarter, it marked only the third occurrence since 1991 that the Cowboys offense had a 45-yard rush and a 65-yard pass in the same game. New Orleans then took the lead on a one-yard Khiry Robinson plunge into the end zone with eight minutes remaining. Following punts by both teams, Weeden and the Cowboys offense got the ball with 4:05 left and a chance to drive 91-yards and tie the game. Weeden seized the opportunity, and completed passes of 24, 28 and 19 yards on the way down the field before the two minute warning. On fourth down with the game on the line, Weeden threw a strike to a diving Terrance Williams in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard score, tying the game. The Saints missed a field goal at the end of regulation before winning the coin toss in overtime and striking for an 80-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Spiller to end the game.

NEW ENGLAND LAST GAME

The New England Patriots were on a bye last week, but in Week 3 earned their third straight win of the 2015 season after a 51-17 rout of the Jacksonville Jaguars. New England opened the game with a 10-0 advantage in the first quarter when Dion Lewis scored on an eight-yard rush and Stephen Gostkowski hit a 46-yard field goal. Jacksonville answered in the second quarter with a 40-yard Jason Myers field goal that cut the lead to 10-3. However, the Patriots fired back with 10 more points behind another Gostkowski field goal (20 yards) and a one-yard passing touchdown from Tom Brady-to-Danny Amendola that pushed the lead back up to 20-3 by halftime.

New England continued to pour on the points in the second half as the lead grew to 30-3 in the third quarter after a 46-yard field goal by Gostkowski and a one-yard LeGarrette Blount rushing touchdown. The Jaguars responded with a 59-yard passing touchdown from Blake Bortles-to-Allen Hurns to make the score 30-10, but the Patriots struck back with a Brady scoring toss to Keshawn Martin from 13 yards out to boost the score back up to 37-10. New England added two more scores in the fourth quarter - both one-yard Blount rushing touchdowns - that increased the lead to 51-17. Jacksonville added one more touchdown late in the fourth quarter as Bortles hit Clay Harbor from six yards out to finish the scoring at 51-17.

PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS VS. PATRIOTS

Dan Bailey - K

In one game (10/16/11), made all three field goals - including a long of 48 - and his lone PAT.

Brandon Carr - CB

In two games - both with Kansas City - has nine tackles.

Matt Cassel - QB

Originally drafted by New England in 2005, and in four seasons completed 349-of-555 passes (62.9%) for 3,946 yards with 23 touchdowns and 13 interceptions. In 15 starts in 2008 as an injury replacement for Tom Brady, was 10-5 as a starter while completing 327-of-516 (63.4%) for 3,693 yards with 21 touchdowns and 11 interceptions. In one game against the Patriots (9/14/14) while with Minnesota, threw for 202 yards on 19-of-36 passes (52.8%) with one touchdown and four interceptions.

Greg Hardy - DE

In one game against New England (11/18/13) while with Carolina, totaled six tackles, a sack and a quarterback pressure.

Sean Lee - LB

In one game at New England (10/16/11), totaled 19 tackles - third-highest of his career - two tackles for loss and a breakup.

Rolando McClain - LB

In one game against New England (10/2/11) while with Oakland, made seven tackles and a pass breakup.

Darren McFadden - RB

In three games - all with Oakland - rushed 44 times for 180 yards (4.1 avg.) with one touchdown. Also caught 11 passes for 122 yards.

Jason Witten - TE

In three games caught eight passes for 101 yards and one touchdown.

RECORD ROAD STREAK ENDS

The Cowboys finished the 2014 regular season with an undefeated 8-0 record on the road - the only squad with a perfect mark away from home in the NFL. The Cowboys eight road wins were the most in team history during the regular season since the NFL began a 16-game schedule. They were the second team in franchise history to win all road games in a season, joining the 1968 team, which won all seven of its road games during a 14-game season. In NFL history, they were the sixth team since the 1970 NFL merger to form a perfect 8-0 record on the road, joining the 2007 New England Patriots, the 2001 St. Louis Rams, the 1984, 1989 and the 1990 San Francisco 49ers.

Dallas continued its road victory streak into 2015, winning the first contest away from home at Philadelphia (9/20) before falling to the Saints at New Orleans (10/4) in overtime, ending the road run. Dating back to the Cowboys final road game of the 2013 season at Washington (12/22), Dallas won 10 consecutive regular season road games to tie a franchise-high with both the 2006-07 and 1968-69 squads for the longest road win streak in team history.

SOLD OUT STADIUMS

The Cowboys have played in front of sold out stadiums in 410 of their last 412 games (including playoffs) and in 212 consecutive games. They played in front of sold out crowds in 153 consecutive games at Texas Stadium (including playoffs) - dating back to Dec. 16, 1990 against Phoenix, their last home non-sellout. Dallas opened what is now named AT&T Stadium with the largest crowd to witness a regular season NFL game with 105,121 tickets distributed and have 52 straight sellouts (including playoffs). The Cowboys have sold out each of their last 204 home games.

On the road, Dallas has played in front of sold out crowds in 106 straight games (including playoffs), dating back to its last road non-sellout - at Arizona (10/20/02).

ROMO AT 30K

Tony Romo climbed to 30,000 passing yards following his 176-yard performance at Tennessee (9/14/14), and now has 33,626 for his career. By reaching 30,000 career passing yards Romo became the second Cowboys quarterback to reach that milestone (Troy Aikman - 32,942), the 38th player in NFL history and only the fifth undrafted player to do so. In his 13th game played of 2014 at Philadelphia (12/14/14), Tony Romo topped 3,000 yards - his seventh career and fourth consecutive - 3,000-yard season - both club-highs.

At the N.Y. Giants (11/23/14), Romo's four scores gave him 22 for the season - his seventh career season with 20-plus touchdown throws. Romo's seven 20-touchdown seasons are a club-high:

ALL-TIME COWBOYS QB WATCH

Tony Romo entered the 2015 season tops in club history with 33,626 passing yards and 245 touchdown passes, and second in attempts (4,255) and completions (2,779). Through his career Romo has steadily climbed the club's all-time quarterback charts, making strides in 2012 by moving into second for completions, then established the club mark in touchdown throws against Philadelphia (12/2/12) to break Aikman's old record of 165. He also moved up the ladder in all-time wins and starts amongst Cowboys quarterbacks, passing Danny White (62) in 2013 to claim the third-most wins as a Dallas quarterback, and passed Roger Staubach (114) for second-most quarterback starts in team history against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14). He overtook Aikman (32,942) as the club's all-time passing yards leader against Indianapolis (12/21/14). Romo closed out the 2014 regular season with a 100.0 rating in each of his last four games. After posting a 103.3 rating against the N.Y. Giants (9/13/15), Romo extended his current streak of consecutive games with a rating of 100.0-or-better to five - the second-longest streak of his career (seven - 2007) - but was unable to repeat the performance at Philadelphia (9/20) to effectively end the streak.

WHAT A RATING

In 2014 he had his first game over 100.0 at St. Louis (9/21) with a 116.8 rating, then had a 137.4 rating the next week against New Orleans (9/28). At Seattle (10/12) Romo finished with a 110.2 rating, then registered his next game against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) with a 135.7 rating. He had his fifth 100.0 rating game of 2014 at Jacksonville (11/9) with a 138.8 rating - the 10th-highest of his career and the 60th of his career. At the N.Y. Giants (11/23) he recorded a then season-high 143.4 rating for the fifth-highest of his career. He posted his seventh game with a 138.0 rating at Chicago (12/4), then racked up a 129.1 rating at Philadelphia (12/14). He posted a career-high rating of 151.7 against Indianapolis (12/21), which also ranked third in team history, for his 64th career 100.0 game. He closed out the regular season with a 100.0 rating at Washington (12/28).

Romo continued his prowess in the fourth quarter with the opening game of the 2015 season against the N.Y. Giants (9/13). In 2012 Tony Romo hit 92 home touchdowns to surpass Danny White (91) for the most in team history. By season's end, he added nine more to total 101. Romo tossed 16 scores at home in 2013 - including a club-record tying five against Denver (10/6) - to give him 117 at the conclusion of the season. In 2014 Romo had one passing touchdown in the season home opener against San Francisco (9/7), three against New Orleans (9/28), two against Houston (10/5), three against the N.Y. Giants (10/19), one against Washington (10/27) and four against Indianapolis (12/21). He began 2015 with three scores at home against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) to up his career franchise-best total to 134 at home:

In 2015, Tony Romo opened the seventh season at what is now AT&T Stadium against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), marking his 42nd game in the stadium since it opened in 2009. ROMO'S ROAD

With his 77-48 record as a starter, Tony Romo has had success when playing on the road. Since being named the club's starter leading into the game at Carolina (10/29/06), Romo holds a 39-24 record away from home.

Romo began his career as a starting quarterback on the road at Carolina (10/29/06) and went on to post an 11-2 road record during his first season and a half at the reins of the Cowboys offense. He was 4-1 in his first season in 2006, then followed that up with a 7-1 record in 2007. In 2008 Romo fought through a finger injury and missed two games to finish 3-3 away from home. He finished 2009 with a 5-3 road record, then in 2010, his season ended three road games in where he was 1-2 before he fractured his left clavicle against the N.Y. Giants (10/25). Romo was 3-5 in 2011, then was 4-4 in 2012. In 2013 he was 3-5. Romo finished 2014 with a perfect 8-0 record and continued it into 2015 as he was victorious at Philadelphia (9/20), but suffered a broken clavicle to his left shoulder and is expected to miss some time:

CONSECUTIVE TD STREAK ENDS

CALL IT A COMEBACK

Since taking over as the Dallas Cowboys starting quarterback during the 2006 season, Tony Romo has been at the helm of some thrilling wins for the club. Included in his 76 wins as a starter are 24 occasions in which he led the team to a come-from-behind victory in the fourth quarter or overtime during the regular season. Romo's 24 wins are a franchise-best, and in 2012 he had three straight games in which he had a come-from-behind win and followed that up with two in 2013.

Romo had three late comebacks in 2014 highlighted by his performance at St. Louis (9/21) as the team battled back from 21 points down to overcome the most points to win a game in a non-overtime game in franchise history. He wasted no time to earn his first comeback win in the fourth quarter or overtime in 2015, coming back from a 10-point deficit in the season opening game against the N.Y. Giants (9/13).

In 2014 Tony Romo completed 304-of-435 passes for a 69.9 completion percentage - highest of his career with at least 10 games played - to lead the NFL. Since 2006 Romo's 65.3 completion percentage is the fourth-highest in the NFL.

He completed at least 60% of his passes in all 15 games played in 2014 - first time of his career - and coupled with the final two games he played in 2013, and the first two games of 2015 against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) and at Philadelphia (9/20), Romo currently owns a career-long streak of 19 consecutive games that he has completed 60-percent-or-better.

Romo had seven games completing 70.0 percent-or-better including in 2014 including the 40th of his career at Jacksonville (11/9) to surpass Troy Aikman (39) for the most in team history. He had his first of 2015 with an 80.0 percent clip against the N.Y. Giants (9/13):

WEEDEN IN RELIEF

Brandon Weeden was signed in free agency by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2014 offseason to be the backup quarterback to Tony Romo. For his career, the former first round draft choice has completed 507-of-884 of his passes for 5,970 yards with 28 touchdowns and 29 interceptions in 31 games with 23 starts.

Weeden made his Cowboys debut against Washington (10/27/14), entering in the third quarter and playing in two series after Romo (back) was injured. He completed four-of-six passes for 69 yards with one touchdown.

He made his first start as a Cowboy against Arizona (11/2/14), filling in for an injured Romo (back) to become the 37th player in team history to start at quarterback for Dallas. He finished the game 18-of-33 for 183 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions while suffering a loss, dropping the record for quarterbacks making their first start for the Cowboys to 14-23. Weeden played once more at Jacksonville (11/9/14) with the game well at hand, completing his only pass for eight yards in the fourth quarter. He entered the game in the fourth quarter against Indianapolis (12/21/14) with a large lead and completed his only pass for a 43-yard touchdown to Terrance Williams.

He made his first appearance of 2015 at Philadelphia (9/20) after Romo went down with an injury (shoulder) and will fill in while he is out. He finished the game seven-of-seven for 73 yards with a touchdown. Against Atlanta (9/27) he completed 22-of-26 passes (84.6% - highest completion percentage of his career with a minimum of 10 attempts) for 232 yards with no touchdowns and one interception. He opened the game against the Falcons completing each of his first nine passes en route to establishing a team record with 21 straight completions dating back to previous games that began against Arizona (11/9/14) last season. At New Orleans (10/4) Weeden connected on 16-of-26 passes (61.5%) for 246 yards including a 17-yard scoring strike in the fourth quarter that tied the game up at 17-17 to force overtime. His completions allowed him to surpass 500 for his career.

In two seasons as a Cowboy, Weeden has appeared in eight games with three starts, completing 69-of-100 passes (69.0%) for 854 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions.

21 IN A ROW

Brandon Weeden made his first start of the 2015 season against Atlanta (9/27) in place of Tony Romo (Reserve/Injured-Returnable - Shoulder). He opened the game perfect on each of his first nine passes before his 10th attempt was intercepted to establish a team record with 21 consecutive completions, surpassing Romo's previous record of 17. Weeden's streak began against Arizona (11/9/14) last season.

Weeden finished the game 22-of-26 for 232 yards with no touchdowns and an interception in the loss to the Falcons.

WEE-LIKE THE 4TH

Brandon Weeden is proving his worth while stepping in for Tony Romo (shoulder), particularly in the fourth quarter. In the final frame, he is 15-of-19 (78.9%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, no interceptions and a 141.9 quarterback rating to rank second in the NFC, third in the NFL:

CLIMBING THE TE CHARTS

Since entering the league in 2003, Jason Witten has proven his skills as an offensive weapon. He has provided Dallas with the full package at tight end. In his 13th season, Witten has caught 968 passes for 10,740 yards and 59 touchdowns. He is the second all-time leading tight end in career receptions and receiving yards.

To open the 2011 Witten became the seventh tight end in league history to reach 7,000 receiving yards. His work through the 2011 season allowed him to crack the top-five on the tight end receiving yards list. In 2012 against Tampa Bay (9/23), Witten moved into third all-time. He then crossed the 8,000-yard mark against Chicago (10/1) with his 15th career 100-yard game. He opened the 2013 season by crossing the 9,000-yard threshold.

By mid-November of 2011, Witten passed Ozzie Newsome (662) for third on the all-time receptions list. With four catches at Seattle (9/16) in 2012, he became the third tight end in league history with 700 career catches. His seven catches in the finale at Washington (12/30) made him the third tight end in league history to reach 800 career receptions. In Week 2 of 2013 at Kansas City (9/15) Witten passed Shannon Sharpe (817) for second in catches.

In 2014 he reached 10,000 career receiving yards on a 34-yard catch against Houston (10/5) to become only the third tight end in NFL history to reach that mark. The very next game at Seattle (10/12) he caught his 900th career pass on a three-yard scoring strike from Romo in the second quarter to become the second tight end in league history, the first Dallas Cowboy and the 16th overall player to do so. He had 27 yards against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) to pass Sharpe (10,060) for the second-most receiving yards by an NFL tight end:

Already placing in the top-two in career receptions and receiving yards all-time among league tight ends, Jason Witten is climbing the NFL's all-time receptions and receiving yards charts among all position players. Witten opened 2015 tied for 13th in receptions (943) and placed 35th in receiving yards (10,502).

In 2014 Witten topped Harold Jackson (10,372) against Indianapolis (12/21) for 35th on the league's all-time receiving yards list.

In 2015 Witten reached 950 receptions against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) - only the second tight end and 12th player overall to do so - while also tying Andre Reed (951) for 12th in NFL history. He then surpassed Reed (951) at Philadelphia (9/20) after seven receptions. He also passed Keyshawn Johnson (10,571) for 34th all-time in receiving yards at Philadelphia (9/20) and Stanley Morgan (10,716) for 33rd at New Orleans (10/4):

THAT'S A BUNCH OF WITT

After coming into the league as Dallas' third round draft pick in 2003, Jason Witten has strung together a Hall of Fame career. He has appeared in the most Pro Bowls by a Cowboys tight end (10, seven consecutive - 2004-10 and three consecutive 2012-14), and is tied for the second-most by any Dallas player in team history, is tops on the club's all-time receptions chart and second on the receiving yards chart. In 2012 he took the top spot on the club's receptions chart from Michael Irvin at Atlanta (11/4). Witten took 151 games to reach the top of the team's receptions chart which was faster than Irvin (159). When compared to the two other NFL tight ends with at least 750 catches - Tony Gonzalez and Shannon Sharpe - Witten also reached the mark faster - Gonzalez (163 games), Sharpe (169).

Witten hit 950 career receptions after a eight catch performance against the N.Y. Giants (9/13). By reaching that mark in his 192nd career game, he did it faster than Tony Gonzalez (198 games) - the only other tight end to reach 950 career receptions.

Witten accounts for 646 catches and 7,248 yards of Romo's 2,797 completions and 33,821 yards. Both numbers are more than any other player that has caught a pass from Romo.

In 2012 Witten caught 13 passes against Chicago (10/1) which was third in his career and tied for third among any Cowboys pass catcher and tied for eighth by an NFL tight end. He then bettered that with a club-record 18-catch game against the N.Y. Giants (10/28). His 18 receptions tied for third in a game in NFL history and were the most by a tight end in league history:

Jason Witten has steadily climbed Dallas' all-time receiving yards charts. In 2008 he became the sixth player in Cowboys history to reach 4,000 career receiving yards. In 2010, Witten became the fifth Cowboy to top 6,000 career yards. He opened 2011 with 110 yards at the N.Y. Jets (9/11) to become the fifth Cowboy to reach 7,000. His 94-yard outing against Detroit (10/2) put him past Bob Hayes (7,295) for fourth all-time in club history. He took third from Drew Pearson with four catches for 24 yards against Philadelphia (12/24). In 2012 Witten topped 8,000 yards with his 112-yard game against Chicago (10/1). Witten opened 2013 with 70 yards against the N.Y. Giants (9/8) to become the second Cowboy and third tight end to reach 9,000 career receiving yards. In 2014 he reached 10,000 career yards after a 59-yard performance against Houston (10/5) to become the third tight end - and second Cowboy - to reach that mark:

By reaching that milestone, he became the third tight end in NFL history, the 41st overall player in league history and the second Dallas Cowboy (Michael Irvin) to reach that mark. Witten reached the 10,000-yard plateau in his 180th career game to become the second-fastest tight end to get to that point. The very next week at Seattle (10/12), Witten caught two passes to up his career total receptions to 900, becoming only the second tight end in NFL history, first Dallas Cowboy and 16th overall player to do so. He reached that mark in his 181st game, the fastest tight end - and eighth-fastest player overall - in NFL history to reach that mark. BY DESIGN

After trading up in the 2010 NFL Draft to select Dez Bryant in the first round with the 24th overall pick, the Dallas Cowboys have seen nothing but production from the wide receiver. Despite his rookie season being cut short due to injury, Bryant was third on the team with 561 yards and six touchdowns and fourth with 45 catches. His reception total was second all-time among club rookies, his touchdowns were third and receiving yards fifth.

He improved upon those numbers in his second season (2011), catching 63 passes for 928 yards and nine touchdowns before topping club receiving charts in 2012 with 1,382 yards (fourth in club history) and 12 touchdowns (tied for fifth) on 92 catches (seventh).

Bryant finished 2013 as the team leader in receptions (93) yards (1,233) and touchdowns (13). He continued in 2014 where he left off, leading the team with 88 receptions for 1,320 yards and a franchise-best 16 touchdowns.

For the first five seasons of his career, he had 381 catches for 5,424 yards and 56 touchdowns. His totals all ranked as the best in club history through a player's first five seasons:

With the selection of Dez Bryant in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, the Dallas Cowboys added to their lineage of home-grown talent at wide receiver. Bryant was issued the jersey number 88 to follow in the footsteps of two of the previous 88s in club history - Drew Pearson (1973-83) and Michael Irvin (1988-99).

His progress as a rookie was slowed after landing on IR with an ankle injury suffered at Indianapolis (12/5/10). He returned to in 2011 season with 63 catches for 928 yards and nine touchdowns. In 2012 Bryant notched his first career 1,000-yard receiving season with a career-best 1,382 yards on 92 catches and 12 touchdowns. In 2013 Bryant led the team in receiving yards (1,233) with his second consecutive 1,000-yard season while also leading with a career-high in catches (93) and a then-career-high in touchdowns (13).

Bryant came on strong in 2014, leading the team with 88 receptions for 1,320 yards and a club-record 16 touchdowns. He looked to return to form in 2015 following signing a new contract extension, but suffered a foot injury against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) after making five receptions for 48 yards and will now miss some time due to the injury.

Bryant's 1,000-yard season in 2014 marks the 31st in franchise history, and he is the 12th different Cowboy to top 1,000 yards in a season. In 2014 Dez Bryant found the endzone a franchise-high 16 times to lead the NFL. This is beginning to be a trend for Dallas' top receiver. He finished the 2013 season with 13 scores to tie for third in the league, was third in 2012 with 12 touchdowns and finished tied for sixth in 2011 with nine. Since entering the league as a first round draft choice by the Cowboys in 2010, Bryant has the second-most receiving touchdowns in the NFL during that span:

DEZ-STRUCTIVE

In 2013 Dez Bryant had back-to-back multi-touchdown games when he caught two each at San Diego (9/29) and against Denver (10/6). Bryant averaged 23.5 yards-per-catch with six catches for 141 yards and two scores in the Broncos game. The 141 yards was his second 100-yard game of the season, eighth of his career, and tied the fourth-most yards in his career. He added 110 yards at Philadelphia (10/20) for his third of the season, ninth of his career. He then had his 10th career (fourth of the season) with 153 yards (second in his career) against Green Bay (12/15).

In 2014 Bryant notched his 11th career 100-yard receiving game with 103 at Tennessee (9/14) to mark his first of the year. His second came against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) when he had 151 yards - fourth-most of his career - to mark his 12th career 100-yard game. Bryant registered 158 yards - all in the second quarter - at Jacksonville (11/9) to mark the second-highest yardage output of his career and 13th career 100-yard game. His 14th career outing came at Philadelphia (12/14) to the tune of 114 yards and three touchdowns - most of his career.

Dez Bryant finished 2012 with 92 receptions, a career-high 1,382 yards and 12 touchdowns. From Weeks 8-13, he opened the flood gates of production. Over that span, he led the league with six touchdown catches, was third with 475 yards and seventh with 29 catches. He logged three 100-yard games, including back-to-back 145-yarders against Cleveland (11/18) and Washington (11/22).

Bryant tied a club record with a touchdown catch in seven consecutive games. On Thanksgiving Day against Washington, he had two scoring grabs then did the same the next week against Philadelphia (12/2), the sixth time in team history - fifth different player - a Dallas Cowboy had back-to-back multi-touchdown games. Bryant repeated the feat in 2013 with another pair in two games - at San Diego (9/29) and against Denver (10/6). He did it again in 2014 with two at Jacksonville (11/9) and two at the N.Y. Giants (11/23) to become the first player in team history to boast three instances of back-to-back multi-touchdown games:

In 2012 Bryant had two scores against New Orleans (12/23). His two touchdown catches came on consecutive drives, both from 58 yards. Bryant became the first league pass catcher with 55-plus yard touchdown grabs on consecutive drives since Buffalo's Lee Evans (at Houston, 11/19/06) did it.

Bryant's two touchdown catches against the Saints was his fourth multi-touchdown game of the season, sixth of his career. Bryant's four in 2012 were a single-season club best, while his six career tied for sixth.

Bryant finished 2013 with three multi-score games. He had two scores at Jacksonville (11/9) for his first multi-touchdown game of 2014 to give him 10 for his career and break a tie with Frank Clarke, Tony Hill and Michael Irvin (all with nine) for sole possession of second in club history.

THE REAL DEAL T-WILL

In his third pro season, Terrance Williams has emerged as one of the Cowboys top receiving targets, particularly in catching touchdowns. After posting five scores as a rookie in 2013, he proved as a threat to score again in 2014 by surpassing his rookie total with eight touchdowns in 2014, good for second on the team. He is tied for the team lead with two scores in 2015. Together, his 15 touchdowns are tied for the fourth-most by a Cowboys receiver during his first three pro seasons:

Williams caught five touchdowns as a rookie to tie for fourth in team history by a player in his first pro season. His rookie year was highlighted by a streak of four consecutive games with a touchdown pass to mark the longest streak of his career.

He increased his scoring production in 2014 with eight touchdowns. After beginning the season with touchdown reception against San Francisco (9/7/14), Williams strung together a stretch of three straight games with a scoring grab: at St. Louis (9/21/14), against New Orleans (9/28/14) - where he had two touchdowns to tally the first multi-touchdown of his career - and against Houston (10/5/14) to record the second-longest touchdown streak of his career. He recorded his second career multi-touchdown game with two scoring catches against Indianapolis (12/21/14).

Williams amped it up for the 2014 postseason, scoring three of the team's four receiving touchdowns while finishing second with 130 receiving yards and tied for fourth with four receptions. His three touchdowns tied for the postseason lead amongst all NFL receivers and also tied for the most by a Cowboys receiver in a single postseason in team history:

Williams notched his first score of 2015 on a 42-yard reception at Philadelphia (9/20). He added his second on a 17-yard strike at New Orleans (10/4).

TERRANCE THE TERRIFIC

With the injury to Dez Bryant in Week 1 of the 2015 season against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), Terrance Williams settles into his new role as the team's No. 1 receiver while Bryant mends his injury. Since entering the league in 2013, Williams has led all Cowboys receivers in each of this three pro seasons in receiving average - which has never dropped below 16.0. Williams has continued that trend in 2015 by leading the offense with a 16.1 yard-per-reception average, which is also currently 20th in the NFL, and his career average of 16.7 is tied for the sixth-highest in the league from 2013-15 among receivers with at least 50 catches during that span:

Additionally, Williams enters Week 5 of the 2015 season as one-of-three receivers to average at least 16.0 yards-per-reception in each season since 2013. Michael Floyd of the Arizona Cardinals and Malcolm Floyd of the San Diego Chargers are the only other two to accomplish the feat in that span. Also, since 2001, Williams is one-of-three receivers to start the first three seasons of their career with an average of 16.0 yards-per-reception - minimum of 20 catches - each season, joining Mike Wallace and Kenny Britt.

OFFICIAL TIMEKEEPERS OF THE NFL

The Dallas Cowboys offense made a point of time possession in 2014, controlling the clock for a season average of 32:26 - highest in the NFL. The offense never held the ball for less than the 24:53 at the N.Y. Giants (11/23/14), and its highest ball possession was clocked in at 41:55 at Philadelphia (12/14/14).

The Cowboys held the ball for at least 30:00 minutes in 11-of-16 games in 2014 and also posted two games with over 40:00 of ball possession - 41:11 at Tennessee (9/14) and 41:55 at Philadelphia (12/14). The offense also recorded a streak of four straight games of controlling the clock with at least 33:00 against New Orleans (9/28), against Houston (10/5), at Seattle (10/12) and against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) - to mark the first time that feat had been accomplished since 1980 (Sept. 21 - Oct. 12).

The Cowboys continue to win the time of possession battle as they are currently fourth in the league in 2015 with an average of 33:21 per-game:

Against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), the Cowboys offense held the ball for 37:10. The opening drive went 17 plays for 79 yards and spanned 10:27. The drive was longer than any drive Dallas' offense produced in 2014 and the longest since an 11:11 drive at Phoenix (9/20/92). The 17 plays were the most by a Cowboys offense since the club had 18 at Carolina (10/21/12). The amount of time in the pocket that was provided by the offensive line allowed Tony Romo to pass for 21 first downs. That number tied for the third-most all-time in a single game in team history and were the most since the 2009 offense had 23 passing first downs at the N.Y. Giants (12/6/09). At Philadelphia (9/20) the offense grinded out a time of possession of 40:30 - the 15th highest in team history and the most since the 41:55 posted at Philadelphia (12/14/14).

FIRST DOWN COWBOYS

The Dallas offense has shown its knack for getting first downs, and through the first four weeks of the NFL season, rank fifth in the league with 92 total first downs:

Additionally, Dallas' 55 first downs via pass is the eighth-highest number in the league while its 21 rushing first downs is tied for 18th.

BIG PLAY RUN & PASS

At New Orleans (10/4), the Cowboys offense pulled off two big plays in the game that resulted in long gains as Lance Dunbar ripped off a 45-yard rush in the first quarter and Brice Butler hauled in a 67-yard pass from Brandon Weeden in the third quarter. Collectively, it marked only the third time since 1991, the furthest back the stat can be tracked, that the Cowboys have recorded at least a 45-yard rush and a 65-yard reception in the same game:

FIRST HALF RUNNING

The Dallas Cowboys rushing attack accumulated 131 yards in the first half against Atlanta (9/27) to mark the ninth-most rushing yards in a first half by a Cowboys team since 1991, the furthest back this stat can be researched. They also recorded nine rushing first downs to tie for the most in team history in a first half since 1991:

Additionally, the Cowboys produced four rushing touchdowns (three by Joseph Randle; one by Darren McFadden) in the first half against Atlanta (9/27) to mark the second time in franchise history that has happened. In total, it is only the second time in team history the team has rushed for four touchdowns in either the first or second half, as it was also accomplished in the first half against the N.Y. Giants (12/1/63).

The Cowboys rushing attack compiled 90 yards in the first half at New Orleans (10/4) to join the Washington Redskins as the only two teams to post two games with at least 90 rushing yards in the first half of a game this season.

CHOOSE YOUR RUNNER

After losing DeMarco Murray in free agency, the Dallas Cowboys chose to replace him with a mixture of in-house young talent such as Joseph Randle (2013 fifth round draft choice) and Lance Dunbar (2012 rookie free agent), a veteran free agent in Darren McFadden (UFA Oakland) and via trade at the cutdown date with Christine Michael (2013 second round draft choice by Seattle) who also played college football at Texas A&M.

Collectively, Dallas is leaning on its premier offensive line to open holes for the collection of runners. Of the group, McFadden has the most experience, rushing for 4,247 yards and 25 touchdowns in 83 games with 63 starts during a seven-year stay with the Raiders who chose him with the fourth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In his two previous seasons in Dallas, Randle rushed for 507 yards and five touchdowns in 29 total games with two starts, including playing in all 16 games in 2014 for the first time of his career. Dunbar's skill set brings a different package for the offense, as collectively he rushed for 324 yards, posted 309 receiving yards and also returned kicks in three seasons in Dallas while playing in 37 games. However, he suffered a serious knee injury on a kick return at New Orleans (10/4) and will miss the remainder of the season. In two seasons with the Seahawks, Michael collected 254 yards on the ground in 14 career games.

RANDLE, RANDLE, RANDLE

Joseph Randle rushed 14 times for a career-high 87 yards and a career-best three touchdowns against Atlanta (9/27). Randle's three rushing scores marked his first career multi-touchdown game, the first by a Cowboy since DeMarco Murray's three rushing scores against Oakland (11/28/13). Murray's three touchdowns was the 19th time a Dallas Cowboy had three-or-more rushing touchdowns in a game, and he is the ninth different Dallas rusher to accomplish the feat.

Each of Randle's three scores came in the first half to mark the third player in team history to total three rushing touchdowns in a first half, joining Don Perkins (vs. N.Y. Giants, 12/1/63) and Ron Springs (vs. St. Louis, 9/13/81). It was also the first time this has happened in the NFL since Russell Wilson had three at Buffalo (12/16/12).

Additionally, with two-of-his three scores coming in the first quarter, Randle also became the only player in team history – since 1991 – to do so since Emmitt Smith had two against Washington (11/20/94).

At New Orleans (10/4) Randle scored on a one-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter to mark his second consecutive game with a score - the first time he has scored in back-to-back games in his career.

For the 2015 season, Randle leads the team and is tied for third in the NFL with four rushing scores:

Additionally, Randle had five rushing first downs in the first quarter against the Falcons, the second-most rushing first downs in a first quarter in team history, since 1991, behind Emmitt Smith's six he gained against Washington (11/20/94).

SIR LANCE-A-LOT

Lance Dunbar, a former undrafted free agent Dallas signed in 2012, looked to showcase his multi talents as a rusher, receiver and returner for the Cowboys in 2015. Dunbar led the team in receiving yards (215) and tied for the lead in receptions (21) following the first three weeks of the season. Additionally, his 228 total offensive scrimmage yards (13 rushing; 215 receiving) ranked second on the team and 33rd in the NFL, while his 361 all-purpose yards (13 rushing; 215 receiving; 133 kick/punt return) led the team and was eighth in the NFL following Week 3 action. However, Dunbar suffered a knee injury on the opening kickoff of the second half at New Orleans (10/4) that will cause him to miss the remainder of the 2015 season.

In the first game of the 2015 season against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), the Cowboys featured him as not only the third down back, but also split out wide as a receiver where he was able to haul in a game-high 70 yards on a game-high tying eight receptions. Combined with his 70 kickoff return yards - good for fourth amongst all NFL returners - he had a game-high 140 multi-purpose yards. He had a 45-yard receiving effort on three receptions at Philadelphia (9/20). Against Atlanta (9/27) he set career-highs in receptions (10) and receiving yards (100) to once again lead the team. It was also his first career 100-yard receiving game, was the 14th time a running back recorded a 100-yard receiving game and was the first time since Marion Barber had 128 at Arizona (10/12/08). At New Orleans (10/4) he ripped of a career-high tying 45-yard run in the first quarter as part of a team-high 54 yards in the contest.

Below are Dunbar's career yardage outputs in each of his four pro seasons, and in particular, his 2015 season which produced the highest total combined yardage number of his career before his injury:

DUNBAR CATCHES THE LEAD

Through the first three games of the 2015 NFL season, Dallas Cowboys running back Lance Dunbar led the offense with 215 receiving yards and tied for the team lead with 21 receptions. It was only the third time in team history that a running back led or tied for the lead in receiving yards after the first three games of a season:

NO RUNNING

Following four games of the early 2015 NFL season, the Dallas Cowboys boast one of the league's top run defenses by limiting their opponents to 91.8 rushing yards-per-game, good for eighth in the NFL. Along with its 19th ranked pass defense, Dallas' defense is ranked 14th overall in the league while allowing 347.8 total yards-per-game - an improvement for a squad that finished 2014 ranked 19th overall in defense, eighth against the run and 26th against the pass.

After limiting the N.Y. Giants (9/13) to 289 total yards in the 2015 season opener, the defense had an eye-opening performance at Philadelphia (9/20). The squad held the Eagles offense to 226 total yards in the game, including seven total rushing yards - tied for the second-fewest in franchise history and tied for 30th in NFL history. This performance also included limiting Philadelphia's rushing total to -3 yards in the first half to mark the fewest rushing yards allowed in a half in team history and tied for the 13th fewest in NFL history:

TAKE IT AWAY

The Dallas Cowboys recorded 31 takeaways in 2014 - the most since the 2006 squad had 31 - while finishing second in the league with that total. In particular, Dallas created 12 turnovers in December to mark the most by any team during the final month of the 2014 season.

The Cowboys defense recorded its first three takeaways of 2015 at Philadelphia (9/20), and in total, the defense has tallied 34 takeaways since Rod Marinelli took over the defense in 2014 to tie for the seventh-highest number in the NFL during that time:

The defense recorded its first three takeaways of the 2015 season at Philadelphia (9/20) to mark the first time the defense recorded multiple takeaways in a game since the four takeaways the unit recorded at Washington (12/28/14). Sean Lee and J.J. Wilcox each picked off Sam Bradford, while Nick Hayden recovered a Bradford fumble.

SHUTTING OUT EACH HALF

The Dallas Cowboys defense posted a shutout in five different halves in 2014 to tie for 19th in team history during a single season. The 1973 defense had the most with 10 total shutouts in either the first or second half.

Despite being behind 28-3 by halftime against San Francisco (9/7/14), the Cowboys defense responded in the second half by not allowing a single point in either the third or fourth quarters. It was the unit's first shutout of an opposing team's defense in the second half since against Buffalo (11/13/11). The Cowboys defense continued its shutout streak into its next game at Tennessee (9/14/14), holding the Titans offense scoreless in the first two quarters. Dallas' defense pitched another shutout against New Orleans (9/28/14), holding the Saints scoreless in the first half to mark the third time in 2014 the defense held an opposing offense scoreless in a half. The defense also limited New Orleans to 114 total yards and seven total first downs in the first two quarters. The squad then held Houston (10/5/14) scoreless in the first half to mark the fourth shutout. The Cowboys recorded their fifth shutout in a half of the season while blanking the Colts (12/21/14) in the first half.

The Dallas defense recorded its first shutout of a half in 2015 at Philadelphia (9/20), shutting out the Eagles offense through the first three quarters. The Cowboys limited the Eagles to one first down and 21 total yards in the first half. It was the first time a Dallas defense had allowed zero or one first downs in a first half since one was allowed against St. Louis (9/22/13) and the fewest yards allowed in a first half since 18 against St. Louis (9/22/13).

SACK ATTACK

From 2007-2011 Dallas racked up at least 35 sacks each season, but fell short in 2012, posting 34. Since the 2013 team finished with 34 once again, and since the 2006 season, Dallas has totaled 360 sacks - 10th in the league over that span:

For the 2015 season, the Dallas defense has logged 8.0 sacks. They began 2015 with Tyrone Crawford logging the team's only sack against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) - the fourth of his career and fourth in his last six games dating back to last season. At Philadelphia (9/20) Anthony Hitchens logged the team's lone sack and first of his career. Sean Lee recorded his first career sack against Atlanta (9/27). The defense recorded three sacks against Drew Brees at New Orleans (10/4) to mark the first multi-sack game of the season, and the first since the squad collected three at Washington (12/28/14). DeMarcus Lawrence notched his first career sack during the regular season, while Jack Crawford chipped in with his first quarterback takedown of the season and Hitchens collared his second sack of the season.

CHURCH IN SESSION

Barry Church finished 2014 atop Dallas' defense with 110 tackles - his second consecutive season with 100+ stops - to become the first player to lead the team in tackles in back-to-back seasons since Bradie James had a streak of six seasons (2005-10).

He logged five tackles against Indianapolis (12/21/14) to allow him to reach 100 tackles for the second consecutive season. It was the first time a Dallas defender posted consecutive 100+ tackle seasons since James had six in a row from 2005-10.

Church made his mark on the Cowboys defense in 2013, turning in a team-leading, and career-best 147 tackles, bouncing back after missing the majority of the 2012 season after suffering a ruptured Achilles tendon three weeks into the season. He posted eight games with 10-or-more tackles in 2013 - most on the defense - including a career-high 17 at New Orleans (11/10/13).

Church's 147 tackles in 2013 were the third-most by a Cowboys safety, and the 11th-most overall by any Cowboys defender, dating back to 1989:

In 2015, Church is currently second on the team with 37 tackles and two tackles for loss.

Church opened the season tying for the team lead with 11 stops against the N.Y. Giants (9/13). At Philadelphia (9/20) he finished second on the team with nine tackles along with two tackles for loss. Church posted seven stops to tie for second on the team against Atlanta (9/27). He was second on the squad with 10 stops at New Orleans (10/4).

HITCH & TACKLE

The Dallas Cowboys used their fourth round selection of the 2014 NFL Draft on linebacker Anthony Hitchens. The Iowa product was expected to ease into the NFL game by backing up Cowboys starting middle linebacker Sean Lee, but a season ending injury to Lee during the offseason immediately changed his role. The rookie took it in stride, going on to play in every game during the regular season while starting 11. Hitchens also remarkably started a game at all three linebacker positions while filling in for other injured players. He settled in as the starter at weakside linebacker where he totaled 100 tackles - third-most on the team - along with three tackles for loss, two quarterback pressures, four pass breakups and an interception.

Hitchens finished 2014 third with 100 tackles to become the first rookie defender to record 100 tackles in a season since Roy Williams (127 - 2002). It was also the fifth-best performance on the all-time tackles list by a Cowboys rookie, according to team statistics:

Hitchens is currently third on the team in tackles with 35, along with two sacks, a tackle for loss and four quarterback pressures.

Hitchens totaled 11 tackles in the 2015 season opening win against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) to tie for the team lead. He added five tackles, a pressure and his first career sack at Philadelphia (9/20). He tied for second on the squad with seven tackles and a pressure against Atlanta (9/27). He topped the defense with 12 stops, a sack, a tackle for loss and a pressure at New Orleans (10/4).

RETURN OF THE LEE-DER

Dallas Cowboys linebacker Sean Lee once again returns to the field in 2015, this time coming back from a torn ACL he suffered in a spring practice that took away his 2014 season. Before that, Lee had bounced back in 2013 to tally a team-best 123 tackles after landing on Reserve/Injured with a toe injury in 2012.

Having manned the middle linebacker spot since his rookie season, Lee moves to a new position this season with a shift over to the weakside spot to further utilize his speed and playmaking ability in the Cowboys 4-3 defense.

In his first game action since 2013 at Chicago (12/9), Lee made his presence felt at his new position in the season-opening win against the N.Y. Giants (9/13), finishing third on the squad with nine tackles and a tackle for loss. At Philadelphia (9/20) he led the defense with 14 tackles - the highest tally since he had 18 against Denver (10/6/13) - along with two tackles for loss, an interception and two pass breakups. He was named as the NFC's Defensive Player of The Week for his efforts. Lee once again led the team in tackles with 11 against Atlanta (9/27) while also notching his first career sack and two pressures. He also surpassed 400 career tackles during the contest.

Known to always be around the ball, Lee has collected 12 interceptions since entering the league as Dallas' 2010 second round draft choice to mark the most on the team, most amongst league linebackers and tied for 31st overall in the NFL during that span. His 12 are also fifth among linebackers in team history. Lee has intercepted a career-high four passes twice in season during his career - leading the team in 2013 and tying for the team lead in 2011 - to tie for sixth-most in a single-season in team history:

NFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sean Lee was named the NFC Defensive Player of The Week following his Week 2 performance at Philadelphia (9/20). He led the defense with 14 tackles - the most since he had 18 against Denver (10/6/13) - two tackles for loss, two breakups and a quarterback pressure. He also recorded the first takeaway of the season, picking off a Sam Bradford pass in the end zone and helped limit DeMarco Murray to just two yards on 13 carries as the Eagles finished with just seven yards on 17 carries (0.4 avg.).

It marked Lee's third NFC Defensive Player of The Week award, and his first - and first for the team - since at Philadelphia (10/20) in 2013.

JONES-ING TO PUNT

Dallas Cowboys punter Chris Jones is off to a solid start to the 2015 season. The fourth-year pro is tied for second in the league with nine punts downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line, is 10th with a 41.9 net average and is tied for 14th with a 46.4 gross yard average and is.

For his career, Jones boasts a 45.2 gross average and a net average of 39.7, with 70 punts downed inside the 20-yard line - good for sixth all-time in team history.

WE-FENSE = PUNT BLOCK TD

At Philadelphia (9/20), the Cowboys blocked a punt that was returned for a touchdown with Danny McCray credited for the block and Kyle Wilber returning it 26 yards for the score. It was the first time Dallas had a punt return for a touchdown since Ken Norton blocked a punt that was returned three yards for a touchdown by Robert Williams at the N.Y. Giants (9/13/92).

BAILEY'S BOOTS

Dan Bailey closed out the 2012 season converting 29-of-31 field goal tries (93.5%). His 29 field goals made in 2012 tied for fourth in a season in franchise history while his 93.5 field goal percentage was second. In 2013 Bailey went 28-of-30 (93.3) and had five games with at least three field goals and one game with five. For his career, Bailey has notched 17 games with three-plus field goals - second in team history. In each of his first three seasons he had five games with three-or-more field goals.

In 2014 Bailey made 25-of-29 kicks (86.2) and had three games with three-or-more field goals. He also has four games with four-plus field goals - tied for first:

GAME-WINNING KICKS

In his rookie season, Dan Bailey was called upon six times to win or tie the game with his foot. Four times he came through for Dallas. Bailey's four game-winning field goals were the most by a Dallas Cowboy in a single season and the most by a rookie in NFL history.

In 2012 Bailey had four opportunities to do the same, and he came through in three games including two in overtime. He added one game-winner in 2013 with a 35-yarder at the N.Y. Giants (11/24).

Bailey was one-of-two during the 2014 season.

In team history, there have now been 38 instances in which a kicker was true on a game-winning field goal with 2:00-or-less left in the fourth quarter or in overtime.

Bailey has rang true with nine game-winners - and a franchise-best five in overtime - to pass Rafael Septien for the most in team history:

BAILEY FROM 50

For his career, Dan Bailey is 16-of-23 (69.6) from 50-plus yards and is atop the club's charts for 50-yarders in a season (six - 2013) and career, while he also tied a franchise-long 56-yard field goal at Seattle (10/12/14).

At Kansas City (9/15/13) Bailey was true on three tries, including a pair from 50-plus yards (51 and a career-long 53). Bailey's two 50-yard field goals marked the second time in team history a kicker hit two 50-plus tries in the same game. The first was Eddie Murray at Minnesota, 12/12/93 (51 and 52 yards). Bailey did it twice more after nailing two 53-yarders at Detroit (10/27) and two 50-yarders against Green Bay (12/15).

Since 2000, a kicker has hit two-or-more 50-plus yard field goals in a game 60 times, and Bailey's were the 53rd, 55th and 57th occurrences, and he became the 34th different kicker to accomplish it over that span. Bailey is one-of-15 players to do it in multiple games, one-of-nine to do it three times and the only one to do three in the same season.

In 2014, Bailey finished five-of-seven (71.4) on field goals from 50 yards-or-more during the regular season for the second-most field goals made in a single season in team history.

MORE RELIABLE IS BETTER

Dan Bailey came to Dallas in 2011 as a rookie free agent and immediately earned his spot as the club's place kicker, finishing the season 32-of-37 (86.5%) on field goals for the second-best field goal percentage by a rookie in franchise history. His 32 field goals made were also a club rookie record. He had a streak of 26 consecutive made which were the most by a rookie in NFL history.

In his second season he finished with a 93.5 (29-of-31) field goal percentage - second in team history. He went 28-of-30 (93.3) in 2013, hitting 30 consecutive field goals from 2013 into 2014 to establish a team record. Bailey finished 2014 25-of-29 (86.2) with a career-high 56 extra points to tie the third-most in team history.

He made both PATs against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) to pass Mike Clark (180) for second all-time while also adding his first two field goals of 2015.

For his career, Bailey has converted 120-of-133 tries (90.2%), and his field goals made are second in team history. Bailey has also hit all 190 PAT tries - second in franchise history:

Dan Bailey has been a scoring machine since entering the league in 2011 as the former undrafted free agent has totaled 550 points to already rank third in team history:

In 2014 Bailey passed Michael Irvin (392), Bob Hayes (456) and Tony Dorsett (516) for third on Dallas' all-time points list. He also reached 400 points during the season to become the second kicker (Rafael Septien - 874) in team history - fifth player overall - to do so. At Philadelphia (12/14/14) he reached 500 career points, becoming the fourth player - second kicker - in team history to get to that plateau. Bailey reached 500 points in his 62nd game to become the second-fastest kicker in NFL history to hit that mark.

CAN'T MISS KICKER

The Dallas Cowboys feature one of the league's most dependable kickers, as the former 2011 undrafted free agent has hit true on 102-of-112 field goals for his career. During that time, Dan Bailey has challenged some of the franchise's longest consecutive field goal records, including 26 in a row in his first season to tie the second-longest streak in team history and mark the longest streak of field goals made by a rookie in team and NFL history. He then hit 21 in a row in between his second and third seasons (2012-13) - the third-longest in team history.

However, after that streak was snapped, Bailey quickly embarked on a new field goals streak in 2013 and extended it into the 2014 season. He opened the season with one field goal made against San Francisco (9/7) to extend his streak to 22 straight field goals made and move to the third-longest streak. Bailey then hit all four of his tries at Tennessee (9/14) to extend his field goals made to 26 in a row, tying Chris Boniol (1995) and his 2011 total for the second-longest streak in team history. He had two field goals at St. Louis (9/21) to reach 28 in a row and pass Boniol's 1995 total of 27 to establish the longest streak of field goals made in team history. He continued that streak up to 30 successful kicks before missing a 53-yarder against Houston (10/5):

2015 DRAFT CLASS
